BY THE NUMBERS

3 - Three ACC teams were among the top five national seeds of the 2011 NCAA Division I Championship field (Virginia No. 1, North Carolina No. 3 and Florida State No. 5).

4 - ACC players selected in the first round of the 2011 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. At least one student-athlete from an ACC program has been taken in the first round of each of the last 20 MLB Drafts, and the conference has boasted multiple first-round selections in 10 of the last 11 years. At least 50 total ACC players have been taken in each of the last six drafts.

5 - Coach Mike Fox's North Carolina team is returning to the College World Series for the fifth time in six years. This also marks the fifth year that the Tar Heels have won at least 50 games in a season.

14 - Since 2006, the ACC has placed 14 teams in the College World Series and has sent multiple teams to Omaha in five of those six seasons.

16 - Virginia's pitching staff has posted an NCAA-leading and ACC-record 16 shutouts in 2011, including Will Roberts' perfect game -- the eighth in NCAA history -- vs. George Washington on March 29.

32 - In his three years at Virginia, ACC Pitcher of the Year Danny Hultzen is 32-5 with a 2.14 ERA – tops among current ACC pitchers with 100 or more career innings pitched.

54 - With 54 wins thus far, ACC Coach of the Year Brian O'Connor's Virginia team owns the school record for wins in a season, topping the previous mark of 51 set last season.

70 - ACC Freshman of the Year Colin Moran of North Carolina leads the ACC in RBI and needs just one more to join former Tar Heel All-American Dustin Ackley as the only first-year player to drive in 70 runs in a season.

ACColades

Nationally No. 1-seeded Virginia and No. 3 seed North Carolina will represent the ACC in the 65th Men's College World Series, which gets under way Saturday at TD Ameritrade Park Omaha in Omaha, Neb. ... UNC (50-14) opens Saturday at 2 p.m. vs. No. 6 seed Vanderbilt (52-10), while the Cavaliers see their first action in Sunday's 2 p.m. game vs. California (37-21) ... Both ACC teams will be the designated "home" squads for their opening games of the eight-team series, which is scheduled to run through June 28 or 29 ... North Carolina is making its fifth CWS appearance in six years and its ninth overall ... Virginia will be making its second appearance, both of which have come in the last three seasons ... In addition to national live coverage on ESPN and ESPN2, all games of the 2011 CWS will be broadcast nationwide on SiriusXM ... All weekend and evening games will be on SiriusXM College Sports Nation, Channel 91 ... Weekday 2 p.m. ET games will air on Sirius 94 and XM 190.

ACC Postseason Notes ...

Seven up for NCAAs

With seven ACC teams among this year's 64-team field for the 2011 NCAA Championship, the ACC has placed at least seven teams in postseason play for the third straight year and the sixth time in seven years.

NCAA streaks extended

Miami made the NCAA postseason field for the 39th consecutive year, extending its own record. Florida State is making its 34th straight appearance, second all-time. Those are the nation's two current longest streaks, with Cal-State Fullerton's 20 straight appearances ranking third.

Among the elite

Three ACC schools rank among the nation's top six in total NCAA Division I Baseball postseason appearances: Florida State (second with 49), Miami (third with 40) and Clemson (tied for fifth with 36).

Terrific trifecta

Clemson, Florida State and North Carolina are three of just 10 schools nationally to go to a bowl game, the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament and the NCAA Baseball Tournament during the 2010-11 academic year. Clemson and Florida State are the only two schools in the nation to accomplish that feat each of the last three years.

Trending upward

Each of the last six ACC Champions - Virginia (2011), Florida State (2010), Virginia (2009), Miami (2008), North Carolina (2007), Clemson (2006) - have gone on to reach the College World Series in Omaha, Neb.

Bringing in the crowds

Despite several alterations to the schedule due to heavy rain on Friday (May 27) total attendance for the 2011 ACC Baseball Championship at Durham (N.C.), Bulls Athletic Park was the seventh-highest in the 38-year history of the event. The tournament's seven largest attended all-time:

AROUND THE ACC

Boston College

BC honored its senior class prior to its final game vs. visiting NC State on May 21 ... In four seasons, the class played a part in 107 wins and helped the Eagles reach their first two ACC Championships and the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in 42 years in 2009 ... The New England weather took its toll on the Eagles' schedule this season as BC (17-33 overall, 7-22 ACC) played only 14 games on its true home field ... six games were canceled, including one game of an ACC weekend series vs. Miami ... the Eagles again traveled extensively in February and March, logging nearly 10,500 total miles before playing their first home game.



Georgia Tech

The Yellow Jackets, who ended their season with a 42-21 overall record and tied for the best record in ACC regular-season play at 22-8, appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the fourth straight year and the 25th time in the last 27 years ... Georgia Tech 3B Matt Skole, DH Daniel Palka and C Zane Evans were named to the NCAA Atlanta Regional All-Tournament Team ... Yellow Jackets' head coach Danny Hall recorded his 300th regular-season ACC win during the 2011 campaign, joining FSU coach Mike Martin, the late Bill Wilhelm of Clemson and current Clemson coach Jack Leggett as the only coaches to reach that milestone.



NC State

The Wolfpack, which finished the year at 35-27, returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year and the eighth time in the past nine seasons ... NC State made its 24th postseason appearance overall ... In his last three starts of the season, junior pitcher Cory Mazzoni allowed two runs on 11 hits in 23 innings, with 32 strikeouts and two walks ... Mazzoni allowed just three earned runs in his last 29 innings pitched and reached double figures in strikeouts a school-record seven times ... Mazzoni had at least as many strikeouts as innings pitched in 12 of his 16 starts this season, including each of his last six.



Clemson

The Tigers (43-20) made their 24th NCAA appearance in 25 years and their 36th overall ... Clemson won 29 of 35 games during one stretch and earned a No. 1 regional seed after a 14-12 start to the season ... ACC Player of the Year Brad Miller hit over .400 most of the season and finished his season leading the conference at .395 ... Jack Leggett, who has coached for 32 seasons, is just 11 wins shy of reaching 1,200 for his career ... Leggett reached his 800th win at Clemson and 300th ACC regular-season win during the 2011 campaign ... senior Jeff Schaus finished as the ACC active leader in games played (258), at-bats (973), hits (311) and doubles (61).



Maryland

The Terps (21-35) were led offensively at the plate in 2011 by freshman Charlie White ... White started 46 of the 51 games in which he appeared and hit a team-high .304 ... Jake Stinnett's five home runs led the team, and Ryan Holland paced the Terps in RBI with 30 ... junior Alfredo Rodriguez led the way in stolen bases with 20 in 27 attempts ... Rodriguez now has 46 stolen bases for his career, tying him for fourth among active ACC players ... David Carroll (5-5) led the Terps in wins and was named the National Pitcher of the Week by College Baseball 360 on April 5 following his strong effort in a 5-0 shutout of Florida State.



Virginia

The Cavaliers (54-10) have advanced to the College World Series for the second time in program history (2009 & 2011) ... Virginia enters this year's CWS as the winningest single-season team in program history, surpassing the 51 wins it posted last season ... Virginia has scored 33 of its 42 runs in the 2011 NCAA Tournament after two outs had been recorded ... That included the tying and winning runs in the bottom of the ninth inning of the Super Regional finale vs. UC Irvine ... ACC Pitcher of the Year Danny Hultzen, the No. 2 overall pick in this year's MLB Draft, is a finalist for the 2011 Golden Spikes Award and a Dick Howser Trophy semifinalist.



Duke

The Blue Devils (26-30, 7-23) could potentially return 26 of 27 letter winners in 2012, including nine of 10 position starters and 11 pitchers ... C/DH Jeff Kremer led Duke offensively during the past season, batting .347 to rank eighth among ACC hitters ... Right-hander Marcus Stroman (3-4, 2.80) finished with 90 strikeouts in 64.1 innings ... Stroman's 12.59 strikeouts per nine innings ranked third nationally and second in the conference only to ACC Pitcher of the Year Danny Hultzen of Virginia ... The baseball team was one of seven Duke programs that achieved perfect scores of 1000 on the annual Academic Progress Report (APR) released by the NCAA



Miami

Miami wrapped up a 38-23 season after competing in the NCAA Championship field for the 39th consecutive year, extending its own national record ... the Hurricanes made their 40th postseason appearance overall ... milestones during the 2011 season included Jim Morris' 800th win as head coach at Miami ... Morris ended the season with 814 victories in 18 years with the Hurricanes and 1,318 wins in 30 years as a college coach overall ... sophomore second baseman Zeke DeVoss, who closed the season on a 10-game hitting streak, led the Hurricanes offensively in 2011 with a .340 batting average and an ACC-leading 32 stolen bases.



Virginia Tech

Sophomore Andrew Rash became just the fifth Hokie to be named either the first- or second-team All-ACC in the school's seven years in the league ... Rash joined former teammate Austin Wates (2010) as the only Tech players to be named first team ... Rash led all ACC players with 18 regular-season home runs, seven more than the next-closest hitter ... The 18 home runs were the most by a Hokie since Kevin Barker hit 20 in 1996 ... senior Michael Seaborn started the last 149 games of his college career at second base ... Seaborn, Tim Smalling and Ronnie Shaban all registered their 200th career hits during the 2011 season.



Florida State

The Seminoles (46-19) appeared in the NCAA Tournament for the 49th time, second-most nationally ... FSU earned a spot postseason tournament play for the 34th consecutive year, second only to Miami's run of 39 straight NCAA appearances ... The NCAA Regional title was the Seminoles' 27th all-time ... First-round MLB draftee Sean Gilmartin's 33 career wins are the most by an active ACC pitcher and rank tied for fourth among active NCAA pitchers ... FSU's 23 runs scored in Game 2 of the Super Regional vs. Texas A&M were its most since defeating Ohio State, 37-6, on May 31, 2009, in the NCAA Regional final.



North Carolina

The Tar Heels (50-14) will compete in their fifth College World Series in six seasons and their ninth overall when they open play against Vanderbilt in Omaha ... The 2011 Tar Heels are the fifth squad in program history to reach 50 wins, joining the 1990 and 2006-08 teams ... UNC has 37 wins in the NCAA tournament since 2006, leading the nation ... Included in that stretch is a 27-3 mark in Regional and Super Regional play and a 23-1 record in those rounds at home ... The Tar Heels have allowed only 10 runs through five games in this year's NCAA tournament ... UNC has led after 39 of the 45 innings it has played in the tournament (trailed 4, tied 2).



Wake Forest

Wake Forest (25-31) opened the season making national headlines as head coach Tom Walter courageously donated a kidney to freshman player Kevin Jordan ... The end of the regular season saw the Demon Deacons finish strong on the field, winning eight of their final nine conference games to earn a spot in the ACC Championship for the first time since 2008 ... Mac Williamson led Wake Forest in batting (.273), home runs (12) and RBIs (49) ... Steven Brooks finished his collegiate career with 79 stolen bases and ranks tied with former Florida State star Tyler Holt for 24th on the all-time ACC list.

Did you know

The ACC's current member schools have made a total of 79 appearances in the College World Series. Six of Clemson's 12 appearances came under the late Bill Wilhelm, who led the Tigers from 1958 through 1993 and posted a conference-record 1,161 wins as their head coach.

Bill Wilhelm: 1929-2010

The 2011 Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Guide was dedicated to the memory of legendary Clemson coach Bill Wilhelm, who passed away on Christmas Eve morning, 2010, at the age of 81.

Wilhelm coached the Tigers for 36 seasons (1958-1993), and his 1,161 career wins still stand as the most ever by a head coach while at an ACC school. His 64 all-time wins in the ACC Championship also rank first, as does his all-time winning percentage (.696) in the event.

Wilhelm led the Tigers to the College World Series six times (1958-59-76-77-80-91) and coached Clemson to 11 ACC Championships, 16 top-25 seasons, 17 NCAA Tournament appearances and 19 ACC regular season titles (including ties). Between 1973-82 Clemson won either the ACC regular season title or the ACC tournament every season. Wilhelm coached 20 All-Americans, 27 players who went on to play Major League Baseball, 88 first-team All-ACC selections and 100 of his former players signed professional baseball contracts. Among his former players is Jimmy Key, a four-time Major League All-Star who played on World Series Championship teams with the Toronto Blue Jays and the New York Yankees.

Wilhelm left a strong program upon his retirement. He took the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament each of his last seven years as head coach and the team averaged 51 wins per year over that time. His 1991 team still holds the Clemson record for wins with 60 and the team's 60-10 mark was the best winning percentage (.857) in the nation that year. That team had an average winning margin of 5.5 runs per game, still a school record. His final team, the 1993 squad, won the ACC Championship, beat 13 top 25 teams, and reached the NCAA Tournament.

"When I think of Clemson University I think of him," said current Clemson head coach Jack Leggett, who succeeded Wilhelm in 1994 and has taken the program to the College World Series six times. "He was what Clemson is all about. He was tough, he was honest, he was competitive and he took pride in everything he did.

"I will always have great respect for Bill Wilhelm. He set such a strong foundation for this baseball program. He set that foundation certainly in what he accomplished on the field, but he also set that foundation in the way he ran the program. He did things the right way and he was a great example to me when I was his assistant for two years before taking over as head coach."

Wilhelm is survived by his wife of over 50 years, Sarah, and his sons, Michael and Randall.
