North Carolina captures its 16th ACC title with an 89-80 victory over NC State in the 54th annual ACC Tournament in Tampa, Florida ... the Tar Heels and Virginia tied for the regular season championship ... Clemson advanced to the finals of the NIT before losing 78-73 to West Virginia ... the ACC became the first conference in NCAA history to have 10 teams with 20 or more wins ... for the second straight year a league-record 10 teams took part in post-season play, including an all-time high seven teams earning NCAA Tournament bids ... the ACC finished the regular season as the top-ranked conference by both the RPI and Sagarin Computer ... Boston College's Jared Dudley named ACC Player of the Year ... North Carolina's Brandan Wright selected ACC Rookie of the Year while Virginia's Dave Leitao tabbed as ACC Coach of the Year ... North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough earns consensus first-team All-America honors.

7 - A league-record seven ACC teams earned NCAA Tournament bids this past season.

10 - For the second straight year, a league-record 10 ACC teams took part in post-season play.

10 - The ACC became the first conference in NCAA history to have 10 teams with 20 or more wins

20 - With a 7-7 record, the ACC extended its streak of non-losing seasons in NCAA Tournament play to 20 consecutive years ... the Big East is second at 14.

33 - Number of freshmen that played in this year's ACC Tournament ... league freshmen combined to average 42.0 points, 13.6 rebounds, 7.7 assists and shoot .501 (173-of-345) from the floor in the Tournament's 11 games.

36 - UNC's Tyler Hansbrough became the 36th ACC player to earn consensus All-America honors ... the Big East is second with 20 consensus selections.

230 - Career blocked shots by Maryland's Ekene Ibekwe, which ranks 16th among ACC career leaders.

261 - Career steals by Clemson's Vernon Hamilton, which ranks seventh on the ACC all-time steal list.

TEAM NOTES

Boston College

The Eagles finished 21-12 overall and tied for third in the ACC with a 10-6 league record ... ACC Player of the Year Jared Dudley scored 10 or more points in 39 straight games and led the ACC in rebounding (8.3) and was second in scoring (19.0) ... Dudley started all 130 career games and finished fifth on the school's all-time scoring list (2,071) and seventh in rebounds (936) ... Tyrese Rice averaged 24.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.5 assists in the Eagles' two NCAA Tournament games and was fourth in the ACC in assists (5.4), sixth in scoring (17.6) and sixth in free throw percentage (.795).



Georgia Tech

The Yellow Jackets finished 20-12 overall and tied for eighth in the ACC with an 8-8 league mark ... Tech's last two losses were by a total of six points ... Tech freshmen combined to average 37.2 points per game this season, the ninth highest average in ACC history ... Javaris Crittenton led the team in scoring (14.4), assists (5.8), steals (2.0) and minutes played (31.3) ... Thaddeus Young averaged 14.4 points, 4.9 rebounds and 2.0 assists and scored in double figures in all but six games his freshman season ... Paul Hewitt is 19th on the ACC career coaching win list with 127 wins in seven seasons at Tech.



NC State

The Wolfpack won six of their last nine games to finish 20-16 overall and tied for 10th in the ACC with a 5-11 league mark ... NC State has four straight seasons of 20 or more wins ... over the past six years, the Wolfpack is 11-6 in ACC Tournament play ... State was second in the ACC and ninth nationally in field goal percentage (.491) ... Brandon Costner led all ACC freshmen in scoring (16.8), rebounding (7.3), double-doubles (8) and scored 10 or more points in all but two games this past season ... Ben McCauley was second in the ACC in field goal percentage (.584) and ninth in rebounding (6.9).



Clemson

The Tigers won six of their last eight games to finish 25-11 overall and reached the championship game of the NIT ... the 25 wins tied for the most in school history ... Clemson was 18-1 in non-league play ... K.C. Rivers averaged 19.0 ppg in five NIT games and led the team in scoring (14.0) ... Cliff Hammonds averaged 11.6 ppg and was second in the ACC in assists-to-turnover ratio (2.53:1) ... Trevor Booker shot .602 from the floor, averaged 10.2 ppg and was fourth nationally among freshmen in blocked shots (2.2) ... Vincent Hamilton finished sixth among ACC career steal leaders (269).



Maryland

The Terps finished 25-9 overall and tied for third in the ACC with a 10-6 league mark ... Gary Williams is third on the ACC career win list with 378 victories in 18 seasons at College Park ... Mike Jones was second on the team in scoring (13.8) and over his last five games averaged 19.8 points and 4.8 rebounds ... freshmen Greivis Vasquez was sixth in the ACC in assists (4.6) while Eric Hayes (3.9) was ninth ... James Gist was second on the team in rebounding (7.2), second in blocked shots (2.1) and third in scoring (12.6) and was one field goal shy of ranking fifth in the ACC in field goal percentage (.535).



Virginia

The Cavaliers finished 21-11 overall and tied for first in the ACC with an 11-5 league record ... guards Sean Singletary and J.R. Reynolds both scored in double figures the final 22 games of the season ... either Singletary or Reynolds led the team in scoring in 20 of the last 21 games ... Singletary and Reynolds combined to average 37.4 points, 8.6 rebounds, 8.4 assists, 2.1 steals and 13.0 free throw attempts per game ... Singletary was second in the ACC in three-point field goals (2.5), third in scoring (19.0), fifth in assists (4.7) and was a first team All-ACC selection for a second-straight year.



Duke

The Blue Devils finished 22-11 and tied for sixth in the ACC with an 8-8 league mark ... guard Greg Paulus finished the season by scoring 10 or more points 12 games in a row and in 16 of his last 17 ... Paulus hit on 68-of-151 (.450) from three-point range and over his last four games averaged 21.0 points and 3.0 assists ... DeMarcus Nelson scored 10 or more points in all but five games this season and led the team in scoring (14.1), steals (1.4) and was second in rebounding (5.4) ... Josh McRoberts averaged 13.0 ppg and was second in the ACC in blocked shots (2.5) and third in rebounds (7.9).



Miami

Miami finished the season 12-20 overall and 12th in the ACC with a 4-12 league mark ... the Hurricanes last three losses were all in overtime ... sophomore Jack McClinton finished the season scoring 10 or more points in 12 straight games ... McClinton, a third-team All-ACC selection, led the ACC in three-point FGs per game (2.9), three-point FG percentage (.440) and free throw percentage (.895) ... over his last nine games freshman forward Dwayne Collins averaged 10.2 points and 9.8 rebounds ... over the last four games senior Anthony Harris averaged 13.8 points, 4.0 assists and 3.3 rebounds.



Virginia Tech

The Hokies finished 22-12 overall, tied for third in the ACC with a 10-6 league record and made their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1996 and eighth overall ... first-team All-ACC guard Zabian Dowdell was seventh in the ACC in scoring (18.4), second in steals (2.1), fifth in free throw percentage (.806) and seventh in minutes played (33.7) ... third-team All-ACC guard Jamon Gordon led the ACC in steals (2.8) and was third in assists to turnover ratio (2.00:1) ... the Hokies led the ACC in turnover margin (+4.62) ... Deron Washington scored in double figures in 10 of his last 12 games and was second on the team in scoring (12.0).



Florida State

The Seminoles finished 22-13 overall and tied for eighth in the ACC with a 7-9 league mark ... the 22 wins were the most since a 25-10 record in 1992-93 ... Al Thornton led the ACC in scoring (19.7), was eighth in rebounding (7.2) and fifth in field goal percentage (.530) ... Thornton finished seventh among FSU career scoring leaders (1,521) and 21st in rebounding (541) ... the Seminoles led the ACC in free throw percentage (.758) and their .481 field goal percentage is their best since a .495 mark in 1992-93 ... Isaiah Swann averaged 19.3 points and 3.7 rebounds over the final three games.



North Carolina

The Tar Heels finished 31-7 overall and captured their 16th ACC title since 1998 and 16th overall with an 89-80 victory over NC State in the 2007 ACC Tournament title game ... Tyler Hansbrough earned consensus All-America honors after leading the team in scoring (18.4) and rebounding (7.9) ... UNC freshmen combined to average 43.1 points per game - the fourth highest per game average in league history ... Brandan Wright averaged 14.7 ppg and 6.2 rpg and became the third straight Tar Heel to earn ACC Freshman of the Year honors ... Ty Lawson finished third in the ACC in assists (5.6) and first in assists to turnover ratio (2.64:1).



Wake Forest

The Deacons won six of their last 11 games and finished the season 15-16 overall and tied for 10th place with a 5-11 league mark ... Kyle Visser earned third-team All-ACC honors ... Visser was eighth in the ACC in scoring (17.0), fifth in rebounding (7.4), seventh in blocked shots (1.4) and third in field goal percentage (.584) ... Ishmael Smith had an ACC Tournament record 15 assists in Wake's first round 114-112 double overtime win over Georgia Tech ... Smith led the ACC in assists per game (6.0) and was 10th nationally ... over his last three games L.D. Williams averaged 11.7 points and 6.3 rebounds.

Boston College's Dudley named ACC Player of the Year

Boston College's Jared Dudley was the media's choice in balloting for the 2007 ACC Player of the Year ... Dudley was named on 45 of the 106 ballots cast by ACSMA (Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association) ... the 6-7, 225-pound San Diego, Calif., senior scored 10 or more points in 39 straight games and led the ACC in rebounding (8.3), minutes played (38.4) and was second in scoring (19.0) and fourth in field goal percentage (.562) ... a second-team All-ACC performer a year ago and a unanimous first-team selection this year, Dudley has started all 130 games in his career and finished his career fifth on the school's all-time scoring list (2,071) and seventh in rebounds (936).

Virginia's Dave Leitao named ACC Coach of the Year

Virginia's Dave Leitao, who guided the Cavaliers to a 21-11 record, a tie with North Carolina for the league's regular season title and the school's first NCAA Tournament berth since 2001, was voted the 2007 ACC Coach of the Year in balloting by ACSMA ... Leitao became the first Cavalier head coach to earn the honor since Terry Holland did so in 1982 ... picked in a pre-season poll by the media to finish eighth in the ACC, Virginia finished the regular season with a flourish, winning 11 of its last 14 regular season games, including three wins against ranked teams and earned a share of their first ACC regular season title since 1995.

Boston College's Jared Dudley, Florida State's Al Thornton and North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough were unanimous selections to the 2007 All-ACC team ... Dudley, Hansbrough and Thornton were first-team picks on all 106 ballots and were joined on the first team by Virginia's Sean Singletary and Virginia Tech's Zabian Dowdell ... Dudley led the ACC in rebounding (8.3) and was second in scoring (19.0) ... Thornton, the league's leading scorer (19.7), became only the third Seminole to earn first team All-ACC recognition and Florida State's first unanimous selection ... Hansbrough was fourth in the ACC in scoring (18.4) and second in rebounding (7.9) and was the first player in league history to be accorded unanimous All-ACC honors in both his freshmen and sophomore seasons ... Singletary, also a first team repeater from a year ago, was third among league scoring leaders (19.0) in leading the Cavaliers to a share of their first ACC regular-season title since 1995 ... Dowdell averaged 17.4 points and ranked second in the ACC in steals (2.1) in leading the Hokies to their first NCAA Tournament berth since 1996.

North Carolina's Wright selected ACC Rookie of the Year

North Carolina's Brandan Wright was a clear cut choice by the media in balloting for the 2007 ACC Rookie of the Year Award ... in becoming the third straight Tar Heel to earn the league's rookie award, Wright was named on 49 of the 106 ballots cast by ACSMA (Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association) ... the 6-9, 200-pound Nashville, Tenn., native is averaged 14.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 1.8 blocked shots for the ACC Champion Tar Heels ... Wright became only the third freshman to lead the ACC in field goal percentage (.646) and scored in double figures in 33 of his 37 games ... averaged 15.7 ppg in three ACC Tournament games while hitting on 22-of-32 from the floor (.688).

TAR HEELS ACC CHAMPIONS



Tournament MVP Brandan Wright and Wayne Ellington scored 16 apiece and Tyler Hansbrough went 11-for-11 from the foul line to finish with 15 points as **North Carolina** captured its first ACC title since 1998 with an 89-80 victory Sunday over NC State ... the title was the 16th for the Tar Heels (28-6) tying them with Duke for the most in conference history ... the 10th-seeded Wolfpack reached the title game with upsets of second-seeded Virginia, third-seeded Virginia Tech and defending champion Duke, which had won seven of the previous eight ACC titles ... for the first time in ACC Tournament history the first four games were all won by lower seeds, including Wake Forest's 114-112 double overtime win over Georgia Tech which set a Tournament record for the most points scored (226) in a game by two teams.
