ACColades

Florida State won its first-ever ACC championship beating North Carolina 85-82 in the finals of the 59th annual ACC Tournament ... five ACC teams - Duke, Florida State, North Carolina, NC State and Virginia - earned NCAA berths ... Miami was the ACC's lone representative in the NIT ... the ACC has placed four or more teams in the NCAA field in 31 of the past 33 years, including each of the past 12 years ... the ACC had three teams - North Carolina (4), Duke (8) and Florida State (10) - in the final AP poll for the eighth time overall ... the ACC has had at least one team ranked in the AP Top 10 for 302 consecutive weeks, dating back to March 11, 1996 ... Florida State's Leonard Hamilton named ACC Coach of the Year ... North Carolina's Tyler Zeller was selected ACC Player of the Year while teammate John Henson was tabbed as the ACC Defensive Player of the Year ... Duke's Austin Rivers was selected ACC Rookie of the Week nine times during the 2011-12 season en route to being unanimously selected as ACC Rookie of the Year ... North Carolina led the nation in rebound margin (+10.5) ... Maryland's Terrell Stoglin led the ACC and was sixth nationally in scoring (21.6).

► The ACC, with a 364-188 mark, is the winningest conference in NCAA Tournament history (.659).

► Over the past 12 years (2001-12), the ACC has won an NCAA-best five National Championships ... the Big East and the SEC are tied for second with three.

► Since the NCAA started assigning seeds in 1979, the ACC has produced more No. 1 seeds (30) than any other conference and has the best winning percentage as a No. 1.

► Since 1981, the ACC has won more NCAA titles (10) than any other conference ... the Big East and the SEC are tied for second with six titles each ... the Big Ten is fourth with four.

► Duke finished the 2011-12 season ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll for an ACC-record 93 consecutive weeks ... the last time the Blue Devils were not ranked in the AP Top 10 was when they held the 13th spot in the Nov. 19 poll of 2007.

► North Carolina's Kendall Marshall set three ACC single-season assist records in 2011-12 ... the Dumfries, Va., sophomore established standards in total assists (351), assists per game (9.8) and games with 10 or more assists (17).

► 25 of the 96 ACC regular season games (26%) played in 2011-12 were decided in the final four seconds ... 44 were decided by seven points or less, including 33 by four or fewer points.

► Home teams were 58-38 (.604) in league play in 2011-12, that is tied for the second-lowest home court winning percentage in the last 15 years.

► North Carolina's Tyler Zeller and Duke's Mason Plumlee were named to the 2012 Capital One Academic All-America Division I Men's Basketball Team by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Team Notes

Boston College

Freshman Ryan Anderson averaged 11.2 points and 7.4 rebounds per game on the year to become just the 11th freshman in ACC history to lead his team in both scoring and rebounding ... a unanimous selection to the ACC All-Freshman Team, Anderson closed his season with 22 points and 12 rebounds against NC State in the opening round of the ACC Tournament ... five of the Eagles' top six scorers in 2011-12 were freshmen ... Boston College (9-22 overall, 4-12 ACC) saw newcomers account for 84 percent of the Eagles' total minutes played, 91 percent of the scoring, 80 percent of the rebounds and 85 percent of the assists.



Georgia Tech

Mfon Udofia led the Yellow Jackets (11-20) with 13 points against Miami in the opening round of the ACC Tournament ... Udofia closed the season with double-figure scoring performances in each of his last two games and had 15 such performances on the year ... Daniel Miller pulled down 10 rebounds vs. the Hurricanes ... Miller had three games this season with 10 or more rebounds, including 15 in a win over Delaware State on Nov. 14 ... Miller also ranks second in the conference with 2.4 blocked shots per game ... Miller blocked at least one shot in 27 of the 29 games in which he played this season.



NC State

NC State (24-13) reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 2005 and 13th time overall ... Mark Gottfried joins Duke's Vic Bubas (1960) and North Carolina's Bill Guthridge (1998) as the only ACC head coaches to win at least two NCAA games in their first year at the helm ... Gottfried also reached NCAA regional semifinals three times while playing at Alabama ... Gottfried ranked second nationally in wins and winning percentage by first year coaches from BCS schools ... his 24 wins this season trails only Missouri's Frank Haith, who guided the Tigers to 30.



Clemson

Clemson (16-15) saw seniors Andre Young (13.3 points per game) and Tanner Smith (11.2) led the team in scoring in 2012 ... Young Andre Young was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team ... Young ranks second in the ACC with 1.7 steals per game ... with 184 steals in 125 career games played, Young ranks seventh on Clemson's all-time list ... freshman Delvin Coleman led the Tigers in the opening round of the ACC Tournament with a career-high 15 points against Virginia Tech ... Coleman's previous career high had been nine points on three occasions, all coming since Feb. 11.



Maryland

The Terps (17-15) saw ACC leading scorer Terrell Stoglin score a game-high 30 points on 11-of-21 shooting, including 5-of-11 from 3-point range, in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals against North Carolina ... it marked the fourth 30-point game of the season for the sophomore ... Combined with his 25-point performance against Wake Forest in the opening round, Stoglin scored 55 in the two games, marking the most points in a two-game span by a Maryland player in the ACC Tournament since John Gilchrist had 30 in the 2004 semifinal vs. NC State and 26 in the final vs. Duke.



Virginia

Virginia (22-10) made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2007 when the Cavaliers advanced to the second round ... this year marked Virginia's 17th NCAA Tournament appearance ... the Cavaliers have compiled an all-time record of 22-17 in the tournament ... the Cavaliers' 22 wins this season were their most since winning 25 in 1994-95 ... with 15 points in the NCAA West Regional loss to Florida in the second round on March 16, senior Mike Scott scored in double figures for the 80th time in his career and 29th time this season ... Sammy Zeglinski moved into 11th place on Virginia's career assists list with 314.



Duke

Duke (27-7) made its 17th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as the No. 2 seed in the South Regional ... Duke's 75-70 loss to Lehigh in the March 15 regional second-round game was only its fourth first-game loss in 28 trips to the NCAA Tournament under head coach Mike Krzyzewski ... Mason Plumlee recorded his 15th double-double of the season with 19 points and 12 rebounds vs. Lehigh ... Plumlee was 9-of-9 from the field with six dunks to set the school's single season record for dunks in a season with 60 ... Austin Rivers set the school record for most free throws made by a freshman (121).



Miami

Miami finished with a 20-13 overall record, making coach Jim Larranaga the first Hurricanes coach to open his UM career with 20 wins ... the previous high was Ron Godfrey, who won 17 games in 1967-68 ... the 2011-12 season marks the third-straight season, and the fourth time in five years, that the Hurricanes posted a 20-win season ... junior guard Durand Scott led Miami in scoring at 12.9 ppg and in assists with 93 ... Scott's 5.4 rebounds per game ranked second on the team to center Reggie Johnson's 7.2 ... junior Kenny Kadji ranked second on the team in scoring at 11.7 ppg and blocked a team-high 51 shots.



Virginia Tech

Virginia Tech (16-17) suffered 11 losses this season by five points or less ... Erick Green (15.5 ppg) finished the ACC Tournament as the ACC's seventh-leading scorer and eighth in the conference in field goal percentage (.438) ... Green scored in double figures in 30 of the 31 games in which he played this season, including four games of 20-plus points ... Green was named second team All-ACC, while freshman Dorian Finney-Smith (6.3 points, 7.0 rebounds per game) earned a spot on the All-ACC Freshman Team ... senior Dorenzo Hudson finished his ACC career with exactly 1,200 career points.



Florida State

The Seminoles (25-10) made history in 2011-12 by capturing their first ACC championship since joining the conference for the 1991-92 season ... Leonard Hamilton earned ACC Coach of the Year accolades for the second time in three years ... the Seminoles earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA East Regional and defeated St. Bonaventure in the second round before bowing out with a 62-56 third-round loss to Cincinnati ... FSU again led the ACC in field goal percentage defense (.381) ... North Carolina was second at .394 ... the Seminoles led the nation in field goal percentage in 2010 and 2011 ranked among the top five most of this season.



North Carolina

UNC (32-6) closed the season with its 26th appearance in an NCAA regional final ... the Tar Heels are now 18-8 in regional finals ... UNC has advanced at least to the regional finals six times in nine seasons under head coach Roy Williams, including Final Four trips in 2005, 2008 and 2009 ... the March 23 Midwest Regional semifinal win over Ohio gave UNC 11 consecutive wins in Sweet 16 games and a 6-0 mark in regional semifinals under Williams ... senior Tyler Zeller's 22 rebounds in the win over Ohio were a career high for Zeller and the most ever by a Tar Heel in an NCAA Tournament game.



Wake Forest

With 14 points against Maryland in the opening round of the ACC Tournament, C.J. Harris scored in double figures for the 29th time in the 30 games he played this season ... Travis McKie led the Demon Deacons with 22 points against the Terrapins, his 11th time reaching the 20-point plateau this season ... in his final game in a Wake Forest uniform, Nikita Mescheriakov finished with 16 points in the ACC Tournament first-round game - only two points shy of the career-high 18 that he notched in the penultimate game of the regular season against Duke - to go with four assists and four rebounds ... Wake closed the season at 13-18.

Leonard Hamilton, Florida State ACC Coach of the Year



Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, who guided Florida State to its first ever Atlantic Coast Conference title after a strong third-place regular season finish, was named the 2012 ACC Coach of the Year in balloting among members of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA) ... in earning the award for the second time in four years, Hamilton guided the Seminoles to 21 regular-season wins, including six against nationally-ranked teams ... Florida State played the nation's 10th-toughest schedule in the regular season, won 12 ACC games for only the second time in school history and then swept three games in the ACC Tournament, defeating nationally top-10 ranked teams Duke and North Carolina in semifinals and finals ... Hamilton's Seminoles finished the season ranked No. 10 in the final AP poll, marking their first Top 10 final season ranking since 1972 ... Florida State also made a school-record fourth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament – currently the second longest streak in the ACC behind only Duke's 15 consecutive appearances ... Hamilton is 201-127 in his 10 seasons as the Seminoles' head coach and 401-337 in 24 seasons overall.

Tyler Zeller, North Carolina ACC Player of the Year



North Carolina forward Tyler Zeller was voted the 2012 ACC Player of the Year after leading the Tar Heels to the 2012 regular-season title and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament ... Zeller finished his senior season ranked in the ACC in scoring (16.3), second in rebounding (9.6), second in field goal percentage (.553), eighth in free throw percentage (.808), eighth in blocked shots (1.5) and first in offensive rebounds (3.8) ... the Washington, Ind., native is the 14th Tar Heel to win ACC Player of the Year honors and the third in the last five years ... Zeller also earned first-team Wooden All-America honors and second-team recognition by the AP, NABC, US-BWA and The Sporting News ... a two-time recipient of the Skip Prosser Award as the ACC Men's Basketball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Zeller is the first North Carolina senior to win the award since point guard Phil Ford in 1978 and the third ACC senior to win the award in as many years, joining Maryland's Greivis Vasquez in 2010 and Duke's Nolan Smith in 2011 ... finished second in the ACC with 14 double-doubles and scored 10-or-more points in all but six games this past season, including 11 games with 20-or-more points ... averaged 18.5 points and 10.1 rebounds over his last 10 games ... had 20 points and a career-high 22 rebounds in North Carolina's 73-65 overtime win over Ohio in the NCAA regional semifinals.

Austin Rivers, Duke ACC Rookie of the Year



Duke guard Austin Rivers was unanimously named the 2012 ACC Rookie of the Year in voting by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA) ... Rivers averaged a team-high 15.5 points per game while leading the Blue Devils to a 27-7 overall record, a 13-3 mark in ACC play and a No.2 seed in the NCAA Tournament ... the 6-foot-4 guard from Winter Park, Fla., a nine-time ACC Rookie of the Week choice, received all 62 votes cast ... Rivers joins North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough (2006) as the only two unanimous ACC Rookie of the Year honorees ... only the seventh freshman in league annals to be named first-team All-ACC, Rivers ranked eighth among conference scorers at 15.5 points per game, ninth in field goal percentage (.433) and seventh in minutes played (33.2) ... in becoming the sixth Blue Devil to earn ACC Rookie of the Year honors, Rivers scored in double-figures in each of Duke's last 17 games and in 29 of 33 games overall, including eight games with 20-or-more points ... became the first freshman to lead Duke in scoring since Johnny Dawkins did so in 1982-83 ... Rivers played 35 or more minutes in 10 of his team's final 12 regular-season ACC games and went 17-for-37 from the 3-point line in a five-game midseason stretch ... his best statistical output came in a win at North Carolina on Feb. 8 in which he made a buzzer-beating 3-pointer to cap a 29-point personal effort and conclude his team's comeback from a 10-point deficit in the final 2:20 of play ... 2012 ACC All-Academic Team

A pair of four-time All-ACC Academic team selections – North Carolina's Tyler Zeller and Clemson's Tanner Smith – and Duke's Mason Plumlee, who along with Zeller, is a first team CoSIDA Academic All-America selection, headlined the 2012 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Basketball team.

To be eligible for consideration, a student-athlete must have earned a 3.00 grade point average for the previous semester and maintained a 3.00 cumulative average during his academic career.

Zeller was also chosen as the recipient of the CoSIDA Academic All-America of the Year award for men's basketball ... the 7-foot senior from Washington, Ind., ranked second in the ACC in rebounding (9.6), fifth in scoring (16.3), second in field goal percentage (.553), eighth in blocked shots (1.5) and second in double-doubles (14).

Smith, a three-year starter for the Tigers, was second on the team in scoring (11.2) and assists (4.1), third in rebounds (5.1).

In 31 starts for the eighth-ranked Blue Devils, Plumlee is tied for second in the ACC with 16 games with 10 or more rebounds ... is third in the ACC in rebounding (9.2) and sixth in blocked shots (1.6).

Florida State's Luke Loucks, third in the ACC in assists (4.3) was chosen to the Academic honors team for a third time.

Clemson's Andre Young, the Tigers' leading scorer (13.3) and the ACC's current career leader in 3-point field goals with 233, and Plumlee each earned a spot on the All-Academic team for the second time in their respective careers.

Virginia Tech's Jarell Eddie had 14 games with 10 or more points and finished third on the team in scoring (9.1) and shot 44.3 per cent (54-of-122) from 3-point range.

Clemson led all schools with four selections, while Duke and Georgia Tech had two each ... Florida State, North Carolina, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest were each represented by one player.
