

ACC Statistics - A Preface

Origins: From 1953, when official ACC football statistics rankings began, through 1969, individual rankings were determined by totals. Beginning in 1970, most season individual rankings were determined by per game averages. In total offense, rushing and scoring, it was yards or points per game; in receiving, catches per game and yards per game; in interceptions, interceptions per game; and in punt and kickoff returns, yards per return. Punting always has been by per punt average and all team rankings have been per game.

Passing Efficiency: Beginning in 1979, passers were rated in all divisions on "efficiency rating points," which was derived from a formula that compares passers to the national averages for 14 seasons of two-platoon Division I football starting with the 1965 season. The formula assumes that touchdowns are as good as interceptions are bad; therefore, these two figures offset each other for the average player. To determine efficiency rating points, multiply a passer's yards per attempt by 8.4, add his completion percentage, add his touchdown percentage times 3.3, then subtract his interception percentage times two.

Minimum Qualifying: All individuals must have played in at least 75 percent of his team's games played to qualify for leadership in yearly categories. The one exception to the 75 percent rule is when a player, who played in less than 75 percent of his team's games, has enough yardage, receptions, points, etc., that when divided by the minimum number of games (to qualify for the 75 percent minimum) would still lead the conference in per game average. Passers must have a minimum of 15 attempts per game to determine rating points because fewer attempts could allow a player to win the championship with fewer than 100 attempts in a season.

All individual and team records and rankings include regular-season games only. Beginning in 2002, in conjunction with the NCAA, bowl games were included in the final statistics. Career records of players include only those seasons in which they competed at an ACC school.

In 1954, the regular-season schedule was limited to a maximum of 10 games, and in 1970, to a limit of 11 games, and most recently to 12 games in the 2002, 2003 and 2006 seasons, excluding post-season competition.

Brian Piccolo Award

One of Wake Forest's most famed athletes, Brian Piccolo was an All-America selection in 1964 after leading the nation in rushing and scoring.
