Duke and South Carolina finished the 1965 regular season tied for conference leadership with identical 4-2 league marks before ACC Commissioner Jim Weaver ruled that the Gamecocks had violated league rules in regards to the eligibility of two players and were required to forfeit all conference games in which the two players had participated. Due to the forfeit wins they received, NC State and Clemson, which had both lost to South Carolina, were declared ACC co-champions with 5-2 records in league play.

The FIRST GAME involving current ACC schools was on October 18, 1888, when Wake Forest defeated North Carolina, 6-4, in Raleigh, N.C. The MOST PLAYED SERIES between ACC schools is 112 games between North Carolina and Virginia. The first game between the Cavaliers and Tar Heels was played in 1892. The longest CONTINUOUS SERIES involving ACC schools is 97 consecutive years between NC State and Wake Forest. The Wolfpack and Demon Deacons have played each year since 1910.

NC State claimed its first title since 1973, finishing with a 5-1 mark while Maryland, defending champion Clemson and surprising Wake Forest ended up in a three-way tie for second at 4-2. The ACC, on the strength of a record-tying five teams having winning records, compiled its best ever record against non-conference opponents, going 28-18-3 versus outsiders. Three teams took part in post season play, with Clemson losing to Baylor in the Peach Bowl, 24-18, North Carolina beating Michigan, 17-15, in the Gator Bowl and Wake Forest, making its first bowl appearance in 30 years, losing to Louisiana State, 34-10, in the Tangerine Bowl. North Carolina captured its second ACC title in four years, completing the regular season with a perfect 6-0 league mark. Maryland was second with a 5-1 record. The Tar Heels knocked off Texas 16-7, in the Bluebonnet Bowl, while the Terrapins dropped a 35-20 decision to Florida in the Tangerine Bowl. Clemson placekicker Obed Ariri led the nation with 23 FG's while Jay Venuto threw for an ACC-record 21 TD passes. North Carolina linebacker Lawrence Taylor was a consensus All-American. NC State punter Calvin Warren and Georgia Tech linebacker Sheldon Fox earned All-America laurels. Clemson became the first league team to win 100 ACC games with a 35-33 victory over Wake Forest. In addition the Tigers became the first conference member to average over 60,000 fans per game, drawing 368,543 in six Memorial Stadium contests. Maryland's Charlie Wysocki rushed for 1,359 yards, the third highest single season total in conference annuals. Georgia Tech's Bill Curry and NC State's Monty Kiffin were the ACC's first year head coaches.
