2012 ALL-ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR

PLAYER OF THE YEAR: JARMERE JENKINS

Atlantic Coast Conference champion Virginia swept postseason honors for men's tennis and leads the 2012 All-ACC team, as announced by commissioner John Swofford.

Virginia junior **Jarmere Jenkins** was selected as the ACC Player of the Year, while the Cavaliers' **Mitchell Frank** earned Freshman of the Year honors and **Brian Boland** was named ACC Coach of the Year for the fifth straight season and the sixth time overall.

Virginia becomes only the second men's tennis team in ACC history – and the first since Miami in 2006 – to boast the conference's Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year and Coach of the Year in the same season. Postseason honors, along with the 18-member 2012 All-ACC team, were selected by a vote of the league's 12 head coaches.

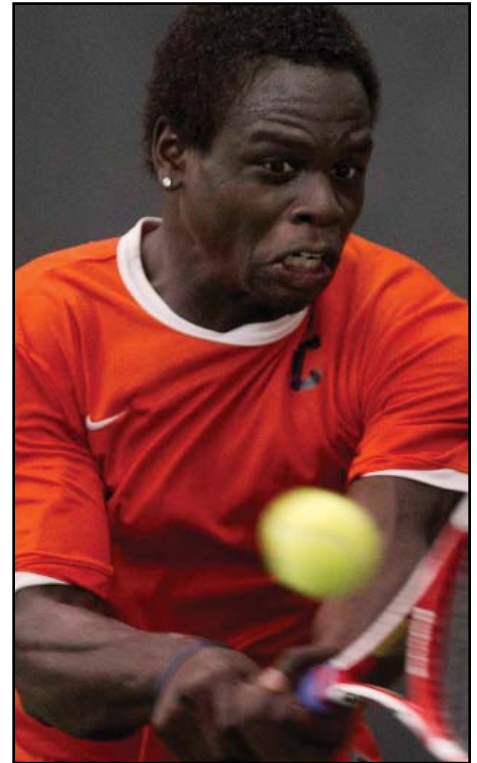
The nationally fourth-ranked Jenkins, who has played most of this season at the top of the lineup, will enter NCAA play with a 29-3 overall record and an 18-1 mark in dual match play. A three-time ACC Player of the Week in 2012, Jenkins owned a 9-1 mark against conference opposition during the regular season. The College Park, Ga., native owns a 15-7 record with primary partner **Drew Courtney** at No. 1 doubles, including three wins during last week's ACC Championship.

Frank, who has spent the season as the nation's top-ranked player, stands 31-1 in singles, including a 19-1 record in dual match play and a 10-0 record vs. ACC opponents during regular-season play. The Annandale, Va., native played most of the season at No. 3 singles, but won his lone dual match at No. 1 and is 3-0 on the No. 2 court.

Boland guided the Cavaliers to their sixth straight unbeaten season in ACC play and their sixth straight ACC Championship. Virginia stands 24-1 heading into the 2012 NCAA tournament and has won a league-record 92 consecutive matches against ACC opponents. The fourth-ranked Cavaliers have posted 10 wins over fellow Top-25 teams this season, including a 4-1 win over No. 8 Duke in the ACC Championship finals.

Virginia led all schools with three student-athletes voted to the All-ACC team. Duke, Georgia Tech, Maryland, North Carolina and Wake Forest each placed two players on the squad.

In addition to Jenkins, three-time All-ACC selections on this year's team include Boston College's **Akash Muppidi**, Duke's **Henrique Cunha**, Georgia Tech's **Kevin King**, North Carolina's **Jose Hernandez**, NC State's **Jaime Pulgar** and Virginia Tech's **Luka Somen**.

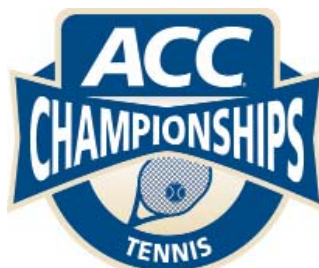

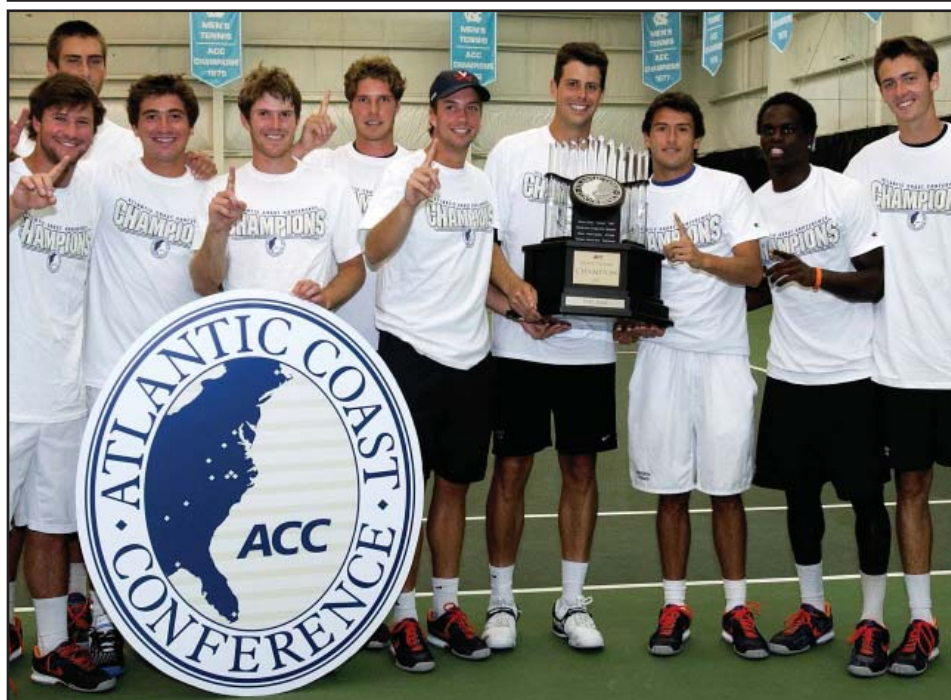

Virginia captures sixth straight ACC Championship

Courtney earns MVP honors as Cavaliers defeat Duke in title match

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. – Virginia maintained its firm hold on the Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Tennis Championship on April 22, downing Duke by a 4-1 score in the title match at Cone-Kenfield Tennis Center.

In a match played indoors due to heavy rain at Cary Tennis Park, the Cavaliers claimed their sixth straight ACC title and their eighth in nine years. The win was Virginia's 92nd consecutive victory against ACC competition (regular season and postseason), extending its conference record. Virginia owns a 27-3 record in the ACC Championship under head coach Brian Boland.

The Cavaliers (24-1) defeated the Blue Devils (22-5) in the championship match for the third straight season. Virginia took a No. 2 national ranking into the match, while the Blue Devils were ranked eighth. Senior Drew Courtney, who posted three tournament wins in straight sets and was part of two key doubles wins, was named the ACC Championship MVP.

"We played well today and needed to because Duke played a great match today," Boland said. "We have so much respect for Duke, and knew we would need to play at a high level to win today. I think we needed a good, competitive match like this to get ready for the NCAA Tournament. Each championship we have won is special. Every year it is a different group of guys and you want to see them be successful as a reward for all their hard work."

Top-seeded Virginia clinched the win when Jarmere Jenkins defeated Henrique Cunha 6-3, 7-6 (4) in a matchup of nationally top-10 ranked players on the No. 1 court. It marked Jenkins' second dual match win of the season over the Duke junior.

Prior to Jenkins' clinching win, Virginia sophomore Alex Domijan registered a 6-2, 6-2 victory over Chris Mengel at No. 2, and Courtney posted a 7-6 (5), 6-3 decision over Fred Saba on the No. 4 court.

Third-seeded Duke snapped the Cavaliers' string of five straight shutouts in ACC Championship play when Jason Tahir posted a 6-3, 6-4 win over Julien Uriguen at No. 6.

In a reversal from Virginia's 4-3 regular-season win at Duke, the Cavaliers claimed the doubles point on Sunday to grab a 1-0 lead. Mitchell Frank and Domijan teamed for an 8-5 win over Raphael Hemmeler and Torsten Wietoska at No. 3. After Duke's Saba and David Holland downed Justin Shane and Steven Rooda by an 8-2 score at No. 2, the doubles point came down to a decisive match on the No. 1 court.

In another nationally-ranked battle, Virginia's Jenkins and Courtney outlasted Cunha and Mengel, 8-6. That underscored the turnaround from the March 23 match, which saw Cunha and Mengel win by an 8-6 margin.

2012 NCAA TOURNAMENT

Six ACC Teams Earn Spots In NCAA Men's Tennis Field *Virginia seeded third, Duke eighth, and North Carolina 15th*

Third-seeded Virginia leads a group of six Atlantic Coast Conference teams in the 2012 NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Championship field.

Eighth-seeded Duke, 15th-seeded North Carolina, Florida State, NC State and Virginia Tech also earned spots in the tournament, as announced by the NCAA early Tuesday evening.

The 64-team NCAA Tournament opens the weekend of May 11-13 with the first two rounds at campus site. The quarterfinals, semifinals and finals will be held at Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga., from May 18-22.

The individual singles and doubles championships will also be held in Athens following the NCAA Team Championships. That competition is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, May 23 and continue until champions are determined on Monday, May 28. Individuals selected to compete in those championships will be announced Wednesday evening.

ACC champion Virginia, Duke and North Carolina will be host teams for the first and second rounds, and all will open play at 12 noon on Saturday, May 12

Virginia (24-1), making its ninth straight appearance as a national seed and regional host, will face Fairleigh Dickinson (15-8) in the opening round, while Duke (22-5) will play host to George Washington (17-7). North Carolina (13-7) will welcome College of Charleston (18-4).

NC State (20-9) travels to Malibu, Calif., where it will face Washington (15-8) at 2 p.m. Eastern time on Friday, May 11. Virginia Tech (11-11) will travel to Gainesville, Fla. to face Harvard (22-2) in a 9 a.m. match on Saturday, May 12. In another 9 a.m. match on May 12, Florida State (18-9) squares off against Boise State (26-6) at Athens, Ga.

Duke is making its 21st straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament and 22nd overall. North Carolina will be appearing for the 13th straight year, the 20th time in 21 years, and the 22nd time overall. Florida State will be appearing for the 10th straight year (13th overall). Virginia Tech earned a spot for the sixth straight time (12th overall). NC State, back in the NCAA Tournament field for the first time since 2007, will be making its fifth overall appearance.

ACC Boasts Three Of Top Five NCAA Seeds In Men's Singles *Ten singles players, five doubles teams earn postseason berths*

Ten Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes - including three of the top five national seeds - will be among the 64 competitors in the 2012 NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Singles Championships, to be held May 23-28 at the University of Georgia's Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga.

ACC Freshman of the Year Mitchell Frank of Virginia earned the ACC's automatic qualifying spot and will be seeded No. 2 in the NCAA singles field. ACC Player of the Year Jarmere Jenkins of Virginia earned the No. 4 seed and Duke's Henrique Cunha is seeded fifth. Virginia, the six-time ACC champion, placed two players among the top four national seeds for the second straight year.

Also selected to the field were Duke's Chris Mengel, Georgia Tech's Kevin King and Juan Spir, North Carolina's Jose Hernandez, NC State's Jaime Pulgar, Virginia's Alex Domijan and Virginia Tech's Luka Somen. In addition, Clemson's Yannick Maden was chosen as the fourth singles alternate.

Five ACC tandems are among the 32-team doubles field, led by automatic qualifier and third-seeded King and Spir of Georgia Tech. Virginia's Jenkins and ACC Championship MVP Drew Courtney drew a 5-8 seed as a doubles team. Courtney teamed with Michael Shabaz to win the 2010 NCAA doubles title. Duke's Mengel and Cunha, Maryland's Maros Horny and John Collins, and North Carolina's Hernandez and Joey Burkhardt were also chosen as at-large team selections, and Duke's Cunha and Fred Saba were picked as the second doubles team alternates.

The individual singles and doubles championships will be held at Georgia following the NCAA Team Championships, which are set to conclude on May 22.

The ACC will also be well-represented in the NCAA men's team competition, which gets under way on May 11. Third-seeded Virginia, No. 8-seeded Duke, No. 15-seeded North Carolina, Florida State, NC State and Virginia Tech, Maryland and Florida State all earned spots in the field.

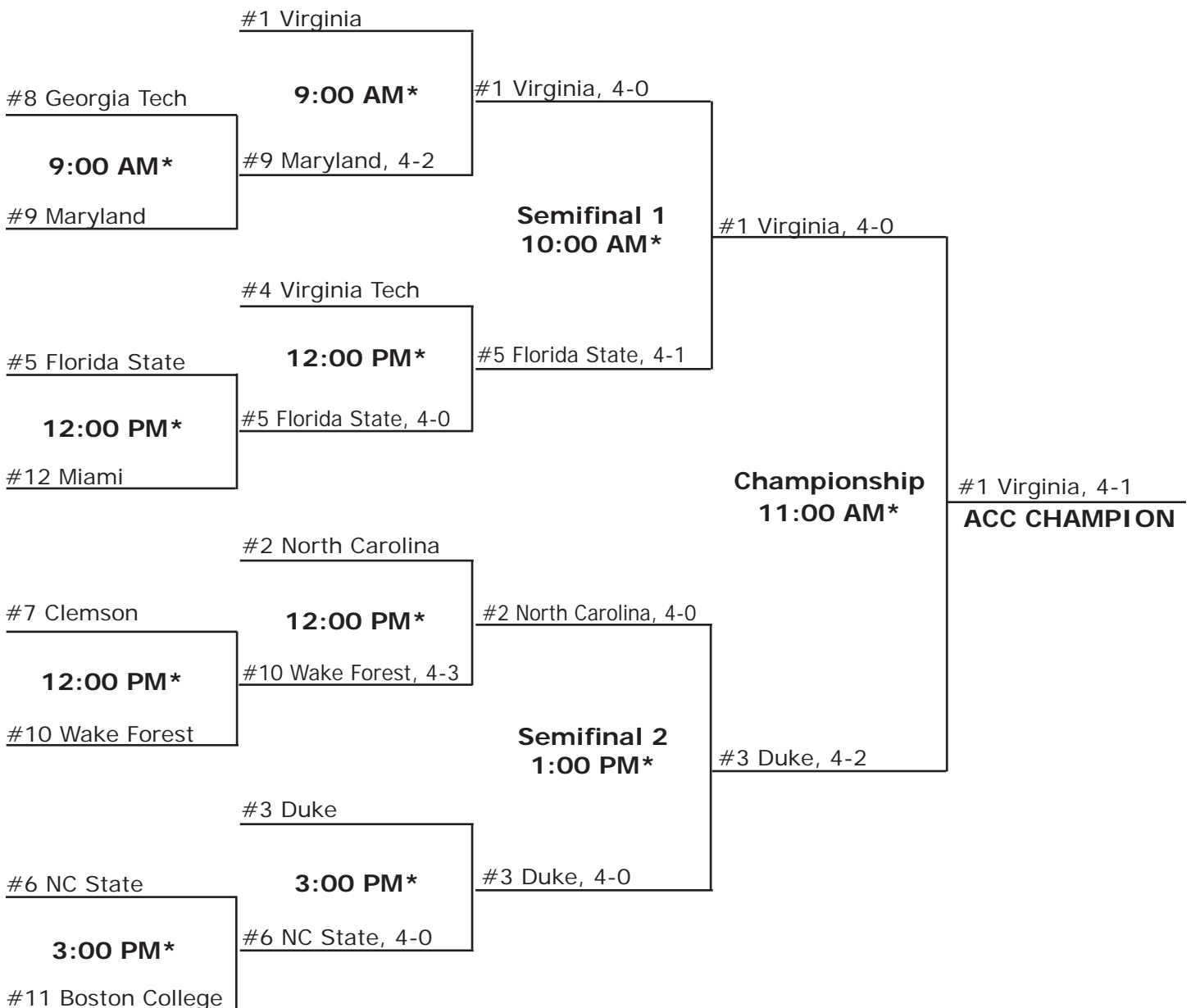

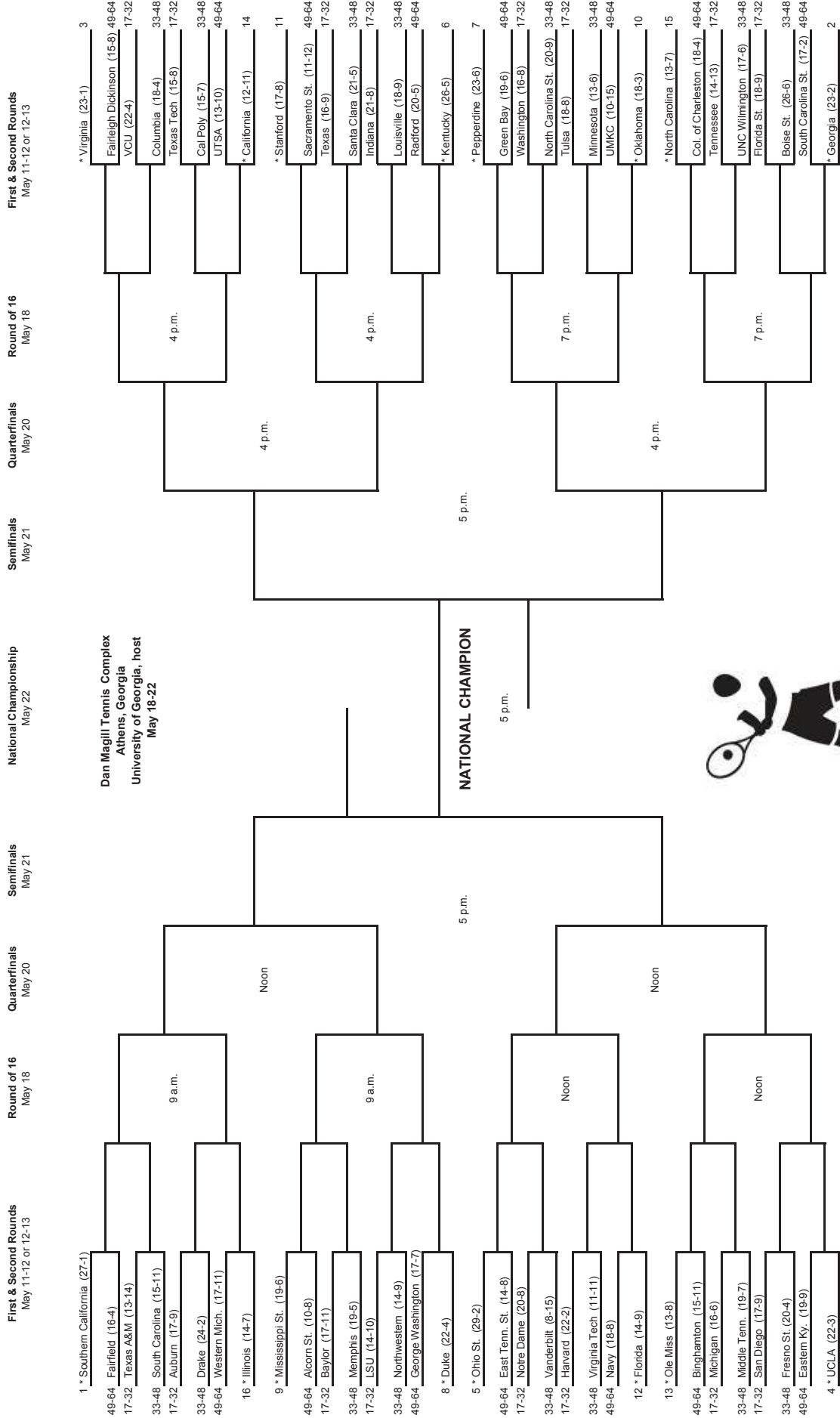
