ACC IN THE WNIT

Georgia Tech's appearance in the 1992 WNIT not only marked the school's first postseason tournament appearance, but also the first WNIT title for an ACC school. Boston College made its first-ever WNIT showing in 2008 after the Eagles made NCAA appearances in seven of the last nine years. All 12 ACC schools have now participated in the WNIT at least once. Georgia Tech, Clemson and Miami each have received four WNIT bids, Florida State, Virginia and Virginia Tech have three appearances, while North Carolina and NC State have earned two berths. Boston College, Duke, Maryland and Wake Forest have each earned one bid.

AIAW TOURNAMENT PARTICIPATION

The Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) was formally organized in 1971-72. This Commission established the national championships and encouraged organization of colleges and universities and/or organizations of women physical educators to govern intercollegiate competition for women at all levels of the sport.

Although the AIAW was the national governing body for collegiate women's athletics from 1971 to 1981, it did not establish its own legal identity until 1979. From 1971 to the AIAW's final Women's Basketball Tournament in 1981, the ACC was represented well with three of the eight schools participating in the tournament, including Maryland's appearance in the championship game of the 1978 AIAW Tournament.
