AIAW TOURNAMENT PARTICIPATION

The Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW) was formally organized in 1971-72. This Commission established the national championships and encouraged organization of colleges and universities and/or organizations of women physical educators to govern intercollegiate competition for women at all levels of the sport.

Although the AIAW was the national governing body for collegiate women's athletics from 1971 to 1981, it did not establish its own legal identity until 1979. From 1971 to the AIAW's final Women's Basketball Tournament in 1981, the ACC was represented well with three of the nine schools participating in the tournament, including Maryland's appearance in the championship game of the 1978 AIAW Tournament.
