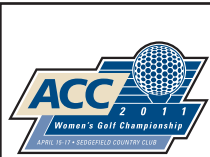

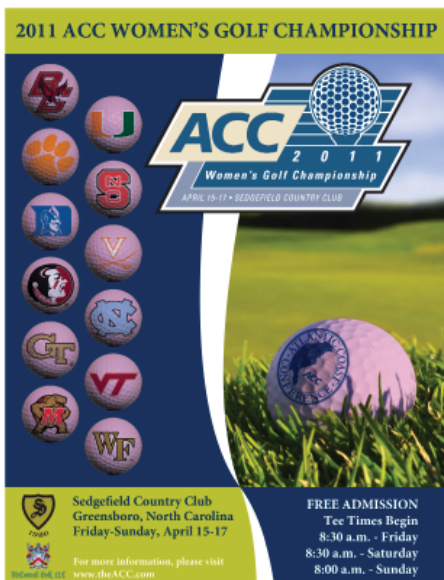

NOTEWORTHY

2011 NCAA HIGHLIGHTS
THREE ACC TEAMS FINISH IN TOP 15 OF
NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP
DUKE'S LINDY DUNCAN (T8th)
INDIVIDUALLY

Three ACC teams, Virginia (4th), North Carolina (T8th), and Wake Forest (14th) placed in the Top 15 team standings at the NCAA Championship, played May 18-21 at the Traditions Golf Club in Bryan, Tex. Two individuals competed at the NCAAAs - Duke's Lindy Duncan (So., Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.), (289, +1, T8th), and Florida State's Jessica Negron (So., Ocala, Fla.), (301, +13, T45th).

NOTEWORTHY:

-Virginia's fourth place team finish at the NCAA Championship was the Cavaliers best showing in the program's history.
-The 2011 NCAA appearance was the fifth in the eight-year history of the Virginia program.
-The Cavaliers were led by Brittany Altomare (So., Shrewsbury, Mass.) who tied for 12th (290, +2).
-Virginia seniors Calle Nielson (Nashville, Tenn.) and Joy Kim (Duluth, Ga.) capped their collegiate careers with their fourth straight NCAA Championship appearance. Nielson tied for 26th and Kim T95.
-Brittany Altomare named NGCA second-team All-American while teammate Calle Nielson named Honorable Mention.
-Calle Nielson named to NGCA All-West Region team for the second year in a row.
-Virginia's Brian Bailie named NGCA Assistant Women's Coach of the Year.
-North Carolina finished in a tie for eighth place at the NCAA Championship, one of the best national finishes in school history.
-This marked the Tar Heels second best NCAA finish. North Carolina has carded eighth place finishes on five occasions - 2011, 1995, 1993, 1992 and 1989.
-North Carolina's best finish came two years ago when they finished seventh.
-Katherine Perry (Fr., Cary, N.C.) had the best finish for the Tar Heels (296, +8, T24th).
-UNC's Catherine O'Donnell (Jr., Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla.) named to NGCA All-America Honorable Mention team and All-Region team.
-Wake Forest finished with its best round (296) of the week at the NCAA Championship and finished in 14th place.
-Wake Forest senior Natalie Sheary (West Hartford, Conn.) tied for eighth individually (289, +1) to lead the Demon Deacons.
-Natalie Sheary finished her career with a 74.43 scoring average, which is the lowest scoring average in school history.
-Natalie Sheary, Cheyenne Woods (Jr., Scottsdale, Ariz.), and Michelle Shin (So., Cape Coral, Fla.) named honorable mention NGCA All-Americans. This was the first time in school history that three Demon Deacons have earned All-America honors in the same season. Woods honored on NGCA All-Region Team.
-Duke's Lindy Duncan finished in the Top 10 individually at the NCAA Championships (289, +1, T8th). Duncan named to NGCA All-Region team and First-Team All-America.
-Florida State's Jessica Negron carded a 1-over par 73 in the final round of the NCAA Championship and finished tied for 45th place. Negron finished with a 301 total in the four round event and carded her second best score in the event in the final round. Negron and Maria Salinas named to NGCA All-Region Team.
