### Virginia Finishes Fourth at NCAA Championships Clemson's First Varsity Four + Crew Claims National Title

Camden, N.J.--With Clemson's First Varsity Four crew winning the conference's fifth national title and Virginia placing fourth nationally as a team, the ACC enjoyed one of its most productive NCAA Rowing Championships May 29-31 on the Cooper River in Camden, N.J.

Clemson's First Varsity Four crew of Kelly Murphy (Marietta, Ga.), Lydia Hassell (Greensboro, N.C.), Cullen Erdecky (Bowie, Md.), Allison Colberg (Six Mile, S.C.) and coxswain Meredith Razzolini (Roswell, Ga.), took a three-second lead at the 500 meter mar and held off second-place Wisconsin to capture the championship in a time of 7:26.78. Yale (7:30.81) took third place, followed by California (7:32.01), Stanford (7:32.29) and 6th-place Virginia (7:34.26).

UVa's First Varsity Four crew was composed of coxswain Sarah Pichardo (Clifton, Va.), Ruth Retzinger (Cincinnati, Ohio), Summers Nelson (Kansas City, Mo.), Carolina Sweeney (Grosse Pointe Park, Mich.) and Shalane Carlson (Nanaimo, BC, Canada).

The individual race national championship was the fifth for the ACC overall, but the first since Virginia claimed the First Varsity Four title in 2007. It was also the first national rowing championship for Clemson as well as for any ACC school besides Virginia.

The Cavaliers, led by their First Varsity Eight boat which placed

second to national champion Stanford by the slim margin of 37 hundredths of a second, recorded the highest team score ever for an ACC school at the NCAA Rowing Championships with 78 points, just 10 points behind the team National Champion Cardinal. The previous highest score by an ACC school was 63 points by UVa in a second place finish in 2005.

In one of the most exciting races of the Championship, Virginia's First Varsity Eight boat composed of coxswain Sidney Thorsten (Atlanta, Ga.), Jennifer Cromwell (Bellvue, Wash.), Helen Tompkins (Friendswood, Tex.), Desiree Burns (Poughkeepsie, N.J.), Amanda Chase (Woodbridge, Va.), Lauren Hutchins (North Vancouver, Can.), Augusta Stratos (Charlottesville, Va.), Nora Phillips (Arlington, Va.) and Victoria Burke (Redding, Conn.), fell behind Stanford by a second and a half after the first 500 meters, then gradually closed before just barely losing in a race that was too close to call visually.

After reviewing the finish, Stanford was declared the winner and posted a winning time of 6:11.95, with Virginia recording a time of 6:12.32, ahead of third-place California (8:14.76).

In the Second Varsity Eight competition, Virginia's team of coxswain Cristine Candland (Greenwich, Conn.), Lauren Shook (Grosse Pointe, Park, Mich.), Claudia Blandford (Winnipeg, Canada), Marie Long (Frederick, Md.), Bridget Fowler (Atlanta, Ga.), Martha Kuzzy (Minneapolis, Minn.), Cara Linnenkohl (Redmond, Wash.), Christine Roper (Redding, Jamaica) and Victoria Burke (Poughkeepsie, N.Y.) placed sixth with a time of 6:37.17 behind first-place Yale (6:29.04)

Clemson's Second Varsity Eight crew of coxswain Melissa Weaver (Greer, S.C.), Corey Geer (Clemson, S.C.), Leah Kelly (Pinehurst, N.C.), Jenn Agee (Bluffton, S.C.), Mairi Trimboli (Ludlow, Vt.), Sarah Daanen (Hayden, Idaho.), Kristen Agee (Bluffton, S.C.), Taylor Hoynacki (Tega Cay, S.C.) and Connie Gorman (Louisville, Ky.) finished 5th in the Petite Final with a time of 6:51.60.

The meet marked the first time two ACC teams have placed in the team competition with Virginia 4th and Clemson finishing 12th.

## Virginia's First Varsity Eight Named Crew of the Week

*Cavaliers Capture NCAA South/Central*

*Regionals; Defeat 3rd-ranked Michigan State, 6th-ranked Michigan, 8th-ranked Ohio State and 10th-ranked Clemson*

Oak Ridge, Tenn.--Virginia made their return to Lake Melton, the scene of their first ACC Championship defeat, a triumphant one as the 11th-ranked Cavaliers stormed their way to the Regional Team Championship behind first-place finishes in the First Varsity Eight, the Second Varsity Eight and the Novice Eight. The win was Virginia's sixth in the last seven years in the South/Central Regionals.

In doing so, Virginia's First Varsity Eight boat upset 3rd-ranked Michigan State, 6th ranked Michigan, 8th-ranked Ohio State and 10th-ranked Clemson. For their efforts, UVA's First Varsity Eight crew--composed of coxswain Sidney Thorsten (Atlanta, Ga.), Jennifer Cromwell (Bellvue, Wash.), Helen Tomkpins (Friendswood, Tex.), Desiree Burns (Poughkeepsie, N.J.), Amanda Chase (Woodbridge, Va.), Lauren Hutchins (North Vancouver, Can.), Augusta Stratos (Charlottesville, Va.), Nora Phillips (Arlington, Va.) and Victoria Burke (Redding, Conn.)--were named the Atlantic Coast Conference's Rowing Crew of the Week.

Virginia's First Varsity Eight finished first in the Grand Final with a season's best time of 6:03.2, with Michigan second (6:05.3), Michigan State third (6:07.7), Wisconsin fourth (6:08.6), Clemson fifth (6:09.2) and Ohio State sixth (6:12.6).

The Cavaliers' Second Varsity Eight also finished first in a time of 6:13.00 edging out Michigan State (6:13.4), Ohio State (6:15.8), Michigan (6:19.2), Wisconsin (6:20.1) and Clemson (6:29.0).

Virginia's Novice Eight posted a winning time of 6:27.60 to nip Wisconsin (6:27.63), Central Florida (6:31.20), Michigan (6:34.70), Duke (6:37.70) and Oklahoma (6:42.20).

UVA's First Varsity 4+ finished second in a time of 6:59.30 as Ohio State (6:58.00) captured first place, Minnesota (7:00.6) finished third, with Clemson claiming fourth place in a time of 7:07.5. Michigan (7:08.8) and Notre Dame (7:13.4) finished fifth and sixth, respectively.

Clemson finished second in the Open Four competition, posting a time of 7:01.2, being edged by Ohio State (6:59.7). Virginia's "B" team finished in 6th-place with a time of 7:10.9.

In all, Virginia scored 387 points to take the team title for the sixth time in the last seven years. Michigan State finished second (348) followed by Ohio State (328), Wisconsin (321), Michigan State (320) and Clemson in 6th place overall with 311 team points.

In South Regional scoring, Virginia was first followed by Clemson, UCF

## Virginia, Clemson Earn Bids to NCAA Championships

Virginia and Clemson both earned team invitations to this year's NCAA Rowing Championships. Both ACC squads are among 16 teams which will compete in the First Varsity Eight, the Second Varsity Eight and the First Varsity Four competitions which will be held May 29-31 at Cherry Hill, N.J.

Virginia, ranked 4th this week in the CRCA poll, is making its 12th appearance in this, the 13 year of the National Rowing Championship. UVA has finished as the national runner-up on three occasions, most recently in 2007.

Clemson, ACC Champion for the first time in league history, will be making its first team appearance in the NCAA's, though the Tigers' First Varsity Eight crew earned an invitation last year. Clemson is ranked 12th nationally this week after finishing in 6th place in the South/Central Regionals, and second place in the South Regional

# 10 ACC Rowers Named to CRCA All-South Region Team

Greensboro, NC--The Atlantic Coast Conference was honored with no fewer than 10 of its student-athletes named to the 2009 All-South Region First and Second Teams as selected by the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association. 2009 ACC Rowing champion Clemson and perennial ACC Rowing power Virginia led the way with four All-Region honorees each.



Clemson, which captured its first ACC Rowing team title on April 20 of this year had two selected to each of the first and second teams. The Tigers, ranked 12th nationally this week, were represented by junior Brittany Cummings (Virginia Beach, Va.) and senior Jessica Leidecker (Westerville, Ohio) on the first

team, with senior Hillary Cumbest (Nashville, Tenn.) and graduate student Stefani Kozuszck (Pinckneyville, Ill.) on the second team.

Virginia, which is coming off a strong showing in the South/Central Regional and is ranked 4th nationally this week, had three selections on the first team as well as one on the second team. Earning first-team recognition for the Cavaliers were juniors Desiree Burns (Poughkeepsie, N.J.) and Jennifer Cromwell (Bellvue, Wash.) as well as senior Amanda Chase (Woodbridge, Va.). Additionally, Virginia senior Augusta Stratos (Charlottesville, Va.) was named to the All-South Region second team.

Joining the eight rowers from Clemson and Virginia were one each from Miami--senior Rachel Sporko (Saratoga Springs, N.Y.)--and from North Carolina, junior Megan McMullin (Burke, Va.).

## Clemson Captures Tiger's First ACC Rowing Championship

**Oak Ridge, Tenn.**--Clemson claimed its first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Rowing Championship on April 20 on Lake Melton in Oak Ridge, Tenn. The Tigers were led by their Varsity 4+ and Varsity 8+ crews and finished with 55 points to capture the conference title.

Virginia, winners of the previous nine conference championships, finished just one point behind the Tigers with 54 total points. Miami placed third with 34 points, followed by Boston College with 23, Duke with 21, and North Carolina finished with 19 points to finish in sixth place.

Clemson's 14th-ranked Varsity 8+ finished first ahead of #11 Virginia with a time of 6:38.40, marking the first time in the history of the conference championship that Virginia did not win the Varsity 8+ race. The Tigers' victory was also just the fifth time a non-Virginia crew won an event at the championship regatta. Virginia finished with a time of 6:47.92, followed by Miami, Boston College, Duke, and North Carolina.

For the 10th consecutive year, Virginia's Second Varsity 8+ finished first in its race with a time of 6:49.30. Clemson finished second with a time of 6:57.13. Virginia's Martha Kuzzy, a member of the Second Varsity 8+ crew, was named the ACC Freshman of the Year.

In the Novice 8+ race, Virginia edged Duke to win the race with a time of 7:04.8. Clemson finished in third place with a time of 7:17.19.

Clemson's Varsity 4+ became just the fourth non-Virginia crew to win an event at the conference regatta when they defeated the Cavaliers with a time of 7:43.10 in the first race of the morning.

Clemson Head Coach Richard Ruggieri was named the ACC Coach of the Year in just his second year with the program after guiding the Tigers to their first conference title.

In addition, Clemson's Varsity 8+ was named the ACC Crew of the Year. The winning crew is composed of Carla Englund (coxswain), Jessica Leidecker, Meg Bendik, Liz Robb, Michelle Nance, Stefanie Kozuszek, Grace Wolff, Brittany Cummings, and Hilary Cumbest.

Leidecker (Clemson), Tracy Maciolek (Boston College), Laura Cordner (Miami), and Augusta Stratos (Virginia) were each named to the All-ACC team for the second consecutive season. Joining them on the all-conference team were Carla Englund (coxswain), Hilary Cumbest, Brittany Cummings, and Michelle Nance from Clemson, Amanda Chase and Bridget Fowler from Virginia, Emily Wingrove (Miami), Laura Harvey (Boston College), Lesley King (Duke), and Megan McMulin (North Carolina).

Greensboro, NC--The First Varsity Eight crew for Virginia has been named the Atlantic Coast Conference's Crew of the week for April 28, the ACC announced today.



Last Saturday, Virginia's First Varsity Eight Crew, ranked 15th nationally, defeated 11th-ranked Southern California, 16th-ranked Harvard, plus Northeastern and Gonzaga in a pair of races on the Charles River in Boston.

The Cavaliers bested the nationally-ranked Trojans and Crimson with a time of 7:08.4 to 7:09.2 for USC and 7:12.9 for Harvard.

Earlier, Virginia's First Varsity Eight led a sweep of Northeastern and Gonzaga with a time of 6:58.3 to 7:06.9 for the Huskies and a time of 7:21.6 for the Zags.

The honor was the first this year for UVA's for First Varsity Eight crew. Virginia's Second Varsity Eight crew was honored on March 31.
