## Virginia, Clemson Earn Invitations to 2011 NCAA Championships

### *No. 3 Cavaliers Look To Defend their 2010 NCAA National Title 13th-Ranked Tigers Seek Highest National Team Finish*

Third-ranked Virginia and 13th-ranked Clemson both received team invitations to compete in the 2011 NCAA National Rowing Championships which will be held May 27-29 on the Gold River in Sacramento, Calif. The setting is the same as last year where Virginia captured its first and the Atlantic Coast Conference's initial National Rowing Championship.

The invitation for the Cavaliers was their 14th in the 15-year history of the NCAA Women's Rowing Championships. They, along with Clemson, will be one of 16 teams that will field a Varsity Eight, a Second Varsity Eight and a Varsity Four crew at the 2011 NCAA Championships. Virginia has competed in the event 13 times, winning last year and finishing runner up on three occasions (most recently in 2007). As a team UVa has finished in the top four nine times (1997, 2000, 2002, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010).

Virginia has also fielded seven individual event National Champions, winning the Second Varsity Eight race three times (1998, 1999 and 2005) and the First Varsity Four competition four times (2004, 2005, 2007 and 2010).

This is Clemson's third-straight team selection and its First Varsity Eight crew's fourth-straight selection. In 2009, Clemson's Varsity Four captured the school's first-ever rowing national championship.

"We are very excited to participate in the NCAA Championships again," said Clemson head coach Robbie Tenenbaum. "I'm very proud of this team and I think we are peaking at the right time. We're excited to race against the best programs in the country."

The Tigers, who have been ranked as high as 11th-nationally this year, recorded their highest national finish in 2009, a 12th-place effort.

Clemson's First Varsity Eight will compete in the second of three heats and will face 2nd-ranked California, 6th-ranked Brown, 9th-ranked Yale and 12th-ranked Dartmouth.

The Tigers' Second Varsity Eight will compete in the first of three heats and will face top-ranked Princeton, No. 6 Brown and 8th-ranked Ohio State. The heat also includes 14th-ranked Michigan, who the Tigers' defeated in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in April.

Clemson's First Varsity Four will compete in the first of three heats against No. 1 Princeton, No. 2 California, No. 8 Ohio State and No. 10 Michigan State.

"I'm so proud of our team and we can't wait to race against the best teams in the country," Tenenbaum continued. "These are programs that we really respect and we are excited to race against them."

## Virginia Captures NCAA Rowing Championship

*Cavaliers Claim First ACC National Rowing Title*

*Clemson Earned 15th-Place National Finish*

*May 30, 2010*

GOLD RIVER, Calif. – For the first time in the 11 years the Atlantic Coast Conference has sponsored Rowing, an ACC team captured the National Championship as Virginia, the No. 1-ranked Rowing team captured the 2010 NCAA Rowing Championship with 87 points on Sunday at Lake Natoma at the Sacramento State Aquatic Center, outdistancing second-place California, which had 82 points.

UVa's First Varsity Four capped off an undefeated season by winning its race and being crowned national champions.

Clemson finished 15th, giving the ACC two schools among the top 15 in the country.

The Tigers' First Varsity Eight boat won the Third Final, while Clemson's First Varsity Four boat finished fourth in the Petite Final.

The team victory gave Virginia its 20th team National Championship in school history.

The Cavaliers were led by their Varsity Four, which handily captured the event title and which had earlier set NCAA records for the event, and by their First Varsity Eight crew which finished a close second to national champion Yale, finishing less than a second behind the Elis.

Virginia's Varsity Four became the seventh crew in school history to win a national championship and the

first since 2007.

The win was also the sixth national event title by an ACC school since the Conference began sponsoring rowing for the 2000 season.

UVa's crew of coxswain Sarah Pichardo (Clifton, Va.), Ruth Retzinger (Cincinnati, Ohio), Hunter Terry (Greenwich, Conn.), Chelsea Simpson (Carlisle, Pa.) and Inge Janssen (Voorburg, The Netherlands), had set an NCAA record in the semifinals on Saturday with a time of 7:07.28 and finished more than four seconds in front of second-place California.

"This is a special feeling," Virginia head coach Kevin Sauer said. "It's unbelievable. We have worked so hard at this. It's a great, great feeling."

The win in the First Varsity Four marked the second straight year an ACC team has captured the national championship in this event. Last year, Clemson captured the national title in the First Varsity Four.

Virginia's 2010 Varsity Four did not lose a race during the spring season and won the ACC Championship race in addition to the NCAA Championship race. It became the first UVa crew to win a national championship since the 2007 Varsity Four.

"They were a dominant crew from day one here," Sauer said. "Associate head coach Steve Pritzker did a great job with those guys. They rowed well and they

rowed hard. They set the tone. Our team would see them launching and coming down the course and just get so psyched. They really set the tone. That's what's cool about this final day, the Four goes first, so they started it off really well with a great race. I'm really happy for Sarah Pichardo, a senior coxswain who went out with a bang."

In the second event of the day, Virginia, one of only three schools to have qualified for the grand finals in all three events, finished 4th in the Second Varsity Eight with a time of 6:35.94. Brown (6:25.72) won the race, followed by Stanford (6:30.45) and California (6:31.96) edged out the Cavaliers for third place.

Virginia's Second Varsity Eight was composed of Coxswain Cristine Candland (Greenwich, Conn.), Victoria Burke, Marie Long (Frederick, Md.), Lauren Hutchins (North Vancouver, Canada), Sarah Borchelt (Boston, Mass.), Caroline Sweeny (Grosse Pointe Park, Mich.), Christine Roper (Reading, St. James, Jamaica), Claudia Blandford (Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada), and Lauren Shook (Grosse Pointe Park, Mich.).

Virginia entered the final race of the day--The First

Varsity Four--trailing California by three points.

Virginia's Varsity Eight, composed of coxswain Sidney Thorsten (Atlanta, Ga.), Jennifer Cromwell (Bellevue, Wash.), Katrin Reinert (Stuttgart, Germany), Desiree Burns (Poughkeepsie, N.Y.), Kristine O'Brien (Massapequa Park, N.Y.), Martha Kuzzy (Minneapolis, Minn.), Helen Tompkins (Friendswood, Tex.), Nora Phillips (Arlington, Va.), Summers Nelson (Kansas City, Mo.) closed hard down the stretch to finish second (6:25.75) to first-place Yale (6:24.76) by just less than a second.

The victory gave UVa the team title with a total of 87 points, five ahead of second-place California. Princeton (76), Stanford (75), Brown (71), Yale (66), Wisconsin (55), Southern California (52), Michigan State (51) and Washington (43) rounded out the Top Ten.

"I feel amazing right now," Virginia senior Jennifer Cromwell said. "This is honestly a dream come true. When I committed to Virginia, I made a promise to myself that I was not leaving here without a national championship. So now it is a dream come true. My last race being a Cavalier, I can't put into words how excited I am."

## **VIRGINIA CAPTURES 2011 ACC ROWING CHAMPIONSHIP**

*Cavaliers Take 11th ACC Rowing Title;  
Clemson's First Varsity Eight Named ACC Crew of the Year*

CLEMSON, S.C.—Virginia swept all four races, highlighted by a close win in the First Varsity Eight+, in route to capturing the 12th Annual Atlantic Coast Conference Rowing Championship on April 23rd on Lake Hartwell in Clemson S.C.

The event was held before an ACC Rowing Championships record crowd of 1,022 with almost near-perfect weather under overcast skies, with temperatures in the 57-61 degree range and calm winds on Lake Hartwell.

The win for the Cavaliers, ranked 5th nationally this week in the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association weekly poll, marked their second straight ACC Rowing title and their 11th triumph in the 12 ACC title events.

Virginia took first place with 60 points followed in second place by host Clemson (49), Duke (41), Miami (23), Boston College (22) and North Carolina (14).

This marked the seventh second-place finish in the ACC's for Clemson, which is ranked 14th nationally, and is the only team other than Virginia to win an ACC Rowing title. The Tigers prevailed in 2009.

UVa. Began the day winning the First Varsity Four race with a time of 7:17.5., the fastest in the ACC this year, to finish ahead of Clemson (7:28.0). The Virginia First Varsity Four is composed of coxswain Sarah Jordan (Flourtown, Pa.) and rowers Ruth Retzinger (Cincinnati, Ohio), Kaity McCullough (Campbell, Calif.), Chelsea Simpson Carlisle, Pa.) and Susanne Grainger (London, Ontario).Ariz.).

Virginia's Novice Eight posted a time of 6:49.5 to best Duke (7:01.0) in the second event. UVa's Novice Eight was composed of coxswain Brittany Wengel (Weston, Conn.); and rowers Allison Mayberry (Wood-

Virginia's Second Varsity Eight crew, which entered the day 6-1 on the season including wins over six ranked foes, posted a time of 6:35.9 in a tight race over Clemson (6:40.8). UVA's First Varsity Eight posted their best time of the year (6:26.0) in defeating both ACC rivals Clemson (6:31.86) and Duke (6:34.78) in the six-team race.

Earlier in the day, the UVA team posted a 6:35.20 clocking in winning its heat over Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Rhode Island and Tulsa.

The win in the First Varsity Eight was one of five victories for the Cavaliers on the weekend which also took home wins in the Second Varsity Eight, the First Varsity Four, the Open Four and the Third Varsity Eight.

Virginia's 1V8+ captured Crew of the Week honors over First Varsity Eight crews from Clemson, which finished second, and Duke, which posted a season-best time of 6:34.78 to outdistance 20th-ranked Notre Dame, 25th-ranked Louisville as well as Oklahoma to finish third.

UVA's First Varsity Four won handily by almost 11 seconds to finish with a time of 8:01.5 to Princeton's 8:12.5, with Tennessee finishing third (8:17.0) and Columbia in fourth (8:29.7)

The Virginia's First Varsity Four Crew is now 7-2 on the season, having defeated No 1 Princeton, second-ranked Stanford, 7th-ranked Michigan State 11th-ranked Ohio State, 15th-ranked Michigan, 17th-ranked UCLA and claimed the ACC Championship, with losses only to third-ranked Southern California and No. 4 California.

Virginia, the 2011 ACC Rowing Champions and ranked 5th nationally in the most recent Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association poll, captured two of five races against the top-ranked Tigers, winning in the 4V8+, but dropping the First, Second and Third Varsity Eight races.

Virginia will next be in action on Saturday, May 15, facing 20th-ranked Notre Dame and Louisville in Oak Ridge, Tenn.

UVa's Second Varsity Eight+ then posted Virginia's only win on Sunday against 3rd-ranked California, besting the Golden Bears' boat by more than eight seconds, recording a time of 6:40.1 to a 6:48.5 time for Cal.

Virginia's crew earned the honors over Clemson's First Varsity 8 crew which captured a seven-team race at Lake Hartwell on March 19 with a time of 6:39.85, besting teams from Indiana, Alabama, Boston University, Syracuse, Purdue and Marist.

Greensboro, N.C.--Clemson's First Varsity 8+ boat was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Rowing Crew of the Week after defeating crews from both 7th-ranked Ohio State and 12th-ranked Michigan this past weekend at the annual ACC-Big Ten Challenge in Columbus, Ohio.

Clemson, ranked 14th nationally in the latest weekly national Collegiate Coaches Rowing Association poll last Wednesday, posted a time of 6:44.40 in defeating the Wolverines (6:47.94) in the morning session, then came back to down 7th-ranked Ohio State in the afternoon, posting a time of 6:56.35 to the Buckeyes' performance of 6:59.60.

The Tigers' First Varsity Eight crew consists of coxswain Katie Bruggeling (St. Catherine's, Ontario, Canada) and rowers Laura D'Urso (Dunross, Ireland), Laura Basadonna (Torino, Italy), Becca Brown (Greenville, S.C.), Liz Robb (Roswell, Ga.), Sarah Daanen (Hayden, Idaho), Heather Cummings (Virginia Beach, Va.), Grace Wolff (Chanhassen, Minn.) and Stephanie Cameron (Alexandria, Va.).

Clemson's crew nosed out the First Varsity Eight crew from Virginia for the honors as the Cavaliers also defeated both Ohio State and Michigan in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge. ACC teams swept all four First Varsity Eight races in the annual competition.

# 2011 National Rankings

## ACC Champion Virginia Finishes Regular Season Ranked 3rd; Clemson 13th; Duke Receives Enough Votes to Be 24th

ACC Champion Virginia moved up to 3rd in the final Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association regular season poll, released on May 18. The Cavaliers now trail first-place Princeton and No. 2 California. The Tigers had 20 first-place votes and a total of 475 points to finish ahead of California which had five first place votes and 461 points. Virginia, the defending NCAA National Champion which swept five races this past weekend at the Oak Ridge (Tenn.) Invitational and defeated three ranked teams, had 416 total points to move ahead of 4th-place Stanford and 5th-place Southern California.



The ranking marked Virginia's 45th consecutive appearance in the poll.

Clemson, under first-year head coach Robbie Tenenbaum, slipped two places in the poll to No. 13, despite a strong showing in the Oak Ridge Invitational. The Tigers finished second to the Cavaliers in three events including both the First Varsity Eight and the Second Varsity Eight competitions. The Tigers previously finished second to Virginia at this year's ACC Championships and their First Varsity Eight crew was named the ACC Crew of the Year and barely missed defeating the Cavaliers by just 1.2 seconds. Clemson finished second to UVa in the ACC in 2010 and 2011 and are also the only ACC team other than the Cavaliers to win the ACC Championship (2009). This marked the 38th consecutive poll in which Clemson has been ranked.



Both Virginia and Clemson have been invited to the NCAA National Championships May 27-29 on the Gold River in Sacramento, Calif.

Duke, which had an impressive third-place showing in the First Varsity Eight race at the Oak Ridge Invitational, earned enough votes in this week's poll to be ranked 24th nationally if the poll went below 20 spaces, the second time this season the Blue Devils received votes.

## CRCA Rowing National Rankings

Since 2002, Virginia leads all Atlantic Coast Conference schools with 81 appearances in the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association poll. The Cavaliers have appeared in 45 consecutive polls, dating back to the final CRCA poll of 2006. The Cavaliers have actually made an appearance in 81 of 82 CRCA polls since 2002. Clemson is next with 39 appearances, including a current streak of 38 consecutive polls. Duke is the only other ACC school to make an appearance in the CRCA national poll, having made six appearances, but none since the 2005 season. Virginia, in 2010, became the first team to be ranked No. 1 nationally, earning that ranking three times last year, the first of which occurred in the poll of April 7. Virginia was also ranked in the final poll of the year on May 19 prior to winning the team title at the NCAA Championships. The Cavaliers earned their 4th No. 1 ranking at the beginning of this year in the first poll on March 16.
