2012 ALL-ACC

ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR: BEATRICE CAPRA

Duke's **Beatrice Capra** has been selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Tennis Player of the Year and the ACC Freshman of the Year and leads the 2012 All-ACC Team, as announced by Commissioner John Swofford.

North Carolina's **Brian Kalbas** received Coach of the Year honors for the third straight season. Individual honors, as well as the 18-member All-ACC team, were determined by a vote of the league's 12 head coaches.

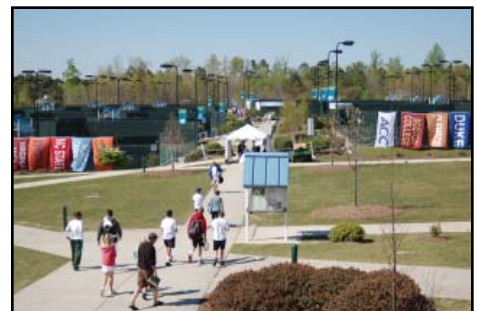
Nationally second-ranked Duke, which placed first in the ACC with a 11-0 conference record and earned the No. 1 seed for the week's ACC Championship in Cary, N.C., led all schools with four student-athletes voted to the All-ACC team, including 2011 ACC Freshman of the Year Rachel Kahan.

Eighth-ranked North Carolina followed with three selections, while No. 9 Miami, No. 15 Virginia and No. 22 Clemson each placed two student-athletes on the squad.

The nation's second-ranked player, Capra is 24-3 overall this season, owns an 18-1 mark in dual matches and a 9-0 record in ACC play. Perhaps most impressive of all is the Ellicott City, Md., native's 15-3 record against ranked opponents. In doubles, Capra and sophomore teammate Rachel Kahan, the nation's 27th-ranked unit, have posted a 16-5 overall record and are 6-2 against ranked doubles teams.

Capra becomes the fourth women's tennis player – and the third from Duke – to be named both the ACC Player of the Year and the ACC Freshman of the Year in the same season since the latter award was established in 1994.

North Carolina's Kalbas led his team to a 20-5 regular-season record and a 10-1 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play, good for a second-place finish behind 11-0 Duke. It marks the seventh coach of the year award for Kalbas, who was honored four times by the CAA as head coach at William & Mary in addition to his ACC honors each of the last three seasons.

Duke claims 2012 ACC Women's Tennis Championship
Top-seeded Blue Devils turn back North Carolina in title match

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – The Duke Blue Devils completed a perfect run through the Atlantic Coast Conference with a 4-2 win over rival North Carolina in the ACC Women's Tennis Championship finale.

In a title match played April 22 at the Wake Forest Tennis Center due to heavy rain at Cary Tennis Park, the Blue Devils extended a pair of conference records by claiming their 17th ACC Women's Tennis Championship and their eighth under current head coach Jamie Ashworth.

Freshman Beatrice Capra, the ACC Player and Freshman of the Year, added to her list of accolades by being named the Championship's Most Valuable Player. Capra scored one of four Duke singles victories on Sunday, as the top-seeded Blue Devils (25-2) regrouped after dropping the doubles point.

Capra scored a 6-0, 6-4 win over Lauren McHale on the No. 1 court. The match followed Duke teammate Rachel Kahan's 6-1, 6-1 victory over Shinann Featherston at No. 3.

With the match knotted at 2-2, Duke finally put the Tar Heels down with three-set wins at No. 4 and No. 6. Hanna Mar turned back UNC's Caroline Price, 6-2, 4-6, 6-1, and Monica Turewicz rallied for a 6-7 (3), 6-3, 6-2 win over Tessa Lyons at No. 6.

Second-seeded UNC (22-6) claimed the early edge by taking the doubles point. The nationally third-ranked doubles team of Featherston and McHale topped Duke's Mary Clayton and Ester Goldfeld 8-3 in the decisive match on the No. 1 court. The win by Featherston and McHale came after UNC's No. 3 team of Price and Gina Suarez-Malaguti defeated Annie Mulholland and Mar by an 8-1 score at No. 3, and Duke's No. 2 team of Capra and Kahan scored an 8-5 win over Hemm and Tessa Lyons.

The Blue Devils quickly regained the momentum when singles play began, with the straight-set wins by Kahan and Capra setting the tone. UNC's Zoe DeBruycker's 6-1, 3-6, 7-6 (5) victory over Goldfeld at No. 2 evened the match before the wins by Mar and Turewicz lifted the Blue Devils.

Both Duke and UNC will now await announcement of NCAA Women's Division I Tennis Championship selections and pairings. The field for the 64-team competition will be announced Tuesday, May 1, at 5:00 p.m., live on NCAA.com. The announcement of those selected for individual and doubles competition will be made after 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 2, and will also be carried by NCAA.com.

2012 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

ACC places seven teams in NCAA Women's Tennis Championship
Duke, North Carolina, Miami and Virginia Earn National Seeds

Atlantic Coast Conference champion Duke received the No. 3 overall seed and led a group of seven league teams in the 2012 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Championships, which got under way May 11.

No. 7 North Carolina, No. 10 Miami and No. 14 Virginia joined Duke as national seeds, and Clemson, Florida State and Georgia Tech were also among the 64-team field announced May 1. All seven teams were among the nation's Top 40 in the most recent ITA rankings.

Duke, UNC, Miami and Virginia hosted the first and second rounds. This marks the 13th straight year - and the 14th in the last 15 - that the ACC has placed at least five representatives in the NCAA women's field. A record-tying nine teams were selected in 2011. Seven conference teams were selected in 2010 and eight earned berths in both 2008 and 2009.

The 64-team NCAA Tournament opened the weekend of May 11-12 with the first two rounds at campus site. The quarterfinals, semifinals and finals will be held at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga., from May 17-22.

First-round matchups included Duke (25-2) playing host to Winthrop (15-10), North Carolina (22-6) playing host to Richmond (14-4), and Miami (18-4) playing host to North Florida (16-4) on Friday, May 11, at 1 p.m. Virginia (18-7) will play host to Fairleigh Dickinson (16-7) at 2 p.m.

Other first-round action on May 11 finds Clemson (15-9) facing Arizona State (11-9) at Athens, Ga. Georgia Tech (14-11) will meet Oklahoma State (11-9) at Tuscaloosa, Ala., while Florida State (12-9) squares off against Washington State (18-6) at Gainesville, Fla.

Duke is appearing in the NCAA field for the 24th time and the 23rd consecutive season. Miami is in the tournament for the 17th straight year and is hosting a regional for the eighth consecutive time. The Hurricanes are playing in their 27th NCAA Tournament overall.

Clemson made its 20th overall postseason appearance and 11th straight. Florida State took part in NCAA play for the 16th time and the sixth straight year. North Carolina is making its 14th straight NCAA appearance and Georgia Tech its 13th. Virginia is also making its 13th overall NCAA appearance, and its fourth in a row.

Twelve From ACC Earn Spots In NCAA Women's Singles
Seven conference doubles teams also qualify for postseason play

Twelve Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes will be among the 64 competitors in the 2012 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Singles Championships, to be held May 23-28 at the University of Georgia's Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga.

ACC Player and Freshman of the Year Beatrice Capra of Duke received the conference's automatic berth and was awarded a No. 2 national seed. Georgia Tech's Jillian McNeill earned one of eight 9-16 seeds.

Also selected to the field were Clemson's Keri Wong, Duke's Hanna Mar, Maryland's Cristina Stancu, Miami's Anna Bartenstein and Gabriela Mejia-Mateus, North Carolina's Zoe De Bruycker and Lauren McHale, NC State's Joelle Kissell and Virginia's Emily Fraser and Lindsey Hardenbergh. In addition, Duke's Mary Clayton was selected as the sixth singles alternate.

Seven ACC tandems are among the 32-team doubles field, led by automatic qualifier and third-seeded McHale and Shinann Featherston of North Carolina. Also chosen were Clemson's Wong and Josipa Bek, Duke's teams of Capra and Rachel Kahan, and Clayton and Ester Goldfeld, along with Georgia Tech's O'Neill and Alex Anghelescu, Miami's Liat Zimmerman and Melissa Bolivar, and Virginia's Hardenbergh and Fraser.

Maryland's Ana Belzunce and Welma Luus were chosen as the third doubles alternates. Virginia's Fraser and Li Xi are the No. 4 alternates, and Duke's Capra and Goldfeld earned the sixth doubles alternate spot.
