ACROSS THE NET - NOTING THE ACC

ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR ... BIANCA EICHKORN

Miami senior **Bianca Eichkorn** was selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Tennis Player of the Year and led the 2011 All-ACC Team.

Rachel Kahan of Duke was selected as the ACC Freshman of the Year, and North Carolina's **Brian Kalbas** received Coach of the Year honors for the second straight season. Individual honors, as well as the 19-member All-ACC team, were determined by a vote of the league's 12 head coaches.

Nationally third-ranked Duke, which placed first in the ACC with a 10-1 conference record and earned the No. 1 seed for the ACC Championship in Cary, N.C., led all schools with four student-athletes voted to the All-ACC team, including four-time selections **Reka Zsilinszka** and **Ellah Nze**.

North Carolina followed with three selections, while Clemson, Florida State and Miami each placed two players on the squad. FSU's **Katie Rybakova** joined Zsilinszka and Nze as a four-time honoree.

Eichkorn went unbeaten in ACC play this season, with all but one of those victories coming in straight sets. The Tengen, Germany, native owned an all-time ACC dual match record of 38-3, including 21 straight victories in a streak that dates to last season. Her 132 career singles wins entering NCAA Tournament play were the most in Miami school history.

Duke's Kahan, like Eichkorn, posted a perfect 11-0 mark in ACC dual match play. The first-year player from Unionville, Conn., entered the NAAs with a 25-1 overall record, including a 22-0 mark in dual match play. Playing mostly at the No. 5 spot, Kahan was a consistent force for a Duke team that climbed into the top five of the ITA national rankings on Feb. 22 and has remained there ever since.

North Carolina's Kalbas, whose team carried a No. 5 national ranking and a 23-5 overall record into the NCAA Championships, kept his team among the nation's elite despite the loss of three seniors from 2010, two of whom were All-Americans and the third who was a four-time All-ACC performer. The Tar Heels, who claimed their sixth ACC Championship after a 9-2 league finish in the final standings, were never ranked lower than No. 6 nationally at any point during the regular season.

It marked the sixth coach of the year award for Kalbas, who was honored four times by the CAA as head coach at William & Mary in addition to his ACC honors each of the last two seasons.

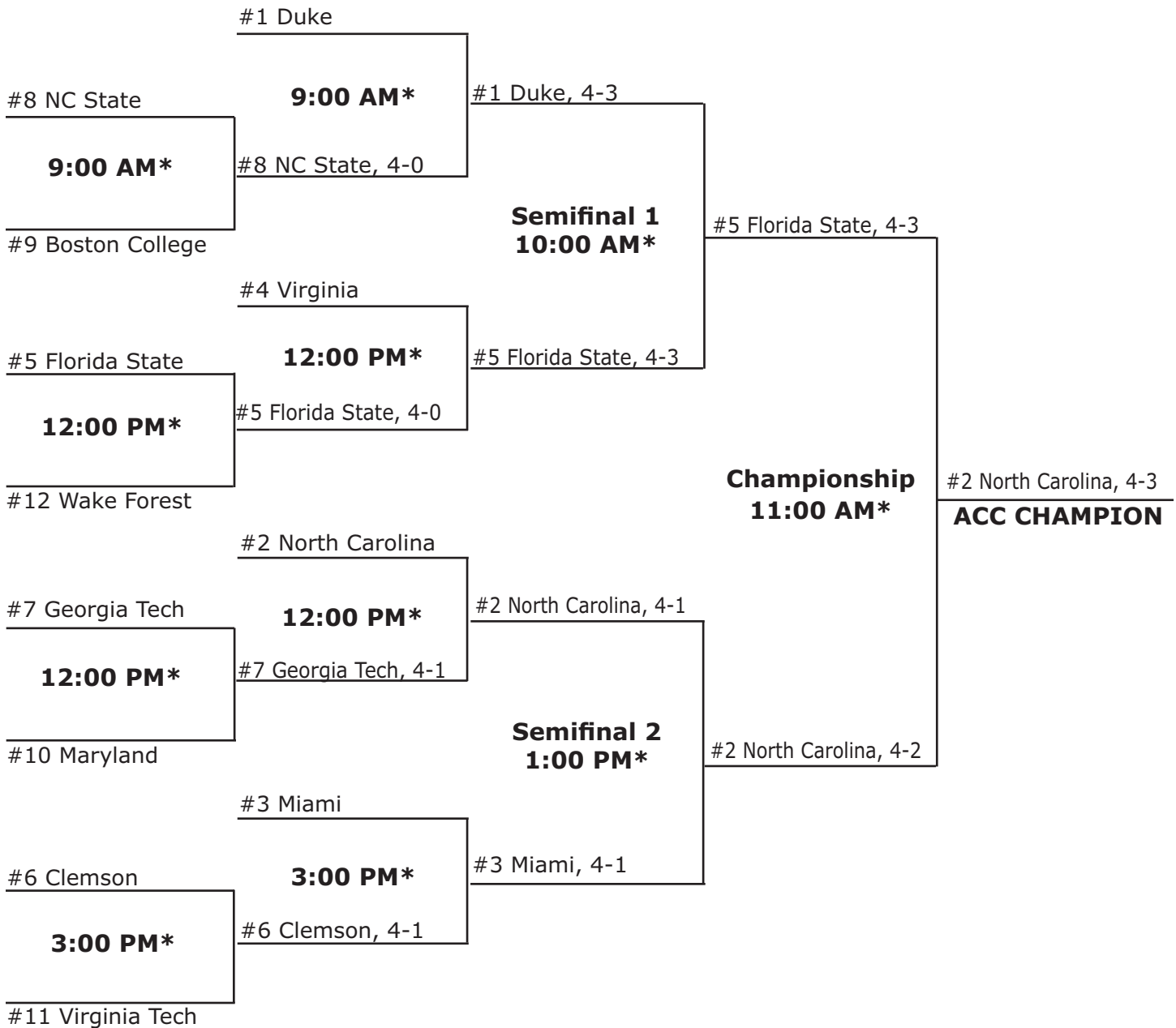

North Carolina claims ACC Women's Tennis Championship
Featherston prevails in tie-breaker to lift UNC past Florida State

CARY, N.C. – North Carolina's hopes of winning the 2011 Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Tennis Championship rested on the shoulders of junior Shinann Featherston. And as far as Featherston and head coach Brian Kalbas were concerned, the Tar Heels were right where they wanted to be.

"It usually happens that I'm the last one out there on the court for whatever odd reason," Featherston said. "It's happened a lot. I love being the last one out there. I know I have it in me to win, and that's all I think about I refuse to lose. If I get hurt, I don't care. If I have to stay out on the court for hours, that's what I will do."

After trailing Florida State's Noemie Scharle 5-3 in the third set, Featherston fought back for a 6-4, 3-6, 7-6 (4) victory on the No. 3 court that lifted the second-seeded Tar Heels to a 4-3 win over the fifth-seeded Seminoles in the April 24 championship match at Cary Tennis Park. The ACC Championship is North Carolina's sixth overall, and its first since 2002.

Featherston, was named the Championship's Most Valuable Player, had also delivered match-clinching efforts in a 4-2 semifinal win over third-seeded Miami, in a 4-3 win over 15th-ranked Georgia during the regular season, and on enough other occasions to give Kalbas full belief the Rockaway Park, N.Y., native could deliver for his team again.

"She's been there before," Kalbas said. "We had a lot of confidence she could come through."

After dropping the doubles point, the Tar Heels stormed back with a trio of singles wins to go up 3-1. Zoe De Bruycker swept Katie Rybakova by a 6-2, 6-1 score at No. 1, while Gina Suarez-Malaguti was victorious set straight sets over Federica Suess, 6-2, 6-0. Jelena Durisic then turned back Francesca Segarelli on the No. 2 court, 2-6, 6-4, 6-2.

UNC's recovery in the first two singles match proved a relief to Kalbas, who had seen his top-seeded 2010 team start slow against seventh-seeded Georgia Tech in last year's championship match and wind up falling to the seventh-seeded Yellow Jackets. Florida State, similar to last year's Yellow Jacket squad, entered the title match on a tear. The 18th-ranked Seminoles were riding an eight-match winning streak and had won four matches against teams ranked in the nation's top 11 in the previous eight days – including a 4-2 decision over the fifth-ranked Tar Heels on April 15.

"Florida State has been the hottest team in the country," Kalbas said. "I did think a little bit about last year, and I just hoped the team wouldn't. After we lost the doubles point, they did a great job of coming back and competing."

So did the Seminoles, who scrapped back to tie the match at 3-all behind wins by Amy Sargeant on the No. 6 court and Ruth Seaborne at No. 4 to set up the dramatic finish.

2011 NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

ACC places nine teams in NCAA Women's Tennis Championship *Number of selections ties league record, leads all conferences*

A league record-tying nine Atlantic Coast Conference teams, including seven of the 16 national seeds, earned spots in the 2011 NCAA Women's Tennis Championship.

No. 3-seeded Duke, No. 4 North Carolina, No. 7 Miami, No. 11 Virginia, No. 12 Florida State, No. 14 Georgia Tech, No. 15 Clemson, NC State and Maryland were among the 64-team field announced May 2.

Duke, UNC, Miami, Virginia and Georgia Tech were host teams for the first and second rounds when the tournament got under way Friday, May 13. The nine ACC teams earning spots in the 2011 NCAA Tournament field led all conferences and matched the league high first set in 2006 and matched in 2007.

This marked the 12th straight year – and the 13th in the last 14 – that the ACC has placed at least five representatives in the NCAA women's field. Seven conference teams were selected last year, and eight earned berths in both 2008 and 2009.

The 64-team NCAA Tournament opened the weekend of May 13-15 with the first two rounds. The third round, quarterfinals, semifinals and finals were held at Stanford University from May 20-24. Six ACC teams -- Clemson, Duke, Georgia Tech, Miami, North Carolina and Virginia -- reached the NCAA's Round of 16.

The individual singles and doubles championships were also held at Stanford following the NCAA Team Championships. That competition began on Wednesday, May 25 and continued until champions were determined on Monday, May 30.

Duke appeared in the NCAA field for the 23rd consecutive season. Miami was in the tournament for the 16th straight year and hosted a regional for the seventh consecutive time. The Hurricanes played in their 27th NCAA Tournament overall.

Clemson made its 19th postseason appearance. Florida State took part in NCAA play for the 15th time and the fifth straight year. North Carolina made its 13th straight NCAA appearance and Georgia Tech its 12th.

Virginia also made its 12th overall NCAA appearance, and its third straight. Maryland appeared in the tournament for the sixth time and the first since 2006. NC State earned its fifth NCAA berth and first since 2008.

2011 NCAA Women's Tennis singles field featured 15 from the ACC *Miami's Bianca Eichkorn earned automatic berths in singles and doubles*

Fifteen Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes were among the 64-player field for the 2011 NCAA Division I Women's Tennis Singles Championships, held May 25-30 at Stanford University's Taube Tennis Center.

ACC Player of the Year Bianca Eichkorn of Miami led the ACC contingent by earning the conference's automatic qualifying berth in singles and joined teammate Anna Bartenstein to snare the league's automatic qualifying spot in doubles.

Eichkorn and Bartenstein were joined in the women's singles field by Clemson's Josipa Bek and Keri Wong, Duke's Nadine Fahoum and Reka Zsilinszka, Florida State's Katie Rybakova and Noemie Scharle, Georgia Tech's Jillian O'Neill, Maryland's Cristina Sanchez-Quintanar, North Carolina's Zoe De Bruycker, NC State's Sanaa Bhambri, Virginia's Emily Fraser and Lindsey Hardenbergh, and Wake Forest's Martina Pavelec.

Eichkorn earned a No. 7 national seed, while Clemson's Bek and North Carolina's De Bruycker were among the No. 9-16 seeded players.

Ten ACC schools placed at least one player in the 2011 NCAA singles field, and the conference landed nine duos in the 32-team doubles competition. In addition to Eichkorn and Bartenstein, the ACC's NCAA doubles entrants included Clemson's Wong/Bek (the eventual NCAA runner-ups), Duke's Fahoum/Ellah Nze, Maryland's Jordaan Sanford/Sanchez-Quintanar, North Carolina's Shinann Featherston/Lauren McHale, NC State's Sandhya Nagaraj/Bhambri, Virginia's Hardenbergh/Erin Vierra and Emily Fraser/Hana Tomljanovic, and the Wake Forest team of Kathryn Talbert/Kayla Duncan,

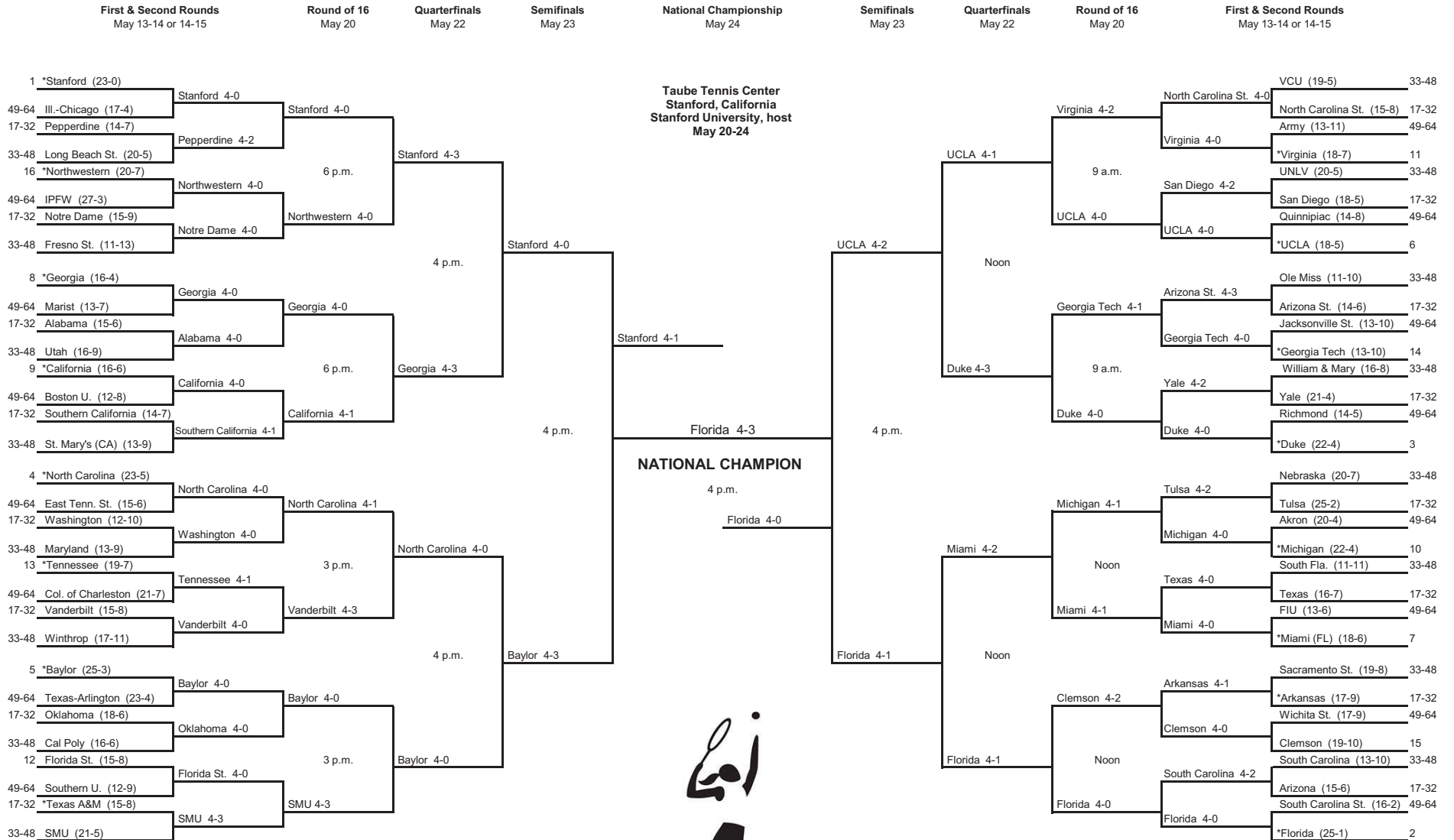

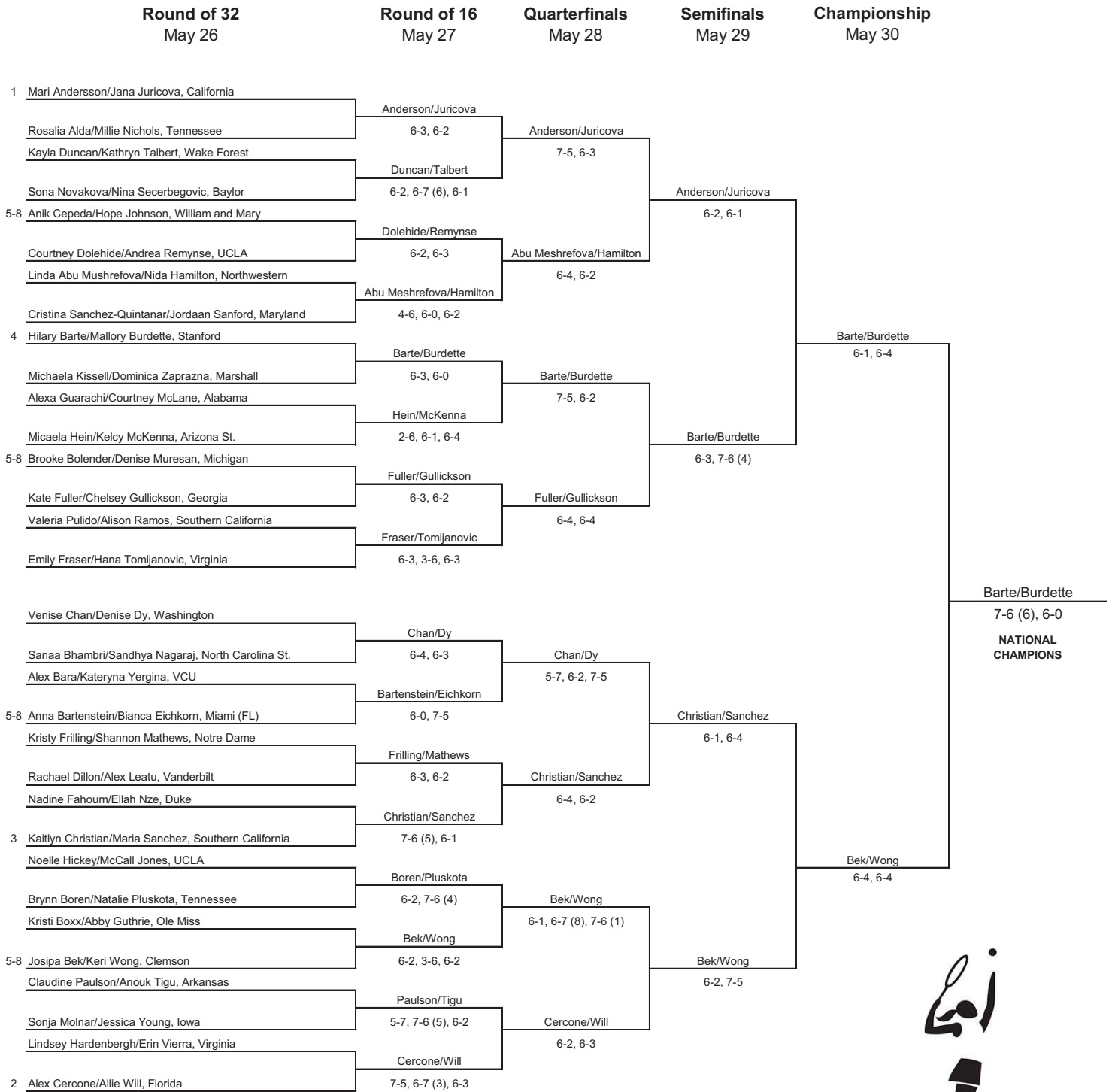
