Andrea Leonard is entering her third season as Boston College's head volleyball coach ... She has posted a 37-24 career record in two seasons ... Leonard led the Eagles to a 20-12 record in 2004, marking the first 20-win season in program history ... With a 6-4 record and a fourth-place finish in Big East play, Leonard directed Boston College to the Big East Championship for the first time since 1993 ... Leonard came to Boston College from the University of New Hampshire, where she was an assistant for five seasons ... As associate head coach at UNH in 2002, Leonard helped New Hampshire to the America East Conference championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament ... Leonard began her coaching career as an assistant at Ferris State University ... A four-year player for Northern Michigan, Leonard helped NMU to Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships in her junior and senior seasons ... Northern Michigan advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight during Leonard's final season ... Leonard graduated from Northern Michigan in 1993.

Junior libero Allison Anderson was named the Big East Conference's Libero of the Year as a sophomore in 2004 ... Was second team All-Big East ... Led Boston College with 706 digs on the season, averaging 5.47 per game to rank second in the league ... Set NCAA, Big East and Boston College records (rally scoring era) with 57 digs against Villanova on Oct. 10 ... Also had 46 digs against Georgetown earlier in the week ... Named the Big East and ECAC Player of the Week after those performances ... Set a Big East record for single-season digs in league play with 327 (7.79 per game) ... Was second on the team in service aces with 40 ... Started the season at outside hitter, tallying a season-high 21 kills against Eastern Illinois on Sept. 3 ... Finished the season with 130 kills ... Was named to the Big East Challenge all-tournament team ... Earned the Athletic Director's Award for Academic Excellence ... Led Boston College with 348 kills as a freshman in 2003 ... Enters the 2005 season just 50 digs shy of 1,000 for her career.



Senior setter Verena Rost set a Boston College single-season record with 1,286 assists as a junior in 2004 ... Earned All-Big East Conference honorable mention ... Ranked seventh in the league with 10.99 assists per game ... Was first in the Big East in overall service aces with 43 and second in service aces per game with 0.37 per game ... Has led Boston College in service aces in each of the last two seasons ... Was third on the team in digs with 321 in 2004 ... Had a career-high 72 assists in the Eagles' five-game match against West Virginia on Oct. 31 ... Named to the Big East Challenge all-tournament team after tossing up 54 assists against Rutgers in the first round and 59 assists against Connecticut in the championship match ... Had 36 assists in a 3-0 win over Notre Dame on Nov. 7, helping the Eagles hand the Fighting Irish their first-ever regular season home loss in Big East play ... Registered a career-high 116 kills on the season ... Two-time recipient of the Athletic Director's Award for Academic Excellence.

Jolene Jordan Hoover is the Tigers' all-time winningest volleyball coach with a 253-143 career record over 12 years at Clemson ... She has won at least 22 matches six times during her tenure ... Hoover's teams have a 106-80 record in ACC play, including a school record and ACC-best 15-1 slate in 1999 ... With Clemson's victory over NC State on Sept. 24 of last season, Hoover joined Joe Sagula of North Carolina and Janice Kruger of Maryland as active ACC coaches to reach the 100-win plateau ... Hoover has led the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament five times, hosting in 1994 and 1999 ... Hoover's 1999 squad posted a 31-3 overall record and finished the season ranked 22nd nationally ... That season included a 27-game winning streak over the first nine matches of the season and a record 16-match winning streak ... Hoover graduated from Illinois State University in 1986, where she was named all-league in the Gateway Conference (1983 & 1985), and the league's Most Valuable Player in 1985 ... Hoover led the Redbirds to four Gateway Conference Championships and four NCAA Tournament appearances.

Junior libero Anna Vallinch set a Clemson school record with 620 digs in 2004, her first season on the squad ... Played in all 123 games for the Tigers in 2004, starting each match at libero ... Vallinch was second in the ACC in overall digs and third in digs per game at 5.04 per game ... Ranked 44th in the nation in digs per game ... Set a new school record in single-season digs per game ... Also set a Clemson sophomore record for overall digs ... Recorded at least 20 digs on 14 occasions ... Voted Clemson's Defensive MVP ... Had 20 digs against Georgia Tech in the ACC Tournament as the Tigers upended the top-seeded Yellow Jackets in the quarterfinals ... Started her collegiate career at Nebraska-Kearney, where she averaged 3.31 digs per game (361 overall) as a freshman in 2003 ... Helped Nebraska-Kearney to a 31-7 overall record and the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in 2003.



Sophomore outside hitter Brittany Ross set a Clemson freshman record with 472 kills in 2004, earning a spot on the ACC All-Freshmen Team ... Ross also set a new freshman record for the Tigers with 1,375 total kill attempts ... Is a 2005 Preseason All-ACC selection ... Was one of just three Clemson players to play in all 123 games last season, and was the only freshman to do so ... Was third on the team in kills and kills per game (3.84) ... Recorded 54 total blocks and tied for second on the team with 15 solo blocks ... Also scooped up 127 digs on the season ... Led Clemson freshmen in kills, kills per game and solo blocks ... Was the Tigers' Rookie of the Year ... Had a career-best 25 kills and hit .489 in Clemson's upset of Georgia Tech at the ACC Tournament ... Recorded at least 20 kills on five separate occasions, including twice at the ACC Tournament.

Jolene Nagel is entering her seventh season at the helm of the Blue Devil program ... She has led Duke to 20-win seasons in four of the last five years ... In 2002, Nagel led Duke to its third straight NCAA Tournament appearance and a 24-10 record ... The Blue Devils' 24 wins were the most for Duke since the 1994 squad posted a 24-6 record ... In 2001 Nagel earned ACC Coach-of-the-Year honors after guiding Duke to a 23-5 record and the second round of the NCAA Tournament ... In her second season, Nagel guided Duke to a 21-13 overall record, an appearance in the ACC Tournament finals and the program's first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1994 ... She was named the 2000 AVCA East Region Coach of the Year ... Prior to arriving at Duke, Nagel served as head volleyball coach at Georgetown University and Cornell University ... Nagel, a graduate of Edinboro, was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 1997 ... A three-time All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference team selection, Nagel helped lead the Scots to three appearances in the national championship (1 NCAA; 2 AIAW) and a 116-43 record.

In 17 seasons at the helm of Maryland volleyball, **Janice Kruger** has collected four ACC titles, six trips to the NCAA Tournament, four ACC and AVCA Region Coach-of-the-Year honors and the top spot among all-time winningest coaches in ACC volleyball history ... Kruger became the ACC's all-time winningest coach with a win over Clemson on 11/22/03 ... Heading into the 2005 season, Kruger needs just three wins for 700 in her career and her 322 victories at Maryland rank first in conference history ... Kruger has amassed a career record of 697-318-6, including a 322-213 record in College Park ... She ranks seventh among active coaches in victories as a four-year college head coach with 674 ... In 1996, Kruger's Terps became the first ACC team to finish a conference schedule 16-0 ... In 1997, Kruger led Maryland to an overall record of 25-0 and in the process, Maryland became just the eighth team in the nation to roll through a regular season without a defeat ... Prior to her arrival at Maryland, Kruger posted a record of 352-96-6 as the head coach at Nebraska-Omaha from 1979-87 ... She was a four-year letterwinner at the University of Nebraska, where she earned her degree in 1977.

Senior middle blocker Rachel Wagener is a two-time All-ACC performer, having earned a spot on the second team in both 2003 and 2004 ... Earned AVCA All-America honorable mention in 2004 ... Was named to the AVCA All-East Region Team last season ... Was picked for the 2005 Preseason All-ACC Team ... Led Maryland and was fifth in the ACC with a .327 hitting percentage in 2004 ... Was fourth in the ACC with 1.36 blocks per game ... Is already the Terrapins' career blocks leader with 452 in just three seasons ... Ranks first in on Maryland's career list with 396 block assists and is fifth with 56 solo blocks ... Is the only player in school history to record 200 total blocks in a season (2003) ...
