CLEMSON WINS SECOND ACC TITLE

Tigers, Blue Devils represent league in NAAs

For the second time in school history, the Clemson Tigers claimed the ACC volleyball championship in 2007. With a 21-1 record in league play, the Tigers finished two games ahead of Duke, which finished second, and tied the conference's all-time record for league wins in a season.

Clemson, which finished the regular season ranked No.20 in the nation, and Duke, which was ranked No. 22, each were awarded berths into the NCAA Volleyball Tournament, giving the league multiple teams in the tournament for the 21st time since 1982.

Both teams recorded a win in the NCAA first round, marking the 15th year in which at least one league team advanced to the second-round, and the seventh year in a row. The Tigers finished the season with a 29-4 final record, while the Blue Devils completed their season with a 25-7 overall mark.

NCAA Tournament Notes

-With wins in the first round, Clemson and Duke gave the ACC 130 all-time victories in NCAA Tournament play. Teams from the ACC have posted a 17-15 record in the NCAA postseason tournament over the last six years.

-2007 marked Duke's 13th-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and its third in a row. For Clemson, this was the school's sixth-ever appearance in the tournament, and first since 1999.

-Clemson received the ACC's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament after claiming the league title with a 21-1 record in conference play. The Blue Devils, who were 19-3 in the ACC, received an at-large bid.

-With Duke and Clemson in this year's tournament, the ACC has had 59 all-time appearances in the NCAAs. Fifteen of those have come in the last five years of competition.

-After defeating American in this year's opening round, Duke is now 7-6 in first round games of the NCAA Tournament. Clemson, which defeated Alabama 3-1 on Nov. 30, is now 3-3 all-time in first-round games.

-Duke leads the ACC with 13 appearances in the NCAA Tournament. With 11, Florida State is second, followed by North Carolina, which has 10 all-time.

-With the win over American in this year's first round, the Blue Devils advanced to the NCAA's second round for the third straight year.

-Clemson's Jolene Jordan Hoover and Duke's Jolene Nagel, who each led their teams to a berth in this year's NCAA Tournament, are currently tied for third in the ACC record books with six appearances each. Janice Kruger of Maryland leads all active ACC coaches with seven appearances in the NCAAs.

On the season's opening weekend, senior setter Ali Hausfeld led the Blue Devils to three wins in three matches, including an upset win over No. 13 Purdue, on their way to the title in the Duke Invitational. In the tournament final, Hausfeld had 61 assists and 14 digs to go along with three kills and three total blocks. For the weekend, she averaged 14.36 assists per game and 3.27 digs per game. For her play, she was named National Player of the Week by CVU.com.

In the second week of October, Virginia senior Sarah Kirkwood had perhaps the best two-match performance of her career in contests against ACC foes Boston College and Maryland. Kirkwood hit for only five errors in the two showings, garnering National Player of the Week recognition from CVU.com on October 10.

Carrie DeMange, a senior middle blocker for the Duke Blue Devils, was recognized as National Player of the Week by both the AVCA and the ECAC during the week of October 22-26. In two matches the prior weekend, the Springboro, Ohio, native averaged 5.62 kills per game with a hitting percentage of .381 to go along with 4.75 digs per game and 1.50 blocks per game as the Blue Devils notched two valuable conference wins.
