SERIES NOTES

Series Records: *Colorado College* has dominated the series against Air Force, holding a 51-6-2 advantage in the series that began in 1969. CC has won 20 straight and has a 25-game unbeaten streak against AFA. The last Falcon win was a 6-5 overtime win in 1985 at the Broadmoor World Arena. AFA is 0-5 at the new World Arena. Last year, CC beat Air Force 7-0 at the Academy. In the last meeting at the World Arena, CC won 8-1 in 2001. Air Force and *Denver* have played 25 times and the Pioneers have a 23-2 lead in the series that began in 1972. DU has won 15 straight in the series. The last Falcon win was a 5-3 victory in Denver in 1980. Last year in Denver, DU beat the Falcons, 7-0. In the last meeting at the Cadet Ice Arena, DU was ranked No. 1 in the nation and beat the Falcons 2-1. For last season's box scores, please see page six of this release. Scouting the Opponents: *Colorado College* is ranked fifth in the nation by USCHO. The Tigers are 6-1-3 overall and 3-1-2 in the WCHA Head coach Scott Owens in his fifth season at CC. Last weekend, CC and Wisconsin skated to a pair of 2-2 overtime ties in Madison. Marty Sertich leads the team with 12 points. Joey Crabb leads the team with nine goals. Curtis McElhinney has started six games in the net and has a 2.47 GAA and a .901 saves percentage. *Denver* is ranked 10th in the nation by USCHO. The Pioneers are 7-4-1 overall and 2-3-1 in the WCHA. George Gwozdecky is in his 10th season at DU. Last weekend, Denver lost a pair of games to top-ranked North Dakota by scores of 8-2 and 6-2. Sophomore forward Gabe Gauthier leads the team with 14 points. Jeff Drummond leads the Pioneers with six goals. Goalie Adam Berkhoel has a 2.84 goals against average and a .911 saves percentage.

HEAD COACH FRANK SERRATORE



Frank Serratore (Bemidji State, 1982) is in his seventh season as the Falcons' hockey coach. Serratore has a 97-119-13 record at Air Force. He is in his 11th season as a college head coach with a 146-210-22 career record. In service academy competition, Serratore is 10-3-1 vs. Army overall and 9-3-1 vs. the Black Knights while at Air Force. Since Navy does not have a varsity team, the only competition is against Army. Serratore came to the Academy from the Manitoba Moose of the International Hockey League, where he was the director of hockey operations in 1996. Serratore was the head coach at Denver from 1990-1994 posting a 49-91-9 record. Serratore spent seven seasons in the United States Hockey League with three different teams and collected a combined record of 247-103-6. He was named general manager of the year twice and coach of the year once in the USHL. Serratore is the only coach to lead Air Force to five-straight 15-win seasons at any point during their careers.

WEEKLY NEWS/NOTES

Radio/Television/Internet: Both games this weekend will be available on the internet at www.AirForceSports.com and on the telephone through TeamLine. The Denver game will be broadcast in Colorado Springs on KBZC AM 1300. Jay Ritchie, in his seventh season of Air Force hockey, will do the play-by-play. Dave Toller will handle the color commentary. The 2003-04 broadcast schedule is on page four of this release.

Follow the Falcons Anywhere: Both games can be heard anywhere in the United States via the telephone. Falcon hockey radio broadcasts can be heard on TeamLine by dialing 1-800-846-4700. The team access code is 0671. This service is free of charge to listeners thanks to the Air Force Academy athletic department. Hockey games can also be listened to on the internet at www.AirForceSports.com. Go to the hockey page and click on Listen to the Falcons on the right side of the screen.

The Denver Connection: Air Force head coach Frank Serratore spent four seasons as the head coach at the University of Denver from 1991-94. He took over a team in the midst of a rebuild and won just six games in his first season. However, in his third year, the Pioneers were 19-16-2 and the attendance rose 20 percent. In his four years, he was 49-91-1 with the Pioneers.

Close Call Two Years Ago: In the last meeting between the Pioneers and Falcons at the Cadet Ice Arena, the Falcons nearly upset the top-ranked Pioneers. Denver was ranked No. 1 in the nation in 2001 and narrowly defeated Air Force 2-1. All three goals were scored in a span of four minutes in the first period. DU's Lukas Dora scored first but AFA's Andy Berg tied the game with a power play goal at 18:11. Thirty seconds later, Pioneer Matt Weber netted the game-winner. DU had 32 shots while AFA had just 17. Mike Polidor made 34 saves while Adam Berkhoel made 16.

Bader's Point Streak Ends: Matt Bader's six-game point-scoring streak ended in the first game against Niagara, Nov. 21. The sophomore winger from Beaverton, Ore., tallied an assist in the second game against Niagara and now has a point in six of his last seven games.

Close games: Eight of Air Force's first 12 games this season have been decided by two goals or less and Air Force is 4-4 in those contests. The Falcons are 2-3 in games decided by one goal and 2-1 in games decided by two goals. Two of AFA's three one-goal losses this season have come in overtime (4-3 loss to Quinnipiac and a 3-2 loss to Niagara). Last season, Air Force played in 18 games that were decided by two goals or less and was 4-14 in those games. The Falcons were 2-6 in one-goal games and 2-8 in two-goal games.

Come from Behind: Another improvement Air Force has already shown from last season is the ability to come from behind. The Falcons are 3-2 this season when the opponent scores first. Last season, Air Force gave up the first goal in 27 of the 37 games and that was a recipe for disaster. Air Force was 4-20-3 when the opponent scored first.

Chasing a Century: Head coach Frank Serratore needs just three wins to reach 100 career victories at Air Force. His current record is 97-115-3. Serratore will become the third head coach in AFA history to post 100 career wins. John Matchefts had a 154-150-6 record from 1975-85. Chuck Delich had a 154-197-19 record from 1986-97.

Rare Home Appearance: Air Force's game against Denver Saturday, Nov. 29, is just the fifth home game this season. The Falcons are 2-2 at home this year. The Falcons don't have another home game until Jan. 8 when the Falcons host CHA rival Wayne State.

First Points: Eight Falcon freshmen have scored their first career points in the first seven weeks of the season and six already have a goal. Three Falcon freshmen had the first points of their careers opening weekend at the Quinnipiac Cup. Forward Andrew Ramsey had two goals in the tournament, one in each game. Defenseman Brian Gineo had an assist in the win over Bentley. Defenseman Billy Devoney had an assist against Quinnipiac. In the Nye Frontier Classic in Anchorage, Oct. 17-18, freshman Theo Zacour scored his first goal against UAA. Gineo collected his first career goal in game two against AIC. Rookie Jay Medenwaldt scored his first career point with a goal in game one against AIC. Brandon Merkosky's first career point was an

assist in game two against AIC. Brian Reese tallied his first career point with an assist against UAH, Nov. 1. Ryan Van Bockel's first career points came against Bentley, Nov. 8, with one goal and one assist. Billy Devoney's first career goal came against Niagara, Nov. 22.

Shoot the Puck: The season is only 12 games old, but the Falcons are doing a much better job than last season of putting the puck on net. Air Force has fired 50 or more shots in two games this season. The Falcons had 51 shots on goal in the win over Bentley. AFA then had 57 shots in the win over American International, Oct. 25. The 57 shots are the most since equalling that number against AIC, Oct. 14, 2000. AFA is averaging 35.8 shots per game. In 2002-03, AFA averaged 30.7 shots per game.

On Deck: Following the Colorado College/Denver weekend, Air Force returns to CHA play with a two-game series at Findlay, Dec. 5-6.

RECENTLY

Air Force was swept last weekend by CHA rival Niagara at the Cadet Ice Arena. NU won the first game (Nov. 21) in overtime, 3-2, and then came from behind for a 5-2 win in the series finale, Nov. 22.

Friday vs. Niagara: Chris Welch's goal with 2:17 remaining in overtime lifted Niagara to a 3-2 win, Nov. 21. The Purple Eagles scored twice in the first period and held the 2-0 lead until early in the third period. Jeremy Hall got the visitors on the board first as he scored on a flurry in front of the net at 11:03. NU took a 2-0 lead at 16:33 when Aaron Clarke took a slap shot from the face-off dot for his first goal of the season. Air Force outshot Niagara, 14-9, in the first period. Each team had seven shots on goal in the second period but neither team scored. The Falcons got on the board early in the third period as Seth Pelletier scored his first of the season. With 4:21 remaining, the Falcons tied the score as freshman Andrew Ramsey re-directed a shot by Buck Kozlowski to tie the score. In overtime, Barrett Ehgoetz took the puck down the left boards and gave it to Welch in the face-off circle. Welch spun around and fired a slap shot that beat Mike Polidor short side for the game winner. Air Force outshot Niagara, 34-20, in the game. Each team had two penalties and each was 0-for-2 on the power play. Polidor made 17 saves for Air Force while VanNynatten had 32 for the Purple Eagles.

Saturday vs. Niagara: Niagara overcame an early two-goal deficit to defeat Air Force, 5-2, Nov. 22. Air Force took a 2-0 lead with goals late in the first period and early in the second period. With 37 seconds left in the first period, freshman Billy Devoney scored his first career goal on the power play from Spanky Leonard and Steve Mead. Leonard made a centering pass and Devoney tipped it past Jeff VanNynatten for a 1-0 lead. Just over three minutes into the second period, the Falcons took a 2-0 lead when another freshman lit the lamp. Theo Zacour redirected a pass from Matt Bader for his third of the season. Freshman Andrew Ramsey also assisted on the play. Niagara scored the final five goals of the game. Brian Hartman scored on a rush up ice at 5:19 of the second period to make the score 2-1. The CHA's leading goal scorer, Barret Ehgoetz, scored the next two goals to give the Purple Eagles a lead they would not relinquish. Ehgoetz' second goal, that came 21 seconds into the third period, was the game winner. Two minutes later, Jeremy Hall's slap shot gave NU 4-2 lead. NU's final goal of the game was an empty-netter from Chris Welch with 39 seconds left. Air Force again out-shot Niagara in every period and 39-28 in the game.

AFA was 1-for-5 on the power play while NU was 0-for-5. VanNynatten earned both wins in the series. He made 37 saves while allowing just two goals. Freshman Peter Foster started and played the first 43 minutes. He stopped 19 of the 23 shots he faced and was replaced by Mike Polidor with 17:32 left in the third period. Polidor stopped all four shots he faced.

SEASON STANDING NOTES

Toy Trick: For the fourth consecutive year, the Air Force hockey team's annual toy drive, the "Toy Trick", was a huge success. At the Niagara series, Nov. 21-22, fans were asked to bring a new stuffed toy, wrapped in plastic, and when the Falcons score their first goal in each game, throw the toy on the ice. Over 420 toys were thrown in the first game of the series and the team collected more than 600 toys in the series. The toys will be distributed to children in local hospitals and clinics during the holiday season. In the four-year history of the Toy Trick, the team has collected and distributed more than 2,000 toys.

Players of the Week, Nov. 10: Senior Spanky Leonard and freshman Peter Foster were honored by the CHA for their performance against Bentley, Nov. 7-8. Leonard was named the offensive player of the week as he recorded five points in leading Air Force to a pair of wins. The senior forward from Elk River, Minn., assisted on two goals in Friday's win and then scored his first career hat trick Saturday. Foster was named the rookie of the week as he earned a victory in his first collegiate start. He made 29 saves in the game while allowing three goals.

Player of the Week, Oct. 27: Freshman Brian Gineo was named the CHA rookie of the week for his performance against American International, Oct. 24-25. The defenseman from South Windsor, Conn., helped lead the Falcons to a weekend sweep of AIC by scoring three points. He collected an assist in Friday's victory as Air Force won 5-1. He then scored his first career goal just one minute into Saturday's game as the Falcons rolled to a 5-1 win.

Players of the Week, Oct. 20: For the second consecutive week, two Falcons earned CHA Player of the Week honors. Shane Saum and Mike Polidor were honored for their performances in the Nye Frontier Classic in Anchorage, Alaska. Saum, a winger from Palmer, Alaska, was named to the all-tournament team as he scored one goal and two assists in Friday's 5-4 loss to tournament champion Alaska-Anchorage. Polidor, a goaltender from Imperial, Penn., was also named to the all-tournament team. Polidor's first career shutout came against 21st-ranked Miami-Ohio.

Players of the Week, Oct. 13: Senior Shane Saum and freshman Andrew Ramsey were named CHA players of the week for their performances in the Quinnipiac Cup, Oct. 10-11. Saum, a senior from Palmer, Alaska, earned the offensive award while Ramsey, a freshman from Noblesville, Ind., earned the rookie award. Saum was named to the all-tournament team as he scored three goals in two games in leading Air Force to a second-place finish. Ramsey scored one goal in each tournament game. The honor is the first of each player's career.

Big Win: Air Force's win over 21st-ranked Miami-Ohio, Oct. 18, is certainly one of the biggest under seventh-year head coach Frank Serratore. AFA gained redemption over a Miami team that beat AFA 12-1 in the season opener last season. The win was the first over a team from one of the big four conferences since defeating Yale, 2-0, in 1999.

First Shutout: Air Force's 2-0 win over Miami, Oct. 18, was the first career shutout for senior goalie Mike Polidor and the first shutout by AFA since a 3-0 win over Connecticut in January, 2001.

Bader's Goal Streak Ends: Sophomore Matt Bader scored a goal in five straight games, the longest streak of his career. The streak ended Nov. 8 against Bentley. His streak ties as the longest by a Falcon since Justin Kieffer scored a goal in 10 straight games in 1996-97. The school record was set by Chuck Delich with a goal in 14 straight games in 1973-74.

Short-Handed Record: Air Force set a new school record with three short-handed goals in the game against Alabama-Huntsville, Nov. 1. The previous record was two done several times. The Falcons now have four short-handed goals this season. The record for shorties in a season is 13 in 1991-92.

Knaeble Sets Shortie Record: Mike Knaeble's two short-handed goals against Ala.-Huntsville, Nov. 1, is a new school record. Knaeble has three shorties this season which is just two shy of Eric Rice's school-record (five) in 1991-92.

Beating the Best: Air Force's win over No. 21 Miami is the first win over a ranked team since the Falcons swept 18th-ranked Niagara, 4-1 and 3-2, at the Cadet Ice Arena, Jan. 22-23, 1999. Since then, AFA was 0-8 against ranked teams.

Captain Saumer: Senior Shane Saum was selected by his teammates as the team captain. Saum, from Palmer, Alaska, was an assistant captain last season.

Wearing the "A": Senior Spanky Leonard was selected as the team's assistant captain by his teammates. Leonard, from Elk River, Minn., played in 100 games in his first three years.

Division I Schedule: Air Force is playing its first all-Division I schedule in the 35-year history of Falcon hockey this season. In the first 31 years, the Falcons were a Division I independent and played several Division II and Division III teams. The Falcons joined College Hockey America for the 1999-00 season. In the last two years, AFA has played just two Division III games per year (the Radisson North Hockey Classic hosted by Air Force).

Looking Back: Air Force closed out the 2002-03 season with a 10-24-3 overall record. The Falcons placed sixth in College Hockey America with a 2-15-3 mark. Air Force was the sixth seed in the CHA Tournament in Kearney, Neb., and lost to third-seeded Wayne State in the first round. Seniors Andy Berg and Brian Reaney were named to the CHA all-conference second-team team as selected by the league's coaches.
