# HEAD COACH DAVE PILIPOVICH



Dave Pilipovich enters his sixth season as head coach at the Academy. He became the eighth head coach in the history of the program on February 8, 2012. He was in his fifth season as a member of the coaching staff and first as associate head coach when he was promoted

to head coach. Pilipovich completed the rest of the 2011-12 season. This season marks his 11th overall at the Academy. Pilipovich has led the Falcons to a 72-94 record.

After taking over the program, Pilipovich won two of his first three games as head coach, including a come-from-behind 58-53 win at Wyoming in his first road game. He then led his team to one of the biggest victories in program history with a 58-56 triumph over 13th-ranked San Diego State at Clune Arena, marking Air Force's first-ever win over a Top 20 team.

In 2012-13, his first full season as head coach, Pilipovich led the Falcons to an 18-14 overall record, tying the fourth-most wins in one season in program history. He also became the first Air Force head coach to beat two ranked teams in the same season and owns three of AFA's four wins against ranked opponents, including an 89-88 regular-season finale victory over No. 12 New Mexico, the highest ranked opponent ever defeated by Air Force. He also coached Air Force to its first-ever postseason road win with a 69-65 victory at Hawai'i in the first round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

In 2013-14, the Falcons posted a 12-18 record and defeated UNLV in Las Vegas for just the second time in program history. Air Force's 6-12 Mountain West record marked just the ninth time with at least six league wins since joining a conference in 1981 and AFA's three league wins on the road were the most in one season since 2008.

Pilipovich led the Falcons to a 14-17 record in 2014-15, despite losing senior captain Kamryn Williams to injury at the start of the conference season and leading scorer Max Yon leaving the team for part of the season for personal reasons. The Falcons still managed to finish ninth in the conference with a 6-12 mark. Air Force's 14 wins overall tie as the 12th most in school history while the six conference wins ties for seventh all-time. The season marked Air Force's third straight with six or more con-

ference wins which is the longest streak in school history. The Falcons won a conference tournament game, beating New Mexico in the opening round, for just the third time. Air Force also posted one of its biggest conference home wins ever, beating Wyoming by 23 points to record the biggest conference home win since 2007.

Air Force was 14-18 last season. The 14 wins ties as the 12th most in school history. The Falcons won the Air Force Classic with a perfect 4-0 mark.

The Falcons were 12-21 in 2016-17. Air Force beat Wyoming in the opening round of the Mountain West tournament to record the program fourth win in the event overall and second by Pilipovich. Air Force opened the game with a Mountain West record 25-0 run. The Falcons opened the season with a program-best 5-0 record.

Pilipovich's tenure at the Academy is already one of the most successful. He is one of two coaches in school history to post multiple conference home winning records in a season, accomplishing it in 2013 and last season. He has led the program to more six-win conference seasons, three from 2013-15, than any other coach. Only two others have accomplished two seasons with six or more wins.

In his nearly five seasons as an assistant coach, Pilipovich helped the Falcons earn their first trip to the postseason since 2007 with an appearance in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament following the 2010 campaign and snap a 16-game losing streak in conference tournament play in 2009. In his first season at Air Force (2007-08), the Falcons finished fifth in the Mountain West Conference after being picked eighth in the preseason media and coaches poll, the greatest margin between predicted and actual finish in the league that season. He also helped Tim Anderson earn the conference's Defensive Player of the Year award that campaign.

Prior to joining the Falcons, Pilipovich spent two years with the University of Michigan basketball program. In his first season with the Wolverines, he served as the administrative assistant to head coach Tommy Amaker and helped the Wolverines to the two NIT appearances, including an NIT final, then was an assistant coach during the 2006-07 campaign.

Pilipovich has 29 years of coaching experience under his belt. He served as an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan University for five years (2000-05) prior to joining the Michigan staff. Before his stint at EMU, he served four years as an assistant coach at Robert Morris University (1996-2000), two years an assistant coach at

Pilipovich began his coaching career serving as a graduate assistant at California University (Pa.) for two years (1986-88), before being named as an assistant coach for one season.

A 1986 graduate of Thiel College in Greenville, Pa., with a degree in business administration, Pilipovich earned four varsity basketball letters and served as team captain during his senior season. He earned his master's degree from California (Pa.) in 1988 in geography and regional planning. He is an active member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and has served on the NABC Assistant Coaches Committee.

Pilipovich and his wife, Kelly, have a son, Kyle, and a daughter, Kelsey.

## SEASON RECAP

Air Force ended last season 12-21 overall and finished 10th in the Mountain West with a 4-14 mark. The Falcons defeated Wyoming, 83-68, in the opening round of the Mountain West tournament in Las Vegas which is just the fourth win by the Falcons in the championships. The Falcons opened the game with a Mountain West tournament record 25-0 run.

The Falcons averaged 73.1 points per game which is the sixth-best single-season mark in school history and best since 1999. Air Force shot 43.6 percent from the field, including a 36.3 mark from 3-point territory which is the 11th best mark in program history. The team averaged 15.0 assists per game which was second in the league and the team's 1.2 assist-to-turnover ratio was second-best in the MW.

Senior Hayden Graham became the first player in 34 years to lead the team in scoring and rebounding in consecutive seasons with averages of 12.6 points and 5.8 rebounds. He became the 24th player in school history to surpass the 1,000-point mark, doing it in his 100th career game. Graham also became just the eighth player in Air Force history to score 1,000 points and grab 500 rebounds.

## FALCONS AT HOME

Air Force finished 11-7 at home last season, including a 4-5 mark in conference games. The Falcons are 15-8 in their last 23 home games dating back to 2015-16. Air Force is 8-6 in its last 14 conference home games dating back to last season.

## FALCONS 3-POINT SHOOTING

Air Force shot 36.3 percent from 3-point territory last season which is the 11th best mark in school history. The mark is the best at Air Force since 2013 when the team shot 38.2 percent. The best single season marks in Air Force history follow.

• Air Force defeated McPherson, 88-71, to open last season and improved to 29-32 all-time in season openers.  
 • Air Force won its 10th straight season opener at home dating back to a 73-68 loss to Valparaiso Nov. 23 to open 1991-92.  
 • Air Force head coach Dave Pilipovich improved to 3-2 in season openers.  
 • Air Force defeated Johnson & Wales, 105-62, Nov. 15 to record its first 100-plus outing since last season's Mountain West Tournament loss to UNLV, 108-102, March 9, 2016. The 105 points are the most since scoring 111 vs. Denver Feb. 16, 1999.  
 • Air Force scored 53 points in the first half vs. Johnson & Wales, its highest scoring half of the season. Air Force's 53 points is the most in a half since scoring 59 vs. Colorado State on Jan. 10, 2015. The Falcons added its second-highest scoring half of the season in the second half with 52 points.  
 • Air Force opened the season 5-0 which is the second-best start ever at the Academy and best since opening 6-0 in 1982-83.  
 • Air Force finished 2-2 in the Savannah Invitational. The Falcons lost to eventual champion, Akron, 84-75, in the semifinals and to East Carolina, 70-63, in the consolation game.  
 • Air Force dropped its Mountain West opener at Wyoming, 84-72. The Falcons are 11-26 all-time in conference openers, including a 3-18 mark on the road. The Falcons are 9-9 all-time in Mountain West openers, including a 3-5 mark on the road.  
 • Air Force defeated Utah State, 78-73, in its Mountain West home opener. The Falcons posted a win in their first conference home game for the fifth consecutive season dating back to 2012-13.  
 • Air Force's 13 points in the first half at San Diego State is the fewest since scoring 10 at BYU Feb. 3, 2003, in a 65-33 loss.

- Air Force held San Diego State to 17 field goals, the lowest output by an opponent this season. The Aztecs were held to an opponent low 28.8 percent from the field.
- Air Force held SDSU to just 14.8 percent from three (4-27). The four 3-pointers is also a season low.
- The 89 combined points between Air Force and SDSU tie as the seventh fewest in a conference game in school history and is the lowest since Air Force (43) and UNLV (46) combined for 89 March 4, 2009.

## MW TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Air Force beat Wyoming, 83-68, in the opening round of the MW tournament to win its first Mountain West conference tournament game since beating New Mexico, 68-61, March 11, 2015, in the opening round.
- Air Force improved to 4-17 all-time in the Mountain West tournament. Air Force improved to 2-3 all-time vs. Wyoming in the tournament. Air Force is 2-4 all-time vs. Wyoming in conference tournament action. The Falcons improved to 1-2 all-time as the #10 seed.
- Air Force's 48 points in the first half vs. Wyoming are the second-most in a game this season and most since scoring 53 vs. Johnson & Wales. The 48 points are the most against a Mountain West team this season. The previous best vs. a MW opponent was 41 at San Jose State.
- Air Force held Wyoming to 27 points in the first half which second-fewest vs. a Mountain West team this season and fewest since San Diego State scored 22 March 1.
- Air Force's 28-point lead during the first half vs. Wyoming was the biggest vs. a Mountain West team this season. The previous was 27 vs. UNLV at home Feb. 22.
- Air Force made a season-high 29 free throws, hitting 85.3 percent on 29-34 shooting.

## FIELD GOAL SHOOTING

The Falcons hit 50 percent or better in seven games, winning five, last season. The team opened the season by hitting 56.0 from the field in an 88-71 win over McPherson College. The Falcons hit 28-50 field goals, including a 61.5 clip (16-26) in the first half. The team shot 53.5 percent against Johnson & Wales and 50.0 vs. Florida A&M. Air Force hit 56.3 percent against Missouri State. The Falcons hit a season-road-best 52.5 percent from the field at San Jose State Feb. 18. The Falcons out-shot 16 opponents and were 11-5 in those games.

## NON-CONFERENCE RECAP

Air Force closed the non-conference schedule with a 7-6 overall record. The Falcons were 7-2 at home, 0-2 on the road and 0-2 in neutral site games. This season marks the fifth straight winning non-conference record under head coach Dave Pilipovich. Air Force was 2-2 in the Savannah Invitational, including a 2-0 mark at home and 0-2 mark in neutral site games. Air Force opened the season with a 5-0 mark at home which is the second best home start in school history. Air Force was 5-3 in November and 2-3 in December. The team posted a 6.8 scoring margin and 3.6 rebounding margin.

## VAN ALL-AROUND

Junior Jacob Van finished third on the team in scoring (10.6) and led the team in assists (9.3). Van ranked second in the conference in free throw percentage (83.6) and 10th in assists (2.8). Van scored a season-best 23 points vs. Jacksonville which was the second-most by a Falcon this season. He led the Falcons in scoring in a game five times which was the third most on the team. Van scored a team-best 16 points and hit three of four free throws in the final 17 seconds to secure the win over Utah State. He scored 14 points and hit 4-4 free throws in the final two minutes in the win over Fresno State. He scored 17 points and had four assists at UNLV. He forced the second overtime with a three at the end of the first overtime. Van scored a team-best 18 points in Air Force's win over Wyoming in the conference tournament, including a perfect 10-10 from the free throw line.

## TOOHEY DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Junior Frank Toohey scored 15 points and 11 rebounds at Nevada Jan. 18 to record his second-career double-double. Toohey had two double-doubles this season. He recorded the first of his career Nov. 22 vs. Stetson with 22 points and a career-high 13 rebounds.

Freshman Lavelle Scottie closed last season playing his best basketball. He scored in double figures in six of the last seven games.
