**Recent Results:** Air Force closed out its first trip around the MWC with an 83-71 victory over Wyoming Saturday at Clune Arena. Colorado State had its three-game winning streak snapped at New Mexico Saturday, losing 63-51 in Albuquerque.

**Coaches:** *Air Force* is coached by Joe Scott (Princeton, 1987), who is in his fourth season with the Falcons. He has a 45-59 record in his tenure at Air Force. Scott came to AFA from his alma mater, Princeton, where he was an assistant coach from 1993-2000.

**Colorado State** is coached by Dale Layer (Eckerd College, 1980), who is in his fourth season with the Rams. He has a 57-54 record at the school and a 224-141 career record in his 13th season. Layer previously coached at Queens College in North Carolina.

**Series:** Colorado State leads the overall series, 60-20. Air Force defeated the Rams, 65-57, earlier this season in Fort Collins, snapping the Falcons' 27-game road MWC losing streak. The teams split a pair of games last season with ewach team winning at home.

## Still In First Place

Air Force improved to 16-3 overall and 6-1 in the Mountain West Conference with an 83-71 victory over Wyoming Saturday at Clune Arena.

The Falcons, who have posted the most wins in one season since a 16-9 campaign in 1975-76, are 6-1 in the MWC and still in first place by one game over Utah (5-2) and three games over five teams (UNLV, Colorado State, San Diego State, BYU and New Mexico are all 3-4).

## Last Time Out

*Air Force 83, Wyoming 71  
Feb. 7, 2004, USAFA, Colo.*

Tim Keller scored a season-high 20 points to lead five players in double figures, and Air Force shot 66 percent to beat Wyoming 83-71 Saturday night.

Air Force (16-3, 6-1 Mountain West) worked its motion offense to near perfection, creating plenty of open shots with perimeter passing, backdoor cuts and kickouts from the post.

The Falcons were 9-of-16 on 3-pointers to beat Wyoming for the first time since Feb. 5, 2000, a span of eight games. Joel Gerlach and Antoine Hood added 14 points each for Air Force, which had lost 26 of 27 in the series.

Jay Straight had 23 points and David Adams and Joe Ries added 14 each for Wyoming (9-11 2-5), which has lost eight straight road games and seven of nine overall.

The Cowboys, who shot a respectable 44 percent and had 19 offensive rebounds, but had just four assists, couldn't keep up with the frenetic Falcons. In fact, Wyoming did not record an assist in the first half.

Air Force led by nine at halftime and pushed it to 46-34 after A.J. Kuhle scored on an inbounds play and hit a 3-pointer.

Wyoming followed with a 12-2 run, capped by Straight's 4-point play from well beyond the arch that made it 48-46 with 12:48 left.

But that was as close as the Cowboys would get. Nick Welch scored on a cut to the basket and a short hook, then Hood and Dan Nwaelele hit two free throws each to put Air Force up 62-53. Gerlach followed with a 3-pointer from the wing, his fourth in four attempts, to push the lead to nine with 5½ minutes left.

## Best Start in School History

Air Force's 16-3 record is the best in school history after 19 games. The previous best was 15-4 in 1957-58 and 1961-62.

The Falcons set a new school record for most non-conference victories (10) in one season on Jan. 21 with their victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. Last year's team set the record by going 9-4. Air Force has one non-conference game left this season, at Texas-Pan American on Monday, Feb. 16.

## First Winning Season in 26 Years

With their 57-43 victory over San Diego State on Jan. 31, the Falcons secured their first winning season since the 1977-78 campaign. Air Force finished that season with a 15-10 record.

Air Force finished the 1988-89 season with a .500 record at 14-14. That was the last time Air Force had a winning regular season.

## Oh So Close

Air Force came close to being ranked in the Top 25 on Feb. 2. The Falcons were ranked No. 26 in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Air Force garnered 116 votes in the AP poll and 37 in the coaches poll.

Air Force has never been ranked in the Top 25 in either poll in the 48-year history of the program. The polls that were released on Feb. 2 are on page 5 of this release.

## Three-Point Streak

Air Force has now made a 3-point shot in 344 consecutive games. The last time the Falcons failed to make a three-pointer was Dec. 4, 1991 in a 57-51 victory over Adams State College.

## First Half Domination

Air Force has outscored its opponents 580-384 in the first half this season. The Falcons, who have led or been tied at halftime in 17 of their 19 games, have held opponents to less than 25 points in the first half in all but two game this season. Opponents are scoring just 20.2 points in the first half and 49.0 points per game.

The second half has not been quite as dominant for Air Force. However, the Falcons are still outscoring their opponents 614-547.

## Up Next

Air Force concludes its three-game MWC home-stand against New Mexico on Saturday, Feb. 14 beginning at 12 p.m. Air Force plays its final non-conference game of the season on Monday, Feb. 16 at Texas-Pan American.

## No. 1 in Scoring Defense

The Falcons are well on their way to a second consecutive national title for scoring defense as Air Force is allowing just 49.0 points per game, currently No. 1 in the country. Air Force has not allowed an opponent more than 50 points in 13 of 19 contests this season. AFA is 12-1 in those 13 games.

In addition, the Falcons are ranked in the top 20 in the nation in five other categories in the latest NCAA statistics (as of Feb. 3).

## Just Score 50

The loss to UNLV was the first this season when the Falcons scored 50 points or more. Air Force is 15-1 this season when they hit the 50-point plateau.

## Joe Scott, Air Force head coach

Joe Scott is a winner. From early on in his life, winning is the one constant that has defined him more than any other. It's that quality that Air Force put their hopes on when the school made him only its fourth head coach on April 7, 2000.

Taking over a program that had not posted a winning season since the 1977-78 campaign, Scott arrived in Colorado Springs with a new system and a new attitude for the Falcon basketball program.

In his first season, he led the Falcons to an 8-21 record, posting the most Division I wins by a Falcon team since the 1989-90 campaign. The Falcons played their first-ever all-Division I schedule in Scott's first season.

In 2001-02, as Air Force again played an all-Division I schedule, the team captured nine victories, just shy of the school record for the most Division I victories in one season.

Last season, the milestones kept piling up. The Falcons led the nation in scoring defense, allowing their opponents just 57 points per game. They also won more games (12) than in any season since 1989-90, and their 9-4 non-conference record was one of the best in school history. Junior Tim Keller became the first Air Force player in Scott's tenure to achieve all-conference honors with a third-team selection.

Scott came to the Academy after eight tremendous years at his alma mater, Princeton. He coached for four years under Hall-of-Fame coach Pete Carril and four as the top assistant under Bill Carmody.

The 38-year-old helped Princeton to a 163-61 overall record, a 90-22 Ivy League record, three league titles and five consecutive post-season appearances. Princeton averaged 23 wins per year during the four years Scott was the No. 1 assistant. Prior to that, the school had just 23 wins in a season three times in 95 years.

The Tigers were 37-19 against schools that offered athletic scholarships in the last five years, including wins over Florida State, Texas and UNC Charlotte on consecutive nights to win the 1998 Rainbow Classic. The team also defeated Georgetown and North Carolina State in the 1999 NIT, and UNLV in the 1998 NCAA tournament.

Scott was a four-year letterman and three-year starter at Princeton under Carril. He helped the Tigers to the 1984 Ivy League championship and a first-round NCAA Tournament win over San Diego. He captained the 1987 squad to a 16-9 overall record while earning all-Ivy League honors for the second consecutive year.

Scott averaged 11.9 points per game as a senior and ranked fourth in the conference in three-point field goal percentage (.407). He finished his career with 809 points in 99 games. He ranks fourth all-time at Princeton in steals and 10th in three-point field goal percentage. Scott is also tied for third with seven 3-pointers made in one game against rival Pennsylvania in 1987.

The Pelican Island, N.J., native earned his bachelor's degree in history from Princeton in 1987, then attended Notre Dame Law School where he earned his Juris Doctor degree in 1990. His basketball playing days were by no means over. While at Notre Dame, Scott played in the famous Notre Dame Bookstore Basketball Tournament, leading his team to two titles and earning most valuable players honors twice.



## Kuhle and Consistent

Senior A.J. Kuhle has been one of the most consistent players for the Falcons this season.

Kuhle, who scored a season-high 17 points on Jan. 26 against Utah, leads the team in assists with 58, is second in rebounds (59) and is fourth in steals (19). He currently leads the conference in assist/turnover ratio at 2.07 (58 assists, 28 turnovers) and has dished out at least three assists in 10 of his last 14 games.

The Concord, Calif., product, who holds the MWC record by playing 59 minutes in a four-overtime game against Wyoming two years ago, is averaging 31.6 minutes per game this year and 33.6 minutes per game in conference play.

Kuhle, who played his 100th game for Air Force at UNLV, has made 74 consecutive starts for AFA.

## Keller Outstanding at the Line

Tim Keller is No. 3 on Air Force's career free-throw percentage list. He has made 83.7 percent (174-208) in 75 career games as a Falcon. Keller made 83.5 percent (81-97) of his free throws last season, the seventh-best mark for one season in school history, and has made 22 consecutive free throws, four shy of his school record of 26 earlier this season.

## Gerlach Hits 1,000 Points

Senior Joel Gerlach became the 16th player in school history to score 1,000 career points with 14 against Wyoming. With 1,006 career points, he needs 12 points to pass Rich Nickelson (1971-74) and move into the No. 15 spot.

Junior Tim Keller became the 40th player in school history to score 700 career points with 15 against CSU. Senior A.J. Kuhle passed the 600-point mark this season. Keller is 34th all-time with 784 points, while Kuhle is 42nd with 696 points.

## Moving Up The Computer Rankings

The Falcons have been moving their way up the computer rankings all season. Air Force posted its best mark ever in the Sagarin ratings at No. 23 on Feb. 1 after its victory at San Diego State. Air Force's previous best spot in the Sagarin ratings was No. 25 prior to playing the Aztecs.

The Falcons achieved their best-ever RPI rating of No. 63 on Feb. 8 after defeating Wyoming, surpassing the mark of 65, after to the Utah game.

After the victory over Wyoming on Feb. 7, Air Force was No. 27 in the Sagarin.

## 7-2 vs. 2003 Tourney Teams

Air Force is 7-2 against teams that played in the postseason last year, including a 5-1 mark against opponents that played in the 2003 NCAA Tournament. The lone loss against an '03 NCAA tourney team was to Auburn on Dec. 7.

## Falcons Rarely Trail At Home

In their nine home games this season (360 minutes), the Falcons have trailed for a total of five minutes, seven seconds. Arkansas-Pine Bluff led 2-0 for 1:04 in the season opener, Wisconsin-Milwaukee held a 2-0 advantage for 24 seconds and Utah held a 40-38 lead for 1:02. Utah's lead snapped a streak of 218 consecutive minutes that Air Force led at home. Wyoming led the Falcons for 2:37, seven seconds more than the first eight home games combined.

During their 13-game winning streak, consisting of 520 minutes of action, Air Force was behind for only 46:10, which includes 21:41 in the two games at the Golden Bear Classic vs. Prairie View A&M and California and 9:26 at San Diego State.

## There's Usually a Dish Involved

When Air Force makes a basket, more times than not an assist is credited. Of the Falcons' 403 made field goals this season, 281 have been the result of an assist. That is an impressive 69.7 percent of the time.

Conversely, Air Force's opponents have been credited with an assist on only 44.0 percent of their made field goals (334 FGM, 147 assists).

Air Force allowed just four assists to Wyoming, including zero in the first half.

Air Force has 170 assists in its last nine games, compared to just 77 by its opponents.

## Home Sweet Home ...

The Falcons won their 12th consecutive non-conference home game on Jan. 21 against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, dating back to a 64-44 loss to Tennessee Tech on Dec. 29, 2001.

The school record for the longest streak at home against non-conference foes is 13, set between the 1996-97 and '98-99 seasons.

With Air Force's 74-52 victory over BYU, the Falcons won their first seven home games by 20 points or more for the first time in program history.

The Falcons' 83-71 victory over Wyoming on Feb. 7 was their ninth straight win overall at home, tying the school record set during the 1961-62 season.

## ...Road Sweet Road

Air Force tied the school record with its sixth road win of the season at San Diego State. That feat had not been done since the 1975-76 campaign. It was first done during the 1957-58 season.

Air Force, 3-1 on the road in conference play, is the only team in the Mountain West Conference that has not lost at least two games on the road so far this year. The other seven MWC teams have a combined 2-22 mark in conference road games.

For just the second time in school history, Air Force has won three conference games on the road. The 1988-89 team won three conference road games in a row.

## Shooting Lights Out in MWC

Thanks to their 66.7 percent (24-of-36) performance from the field against Wyoming, Air Force is shooting an outstanding 54.4 percent (154-of-283) from the field in its seven MWC games this season, the only conference team above 50 percent in just MWC games.

The Falcons also lead the MWC in three-point percentage at 46.3 percent (62-134). Air Force shot 56.3 percent from behind the three-point line (9-of-16) against Wyoming.

## Welch MWC Player of the Week

Sophomore center Nick Welch, who led Air Force to its first 2-0 start in conference play since 1986-87, was named the Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week, Jan. 19. The Falcons defeated both Colorado State (75-67) and New Mexico (68-42) on the road that week. This is Welch's first career MWC Player of the Week honor.

Welch, a Fort Worth, Texas native, averaged 15 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists in two games last week. He shot 56 percent (10-for-18) from the field, including 67 percent (4-for-6) from three-point range, as the Falcons extended their current school record winning streak to nine games.

## On Pace for Best Shooting Pct.

Air Force is currently shooting 50.1 percent (403-805) from the field. If the Falcons keep shooting at that rate, they will challenge the single-season record, which is 49.0 percent, set in 1969-70. Here are the top five shooting percentages in school history:

## Three's Company

Air Force is 12th in the nation in three-pointers made per game. AFA is sinking 8.89 long range shots each contest, No. 1 in the MWC.

AFA's 60.0 percent (12-20) from 3-point range at New Mexico is a season-high and the best since shooting 66.7 percent (16-24) against Ga. Southern on Jan. 1, 2003. AFA is making 39.3 percent (169-430) of its shots from beyond the line.

Individually, Air Force has four of the top 10 3-point percentage shooters in the MWC. Nick Welch leads the conference at 52.6 percent (20-of-38), Joel Gerlach is seventh at 42.3 percent (22-of-52) and Antoine Hood and A.J. Kuhle are tied for eighth at 41.9 percent (26-of-62).

## Quite a Backcourt

Junior Tim Keller and sophomore Antoine Hood comprise one of the best guard tandems in the Mountain West Conference.

They are two of three players on the team averaging double figures in scoring. Keller leads the squad, averaging 11.3 points per game, while Hood is second at 10.5 ppg. Keller scored a season-high 20 points against Wyoming on Saturday.

Hood leads the team and is second in the conference in field-goal percentage, making 59.5 percent of his shots. He is the only guard in the top 10. Keller, meanwhile, leads in the MWC in free-throw shooting at 85.1 percent and is sixth in 3-pointers made per game at 1.79.

## Freshmen Making an Impact

Freshmen Matt McCraw and Jacob Burtschi have each played in all 19 games this season for the Falcons. McCraw, who tied his career-highs with 11 points and three rebounds against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Jan. 21, is shooting 58.3 percent (14-24) from the floor in his last 12 games.

Burtschi, meanwhile, played a career-high 23 minutes at New Mexico and has collected at least three rebounds in 11 of the team's 19 games this season. He had a career-high three steals vs. Utah.

## Falcons Win Golden Bear Classic

Air Force won the second regular season tournament title in school history and the first in 31 years by defeating California, 49-44, on Dec. 29 in the final of the Office Depot Golden Bear Classic in Berkeley, Calif.

Air Force, which defeated Prairie View A&M, 59-46, in the first round, last won a tournament at the Evansville Invitational in December of 1972. AFA defeated Seton Hall, 64-58, in the opening round and Boston, 65-53, in the final.

## Keller Makes All-Tourney Team

Tim Keller was selected to the all-tournament team at the Office Depot Golden Bear Classic.

The Austin, Texas, product scored 25 points in the two games, including a team-high 16 in AFA's 59-46 victory over Prairie View A&M in the first round. He then added nine points and tied his career-high with four assists in the title game vs. Cal.

## Air Force Wins at The Pit ... Finally

With its 68-42 victory over New Mexico on Jan. 17, Air Force ended 42 years of futility in Albuquerque. The Falcons, who had not won in the town since Feb. 7, 1962, also won for the first time in 23 tries at The Pit, which opened in 1966.

The Falcons handed New Mexico its fourth-worst defeat in the history of the building and held the Lobos to their third-lowest point total ever at The Pit.

## Last Time vs. Colorado State

Tim Keller scored 15 points and A.J. Kuhle had 14, leading Air Force to a 65-57 win over Colorado State on Monday night.

Air Force (10-2, 1-0 Mountain West), which snapped a 27-game conference road losing streak, also got 12 points from Nick Welch, 11 from Joel Gerlach and 10 from Antoine Hood.

Matt Williams had 17 points and eight rebounds for short-handed Colorado State (8-6, 0-1), which was without two starters - center Matt Nelson (knee) and guard Micheal Morris (hamstring).

Air Force, which led 30-20 at halftime, padded its lead to 38-26 on Gerlach's 3-pointer with 16:02 remaining.

Ronnie Clark had 10 of his 12 points in the first seven minutes of the half to help Colorado State trim the deficit to 43-39.

But Air Force responded with an 8-0 run, and the Rams got no closer than six points after that. Hood started the surge with a three-point play following a steal on the other end. Gerlach then hit a 3-pointer and added two free throws for a 51-39 lead with 4:40 remaining.

Colorado State was forced to foul in the final two minutes, and the Falcons hit 11-of-14 free throws.

Air Force, off to its best start in school history, was outshot 51 percent to 46 percent but made 24-of-33 free throws compared to CSU's 11-of-15.

It was Air Force's first conference win on the road since Jan. 20, 2000 and the Falcons posted their eighth consecutive victory, tying the school record set back in the 1958-59 season.

Kuhle scored 11 points in the first half to help spark Air Force to its 10-point halftime lead.

Hood's 3-pointer and Kuhle's basket in the lane gave the Falcons an early 10-6 lead.

Colorado State's Derrick Stevens hit a 3-pointer to cut the deficit to 16-14, but Air Force outscored Colorado State 14-6 the rest of the half.

The Falcons used a five-point possession to open up a 23-16 lead. Keller was intentionally fouled by Freddy Robinson and made both free throws. The Falcons retained possession, and Gerlach hit a 3-pointer from the corner with 5:15 remaining.
