## Conference Play Begins

Air Force opens its 10th Mountain West Conference campaign on Saturday, Jan. 3 against San Diego State. The Falcons are coming off a 67-64 loss to Stony Brook at home last Wednesday. Air Force went 1-2 against SDSU last season.

## Conference Openers

The Falcons are 6-22 all-time in conference openers. They were 2-17 in conference openers in their 19 years in the Western Athletic Conference, with the two victories coming against San Diego State (86-75) in 1986-87 and Colorado State (69-58) in 1992-93.

Air Force is 4-5 in conference openers since the Mountain West Conference began play in 1999. The Falcons had won four straight conference openers before falling at Utah, 58-36, last season.

## ***Johnson Stays Hot***

Senior Anwar Johnson scored a career-high 25 points in the Falcons loss to Stony Brook on Wednesday. He was 6-of-8 from the field and 13-of-17 from the free-throw line. His FTM and FTA were the most by a Falcon in one game since Lamoni Yazzie went 15-of-17 against Liberty on Dec. 22, 2001. Johnson has scored in double figures in 12 of AFA's 13 games this season, including each of the last nine, and has 20 or more points in three of those games.

## ***Up Next***

The Falcons are idle for a week until playing New Mexico on Saturday, Jan. 10 in Albuquerque. Tip-off is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. and the game will be nationally televised on The Mtn.

## ***Golden Bear Classic Recap***

Air Force split a pair of games and captured third place at the Golden Bear Classic, hosted by the University of California, last weekend. The Falcons dropped a 43-42 decision to Portland in the first round, then rebounded to defeat Dartmouth in the third-place game, 63-41. Senior Anwar Johnson was named to the all-tournament team after averaging 12 points and four rebounds in the two games.

## ***Falcons No. 3 in Country in Shooting the 3-Ball***

Air Force is currently ranked No. 3 in the nation in three-point percentage at 43.3 percent. California leads the country at 50.6 percent and Arizona is No. 2 at 43.5 percent

## ***Nearly Unbeatable at Clune***

Despite their loss to Stony Brook on Wednesday, the Falcons have been close to unbeatable at Clune Arena the last five-plus seasons. Since the beginning of the 2003-04 season, Air Force has won 75 of its 83 home games, including 40 of its 43 non-conference games.

In addition, the Falcons have won 35 of their 40 Mountain West Conference games at Clune Arena during that stretch.

## ***Three-Point Streak***

Air Force has made a three-point shot in 493 consecutive games. The last time the Falcons failed to make a three-pointer was Dec. 4, 1991 in a 57-51 victory over Adams State College. The streak is the third-longest in the MWC behind UNLV (720) and New Mexico (595).

## ***Last Time Out***

Bryan Dougher had 22 points and Muhammad El-Amin added 20 as visiting Stony Brook University surprised Air Force 67-64 at Clune Arena Wednesday afternoon. Matt Holland's possible game-tying 3-point attempt at the buzzer hit the back of the rim as the Falcons fell to 9-4 and the Seawolves improved to 7-5.

The Falcons could not overcome the Seawolves' offensive rebounding and second-half 3-point shooting in a game that was a seesaw battle from start to finish. Air Force used a 9-0 run early in the second half to take a 34-29 lead and led 44-42 with 8:22 remaining, but it would be the Falcons' last lead of the game.

Stony Brook pushed its lead to eight points, 60-52, with 1:05 remaining, but the Falcons used a 10-3 run to cut the lead to 63-62 with 19 seconds left. Dougher hit two clutch free throws with eight seconds remaining to give Stony Brook its 67-64 lead.

Stony Brook had 23 second-chance points, thanks to a 35-23 rebounding advantage, en route to the win. After beginning the game 2-of-15 from 3-point range in the first half, Stony Brook connected on 5-of-9 from beyond the arc in the second half to help spur the upset. Free throw shooting was the other downfall for Air Force, as the Falcons connected on just 20-of-32 from the line.

Anwar Johnson's career-high and 25 points were the most by an Air Force player this season, but weren't enough for the Falcons.

Johnson, Air Force's leading scorer, had 17 free-throw attempts, the most for a Falcon since Lamoni Yazzie made 15-of-17 from the line on Dec. 22, 2001, against Liberty. Sophomore guard Evan Washington added 13 for Air Force, while junior forward/center Grant Parker had 12 in the loss.

**Stewart Makes Immediate Impact**

Freshman Taylor Stewart became the first Air Force freshman to record a double-double since 2000 when he scored 13 points and grabbed 10 rebounds against CSU Bakersfield on Nov. 16. Tom Bellairs was the last freshman to have a double-double in his first season at Air Force and he had eight of them during the 1999-2000 campaign.

Stewart is also the first Falcon freshman to score in double figures in his first three collegiate games since David Schuck during the 1997-98 campaign.

**Henke No. 3 All-Time in Three-Point Pct.**

## Reynolds Captures 100th Career Win

Jeff Reynolds won his 100th career game as a head coach earlier this season. The Falcons' victory over CSU Bakersfield on Nov. 16 was his 18th at Air Force. He won 21 games in his only season as head coach at North Carolina Wesleyan, then won 61 in three years at Wingate College.

## Seniors Dominate Against Northern Illinois

The Falcons' three seniors, Andrew Henke, Anwar Johnson and Matt Holland, combined for 54 of Air Force's 67 points on Dec. 3 against Northern Illinois. They also combined for 10 rebounds and nine assists.

For the season, the trio is averaging 38.7 points and 12 rebounds per contest. Johnson has scored in double figures in 12 of 13 games this season, while Henke has in 10 of 13. Holland has scored 10 or more points in seven of 13 games.

## Parker Playing Solid

Junior Grant Parker is making the most of his playing time this season. After playing in just 14 games his first two seasons at Air Force, he has appeared in all 13 this season and is averaging 6.9 points and 3.9 rebounds per contest. He is third on the team in rebounding.

Parker scored a career-high 15 points against Wofford on Nov. 23 and grabbed a career-best nine rebounds against CSU Bakersfield and Northern Illinois.

## Last Time vs. SDSU

Lorenzo Wade sank four free throws and grabbed a critical rebound in the final seven seconds, allowing San Diego State to edge Air Force 53-49 in the Mountain West Conference tournament quarterfinals.

The Aztecs (20-11) advanced to face No. 24 BYU in the semifinals despite making just two baskets in the final 16:07, both of them by Richie Williams.

It appeared as though Wade might be lamenting a loss instead of celebrating a win after he charged into Andrew Henke with 20.1 seconds left and the Aztecs clinging to a 49-48 lead.

Instead of playing for the last shot, however, the Falcons (16-14) broke San Diego State's press and Anwar Johnson, who didn't score any points, darted to the basket only to miss the layup.

San Diego State got the ball and Wade was fouled and sank both free throws for a 51-48 lead with seven seconds left.

Tim Anderson, who led Air Force with 17 points, was fouled before he could get off a game-tying 3-pointer. He sank his first free throw and missed his second.

Wade skied above the outstretched arms of three Falcons to pull down the rebound and draw another foul. He sank both shots and finished with 12 points, including a career-best 10 of them from the stripe.

Ryan Amoroso led the Aztecs with 15 points, including a career-high nine free throws.

The Aztecs jumped out to a 16-point lead in the first half and took a 32-21 lead into the locker room before going cold.

Williams' basket with 16:07 left made it 39-30 but the Aztecs wouldn't make another field goal until Williams, who scored 12 points, hit a floater with 2:20 remaining. That gave San Diego State a 47-46 lead after the Falcons had taken their first and only lead of the game on Anderson's three-point play with 2:45 left.

Anderson set a new Mountain West Conference Tournament record with seven steals, while Henke added 16 points for the Falcons.

## ***Head Coach Jeff Reynolds***

Jeff Reynolds, the seventh head coach in Air Force basketball history, is in his second year at the helm after leading the Falcons to a 16-14 record in 2007-08.

Reynolds, who served as an assistant coach for two seasons before his promotion to head coach on April 17, 2007, guided the Falcons to a fifth-place finish in the Mountain West Conference after his team was picked eighth in the preseason media and coaches poll. It was the greatest margin between prediction and actual finish in the conference last season.

Reynolds, who enters the '08-09 campaign with a 98-48 career record in five seasons, coached one of the best players in program history, Tim Anderson. He was named the Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year and second-team all-conference after leading the team in scoring and the MWC in steals.

Last season, Reynolds became the first head coach in school history to win his first three games and the fourth to post a winning season in his first campaign.

During his two seasons as an assistant, Reynolds helped guide Air Force to two of its most successful campaigns on the basketball court. In 2005-06, the Falcons were 24-7, the best record in program history, and played in the NCAA Tournament for just the fourth time ever. In '06-07, Air Force posted a 26-9 record, setting a new school record for most victories in one season, and advanced to the semifinals of the NIT. Air Force was just one of 17 Division I teams to win at least 50 games in those two seasons.

In addition, the Falcons posted a 31-1 record at Clune Arena and Reynolds helped four Falcons, Jacob Burtschi, Nick Welch, Dan Nwaelele and Matt McCraw, join the 1,000-point club during the 2006-07 campaign.

Reynolds came to the Academy after serving as an assistant coach at Tulane for five seasons. During his time at Tulane, Reynolds coached Linton Johnson, who has played in the NBA for six seasons, most recently with the Phoenix Suns. Johnson was a member of the San Antonio Spurs when they won the NBA championship in 2005.

Prior to his stint at Tulane, Reynolds served as the head coach at Division II Wingate University in Wingate, N.C., where he logged an impressive 61-27 record in three seasons.

In those three seasons, Reynolds built the program into a Division II powerhouse. In 1999-2000, his team led the nation in scoring defense and posted an impressive 26-4 record, closing the year with a final national ranking of No. 7 and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs also won their second-consecutive South Atlantic Conference title and established the longest home-court winning streak at the Division II level (26 games).

While at Wingate, Reynolds coached current NBA player Lorinza "Junior" Harrington for two seasons. Harrington was named to the all-SAC Freshman Team in 1998 and earned Division II All-America honors as a senior. He has played three seasons in the NBA, including the 2006-07 campaign with the Memphis Grizzlies.

In 1998-99, Reynolds guided Wingate to its first NCAA Tournament bid, as well as its first national ranking, and the Bulldogs closed that season with a 23-6 mark as Reynolds earned South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year honors.

As the top assistant coach at his alma mater, UNC-Greensboro, from 1995-97, Reynolds helped the program to the 1996 Big South Championship and a bid to the 1996 NCAA Tournament. The Spartans fell to Elite Eight team Cincinnati, 66-61, in the first round.

Prior to that, he served for four years as the top assistant at UNC-Wilmington, helping the Seahawks to Colonial Athletic Association Most Improved Team honors in 1992.

Reynolds began his coaching career at James Madison University in 1981, serving as a part-time assistant for a team which won 24 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1982. He went on to Division II power Randolph-Macon College, which reeled off three straight NCAA Tournament appearances and earned a No. 4 national ranking in the final poll of 1984.



He logged one year as the head coach of North Carolina Wesleyan College in 1985-86, leading the program to a 21-7 mark and the Dixie Conference Championship, before moving on to Winthrop College as an assistant coach for four years. At Winthrop, he was directly involved in the team's transition from Division II to Division I, and, in 1988, the school captured the Big South Conference Championship.

Reynolds, 52, is married to the former Janet Montgomery and the couple resides in Colorado Springs.

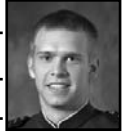

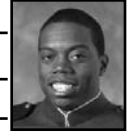
