### Falcons Play at Wright State on Wednesday

The Air Force Falcons (5-1) play their second road game of the season against the Wright State Raiders (3-5) on Wednesday, Dec. 8 in Dayton, Ohio. Tip-off is scheduled for 7 p.m. (ET) and the game will be broadcast in the Colorado Springs area on AM 1300 KCSF. The Falcons won their fourth straight game on Sunday afternoon, edging Evansville, 57-56, in the final game of the 2010 Mountain West / Missouri Valley Challenge. Sophomore Michael Lyons scored a season-high 20 points and sophomore Taylor Broekhuis added a career-high 19 points. Wright State is coming off a 78-69 loss at Detroit on Saturday and has lost four consecutive games.

### Looking for Back-to-Back Road Wins

With their 72-66 victory at Wofford on Nov. 24, the Falcons captured their first true road win in nearly two years. Their last victory on an opponent's court was Dec. 6, 2008, a 71-64 victory over Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colo. Air Force, which won four neutral-site games in between, including two last year (Niagara at the Sun Bowl Invitational and Wyoming at the MWC Championships), had lost 18 consecutive true road games before defeating Wofford. Air Force has not won consecutive road games since winning at Colorado State and Wyoming in 2007.

### Balanced Attack So Far This Season

Air Force has had five players score in double figures in two of the team's six games this season (UCCS and Tennessee State). Prior to this season, the last time Air Force had five players in double figures in one game was March 14, 2007 against Austin Peay in the postseason NIT. The Falcons had three games that season with five players in double figures. Air Force had four players in double figures last Thursday night in the 72-63 victory over CSU Northridge.

### Up Next

The Falcons return home to Clune Arena to face North Carolina Central on Saturday, Dec. 11 beginning at 7 p.m.

## Top Five in Country in FG Defense

The Falcons lead the Mountain West Conference and are ranked No. 5 in the country in field-goal percentage defense. Opponents are shooting just 34.8 percent against Air Force this season. Evansville has the best FG% against Air Force this year at 38.2 percent.

## Injuries Are Here Again

After enduring a season full of injuries in 2009-10, the Falcons were hoping for a healthy '10-11 campaign. Unfortunately, it has not started out that way. Freshman Ethan Michael tore his ACL during Basic Cadet Training, then sophomore forward Zach Bohannon tore a ligament in his right hand and underwent surgery on Oct. 28. In addition, freshmen Sean Bowman (knee) and Myles Jerrett (shoulder) underwent surgery recently. Michael and Jerrett are out for the year while Bohannon and Bowman will miss most, if not all, of the non-conference portion of the schedule. The Falcons already started the year shorthanded when junior center Sammy Schafer took an administrative leave for this academic year after suffering continued effects from a concussion.

## Best FT% in Over Three Years

Air Force shot 94.1 percent (16-of-17) from the free throw line against Colorado College on Nov. 17, the best single-game percentage since going 16-for-17 against Georgia on March 19, 2007. The previous high under Jeff Reynolds was 93.8 percent (15-of-16) against Washington State on Nov. 25, 2007.

## Mountain West / Missouri Valley Challenge

The 2010-11 edition of the MWC/MVC Challenge is the second in a four-year agreement between the Mountain West and Missouri Valley Conferences. Nine Challenge games will be played each year, and each conference will host a total of 18 games in the four-year period. Missouri State will be the Valley team that does not participate in the 2010 Challenge Series. The Mountain West won eight of the nine games this season:

## Air Force Almost 60 Percent Last 7

Air Force is currently ranked sixth among Mountain West Conference teams for the best overall winning percentage since the beginning of the 2003-04 season. AFA's winning percentage is 58.5 percent. Air Force is one of only five teams in the conference to have a winning record in at least four of the last seven seasons (UNLV (7); BYU, New Mexico (6), San Diego State (5), Air Force (4)).

## Evan Washington in Search of 1,000

Senior Evan Washington entered the 2010-11 campaign within striking distance of becoming the 23rd player in Air Force history to reach the 1,000-point plateau. Washington, the only Falcon to start all 31 games last season, has 794 career points and is currently 42nd on the school's career scoring list. The last Falcon to join the 1,000-point club was Matt McCraw in 2007.

## Last Time Out

Michael Lyons scored a season-high 20 points and Taylor Broekhuis added a career-high 19 as Air Force defeated Evansville, 57-56, Sunday afternoon in the final game of the 2010 Mountain West / Missouri Valley Challenge at Clune Arena.

With the score tied at 56, Derek Brooks grabbed a rebound off a miss by Denver Holmes and threw it up court to a driving Lyons who was fouled with 3.1 seconds left attempting a layup. Lyons hit the first of two free throws to give the Falcons the lead. Kenny Harris missed a desperation three-point attempt while being heavily pressured by Brooks as time expired.

Air Force (5-1) finished the game hitting 47.7 percent from the field, including eight of 20 from three-point range. Broekhuis led the way hitting a career-best five of 10 attempts. He had made two three-pointers in his career before today's effort.

The Falcons held a 30-25 lead at halftime, but Evansville's Colt Ryan made a three-pointer right out of the gate to cut the lead to two, but back-to-back three-pointers by Broekhuis put the Falcons up 36-30 at the 18-minute mark. Later in the half, AFA's Tom Fow hit a three with 11:34 remaining to give Air Force its biggest second-half lead at 47-40, but the Aces rattled off seven straight points to tie the game at 47-all.

A 3-pointer by Kenny Harris gave Evansville (3-3) its first lead of the game at 51-49 with 7:23 left, but consecutive jumpers by Lyons gave the Falcons a 53-51 advantage and they would not relinquish the lead the rest of the way. Pieter van Tongeran made two free throws to tie it at 53-all at the 3:33 mark, then Broekhuis made his final 3-pointer with 1:49 left and Ryan hit a three with 1:22 remaining to make it 56-all.

Evansville was held with 38.2 percent shooting, the best by an Air Force opponent this season, but out-rebounded Air Force 38-22. Ryan was the only Evansville player in double figures with a team-best 20 points.

**Super Sophs Solid So Far**

Sophomores Michael Lyons, Taylor Broekhuis and Todd Fletcher have produced some impressive numbers in the Falcons' first six games. Lyons is second on the team in scoring at 13.5 ppg and leads the team with 11 offensive rebounds. He scored a season-high 20 points on Sunday vs. Evansville and has scored in double figures four times this season.

Broekhuis, meanwhile, scored a career-high 19 points against Evansville and shot 5-for-10 from three-point range. He had made two career 3-pointers entering the game. Broekhuis is shooting a team-high 57.4 percent from the field and is third on the team in scoring at 12 ppg. He also played a career-high 41 minutes against CC and blocked a personal-best three shots, the most by a Falcon in one game since Matt Holland swatted four against Wyoming on Feb. 28, 2009.

Fletcher has been just as solid at point guard, dishing out four assists per game and scoring a career-high 15 points against Cal State Northridge. He leads the team with 24 assists and is tied for the lead with 10 steals.

**Fow Lighting It Up**

Senior Tom Fow, who is leading the team and No. 6 in the MWC in scoring (15.8 ppg) after six games, is shooting 51.6 percent from the field and 51.5 percent from three-point range. Fow, who has led or tied for the team lead in scoring in four of AFA's six games, scored a season-high 22 points last Thursday against CSU Northridge. Fow is fifth in the MWC and 20th in the country in three-point percentage. He also tied his career-high with eight rebounds against Colorado College on Nov. 17.

**5-1 Ties Best Start Ever**

Air Force's 5-1 record ties the best start ever in program history after six games. The Falcons have been 5-1 nine times in the past, most recently during the 2007-08 campaign.

**First Four-Game Win Streak Since '08**

With its 57-56 victory over Evansville on Sunday, Air Force has won four consecutive games for the first time since early in the 2008-09 campaign. The Falcons won five straight games from Nov. 30 - Dec. 22, 2008.

**Most Assists in Nearly Four Years**

The Falcons dished out 24 assists against Tennessee State on Nov. 20, the most by an Air Force team since it had 24 against Norfolk State on Dec. 13, 2006.

**Stellar Second Half vs. TSU**

Air Force scored 58 points and shot 76 percent (19-of-25) from the field in the second half against Tennessee State on Nov. 20. The 58 points were the most in one half since scoring 58 in the second half vs. Utah on Jan. 16, 2007 and it was the best shooting percentage in one half since shooting 76.5 percent (13-of-17) in the first half against Utah on Jan. 19, 2006.

**Extra Time a Couple of Times**

Two of Air Force's first five games have gone to overtime this season. Prior to this season, AFA's last overtime game was on Jan. 16, 2008, a 64-62 victory at Wyoming. Including this season's 1-1 mark, Air Force's all-time overtime record is 24-31.

**Still a Great Record at Clune**

Including a 4-1 record at home this season, the Falcons have been hard to beat at Clune Arena the last seven seasons. Since the beginning of the 2003-04 season, Air Force has won 87 of its 113 home games, good for a .770 winning percentage.

In addition, the Falcons have won 36 of their 56 Mountain West Conference games at Clune Arena during that stretch.

**Falcons Win Eighth Straight Season Opener**

With its 66-53 victory over UCCS at Clune Arena on Nov. 14, Air Force is now 25-30 all-time in season openers. The Falcons are 19-8 at home and 6-22 on the road (including neutral games). Air Force has won its last eight season openers and 10 home openers.

## ***Head Coach Jeff Reynolds***

Jeff Reynolds, the seventh head coach in Air Force basketball history, begins his fourth season at the helm in 2010-11.

Reynolds has guided the Falcons to a 10-21 record each of the last two seasons, including an injury-riddled 2009-10 campaign in which seven significant players missed a total of 61 games, forcing him to use 10 different starting lineups. The previous season, Reynolds led the Falcons to their first-ever victory at the Mountain West Conference Championships with a thrilling, 71-67 victory over Colorado State in the first round.

In fact, counting AFA's 59-40 win over Wyoming at the 2010 MWC Tournament, Reynolds has the second-most conference tournament victories of any coach in program history.

Reynolds, who served as an assistant coach with the Falcons for two seasons before his promotion to head coach on April 17, 2007, led the Falcons to a fifth-place finish in the Mountain West Conference in his first season after Air Force was picked eighth in the preseason media and coaches poll. It was the greatest margin between prediction and actual finish in the conference that season. Reynolds, who enters the '10-11 campaign with a 118-90 career record in seven seasons, took over a program that had just graduated its best class ever and returned one player that had ever started a game. He led the team to an impressive 16-14 overall record and 8-8 mark in the Mountain West Conference. In addition, he was instrumental in helping Tim Anderson earn the MWC Defensive Player of the Year award.

During his two seasons as an assistant, Reynolds helped guide Air Force to two of its most successful campaigns on the basketball court. In 2005-06, the Falcons were 24-7, the best record in program history, and played in the NCAA Tournament for just the fourth time ever. In '06-07, Air Force posted a 26-9 record, setting a new school record for most victories in one season, and advanced to the semifinals of the NIT. Air Force was just one of 17 Division I teams to win at least 50 games in those two seasons.

In addition, the Falcons posted a 31-1 record at Clune Arena and Reynolds helped four Falcons, Jacob Burtschi, Nick Welch, Dan Nwaelele and Matt McCraw, join the 1,000-point club during the 2006-07 campaign.

Reynolds came to the Academy after serving as an assistant coach at Tulane for five seasons. During his time at Tulane, Reynolds coached Linton Johnson, who has played in the NBA for six seasons, most recently with the Phoenix Suns. Johnson was a member of the San Antonio Spurs when they won the NBA championship in 2005.

Prior to his stint at Tulane, Reynolds served as the head coach at Division II Wingate University in Wingate, N.C., where he logged an impressive 61-27 record in three seasons.

In those three seasons, Reynolds built the program into a Division II powerhouse. In 1999-2000, his team led the nation in scoring defense and posted an impressive 26-4 record, closing the year with a final national ranking of No. 7 and a spot in the NCAA Tournament.

In 1998-99, Reynolds guided Wingate to its first NCAA Tournament bid, as well as its first national ranking, and the Bulldogs closed that season with a 23-6 mark as Reynolds earned South Atlantic Conference Coach of the Year honors.

As the top assistant coach at his alma mater, UNC-Greensboro, from 1995-97, Reynolds helped the program to the 1996 Big South Championship and a bid to the 1996 NCAA Tournament. The Spartans fell to Elite Eight team Cincinnati, 66-61, in the first round.

Prior to that, he served for four years as the top assistant at UNC-Wilmington, helping the Seahawks to Colonial Athletic Association Most Improved Team honors in 1992.

Reynolds began his coaching career at James Madison University in 1981, serving as a part-time assistant for a team which won 24 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1982. He went on to Division II power Randolph-Macon College, which reeled off three straight NCAA Tournament appearances and earned a No. 4 national ranking in the final poll of 1984.

He logged one year as the head coach of North Carolina Wesleyan College in 1985-86, leading

the program to a 21-7 mark and the Dixie Conference Championship, before moving on to Winthrop College as an assistant coach for four years. At Winthrop, he was directly involved in the team's transition from Division II to Division I, and, in 1988, the school captured the Big South Conference Championship.

Reynolds, 54, is married to the former Janet Montgomery and the couple resides in Colorado Springs.

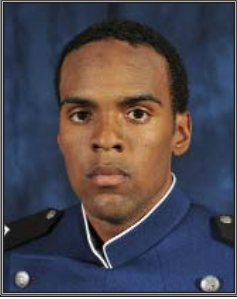
