## NEW FACES JOIN COACHING STAFF

Air Force added two new coaches and a familiar one to the coaching staff for 2018. Nick Jones enters his first season as tight ends coach after six years at Coastal Carolina. He graduated from Wake Forest in 2008. Chip Vaughn is in his first year as the secondary coach and comes to the Academy from Fayetteville State. Brian Knorr returns for his third stint with the Falcons. He will be a defensive assistant. Knorr coached at Arizona last season. He previously was the assistant head coach and inside linebackers coach in 2007, outside linebackers and safeties coach from 2005-06 and was the junior varsity head coach and varsity assistant from 1992-94.

## AIR FORCE AT HOME

Air Force is 50-18 in Falcon Stadium under head coach Troy Calhoun, including a school-record 15-game winning streak from 2014 to Oct. 22, 2016. The Falcons have won 20 of their last 24 at home games dating back to 2014.

Air Force's 17 wins from 2014-16 is a school record for a three-year stretch. Air Force finished 6-0 at home in 2014 and 2015 to mark the first back-to-back undefeated home seasons in school history. Air Force has finished undefeated at home just five times overall in school history, three coming under Calhoun.

## HOME STREAK BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Air Force went 20-4 at home over the last four seasons. The 20 wins is the best four-year mark in school history, breaking the record of 19 set from 1982-85 and 1998-2001 when the program went 19-4 those years in Falcon Stadium. The Falcons were 19-6 from 2009-12.

Air Force set a record for the best three-year run from 2014-16 with a 17-1 record, breaking the mark of 15-2 from 1983-85. The Falcons were 14-3 from 1998-2000 and 1997-99 and 14-5 from 2009-11 to round out the top five marks in school history.

### DEBERRY, CALHOUN THE ONLY TWO

Air Force has had only two head coaches the last 35 years which is the fewest in the nation over that time span. Fisher DeBerry led the program for 23 years (1984-2006) while Troy Calhoun has been at the helm since 2007 and is in his 12th season.

### AIR FORCE VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES UNDER CALHOUN

Air Force is 33-22 against non-conference opponents under head coach Troy Calhoun. The Falcons are 21-4 at home, 7-13 on the road and 5-5 in neutral site games. Air Force was 1-3 last season with the win coming vs. VMI and losses at #7 Michigan and Navy and at home vs. Army.

### AIR FORCE WINS MW RUSHING TITLE, FINISHES FOURTH NATIONALLY

Air Force won the Mountain West rushing title last season with a 307.4 per-game average. The title is the 31st in school history and 16th in the Mountain West. The Falcons finished second the three years they didn't win the MW rushing title. The Falcons finished fourth nationally which is the 28th time in the last 30 years the team has been in the top 10 nationally.

### CALHOUN'S TENURE RANKS EIGHTH NATIONALLY

Troy Calhoun enters his 12th season at head coach at Air Force. His 12-year tenure is the longest in the Mountain West and eighth longest among active coaches in the nation.

### THIS IS AIR FORCE FOOTBALL

- Air Force has an all-time record of 385-339-13 in 62 seasons of varsity football. The Falcons are 214-127-3 at home, 150-172-6 on the road and 21-21-4 in neutral site games. AFA has played in 26 bowl games and has a 12-13-1 all-time record. Air Force is 181-109 all-time in Falcon Stadium.
- Air Force will play in its 39th year in a conference in 2018. The 2018 season marks Air Force's 20th year in the Mountain West Conference. Prior to 1999, Air Force was a member of the Western Athletic Conference from 1980-98. The school was an independent prior to 1980.
- Air Force is 75-70 as a member of the Mountain West. The team is 45-27 at home, 30-42 on the road and 0-1 in neutral site games. The Falcons are 131-105 overall since joining the MW in 1999, including marks of 78-38 at home, 45-59 on the road, 8-8 in neutral site games and 6-5 in bowls.

### BENNETT IN THE RECORD BOOKS

Senior receiver Marcus Bennett recorded career highs in every receiving category at Navy last season with five catches for 161 yards and two touchdowns. He also hauled in a career-long 59 yard reception and a 51-yarder, both for TDs. Bennett is the first Falcon since Jalen Robinette in 2016 to record a 100-yard game. His 161 yards receiving rank as the 11th most in school history and are the most by a Falcon since Robinette had 182 vs. New Mexico in 2016. Bennett averaged 32.2 yards per catch which is the second best mark in Air Force history, trailing the record of 32.6 by Robinette vs. Navy in 2016. Bennett entered the game with four receptions for 73 yards with a long of 33 yards on the year.

Bennett led the Falcons in receiving last season with 19 catches for 403 yards and three touchdowns.

### WORTHMAN LEADING THE WAY

Senior quarterback Arion Worthman ranked in the top 10 in the Mountain West in four categories last season. He was fifth in the conference in rushing with an 82.1 average, seventh in total offense (192.1), sixth in scoring (7.8) and third in scoring TDs (7.8).

Worthman recorded a career day vs. UNLV, recording a career-high 30 carries for a season-best 166 yards and a career-best five touchdowns. His five touchdowns tie as the second-most in school history. He is tied with Marty Louthan, who scored five vs. Navy in 1983. Worthman's 30 points scored is also the second most in school history and most since Dee Dowis scored 36 vs. San Diego State in 1989.

Worthman had another career day at Navy, breaking a 47-year-old Air Force record for total offense with 396 yards. Worthman rushed for 139 yards and two touchdowns with a season-long run of 52 yards. He hit nine of 16 passes for a career-best 257 yards and two touchdowns. His nine completions matched a career-high while recording a season-long pass of 60 yards. He also recorded his first-career catch, good for 24 yards. Worthman broke the total offense record of 380 yards set in 1970 by Bob Parker vs. Colorado State.

Worthman became 47th player in Air Force history to top the 1,000 yard mark for his career at Navy Oct. 7 and ranks 28th with 1,495 yards. Worthman has a career 168.56 quarterback efficiency rating. He has a 9-6 record in his career as a starter while averaging 92.6 yards rushing (307-1,389-17) and 108.6 yards passing (75-147-5-1,629-13) per game.

### SCOTT PUNTING

Junior punter Charlie Scott averaged 42.1 yards on 41 punts with 12 fair catches, 13 downed inside the 20 and 12 of 50 yards or more last season.

Scott punted three times for a 46.3 average at Boise State with a pair of 50-plus punts and two downed inside the 20. He punted just once at Colorado State, but nailed a career-long 69 yard punt that was downed inside the 20 in the final minutes. The punt is the longest by a Falcon since Ryan Harrison had an 81 yard punt vs. Wyoming in 2007.

Scott averaged 47.8 yards per punt against San Diego State and New Mexico in back-to-back games, including a 46.1 net average. He averaged 46.5 yards with a 59 yarder vs. San Diego State and a season-best 47.8 at New Mexico. Both games were played in wet weather conditions. Scott is a native of Greenwood Village, Colo., and attended Cherry Creek High School. Scott's

The catch was his first touch of his career and put him in rare company for the 2017 season. He is one of nine receivers in the nation to score on his first touch of the season. Sanders became the only receiver in the nation to score on his two touches, as he added a five yard TD reception early in the second quarter.

The Colorado Springs, Colo., native and Palmer Ridge High School graduate led the Falcons to a 38-35 victory. Sanders set a single-game school record with 44 rushing attempts, surpassing the previous record of 42 set by Brian Bream against Stanford in 1970. Sanders finished with 196 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns, including the game-winning TD with 1:38 left. Sanders was 4-of-12 passing for 33 yards and one interception through the air. Sanders earned the National Football Foundation, Colorado Chapter, player of the week honor and was named the Mountain West offensive player of the week by CollegeSportsMadness.com.

## Air Force Head Coach Troy Calhoun

Troy Calhoun enters his 12th season as head coach at Air Force where he has a 82-60 overall record and a 49-38 mark in Mountain West play. He has led Air Force to nine bowl games, including a school-record six straight from 2007-12. Calhoun led the program to a 10-3 mark in 2016, just the seventh 10-win season in school history. Air Force won the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy for a record 20th time and won a bowl game for the second time in three seasons. He led the Falcons to an 8-6 overall record in 2015 and the Mountain Division championship and first-ever MW title game appearance. The Falcons were 6-2 in conference play.

Calhoun is the only coach in the 100-plus year history of service academy football to lead teams to at least seven wins and a bowl game in each of his first five seasons. Calhoun has twice been semifinalist for the National Coach of the Year award for his efforts on and off the field (2007, 2010).

Calhoun came to his alma mater in 2007 and took over a program that had three straight losing seasons. Air Force finished the 2007 season 9-4 overall and placed second in the Mountain West Conference with a 6-2 mark in Calhoun's first year. The Falcons earned their first bowl bid in five seasons, advancing to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl in Fort Worth, Texas. The five-game turnaround from the previous season was the largest in the nation by a first-year head coach and tied as the third-largest overall in the nation.

Calhoun was named the conference's coach of the year for his efforts. In addition, he was named coach of the year in Region 5 by the American Football Coaches Association and was one of eight finalists for national coach of the year honors. Calhoun followed with back-to-back 8-5 overall records and fourth place conference finishes with 5-3 marks in 2008 and 2009. The team earned bids to the Armed Forces Bowl each season and posted the school's first bowl victory since 2000 with a 47-20 win over Houston in 2009.

In 2010 the Falcons posted a 9-4 overall record and recorded their fourth straight top four conference finish with a 5-3 mark. The Falcons were nationally ranked for the first time since 2003 and posted a victory as a ranked team for the first time since 2002. The team capped the season with a 14-7 win over George Tech in 2010 Independence Bowl to earn a second-straight bowl victory.

Air Force posted a 7-6 record in 2011 and qualified for the Military Bowl. The Falcons were 6-7 in 2012 while finishing fourth in the conference with a 5-3 mark. Air Force played in its fourth Armed Forces Bowl to extend the school's record of consecutive bowl games to six dating back to 2007.

Calhoun led the Falcons to new heights in 2014, posting a 10-3 overall record and a fourth place finish in the Mountain Division with a 5-3 mark. The eight-game turnaround from a 2-10 mark in 2013 is a school record and tied as the best in the nation. The Falcons capped the season with a record 19th Commander-in-Chief's Trophy and a victory over Western Michigan in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Calhoun brought a wealth of experience and impressive resume at the collegiate and professional levels that is flooded with success at every stop to the Academy. Calhoun came to the Academy after serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Houston Texans in 2006. The Texans were one of only two NFL teams to triple their number of wins from the previous year.

Calhoun became a well-rounded NFL coach, working as a defensive assistant, special teams assistant and offensive assistant with the Denver Broncos from 2003-05. He began his NFL coaching career by serving as the defensive assistant under defensive coordinator Larry Coyer in 2003. Prior to the NFL, Calhoun was an offensive coordinator for six seasons on the collegiate level. He began his coaching career at Air Force, where he worked as a graduate assistant from 1989-90. He started at quarterback for the Academy in 1986 and was one of only two freshmen to letter for the 1985 team that finished fifth in the final polls with a 12-1 record that included wins over national powers Notre Dame and Texas.

Calhoun served his country from 1989-95 as an active duty officer in the Air Force. He was the Falcons' recruiting coordinator and the junior varsity offensive coordinator in 1993-94. He moved to Ohio University in 1995 where he served as the quarterbacks coach for two seasons. Calhoun was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1997. Calhoun moved to Wake Forest in 2001 and remained there prior to his stint with the Broncos.

Groomed on the basics of integrity and passion, Calhoun is a native of Roseburg, Ore., and was raised in a home where both kids graduated from the Air Force Academy and were varsity letter winners on nationally-ranked teams. He and his wife, Amanda, live in Colorado Springs and have two children, Tyler (15) and Amelia (13).
