### The Game Facts...

**The Records** -- Air Force is 0-1. Eastern Washington is 0-1.

**Television** -- None.

**Radio** -- Locally on KVOR AM 740 in Colorado Springs and KLZ 560 AM/ESPN radio in Denver and parts of Wyoming, Kansas, Nebraska, Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico. KVOR's Jim Arthur (play-by-play) and Lee Douglas of News First 5/30 (color) will call the action. They are joined on the pre- and post-game shows by KVOR's Jay Ritchie and Greg Lazor of Magic FM.

**National Polls** -- *Air Force* is not ranked.

**Series** -- This is the first meeting between the two schools.

**Coaches** -- *Air Force* is coached by Fisher DeBerry (Wofford, 1960), who is in his 21st season. DeBerry, the winningest coach in service academy history, has led the Falcons to a 156-89-1 mark in his only head coaching position.

*Eastern Washington* is coached by Paul Wulff (Washington State, 1990), who is in his fifth season. Wulff has led the Eagles to a 25-20 record in his first head coaching position.

**Streaks** -- *Air Force* has lost three straight dating back to last season.

*Eastern Washington* has lost two straight dating back to last season.

**Last meeting** -- This is the first meeting between the two.

**Last week** -- *Air Force* was beaten, 56-14, by 13th-ranked California in Falcon Stadium in the season opener for both schools. Eastern Washington lost its season opener, 37-14, at Nicholls State.

**Did you know** -- Air Force is 10-0 under Fisher DeBerry against Division I-AA opponents. The team defeated Wofford, 49-0, last year in its last game against a I-AA foe.

**Stat of the week** -- Air Force is 6-1 all-time against teams from the Big Sky Conference. Air Force defeated Cal State Northridge in 2000 in its last game against a Big Sky team.

**What to watch for** -- Air Force has not opened a season 0-2 since 1994. That year, the Falcons opened 0-3 before winning eight of the next games and finish 8-4 overall.

Air Force has just one player from the state of Washington on its roster, wide receiver Greg Kirkwood of Othella.

### The large and small of it...

Despite Eastern Washington being a Division I-AA opponent, Air Force still finds itself at a size disadvantage. The Eastern Washington offensive line averages 6-foot-4 and 284 pounds. Air Force defensive linemen average 6-foot-2.5 and 270 pounds, which is 1.5 inches shorter and 14 pounds lighter. That is, however, better than last week when Air Force averaged 2.0 inches shorter and 42 pounds lighter.

## Last week...

Air Force was defeated, 56-14, by 13th-ranked California in Falcon Stadium in the season opener for both schools. Cal running back J.J. Arrington rushed for 181 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Bears, who out-rushed Air Force 342-182. Arrington opened the scoring with an 11-yard scoring run to give the Bears a 7-0 lead. The Falcons answered when freshman QB Shaun Carney hit Robert McMenomy with a 10-yard scoring strike to tie the game. The touchdown capped a 17-play, 77-yard drive that took 6:19 off the clock. The Falcons converted all five third-down conversions on the drive. Arrington added his second TD of the first quarter to give Cal a 14-7 lead. Quarterback Aaron Rodgers then added a one-yard run early in the second quarter to give the Bears a 21-7 lead. The Falcons then posted another impressive drive, going 80 yards in eight plays to make it 21-14 at halftime. Dan Shaffer capped the drive with a two-yard TD run. The biggest play of the game came on Cal's opening drive of the second half. Arrington dived over the pile from the one-yard line and fumbled into the endzone after being hit by John Rudzinski. Air Force recovered, but officials ruled that Arrington had crossed the goal line before the fumble, giving him his third score of the game and California a 28-14 lead. The Bears rolled from that point, holding Air Force to just 56 total yards in the second half. Cal finished the game with 573 total yards while holding the Falcons to just 271. Marshawn Lynch added 92 yards rushing and Rodgers hit 11 of 16 passes for 208 yards for the Bears, who improved to 1-0. Air Force was led by Carney, making his first-career start, who rushed for

75 yards on 18 carries. He also hit nine of 15 passes for 89 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

## Quoting DeBerry...

Quotes from Air Force head coach Fisher DeBerry following the Cal game follow:

"We're certainly very disappointed, as you would expect in the outcome of this game. The score is not very typical of Air Force football, and to be honest with you, we're a little embarrassed. We were hoping for a miracle, that was sort of our approach today. I thought when we came out in the second half, we were right where we wanted to be. We were in good shape, we were going to have the football to start the second half, and obviously we didn't do anything with it."

"To me this is when it's most critical in a football game, the attitude and performance and the way you come out to start the second half, and that's probably the thing that disappointed me most. We didn't come out with the intensity level that I thought we should show coming out, being in the position that we were and we hadn't played bad football. We just didn't take advantage of our opportunities."

"The other thing that probably disappointed me most was that we gave up the big play. You can't beat a solid football team giving up the big play. Obviously we've got to look at that very closely and do something about that. The other thing was that we had some penalties that stopped some drives for us. And we didn't tackle very well. It was very uncharacteristic of Falcon football."

"You've got to give Cal a lot of credit, they're a much improved football team than when we played them two years ago. They're a much stronger football team, and obviously, they've got great balance."

## Last week's post-game notes...

### Team Notes

- The attendance of 50,075 is the largest opening day crowd since 56,162 watched the Air Force-Oklahoma game in 2001.
- The attendance is fifth largest opening day crowd in school history.

### Individual Notes

- Shaun Carney is the first freshman quarterback to ever start the season opener at Air Force. He is the

first freshman QB to start a game at any point in the season since Dee Dowis in 1986.

■ Carney's first career drive was a 17-play, 77-yard drive that took 6:19 off the clock. The 17 plays tied as the longest drive the Falcons had all last season. AFA was 5-for-5 on third down on the first drive of his career.

■ Carney's touchdown pass to Robert McMenomy in the first quarter was the first score of each player's career.

■ Donny Heaton's 62-yard punt in the third quarter is the longest of his career.

■ Fifteen Falcons made their first career start: TE Robert McMenomy, LT Robert Kraay, LG Jon Wilson, C Lawrence Hufford, RG Curtis Grantham, QB Shaun Carney, SB Kris Holstege, LE Nate Terrazone, NG Russ Mitscherling, RE Ryan Carter, ILB Cameron Hodge, ILB Kenny Smith, FAL Tyler Hess, CB Jordan Wilkie, FS Mark Carlson.

## Air Force injury report...

Junior Curtis Grantham is out indefinitely following a broken fibula against California. Grantham is scheduled to have surgery later this week. A closer look at the injury report for this week follows:

## The most to the second-fewest...

Air Force is back to normal this season. The Falcons usually rank among the teams with the fewest returning starters in the conference. This year, AFA returns just six starters which is the second-fewest in the Fisher DeBerry era. The only time the team returned fewer was in 2002 when just five returned. Last year, AFA was in unfamiliar territory when 16 starters returned. The Falcons had seven returning starters on offense and defense, as well as two kickers back. This year, the team has three on offense and defense and no kickers.

## Falcons vs. non-conference foes...

Air Force is 23-7 in its last 30 non-conference games dating back to 1997. Three of the losses have

come at the hands of nationally ranked teams. Air Force fell to eighth-ranked Notre Dame, 34-31, in overtime in 2000 and in 2001 to third-ranked Oklahoma, 44-3, in Falcon Stadium. In 2002, the team fell at home, 21-14, to seventh-ranked Notre Dame. AFA head coach Fisher DeBerry is 61-29 during his career in non-conference games. ### Fast starts the norm...

Air Force has a history of getting off to a fast start with Fisher DeBerry at the helm. In addition to a 17-4 mark in season openers, the Falcons are 61-25 (.709) in August and September under DeBerry. Air Force has 27 of its last 33 games (.818) during the last nine seasons in August and September. The team's last two losses have come against ranked opponents. The Falcons lost to defending national champion Oklahoma in 2001 and last week vs. 13th-ranked California. A closer look at the last nine years follows:

### Air Force among the best...

Air Force ranks second in the Mountain West Conference and 18th nationally since 1997 in total wins. The Falcons have a 58-29 record (.667). During the last eight years, Air Force has posted seasons with nine (2000), 10 (1997) and 12 (1998) wins. Air Force posted the first back-to-back 10-win seasons in program history in 1997-98 with 10 and 12 wins, respectively. A closer look at the national leaders since 1997 follows:

### Notes about 0-1...

Some interesting notes about Air Force's 0-1 start this season follows:

■ Air Force is 0-1 for the first time since 2001 and just the fifth time under Fisher DeBerry.

■ The last time AFA opened 0-1 was in 2001. That year the loss was to third-ranked Oklahoma. AFA rebounded the next week for a win over a Division I-AA team. The Falcons play I-AA Eastern Washington this week.

■ AFA has opened 0-2 only once under head coach Fisher DeBerry. The team opened 0-3 in 1994 before winning eight of the next nine games to finish 8-4 overall.

■ AFA has lost three straight games dating back to last season. The last time the Falcons lost four straight games was in 1993-94. AFA last the final two games of 1993 and the first three of 1994. The team went on to win 10 of its next 11 and 14 of its next 17 games.

### AFA national power in rushing...

Air Force has been one of the most dominant rushing teams in college football since Fisher DeBerry took over in 1984. The team has ranked among the nation's top 10 a remarkable 19 times and the top five 15 times. In 2002, the Falcons won the school's first national rushing title.

As dominant as the team has been nationally, it has no equal in conference play. Air Force has won 20 conference rushing titles, including 18 under DeBerry.

The Falcons got off to a rough start this season, rushing for just 182 yards against 13th-ranked California last week. That total ranks fifth in the conference and 41st nationally this week. If history repeats itself, the Falcons should rebound. In 2001,

the Falcons opened the season with a tough day against defending national champion and third-ranked Oklahoma. AFA rushed for just 137 yards and ranked fifth in the conference and 48th nationally after one week. The Falcons ended the season with a 273.2-yard average to lead the conference and rank third nationally.

### Blocked kicks...

The Falcons have made blocking kicks an art form. Air Force has blocked 87 kicks since 1990 to rank second nationally behind Virginia Tech, who has 89. During the 1990s, Virginia Tech led the nation with 62 while Air Force was second with 60. AFA has blocked at least three kicks 14 consecutive years.

### Halfback rushing game...

Air Force's halfback rushing game has been as good as ever in the option era over the last couple of years. Last year, the position posted some impressive numbers. The group had its best game of the season against Wyoming, rushing for 235 yards and scoring three touchdowns. Darnell Stephens led the way with 91 yards and a TD on 14 carries. Last season, halfbacks gained 44.2 percent (1,489 yards) of the team's 3,367 rushing yards.

The halfbacks, like everyone else last week, got off the a slow start against California. The halfbacks combined for 32.9 percent of the team's 182 yards with a combined 60 yards.

### Stephens, Butler moving up...

Senior halfbacks Darnell Stephens and Anthony Butler have established themselves as two of the top halfbacks in Air Force history. Last season, Butler became the 31st player in AFA history to reach the 1,000-yard mark for his career. He now stands 27th in career rushing at the Academy with 1,135 yards. Stephens became the 32nd player in school history to reach 1,000 yards in his career last season and has 1,113 for his career to rank 29th.

### Commander-in-Chief's Trophy...

This season marks the 33rd year of Commander-in-Chief's Trophy competition between Air Force, Army and Navy. Each year, the President of the United States hosts the winning team at the White House to present them the CIC Trophy. Air Force has dominated the competition with 16 titles. Army and Navy have won it six times each.

Air Force was 1-1 last season, losing to Navy and defeating Army. The Midshipmen ended a drought of over 20 years by going on to beat Army and win the trophy.

Air Force has a 44-20-0 all-time CIC record. Fisher DeBerry has led the Falcons to 14 of the 16 titles and has a 33-7 CIC record. The Falcons have been in possession of the Trophy for all but two years (Army, 1996; Navy 2003) since 1989.

### A freshman will lead them...

Air Force head football coach Fisher DeBerry announced that freshman Shaun Carney will start at quarterback for the Falcons this season. Carney is the first freshman in Academy history to be named the starter at the beginning of the season and first rookie QB since Dee Dowis in 1986 against Brigham Young to start any game.

Carney beat out junior Andy Gray for the position. Fellow junior Adam Fitch was the favorite to win the job until a ruptured Achilles tendon during the spring put him out of action. He returned to practice on Aug. 23 and is expected back this week.

Carney, a native of North Olmsted, Ohio, attended the Air Force Academy Prep School last year and started at quarterback. He was a three-year letterman in football and basketball at St. Edward High School.

"I've been dreaming about this for a long time and am very confident in my ability," Carney said. "Without my year at the Prep School, I would not be here in this position. I played against incredible competition last year at the Prep School and really adapted to the speed of the college game. I'm a game player. When the lights go on, I'm the guy who's going to make plays."

## Coach...

The Falcons will wear a sticker on their helmets this season in memory of former head coach Ben Martin. Known widely as the Father of Air Force Football, Martin passed away in



Colorado Springs in July. He was 83 years old. Martin put Air Force football on the map during his 20-year (1958-77) coaching tenure. His short, controlled passing game enabled the much-smaller Falcons to compete on a national scale. The coach led the Falcons to three bowl games, including the 1959 Cotton Bowl, 1963 Gator Bowl and 1971 Sugar Bowl. The Cotton and Sugar bowl games mark the only New Year's Day bowl games Air Force has participated in. Martin's 1958 team, his first at Air Force, is still considered one of the top teams in college football history. The Falcons went 9-0-1 in the regular season before battling to a 0-0 tie with Texas Christian in the Cotton Bowl to finish 9-0-2. The undefeated team is still the only one in Academy history. Martin's 20-year stint is the second-longest in service academy football history and his 96-103-9 record at Air Force is the second-best in school history. Only current Falcon mentor Fisher DeBerry's 21-year tenure and 156-88-1 career record are better in either category.

## Heaton looks good ...

Junior punter Donny Heaton had a solid debut as the team's starting punter last week. Heaton punted seven times for a 47.0 average. He also recorded a career-long 62 yard punt and had one downed inside the 20 yardline. Heaton entered the game with just one punt in his career, a 54-yarder in 2003. He leads the conference in punting this week and ranks fourth nationally.

## Messerall third...

Kickoff returner Alec Messerall ranks third in the Mountain West Conference this week with a 21.0 average. Messerall returned three kickoff for 63 yards against California. The senior, who also plays wide receiver, will likely not get a chance to improve his statistics this week. He is listed as questionable due to a strained elbow. He has been replaced as a kickoff returner by Justin Handley. He'll only see action at wide receiver this week against Eastern Washington.

## Spence returns to team...

Junior linebacker Overton Spence has been reinstated to the football team by the Academy. Spence was suspended by the Academy during an investigation for steroid-related charges. Spence was found not guilty during a court-martial Aug. 31. He was then cleared administratively by the Academy and will join the team Monday for practice Sept. 6.

# Fisher DeBerry

## Air Force Head Football Coach



Faith, family and the Falcons!

Nothing is more important to Fisher DeBerry, who is in his 21st season as the head football coach at Air Force. As successful as he is colorful and charitable, the 66-year-old DeBerry has become as much a part of the AFA landscape as Falcon Stadium and the Cadet Chapel.

DeBerry has guided the Falcons to 18 winning seasons since taking over in 1984. He's guided the Academy to three conference championships. Air Force won the Western Athletic Conference title in 1985 and again in 1995. In 1998, DeBerry guided the team to its first out-right title and a championship game win over Brigham Young. His 1998 team matched the school record with a 12-1 season while earning him his third coach of the year award.

The Cheraw, S.C., native has done it all at Air Force. He is the winningest coach in school history with a **156-89-1** mark, including a 7-5 mark in 2003. He stands second in Mountain West Conference history in career wins with **91**, trailing only close friend and former BYU coach LaVell Edwards. He has also beaten Notre Dame three times, including a 20-17 overtime thriller in South Bend in 1996.

DeBerry has dominated service academy football. In 1999, DeBerry became the winningest coach in service academy football history when AFA knocked off Washington in Seattle. He is an amazing 33-7 against Army and Navy in his career and has led the Academy to 14 of its 16 Commander-in-Chief's trophy titles.

DeBerry is a 1960 graduate of Wofford College in Spartanburg, S.C., where he lettered in football and baseball. After six years of coaching and teaching in the South Carolina high school ranks, DeBerry returned to Wofford, where he stayed two years as an assistant when the school won 21 consecutive games and was ranked No. 1

nationally. It was during a nine-year stop at Appalachian State in Boone, S.C., where his work with the option offense began to blossom. Three times (1975, '78, '79) Appalachian State ranked in the top 10 nationally in either rushing, total or scoring offense under DeBerry.

Former Air Force head coach Ken Hatfield hired DeBerry in 1980 as the quarterbacks coach at Air Force. DeBerry was promoted to offensive coordinator in 1981. When Hatfield left Air Force after the 1983 season, DeBerry became the school's fifth head coach. During his inaugural news conference, DeBerry stated the team goals and they have not changed since. They are: 1 - win the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy, 2 - win the conference and 3 - go to and win a bowl game.

Deeply religious, DeBerry and his wife, LuAnn are active in church, charity and community affairs. The coach gives motivational speeches to religious and corporate groups. DeBerry has strong ties to the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and in 2001 authored a book "For God and Country" of which the proceeds go to the FCA.

The coach was also honored with the State Farm Coach of Distinction Award for his efforts on and off the field in 2001.

This past summer, the DeBerrys launched the Fisher DeBerry Foundation, which is dedicated to single-parent families and providing children opportunities they would not normally have had.

## **Blocking and Scoring**

Since 1990, Air Force's 87 blocked kicks have led to 206 points. The Falcons have scored 146 points off blocked punts, 44 off of blocked field goals and 16 off of blocked PATs. Six blocked kicks have been recovered/returned for a touchdown while 24 have led to touchdowns on the ensuing drive. Six blocked kicks have led to field goals.
