Arizona Football's New Face – Head Coach Rich Rodriguez

Rich Rodriguez took the reins of Arizona Football in late November 2011, bringing with him a career record of 120-84-2, a keen grasp of explosive offensive football and organizational skills that were manifested as he completed the hiring of a staff and dove into recruiting.

He became Arizona's 30th head coach and takes on his third Division I challenge in his 19th year as a head man. He built records of 60-26 at West Virginia and 15-22 at Michigan. His Mountaineer program won four Big East championships and appeared in two BCS bowls.

After working for CBS Sports in 2011, Rodriguez is ready for the task of returning Arizona to contender on the heels of its 11-14 mark in the last two seasons under Mike Stoops and, on an interim basis, Tim Kish for the last six contests in 2011. The Cats matched a program streak of three consecutive bowl seasons from 2008-10 but fell from the discussion a year ago at 4-8.

The Cats signed 23 prep players in his first class in February, comprised of about half players who committed to Stoops' staff and half hand-picked by his new staff – the bigger news in the new faces category.

Rodriguez hired his former defensive coordinator, Jeff Casteel, away from West Virginia, and gathered up a bunch of other familiar faces in co-offensive coordinators Calvin Magee and Rod Smith, defensive line coach Bill Kirelawich, safeties coach Tony Gibson and receivers coach Tony Dews, all of whom worked with him at either WVU or UM. He re-hired UA offensive line coach Robert Anae and added two guys who also have ties with the others, tight ends coach Spencer Leftwich from Pitt and secondary/corners coach Donnie Lockwood off Casteel's WVU staff. Those guys and operations director Mike Parrish got some guys back together, for a band-of-brothers staff built on smooth working relationships.

It's going to be needed. While Arizona will return 55 lettermen in 2012, and some 33 guys who have started games, Rodriguez's main focus is to change the culture of Wildcat football.

One change will come in the physical plant, with construction under way on UA's new football facility in the north end zone of Arizona Stadium. The building will be completed in summer 2013 to give UA a showpiece second to none in terms of a working environment. The other change – getting players and staff "pulling the rope in the same direction," as Rodriguez puts it, will require the mental commitment that in some ways has been lacking. Rodriguez put a handful of new people in charge of off-season workouts, headed by former colleague Chris Allen as director of strength and conditioning.

A full year of recruiting, too, will help, after the whirlwind 2011-12 effort spanning less than a dozen weeks instead of 12 months. The Cats picked up players from eight states and five time zones in the latest class, something unlikely to occur after re-establishing solid networks in Arizona, California and Texas.

Arizona will run his high-speed spread offense, marked notably by no huddles ("They're a waste of time.") and mobile quarterbacking. Casteel brings Rodriguez's defense of choice, a 3-3-5 system the former was unable to successfully adopt at Michigan without Casteel aboard in Ann Arbor. The stack defense fits a number of returning UA players well, but without hands-on coaching and considerable evaluation able to happen until spring ball, this notion is only that.

There's little question the 2012 Wildcats will be only a forerunning squad in terms of Rodriguez's reshaping of the program, but it's under way with a full head of steam and the initial results are all good. Check back in September.

Arizona's Assistant Coaches

Take four guys from Pitt, three from West Virginia and add in an Arizona guy and an Indiana coach with other personal ties and you get Rodriguez's 2012 UA staff. It took a while, until after the BCS bowls where a couple of them worked. It adds up to 48 comingled coaching years with Rodriguez as a staff member or player, thanks to his history at Glenville State, West Virginia and Michigan. The coordinators are the ones he wanted. The two newer faces have no sidekick history with Rodriguez but understand what he's doing. One the field, in the office or on the chicken circuit it's probably the most cohesive coaching staff Arizona has had this century, and they're all family men of note.

Jeff Casteel – Defensive Coordinator Linebackers

Casteel brings a 3-3-5 defense to Arizona, one he proved highly successful operating at West Virginia. His experience and familiarity with Rodriguez is huge for the transition in Tucson from the 4-3 systems used in recent years. He'll mentor the defense while coaching the Wildcat linebackers – a group that returns a medical-redshirt starter and will depend on some new guys. His 2011 WVU defense gave up 348 ypg, which would have been fourth in the Pac-12, while his pass efficiency defense would have led the Pac-12 by a wide margin. Most important is the level of trust between him and the head guy.

Calvin Magee – Co-Offensive Coordinator Running Backs

Magee, associate head coach, comes from Pitt and previously worked closely with Rodriguez at Michigan and WVU. He'll mentor the Arizona running backs -- what could be a fairly deep group in the new system – one he operated for three years in Ann Arbor and seven years in Morgantown. He was an All-America tight end at Southern and played five years in the NFL. He, Dews and Gibson were the first named to Arizona's new staff in early December and helped get the ball rolling.

Rod Smith - Co-Offensive Coordinator Quarterbacks

Smith comes to Arizona from Indianawill coach quarterbacks at Arizona and did the same under Rodriguez at Michigan for three years and one season at WVU. He's a guy who worked with Pat White and Denard Robinson, players who have exemplified Rodriguez's offensive bent. He played QB under the new UA mentor at Glenville State, and was QBs for six years at South Florida, the last two as OC. He'll work to make Arizona's Matt Scott and some newcomer adept at the system.

Robert Anae – Offensive Line Coach

Anae's re-hiring early this year gave Rodriguez an inside man with a keen grasp of offensive football at high levels, and a bridge of sorts between the old and the new. His work with a totally new group in 2011 was one of the bright spots in Arizona's otherwise rugged 4-8 season. He knows various football dialects and gives Rodriguez' re-assembled band of brothers some Pac-12 and Western influence. He brings back his entire starting unit.

Tony Dews – Receivers Coach

Dews coached receivers for a pair of years at Michigan and West Virginia, and coached tight ends at Pitt in 2011. He's coached linebackers, special teams, defensive line, offensive line and receivers and worked at Millersville, California (Pa.), Holy Cross and Central Michigan. He knows the big picture. At UA he'll work with a talented group but one that lost its three top 2011 receivers.

Tony Gibson – Safeties Coach

Gibson was in the first group of assistants hired and has the biggest connection with Rodriguez thanks to his playing days at Glenville State and 10 years with him at WVU and Michigan. He'll coach the secondary, focusing on the three safety positions, plus will serve as coordinator of kick-coverage special teams. He worked closely with Casteel for the seven years they shared under Rodriguez in Morgantown. Arizona's safeties could be a unit strength in 2012.

Bill Kirelawich – Defensive Line Coach

Kirelawich (kerr-LAV-itch, rhymes with have) is the most unlikely desert transplant, coming to Tucson after a career at West Virginia University for the past 33 years. He's been a national DL coach of the year (2010), and is wise in the ways of the stack defense. Rodriguez bumped him to administrative duties when he first arrived in Morgantown and then got wise. Kirelawich has been coaching football for 42 years. He'll have a youngish group in 2012 at UA.

Spencer Leftwich – Tight Ends Coach

Leftwich will coach tight ends for Arizona and give Anae another set of experienced eyes up front after serving as offensive line coach since 1989 at Stephen F. Austin, NMSU, North Texas, Tulsa and most recently, Pitt. A three-year starter at SFA, his coaching has been all about the trenches. He'll also coach offensive special teams, the return units. At tight end, he'll have a couple of returning lettermen in his unit.

David Lockwood – Cornerbacks Coach

Lockwood coached corners under Casteel at WVU the past four years, and will tutor a solid group at Arizona. He was a G.A. on the staff at WVU when Rodriguez was a young volunteer, and has coached at Notre Dame, Minnesota, Memphis and Kentucky, Delaware and James Madison. His background includes not only coaching DBs, but tight ends, linebackers and receivers.

Operations – Mike Parrish (director), Matt Dudek (on-campus recruiting), Charlie Ragle (assistant DFO), Billy Kirelawich (operations coordinator).

Strength and Conditioning – Chris Allen (director), Parker Whiteman, Frank Davis. Ovid Goulbourne.

2012 Arizona Spring Outlook

Arizona Football's coming season brings as many question marks as any in its recent history, but one factor is clear: Head Coach Rich Rodriguez is in charge and he has a plan.

The great news is that he's a head coach with 18 years under his belt developing and running programs, he's been to the BCS bowl level, and he knows what he's doing. There is no learning curve in the front office.

Changing the culture has been his primary objective in the months since taking the job. His plan started with off-season workouts, part of which the Wildcats missed due to their no-bowl 2011 season and the transition to a new coach and staff.

"The players' attitude has been really good, and the senior class is doing a good job," he says of buying into a new system, "but the hard part hasn't started.

"Playing in our system, you have to be in shape, you have to be able to fight through practice. We're just getting our guys back to normal levels of conditioning, and to play at a championship level you have to work at a championship level," he said.

A new strength staff, led by Chris Allen, took the reins in that regard the first week in January when players returned to school.

Spring ball, slated to begin March 5 and end April 14 with the Spring Game, takes a different slant for Arizona.

"Normally in spring you're working on fundamentals and techniques. We'll be doing that, but we'll also be spending a lot of time on evaluation. We have to teach our systems, but there will be a lot of attention paid to evaluating the players," he said.

Until that's complete – no doubt sometime in August – guesswork is guesswork. But UA returns 55 lettermen, and among those are 33 who have started games at some point in their careers. There are players on hand.

Arizona lost 10,000-yard passer Nick Foles and with him the system that made those numbers possible. Ditto for receivers Juron Criner, David Douglas and Gino Crump. Defensive backs Trevin Wade and Robert Golden also will be missed, along with RB Keola Antolin. But, Rodriguez is bringing a wave of different concepts to the table and gets a fresh start picking his own personnel.

OUTLOOK BRIEFS

*Opponents threw the ball an average of 36 times a game last year. UA got to the QB for 23 sacks, once every 18 attempts. That won't work. Developing a pass rush will be a key to 2012 success. The last really prolific UA sack squad (46 in 1998) got to the QB once every nine throws). Desert Swarm did it once in 6.2 throws in 1993 when it set the school record with 59 sacks. Whether UA has the people to get it done this year remains to be seen, but no question it has to happen.

*Fifth-year senior quarterback Matt Scott is the right guy to run Rodriguez's system. His stewardship led Arizona to an average 451 yards in total offense in his five career starts (4-1 record). The Cats were unpredictable with him at the helm, noted by his average of 61 rushing yards in the five games. UA owes Mike Stoops and staff for saving Scott's final year by keeping him on the sidelines as No. 2 in 2011.

*Knee injuries to linebacker Jake Fischer, safety Adam Hall and cornerback Jonathan McKnight in fall had a serious impact on Arizona's 2011 defense, sidelining three of its most active and talented players all year. Hall tried to return at mid-year but couldn't go. McKnight was thought to be the best cover man on the team, junior-to-be Fischer was a big-play versatile back and Hall was an on-the-ball physical presence. Their return in 2012 should be an immediate plus. Juniors Hall and Marquis Flowers figure to be two of the three safeties in the Jeff Casteel system while RS soph McKnight and junior Shaquille Richardson can be considered front runners on the corners. Sophs Tra'Mayne Bondurant, Cortez Johnson and Jourdan Grandon figure to keep their freshman presence going, somewhere. All three started a number of games, and get to the ball. Blending this group under Casteel's style will be one of the intriguing factors in 2012 Arizona football.

*John Bonano's place kicking and kickoff talent will help UA in 2012. He took over the PK chores after six games in 2011, made all 24 of his PATs (an adventure before he took over), and eight of 12 field goals (a bigger adventure). He's been the kickoff specialist for 32 games, and gets it deep and high. There are contenders behind him but there his jobs.

*Punter Kyle Dugandzic had an individual average of 46.0 yards per kick after joining UA from the juco ranks a year ago, the second-best average in Arizona history. Improvement in and better coverage could help make him a better weapon in 2010. The Cats were hurt by two blocks and a bad snap that put their net punting at No. 12 in the Pac-12, at 33.8 yards per. It easily could have been No. 2 in the league without the miscues, right around 40.

*Attention to detail is a Rodriguez concept of note, and he will employ two special teams coordinators to lead the charge, coaches Tony Gibson and Spencer Leftwich. They'll head coverage and returns, respectively, and get some steady aid from all the position coaches to help put some special back in UA kicking teams. The Cats have the kickers and some return ability and will work like the dickens to fly around when the stuff is happening.

*Arizona's offensive line opened 2011 with a combined one career start, then-junior Kyle Quinn at center. His fifth-year senior leadership will be key to a group returning intact, along with several backups who had fill-in starts. Sophomore tackles Fabbians Ebbele (Sporting News Freshman All-America) and Mickey Baucus, and guards Chris Putton (junior) and Trace Biskin (senior) are back, all with a combined 56 starts, Guards Carter Lees (2) and Shane Zink (3) also started. Promising redshirt freshman Lene Maiava is poised to push, somewhere along with a couple of other youngsters. Bringing back line coach Robert Anae will help continuity here, and it could be a UA strength. These guys bought into hard off-season work as quickly as any unit on the team, too. (They're smart.)

*Sophomore running back Ka'Deem Carey, the team's second leading rusher (425, 4.7 ypc, 6 TD) as a freshman, is capable of Pac-12 ascendancy. He and Daniel Jenkins have the most experience, along with H-backs Taimi Tutogi and Greg Nwoko (who missed 2011 with a knee injury rehab). Junior Kylan Butler and RS frosh Jared baker also could factor in the backfield, but it's clear that Carey can be special. His three TDs at USC weren't runs of-the-mill, but a 27-yard run-and-catch, and a tough plunge and 16-yard red-zone effort on the ground.

*Incoming freshmen will get their chances, notably linebacker Dakota Conwell, quarterback Javelle Allen, defensive end Kyle Kelley, safeties Yamen Sanders and Leo Thomas, along with athletic skill-positions players Bryan Harper, J.T. Washington, Wayne Capers and others. The incoming class was split between early commitments to Mike Stoops and some late round-up work in the East by new staff members. Rodriguez says the class, which includes seven players from EST locales, isn't representative of future UA recruiting, but worked this time around. Expect some faces to emerge. Speed was a big factor in many choices. The Cats also brought in transfer linebacker Brian Harper, an Akron graduate, and mid-year freshman linebacker C.J. Dozier to get an early start.

*Arizona has eight home games (five league contests) in 2012. Protecting the home turf makes for a good starting point with such a schedule. The ZonaZoo student section is as good as any in the country, 10,000 strong right behind the home bench. UA has enjoyed solid home attendance of late and expects it to ramp up in 2012.

*Team spirit has manifested itself in some behind-the-scenes, simple accountability and mental-preparation chores for players. It will only get more intense through spring and beyond. Rodriguez is a no-nonsense guy who likes to have fun, and those sentiments don't conflict. But slob up the locker room, miss a drill or otherwise lose focus, and a guy will have some answering responsibilities. No question discipline will be a byword of Arizona football under Rich Rodriguez. He doesn't like to waste time in any endeavor and appears unlikely to permit that breach by any player.

Lineup Notes...

Senior redshirt Matt Scott had the starting QB job entering the 2009 season but after three games backed up Nick Foles. He was able to redshirt 2011. He's back and brings his 4-1 mark as a starter (2 in 2010) into the mix. The team averaged 461 yards in total offense in his five starts with a remarkable figure of 251 rushing yards per outing. He had 61 rushing yards per game and 190 passing yards per game in the five starts...

If UA's offensive line impresses the new staff, it will return all starters intact. The return of OL Coach Robert Anae could help that factor...

Tra'Mayne Bondurant and Jourdon Grandon, sophomores to be, should be helped by a 3-3-5 defensive scheme, with their debuts at hybrid positions for the Cats in 2011...

The Cats would appear to have experience in the middle up front on defense and could see a spirited battle for the starting DT spot. There's only one in the 3-3-5, whereas Mike Stoops' 4-3 scheme used two. Like all positions, spring evaluation will determine DE/DT breakdowns entering fall camp...

Junior slot receiver Richard Morrison, who played some prep QB, will get spring work back at the QB position to help with depth... Finding five quality defensive backs for the new system could be fun, with a handful of game-ready guys back there... One position switch on the early horizon is redshirt freshman end Dame Ndiaye to linebacker...

Taking over for departed receivers Juron Criner, David Douglas and Gino Crump also shapes up as a matter of contention, although Dan Buckner and Austin Hill played regularly on the outside throughout 2011 and contributed 66 receptions and four touchdowns, while Morrison and Terrence Miller added 33 more grabs inside...

The running backs who most swiftly grab the concepts of Rich Rodriguez's offensive backfield flow should get ahead of the curve. Ka'Deem Carey, Daniel Jenkins, Taimi Tutogi and Greg Nowko have the most experience...

Whether safety Adam Hall, a 2010 starter, plans a return for a senior year in 2013 (based on a medical hardship for his one-game tour of duty in 2011), remains to be seen. He's been at it full speed in all preparations for 2012...

2011 Notes

*Arizona's Nick Foles became the school's first 10,000-yard passer with his first-ever 4,000-yard UA season in 2011. He set marks for completions, yards, attempts, and touchdowns in various career, single-season and single-game categories.

*The Wildcats' 4-8 year ended a three-year streak of bowl appearances under Mike Stoops, which had matched the school's best from 1992-94 under Dick Tomey.

*Cornerback Trevin Wade earned second-team All-Pac-12 honors, with honorable mention going to QB Nick Foles, C Kyle Quinn, PK John Bonano and LB Tra'Mayne Bondurant. RT Fabbians Ebbele was named Freshman All-America by the Sporting News. LB Paul Vassallo and Bonano earned first-team Academic All-Pac-12, while OG Carter Lees and DB Jared Tevis were named to the scholastic second team. Bonano earned UA's lone Pac-12 Player of the Week honor, for special teams, against UCLA.

*Senior receivers Juron Criner (209) and David Douglas (151) finished their careers on the UA historical chart at No. 4 and No. 6, respectively in receptions. Criner's 2,859 career yards checked out at No. 4, while his 32 career scoring catches set an Arizona record along with his twin 11-TD single-season grabs in 2010 and 2011. Running back Keola Antolin finished with 2,398 rushing yards in his four years, No. 9 in Arizona annals. His 26 scoring runs rate No. 4 on the chart. He became the sixth Wildcat to lead UA in rushing three consecutive years.

*The Cats led the Pac-12 with 371 passing yards per game, No. 3 nationally. UA's figure of 465 yards per game rated No. 16 in total offense. Rushing finished No. 114 at 95 yards per game. UA's defense gave up a program-high (low?) 5,526 yards, just edging the 5,520 allowed by the 2003 team that Mike Stoops inherited for his first year in 2004.

*Mike Stoops completed his seven-plus seasons at UA with a coaching mark of 41-50 and a Pac-10/12 games record of 27-38. Interim coach Tim Kish completed the last half of 2011 with a 3-3 mark, 2-3 in league games.

*3-4-5-6... UA played a brutal stretch in September and the first day in October against teams that finished the regular season ranked No. 3 (Oklahoma State), No. 4 (Stanford), No. 5 (Oregon) and No. 6 (USC), a sequential nightmare. The UA was outscored 178-96 in the games with the last the closest at 48-41. Every other game that followed was close in the fourth quarter and UA went 2-4 thereafter.

*The Cats played an entirely new offensive line in 2011, with one-game starting center Kyle Quinn the veteran as a junior. LT Mickey Baucus (RS-Fr), LG Chris Putton (So.), Quinn, RG Trace Biskin (Jr.) and RT Fabbians Ebbele (RS-Fr.) all saw their first real action under coach Robert Anae, who remains on Rodriguez's staff. Other newcomers who saw action included junior guard Shane Zink and redshirt freshman guard Carter Lees. Ebbele and Baucus could be four-year starters.

*The Cats tried three place kickers and the last, John Bonano, took the job and ran with it. Jaime Salazar and Alex Zendejas opened the year 2-for-6 on field goals and 13-for-18 on PATs. Bonano, who was listed as a senior but did not play football as a freshman and has a fifth year for 2012, finished at 8-12 on FGs and a perfect 24-24 on PATs. His return is a big bonus.

Some Key Wildcats

Who will impress Arizona's new coaching staff? Who can work at a championship level between now and Sept. 1? Rodriguez asked the second question prior to spring ball. Here are a few players who might fit the bill. There are others.

Matt Scott - Quarterback

Senior, 6-3, 197 - Corona, Calif. (Centennial)

Arizona: 3L... Expected to embrace Arizona's new offense with serious elan as a fifth-year senior... Was ready to go every game as emergency option in 2011 but able to redshirt... Clearly one of the team's most talented players... Team co-Offensive MVP in 2010... Remarkable 2-0 mark in starts against Washington and UCLA in 2010 filling in for injured Nick Foles, accumulating 688 yards in total offense... Team averaged 462 yards and 251 yards rushing in his five starts overall (4-1)... Career-best 319 passing yards against Bruins on career-best 24-for-36 throwing in 2010... 18-for-22 vs. Huskies and earned Pac-10 Offensive POW honor... Rushed 19 times for 136 yards, including career-high 12 totes vs. UCLA, in those games... Career-long 41-yard pass against UCLA... Finished WSU game after Foles' injury with 14-for-20 passing... 4-1 record as the starter in his career... In 2009, athletic ability and running skill put him as the No. 1 quarterback after spring ball and fall camp, and started the first three games... Played in five other contests... Winning performance in first collegiate start, completing 19 of 30 for 202 yards against Central Michigan, and was 14-for-20 for 150 yards and a TD against NAU... Meantime, rushed for career-high 91 yards on 10 attempts against Washington State, and another 83 yards in opener against the Chippewas... Third on the team in rushing with 309 yards and among best at 7.5 yards per tote... Had 29 key rushing yards at ASU... As a true freshman in 2008 he led the team with 8.2 yards per rush in flush-out or designed plays, and completed 64 percent of his 11 pass attempts... Scored a pair of rushing TDs (Idaho, WSU) and throwing for another (Idaho)... Six-for-10 passing for 77 yards and season-high eight carries (48 yards) in opener, high of 58 yards rushing vs. Washington... As a junior, he threw for 1,700 yards and 10 scores, rushing for 526 yards and seven TDs on 71 carries (7.5 yards per carry), in an offense featuring a 2,000-yard running back...
