SATURDAY'S HEADLINES

- After scoring its first victory of the season last week, a come-from-behind 34-31 win over Boston College, the Black Knights wrap up their three-game homestand versus the Kent State Golden Flashes.
- The Army offense got back on track in the win over the Eagles, rushing for 516 yards and gaining 595 yards of total offense. It was the eighth-best rushing game in Academy history and the most against a current Football Bowl Subdivision opponent since running for 546 against Rutgers on Oct. 12, 1996. The Black Knights' total offense output was the seventh most in Academy history and the most ever against a current Football Bowl Subdivision opponent.
- Senior QB Trent Steelman continued to cement his place in Army lore with a 141-yard, three touchdown performance against the Eagles. Steelman scored the game-winning touchdown on a 29-yard scamper with just 45 seconds left in the fourth quarter. His dramatic score broke Army's career record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. Steelman's 36 rushing scores is not only most by a Black Knights' signal caller, but also the third most in Academy history behind only Army legends Glenn Davis (43) and Mike Mayweather (37). Steelman now holds the records for most rushing attempts (628), rushing yards (2,503), rushing touchdowns and points (218) by an Army quarterback.
- Army moved back into the No. 1 position on the NCAA rushing ledger. The Black Knights are averaging 397.2 yards per game on the ground, eight yards better than second place Air Force and 66 yards ahead of third place Georgia Tech.
- The Black Knights' triple option has produced three runners who rank in the top 50 in the nation in rushing yards per game. Army is the only team to have three of the country's top 50 rushers. Junior RB Raymond Maples is fifth in the nation with a 134.2 yards per game average. Sophomore FB Larry Dixon is tied for 35th at 92.00 yards per contest, while senior QB Trent Steelman is 46th at 86.20 yards per game. Nevada is the only other team in the nation with multiple top-50 rushers (2).
- The dynamic rushing trio each ran for 100 yards against Boston College. Maples led the way with a career-best 184 yards on a career-high 34 carries. Steelman went for 141 yards and three scores, while Dixon posted 128 yards and one touchdown. Army has had at least two 100-yard rushers in four of the first five games, tying the Academy record for most games with multiple 100-yard runners (1948). Army's two games with three 100-yard rushers equals the program record set in 1984.
- Army has not won back to back games since defeating North Texas on Sept. 18, 2010 and Duke on Sept. 25, 2010. The Black Knights have lost eight straight games following victories, including the 2011 season opener after the win in the 2010 Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl.

A WIN VS. KENT STATE WOULD ...

- Mark the first time Army won back-to-back games since Sept. 18 and Sept. 25, 2010.
- Be the Black Knights' fifth win in the last eight games at Michie Stadium.
- Be Army's third win in as many games all-time against the Golden Flashes.
- End the Black Knights' five-game losing streak versus Mid-American Conference opponents.
- Be the Black Knights' first win in a game immediately following a victory over an opponent from a BCS automatic qualifying conference (0-4).
- Improve Army's October record to 6-4 since 2010.
- Be Head Coach Rich Ellerson's 17th win at West Point (16-26)

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN FLASHES

- ▶ Kent State is under the guidance of second-year head coach Darrell Hazell. After a 5-7 record in his first season, Hazell has the Golden Flashes off to a 4-1 start in 2012. Army fans should be familiar with Hazell after his stint as Army's wide receivers and tight ends coach during the 1997 and 1998 seasons. A 1986 Muskingum graduate, Hazell has more than 25 years of experience at the collegiate level, mostly with wide receivers, running backs and tight ends. He arrived in Kent after seven seasons at Ohio State, including six years as the assistant head coach.
- ▶ The Golden Flashes are off to their best start since 1977 after a 41-14 road win at Eastern Michigan on Saturday. Dri Archer scored three touchdowns — a five-yard reception, a 98-yard kickoff return and a 64-yard run — to lead Kent State to its third 40-point effort of the season. Quarterback Spencer Keith completed 12 of his 21 passes for 113 yards and a touchdown, while Trayion Durham ran for 116 yards and two scores on 24 carries. Archer finished the game with 222 all-purpose yards.
- ▶ Offensively, the Golden Flashes are averaging 401.6 yards and 32.8 points per game. The ground game has been especially potent, running for 201.8 yards per game, 30th best in the nation. Durham is the team's top rusher with 92.0 yards per game. He is tied for the team lead with five of Kent State's 12 rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ Archer has been the Golden Flashes' No. 1 weapon this season. Lining up as both a running back and wide receiver, he leads the country in all-purpose yards (230.6) and ranks fourth in scoring (13.2). He has 11 touchdowns this season, five on the ground, three through the air and three on kickoff returns. He is the nation's top kick returner, averaging 47.7 yards per return (11 attempts, 525 yards). Archer is averaging 80.6 rushing yards and 45.0 receiving yards per contest.
- ▶ Josh Boyle leads the receiving corps with 18 catches for 254 yards despite not starting a game. Archer has 14 catches for 225 yards, while Matthew Hurdle has caught 13 passes, three for touchdowns.
- ▶ Linebacker Luke Batton leads the Kent State defense, which is giving up an average of 375.4 yards and 26.4 points per game, with 41 tackles. Luke Wollet has 36 stops and is tied for the team lead with two interceptions. Roosevelt Nix paces the Golden Flashes with 7.5 tackles for loss and is tied for the team lead with 2.5 sacks. Jake Dooley also has 2.5 quarterback takedowns. Darius Polk also has two interceptions.
- ▶ The Golden Flashes' special teams are among the nation's top units. Kent State ranks second in the nation in kickoff returns (37.29) and 42nd in net punting (38.50). The Golden Flashes punt coverage is eighth in the nation, allowing just 1.6 yards per return.
- ▶ Aside from Archer, Eric Adeyemi is averaging 23.2 yards per kickoff return. Wollet leads the team with 14 yards on two punt returns. Anthony Melchiori is averaging 39.8 yards per punt, pinning opponents inside the 20-yard line eight times. Freddy Cortez is 8-for-12 on field goal tries, including a perfect 5-for-5 from inside 30 yards. Cortez ranks tied for 16th in the nation with 1.6 field goals per game.

THE ARMY-KENT STATE SERIES

- ▶ Army and Kent State have met twice before. Army has won both games, including a 17-14 overtime win at Michie Stadium on Sept. 9, 2006.
- ▶ The Black Knights won their only trip to Kent, defeating the Golden Flashes 45-28 in 2010.

ARMY VS. THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

- ▶ Kent State is the second of four teams from the Mid-American Conference on Army's 2012 schedule. The Black Knights will also host Ball State, along with making a trip to Eastern Michigan.
- ▶ The 2012 season marks the seventh straight year Army has played at least one game versus a MAC opponent.
- ▶ The Black Knights are 8-13 against the MAC since 2005, and have lost their last five outings versus MAC foes (2005: 1-1; 2006: 1-0; 2007: 1-2; 2008: 1-3; 2009: 2-1; 2010: 2-1; 2011: 0-4; 2012: 0-1).
- ▶ Army is 19-12 all-time against teams currently competing in the MAC (Akron, 3-1; Ball State, 2-1; Buffalo, 1-2; Central Michigan, 0-2; Eastern Michigan, 4-0; Kent State, 2-0; Massachusetts, 2-0; Miami, 2-3; Northern Illinois, 1-2; Ohio, 1-0; Western Michigan, 1-1).

THE LAST MEETING — ARMY 45, KENT STATE 28 (NOV. 13, 2010)

KENT, Ohio — Army scored its sixth win of the season, a 45-28 victory over Kent State at Dix Stadium, to become bowl eligible for the first time since the 1996 season. The Black Knights rushed for 233 yards against the nation's No. 1-ranked rushing defense entering the game.

Trent Steelman threw for a season-high 149 yards, completing nine of his 10 throws to lead the Army offense to its highest offensive output against a Football Bowl Subdivision team since a 48-29 win over Cincinnati in 2004. Steelman also rushed 13 times for 37 yards and two touchdowns.

Jared Hassin led the Black Knights with 75 rushing yards and a touchdown on 23 carries, snapping his string of 100-yard games at four. Brian Cobbs added 64 yards and a touchdown on nine carries. Raymond Maples was the season-high fourth Army player to score a rushing touchdown, the first of his career. George Jordan led the receiving corps with a career-best four catches for 46 yards. Davyd Brooks had two catches for 47 yards, including a 41-yarder, accounting for Army's longest passing play of the season.

The Black Knights defense forced four turnovers, while the offense did not give the ball away. Richard King intercepted two passes, while Donovan Travis picked off another. Mike Gann recovered a fumble to account for the final takeaway. Stephen Anderson led the Army defense with seven tackles.

Kent State outgained the Black Knights, 410-382, but could not overcome the turnovers. Eugene Jarvis had 71 yards and a touchdown on the ground, while Giorgio Morgan completed five of his nine pass attempts for 122 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Tyshon Goode led the receivers with seven catches for 155 yards and a 72-yard touchdown. Dorian Wood led the KSU defense with 14 tackles.

ARMY IN OVERTIME

- ▶ After playing just one overtime game between 1996 and 2005, Army has had seven games go to an extra session in its last 59 outings.
- ▶ Army's seven overtime games since 2006 is tied for fourth most in the nation during that span. East Carolina and Navy have played nine such games, while Buffalo has played eight OT games. The Black Knights are tied with Minnesota at seven.
- ▶ Army lost its last overtime game, a 23-20 setback versus Rutgers on Oct. 16, 2010. Army is now 6-2 all-time in overtime. Army is 5-0 at Michie Stadium in overtime.
- ▶ Army has allowed just 16 points in its eight overtime games. Rutgers' game-winning score was the first time the opponent reached the end zone after regulation since Louisville scored a touchdown in the first overtime in 1999. It stopped a streak of seven straight overtime periods without allowing a touchdown.

SATURDAY'S UNIFORM PATCH

The Black Knights will be wearing the unit patch of the **1st Armored Division** when it takes on Kent State. Headquartered at Fort Bliss, Texas the 1st AD was activated at Fort Knox, Ky., on July 15, 1940. It was the first American armored division in history to see combat. The 1st AD was dubbed "Old Ironsides" in 1941 after the famous U.S.S. Constitution. Maj. Gen. Bruce R. Magruder, the division's first commander, likened the early development of the tank to the spirit of daring and durability demonstrated by the Navy's "Old Ironsides" and decided the 1st AD should also have that moniker.

ON THE MARGIN

- ▶ After its three-point win over Boston College, the Black Knights improved to 8-8 in games decided by seven points or less since the start of the 2009 season. Conversely, Army is 8-18 in that span when the margin of victory is at least eight points.
- ▶ Two of Army's last three wins over Football Bowl Subdivision foes have been by a touchdown or less.
- ▶ Army's 55-0 win over Fordham last season was the program's largest margin of victory since a 62-7 victory against VMI on Oct. 7, 2006. The Black Knights' 45-6 win over Tulane in 2011 was their largest victory over an NCAA FBS foe since a 49-7 win at Boston College on Oct. 21, 1995.

NO (TURNOVER) MARGIN FOR ERROR

- ▶ Turnover margin has been one of the best predictors of Army's success in recent seasons. Since the start of 2006, the Black Knights have posted a 15-6 record when winning the turnover battle. On the flip side, Army is 10-46 when the margin is negative or even.
- ▶ In its last 13 losses, Army is -14 in turnovers (-1.1). In their last four wins, the Black Knights are even in the turnover category.
- ▶ Army has lost only four games under Rich Ellerson when on the plus side of the turnover battle and just three times when holding at least a two-takeaway advantage. The Black Knights are 11-4 when winning the turnover margin under Ellerson.
- ▶ In Army's last 16 wins the Black Knights are averaging 2.8 takeaways and hold a +1.7 turnover margin average (45-18 overall). Conversely, in its last 26 losses, Army is averaging just 1.2 takeaways per game and is on the wrong end of a -0.73 turnover margin average (31-50 overall).
- ▶ Army is 2-14 in its last 16 games without forcing an opponent turnover.

LAUNDRY DAY

- ▶ The Black Knights had an uncharacteristic seven penalties for 56 yards against Boston College. Both totals were season highs. It was the most penalty yards walked off against Army since last season versus Rutgers (59), and the most flags thrown against the Black Knights since being whistled eight times against Navy in 2010.
- ▶ Army has ranked in the top 35 in fewest penalties per game every season since 2006. The 34th-place showing (5.42/game) in 2009 is the only time in that span the Black Knights have finished outside the top 10.
- ▶ In its 16 wins since the start of 2009, Army has committed an average of 3.94 penalties for 33.0 yards per game (63-528). In the 26 losses in that same span, the Black Knights have committed 4.8 penalties per game for an average of 42.2 yards (126-1096).

- ▶ The Black Knights trailed Boston College at halftime, 24-17. The victory snapped an 11-game losing streak when losing after two quarters. Prior to BC, Army's last such win was on Nov. 21, 2009 at North Texas. Army trailed the Mean Green 7-3, but scored a 17-13 victory.
- ▶ Since the start of 2009, Army is 12-8 when holding the lead into intermission. Conversely, the Black Knights are 2-14 in that same span when trailing at the half.
- ▶ Army has won just 12 games when it was either tied or trailing at halftime since the start of the 2002 season (12-80).
- ▶ The Black Knights own a 18-9 mark in their last 27 games when leading at the break.

- ▶ In addition, there are three players on the Army roster who had older brothers play for the Black Knights in recent years. Junior LB Justin Trimble is the younger brother of both Jeremy Trimble (2004-07) and Jordan Trimble (2007-10). Sophomore DT Michael Ugenyi and freshman OL Jake Peterson are the younger brothers of Victor Ugenyi (2006-09) and Zach Peterson (2007-10).

THE RANK OF CAPTAIN

- ▶ Army junior Jarett Mackey was chosen as the Black Knights' "legacy" captain by last year's seniors during Army-Navy preparation. Mackey was chosen by that group as the best representative to carry on their voice and legacy.
- ▶ When the vote was taken, Mackey and the team believed 2012 would be his last season. He has since received a waiver from the NCAA to play in 2013. Mackey received medical leave from the Academy during the fall last year after suffering a knee injury in the opener at Northern Illinois.
- ▶ After rotating game captains through the first four weeks of the season, the Black Knights chose their permanent captains during preparations for Boston College. Senior QB Trent Steelman and senior LB Nate Combs were chosen to join Mackey as Army's 2012 team captains.

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF

- ▶ Army rushed for a school record 4,158 yards in 2011. It was the first time in school history the Black Knights breached the 4,000-yard mark. The Black Knights' 346.5 yards per game last season tied for the fourth best on the Academy season list, while the team's 5.62 yards-per-carry average listed fifth.
- ▶ The Black Knights are back on top of the national rushing chart, averaging 397.2 rushing yards per game through the first five outings.
- ▶ In the last four weeks, Army is averaging 426.0 yards per game on the ground.
- ▶ Army rushed for 516 yards in the win over Boston College. It was the eighth-best rushing game in Academy history, and the best against a current FBS opponent since Rutgers in 1996 (546).

- ▶ Army ran the ball on 86 of its 90 offensive plays against Northern Illinois. It was the second-most rushing attempts in a game in Army history. The record is 88 attempts versus Holy Cross on Oct. 26, 1974.
- ▶ Since the start of 2009, Army the Black Knights are averaging 57.4 rushing attempts per game (2,410 att. in 42 games). That total accounts for 84.7 percent of Army's offensive plays in that span (2,410 rushes, 437 passes).
- ▶ Army leads the nation with 349 rushing attempts. Army's 69.8 rushing attempts per game is also tops in the country.

SPREAD THE WEALTH

- ▶ The Black Knights have had multiple 100-yard rushers in four of the first five games. It is the first time since 1948 that the Black Knights have had at least four games with multiple 100-yard ground gainers in a season.
- ▶ This season marks the first time Army started a season with three such outings. It is the first time since 1948 that the Black Knights accomplished the feat in three consecutive games.
- ▶ Junior RB Raymond Maples, sophomore FB Larry Dixon and senior QB Trent Steelman have each reached the 100-yard rushing mark in the same game twice this season. It is the first time Army had three players gain at least 100 yards in multiple games since the 1984 campaign.
- ▶ The Black Knights have had four players register at least one 100-yard game already this season. In addition to the three versus Northern Illinois, sophomore RB Terry Baggett posted his first 100-yard effort in the opener at San Diego State. It is the first time four different Black Knights have had at least one 100-yard game in the same season since 1999 (5).

- ▶ Junior RB Raymond Maples (5th, 134.20), sophomore FB Larry Dixon (t-35th, 92.00) and senior QB Trent Steelman (46th, 86.20) are all ranked in the nation's top 50 in rushing. The Black Knights are the only team with three players among the nation's top 50.
- ▶ The trio is averaging 312.4 rushing yards per game. That would place them third in this week's national team rushing rankings (not counting Army).

TOTALLY OFFENSIVE

- ▶ The Black Knights posted 595 yards of total offense in its win over Boston College. It was the seventh best total in Academy history and the most versus a current Football Bowl Subdivision opponent.
- ▶ It was Army's highest offensive output since going for 631 yards against Colgate on Nov. 18, 1989.
- ▶ Army has won five of its last six games when reaching the 500-yard mark. It's only loss in that span was to Wake Forest earlier this season.

SCOREBOARD WATCHING

- ▶ The Black Knights suffered a rare defeat when reaching the 40-point mark in its 41-40 loss to Northern Illinois. The loss snapped Army's eight-game winning streak when scoring at least 40 points.
- ▶ The Black Knights have scored at least 21 points 23 times since the start of 2009, posting a 13-10 record which accounts for 81 percent of the team's 16 victories in that span.

STEELMAN TOPS ON ARMY QUARTERBACK LISTS

- ▶ Senior QB Trent Steelman rushed for three touchdowns in the win over Boston College to break the Army record for career rushing scores by a quarterback. Steelman's 36 career touchdowns not only is tops among Black Knight quarterbacks, but sits third all-time at West Point regardless of position. Steelman trails only Glenn Davis (43) and Mike Mayweather (37).
- ▶ Steelman now holds nearly every major Army quarterback rushing record. He is first in rushing yards (2,503), rushing attempts (628) and touchdowns. He also is the highest-scoring Army quarterback in history with 218 points.

MAPLES HOPING FOR ENCORE PERFORMANCE

- ▶ Raymond Maples ran for 1,066 yards last season, the ninth best total in Academy history.
- ▶ Maples is off to a fast start in his quest for a second 1,000-yard season. Through five games, he ranks fifth in the nation at 134.2 rushing yards per game.
- ▶ Maples has 671 yards entering this weekend's games. He needs to average just 47.0 yards per game to reach the 1,000-yard mark for the second straight year.
- ▶ Only two Army players — Mike Mayweather (3) and Carlton Jones (2) — have rushed for 1,000 yards in at least two consecutive seasons.

BIG PLAY RAY

- ▶ Raymond Maples averaged 7.3 yards per carry in 2011, the highest average in Army history among runners with at least 100 carries in a season.
- ▶ Maples is averaging 6.5 yards per carry through the first three games this season, needing only 104 carries to gain 671 yards.
- ▶ For his career, Maples is averaging 6.55 yards per carry, which ranks third behind only Glenn Davis (8.26) and Tommy Bell (6.67) on Army's career list among those with at least 100 rushing attempts.
- ▶ Including his receiving and kickoff return numbers, Maples averages 7.01 yards every time he touches the ball. He owns a career 14.7 yards-per-reception average (6-88) and 16.2 yards-per-kick return average (10-162).

CLOSING IN ON A MILESTONE

- ▶ Raymond Maples has accumulated 1,945 rushing yards. His career-high 184 yards against Boston College pulled him within 47 yards of cracking the Black Knights' all-time top 10, and just 55 yards from becoming the 10th member of Army's 2,000-yard club.

B-BACK GETS A-PLUS GRADE

- ▶ Sophomore FB Larry Dixon has started 10 straight games, which ranks as Army's longest current streak of consecutive starts. Dixon made his first career appearance with the No. 1 offense last season against Fordham.
- ▶ In those 10 games, Dixon is Army's second-leading rusher. He has run for 787 yards and nine touchdowns on 127 carries. He is averaging 6.2 yards per attempt in that span.
- ▶ Dixon has found the end zone in seven of his 10 starts, and has three 100-yard games during those outings.
- ▶ Dixon is second on the team through the first five games this season with 560 rushing yards and five touchdowns. He is one of three Army players to average 6.0 yards or better on at least 25 carries.

BROWN RETURNS TO THE BACKFIELD

- ▶ Senior Malcolm Brown returned to his roots at Wake Forest, lining up in the backfield as one of Army's three running backs. Brown started the season as a wide receiver. He played running back during his first three seasons.
- ▶ Brown matched his career high with 12 rushing attempts. He totaled 79 rushing yards in his first game back at his initial position. He also caught one pass for 19 yards out of the backfield.
- ▶ In his first three games back at running back, Brown has rushed 25 times for 161 yards and is averaging 6.4 yards per carry.

LAIRD MOVES TO FRONT OF RECEIVING LINE

- ▶ Junior WR Patrick Laird made a career-high three catches for 42 yards in the win over Boston College. In the last two weeks, he has caught five passes for 82 yards. He had a career best 33-yard catch versus Stony Brook.
- ▶ Laird jumped to the top of Army's receiving chart. He leads the team with six catches and ranks second with 91 yards. He entered the season with two catches for 23 yards in his career.
- ▶ Five of Laird's six catches have gone for first downs, including both of his third down receptions.

LAWRENCE MAKES ANOTHER BIG CATCH

- ▶ Sophomore WR Chevaughn Lawrence has caught a pass in each of the last three games, including a 28-yard reception against Boston College
- ▶ Lawrence had a career-long 45-yard catch at Wake Forest. It stands as Army's longest completion of the season.
- ▶ Lawrence has four catches and leads the team with 98 receiving yards. He is averaging a team-high 24.5 yards per catch. He has two of Army's four pass receptions of at least 20 yards.

WILLIAMS MAKES FIRST CAREER CATCH

- ▶ Junior WR Scott Williams accounted for Army's lone reception against Northern Illinois. It was the first catch of his career.
- ▶ Williams was converted to wide receiver during preseason camp. He played his first two seasons as a running back.

ARMY SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SPECIAL TEAMS SCORING

- ▶ San Diego State's Colin Lockett returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown in the season opener.
- ▶ Dating back to the start of the 2007 season, the Black Knights have lost nine straight games when allowing a special teams touchdown.
- ▶ Army's last special teams touchdowns came versus Temple on Sept. 29, 2007. Corey Anderson returned the opening kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown and Jeremy Trimble returned a punt 85 yards for a score against the Owls.
- ▶ Army has gone 324 kickoffs and 259 kickoff returns without a touchdown.
- ▶ The Black Knights have gone 257 punts and 95 punt returns without a score since Trimble's touchdown.

GROCHOWSKI NO SLOUCH

- ▶ Freshman Daniel Grochowski had his first career multi-field goal game against Boston College, going 2-for-3. His first kick of the game was a career-long 46-yard field goal to end the first half.
- ▶ Grochowski's 46-yarder against the Eagles was the longest by an Army player since Alex Carlton hit a 49-yarder in 2010.
- ▶ Grochowski is 11-for-13 on extra point tries this season.
- ▶ Grochowski has made a field goal in each of the last three weeks. He hit his first career field goal try, knocking in a 21-yarder on the final play of the first half at Wake Forest.
- ▶ Grochowski is not the only freshman to come out on the field as part of the FG/PAT unit. Long snapper Andrew Ellerson and holder A.J. Schurr are both in their rookie seasons.

LEADERS ON AND OFF THE FIELD

- ▶ The Army football team is well represented among the cadet leadership this school year. Senior DB Brandon Whittington is serving as the First Captain of the United States Corps of Cadets, the highest position in the West Point cadet chain of command, for the 2012-13 school year.
- ▶ In addition, senior P Chris Boldt is the First Regimental Commander, giving the team two of the top seven leadership positions.
- ▶ As First Captain, Whittington is responsible for the overall performance of the approximately 4,400 member Corps of Cadets.
- ▶ He follows in the footsteps of other notable First Captains such as John J. Pershing, Douglas MacArthur and Pete Dawkins.

ARMY DEFENSIVE NOTES

THE MAGIC NUMBER

- ▶ Army won its 15th straight game when holding an opponent to 14 points or less in its 55-0 win over Fordham last season. The last time the Black Knights allowed 14-or-fewer points and lost was Sept. 2, 2006 in a 14-6 loss at Arkansas State. Since 2000, Army is 18-2 when holding opponents to no more than 14 points. Since the start of the 1996 season, Army is 32-7 when the opponent tallies 17 or less.
- ▶ Army's 34-31 win against Boston College was a rare feat for the Black Knights. It was only the 21st time in the last 17 seasons (since 1996) Army has won a game in which it gave up more than 17 points (21-120). It was Army's first win when allowing an opponent to score at least 30 points since a 42-35 victory at USF on Oct. 16, 2004. The win snapped Army's 39-game losing streak when giving up 30-or-more points.
- ▶ The Black Knights' 49-37 defeat at Wake Forest was their 40th straight defeat when allowing at least 40 points. The last time Army won a game when its foe scored more than 40 was a 59-52 double-overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 7, 1999.

GET OFF THE FIELD

- ▶ Much like the offense, distance generally dictates third-down success. In the last 40 games, the Black Knights have allowed their opponents to convert only 27.1 percent of their third downs when the line to make is at least seven yards away (69-255). Conversely, when Army's opponent has three-or-fewer yards to go, they are converting at a 75.0 percent clip.

TAKING VICTORIES

- ▶ Army did not force a turnover in the loss at Wake Forest, falling to 2-14 in its last 16 games without forcing an opponent turnover.
- ▶ The Black Knights' last win without a takeaway came last season against Northwestern (21-14).
- ▶ Army is 10-2 when forcing at least three turnovers and 6-24 with two-or-less takeaways since the start of the 2009 season.

DIALING UP THE PRESSURE

- ▶ Army had a season-high five sacks in the win over Boston College. The Black Knights entered the game with six quarterback takedowns through the first four games.
- ▶ Army has had five sacks in each of its last two wins against Football Bowl Subdivision opponents. The Black Knights got to Tulane's quarterback five times in its 45-6 win last season.
- ▶ Since the start of 2009, the Black Knights' defense is averaging 2.4 sacks per game in its 16 victories and 1.5 sacks per game in its 26 losses.

ARMY'S LOSS LEADER

- ▶ Senior LB Nate Combs has made himself at home in the opponents' backfield this season. Through five games, he has a team-leading 6.0 quarterback sacks and 8.0 tackles for loss.
- ▶ Combs has had multiple sacks in four of his last six games. He ended last season with a two-sack game versus Navy, and has had two sacks against San Diego State, Stony Brook and Boston College.
- ▶ Combs had a career high 3.0 tackles for loss against the Seawolves.
- ▶ Combs leads the Black Knights with 8.0 tackles for loss and has six of Army's 11 sacks. Both totals have already surpassed his 2011 season totals of six tackles for loss and three sacks.

BACON HAS CAREER DAY VERSUS SEAWOLVES

- ▶ Sophomore LB Geoffery Bacon made a career-high 14 tackles against Stony Brook. His previous best was 13 against Vanderbilt last season.
- ▶ Bacon has reached double figures in tackles in two of the last three games. He had 11 stops at Wake Forest.
- ▶ The Milwaukee native leads the Black Knights with 48 stops through five games.

ROOKIES GET STARTING NODS

- ▶ Army has started three freshmen on defense in each of the last three games. Chris Carnegie (CB), Brandon Fusilier-Jeffries (FS) and Alex Meier (LB) started against Wake Forest and Stony Brook. Carnegie and Meier were joined by T.J. Atimalala (DL) versus Boston College. Fusilier-Jeffries missed the game against the Eagles with a concussion.
- ▶ Fusilier-Jeffries leads the group with 23 stops, including a career-high 15 tackles at Wake Forest. It was the highest tackle total by an Army player this season. For the season, he is second on the team with 32 tackles, and is tied for the team lead with 20 solo stops.
- ▶ Carnegie has 17 total tackles, nine of which against Stony Brook.
- ▶ Meier has 24 stops, the fourth best total on the team.
- ▶ Atimalala has two tackles in three games played.

Since taking charge of the Army football program prior to the 2009 season, **Rich Ellerson** has been dedicated to the mission of reviving

the Black Knights' storied history. In just three seasons, he has put Army on the path back to prominence, and has the program poised for excellence for years to come.

In addition to winning Army's first bowl game since 1985 in just his second season, Army football players have continued to make their mark in the classroom under Ellerson. Army has had four CoSIDA Academic All-American selections since 2009, including three first-team honorees. Andrew Rodriguez and Zach Watts were both first-team choices in 2011, marking the first time Army had multiple players on the first team since 1957.

One of the nation's true triple-option experts, Ellerson agreed to become Army's 36th head football coach on Dec. 26, 2008.

Ellerson is a veteran of nearly 30 years of coaching on the collegiate ranks, including eight as head coach at Cal Poly prior to his arrival at West Point. Not regarded as a traditional FCS power prior to Ellerson's arrival in 2001, Cal Poly finished each of his last four years ranked in the Top 25 of national FCS polls. The Mustangs won at least seven games during each of Ellerson's last six seasons at the helm and spent the majority of the 2008 season ranked in the top 10 of both the FCS Coaches Top 25 Poll and The Sports Network Division I-AA Poll. Cal Poly was ranked No. 3 in the FCS Coaches Poll for the final seven weeks of the regular season (and

the last four weeks of The Sports Network Poll) before they were upset in the first round of the FCS playoffs by Weber State on Nov. 29. Before Ellerson's arrival, the Mustangs had not fashioned a winning season since 1997 and had enjoyed only three winning years since 1990.

It didn't take long for Ellerson to prove he was the right choice to revive the Army program. A finalist for the 2010 Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award, Ellerson produced more victories in his first two seasons (12) than any Army coach since Tom Cahill won 16 games during the 1966 and 1967 seasons.

In his first season on the banks of the Hudson, he led the squad to a 5-7 record, the most wins for the program in 13 seasons and came just one win shy of Army's first bowl berth since the 1996 Independence Bowl. It took little time for Ellerson's triple-option offense and double-eagle flex defense to prove their effectiveness. Army finished the 2009 season ranked 16th in the nation in rushing offense (203.6 yards per game) and 16th in the NCAA in total defense (304.7 yards per game).

The Black Knights built on that success in 2010, posting a 7-6 mark and winning the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. Army's triple option produced the nation's eighth-ranked rushing attack (251.62 yds/game), while its 3,271 total rushing yards were the 10th most in program history. Defensively, the Black Knights ranked third in the nation in turnover margin (+1.23/game) while keeping five opponents to 21 points or less.

Ellerson, who turned 57 on New Year's Day, was born on Jan. 1, 1954, in Yokohama, Japan, while his father was stationed there. He and his wife, Dawn, have four children: Sean, 33, Shea, 29, Leta, 26, and Andrew, 19, and one granddaughter, Betty, 3.
