ARMY-NAVY HEADLINES

- Army and Navy will square off for the 113th time December 8 at Philadelphia's Lincoln Financial Field. The game returns to its most-played city after a one-year hiatus in the the Washington, D.C. area. Eighty-three (83) of the 112 previous contests have been played in Philadelphia.
- This year's game will serve as the deciding contest for the 2012 Commander In Chief's Trophy. For the first time since 2005 both teams enter the game with wins over Air Force. The Black Knights have not hoisted the hardware since 1996.
- The Dec. 8 showdown will feature two of the top six rushing offenses in the nation this season. The Black Knights lead the country with 369.82 yards per game on the ground, while Mids are sixth at 285.45 rushing yards per contest.
- As a team, Army has run for 4,068 yards. It is the second-highest total in Academy history behind last year's record total of 4,158. Army's per-game average is on pace to break the record of 359.8 that has stood since the 1945 season. The Black Knights need 251 yards against Navy to break the rushing average mark.
- The Black Knights enter the annual rivalry match up with two 1,000-yard rushers. It is just the second time in Academy history Army has had two players reach the millenium mark. Senior QB Trent Steelman leads the team with 1,152 yards, a record for Black Knight quarterbacks, while junior RB Raymond Maples is second with 1,059 yards. The last Army duo to both reach the 1,000-yard mark was Doug Black and Nate Sassaman in 1984.
- Steelman and Maples enter the final game of the season as Army's second most productive tandem ever. They have combined for 2,211 yards this season second only behind Mike Mayweather (1,338) and Willie McMillian (900) gained 2,238 yards in 1990.
- Steelman, on track to become the first modern era Army quarterback to start four times versus Navy, is on a record-setting run for the Black Knights. He has reached the 100-yard rushing mark in each of the past five games, breaking the Academy mark for consecutive 100-yard outings. Steelman ha seven 100-yard games this season. A 100-yard effort against Navy would tie the Black Knights' single-season record of eight currently held by Mayweather (1990).
- Steelman rushed for three touchdowns last time out against Temple to break the Black Knights' career record. The senior signal caller has found paydirt 44 times in his career, breaking the old record of 43 set by 1946 Heisman Trophy winner Glenn Davis.
- Maples' 1,000-yard season also puts him in select company. The Philadelphia native is just the third player in Army history to rush for 1,000 yards in at least two straight seasons. Mayweather did it three times (1988-90), while Carlton Jones was the last to accomplish the feat (2004-05).

A WIN VS. NAVY WOULD ...

- Snap Army's two-game losing streak since defeating Air Force.
- Give Army possession of the Commander In Chief's Trophy for the first time since 1996.
- End the Black Knights' 10-game losing streak against the Mids.
- End Army's 12-game losing streak in games played away from West Point.
- Be the Black Knights' first win at Lincoln Financial Field (0-9).
- Be Head Coach Rich Ellerson's 18th win at West Point (17-31).

SCOUTING THE MIDSHIPMEN

- ▶ Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo is in his fifth season on the Mids' sideline. He has posted a 39-25 record during his tenure and guided the Mids to four bowl games, including this season. He owns a 4-0 record against the Black Knights. Niumatalolo and Army head coach Rich Ellerson are quite familiar with one another. During Ellerson's stint as Hawaii's defensive coordinator from 1987-91, Niumatalolo lettered three times at quarterback for the Warriors.
- ▶ Navy scored a 21-10 victory versus Texas State in its final game before Army on Nov. 17. The Mids took a 14-0 lead on two touchdown runs by Noah Copeland and never trailed by less than two scores for the remainder of the game. Gee Gee Greene added a 10-yard scoring run to cap the Mids' scoring. Navy ran for 407 yards in the contest, led by Copeland's 110. Greened added 71 rushing yards, while Darius Staten averaged 9.7 yards per carry (68 yds./7 att.). Defensively, Matt Warrick led the team with nine tackles. Keegan Wetzel and Kwazel Bertrand each had two tackles for loss in the victory.
- ▶ Navy boasts the nation's sixth-best rushing offense at 285.45 yards per game. The Midshipmen average 394.09 yards and 25.45 points per game.
- ▶ Navy has three players that have run for at least 500 yards this season. Greene is team's top ground gainer with 750 yards on just 104 attempts (7.2 per rush). He has three rushing scores, and is one of 10 different players to have scored a touchdown on the ground. Copeland has run for 592 yards and four scores, while rookie QB Keenan Reynolds owns 585 yards and a team-leading nine rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ Reynolds has played in all 11 games, starting the last six outings. he has completed 57.5 percent of his throws (46-80) for 754 yards and eight touchdowns versus just one interception. Trey Miller started the season as the Mids' signal caller and has thrown for 376 yards and a score, completing 34 of his 58 throws.
- ▶ Brandon Turner has been the most frequent target in the passing game, catching 19 passes for 248 yards and three scores. Greene has 14 receptions and leads the team with 280 yards. He also has two scores through the air. Shawn Lynch (13), Casey Bolena (13) and Copeland (10) all have double-digit receptions.
- ▶ Defensively, Navy is allowing 386.27 yards and 23.55 points per game. Tra'ves Bush leads the team with 76 tackles and is tied for the team lead with four pass breakups. Keegan Wetzel leads the team with 13.5 tackles for loss, including six quarterback sacks. Matt Warrick has 73 tackles and a team-high three interceptions.
- ▶ On special teams, Nick Sloan has handled the placekicking duties. he is 9-for-13 on field goal tries with a long of 41. Pablo Beltran is averaging 45.1 yards per punt, but has been called on just 34 times in 11 games.
- ▶ Marcus Thomas is the team's top kick returner, averaging 23.0 yards per attempt. Lynch has been the Mids' primary punt returner, taking 11 kicks back for 103 yards (9.4).

THE ARMY-NAVY SERIES

- ▶ While Army enjoyed the upper hand against Navy during the majority of the decade of the 1990s, Navy has turned the tide in recent years. The Midshipmen have captured 13 of the last 15 meetings, including the past 10, to grab a 56-49-7 advantage in the classic rivalry. The Mids' current 10-game winning streak is the longest in the series by either academy.
- ▶ Hard-fought Army victories were commonplace in the 1990s, with the Black Knights prevailing in seven of those 10 matchups. Those seven Army victories came by a TOTAL of just 24 points, with an amazing six-game stretch of Cadet wins decided by a TOTAL of only 14 points. The point differential over the course of the 112-game series stands at a rather microscopic 329 points (an average of 2.9 points per game). That figure stood at 92 entering the 2002 contest, but Navy has outscored Army 346-112 the last 10 years. The Mids blasted Army 58-12 in 2002, setting a series-record scoring total in the process, then followed with 34-6, 42-13, 42-23, 26-14, 38-3 and 34-0 victories. The series has become more competitive in the last three seasons with the Mids earning wins by the count of 17-3, 31-17 and 27-21. Last season's six-point margin was the closest since since Navy's 30-28 victory in 2000.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS

- ▶ The 2012 contest is the fourth in the 10-year agreement that CBS Sports announced in 2008, extending its broadcast rights to one of the greatest rivalries in all of sports, the annual Army-Navy football game, through the 2018 season. As part of the new agreement, the game is being played on the second Saturday in December to conclude college football's regular season.
- ▶ Future dates include Dec. 14, 2013, Dec. 13, 2014, Dec. 12, 2015, Dec. 10, 2016, Dec. 9, 2017 and Dec. 8, 2018.

USAA CONTINUES PRESENTING SPONSORSHIP

- ▶ The United States Military Academy and United States Naval Academy announced in July 2009 that financial services leader USAA signed a 10-year agreement to be the presenting sponsor of the annual Army-Navy football game. USAA is among the premier providers of banking products, insurance, investments, and financial planning to current and former members of the U.S. military and their families - including the Cadets and Midshipmen from the two academies.



ARMY AT LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD

- ▶ The annual Army-Navy tilt will be the Black Knights' 10th appearance at Lincoln Financial Field.
- ▶ The Black Knights have never won in the facility. Army is 0-7 in the previous Army-Navy games played at Lincoln Financial Field, and lost to Temple during the 2009 and 2011 seasons.
- ▶ Army's last win in the City of Philadelphia was in 2001. That game was the last Army-Navy tilt contested at Veteran's Stadium.

ARMY-NAVY MISCELLANY

- ▶ The Army-Navy series has been tied on 13 occasions (five times since 1979). The most recent tie prior to 2005 came entering the 1992 pairing (43-43-7).
- ▶ Until winning in 1980 to break a 37-37-6 stalemate, Navy had not led in the series standing since 1921, after just the 24th meeting between the academies. Prior to its current advantage (55-49-7), Navy last held a lead in the series following its 24-3 victory in 1991.
- ▶ Army-Navy games have been contested annually since 1930 when the series resumed following a two-year layoff.
- ▶ In 1996, Bill Clinton became the first sitting United States President since Gerald Ford in 1974 to attend the Army-Navy Classic. Ford had been the most recent U.S. President since John F. Kennedy in 1962. President George W. Bush attended the 2001, 2004 and 2008 games in Philadelphia.
- ▶ Nine of the last 24 meetings between Army and Navy have been decided by five points or less. Six of the last 23 pairings have been decided by two points or less. Eight of the last 22 have been decided in the game's final minute.
- ▶ Navy's current 10-game winning streak versus Army is the longest in the history of the series. Teams have boasted five-game winning streaks on five different occasions (two by Army, three by Navy). Army authored its most recent five-game series winning streak, defeating Navy five straight times from 1992 through 1996. The Black Knights captured those five contests by a TOTAL of 10 points.
- ▶ The Mids have won the last 10 encounters in very convincing fashion, outscoring Army 346-112 in those showings. Navy posted the series' most lopsided back-to-back victories in 2002 and 2003, winning those contests by a total of 74 points.
- ▶ The Army-Navy rivalry became just the 12th Division I-A series to join the "Century Club" when the teams battled for the 100th time in 1999.

THE LAST MEETING — NAVY 27, ARMY 21 (DEC. 10, 2011)

LANDOVER, Md. — Navy kicked two field goals in the final quarter and held off Army, 27-21, in the 112th meeting in front of a crowd of 80,789 fans at FedEx Field.

Army twice battled back from deficits, but Navy was able to secure two field goals in the final stanza and topped the Black Knights.

Army led in several offensive categories, including rushing yards (298-296) and passing yards (77-13) but was hurt by three fumbles that led to 17 Navy points.

Malcolm Brown and Raymond Maples both rushed for 82 yards to pace Army offensively with Brown scoring a rushing and receiving touchdown. Quarterback Trent Steelman completed 4-of-6 passes for 77 yards and rushed for 62 yards and a touchdown.

Steve Erzinger led the Army defense with 11 tackles, while Nate Combs posted two sacks, nine tackles and a fumble recovery.

The two teams traded turnovers in the first quarter. Army's Jacob Drozd forced a Navy fumble that was recovered by Combs. Three plays later, Tuani Jabaree scooped up a loose ball at the Army 26. Kriss Proctor scored from four yards out two plays later for a 7-0 Navy lead with 2:56 left in the first quarter. Proctor rushed for 97 yards and a pair of scores and completed one of three passes.

The Midshipmen took advantage of Army's second turnover for a 14-0 lead. Navy marched 55 yards in seven plays capped by Alex Teich's 10-yard scoring run after an Army fumble. Teich carried 18 times for 93 yards.

Army cut its deficit in half late in the second quarter. Steelman broke off a 34-yard scoring run and the PAT made it a 14-7 contest with 3:34 left in the first half. The Black Knights knotted the score with under a minute remaining in the first half on a nine-yard run by Brown.

Navy took a 21-14 lead when Proctor capped the opening drive of the second half with a two-yard scoring run at the 12:43 mark of the third quarter. Army again answered with a Stellman to Brown scoring pass.

Navy broke the tie three minutes into the final quarter when Jon Teague converted a 23-yard field goal. Teague set the final margin with a 44-yard field goal less than two minutes later.

ON THE MARGIN

- ▶ After its three-point win over Boston College, the Black Knights improved to 8-8 in games decided by seven points or less since the start of the 2009 season. Conversely, Army is 9-23 in that span when the margin of victory is at least eight points, including its 20-point win versus Air Force.
- ▶ Two of Army's last four wins over Football Bowl Subdivision foes have been by a touchdown or less.
- ▶ Army's 55-0 win over Fordham last season was the program's largest margin of victory since a 62-7 victory against VMI on Oct. 7, 2006. The Black Knights' 45-6 win over Tulane in 2011 was their largest victory over an NCAA FBS foe since a 49-7 win at Boston College on Oct. 21, 1995.
- ▶ The Black Knights' 41-21 win against Air Force was its largest margin of victory over the Falcons since 1980 (47-24) and its largest winning margin in a Commander In Chief's Trophy game since a 27-7 win over Navy in 1986.

FIRST HALF INDICATOR

- ▶ The Black Knights trailed Boston College at halftime, 24-17, snapping an 11-game losing streak when losing after two quarters. Prior to BC, Army's last such win was on Nov. 21, 2009 at North Texas. Army trailed the Mean Green 7-3, but scored a 17-13 victory.
- ▶ Since the start of 2009, Army is 13-8 when holding the lead into intermission. Conversely, the Black Knights are 2-18 in that same span when trailing at the half.
- ▶ Army has won just 12 games when it was either tied or trailing at halftime since the start of the 2002 season (12-85).
- ▶ The Black Knights own a 19-9 mark in their last 28 games when leading at the break, including its win over Air Force.

ARMY IN OVERTIME

- ▶ After playing just one overtime game between 1996 and 2005, Army has had seven games go to an extra session in its last 59 outings.
- ▶ Army's seven overtime games since 2006 is tied for fourth most in the nation during that span. East Carolina and Navy have played nine such games, while Buffalo has played eight OT games. The Black Knights are tied with Minnesota, Michigan State and Notre Dame at seven.
- ▶ Army lost its last overtime game, a 23-20 setback versus Rutgers on Oct. 16, 2010. Army is now 6-2 all-time in overtime. Army is 5-0 at Michie Stadium in overtime.
- ▶ Army has allowed just 16 points in its eight overtime games. Rutgers' game-winning score was the first time the opponent reached the end zone after regulation since Louisville scored a touchdown in the first overtime in 1999. It stopped a streak of seven straight overtime periods without allowing a touchdown.

THE RANK OF CAPTAIN

- ▶ Army junior Jarett Mackey was chosen as the Black Knights' "legacy" captain by last year's seniors during Army-Navy preparation. Mackey was chosen by that group as the best representative to carry on their voice and legacy.
- ▶ When the vote was taken, Mackey and the team believed 2012 would be his last season. He has since received a waiver from the NCAA to play in 2013. Mackey received medical leave from the Academy during the fall last year after suffering a knee injury in the opener at Northern Illinois.
- ▶ After rotating game captains through the first four weeks of the season, the Black Knights chose their permanent captains during preparations for Boston College. Senior QB Trent Steelman and senior LB Nate Combs were chosen to join Mackey as Army's 2012 team captains.

NO (TURNOVER) MARGIN FOR ERROR

- ▶ Turnover margin has been one of the best predictors of Army's success in recent seasons. Since the start of 2006, the Black Knights have posted a 16-6 record when winning the turnover battle. On the flip side, Army is 10-51 when the margin is negative or even.
- ▶ In its last 18 losses, Army is -20 in turnovers (-1.1). In their last five wins, the Black Knights are +5 in the turnover category.
- ▶ Army has lost only four games under Rich Ellerson when on the plus side of the turnover battle and just three times when holding at least a two-takeaway advantage. The Black Knights are 12-4 when winning the turnover margin under Ellerson.
- ▶ In Army's last 17 wins the Black Knights are averaging 2.9 takeaways and hold a +1.9 turnover margin average (50-18 overall). Conversely, in its last 31 losses, Army is averaging just 1.1 takeaways per game and is on the wrong end of a -0.81 turnover margin average (34-59 overall).
- ▶ Army is 2-16 in its last 18 games without forcing an opponent turnover.

- ▶ The Black Knights had an uncharacteristic seven penalties for 56 yards against Boston College. Both totals were season highs. It was the most penalty yards walked off against Army since last season versus Rutgers (59), and the most flags thrown against the Black Knights since being whistled eight times against Navy in 2010.
- ▶ Army has ranked in the top 35 in fewest penalties per game every season since 2006. The 34th-place showing (5.42/game) in 2009 is the only time in that span the Black Knights have finished outside the top 10.
- ▶ In its 17 wins since the start of 2009, Army has committed an average of 3.88 penalties for 33.47 yards per game (66-569). In the 31 losses in that same span, the Black Knights have committed 4.6 penalties per game for an average of 39.0 yards (143-1210).

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF

- ▶ Army rushed for a school record 4,158 yards in 2011. It was the first time in school history the Black Knights breached the 4,000-yard mark.
- ▶ The Black Knights are back on top of the national rushing chart, averaging 369.8 rushing yards per game through the first 11 outings.
- ▶ Army is on pace to break last season's rushing record. At its current rate, the Black Knights will rush more than 4,400 yards.
- ▶ The Black Knights have led the nation in rushing eight time since 1937. The last time they did it in consecutive seasons was 1944-45.

- ▶ Army ran the ball on 86 of its 90 offensive plays against Northern Illinois. It was the second-most rushing attempts in a game in Army history. The record is 88 attempts versus Holy Cross on Oct. 26, 1974.
- ▶ Since the start of 2009, Army the Black Knights are averaging 58.3 rushing attempts per game (2,800 att. in 48 games). That total accounts for 84.7 percent of Army's offensive plays in that span (2,800 rushes, 506 passes).
- ▶ Army is third in the nation with 739 rushing attempts. Air Force has run the ball 756 times in 12 games, and Georgia Tech has 745 carries in 13 games.

SPREAD THE WEALTH

- ▶ The Black Knights have had multiple 100-yard rushers an Academy record six times through the first 11 games.
- ▶ This season marked the first time Army started a season with three such outings. It is the first time since 1948 that the Black Knights accomplished the feat in three consecutive games.
- ▶ Junior RB Raymond Maples, sophomore FB Larry Dixon and senior QB Trent Steelman have each reached the 100-yard rushing mark in the same game twice this season. It is the first time Army had three players gain at least 100 yards in multiple games since the 1984 campaign.
- ▶ The Black Knights have had five players register at least one 100-yard game already this season. In addition to the three versus Northern Illinois, sophomore RB Terry Baggett posted his first 100-yard effort in the opener at San Diego State and junior FB Hayden Tippett tallied his first 100-yard game against Ball State. It is the first time five different Black Knights have had at least one 100-yard game in the same season since 1999 (5).

- ▶ The Black Knights have posted a 46.43 (78-168) conversion rate through 11 games. Army is 25th in the nation in third-down efficiency. If they can maintain the current rate, it would be the third consecutive year they were at 40.0 percent or better, a program first since doing it every year from 1984-96.
- ▶ Army is 26-for-52 on third down in the last three weeks. During the previous three weeks, the Black Knights were just 14-for-44 (.318).
- ▶ First down success has been key for Army's third-down conversion rate. The Black Knights are second in the country with 1,921 rushing yards on first down and are third in the nation with 6.12 yards per carry on first down.

STEELMAN TOPS ON ARMY QUARTERBACK LISTS

- ▶ Senior QB Trent Steelman ran for three touchdowns against Temple to extend his record for rushing scores by an Army quarterback and break the overall mark. Steelman's 44 career rushing touchdowns tops the old mark of 43 set by 1946 Heisman Trophy winner Glenn Davis.
- ▶ Steelman holds nearly every major Army quarterback rushing record. He is first in career rushing yards (3,224), season rushing yards (1,152), career rushing attempts (735), career touchdowns (44) and season touchdowns (16). He also is the highest-scoring Army quarterback in history with 268 points.

OTHER NOTABLES

- ▶ Sophomore WR Chevaughn Lawrence has caught a pass in nine straight games, the longest such streak since since Jeremy Trimble caught a pass in 22 straight during the 2006-07 seasons.
- ▶ Senior QB Trent Steelman and junior RB Raymond Maples connected on a 53-yard pass against Air Force. It was Army's longest passing play since the 2007 season.
- ▶ Steelman ran for 101 yards and threw for 100 yards against Air Force. It was his second career 100/100 game. The first was against Rutgers in 2010 (102 rushing/115 passing).

ARMY DEFENSIVE NOTES

THE MAGIC NUMBER

- ▶ Army won its 15th straight game when holding an opponent to 14 points or less in its 55-0 win over Fordham last season. The last time the Black Knights allowed 14-or-fewer points and lost was Sept. 2, 2006 in a 14-6 loss at Arkansas State. Since 2000, Army is 18-2 when holding opponents to no more than 14 points. Since the start of the 1996 season, Army is 32-7 when the opponent tallies 17 or less.
- ▶ Army has allowed 31 and 21 points in its two wins against Boston College and Air Force, respectively. Both wins could be considered rare feats. In the last 17 seasons (since 1996) Army has won a game in which it gave up more than 17 points just 22 times (22-124). The win against Boston College was Army's first win when allowing an opponent to score at least 30 points since a 42-35 victory at USF on Oct. 16, 2004. The win snapped Army's 39-game losing streak when giving up 30-or-more points.
- ▶ The Black Knights' 63-32 defeat versus Temple was their 42nd straight defeat when allowing at least 40 points. The last time Army won a game when its foe scored more than 40 was a 59-52 double-overtime win over Louisville on Oct. 7, 1999.

GET OFF THE FIELD

- ▶ Much like the offense, distance generally dictates third-down success. In the last 45 games, the Black Knights have allowed their opponents to convert only 28.2 percent of their third downs when the line to make is at least seven yards away (81-287). Conversely, when Army's opponent has three-or-fewer yards to go, they are converting at a 72.8 percent clip.

TAKING VICTORIES

- ▶ Army forced a season-high five takeaways in its win over Air Force. The Black Knights improved to 11-2 when forcing at least three turnovers. Conversely, Army is 6-29 with two-or-less takeaways since the start of the 2009 season.
- ▶ Army did not force a turnover in the loss to Temple, falling to 2-16 in its last 18 games without forcing an opponent turnover.
- ▶ The Black Knights' last win without a takeaway came last season against Northwestern (21-14).

ARMY'S LOSS LEADER

- ▶ Army welcomed back its top playmaker on defense in the win over Air Force. Senior LB Nate Combs injured his shoulder against Kent State and missed the Eastern Michigan and Ball State games.
- ▶ Combs came back with a vengeance, registering eight tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, a fumble recovery for a touchdown and his first career interception.
- ▶ In his nine games played, Combs has a team-leading 6.0 quarterback sacks and 12.0 tackles for loss. Both totals are career highs.
- ▶ Combs has had multiple sacks in four of his last 10 games. He ended last season with a two-sack game versus Navy, and has had two sacks against San Diego State, Stony Brook and Boston College.
- ▶ Combs had a career high 3.0 tackles for loss against the Seawolves.

BACON POSTS CAREER HIGH IN CONSECUTIVE WEEKS

- ▶ Sophomore LB Geoffery Bacon made a career-high 14 tackles against Stony Brook and matched that effort against Kent State and Eastern Michigan. He had a career-best 12 solo stops versus Kent State.
- ▶ Bacon has reached double figures in tackles in eight of the last nine games. He had 11 stops at Wake Forest, 13 tackles in the win over Air Force, 12 tackles at Rutgers and 10 stops against Temple.
- ▶ Bacon was named the Independent Defensive Player of the Week for his effort against the Falcons. In addition to his tackles, he also intercepted a pass.
- ▶ The Milwaukee native leads the Black Knights with 122 stops through nine games. He is seventh in the nation at 11.09 stops per game.

ROOKIES GET STARTING NODS

- ▶ Army has started at least three freshmen on defense in each of the last seven games. At least three of the quartet made up of Chris Carnegie (CB), Brandon Fusilier-Jeffires (FS) and Alex Meier (LB) and T.J. Atimalala (DL) have been in the lineup every week since Sept. 22.
- ▶ Fusilier-Jeffires leads the group with 83 stops, including a career-high 15 tackles at Wake Forest. It was the highest tackle total by an Army player this season. For the season, he is second on the team in both total tackles and unassisted tackles (42). He made his first career interception against Air Force.
- ▶ Meier has 61 stops, the third best total on the team. He registered his first career interception, snuffing out an Eastern Michigan drive on the goal line. He returned the ball 65 yards.
- ▶ Carnegie has 47 total tackles, nine of which against Stony Brook. He is fifth on the team.
- ▶ Atimalala made 1.5 tackles for loss, the first of his career, versus Kent State. He has seven total tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss.

OTHER NOTABLES

- ▶ Sophomore DT Robert Kough made a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss against Air Force.
- ▶ Army allowed Air Force only 103 rushing yards, its lowest total since the 2008 season. The Falcons entered the game No. 2 in the nation with more than 366 yards per contest. The Black Knights allowed only 108.0 rushing yards per game against Air Force and Rutgers.

ARMY SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SPECIAL TEAMS SCORING

- ▶ San Diego State's Colin Lockett returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown in the season opener.
- ▶ Dating back to the start of the 2007 season, the Black Knights have lost nine straight games when allowing a special teams touchdown.
- ▶ Army's last special teams touchdowns came versus Temple on Sept. 29, 2007. Corey Anderson returned the opening kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown and Jeremy Trimble returned a punt 85 yards for a score against the Owls.
- ▶ Army has gone 363 kickoffs and 285 kickoff returns without a touchdown.
- ▶ The Black Knights have gone 277 punts and 100 punt returns without a score since Trimble's touchdown.

OSTEEN TAKES OVER

- ▶ Senior Eric Osteen took over the placekicking duties against Temple. Osteen has served as Army's kickoff man for the last two seasons.
- ▶ Osteen made his first career field goal try, drilling a 37-yarder in the second quarter. He was 1-for-2 on his first two career PAT tries.
- ▶ This season on kickoffs, Osteen has 27 touchbacks on 50 kicks.

LEADERS ON AND OFF THE FIELD

- ▶ The Army football team is well represented among the cadet leadership this school year. Senior DB Brandon Whittington is serving as the First Captain of the United States Corps of Cadets, the highest position in the West Point cadet chain of command, for the 2012-13 school year.
- ▶ In addition, senior P Chris Boldt is the First Regimental Commander, giving the team two of the top seven leadership positions.
- ▶ As First Captain, Whittington is responsible for the overall performance of the approximately 4,400 member Corps of Cadets.
- ▶ He follows in the footsteps of other notable First Captains such as John J. Pershing, Douglas MacArthur and Pete Dawkins.

ACADEMIC HONORS

- ▶ Senior DE Zach Watts and junior DE Holt Zalneraitis have been selected to the Capital One Academic All-District I Football Team. It is the fourth straight season that Army has had two players selected Academic All-District.
- ▶ Limited to starters or key reserves with a 3.2 or better grade point average, the 27 All-District I honorees are now eligible for Academic All-America honors.
- ▶ Watts was a first-team Academic All-America selection in 2011. He is an engineering management major with a 3.46 GPA.
- ▶ Zalneraitis was honored for the first time. He owns a 4.01 grade point average in kinesiology.
- ▶ Army has had at least one player selected to the Academic All-District squad in each of the past five seasons, and has produced five Academic All-Americans in that span, including four in the last two seasons. Last year's two first-team selections was a program first since the 1958 season.

ARMY BRANCH DESCRIPTIONS

AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY - Officers lead, train, and employ Air Defense forces in support of military operations, primarily against enemy aircraft and missile attacks.

ARMOR - The job of this branch is to command, direct and control armored and/or combined arms organizations during mobile land combat operations.

AVIATION - The role of an officer in this branch is to direct and coordinate the employment of Army Aviation units in support of land combat operations.

FIELD ARTILLERY - In Field Artillery, officers coordinate for and employ Field Artillery and target acquisition means in support of military operations.

FINANCE - Finance provides the essential professional analysis of financial data necessary for the efficient use of the Army's money, material, and personnel resources.

INFANTRY - To lead, train, and employ infantry and combined arms forces in military operations on land.

QUARTERMASTER - A Quartermaster officer plans and directs the activities of Army units and organizations engaged in the acquisition, receipt, storage, preservation, and issue of equipment, repair parts, construction material, subsistence, petroleum products, water, and other general supplies.

SIGNAL CORPS - Providing rapid and reliable-information systems to support command and control of the Army's combat forces during both peace and war is the job of a Signal Corps officer.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

"Rich is an excellent football coach whose football mind speaks for itself. He's an individual that wants to be at West Point. He thinks there's something very important about Army winning on the football field as it carries over into the total military. I'm very high on Rich as a person, as a coach and as an individual that will do everything in his power to have a successful program at West Point."

Since taking charge of the Army football program prior to the 2009 season, **Rich Ellerson** has been dedicated to the mission of reviving

the Black Knights' storied history. In just three seasons, he has put Army on the path back to prominence, and has the program poised for excellence for years to come.

In addition to winning Army's first bowl game since 1985 in just his second season, Army football players have continued to make their mark in the classroom under Ellerson. Army has had four CoSIDA Academic All-American selections since 2009, including three first-team honorees. Andrew Rodriguez and Zach Watts were both first-team choices in 2011, marking the first time Army had multiple players on the first team since 1957.

One of the nation's true triple-option experts, Ellerson agreed to become Army's 36th head football coach on Dec. 26, 2008.

Ellerson is a veteran of nearly 30 years of coaching on the collegiate ranks, including eight as head coach at Cal Poly prior to his arrival at West Point. Not regarded as a traditional FCS power prior to Ellerson's arrival in 2001, Cal Poly finished each of his last four years ranked in the Top 25 of national FCS polls. The Mustangs won at least seven games during each of Ellerson's last six seasons at the helm and spent the majority of the 2008 season ranked in the top 10 of both the FCS Coaches Top 25 Poll and The Sports Network Division I-AA Poll. Cal Poly was ranked No. 3 in the FCS Coaches Poll for the final seven weeks of the regular season (and

the last four weeks of The Sports Network Poll) before they were upset in the first round of the FCS playoffs by Weber State on Nov. 29. Before Ellerson's arrival, the Mustangs had not fashioned a winning season since 1997 and had enjoyed only three winning years since 1990.

It didn't take long for Ellerson to prove he was the right choice to revive the Army program. A finalist for the 2010 Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award, Ellerson produced more victories in his first two seasons (12) than any Army coach since Tom Cahill won 16 games during the 1966 and 1967 seasons.

In his first season on the banks of the Hudson, he led the squad to a 5-7 record, the most wins for the program in 13 seasons and came just one win shy of Army's first bowl berth since the 1996 Independence Bowl. It took little time for Ellerson's triple-option offense and double-eagle flex defense to prove their effectiveness. Army finished the 2009 season ranked 16th in the nation in rushing offense (203.6 yards per game) and 16th in the NCAA in total defense (304.7 yards per game).

The Black Knights built on that success in 2010, posting a 7-6 mark and winning the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. Army's triple option produced the nation's eighth-ranked rushing attack (251.62 yds/game), while its 3,271 total rushing yards were the 10th most in program history. Defensively, the Black Knights ranked third in the nation in turnover margin (+1.23/game) while keeping five opponents to 21 points or less.

Ellerson, who turned 57 on New Year's Day, was born on Jan. 1, 1954, in Yokohama, Japan, while his father was stationed there. He and his wife, Dawn, have four children: Sean, 33, Shea, 29, Leta, 26, and Andrew, 19, and one granddaughter, Betty, 3.
