All-Tournament Honors

Scouting This Weekend's Competition/Series History:

Dayton Flyers:

The Flyers come to Tempe this weekend after an incredible 2007 season which saw them finish with a 33-2 record and advancing to the NCAA Second Round where they fell to Michigan State. While the Flyers lost their best outside hitter in Jaime-Lee Richards, RS sophomore Lindsay Fletemier, who was second behind Richards in kills will look to fill the gap. Assisting her will be senior setter and AVCA Honorable Mention All-American Erin Schroeder, who led the team with 1,465 assists last season. The Sun Devils have met Dayton only once before and pulled away victorious as they own a 1-0 record all-time against them.

South Carolina Gamecocks:

The Gamecocks head to the desert after a 2007 season that saw them go 14-15 overall. They come with experience though as they return top outside hitter, junior Ivana Kujundzic who collected 349 kills on the season as well as top setter, sophomore Jordan Bradosky. ASU has met SC three times in their storied history, but hold only a 1-2 record against them as they've won the last two meetings in 2001 & 2002 after ASU collected the first series win in 1999.

UNLV Rebels:

Fellow desert dwellers, UNLV take a trip to the Valley this weekend after a stellar season which saw them finish 24-6 overall with a Mountain West Conference Championship under their belt en route to a NCAA Tournament appearance where they were downed by Long Beach in the first round. While the leading Rebel Rousers in kills, Lauren Miramontes and Maria Aladjova graduated, the Rebels still return a strong line-up with senior setter Melody Nua ready to lead them. ASU met UNLV last year, but were unable to overcome the Rebels dropping their series history to 2-3.

Bring The Heat!

The Sun Devils will return their top two outside hitters, Sarah Reaves and Margie Giordano as they combined for 811 kills last season alone as they bring the heat to the net. Reaves returns for only her sophomore year after leading the 2007 squad in kills, something a Sun Devil froshie hasn't done since Christine Gardner in 1992. In addition to smashing some freshman ASU records, Reaves decided to break another ASU all-time record as she bested Juliana Escobar's 27 kills against Oregon in 2002 with 28 of her own, also against Oregon on Sept. 27.



Ready, SET, Go:

Marina Mercer returns for her junior season after two stellar seasons which saw her dish out 1,183 assists in 2006 and 1,277 in 2007, good for fifth place in ASU single-season records. Her career total of 2,460 also ranks seventh all-time in ASU career records...with two seasons left to better them.

Brains and Brawn These Girls Have It All:

The Sun Devil Volleyball team has proven year after year that they are some of the best on the court and also in the classroom. ASU holds the proud title of MOST Pac-10 All-Academic selections in history with 41 over every other Pac-10 school. They also have a eleven-year streak of at least one honor on the Pac-10 All-Academic team. Leading the list was Marina Mercer, who was named to the first-team as well as Danielle Fernandes and Kristen Trayser who also received honorable mentions. Last season, Marina Mercer was also named to the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA All-District Academic Second Team.

A Tough Schedule:

As always, ASU is set to face a tough slate for the 2008 season, their conference schedule alone sets the standard high in terms of RPI as the all-powerful Pac-10 who have captured 13 NCAA titles and 11 of the las 18. In both 2006 and 2007, THREE Pac-10 teams made it to the Final Four. The Sun Devils will go head-to-head with a Top 25 team nearly every week of the season. Currently six of the ten teams are ranked in the nation's top-11 teams.

Head Coach Jason Watson



Sun Devil Volleyball will usher in a new era in the 2008 season as Jason Watson takes the helm of the program in his first season as Head Coach.

Watson travels to Tempe after three stellar seasons at the helm of the Brigham Young University women's volleyball program, where he compiled a 74-18 (.804) overall record while leading BYU to three straight NCAA Tournament appearances. In only his first season as Head Coach, he was named the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year after leading his team to a 25-4 record, the program's best record since 1998. In addition to leading BYU to the MWC regular-season title, Watson also helped lead them back to the NCAA Tournament as well, where his teams have resided and succeeded in the last few years.

In 2007, he led the Cougars to a 24-8 overall record and finish in NCAA Regional Final (Elite 8) as well as a final national ranking of 12th and at one point in the

season as high a rank as ninth. No stranger to the best competition, Watson's teams have been ranked as high as eighth on RPI, showing the character and strength of the teams he builds and that they shy away from no challenge.

Prior to his head-coaching debut at BYU in 2005, Watson had amassed 11 years as an assistant coach at four universities. After an All-American playing career at BYU from 1990-1994, where he was a four-year starter and two-time captain, Watson coached for two years under his former coach, Carl McGown before beginning his career in women's volleyball with extremely successful stints at Kansas State, Arkansas State and Montana State.

In his first foray into women's volleyball in 1996 after completing his Bachelor's at BYU, Jason landed the Assistant Coach position at Montana State where he made an immediate impact working on the development of the offense and setters where he helped lead the Bobcats to a 19-12 record in 1997, their best finish since 1983.

After his stint at Montana State, Watson took a position as an assistant at Arkansas State University from 1998-2000 where he worked to train and develop offensive and defensive systems while also serving as the recruitment coordinator as well. In 1998 he helped collect a Sun Belt Championship with a record of 23-9 and in 1999 helped better the Indians record to a phenomenal 28-7 overall finish with yet another Sun Belt Championship as well as an NCAA First Round appearance.

In 2000, Watson took another Assistant Coach position at Kansas State, where after one year he was promoted to Associate Head Coach. While in Manhattan, Jason served as the offensive coordinator as well as assisting with recruiting. While at Kansas State, Jason enjoyed his first AVCA ranking as the 2000 team finished with a ranking of 16 and advanced to the NCAA Round of 16. In 2001 the Wildcats advanced to the NCAA Second Round and finished ranked 18th.

The end of 2002 saw Jason return to his alma mater where he joined the Cougar coaching ranks as an assistant where he worked closely with the Head Coach in development of the athletes and a Nationally Competitive schedule. He also served as the defensive coordinator, taking responsibility for the defensive systems, opponent scouting reports and coordinating team video meetings.

His success as an assistant for three years at BYU found him rewarded with his first Head Coaching position in 2005 where the rest, they say, is history.

Watson joins the ranks of successful coaches who can also boast an impressive playing career. While at BYU as a student-athlete, Watson was a four-year starter and two-time captain from 1990-1994. While donning the blue and white, Watson took a young program that in only its second year as a program was 2-25 overall to a 21-6 powerhouse and a No. 2 national ranking by his senior season. He still currently holds the BYU all-time and single game assist record. In 1993 he was

ASU: Heads into her senior year as one of the main staples to the ASU program, has been a leader offensively and defensively for the past three seasons...comes into this season with high expectations to lead the offensive power of the Sun Devils...earned Freshman All-Pac-10 Honors in 2005 as well as an All Pac-10 Honorable Mention last season.

2007 (Junior): Only player on the team to start every match and play in all 109 games on the season...was a mainstay in the line-up of the Sun Devils with 3.51 kills per game and 2.64 digs per game, second only to libero Sydney Donahue...collected 41 total blocks and was second on the team in points per game with a 3.88 average...tallied 383 kills on the year...tied her career-high of 23 kills in a match twice in the 2007 season...also received an Honorable

Mention on the All Pac-10 team.



2006 (Sophomore): Only player remaining on the team who played in all 31 matches last season, starting 28 of them...collected 328 kills on the year, good for third on the team, as well as a 2.90 kill per game average...had 28 service aces, second highest total on the team...had 393 digs, second only to Sydney Donahue and 43 total blocks...had a career-high 23 kills in a win over Washington St. (11/16)...also had a career-high 23 digs in a win over Butler (9/23).

2005 (Freshman): Earned Freshman All-Pac-10 Honors after appearing in all 28 matches with 26 starts...recorded her first career double-double in her second career match, collecting 17 kills and 13 digs at Cal State Northridge (8/26)...totalled 12 matches with ten or more digs...tallied nine double-doubles on the year...had 16 kills and 17 digs against Oregon State (9/24)...finished second on the team with 235 kills...averaged 2.53 kills per contest...second on team in digs with 236...compiled 28 service aces, second highest total on the team...blocked 23 total shots.

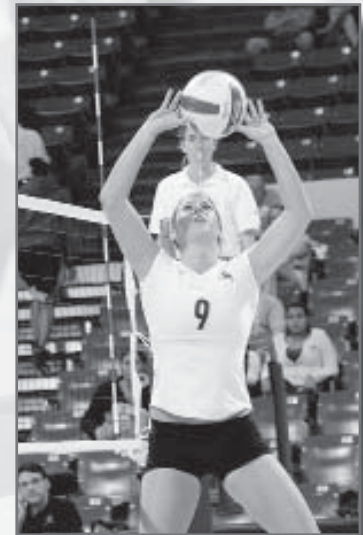
ASU: Junior setter who took the brunt of the setting duties in the 2006 season as a redshirt freshman and helped to lead the Sun Devils to their first NCAA appearance since 2002...will resume the starting setter duties ...an athletic setter who is a high-energy player... was a standout prep athlete at Chandler High School...named to the 2006 All Pac-10 Freshman Team as well as the Pac-10 All-Academic Team...named to the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District VIII second team and the Pac-10 All-Academic First Team as well in 2007.

2007 (Sophomore): Helped lead the team as the main setter all season leading Margie Giordano and Sarah Reaves to stellar a offensive season...was named to the Pac-10 All-Academic Team (first) for the second consecutive season as well as the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District VIII second team...had 1,277 assists on the season, good for fifth in ASU single-season records... finished sixth in the Pac-10 in assists per-game with a 12.40 average...led the team in service aces with a career-high 24 on the season...had a career-high 73 assists against Utah Valley on September 8, which is the second-highest total in ASU rally scoring history...tied her match-high of three aces against Oregon on Oct. 26...had 194 digs on the year as well as 53 total blocks.

2006 (RS Freshman): Had a phenomenal debut season coming off of a redshirt season in 2005 to take the bulk of the setting duties...was named to the All Pac-10 Freshman Team as well as named to the Pac-10 All-Academic Team...played in 31 matches, starting 28 of them...had 1183 assists on the season, while averaging 10.56 per game, good for eighth all-time in ASU single-season assist totals...had a career-high 62 assists in a four-game match against Washington St. (10/20)...also claimed 22 service aces, collecting a career-high of three in four separate matches...had 174 digs on the year as well as 51 total blocks.

ASU: Incredibly athletic outside hitter who is an in-state product of Glendale, Ariz...had an amazing freshman season where she led the team in kills, only the second freshman in program history to do so...set an ASU rally scoring record with her 28 kills against Oregon (9/27), besting former record-holder Juliana Escobar's 27 against Oregon on 10/18/02...received an All Pac-10 Honorable Mention as well as being named to the All Pac-10 Freshman Team in 2007.

2007 (Freshman): Saw action in 29 of ASU's 31 matches, starting 27 of them... led the team in kills as a freshman with 418 (4.14 per game), only the second time a Sun Devil freshman has led the team in kills in program history, last to do so was Christine Garner in the 1992 season...her 4.14 per game average placed her sixth in the Pac-10 by season's end...she collected a 4.62 points per game average, good for ninth overall in the conference as well...also amassed 19 service aces, good for fourth on the team...had 250 digs on the year (2.48 per game), placing her third on the team...had 48 total blocks, 11 of them solo...set an ASU rally scoring record against Oregon (9/27) with 28 kills, besting Juliana Escobar's record of 27 against Oregon in 2002...was named to the Pac-10 All Freshman Team as well as received an Honorable Mention on the All Pac-10 Team.

High School: A 2007 graduate of Ironwood High School in Peoria, Ariz... earned three varsity letters, captaining the squad in 2006... also earned four varsity letters in track & field, of which she was MVP of the team from 2004-2006... named MVP of the volleyball team in 2005 & 2006...holds the Ironwood career kills record and single-match kills record, as well as several track & field records...also played club ball for the Zia Athletic Club...lists beating Xavier in the state tournament in 2004 as her most exciting moment in sports.
