

A LOOK AHEAD...

TRAGEDY AT DUQUESNE: On the morning of Sept. 17, five Duquesne basketball players were shot following a dance on campus. Sam Ashaolu, Stuard Baldonado, Aaron Jackson, Shawn James, and Kojo Mensah attended the dance with a number of their teammates at the Duquesne Union prior to being assaulted by a pair of gunmen who were not Duquesne students. Jackson and James were treated and released within a day of the incident. Mensah was hospitalized for three days with wounds to his arm and shoulder. Baldonado, who was shot in the left arm and back, was hospitalized for five days. Ashaolu, who was shot in the head, remained hospitalized at press time (beginning of October).

NEW FACES: There will be a couple of familiar faces in new places when the 2006-07 season tips-off. Longtime Penn head coach Fran Dunphy moved across Philadelphia to take over at Temple. Dunphy, who was named head coach on April 10, spent 17 seasons at Penn, compiling a 310-163 (.655) record and 10 Ivy League titles while making nine trips to the NCAA Tournament. His Quaker teams won an unprecedented 48 straight Ivy League games and four league titles from 1992 through 1996. His 1993-94 team posted a 25-3 record and earned a No. 25 ranking in the CNN/USA Today coaches' poll. Over the last eight seasons, Dunphy guided Penn to six Ivy League titles and a 93-19 league record. From 1999-2001, the Quakers won 25 straight league games, including a perfect 14-0 mark in 1999-2000. This past season, Penn was 20-9, its fourth 20-win season in five years.

Across the state of Pennsylvania, Ron Everhart begins his tenure at Duquesne. Named head coach on March 29, Everhart comes to Duquesne with a reputation of turning around programs. At McNeese State from 1995-2001, Everhart ended a streak of six consecutive sub-.500 seasons by leading the Cowboys to a 15-12 mark in 1995-96. His seven-year stay culminated with a 22-9 record, the Southland Conference regular season title, and an NIT bid — the school's first postseason bid in 12 years. Everhart then moved on to Northeastern in 2002, where he inherited a program that averaged fewer than nine wins in the six seasons prior to his arrival and produced 19, 21 and 19 victories in each of the past three years. In his five seasons, the Huskies averaged 16.4 wins. His 2004-05 team, which finished second in the America East Conference with a 15-3 record (21-10 overall), went on to earn an NIT bid — its first postseason appearance in 14 years.

RETURN TO FORM: After placing four teams in the 2004 NCAA Tournament and seeing two of them advance to within a hair of the Final Four, the Atlantic 10 looks to return to that form. To do that, the league will rely on seven returning All-Conference players and nine of the league's top 20 scorers. Headlining the group are first-team honorees De'Angelo Alexander of Charlotte, Fordham's Bryant Dunston, Rashaun Freeman of Massachusetts, and Ian Vouyoukas of Saint Louis. Returning members of last season's All-Conference second-team are Xavier's Stanley Burrell, Carl Elliott of George Washington, and Dayton's Brian Roberts. Alexander is the league's leading returning scorer, having averaged 17.0 ppg in his debut season with the 49ers. Freeman, who pulled down 9.3 rebounds a game a year ago, leads 11 of the league's top 15 returning rebounders.

DRAFT DODGERS: George Washington's Carl Elliott and Saint Louis' Ian Vouyoukas withdrew from the NBA June draft and will return for their senior seasons. GW's starting point guard for the last three seasons, Elliott led the team in assists for the third straight year with 117 for an average of 3.9 assists per game. A second-team All-Conference pick, he also led the Colonials with 59 steals. Vouyoukas, the Billikens' Most Valuable Player, earned first-team All-Atlantic 10 honors and received the A-10's Chris Daniels Award as the league's most improved player. He ranked 14th in the A-10 in scoring at 13.9 points per game, sixth in rebounding at 7.4 rebounds per game, fourth in blocked shots at 1.9 blocks per game, and 13th in free throw percentage at .725.

STEPPING STONE: Three Atlantic 10 assistant coaches will be heading their own programs this season. Temple's Dan Leibovitz will lead Hartford, Monté Ross of Saint Joseph's is in charge at Delaware, and Benny Moss of Charlotte was named head coach at UNC Wilmington.

DID YOU KNOW...? Ten of the 14 head coaches in the Atlantic 10 have been in their current positions for less than five years. Brad Soderberg (SLU) is entering his fifth season; Brian Gregory (UD), Anthony Solomon (SBU), and Dereck Whittenburg (FOR) are in their fourth seasons; John Giannini (LAS) and Sean Miller (XU) are entering their third seasons; Travis Ford (UM) and Chris Mooney (UR) are in their second seasons; and Fran Dunphy (TU) and Ron Everhart (DUQ) are in their first seasons.

CHARLOTTE

CHARLOTTE OUTLOOK

The 49ers look to a restocked roster and a dangerous returning lineup to add increased pressure in the 49ers' classic up-tempo style.

First-team All-Atlantic 10 selection De'Angelo Alexander leads the 49ers' explosive offense. The 6-6 senior averaged a team-high 17.0 points and shot 43 percent from long range while leading the league in three-pointers made (3.0 per game). Junior shooting mate Leemire Goldwire, who ranked third in three-pointers (2.6 per game), also averaged in double figures (13.4 ppg). Add 6-9 senior forward E.J. Drayton, who returns from a medical red-shirt season, and Charlotte has the weapons to hit the ground running. With Alexander and Goldwire hitting from outside, a 49er player is likely to lead his league in three-pointers made for the ninth straight season - which just happens to correspond to head coach Bobby Lutz's tenure as 49ers head coach.

Underneath, the 49ers will need increased contributions from seniors Antwon Coleman and Courtney Williams to offset the loss of Curtis Withers, one of three players in 49ers' history to earn three first-team all-league honors in his career. Coleman gave the 49ers good energy and solid numbers (3.6 ppg, 3.4 rpg) despite averaging just 13 minutes a game. Williams (1.7 ppg, 2.1 rpg) has been ever-present in the practice gym and weight room over the summer, rededicating himself after averaging just 10 minutes as a junior. Coleman gives the 49ers size and shooting touch around the basket while the long-limbed Williams can be a defensive standout. Returnees Jerrell Jamison (6-5, G/F) and Jerrell Lewis (6-2, PG) saw limited time in their first seasons but give Lutz added experience.

Lewis, in particular, will battle newcomer Carlos Williams for the starting point guard slot. Williams (10.8 ppg) was considered the nation's top junior college point guard and has brought comparisons to all-time single-season assist leader Sean Colson. More perimeter offense will come from 6-9 shooter Sean Phaler (8.7 ppg), who was originally signed by UCLA before leading Fullerton College to a perfect 37-0 record last year. Charlotte's ranks will be fortified by true freshmen Charles Dewhurst (20.0 ppg, 9.0 rpg), Phil Jones (19.0 ppg, 12.0 rpg) and Ian Andersen (22.0 ppg, 7.1 rpg). Mississippi prep standout David Booker (27.0 ppg, 12.0 rpg) gives the 49ers a strong rebounder after being named Mississippi player of the year. Dewhurst hopes to join a long line of local products who enjoyed stellar careers with the 49ers, including Drayton, Withers, Jobey Thomas, DeMarco Johnson, and Byron Dinkins.

In Lutz's eight seasons, expectations have continually grown. And he would have it no other way. They've grown to the point that a ninth-straight postseason trip with a runner-up finish in league play will not be acceptable. So Lutz is not satisfied, not even with a season in which the Niners won 19 games, advanced in NIT play, and finished as runners-up in the Atlantic 10 Conference.

DAYTON

DAYTON OUTLOOK

The 2005-06 season began well for Dayton. The Flyers opened with an 8-3 record, which included a road win at Cincinnati and an overtime road loss at Creighton. However, injuries and disappointing production by players stepping into the void created by those injuries led to a 14-17 final record. Five of the wins and 11 of the losses came against postseason teams.

In 2006-07, Dayton returns four starters and its top three scorers as Brian Roberts, Monty Scott, and Norman Plummer look to lead a Flyers' resurgence.

In his first year as a starter, Roberts was named second-team All-Atlantic 10 last season. The 6-2 junior led the Flyers in scoring (16.0 ppg), minutes (33.4 mpg), and three-pointers made (68). Despite being a marked man, Roberts was seventh in the A-10 in scoring and was the only player in the A-10 among the Conference's top 10 in scoring (seventh) as well as the top dozen in assists (12th, 3.5 apg), three-pointers (eighth, 2.19 pg), field goal percentage (10th, .418), and three-point field goal percentage (sixth, .410).

Scott was Dayton's second-leading scorer (11.2 ppg) and rebounder (4.3 rpg) in 2005-06, despite missing six games and being limited in practices and games for much more than that with a stress fracture in his left foot. An All-Conference selection two years ago, there is little coincidence that the Flyers' fast start came with a healthy Scott starting at forward, and UD's struggles came after the injury.

Plummer averaged 6.5 rebounds a game to lead the team. He was also the Flyers' third-leading scorer at 10.0 ppg. The 6-7 junior joined Roberts on the Las Vegas Holiday Classic all-tournament team, tallying double-doubles in three of the four games.

The fourth starter is Charles Little. The 6-6 forward began his freshman year with a hamstring injury, but once it healed he showed why he was a finalist for Tennessee's Mr. Basketball. After averaging just 7.9 minutes, 2.7 points, and 1.7 rebounds a game in non-conference action, Little all but doubled his production in league play, picking it up to the tune of 18.1 minutes, 6.3 points, and 3.1 rebounds in A-10 action. A productive off-season in the weight room has reduced his body fat to six percent, with a squat of 450 pounds and bench press of 325, while keeping his vertical leap at 37.5 inches.

Dayton's quartet of newcomers - junior guard Andres Sandoval, freshman forward Kurt Huelsman, and freshman guards Marcus Johnson and London Warren - are an upgrade in talent and depth for head coach Brian Gregory. Sandoval started at Richmond two seasons ago, but left the Spiders when coach Jerry Wainwright took the DePaul job. After playing last year at Sante Fe Community College in Gainesville, FL, Sandoval will get the first shot at starting at point guard for the Flyers in 2006-07. The 6-10 Huelsman averaged 15.9 points and 9.0 rebounds last season, while Johnson, a 6-3 guard, posted 18.3 ppg and 7.3 rpg and the 6-0 Warren averaged 21.0 ppg and 7.5 apg.

DUQUESNE OUTLOOK

First-year head coach Ron Everhart wasted little time in putting his stamp on the Duquesne program as he completely overhauled the roster in his first 50 days on the job. Just two players from last year's 3-24 team, junior forward Kieron Achara and sophomore guard Aaron Jackson, will be back, and they'll be joined the largest recruiting class in NCAA Division I.

Everhart, who reversed the fortunes at both McNeese State and Northeastern in his two previous head coaching stops, has brought in 10 players in a situation similar to one he faced as a young assistant coach at Tulane in the late 1980s when he helped Perry Clark rebuild a Green Wave team from scratch after Tulane reinstated its basketball program.

"For an entire year as a young assistant coach I had the opportunity to only recruit," said Everhart to the *Pittsburgh Press* in May. "We did not compete, we did not play games, we did not prepare for opponents. I was thrown into a trial-by-fire situation that has helped me in every head coaching situation. It helped me understand the urgency by which you have to do this to fill out roster spots and to be able to put yourself in a position to be competitive."

That experience proved valuable as Everhart and his staff assembled a team in record time. The incoming 10 consists of five junior college players, four freshmen, and one transfer. There is one senior on the 2006-07 roster.

"We really concentrated on identifying players with athleticism and quickness," said Everhart who covered 6,200 air miles and visited a half-dozen states while not conducting on-campus visits during the 50-day span. "We looked for guys who could change direction and defend."

Everhart will put that athleticism and quickness to the test as he installs his preferred style of play.

"Our goal is to put a team on the floor that is intelligently aggressive," said Everhart. "We always want to be on the attack. We want our offense to create an up-tempo situation and create advantages. Defensively, we want to be on the attack at all times, play 94 feet. We want to use a disciplined and aggressive approach, which means we have to be the most physically fit, most well-conditioned, most mentally tough basketball team in this league."

Everhart's message reached Achara, who dropped nearly 15 pounds in Everhart's first two months on campus. The Stirling, Scotland native, who underwent surgery to repair a torn labrum in his left shoulder on December 15, steadily rehabilitated the shoulder over the spring in an attempt to regain the form that made him the 2004-05 Atlantic 10 Chris Daniels Award winner. Achara, who weighed 260 pounds in the three games he played last season, ranks second on the Dukes' career blocked shots list (81) and his 52.4 career shooting percentage ranks seventh all-time. He has scored in double digits 29 times with nine career double-doubles.

The 6-2 Jackson, who became a full-time starter in late December, averaged 31 minutes per game at the point guard spot. His 97 assists and 30 steals ranked second on the team and his 1.7-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio is best among Atlantic 10 returnees.

FORDHAM

FORDHAM OUTLOOK

Ever since Dereck Whittenburg took over as head basketball coach at Fordham three years ago, the Rams have been showing tremendous improvement each year. It started in the 2004-05 season when Fordham, which started three freshmen that year, won its first Atlantic 10 Championship game, and continued last year when the Rams went 16-16 for their first non-losing season since 1991-92. More importantly, Fordham has improved steadily in the Atlantic 10, going 9-7 last year for their first winning Conference record since joining the league in 1995-96. The Rams also advanced to the A-10 Championship semifinals for the first time ever.

The Rose Hill Gym was rocking again last year as the Rams sold out back-to-back games against Charlotte (when Fordham made its first ever appearance on ESPN) and George Washington. The back-to-back sellouts were the first for Fordham since 2002.

The Rams also did something in 2006 that they hadn't done in over 16 years — win a game in Philadelphia. When Fordham defeated Temple in the regular season finale, the Rams broke a 34-game losing streak in the city of Philadelphia dating back to the 1989-90 season. The win was also Whittenburg's 100th career coaching victory.

The Rams will be looking to improve upon their accomplishments, led by 6-8 junior forward Bryant Dunston, a 2006 first-team All-Atlantic 10 selection who averaged 16.1 ppg and 7.6 rpg while blocking 75 shots - all team highs. Dunston led the A-10 in field goal percentage, hitting 53.5 percent (174-325) of his shots, while also ranking among the league leaders in scoring (sixth), rebounding (fifth), blocks (second), and free throw percentage (.673, 18th).

Also back is 6-4 junior guard Marcus Stout, who averaged 13.0 ppg and 3.0 rpg while dishing out 91 assists and recording 36 steals a year ago. He ranked among the Atlantic 10 leaders in scoring (19th), assists (18th), and three-point field goal percentage (12th), hitting 48 of his 127 long-range attempts (.378).

Junior point guard Kevin Anderson and 6-7 junior forward Michael Binns are the other returning starters for the Rams. Anderson again displayed his defensive skills in 2005-06, leading the team with 40 steals — 13th best in the Atlantic 10 — while averaging 3.3 ppg and 2.3 rpg and handing out 71 assists. Binns, who started 31 of the 32 games last season, finished the year averaging 5.6 ppg and 4.2 rpg, the latter figure second best on the squad.

Other returning players Whittenburg is counting on include 6-8 junior forward Sebastian Greene (4.3 ppg, 3.3 rpg, 23 blocks), 6-5 sophomore Chris Bethel (2.6 ppg, 0.6 rpg) and 6-8 classmate Demetrius Phillips (1.0 ppg, 0.7 rpg), as well as 6-5 senior Dominic Osei (12 games played).

Whittenburg welcomes two freshmen who will look to make an impact: 6-2 guard Brenton Butler (16.0 ppg, 4.0 rpg) and 6-8 forward Dan Landisch (22.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg).

GEORGE WASHINGTON OUTLOOK

The defending A-10 regular season champion will have a decidedly new look when GW takes to the court in 2006.

The Colonials will feature just one returning starter in point guard Carl Elliott, 2006 Atlantic 10 Sixth Man of the Year Maureece Rice, redshirt senior Dokun Akingbade, and second-year transfer Regis Koundjia.

These returnees promise to use the experience gained from last year's historic 27-3 season and make 2006-07 an exciting ride for Colonials fans. With an emphasis on player development and with transfer Cheyenne Moore joining the fray, GW has lofty goals for this season, including a repeat appearance in the 2007 NCAA Tournament.

Elliott has started 89 of 90 GW games over the past three years and runs the Colonials' offense like the seasoned veteran that he has become. He was among the national leaders in steals per game with 2.63 spg as a sophomore and dished out a team-high 3.9 assists per game while scoring 11.5 points per outing as a junior last season. Rice will move into the starting backcourt this season. Rice, a sturdy 6-1, is a prolific scorer, averaging 12.6 ppg last season while averaging just under 26 minutes a contest.

The frontcourt took the biggest hit with the graduations of Pops Mensah Bonsu, Omar Williams, and Mike Hall. Koudjia, who transferred from LSU and began his Colonials' career after last year's first semester, became a valuable performer for head coach Karl Hobbs. Koudjia ended the season with averages of 4.8 ppg and 3.3 rpg.

Six-eight sophomore Rob Diggs also saw valuable time last year and averaged 1.7 ppg while seeing time in 26 games. Hobbs will also welcome 6-9 senior Dokun Akingbade back after he red-shirted last season.

Moore becomes eligible this season and should step in immediately to fill the void left by the Danilo Pinnoch, who was a second round selection in the NBA Draft. The 6-5 forward left Clemson after one season where he started 17 of 32 games as a freshman in 2004-05, averaging 19.5 minutes per game for the Tigers. A native of Baltimore, Moore posted 6.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game and added 51 assists. He also converted 39 three-pointers as a freshman and will have three seasons of eligibility at GW after sitting out last season.

In addition to Moore, Hobbs' staff signed a pair of athletic forwards in Damian Hollis (22.0 ppg, 11.0 rpg) and Hermann Opoku (5.0 ppg, 4.2 rpg), and point guard Travis King (18.4 ppg, 6.7 apg).
