SEC HIGHLIGHTS

* - SEC teams were 3-0 against non-conference foes during the fourth weekend of the season. For the season, the SEC is 22-3 (.880) against non-conference competition. The SEC currently has the nation's top non-conference winning percentage (.880).

* - After four weeks and 31 games at SEC stadiums, games have drawn 2,409,015 fans, an average of 77,710 fans per game. Stadiums have been filled to an average 97.97 percent capacity with 15 sellouts.

* - This week, the SEC has six teams ranked in the top 25 in of the USA Today Top 25 and AP polls, tied with the Big Ten for the most teams in the top 25 this week.

* - Since 1992, the SEC has had a least five teams ranked in the AP Top 25 a total of 218 times, an average of 11.4 times per year.

* - Two of the SEC's four intra-conference games this past weekend were decided by eight points or less. Since 2004, the SEC has had 49.5 percent of its games (151 of 305 total games) decided by 10 points or less - third of all FBS conferences .

* - For the 10th straight year, the SEC has led the nation in total number of former players on NFL opening weekend rosters. The SEC has 272 of its former players on opening weekend NFL rosters followed by the ACC at 228.

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

The head coach may challenge the ruling of any reviewable play. He retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The head coach will then have a single challenge that he may use anytime during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference has used instant replay since 2005.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including the ball in possession of a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
 - b. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
 - c. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by a player or an official
 - c. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
 - d. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
 - e. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
 - f. Quarterback (Passer) starts arm forward, ball comes loose and play is ruled incomplete (if ball is quickly recovered)
 - g. Quarterback (Passer) throws incomplete swing pass that is close to being forward or backward, and pass is ruled forward (if ball is quickly recovered)
3. Miscellaneous:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Runner ruled down (when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
 - c. Forward progress with respect to first down
 - d. Touching of a kick
 - e. Number of players on field
 - f. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with reviewed plays)
 - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays
 - h. Field Goal Attempts (only when ball is ruled below or above the crossbar, inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights.)
 - i. The game clock expires at the end of a half. If at the end of the game, the time may be restored to the clock only if the score is tied or the team that would next snap the ball trails by eight points or fewer.

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with the HD Instant Replay system provided by XOS Digital. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official and the Communicator are selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live HD video feed is sent directly to the replay booth from the TV truck. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while recording it into the XOS Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play while the Communicator marks all incoming replays.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Replay Technician. As the Technician and the Communicator mark the incoming video, each view will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Replay Technician can touch the thumbnail and immediately send that play or replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a jog shuttle remote controlled by the Replay Official. All video is viewed on an HD monitor that sits in front of the Replay Official. The touch screen is only used to select the replays and to log specific play data in the event a call is overturned.

While all plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the HD Replay System developed by XOS Digital of Orlando, FL. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from XOS Digital.

SEC FOOTBALL ON TELEVISION

CBS SPORTS

CBS Sports continues to be the exclusive national network broadcaster of SEC home football games, including the SEC Championship Game. CBS Sports will showcase the top conference matchups each week of the package with the "SEC Game of the Week". The agreement also includes a prime time game and doubleheader opportunities. In addition, CBS Sports continues its coverage of SEC regular-season basketball. In addition to the broadcast rights on CBS Sports, this 15-year contract includes certain digital, internet, wireless, Video-on-Demand, data and enhanced highlight rights across all CBS platforms, including CBS College Sports Network and CBS Sports.com. Also, simulcasts of CBS Sports games will be available for distribution by the CBS College Sports Network.

ESPN

ESPN is the exclusive national cable home and the syndication rights holder for the SEC, including every SEC home football game (excluding those on the network broadcast package).

ESPN and ESPN2: The networks have increased coverage by combining to televise a minimum of 20 SEC games annually, including Saturday night and two primetime Thursday matchups.

ESPNU: The 24-hour college sports network presents an SEC Game of the Week (generally in primetime and a minimum of 13 games annually) as well as the studio show *SEC Weekly*.

SEC Network (ESPN Regional Television): The nation's largest syndicator of collegiate sports programming, is the official over-the-air syndication home for the SEC and will feature an SEC Game of the Week (generally at noon ET), with a minimum of 13 games each season throughout the SEC footprint and beyond. In addition, ESPN produces the integrated SEC Studio show, hosted by Dari Nowkhah, with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia and NFL standout.

ESPN360.com: Simulcasts of SEC game telecasts are offered on the broadband sports network.

ESPN Mobile TV: Live games are simulcast on mobile phones.

ESPN International: The agreement includes global rights to present live games and encore presentations.

ESPN Deportes: ESPN holds domestic Spanish-language rights for SEC football on the 24-hour, U.S.-based network.

ESPN GamePlan: The out-of-market college football pay-per-view service, offers SEC action.

ESPN Classic: The network may telecast select SEC live games as well as historic and immediate encore presentations.

ESPN.com: Extensive SEC content, including highlights, will be presented online.

COMCAST/ CHARTER SPORTS SOUTHEAST

Comcast / Charter Sports Southeast (CSS), the regional sports channel focusing on college sports in the southeast, has an agreement with ESPN to televise live Southeastern Conference (SEC) content including a minimum of six football games, twenty men's basketball games, and sixteen women's basketball games as well as fifty SEC Olympic sports each year. The agreement began with the 2009-10 academic year and goes for five years.

FOX SPORTS NET

Fox Sports Net's (FSN) regional sports networks serving the SEC territory – FOX Sports South, FOX Sports Carolinas, FOX Sports Tennessee, Sun Sports, FOX Sports Southwest and FOX Sports Houston – will be the outlets for a minimum of 92 SEC athletic events each year. Events will include eight live, exclusive football games, 20 men's basketball games, 24 women's basketball games (16 regular season, eight tournament), 16 baseball games (10 regular season, six tournament) and 24 additional Olympic sporting events (softball, volleyball, soccer, gymnastics). SEC athletic events on FSN will be distributed to more than 22 million cable and satellite households throughout the SEC territory.

INSTITUTIONAL MEDIA PACKAGES

As part of the SEC's television contracts, each conference institution was able to maintain a contractual television arrangement of its own. As part of this arrangement, each SEC institution has the ability to televise one pay-per-view football game per year as well as to host its own tape-delayed game package, coaches' TV shows as well as other sport packages.

SEC FOOTBALL SHOWS ON TELEVISION

SEC Weekly on ESPNU

SEC Weekly, a one-hour program airs Wednesdays at 5 p.m. ET on ESPNU, throughout the academic year and will cover SEC sports, including sport-by-sport previews, reviews, specials and features on student-athletes. The show is hosted by Cara Capuano with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia All-America and NFL player. *SEC Weekly* is a product of ESPN's landmark 15-year agreement with the Southeastern Conference. ESPNU will complement the show with SEC game telecasts, including football, basketball, Olympic sports and select conference championships.

SEC Gridiron Live

SEC Gridiron LIVE, airing live every Wednesday at 10 p.m. ET, breaks down every SEC game with footage, interviews and analysis. Tim Couch, former Kentucky standout and top pick in the 1999 NFL Draft, joins the live, weekly one-hour show as an analyst, with host Charles Davis and analyst Randy Cross. Also new to the SEC Gridiron LIVE team is social media host Kristina Akra. SECGridironLIVE.com is the hub for the show's social networking component, allowing viewers to participate in the live show and interact instantaneously with the broadcast team and SEC fans across the country.

CBS College Sports SEC Tailgate

Beginning Sept. 18, CBS Sports will start SEC programming with its live pre-game show COLLEGE FOOTBALL TODAY followed by the "SEC Game of the Week" CBS College Sports Network will broadcast SEC TAILGATE on select Saturdays at 2:00 PM, ET, from the site of CBS Sports' SEC Game of the Week. The show brings fans a fast paced and authoritative look at football and life in the SEC. The show captures all the excitement, traditions and festivities from the various campuses and stadiums across the SEC, and features local SEC legends and celebrity alumni.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC - FOUR STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Alabama's 37-21 win over Texas in the 2010 BCS National Championship Game gave the Southeastern Conference its fourth straight BCS National Championship and its sixth BCS title overall. The SEC is now 6-0 in BCS National Championship Games (LSU 2-0, Florida 2-0, Alabama 1-0, Tennessee 1-0).

Alabama is the fourth SEC team to win a BCS National Championship and the third different SEC team to win it during the last four seasons. Tennessee won the BCS' first national title in 1998, LSU won the crown in 2003, Florida's claimed the national championship in 2006 and 2008 while LSU took the title in 2007 and Alabama claimed the national title this past season. The Big 12 has two BCS national titles followed by the ACC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and Big East with one each.

The SEC is the first conference to claim four consecutive Associated Press (first poll - 1936), National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame (first poll - 1959), Football Writers Association of America (first poll - 1954) and USA Today or UPI Coaches Poll (first poll - 1950) national championships.

Since SEC expansion in 1992, the SEC has the most national championships (AP, USA Today) with eight. During that time, the SEC has had more teams with national titles than any other conference (4). Here is a breakdown:

- SEC - Florida (2008, 2006, 1996), LSU (2003, 2007), Tennessee (1998), Alabama (1992, 2009)
- Big 12 - Texas (2005), Oklahoma (2000), Nebraska (1994, 1995, 1997)
- Big Ten - Ohio State (2002), Michigan (1997)
- Pac-10 - Southern California (2004, 2003)
- ACC - Florida State (1999, 1993)
- Big East - Miami, Fla. (2001)

SEC IN BOWL GAMES

The SEC has the most wins (14) and the highest winning percentage of any conference that has three-or-more appearances in BCS bowl games. The SEC is 14-5 in BCS games (.737 percentage).

The SEC finished 6-4 in bowl games this season. Since 2006, the SEC is 25-11 in post-season bowl games (.694). The league has posted a non-losing bowl record for seven straight seasons. The last time the league finished under .500 in bowl games was in 2002 (3-4).

Since conference expansion in 1992, the SEC has won at least five bowl games in nine of 18 seasons. The SEC has won at least six bowl games during the last four seasons (6-3 in 2006; 7-2 in 2007; 6-2 in 2008; 6-4 in 2009). Those years are the only ones since 1992 the league has won six bowl games.

The schools that currently comprise the SEC have appeared in 379 bowls (including 2009-10). That is by far the most of any conference in the nation. In its history, the SEC is 196-170-13 in post-season bowl games, a 53.4 winning percentage. The SEC has the nation's top bowl winning percentage surpassing the Pac-10 (120-107-6, 52.8 percentage). Below is a look at how the various conferences have fared in bowl games in its history (using 2009 conference alignments):

SEC vs. NON-CONFERENCE FOES

The SEC finished the 2009 season with a non-conference mark of 48-10 (.828). Counting bowl games, the SEC bested its best-ever win total in non-conference games of 47 set in 2007 (40-8 regular season/7-2 bowl mark) and 2006 (41-7 regular season/6-3 bowl mark). Since confer-

ence expansion, the SEC's best non-conference winning percentage (counting bowl games) is 37-5 (.881), set in 1997 (32-4 regular season/5-1 bowl mark).

SEC LEADS NATION IN ATTENDANCE AGAIN

For the 29th straight season, the SEC recorded the largest total attendance figure of any conference in the nation. In 2009, a total of 6,560,738 fans attended 86 games, an average of 76,288 per contest, also tops in the nation. SEC stadiums were filled to 98.10 percent of capacity for each home game in 2009. The SEC had seven of the top 15 schools in total attendance in 2009 - Tennessee (3), Auburn (6), LSU (6), Alabama (7), Florida (8), Georgia (13) and South Carolina (15).

MISCELLANY

Since 2000, the Southeastern Conference has had more teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll than any other conference. The SEC has had 43 teams ranked in the last nine final USA Today Coaches polls, an average of almost five per season. The Big 12 is second with 36 teams ranked since 2000. The SEC has led or tied for lead in most teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Polls in seven of the last nine seasons.

Three SEC schools were among the top 10 in most players on 2009 opening weekend rosters. LSU and Miami (Fla.) led the nation with 41 each, while Georgia was sixth with 35 and Tennessee seventh with 30.

The SEC had 49 players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft. The number represents the most SEC players ever taken in the NFL Draft. The SEC had the most players taken among conferences in the draft. Behind the SEC's 49 selections were the Big Ten (34), ACC (31), Big 12 (30) and Pac-10 (29).

Since 1990, the SEC has had 782 total selections in the NFL Draft, an average of 37.2 selections per year. The Big Ten is second with 672 selections.

Since 1997, the SEC has had 552 total selections in the NFL Draft, an average of 39.4 selections per year.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send nine of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2010 season.

The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One Bowl has the second selection, making its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The AT&T Cotton and the Outback Bowls share the third and fourth selections from the SEC. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference.

The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the fifth selection of preference from the SEC.

New to the SEC bowl rotation this year, the Gator Bowl has the sixth selection from the SEC.

The Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl has the seventh selection from the SEC.

In selections 8-9, the AutoZone Liberty and Birmingham Bowls share the selection over the four-year agreement.

2010 BOWL CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCHEDULE

Following the 2010 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the Discover Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Tostitos BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

ESPN will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

SEC DIVISIONAL TIE-BREAKER

In the event of a tie for the division championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties to determine the SEC Football Championship Game representative. All Conference versus Conference Games (both division and non-division) will be counted in the Conference Standings.

Two-Team Tie. In the event two teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order:

- Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams;
- Records of the tied teams within the division;

C. Head-to-head competition against the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference record, and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);

D. Overall record against non-divisional teams;

E. Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;

F. Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional or non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and

G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game.

Three-Team Tie (or more). If three teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order: (Note: If one of the procedures results in one team being eliminated and two remaining, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used):

A. Combined head to head record among the tied teams;

B. Record of the tied teams within the division;

C. Head to head competition against the team within the division with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);

D. Overall Conference record against non divisional teams;

E. Combined record against all common non divisional teams;

F. Record against the common non divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through other common non divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and

G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest-ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the SEC Championship Game.

ALABAMA VS. FLORIDA TIDBITS

1) The game is a rematch of the 2008 and 2009 SEC Football Championship Games. It is the eighth rematch of an SEC Championship Game in the immediate next season and the fifth in a regular season SEC game. In the rematches, the team that won the SEC title game is 3-4 in the following game. These include:

- 1992 SEC Championship Game – Alabama 28, Florida 21 (rematch: 1993 SEC Championship Game – Florida 28, Alabama 13)
- 1993 SEC Championship Game – Florida 28, Alabama 13 (rematch: 1994 SEC Championship Game – Florida 24, Alabama 23)
- 1995 SEC Championship Game – Florida 34, Arkansas 3 (rematch: 1996 – Florida 42, at Arkansas 7)
- 1997 SEC Championship Game – Tennessee 30, Auburn 29 (rematch: 1998 – Tennessee 17, at Auburn 9)
- 2000 SEC Championship Game – Florida 28, Auburn 6 (rematch: 2001 – at Auburn 23, Florida 20)
- 2003 SEC Championship Game – LSU 34, Georgia 13 (rematch: 2004 – at Georgia 45, LSU 16)
- 2008 SEC Championship Game – Florida 31, Alabama 20 (rematch: 2009 SEC Championship Game – Alabama 32, Florida 13)
- 2009 SEC Championship Game – Alabama 32, Florida 13 (rematch: 2010 at Tuscaloosa)

2) The game is a pairing of two of the top three winningest teams in the SEC since 2006. Since 2006, Florida has the SEC's best overall mark at 51-7 (.879) while Alabama is third at 42-15 (.737).

3) The game is a pairing of two of the most successful SEC head coaches in league history. Currently, Florida coach Urban Meyer has the league's best win percentage in all games at SEC schools (.857, 60-10) and in SEC vs. SEC games win percentage (.800, 36-9) while Alabama's Nick Saban is 7th in win percentage in all games at SEC schools (.778, 84-24) and 5th in SEC vs. SEC games win percentage (.750, 51-17).

4) Starting quarterbacks for both teams are a combined 21-0. Alabama's Greg McElroy is 17-0 as a starting quarterback while Florida's John Brantley is 4-0 as a starter.

5) Alabama and Florida are #1-#2 in the SEC in scoring offense (UA – 39.5; UF – 37.8); #2-#3 in total defense (UA – 295.2; UF – 295.5) and #1-#3 in scoring defense (UA – 9.8; UF – 14.2). Florida and Alabama have given up just one rushing TD each this season.

SEC MISSION STATEMENT

"The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

THE SEC

The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports – 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

2009-10 ANOTHER BANNER ATHLETIC YEAR FOR THE SEC

The SEC claimed four national championships in the 2009-10 year. SEC teams have won at least four national titles every year since 1991. In eight of its 20 sponsored sports, the SEC had either the national champion or the national runners-up. The SEC had national championships in football (Alabama), men's indoor track & field (Florida), women's swimming & diving (Florida) and baseball (South Carolina).

In its 77 year history, the Southeastern Conference has won 183 team national championships, including 67 since 2000. In this decade, the SEC has won at least one national championship in 16 of its 20 sponsored sports with the exception of women's cross country, volleyball, soccer and softball.

SEC LEADS ALL CONFERENCES IN 2009-10 OVERALL SPORTS CONFERENCE VS. CONFERENCE SURVEY

In a statistical survey that is based on NCAA championship and rankings, the Southeastern Conference placed first in both men's and women's sports. The survey, compiled each year since 1986 by Bo Carter, takes into account final NCAA championship standings in 10 men's and 11 women's sports and poll rankings in football. Each conference gets 20 points for a team that wins a national championship, 19 for a second place finish and down to 1 point for a 20th place finish. Wrestling is included in the men's totals, but the sport is not sponsored by the Southeastern Conference.

In the 10 men's sports for the survey, the SEC had 398 points with the Pac-10 coming in second with 396 points, followed by the Big 12 with 395 points, Big Ten with 279.5 points, ACC with 238 points and the Big East with 83 points. In the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors, the SEC led the way with 502.5 points followed by the Pac-10 with 480 points, the Big 12 with 382 points, ACC with 369 points, Big Ten with 221 points and the Big East with 164 points.

Combining the 21 sports in the survey, the SEC had 900.5 points to pace all conferences followed by the Pac-10 with 876 points, Big 12 with 777 points, ACC with 607 points, Big Ten with 500.5 points and the Big East with 247 points. The SEC has had the highest men's point total in 17 seasons since 1986-87, the first year this survey was done, and in 11 of the last 12 seasons. The SEC has had the highest women's point total five times since 1986-87, including three of the last six years.

SEC LEADS DIVISION I CONFERENCES IN MOST FIRST-TEAM ESPN THE MAGAZINE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

The Southeastern Conference had 15 of its student-athletes earn first-team ESPN The Magazine / CoSIDA Academic All-America status in 2009-10, more than any other Division I conference in the nation. The Big 12 had 14 while the Big Ten and Pac-10 had 13 student-athletes each earn the honor.

The SEC had 36 total student-athletes earn either first, second or third team mention. That total is second overall to the Big 12 Conference, which had 39. The Big Ten was third with 34 total student-athletes earned first, second or third team mention.

The SEC's academic success of its student-athletes in 2009-10 was not just Academic All-Americans. The league honored 2,424 of its own student-athletes who made the SEC Academic Honor Roll. The league also honored Auburn swimmer Jordan Anderson and Tennessee track & field athlete Phoebe Wright with its McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year as well as naming a scholar-athlete of the year in each of its sports.

Among honors given by the NCAA, SEC student-athletes also shined. Three student-athletes from the SEC – Florida's Tim Tebow (football), Georgia's Courtney Kupets (gymnastics) and Alabama's Brittany Rogers (softball) were honored this past year with the Today's Top VIII Award from the NCAA. Since 2004, the SEC has had 10 student-athletes awarded this honor, more than any other conference in the country.

The SEC also had 13 student-athletes receive NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships in 2009-10, more than any other conference in the nation.

SEC SPORTSMANSHIP STATEMENT

The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states: "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

SEC TOPS IN FAN SUPPORT

The Southeastern Conference has led the nation in total attendance in football every year since 1981 (29 straight years). Since 1988, the SEC has led the nation in average attendance. More than 6.5 million fans witnessed first-hand, the excitement of SEC football in 2009. The average capacity of the 12 SEC stadiums during the last 10 years has been 97 percent. Every year since 1988, the SEC has had at least four teams ranked in the top 10 in average attendance.

In men's basketball, the SEC has finished second in national average attendance for four straight seasons and has finished in the top three every year since 1994 (17 straight years). Kentucky has led the nation in 14 of the last 15 years in attendance. In 2009-10, five SEC schools finished in the top 30 in average attendance.

In women's basketball, after finishing third in the nation for 10 straight seasons, the SEC was second in national average attendance in 2009-10. The SEC has had at least two schools in the top 25 in average attendance every year since 1999-2000. Tennessee has led the nation in attendance in 10 of the last 11 seasons. In 2009-10, the SEC had four schools finish in the top 25 in average attendance.

In baseball, the SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the last 13 seasons, and 18 of the last 24 years. The SEC and its member institutions own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The SEC has broken its own national record each of the last five seasons in total attendance, after having set a goal of 1.5 million fans in 2005 as part of the league's "Drive for 1.5 ... Pack the Parks" promotion.

THE COACHES

Todd Berry is in his first season at ULM and ninth overall with a record of 30-62 (.326). The Warhawks' offensive coordinator is Steve Farmer and the defensive coordinator is Troy Reffett.

Gene Chizik is in his second season at Auburn with a record of 12-5 (.706) and in his fourth season overall with a record of 17-24 (.415). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gus Malzahn and the defensive coordinator is Ted Roof.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ULM HAS THE BALL

Kolton Browning led the Warhawks in rushing for the second straight game with 75 yards, marking the first time since 2004 that a ULM quarterback led the team in rushing in back-to-back games. Browning is third in the Sun Belt in total offense, averaging 257.7 yards per game. Browning threw for 249 yards last week and a TD. Luther Ambrose ranks second in the Sun Belt in all-purpose yards, averaging 163.3 per game. Tavarese Maye's 47-yard touchdown reception last week was the first of his career and the longest play from scrimmage for the Warhawks this season. His three receptions were a career-high.

Nick Fairley leads the SEC in both sacks (4.0, tied for 15th nationally) and tackles for loss (8.5, tied for seventh nationally), and has at least 1.5 tackles for loss in every game this season. Antoine Carter is tied for third in the SEC with three sacks, and his 5.0 tackles for loss is tied for 11th best. Josh Bynes led Auburn in tackles with 104, and is leading the squad again this season. He currently has a team-best 29 tackles and has 3.5 tackles for loss, an interception, two pass break-ups and four quarterback hurries.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL

ULM leads the Sun Belt in rushing defense, allowing just 129.0 yards per game. The Warhawks have held eight of their last 14 opponents under 100 yards rushing and 11 of their last 14 opponents under their season average. Jason Edwards is tied for the Sun Belt lead in tackles, averaging 9.7 per game. He made 11 stops in the season opener against Arkansas and followed that up with 13 against Arkansas State.

Cam Newton is the first quarterback in Auburn history to throw at least two touchdown passes in each of the first four games of a season. Newton has been impressive running the ball this season, leading the SEC and ranking 11th nationally in rushing (third among quarterback), averaging 121.3 yards per game. Lee Ziemba has started all 42 games at tackle since arriving as a true freshman, while center Ryan Pugh has made 36 starts since his true freshman season. In 17 games under Gus Malzahn, Auburn has totaled at least 500 yards of offense five times.

SPECIAL TEAMS

When Aaron Munoz stepped on the field as ULM's starting punter against Arkansas it marked the first time he had punted in a game since he was in eighth grade -- he boomed his first kick 60 yards and finished the game with a 41.6 yards-per-punt average over nine kicks. Place kicker Radi Jabour is coming off a season where he scored 71 points, the fourth-best total by a kicker in school history and the ninth-best overall.

Senior kicker Wes Byrum is just 44 points away from becoming Auburn's all-time leading scorer. He currently ranks fourth with 269 career points. Demond Washington ranks fourth in the SEC averaging 25.9 yards per kickoff return, and had 126 kickoff return yards against Arkansas State, which is the 12th best total in school history.

SERIES/GAME NOTES

Record: AU, 7-0

Auburn plays its first day game of the season Saturday when the Tigers host ULM in a nonconference contest that begins at 11 a.m. CT and will be nationally televised by ESPNU... The two teams have met seven times in the past, with Auburn winning all seven games in Jordan-Hare Stadium...Auburn has never lost to any of the current members of the Sun Belt Conference, with an all-time record of 15-0...Auburn is 4-0 for the second straight season and the fourth time in the last seven years.

THE COACHES

Joker Phillips is in his first season at Kentucky and overall. The Wildcats' offensive coordinator is Randy Sanders and the defensive coordinator is Steve Brown.

Houston Nutt is in his third season at Ole Miss with a record of 20-10 (.6667) and 18th overall with a record of 131-80 (.621). The Rebels' co-offensive coordinators are Mike Markuson and Dave Rader and the defensive coordinator is Tyrone Nix.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN KENTUCKY HAS THE BALL

Senior tailback Derrick Locke is the SEC's No. 2 rusher, averaging 118 yards per game. He has surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark in all four games this season. He also ranks second in all-purpose yards, averaging 173.2 yards per game. Randall Cobb contributes as a wide receiver, quarterback, punt returner, kickoff returner and place-kick holder. He leads the team in receptions, is second in rushing, has returned a punt for a touchdown and has thrown for two TDs, including one on a fake field goal.

Jonathan Cornell set a career high with 12 tackles (seven solo) in Ole Miss' win over Fresno State. Cornell leads Ole Miss and is tied for the SEC lead in tackles (9.8 pg). He also ranks second in the league in TFLs (2.0 pg) and is tied for third sacks (0.75 pg). The Rebel defense ranks second in the SEC in sacks (13). Allen Walker finished the Fresno game with a career-high 10 tackles and 2.0 quarterback sacks. He also tied a career-best with 2.5 TFLs.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL

Kentucky leads the SEC and ranks 14th nationally in pass defense. Junior line-backer Danny Trevathan paces the defense with 27 tackles and six tackles for loss. He is tied for fifth in the SEC and tied for 34th nationally in tackles for loss. Ricky Lumpkin has 3.5 tackles for loss in the first four games, including a quarterback sack, and also has been credited with a quarterback hurry. Luke McDermott added a sack at Florida and leads the team with three sacks on the year. Mychal Bailey is third on the team with 18 tackles.

Ole Miss has scored 145 points in the first four games of the season, which is the most points the Rebels have scored in their first four games since scoring 162 points in 2003. Running back Brandon Bolden exploded for 228 yards rushing and three total TDs against Fresno State. The junior accounted for the yardage, which is the highest rushing total in the SEC this season. Jeremiah Masoli currently ranks third in the SEC in total offense averaging 238.0 yards per game and seventh in passing efficiency (142.2).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Ryan Tydlacka is in his second season as the starting punter. He averaged a personal-best 49.8 yards per punt vs. Louisville and for the season he ranks third in the SEC at 45.2 yards per punt. Joe Mansour has handled most of the kickoffs this season. He now has a league-leading 11 touchbacks this season. Matt Roark has blocked six kicks during his career, including five extra points and a field goal.

Sophomore placekicker Bryson Rose has started out the 2010 season an outstanding 24-for-26 on kicks. Rose set a career-high with 13 points including seven PATS against Fresno State. He also connected on a career-long 41-yard field goal as part of a perfect that day that helped Ole Miss to a road win over Tulane, as he finished 2-for-2 on FGs and 3-for-3 on PATs. Rose leads the SEC in PAT percentage (18/18) and ranks every other kicking category, including scoring (9.0 ppg/2nd) and field goals (1.5 pg/4th).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALCORN STATE HAS THE BALL

Arnold Walker, Capital City Classic MVP, had a breakout season as a true freshman in 2009, with 432 yards rushing on 118 carries and 3 touchdowns. The split end position is led by Senior Edward Johnson, a 3-year starter, who has led the Braves in receptions the past two seasons. The leader of the offensive line is two-year starter, and 2nd Team All-SWAC center, Isaac Williams. Gabriel Nash ran for 135 yards and two touchdowns to lead Alcorn State to a 41-21 victory over Alabama State on Saturday night. Brandon Bridge scored on a 57-yard touchdown run.

Through three games, the Bulldog defense ranks 34th nationally in total defense, 28th in scoring defense and 42nd in passing defense. State ranks among the top half of the SEC in each of those categories. In the victory over Georgia, K.J. Wright posted seven tackles, one-half sack, one-half tackle for loss and recorded four pass breakups and three quarterback hurries. Of Georgia's 13 incompletions, Wright had a hand in forcing seven. In State's win over Georgia, Nickoe Whitley rocked Georgia running back Washaun Ealey as he approached the endzone, forcing and recovering a fumble to stop the drive.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL

The Alcorn State Braves defense will feature nine returning starters, including two All-SWAC performers in Malcolm Taylor (1st Team All-SWAC) and Josh Cragin (2nd Team All-SWAC). The Braves 2010 secondary will be led by junior safety Jason Owens and senior cornerback Jameson Smith. Herve Tonye-Tonye returned a fumble 55 yards for a touchdown last week.

In his 16 games as head coach at Mississippi State, Dan Mullen's team has eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in all but one contest. Chris Relf completed nine of 14 passes for 148 yards and two scores vs. Georgia last week. He also rushed for 109 yards on 20 carries, becoming the first Bulldog quarterback since 2000 to eclipse the 100-yard mark both rushing and passing in the same game. Chad Bumphis again led the team in receiving against Georgia last Saturday, pulling in four catches for 64 yards on the day. Through four games of the 2010 season, junior Vick Ballard has scored six of the Bulldogs 13 touchdowns.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior linebacker/punter Josh Cragin will return for his second season as the Braves Punter. Cragin averaged 37.3 yards per punt in 2009, for the 4th best average in the SWAC. Senior Ryan McMahon will have to battle for the job as Place Kicker with Arturo Tamayo, incoming Junior College Transfer from California.

Mississippi State punter Heath Hutchins may not be leading the nation in punting yards, but the senior has punted 16 times and allowed only 14 return yards. After dropping 11 punts inside the 20 a year ago, Hutchins has already pinned opponents inside the 20 seven times already this season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL

Warren Norman topped the running corps at Ole Miss with 111 rushing yards, including an 80-yarder that gave Vanderbilt a 21-14 lead. Norman's 80-yard rush for a score in the third quarter equaled the longest carry ever by a Commodore RB. Vanderbilt rank first in the SEC in red zone offense, converting on all four possessions inside the opponent's 20-yard line (2 TDs and 2 FGs). Larry Smith needs 11 yards of total offense to reach 2,000 for his career.

UConn redshirt sophomore Sio Moore started the first game of his collegiate career on Saturday vs. Buffalo. He responded well as he led the team in tackles with 16 and also had an interception. For his efforts, Moore was named the BIG EAST Conference Defensive Player of the Week. Lawrence Wilson has started 2010 right where he was in 2009 as he led the Huskies with 12 tackles vs. Michigan, seven against Texas Southern, six vs. Temple and 14 vs. Buffalo.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN UCONN STATE HAS THE BALL

Through three games, the Commodores rank among the SEC leaders with a turnover margin of +3. Only Florida (+8) has performed better among SEC teams. Eddie Foster is just two tackles shy of matching his 2009 total. He also ranks second on team with four tackles for loss. Sean Richardson finished the Ole Miss game with 11 total tackles, a season high for the junior safety. Richardson ranks among the SEC leaders, averaging 9.7 tackles a game. Chris Marve reached double digits in tackles (10 total) at Ole Miss for the second time this season – and fifth time in his last seven games. John Stokes produced a career high with 10 total tackles, and added a key forced fumble in the fourth quarter. Tim Fugger tops the SEC – and shares the NCAA lead – with three forced fumbles.

Jordan Todman has led Connecticut in rushing in all three games this season. He is ranked fifth in the country in rushing and first in the BIG EAST at 149.33 yards per game. Redshirt junior Cody Endres took over quarterback duties for UConn at the end of the first half on Saturday vs. Buffalo and led the Huskies to scoring 31 second half points as UConn won 45-21 in a game that was tied 14-14 at the half. He was seven of 11 in the air for 139 yards and two TDs vs. the Bulls. Robbie Frey rushed for a career-high 112 yards with a TD on Saturday vs. Buffalo. Mike Smith leads the Huskies in receiving this year with 16 for 310 yards and two TDs.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Punter Richard Kent (R-Fr.) is off to a stellar season in his first year as the starter. Kent continued his excellent early-season performance in the win at Ole Miss, earning consideration for SEC Specialist of the Week honors after posting a 39.1-yard net average on nine punts. In the second half alone, Kent forced Ole Miss to start drives deep in its own territory. Four of the Rebels' last five drives started inside the Ole Miss 15-yard line. Three of those drives followed a Kent punt. Kent has been incredibly efficient. He has allowed just two yards on five punt returns (0.2-yard average).

Dave Teggart has connected on all 77 of his extra point attempts during his career -- including 47 last year. The 47-straight extra points ties a school record (based on a single-season) while its also the fourth-highest total in single-season history. Teggart is the first kicker in school history to successfully convert his first 11 field goal attempts.

Derek Dooley is in his first season at Tennessee and in his fourth season overall with a record of 19-22 (.463). The Volunteers' offensive coordinator is Jim Chaney and the defensive coordinator is Justin Wilcox.

Les Miles is in his sixth season at LSU with a record of 55-15 (.785) and 10th overall with a record of 83-36 (.697). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gary Crowton and the defensive coordinator is John Chavis.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

Matt Simms ranks fifth in the SEC in passing yards per game at 209.0. He is coming off a career-high three-TD performance against UAB that included 245 passing yards against no interceptions. His season-high of 259 yards passing came vs. Florida. Tauren Poole missed most of Saturday's game against UAB with a thigh injury. He leads the Vols with 318 yards rushing and three touchdowns on 56 carries, but had just six attempts for 23 yards against the Blazers. Luke Stocker has nine receptions for 97 yards over his last two contests. Denarius Moore leads the team with 14 receptions, 220 yards, and four receiving TDs (five overall).

LSU brings the SEC's top overall defense into the contest as the Tigers are leading the league in rush defense (74.8 ypg) and total defense (254.0 ypg) and they are No. 2 in total defense (12.0 ppg) and No. 4 in pass defense (179.2 ypg). Senior LB Kelvin Sheppard leads the Tigers with 38 tackles. Drake Nevis ranks second in the SEC in sacks with 3.5 and he leads the Tigers and is fifth in the SEC with six tackles for loss. Nevis has racked up 7.5 sacks and 24.5 tackles for loss for his career.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN LSU HAS THE BALL

Chris Walker has started all four games this season and has 16 career starts, including the last nine consecutive. Walker has 22 tackles (one for loss) this season and led the team with 6.0 sacks in 2009. Gerald Williams had five tackles vs. the Blazers and is tied for the team lead with 3.5 tackles for loss. He leads the team with 2.0 sacks and also has 16 tackles in four games. Nick Reveiz led the team with 14 tackles with UAB, becoming the first player to record 10-plus tackles in three consecutive games since 2007. Prentiss Wagner leads the team with two interceptions, both of which he has returned for TD's.

Offensively, LSU is averaging 26.5 points and 299.8 yards per game. The Tigers are No. 5 in the league in rushing with 189.8 yards a contest. Individually, RB Stevan Ridley is averaging 108.5 yards rushing per game. He's third in the SEC. Ridley has two 100-yard games to his credit this year, including a career-best 159 yards and one TD in the win over Vanderbilt. Jordan Jefferson goes into the Tennessee game with a 13-5 overall record as the Tigers' starting quarterback. The 13 victories make Jefferson the second-winningest active quarterback in the conference, trailing only Greg McElroy.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Daniel Lincoln is a four-year starter at the position who is off to an excellent start to the 2010 season. Lincoln is a perfect 7-for-7 on field goal attempts this season, one short of his Tennessee record of eight consecutive made field goals to start a season, accomplished during his All-American season in 2007. Lincoln is 10-for-11 on PAT's and tied his career long with a 49-yard field goal vs. Florida.

PK Josh Jasper is first in the SEC in field goals (9), scoring (38 total points) and field goal percentage (90.0 pct.). Junior CB Patrick Peterson leads the SEC in punt returns (28.1 avg.), is third in kickoff returns (31.7 avg.) and tied for sixth in interceptions with two. Peterson accounted for 86 punt return yards last week, including a 60-yard touchdown that gave LSU a 17-0 lead with 9:39 left in the second quarter. Peterson also blocked a field goal with 7:37 in the first quarter.

Mark Richt is in his 10th season at Georgia and overall with a record of 91-30 (.752). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Mike Bobo and Todd Grantham serves as the defensive coordinator.

Dan Hawkins is in his fifth season at Colorado with a record of 18-34 (.346) and 16th overall with a record of 110-57-1 (.658). The Buffaloes' offensive coordinator is Eric Kiesau and the defensive coordinator is Ron Collins.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA HAS THE BALL

A.J. Green will make his 2010 debut versus the Buffaloes. He finished second in the SEC receiving yards/game (80.8) and rec./game (5.3) and was named to the AP All-SEC first team as a sophomore in 2009 despite just playing in 10 games because of injuries. Kris Durham was the leading receiver in each of the first three games. He has 17 catches for 324 yards and one touchdown on the year. Aaron Murray's efficiency has continued the last three games. On the road against Mississippi State, he completed 18 of 31 for a career-high 274 yards and a touchdown.

Colorado limited Colorado State to 49 rushing yards on 25 attempts (61 on 22 true rushes) in the season opener, with the 49 yards is the fifth fewest CU has ever allowed in a season opener. Jimmy Smith is one of 35 players nationwide named to the Thorpe Award watch list. Smith has played in all 173 defensive snaps this season and in 974 of 977 since the start of the 2009 season for the Buffaloes. Smith led the Buffs compiling a career-high 12 tackles (nine solo) against Colorado State in the 2009 season opener. Marquez Herrod is the most experienced returning defensive lineman and has played in 534 of a possible 804 snaps in 12 games this season. He leads the Buffs with 6.0 sacks through 12 games on the season and had 10 total tackles for loss in 2009.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN COLORADO HAS THE BALL

Junior OLB Justin Houston's progression as one the SEC's dominant pass rushers has continued in 2010. Houston is tied for third in the conference in both tackles for loss (6.5) and sacks (3.0). He exploded for a career-high 10 tackles, including two sacks, and forced a fumble against South Carolina. Senior ILB Akeem Dent had the third game of his career with 10 or more tackles after finishing with 10 against Mississippi State. Also against MSU, senior OLB Darryl Gamble picked off his first pass since snagging a pair at LSU in 2008.

TB Rodney Stewart is the featured runner in the Buffs' rushing attack, figuring to get the bulk of the carries as he did over the last 10 games of the 2009 season. He has started off 2010 on a good note, with 253 yards, 90 after contact. Scotty McKnight has caught a pass in every game he has played in as a Colorado Buffalo—39 regular season plus the one bowl game for a total of 40. Through just three games of his junior season (12 career starts), QB Tyler Hansen is already 15th in school history in true rushing yards by a quarterback.

SPECIAL TEAMS

So far in 2010, Drew Butler has averaged 44.3 yards on 19 punts, five that went for 50+. Blair Walsh connected on two FGs, one from 52 yards and the other from 48 yards, in the 2010 season opener. The 52 yarder tied for the second-longest of his career. Walsh was also 7-for-7 in PATs versus UL and is now 102-for-102 in his career.

Brian Lockridge is poised to reach the 1,000-yard mark in career kickoff return yardage; he has 907 entering the Georgia game and is thus 93 shy of the threshold. He is looking to become the 101st player in Colorado history to accumulate at least 1,000 yards in a single statistical category: 49 players have 1,000-plus career rushing yards, 29 have passed for 1,000 or more yards, 21 have a grand-plus in receiving yards and six have reached them mark in kickoff return yardage.

Urban Meyer is in his sixth season at Florida with a record of 61-10 (.859) and 10th overall with a record of 100-18 (.847). The Gators' offensive coordinator is Steve Addazio and the defensive coordinator is Teryl Austin.

Nick Saban is in his fourth season at Alabama with a record of 37-8 (.822) and 17th overall with a record of 143-67-1 (.680). The Crimson Tide's offensive coordinator is Jim McElwain and the defensive coordinator is Kirby Smart.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA HAS THE BALL

John Brantley has completed 73 of 114 passes (64.0 percent) for 700 yards and six touchdowns with one interception for a passer rating of 131.2. True freshman Trey Burton set a UF record and an SEC freshman record scoring six touchdowns in a single game against Kentucky. Burton had five on the ground and one receiving. Jeff Demps leads the Gators with 367 rushing yards through four games, averaging 6.9 yards per carry. He is averaging 172.0 all-purpose yards per game, third-highest in the SEC. Deonte Thompson leads the UF receiving corps with 18 receptions for 248 yards (13.8 avg.), and average of 62 yards per game.

Alabama leads the nation in scoring defense, surrendering just 9.75 points per game or 39 total points in four games. Robert Lester had two huge interceptions against Arkansas that helped the Crimson Tide complete the come-back win in Fayetteville and preserve their undefeated season. He now has four interceptions this season to lead the SEC and rank tied for second nationally at 1.00 per game. Dont'a Hightower has a team-high 20 tackles, a pass breakup and one quarterback hurry in 2010. Mark Barron is tied for the team lead with 20 tackles while recording one interception, one sack (-7), one forced fumble, one quarterback hurry and two pass breakups.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ALABAMA HAS THE BALL

In its two SEC games this season, Florida's opponent has come into the game with the league's leading rusher. In both cases, Florida has held its opponent under 100 yards rushing as a team. Jonathan Bostic has three interceptions this season, tying for the team lead. He is tied with three others for the national interception lead among linebackers. Jelani Jenkins has 23 tackles on the season, with two tackles for loss and one sack. Ahmad Black leads the team for the season with 30 tackles and has 2.5 tackles for loss, as well.

The Crimson Tide offense is averaging 511.75 yards of total offense per game to rank sixth nationally and first in the SEC. Mark Ingram rushed for 157 yards on 24 carries against Arkansas, moving him up the Alabama career rushing yards chart into fifth place with 2,694 yards in his career. Julio Jones has caught 20 passes for 303 yards and two touchdowns in four games in 2010, averaging 15.1 yards per catch to give the Tide a lethal threat on the outside. Greg McElroy has completed 70.9 percent of his passes for 899 yards and seven touchdowns and three interceptions while ranking seventh nationally in passing efficiency at 178.62.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Demps is No. 2 in the SEC with a 32.5-yard kick return average. He has returned eight kicks for 260 yards with a long of 54. He had a kickoff return of 40-plus yards in each of the first three games this season. Chas Henry punted three times for a 43.7-yard average against Tennessee, pinning UT inside the 20 twice. He followed that up with a booming 56.0-yard average on three punts against Kentucky. Under Urban Meyer, the Gators have successfully converted all eight fake punt attempts into first downs.

Trent Richardson's 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on Sept. 18 at Duke did not make the Alabama all-time top-10 list for longest kickoff returns, but it does mark the first Crimson Tide kickoff return for a touchdown since a 100-yard return for a score by Tyrone Prothro on October 10, 2004. Richardson leads the SEC and ranks fifth nationally in kickoff returns this season with a 35.25 ypr average. He also ranks fourth nationally in all-purpose yards 764 in four games for a 191.0 per game average.
