THE GAME

Auburn hosts Arkansas in an SEC West showdown Saturday that will be nationally televised by CBS. Auburn enters the contest with a 6-0 record for the first time since the 2004 season after a last-second 37-34 win at Kentucky, while Arkansas rebounded from its only loss of the season with a 24-17 victory over Texas A&M last Saturday to improve to 4-1.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ This will be the first time in the Auburn-Arkansas series that both teams are nationally ranked entering the contest.
- ▶ Auburn has won four games by single digits this season, including three games by just three points.
- ▶ Auburn has its highest ranking in the Associated Press poll since the 2006 season.
- ▶ Auburn is ranked eighth nationally in rushing offense (276.0), 10th in total offense (483.0) and 18th in scoring offense (36.7).
- ▶ Cam Newton leads the SEC and ranks 17th nationally (third among quarterbacks) in rushing (112.0). He has three 100-yard rushing games this season, all of at least 170 yards.
- ▶ Newton ranks second in the nation by being responsible for 21.0 points per game. He has had a hand in 21 of Auburn's 28 touchdowns, and the 21 combined rushing and passing TDs are already eighth most in a single season in Auburn history.
- ▶ Newton is second in the nation in passing efficiency (180.73) and 12th in total offense (301.7).
- ▶ Auburn has rushed for at least 300 yards three times this season and five times under Gus Malzahn, after having just four 300-yard rushing games in the six previous seasons combined.
- ▶ Auburn ranks 14th in the nation in rushing defense, allowing just 95.7 yards per game, and has held six of its last 10 opponents under 100 yards rushing.
- ▶ Auburn's defense has allowed just 13 points in the fourth quarter and overtime this season, including just three points against its three SEC opponents.
- ▶ Nick Fairley leads the SEC in tackles for loss (12.5), and Auburn ranks 10th nationally as a team averaging 8.0 tackles for loss per game.
- ▶ Senior kicker Wes Byrum is just 21 points away from becoming Auburn's all-time leading scorer. He currently ranks second with 292 career points.
- ▶ Auburn has won 60 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points in a game, dating back to a 56-49, four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996.

AU-ARKANSAS SERIES NOTES

In 16 of the previous 19 meetings, one of the two teams was nationally ranked, but this is the first time Auburn and Arkansas have played when both teams were ranked entering the contest ... The road team has won six of the last eight games ... The Tigers went 5-1-1 in the first seven meetings in the series, before Arkansas won four of the next five contests ... The winning team has scored 21 or more points in every game of the series except 2003 and 2007 ... Nine winning scores in the series have been 30 or more points ... Nine of the 19 games between the two schools have been decided by seven points or less ... In the last eight meetings, Arkansas has averaged 203.8 yards rushing, ... Auburn has not thrown a touchdown pass against Arkansas since the second quarter of the 2006 contest ... The first meeting was a 21-15 Auburn victory in the 1984 Liberty Bowl.

ARKANSAS QUICK HITTERS

Arkansas defeated Texas A&M 24-17 in Cowboys Stadium in Dallas last Saturday to improve to 4-1 ... Arkansas has held three of its five opponents to fewer than 20 points while scoring at least 20 points in each game this season ... The Razorbacks are third in the nation in passing offense (354.0) but 96th in rushing offense (108.8) ... Ryan Mallett is second in the nation in passing yards per game (349.6), third in total offense (344.8) and seventh in passing efficiency (170.30) ... The Razorbacks have three of the top seven receivers in the SEC in Greg Childs (5.6 rpg - 2nd), D.J. Williams (4.4 - 6th) and Joe Adams (4.2 - 7th) ... Arkansas is second in the SEC and 13th nationally in scoring defense (15.0), and third in the league and 19th nationally in total defense (302.4) ... The Razorbacks average 3.4 sacks per game, which ranks fourth in the country.

ARKANSAS TIGERS

Auburn seniors Kodi Burns (Fort Smith) and Lee Ziemba (Rogers) and freshmen Michael Dyer and Dakota Mosley (both of Little Rock) are all natives of Arkansas.

In addition, four members of the Auburn staff hail from Arkansas. Offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn is from Fort Smith and was a head coach at Springdale High School (2001-05), Shiloh Christian High School (1996-2000) and Hughes High School (1991-95). Safeties coach Tommy Thigpen hails from El Dorado, Ark. Offensive graduate assistant Rhett Lashlee is from Springdale and played at Shiloh Christian from 1999-2001, while offensive quality control assistant Elish Drinkwitz graduated from Arkansas Tech and coached at Alma High School (2001-03, 2005) and Springdale (2004, 2006-09).

ALABAMA RAZORBACKS

Three members of the Arkansas squad are from the state of Alabama. Senior defensive end Damario Ambrose is from Mobile, sophomore punter Dylan Breeding, freshman wide receiver Maudrecus Humphrey and freshman defensive

tackle Jeremiah Jackson are all from Hoover and senior linebacker Ryan Powers is from Athens.

AU-UA CONNECTIONS

- ▶ Arkansas head coach Bobby Petrino was the offensive coordinator at Auburn during the 2002 season. Auburn went 9-4 during his one season on the Plains. Gene Chizik was in his first year as Auburn's defensive coordinator that season.
- ▶ Auburn offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn played wide receiver at Arkansas in 1984-85, and later was the Razorbacks' offensive coordinator during the 2006 season.
- ▶ Auburn defensive line coach Tracy Rocker served as the defensive line coach at Arkansas from 2003-07.
- ▶ Arkansas defensive tackles coach Bobby Allen was on Arkansas' defensive staff during Rocker's stint with the Razorbacks, coaching the cornerbacks (2003-07) and safeties (2003-04).
- ▶ Auburn assistant head coach/wide receivers coach Trooper Taylor coached running backs (2004-05) and wide receivers (2006-07) at Tennessee while Arkansas defensive ends coach Steve Caldwell coached the Vols' ends.
- ▶ Auburn offensive graduate assistant coach Rhett Lashlee was a walk-on quarterback at Arkansas from 2002-03, and served as a graduate assistant coach for the Razorbacks under Gus Malzahn in 2006.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn has an all-time record of 7-6 on Oct. 16, and has won three of its last four, including a 2004 victory against Arkansas in its last appearance on Oct. 16. The Tigers' biggest win on Oct. 16 came in 1993, when the No. 19 Tigers rallied to beat No. 4 Florida in Jordan-Hare Stadium, 38-35, to improve to 7-0. Auburn is 3-0 as a ranked team on Oct. 16, and 1-3 playing against ranked teams.

IN OCTOBER

Auburn, which just concluded its seventh consecutive winning month of September, is 292-149-18 (.656) all-time in the month of October. The Tigers are 27-11 (.711) in their last 38 games in October.

IN THE POLLS

Auburn is currently ranked seventh in the Associated Press, *USA Today* and Harris Interactive polls. It marks the highest ranking in the AP poll for Auburn since the 2006 season, when Auburn was ranked fifth in the Nov. 5 poll prior to a game against Georgia.

6-0 START

Auburn's 6-0 start is the first for the Tigers since the 2004 season, and the fifth in the last 18 seasons. In the previous 18-year period from 1975-92, the Tigers only started 6-0 one time (1986). Auburn has now started a season 6-0 16 times in its history.

CARDIAC KIDS

Auburn has won four games this season by single digits, including three games that were decided by just three points. The last time Auburn won three games by three or fewer points in the same season was 2007, and the last time Auburn was 3-0 in any season in games decided by three points or less was in 2001, when the Tigers beat Vanderbilt (24-21), Mississippi State (16-14) and Florida (23-20) on consecutive Saturdays.

SCOOTIN' NEWTON

Junior quarterback Cam Newton leads the SEC and ranks 17th nationally (third among quarterbacks) in rushing, averaging 112.0 yards per game. In his Auburn debut, Newton posted the second-highest rushing total ever for an Auburn quarterback, gaining 171 yards and two touchdowns against Arkansas State. He topped that against South Carolina, going for 176 yards and three scores, then went for 198 yards and four TDs at Kentucky, tying the school single-game record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. His 408 all-purpose yards against Kentucky was the fifth-best single-game total in school history.

In just six games, Newton already ranks fifth in Auburn history for career rushing yardage by a quarterback with 672 yards, and has a chance to post the most rushing yards in a single season by a quarterback in SEC history. With half the regular season completed, Newton is on pace to finish the regular season with 1,344 yards rushing. The SEC record for yards rushing by a quarterback in a single season is 1,006 by Auburn's Jimmy Sidle in 1963.

HE CAN THROW, TOO

Cam Newton hasn't just excelled with his feet, but also throwing the ball. Newton ranks second nationally in passing efficiency (180.73) and became the first quarterback in school history to throw at least two touchdown passes in each of the first five games of a season. No other Auburn quarterback had done that in the first three games.

Newton has accounted for five TDs in a game twice this season (vs. Arkansas State and South Carolina) and was named SEC Offensive Player of the Week after both games. In addition to his rushing and passing efficiency numbers, he ranks second in the SEC and 12th nationally in total offense (301.67), ninth in the SEC in all-purpose yards (115.7), has caught a pass for 22 yards and even punted once for 22 yards.

CARRYING THE LOAD

Cam Newton has been extremely vital to Auburn's success this season, as he has had a hand in 21 of the team's 28 touchdowns, throwing for 12 and rushing for nine. The 21 TDs passing and rushing already ranks eight best in a single season in school history. Newton ranks second in the nation by being responsible for 21.0 points per game.

Newton has accumulated 1,810 yards of total offense, with 1,138 yards through the air and 672 yards rushing. That makes him responsible for 62.5 percent of Auburn's 2898 yards of offense, which is 10th most nationally.

OFFENSE KEEPS ROLLING

Auburn's offense continues to shine under second-year offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn, as the Tigers rank eighth nationally in rushing offense (276.0), 10th in total offense (483.0) and 18th in scoring offense (36.7). In 19 games under Malzahn, Auburn has totaled at least 500 yards of offense seven times. Prior to Malzahn's arrival in 2009, Auburn hadn't had a single 500-yard game since the 2005 Georgia game - a streak of 40 games.

PASSING FANCY

Auburn currently ranks second in the nation in passing efficiency with a rating of 179.47, thanks largely to two key factors. First, the Tigers lead the nation with an average of 10.62 yards per pass attempt. Only one other school (Boise State - 10.31) averages at least 10 yards per attempt. Second, the Tigers have scored touchdowns on 10.3 percent of their pass attempts, which is second in the nation.

Individually, Cam Newton leads the SEC and ranks second in the country with a rating of 180.73, thanks largely to his nation-best 11.11 touchdown percentage (second best is 10.37 by Boise State's Kellen Moore), and his average of 10.54 yards per pass attempt, which also leads the country (second is Iowa's Ricky Stanzi at 10.13).

GAINING GROUND

Auburn's running game has been dominant this season, as the Tiger lead the SEC and rank eighth nationally averaging 276.0 yards per game on the ground. Auburn has three of the top 12 rushers in the SEC, led by junior quarterback Cam Newton, who averages a league-best 112.0 yards per game on the ground even after not calling his own number on a running play once Oct. 2 vs. ULM. Freshman Michael Dyer is 11th in the SEC averaging 65.0 yards per game, while sophomore Onterio McCalebb is one spot behind averaging 65.7 yards rushing.

Against South Carolina Sept. 25, Auburn had two 100-yard rushers in the same game for the third time in the last two seasons, as Newton had 176 yards on the ground and Dyer rushed for an even 100.

Auburn rushed for 367 yards against Arkansas State, 334 yards against South Carolina and 311 yards at Kentucky. The last time Auburn rushed for 300+ yards in back-to-back conference games was 1979 when the Tigers rushed for 309 at Tennessee (9/29/1979) and 381 versus Vanderbilt (10/13/1979).

In 19 games under Gus Malzahn Auburn has now rushed for at least 300 yards five times. Prior to Malzahn's arrival, Auburn had just four 300-yard rushing games in the previous six seasons combined.

BIG PLAYS

The Tigers have run 15 plays already this season that covered at least 35 yards, including nine that resulted in touchdowns. In fact, Auburn's 28 touchdown plays have averaged 23.2 yards per play this season.

Last season, Auburn had 22 plays of at least 35 yards. In 2008, before Gus Malzahn's arrival, the Tigers had just nine plays that covered 35 or more yards all season.

GO LONG

Auburn has had an excess of long pass plays over the past two seasons, including the two longest plays from scrimmage in Auburn history. In the first 115 years of Auburn football, the Tigers had just 24 passing plays of more than 70 yards. But in the past two seasons, covering only 19 games, the Tigers have had five pass plays of more than 70 yards, including two this season.

Last year against Louisiana Tech, Chris Todd found Terrell Zachery for a 93-yard touchdown to break the record for the longest play from scrimmage in Auburn history. This year against ULM, Cam Newton and Emory Blake did them one yard better, scoring on a 94-yard pass.

EXPERIENCED O-LINE PAVES THE WAY

Auburn has one of the most experienced if not one of the best offensive lines in the country, with four starters returning who have combined to make 133 career starts. Senior All-American candidate and Outland Trophy watch list candidate Lee Ziemba has started all 44 games at tackle since arriving as a true freshman, while center

Ryan Pugh, a Rimington Trophy candidate, has made 38 starts since his true freshman season. Guards Mike Berry (27 starts) and Byron Isom (24 starts) round out the experienced group.

Auburn's offensive line was ranked as the fifth-best OL unit in the country by Phil Steele and Lindy's in their preseason publications.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT

Of Auburn's 35 scoring drives in regulation this season, 13 have taken less than two minutes off the clock, while six have taken more than four minutes. Ten used just four plays or fewer, while 10 others have used nine plays or more.

Auburn held the ball for the final 7:22 of the game against Kentucky, driving 86 yards on 19 plays before Wes Byrum kicked a game-winning 24-yard field goal as time expired. The 19-play drive tied for the second longest in school history, just missing the school record of 20 plays set at West Virginia in 2008.

STOPPING THE RUN

Auburn's defense has excelled against the run this season, ranking second in the SEC and 14th nationally in rushing defense, allowing just 95.7 yards per game. Auburn has held six of its last 10 opponents to less than 100 yards rushing dating back to the end of the 2009 season. In three games against SEC teams this season, the Tigers have not allowed any individual runner to gain more than 47 yards rushing.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

Auburn's defense has been able to get into the opposition's backfield at will, as the Tigers are 10th nationally in tackles for loss, averaging 8.0 per game. Individually, Nick Fairley leads the league and is tied for fifth in the nation averaging 2.1 tackles for loss including five sacks, while Antoine Carter and Zach Clayton both have 5.5 tackles for loss. Seventeen different players have recorded tackles for losses this season for Auburn, including eight players with at least two.

GETTING STINGIER AS WE GO

Auburn's defense has allowed fewer points in every quarter this season as the game has progressed. The Tigers have allowed 44 first-quarter points and 36 points in the second quarter. In the third quarter, the Tigers have surrendered 35 points, and Auburn has allowed just 13 fourth-quarter points. The Tigers have allowed just 60 percent as many points in the second half (48) than the first half (80) this season.

FOURTH QUARTER DEFENSE

Auburn's defense has stepped up late in games, as the Tigers have allowed just 13 points in the fourth quarter and overtime this season while limiting their three SEC opponents to just three fourth-quarter points. Auburn has held opponents to 4-of-19 on third-down conversion attempts in the fourth quarter and overtime and forced turnovers on all four of South Carolina's fourth-quarter possessions Sept. 25.

2010 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

CREATING TURNOVERS

Auburn has forced nine turnovers in the last three games, getting four each against South Carolina and ULM. It marked the first time that Auburn had forced four or more turnovers in consecutive games since 2002 (Vanderbilt 4, Mississippi State 6).

In the first three games of the season, Auburn was -4 in turnover ratio (2 forced/6 giveaways), while in the last three games, Auburn is +5 in turnover ratio (9 forced/4 giveaways).

Seven of the nine turnovers in the last three games have come in the second half and resulted in 35 Auburn points.

FAIRLEY DOMINANT

Nick Fairley has emerged as a force at defensive tackle for Auburn, leading the SEC in tackles for loss (12.5) and tying for second in sacks (5.0). His 12.5 tackles for loss are tied for second most in the country while just 25 players in the nation have at least five sacks.

Fairley has at least one tackle for loss in every game this season. He was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance at Mississippi State, where he totaled five tackles including 2.5 for losses and 1.5 sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and three quarterback hurries. He was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after recording four tackles, three of which went for losses including a sack, against ULM.

BYNES LEADS LINEBACKERS

Senior Josh Bynes led Auburn in tackles last season with 104, and is currently second this season with 34 tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss. He has also recorded an interception, two pass break-ups and four quarterback hurries. Bynes has started the last 27 consecutive games at linebacker for the Tigers.

SUCCESSFUL RETURN FOR DBs

Auburn's secondary has been boosted by the return of three former starters who returned from injuries, including two that missed the entire 2009 season.

Senior safety Zac Etheridge, who suffered a season-ending neck injury last Halloween against Ole Miss, leads the team with 38 tackles and has an interception and a pass break-up. Senior safety Aairon Savage, who missed both the 2008 (knee) and 2009 (Achilles) seasons in their entirety before being granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA in February, is third on the team with 33 tackles, including one for loss.

Junior safety Mike McNeil, who missed all of 2009 after breaking his leg in the spring, has added 13 tackles and a pass break-up.

BATES' MOVE TO LB A GOOD ONE

Sophomore Daren Bates started all 13 games at safety as a true freshman in 2009, but converted to linebacker prior to this season. It proved to be a good move, as Bates led the team with a career-high 10 tackles in the season opener against Arkansas State, and currently ranks fourth on the team with 32 tackles. He has also forced two fumbles.

BYRUM RECORD WATCH

Lou Groza Award candidate Wes Byrum is closing in on becoming Auburn's all-time leading scorer. Byrum, who set a school single-season record for points by a kicker last season with 99, has 52 points this season and needs 21 more to pass John Vaughn (2003-06) for the top spot on Auburn's career points scored list. Byrum is currently second on the list with 292 points.

Byrum had a field goal attempt blocked in the fourth quarter at Mississippi State, snapping a streak of nine consecutive made field goal attempts dating back to last season. His last previous miss was at Tennessee in 2009. He has made 23 of his last 27 field goal attempts after hitting just 11-of-19 in 2008.

SPECIAL TEAMS IMPROVEMENTS

In addition to Wes Byrum, a number of other players are excelling on special teams. Senior Demond Washington ranks ninth in the SEC averaging 24.1 yards per kickoff return, and had 126 kickoff return yards against Arkansas State, which is the 12th best total in school history. Junior Quindarius Carr has averaged 7.7 yards per punt return, which is seventh in the league. Freshman Demetruce McNeal and sophomore Jonathan Evans have a team-high eight tackles on special teams each.

In addition, senior Mike Blanc blocked a PAT against Arkansas State, marking the second straight game Auburn blocked a PAT. It was the fourth blocked extra point by the Tigers in the past two seasons.

YOUNG GUNS GET FIRST ACTION

Auburn has played 15 true freshmen this season, including 12 who played in the season opener, which was tied for second behind Florida (15) for the most true freshmen played by any team in the country. The true freshmen who have played included: DL Kenneth Carter, P Steven Clark, LB Jessel Curry, DB Chris Davis, RB Michael Dyer, WR Antonio Goodwin, LB Jake Holland, WR Shaun Kitchens, DE Corey Lemonier, DB Demetruce McNeal, K Cody Parkey, WR Trovon Reed, DE Craig Sanders, DB Ryan Smith and DL Jeffrey Whitaker.

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Auburn has won 60 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points. The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 279-4 all-time when scoring at least 30 points.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

Since the 2000 season, Auburn is 84-11 (.884) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to the start of the 1993 season, Auburn is 127-18-1 (.873) when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

COMEBACK KIDS

Auburn overcame double-digit deficits to beat both Clemson and South Carolina this season. The Tigers trailed Clemson 17-0 in the second quarter Sept. 18 before winning 27-24 in overtime, and trailed the Gamecocks 20-7 in the second period Sept. 25 before rallying for a 35-27 victory.

It marked just the third time since 1970 that Auburn has had two wins in the same season while overcoming double digit deficits, and the first time it happened in consecutive games. In 1997, Auburn overcame 11-point deficits to beat both Alabama in the Iron Bowl and Clemson in the Peach Bowl. In 1972, Auburn trailed Georgia Tech by 14 and Alabama by 16 in the Punt Bama Punt game before winning both contests.

The victory over Clemson also marked the first time that Auburn overcame a deficit of at least 17 points to win since Sept. 28, 2002, when the Tigers trailed Syracuse 17-0 at Jordan-Hare Stadium before coming back to win 37-34 in three overtimes. It was just Auburn's fourth 17-point deficit overcome in a victory since 1970.

The Tigers now have seven come-from-behind victories in the past two seasons under Gene Chizik, including four this season.

CHIZIK ERA IN SECOND YEAR

Head coach Gene Chizik is in his second year at the helm of the Auburn program, after recording the second-most wins by a first-year coach in Auburn history last season. He also became the first Auburn head coach to take his team to a bowl game in his initial season, leading the Tigers to a 38-35 overtime victory over Northwestern in the Outback Bowl. Chizik also became just the third coach in Auburn history to win his first five games as head coach, and became just the third SEC coach since the league expanded in 1992 to start 5-0.

STAFF REMAINS INTACT

Auburn achieved a rare feat by keeping its entire coaching staff from last season, making Auburn the only school in the SEC to return its head coach and every full-time assistant coach. The last time Auburn returned its entire coaching staff was when the 2006 staff returned intact in 2007.

THE SENIOR CLASS

Head coach Gene Chizik has a senior class that includes 24 players at Auburn in 2010, which is the largest in Auburn history and almost double the size of last year's senior class of 13. The previous largest senior class was 23 in 1988.

The 2010 seniors include: OL Mike Berry, DL Mike Blanc, OL Jorrell Bostrom, WR Kodi Burns, LB Josh Byrnes, K Wes Byrum, DE Antoine Carter, QB Neil Caudle, LB Wade Christopher, DL Zach Clayton, OL Bart Eddins, S Zac Etheridge, RB Mario Fannin, DE Michael Goggans, OL Byron Isom, DB Woody Parramore, OL Ryan Pugh, DB Aairon Savage, P Ryan Shoemaker, LB Craig Stevens, DB Demond Washington, WR Jay Wisner, WR Terrell Zachery and OL Lee Ziemba.

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 24 seniors, 13 have seen time in at least 30 games during their careers, including seven who have played in 40 or more games. Mario Fannin leads the group with 46 games played, including three in 2006 before redshirting and 42 games over the past four seasons, while Michael Goggans and Lee Ziemba have played in all 44 games since 2007. Mike Blanc and Wes Byrum are next with 43 games played each, followed by Zac Etheridge and Craig Stevens (42), Ryan Pugh (39), Kodi Burns and Antoine Carter (38), Mike Berry (37), Josh Byrnes (36) and Zach Clayton (33).

HIGHLY TOUTED RECRUITING CLASS

While Auburn's seniors are a critical part of the team, another strong recruiting class is playing a big role in the Tigers' success. Auburn's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 in the nation by both ESPN.com/Scouts, Inc., and Rivals.com and sixth by Scout.com. Seven members of the recruiting class were part of the ESPNU 150.

STARTS STREAKS

Senior Lee Ziemba has the longest starting streak on the squad, having started all 44 games over the past four seasons. If he starts all 12 regular-season games this year, he will break Will Herring's school records of 49 career starts and 49 consecutive starts.

One other senior has a streak that dates back to his freshman season, as Ryan Pugh has made 34 straight starts. Senior Josh Byrnes is next with 27 consecutive starts and senior Mike Berry has made 24 straight starts. Sophomore Daren Bates has started all 19 games over the last two seasons.

2010 AUBURN FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

SOMETHING OLD, SOMETHING NEW

The players on Auburn's roster ranged in age from 17 to 23 when the season opened. The oldest Tiger, sixth-year senior Aairon Savage (DOB 12/29/86) was 23 years, eight months and six days old on the date of the season opener. The youngest player is freshman Jonathon Mincy (DOB 9/5/92), who celebrated his 18th birthday the day after the Arkansas State game.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Now celebrating its 71st year as home to the Auburn football team, Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 10th-largest on-campus stadium, with a capacity of 87,451 fans. The Tigers, who have averaged more than 80,000 fans during each of the past 17 seasons, are 274-69-7 (.793) all-time at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Auburn has had 10 straight winning seasons at Jordan-Hare Stadium, posting a mark of 60-15 (.800) at home since the 2000 season. The Tigers were undefeated at home during two of those seasons, going 7-0 in both 2000 and 2004.

UNDER THE LIGHTS AT JORDAN-HARE

Auburn has been tough to beat in night games at Jordan-Hare Stadium, accumulating a record of 22-4 (.846) since the 2000 season in home games starting at 6 p.m. or later, including a 3-0 mark this year. That stretch includes a 5-1 record against nationally-ranked opponents, with wins over No. 1 Florida in 2001, No. 2 Florida in 2006, No. 7 Tennessee in 2003, No. 12 South Carolina this season and No. 14 Georgia in 2000.

TIGER GRADS

Auburn began the season with 11 graduates on its roster, which is second most among all FBS schools.

The Tiger graduates include: OL Mike Berry (Public Administration), DT Mike Blanc (Public Administration), DT Zach Clayton (Finance), S Zac Etheridge (Public Administration), RB Mario Fannin (Public Administration), DE Michael Goggans (Public Administration), OL Byron Isom (Public Administration), S Aairon Savage (Education/Master's in Exercise Science), P Ryan Shoemaker (Exercise Science), LB Craig Stevens (Business Management) and WR Terrell Zachery (Public Administration).

TIGER PROS

Auburn has demonstrated a proficiency for placing players in the National Football League. There were 27 former Auburn Tigers listed on NFL rosters on opening day, which was tied for 12th most from any school in the nation. Four NFL teams have three former Tigers on the roster, including the Buffalo Bills, Miami Dolphins, Oakland Raiders and Tennessee Titans. Twenty-two of the 32 teams have at least one former Auburn player on the roster.

AUBURN BY THE NUMBERS

The Tigers return 48 lettermen from last season, including 24 on offense, 22 on defense and two specialists. Auburn returns seven starters on offense and eight on defense.

Auburn's current roster of 112 players includes 24 seniors, 24 juniors, 22 sophomores, seven redshirt freshmen and 35 freshmen. The underclassmen (64) represent 57.5 percent of the Tigers' roster.

AUBURN FOOTBALL: EVERY DAY ...

For the second year in a row Auburn will have a weekly 30-minute show offering fans a reality-based, behind the scenes style production that chronicles the inner-workings of the Tigers' football program through the entire season. The program follows the high and lows of competing as an SEC football player, with wired up coaches and players and exclusive interviews.

The show may be viewed on various stations across the state of Alabama and the Southeast as well as the Comcast Sports Southeast (CSS) regional cable network. The show will also be streamed via the internet at www.auburntigers.com. The show will air either Friday nights or Saturday mornings in all markets.

TIGERS ON CSS

Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast (CSS) will broadcast encore presentations of Auburn football every Sunday at 6 p.m. ET/5 p.m. CT, and on Wednesdays at 12 p.m. ET/11 a.m. CT, with Andy Burcham handling play-by-play duties. CSS will also air the Auburn Football Review every Tuesday at 5 p.m. ET/4 p.m. CT.

CSS is a 24-hour regional sports network serving over six million customers in 13 states.

SEC SUCCESS

Since the 2004 season, Auburn has won 34 of its 51 Southeastern Conference games and 35 of its 52 games against SEC schools, including the 2004 SEC Championship game victory over Tennessee. Auburn's success against conference schools dates back beyond 2004, however, as since the start of the 2000 season, the Tigers have the fourth best record among the 12 league schools in regular season conference games. Razorback Stadium (72,559) • Fayetteville, Ark.

Ben Tate rushed for a career-high 184 yards and two touchdowns for No. 17 Auburn, but Arkansas defeated the Tigers 44-23 to hand Auburn its first loss of the season before 72,599 in Reynolds Razorback Stadium Saturday.

The 184 yards marked a new career high for Tate, breaking his previous mark of 157 set against Mississippi State earlier in the season. It was his ninth career 100-yard rushing game and fourth of the season.

Arkansas' Ryan Mallett threw for 274 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another while Michael Smith rushed for 145 yards and a touchdown to lead the Razorbacks.

After Arkansas opened the game with a 20-0 lead, junior Wes Byrum put Auburn on the board in the second quarter, posting the Tigers' only points of the half on a 37-yard field goal.

Tate scored on a 1-yard touchdown run to make it 34-10 with 5:14 to go in the third quarter after Auburn drove 67 yards in eight plays in 2:42. The Tigers then made Arkansas go three and out to set up a career-long 60-yard Tate touchdown run on the

first play from scrimmage to draw Auburn to within 34-16 with 3:52 left in the third. It was Auburn's second touchdown in only 1:22. The Tigers' pass failed for the two point conversion.

Auburn's Mike Blanc made a big tackle for loss on fourth down from the Auburn 35 to end another Razorback drive.

On Auburn's first play, Kodi Burns handed the ball to Terrell Zachery on a reverse that gained 60 yards to the Arkansas six yard line. It was Auburn's second straight 60 yard rush of the game and set up Onterio McCalebb's 3-yard touchdown run. Byrum's point-after cut the Razorback lead to 11 – the smallest margin of the second half.

Arkansas would go on to score 10 points in the fourth quarter, extending its lead to 44-23 for the team's first SEC win of the season.

With the 23 points scored in the game, Auburn has now scored 230 points on the season, surpassing the 208 points scored in all of the 2008 season.

For the game, Arkansas outgained Auburn 495-375 while the Tigers had three fumbles and the Razorbacks one interception. Arkansas had 28 first downs to Auburn's 15. Chris Todd completed 15-of-28 passes for 133 yards for the Tigers.

Tate led Auburn with 184 rushing yards, followed by Zachery with 60 and McCalebb with 23. Mario Fannin led the team in return yardage, picking up 84 yards on four kickoff returns in the game.

Defensively, Auburn was led by Craig Stevens with 12 tackles, followed by Neiko Thorpe with 11. Josh Bynes finished with eight tackles and a team-high two pass breakups in the game.

Cam Newton accounted for five touchdowns and 357 yards of total offense, rushing for a school-record 171 yards on 15 carries as a quarterback, as Auburn defeated Arkansas State, 52-26, to open up the 2010 football season. Newton, playing in his first game at Auburn, rushed for three touchdowns and threw for two others as Auburn racked up 608 yards of total offense on the night.

Arkansas State struck first, but Auburn scored on three of its next four possessions to take a 21-6 lead. Kodi Burns got it started with a 3-yard run with 3:27 left in the first quarter. Mario Fannin followed with a 36-yard reception from Cam Newton less than three minutes later. Newton then picked up his first rushing touchdown on a 2-yard run with 9:43 left in the half.

The teams traded blows to wrap up the half. After an ASU touchdown Auburn's Quindarius Carr responded 47 seconds later with a 48 yard catch from Newton to put the lead back at 28-13.

Following an ASU field goal, Newton closed out the half by tearing off on a 71-yard run on a broken play, picking up his second rushing touchdown of the game.

Auburn took a 35-16 lead into the half as Newton rushed for two scores and threw another in the first half alone, taking less than two minutes on each drive and using only 16 total plays.

ASU struck first again in the second half, but Fannin caught his second touchdown pass of the game with 8:07 left in the third quarter. The Tigers extended the lead as time expired in the quarter with Wes Byrum connecting on his first field goal of the season, a 24-yard attempt.

Freshman Michael Dyer scored his first career touchdown with 9:11 left in the game, coming in on a 2-yard run to make the score 52-23. He finished the night with 95 yards rushing. The Red Wolves would score once more on the team's final possession to finish the game with the 52-26 Auburn win.

Newton threw for 186 yards on the night, completing nine of 14 passes and tossing three touchdowns passes.

Carr led Auburn's receiving with 87 yards on two catches. Fannin finished with 65 yards receiving while Darvin Adams added 58.

Newton led the Tigers in rushing with 171 yards, followed by Dyer with 95 and Onterio McCalebb with 76.

Newton also led in all-purpose yards with 171. Carr finished with 134, including 47 return yards, while Demond Washington added 126 yards on kick returns.

Byrum, Auburn's senior kicker, scored 10 points in the win with a field goal and seven extra points.

Daren Bates led the Auburn defense with 10 tackles. Senior Aairon Savage, who missed the last two seasons with injuries, added seven. Washington, Eltoro Freeman and Josh Bynes added six tackles each while Antoine Carter led the team with 2.5 sacks.

In all, Auburn had 10 tackles for loss and four sacks in the game.

Cam Newton, Nick Fairley and a strong Tiger defense led No. 21 Auburn to a 17-14 victory over Mississippi State in the SEC opener for both teams at Davis Wade Stadium at Scott Field on Sept. 9. It is AU's 17th SEC-opening win in 18 tries.

Newton threw for 136 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 70 yards while defensive lineman Fairley had an interception, fumble recovery and three sacks. The Tigers defense limited Mississippi State to only 246 total yards.

Auburn took the opening kickoff and grabbed a quick 7-0 lead only 3:38 into the game on a 39-yard Newton touchdown pass on a screen to Emory Blake, marking his first touchdown reception of his career. On the 8-play, 68-yard drive, Newton converted a huge 4th and 1 from the State 46.

After the Tigers sacked the Bulldogs three straight times on a three and out, two by Nick Fairley and the other by Mike Blanc, Quindarius Carr fumbled the ensuing punt and Mississippi State recovered it at the Auburn 20 yard line.

State tied it up three plays later from the Tigers 2 as quarterback Chris Reif fumbled the ball into the end zone and State offensive lineman Gabe Jackson recovered it with 2:30 remaining in the opening quarter.

Fairley intercepted State quarterback Tyler Russell's pass at midfield, setting up Auburn's eight play touchdown drive to give the Tigers a 14-7 lead with 8:37 left in the half. On 3rd and goal from the State 12, Newton threw his second touchdown pass of the game, this time to Darvin Adams.

Fairley continued his outstanding performance with a fumble recovery at the State 44 on the Bulldogs' next possession. It led to a 34-yard Wes Byrum field goal for the final scoring of the first half that stretched Auburn's lead to 17-7 with 4:29 remaining.

Mississippi State took the opening kickoff of the second half and closed to within 17-14 on a 1-yard touchdown run on third down by Vick Ballard with 8:55 left in the third quarter. The Bulldogs used 12 plays to drive 63 yards.

The Bulldogs then recovered an onside kick at their own 44. Auburn held the Mississippi State to a three and out to finally gain its first second half possession with 8:28 to go in the third at its own 12 yard line.

Mississippi State blocked Byrum's 37 yard field goal attempt with 2:19 to play. The Bulldogs took over at their own 20 yard line and converted a fourth and 4 from their own 26 to the MSU 48 with 90 seconds remaining. On second down, Fairley

recorded his third sack of the game to leave the Bulldogs with a 3rd and 15 from their own 45 as they called their final time out.

A pass interference penalty by Neiko Thorpe resulted in a Mississippi State first down at the Auburn 41 with 45 seconds left. Two plays later, Thorpe broke up a 2nd down Relf to Leon Berry pass inside the Auburn 20 with 34 seconds to go. The Tigers held MSU on an incomplete 4th and 10 pass with 22 seconds remaining to clinch their 22nd win in the last 29 games against the Bulldogs.

Onterio McCalebb rushed for 68 yards on 12 carries while Mike Dyer had nine rushes for 48 yards.

Eltoro Freeman recorded a team-high nine tackles, while Zac Etheridge, Aairon Savage and Josh Bynes had six each.

Wes Byrum's 39-yard field goal in the first overtime period propelled No. 16 Auburn to a thrilling 27-24 win over Clemson in front of a sold-out Jordan-Hare Stadium on Sept. 18. Auburn trailed 17-3 at halftime but used a 21-point third quarter to take a lead before winning in the first overtime period. Clemson's Chandler Catanzaro had a chance to send the game to a second overtime period but missed a 32-yard field goal into the Auburn student section end of the stadium.

Darvin Adams finished the game with 118 yards on five catches with a touchdown, including an eight-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter that tied the game at 17-17.

Onterio McCalebb led Auburn on the ground with 81 yards and a touchdown on 10 rushes and teammate Michael Dyer had 69 yards on 16 rushes.

Cam Newton was 7-for-14 for 203 yards and two touchdowns and added 68 yards on the 17 rushes.

Auburn, which last overcame a 17-0 deficit in 2002, went up 24-17 lead as Newton and Adams hooked up for four completions that covered 95 yards and directly led to two touchdowns, with Adams catching one and McCalebb running one in.

McCalebb's 12-yard touchdown run capped a six-play, 61-yard drive for Auburn to start the comeback, bringing Auburn to within a touchdown, 17-10, midway through the third quarter. The big play on the drive was Newton's 34-yard pass to Adams on a third and one play that brought the ball to the Clemson 18 yard line.

Auburn's next series saw Adams score his second touchdown of the season as he tapped the tip of his shoe down in bounds to finish off an eight-play drive that started at the Auburn 28 yard line and took just 3:41 off the clock.

The next time Auburn touched the ball it needed just 38 seconds to score as Newton's first pass completion to someone other than Adams gave Auburn its first lead of the day, 24-17. Following a five-yard run by McCalebb, Newton found Zachery down the sideline for a 78 yard touchdown, Auburn's third straight series that ended with a touchdown.

Clemson answered the Zachary score with an eight-play march down the field to tie the game at 24-24 with 12:36 left in regulation. The drive covered 77 yards and took just 3:27 off the clock.

The Auburn defense created four turnovers and Auburn quarterback Cam Newton accounted for all five touchdowns as No. 17 Auburn claimed a 35-27 victory over No. 12 South Carolina on Sept. 25 in Jordan-Hare Stadium. Newton rushed 25 times for 176 yards and three touchdowns as Auburn improved to 4-0, 2-0 SEC.

Josh Bynes forced one fumble and had a key interception of backup South Carolina quarterback Connor Shaw as Auburn picked Shaw twice, both in the final quarter, and forced South Carolina starting quarterback Stephen Garcia into a pair of costly fourth-quarter fumbles.

Newton had rushing touchdowns of 54 yards, three yards and four yards and also threw two fourth-quarter touchdowns. The first was to Philip Lutzenkirchen, a seven-yard pass that put Auburn ahead, 28-27. The second went to Emory Blake, a 12-yard pass that capped a nine-play, 53-yard drive, putting Auburn up by eight, 35-27, with 6:23 left.

Freshman tailback Michael Dyer gained 100 yards on 23 carries, with 67 of those yards coming in the second half, as Auburn rushed for 334 total yards to just 79 for South Carolina. The milestone marked Dyer's first 100-yard rushing game of his Auburn career.

Newton was 16-for-21 in the air for 158 yards, hitting six different receivers on the night. Terrell Zachery (49 yards) and Darvin Adams (45 yards) each had four catches while Blake (33 yards) and Lutzenkirchen (22 yards) had three apiece.

Newton's 54-yard touchdown run on Auburn's first possession gave the Tigers a quick 7-0 lead. Newton rushed twice on the drive, gaining 59 of the 80 yards covered on the drive, and also completed a pair of passes, one to Adams for 15 yards and one to Fannin for three.

South Carolina answered with three straight touchdowns as Garcia hit Alshon Jeffery for a pair of scores, a 30-yard touchdown with 5:32 remaining in the first quarter and a six-yard score with 6:16 left in the half. Those scores sandwiched a Marcus Lattimore one-yard touchdown run as South Carolina led 20-7. Jeffery finished with eight catches for 192 yards.

Newton's three-yard score with just 46 seconds left in the half drew Auburn to within six, 20-14, and then took the lead at 21-20 on its second drive of the second half, going 80 yards on 11 plays in 3:46.

South Carolina reclaimed the lead when Garcia, who finished the night 15-for-21 for 235 yards with three touchdowns, hit Tori Gurley with a three-yard touchdown pass to put South Carolina up 27-21.

Auburn's defense held Lattimore to just 33 yards rushing on 14 carries.

Zac Etheridge and Mike Blanc each had six total tackles while Bynes had six, including a half-sack and a forced fumble along with his interception, while Daren Bates had five along with a forced fumble.

In all, seven different Tigers accounted for at least one tackle for loss with Auburn also tallying three quarterback sacks.

The four turnovers forced were a season-high for AU.

Cam Newton connected with Emory Blake on a school-record 94-yard pass on his first throw of the game Oct. 2, helping No. 10 Auburn to a 52-3 win over the University of Louisiana at Monroe. Newton completed 14 of 19 passes against the Warhawks for 245 yards and three touchdowns in the win.

The win marked Auburn's second 50-point game of the season and its second 500-yard game of the season. The Tigers' defensive line also had a big game, limiting ULM to just 38 yards rushing marking a season-low for Auburn opponents and the third sub 100-yard game for an opponent this season.

Auburn opened the game by scoring 14 points on four plays within the first five minutes of the game. Oterio McCalebb scored Auburn's first touchdown, breaking away on a 50-yard run down the right side of the field.

ULM was forced to punt on its opening possession and pinned the Tigers at their own 3-yard line. A short run by Kodi Burns set up the 94-yard pass from Newton to Blake, breaking the Auburn record for longest play from scrimmage. Wes Byrum's kick put the Tigers up 14-0 with 11:04 left to play in the opening period.

The Warhawks scored their lone points of the game on their next possession, using 14 plays to work 61 yards down the field for a 35-yard field goal by Radi Jabour. Auburn answered on its next possession, capping off a 17-point first quarter, as Byrum connected on a 19-yard attempt.

Freshman running back Michael Dyer extended the lead for the Tigers in the second quarter, capping off a 66-yard, nine-play drive with a 3-yard run for touchdown. Quindarius Carr then gave Auburn a comfortable 31-3 lead heading into halftime on the Tigers' next possession, catching a 16-yard pass from Newton for a touchdown with 1:41 left in the half.

Sophomore Philip Lutzenkirchen scored Auburn's lone third-quarter points, catching a cross-field pass in the flat from Newton for the 5-yard touchdown reception with 2:22 left in the quarter.

Sophomore quarterback Barrett Trotter took over for Newton on the next possession and guided Auburn to two more touchdowns. The first capped off a nine-play, 56-yard drive with Mario Fannin running in two yards for a touchdown to open the fourth quarter. Trotter would score one of his own, the first of his career, with 8:46 left in the game, giving Auburn a 52-3 lead.

Fannin led the Tigers in rushing with 89 yards, followed by McCalebb with 56, Trotter with 29 and Dyer with 22.

Blake caught two passes for 101 yards to lead the Tigers. Terrell Zachery and Lutzenkirchen caught four passes each for 50 and 41 yards, respectively. In all, Auburn quarterbacks threw to nine different receivers.

Defensively, Anthony Morgan led the team with six tackles, five of which were solo. Aairon Savage and T'Sharvan Bell accounted for five tackles each. As a team, the Tigers forced two fumbles, totaled 10 tackles for loss and tallied three quarterback sacks. Senior Zac Etheridge also picked up an interception in the win.

Wes Byrum kicked a 24-yard field goal as time expired to give unbeaten Auburn a 37-34 victory over Kentucky at Commonwealth Stadium on Oct. 9. The Tigers had a 19-play, 86-yard drive in the final 7:22 to set up the game-winner.

The drive tied for the second longest drive by plays in Auburn history. Cam Newton had 54 yards rushing and completed 2-of-3 passes for 20 yards on the final possession. He finished with 408 yards total offense for the game for Auburn.

Newton tied a school record with four touchdowns. He totaled 198 yards rushing on 28 carries and had 210 yards passing, completing 13-of-21 passes.

Kentucky's Randall Cobb returned the opening kickoff 36 yards just beyond midfield to set up a 7 play, 49 yard touchdown drive for a 7-0 Wildcat lead on a 2 yard run by Cobb 3:09 into the game.

Auburn tied the score on its first possession on a 16-yard Cam Newton touchdown run with 6:44 left in the first quarter. The Tigers drove 78 yards in nine plays.

Michael Dyer started the Tigers' second possession at the Auburn 20 with a 27-yard run. Newton capped off the 80 yard drive with an 8-yard touchdown run to put Auburn ahead 14-7 with 1:17 left in the opening quarter.

A 33-yard Newton to Kodi Burns pass completion to the Kentucky 9 set up Newton's third touchdown run of the game, this time a 5 yarder, to give Auburn a 21-7 lead with 10:01 remaining in the half.

Following a fumble forced by Daren Bates. Auburn took over on its own 48, leading to a 38 yard Byrum field goal that put Auburn up 24-7.

Kentucky ended the run of 24 consecutive points by Auburn with a 6-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jordan Aumiller with 4:52, making it 24-14.

A 34-yard Newton pass on an incredible reception by Darvin Adams on 3rd down and 17 from the Auburn 17 helped the Tigers move the chains late in the second quarter. Newton scored his fourth touchdown rushing of the half on a 3-yard run for a 31-14 lead with 1:06 left.

Kentucky's Craig McIntosh kicked a 29-yard field goal as the first half ended with Auburn leading 31-17.

Auburn finished with 521 total yards offense while Kentucky had 336 yards. Michael Dyer rushed for 56 yards on nine carries and Mario Fannin gained 50 yards on eight carries.

Defensively, Zac Etheridge led Auburn with 11 tackles while Bates had eight.
