SEC HIGHLIGHTS

- SEC Players of the Week for games of Oct. 23 are Auburn QB Cam Newton (offense), Georgia OLB Justin Houston (defense), Arkansas RS/WR Joe Adams (special teams), Alabama OT James Carpenter (offensive line), Auburn DT Nick Fairley (defensive line) and Mississippi State RB LaDarius Perkins (freshman).
- The SEC has six teams ranked in the four major rankings (AP, USA Today, Harris Interactive and BCS), more than any other conference.
- Auburn becomes the fifth SEC team to hold the top spot in the BCS standings since its inception in 1998. It's the most teams than any conference to hold the top spot. An SEC team has held the #1 ranking in the BCS standings in 16 of the also 22 editions.
- The SEC has a 29-5 non-conference record this season. The 85.3 win percentage is the highest of any conference.
- SEC stadiums reached the 4 million attendance mark last weekend. In 53 home dates, SEC stadiums have been filled to 98.49 percent capacity.
- Since 2007, an SEC student-athlete or coach has won 17 of the 21 individual post-season honors awarded.
- The only seniors to lead an SEC individual statistical category this week are LSU kicker Josh Jasper (FG percentage), Auburn kicker Wes Byrum (PAT percentage, scoring by kicking) and Florida punter Chas Henry (punting average) [23 total categories].

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC DIVISIONAL TIE-BREAKER

In the event of a tie for the division championship, the following procedures will be used to break all ties to determine the SEC Football Championship Game representative. All Conference versus Conference Games (both division and non-division) will be counted in the Conference Standings.

Two-Team Tie. In the event two teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order:

- A. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams;
- B. Records of the tied teams within the division;
- C. Head-to-head competition against the team within the division with the best overall (divisional and non-divisional) Conference record, and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- D. Overall record against non-divisional teams;
- E. Combined record against all common non-divisional teams;
- F. Record against the common non-divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional or non-divisional) and proceeding through other common non-divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game.

Three-Team Tie (or more). If three teams are tied for a division title, the following procedure will be used in the following order: (Note: If one of the procedures results in one team being eliminated and two remaining, the two-team tiebreaker procedure as stated in No. 1 above will be used):

- A. Combined head to head record among the tied teams;
- B. Record of the tied teams within the division;
- C. Head to head competition against the team within the division with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through the division (multiple ties within the division will be broken from first to last and a tie for first place will be broken before a tie for fourth place);
- D. Overall Conference record against non divisional teams;
- E. Combined record against all common non divisional teams;
- F. Record against the common non divisional team with the best overall Conference record (divisional and non divisional) and proceeding through other common non divisional teams based on their order of finish within their division; and
- G. The tied team with the highest ranking in the Bowl Championship Series Standings following the last weekend of regular-season games shall be the divisional representative in the SEC Championship Game, unless the second of the tied teams is ranked within five-or-fewer places of the highest-ranked tied team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the top two ranked tied teams shall determine the representative in the SEC Championship Game.

SEC - AP POLL HISTORY

The Southeastern Conference has had at least five teams ranked in at least one AP Top 25 poll every year since expansion (1992).

Since 1992, the SEC has had at least 5 teams ranked in the AP Top 25 a total of 221 times, an average of 11.63 times per year.

Since 1992, the SEC has had at least 5 teams ranked for at least 10 weeks in 15 of the last 19 years.

The SEC has had seven teams ranked in the AP Top 25 poll seven times since 1992, including three weeks in 1999 and 2007 and one week this season.

AUBURN RANKED NO. 1 IN LATEST BCS STANDINGS

Auburn is ranked first in the latest BCS standings, becoming the fifth SEC team in the standings' history to hold the top spot.

The SEC team that has held the top spot the most is Florida at seven weeks, followed by Alabama at six weeks, Tennessee at five weeks and LSU at two weeks. Oklahoma has held the top spot longer than any other school in the nation at 20 weeks.

This marks the fourth straight year that the SEC has had a team at the top of the weekly BCS standings. The SEC held the top spot in the BCS rankings every week in 2009 (Florida seven weeks; Alabama one week) and five of eight weeks in 2008 (Alabama). It also held the top spot for two weeks in 2007 (LSU).

An SEC team has held the top spot in the BCS standings for 16 of the last 22 editions.

The first BCS standings are released in mid-October and the final rankings are released following championship weekend in early December.

The national average for scoring offense is 28.0. The Pac-10 leads the nation in scoring at 32.8 points per game (SEC is fourth). The national average for total offense is 382.3. The Big 12 leads the nation at 417.4 yards per game (SEC is fifth).

SEC FOOTBALL VIDEO REPLAY

THE OBJECTIVE

To allow for specific types of officiating calls to be immediately reviewed during all games hosted by SEC teams.

THE COACHES' CHALLENGE

The head coach may challenge the ruling of any reviewable play. He retains a challenge if his initial challenge is successful and thus results in a reversal by the replay official. The head coach will then have a single challenge that he may use anytime during the game if his team has not used all its timeouts. Thus a team may have a total of two challenges in the game, but only if the first results in a reversal of the on-field ruling.

THE SOURCE

All reviewable video comes direct from either the television network broadcasting the game or other TV production facilities that meet established conference standards. The Southeastern Conference has used instant replay since 2005.

THE PLAYS

Reviewable

1. Plays governed by Sideline, Goal Line, End Zone, and End Line:
 - a. Scoring Plays, including the ball in possession of a runner breaking the plane of the goal line
 - b. Runner/receiver in or out of bounds
 - c. Recovery of loose ball in and out of bounds
2. Passing Plays:
 - a. Pass ruled complete/ incomplete/ intercepted in the field of play and end zones
 - b. Touching of a forward pass by a player or an official
 - c. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off beyond the line of scrimmage
 - d. Illegal forward pass or illegal handing off after change of possession
 - e. Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage
 - f. Quarterback (Passer) starts arm forward, ball comes loose and play is ruled incomplete (if ball is quickly recovered)
 - g. Quarterback (Passer) throws incomplete swing pass that is close to being forward or backward, and pass is ruled forward (if ball is quickly recovered)
3. Miscellaneous:
 - a. Runner ruled not down.
 - b. Runner ruled down (when ball carrier is judged down by rule and the ball is fumbled, play may be reviewed if recovery of ball occurs in the immediate action following fumble and is prior to any official signaling ball is dead. Also reviewable when runner is ruled out of bounds near goal line.)
 - c. Forward progress with respect to first down
 - d. Touching of a kick
 - e. Number of players on field
 - f. Clock adjustments (in conjunction with reviewed plays)
 - g. Fourth-down/try fumble plays
 - h. Field Goal Attempts (only when ball is ruled below or above the crossbar, inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights.)
 - i. The game clock expires at the end of a half. If at the end of the game, the time may be restored to the clock only if the score is tied or the team that would next snap the ball trails by eight points or fewer.

THE PROCESS

Each SEC football stadium has a secured replay booth equipped with the HD Instant Replay system provided by XOS Digital. Three individuals work in the booth for the duration of the game: 1. Replay Official, 2. Communicator, 3. Technician. The Replay Official and the Communicator are selected and assigned by the Conference Office.

A live HD video feed is sent directly to the replay booth from the TV truck. The Technician watches the feed on an input monitor while recording it into the XOS Digital Replay System. The Technician also marks the beginning of each play while the Communicator marks all incoming replays.

Each play and subsequent replay then appears on a touch screen in front of the Replay Technician. As the Technician and the Communicator mark the incoming video, each view will appear as a small picture on the computer touch screen. At any time, the Replay Technician can touch the thumbnail and immediately send that play or replay to the Replay Official.

With the Communicator's assistance, the Replay Official can quickly jump between replays while playing back the video. All replay video navigation is done via a jog shuttle remote controlled by the Replay Official. All video is viewed on an HD monitor that sits in front of the Replay Official. The touch screen is only used to select the replays and to log specific play data in the event a call is overturned.

While all plays are reviewed between the whistle and the beginning of the next play, the Replay Official can stop play on the field by using a pager system. Five onfield officials wear pagers. If play is stopped the Referee announces on the stadium PA microphone that play has been stopped so the previous play can be reviewed. The Referee then proceeds to the sideline headset, which provides direct communication to the Replay Official in the booth. Once the play has been reviewed, the Replay Official notifies the Referee, who then announces the decision on the stadium PA system.

THE EQUIPMENT

Each SEC member institution uses the HD Replay System developed by XOS Digital of Orlando, FL. The replay systems are maintained by the home institution with technical support from XOS Digital.

A PRIMER FOR NCAA RULES FOR FOOTBALL SAFETY

For years, the NCAA has been at the forefront of student-athlete safety and implemented initiatives to make competition as safe as possible. Rules changes have expanded beyond the traditional notion of helmet-to-helmet contact and added a focus on all hits targeting and contacting defenseless players above the shoulders.

“The health and safety of student-athletes is the reason the NCAA was created,” said NCAA President Mark Emmert. “We have to remain vigilant to that mission, and these types of injuries require our careful attention.”

Rogers Redding, football rules secretary-rules editor and Southeastern Conference Coordinator of Football Officials, noted that the NCAA Football Rules Committee continually reviews player safety and has implemented rules to remove the word intent from head-down contact, penalize the horse-collar tackle, eliminate wedge-blocking and strengthen penalties regarding the tackling of defenseless players.

“Student-athlete safety is of the utmost importance, and the Association will continue to protect its student-athletes,” Redding said.

Football student-athletes who target the head and neck area of defenseless players will continue to be penalized for initial contact with a forearm, elbow, shoulder or helmet. A 15-yard penalty is enforced on these violations. In egregious situations, officials may eject the offending player. Last season, five Division I football student-athletes were ejected from games for these violations.

Following the rules change in 2009 requiring conferences to further examine these fouls after games, 73 plays were reviewed, resulting in four suspensions from games. In addition, some conferences sent letters of reprimand to coaches and student-athletes following post-game reviews.

“We believe the committee’s decision has helped to reduce the unnecessary roughness penalties involving hits to the head,” said David Parry, national coordinator of football officials. “We have seen a decline in them.”

Rules changes for the 2010 season mandate that injured student-athletes, including those who exhibit signs of a concussion, must be cleared by appropriate medical personnel as determined by the institution before returning to competition. An injured player must also miss a play before he is allowed to take part in the game again. Previously, a player could return to action before the next play if a timeout was called.

Receiving teams are no longer allowed to have wedge-blocking formations of three or more players on kickoffs. (NCAA research showed that one of every five injuries that occur on kickoffs resulted in a concussion.) Two-player wedges remain legal, but the formation of three or more players in a wedge is now a foul that results in a 15-yard penalty. It also will be considered a live-ball foul, regardless of whether there is contact between opponents.

The NCAA’s health and safety needs are addressed through the collaborative efforts of national office staff, governance committees, sports rules committees, sports issues committees and external associations. The NCAA Football Rules Committee works closely with the NCAA Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sports and other medical experts.

NCAA football rules changes timeline

1976 – Rule changes for the 1976 football season eliminate the head and face as a primary and initial contact area for blocking and tackling.

2002 – The NCAA Football Rules Committee adds specific language to define when a student-athlete is defenseless and adds a point of emphasis for protection of these players.

2005 – The NCAA Football Rules Committee changes college football rules regarding spearing and head-down contact, removing any reference to “intent” from the rule. In addition to the rule change, the NCAA focuses on the education of student-athletes, coaches, officials and administrators regarding prevention of head and neck injuries. The NCAA partners with several membership groups (coaches, athletic trainers, etc.) to produce educational materials to teach proper tackling technique and prevention of head contact.

2008 – The NCAA makes the horse-collar tackle illegal, revamps illegal contact of an opponent and simplifies the chop-block rule. More emphasis is placed on eliminating hits on defenseless players and blows to the head. No player is permitted to initiate contact and target an opponent with the crown of his helmet, and no player is permitted to initiate contact and target a defenseless opponent above the shoulders.

2009 – A rule is added to require conference review of fouls related to targeting/initiating contact to players. If a foul is not called, conferences are allowed to review plays and impose sanctions. As a result, several conferences enforce suspensions on egregious fouls using supplementary discipline.

2010 – Wedge blocking is eliminated and specific concussion and injury management rules are implemented. Injured student-athletes must be cleared by appropriate medical personnel (as determined by the institution) before returning to competition. The committee also clarifies that contact above the shoulders with any body part is a violation (e.g., forearm, shoulder, etc.). The committee took advantage of the two-year playing rules process that allowed for safety alterations in the non-change year.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL NOTES

SEC - FOUR STRAIGHT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

• Alabama's 37-21 win over Texas in the 2010 BCS National Championship Game gave the Southeastern Conference its fourth straight BCS National Championship and its sixth BCS title overall. The SEC is now 6-0 in BCS National Championship Games (LSU 2-0, Florida 2-0, Alabama 1-0, Tennessee 1-0).

• Alabama is the fourth SEC team to win a BCS National Championship and the third different SEC team to win it during the last four seasons. Tennessee won the BCS' first national title in 1998, LSU won the crown in 2003, Florida's claimed the national championship in 2006 and 2008 while LSU took the title in 2007 and Alabama claimed the national title this past season. The Big 12 has two BCS national titles followed by the ACC, Big Ten, Pac-10 and Big East with one each.

• The SEC is the first conference to claim four consecutive Associated Press (first poll - 1936), National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame (first poll - 1959), Football Writers Association of America (first poll - 1954) and USA Today or UPI Coaches Poll (first poll - 1950) national championships.

• Since SEC expansion in 1992, the SEC has the most national championships (AP, USA Today) with eight. During that time, the SEC has had more teams with national titles than any other conference (4). Here is a breakdown:

SEC IN BOWL GAMES

• The SEC has the most wins (14) and the highest winning percentage of any conference that has three-or-more appearances in BCS bowl games. The SEC is 14-5 in BCS games (.737 percentage).

• Since conference expansion in 1992, the SEC has won at least five bowl games in nine of 18 seasons. The SEC has won at least six bowl games during the last four seasons (6-3 in 2006; 7-2 in 2007; 6-2 in 2008; 6-4 in 2009).

• The schools that currently comprise the SEC have appeared in 379 bowls (including 2009-10). That is by far the most of any conference in the nation. In its history, the SEC is 196-170-13 in post-season bowl games, a 53.4 winning percentage. The SEC has the nation's top bowl winning percentage surpassing the Pac-10 (120-107-6, 52.8 percentage). Below is a look at how the various conferences have fared in bowl games in its history (using 2009 conference alignments):

MISCELLANY

• Since 2000, the Southeastern Conference has had more teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll than any other conference. The SEC has had 43 teams ranked in the last nine final USA Today Coaches polls, an average of almost five per season. The Big 12 is second with 36 teams ranked since 2000. The SEC has led or tied for lead in most teams ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Polls in seven of the last nine seasons.

• For the 10th straight year, the SEC has led the nation in total number of former players on NFL opening weekend rosters. The SEC has 272 of its former players on NFL opening weekend rosters followed by the ACC with 228, the Big Ten at 217, the Big 12 at 184 and the Pac-10 at 180. LSU leads all SEC schools with 35, followed by Florida, Georgia and Tennessee with 33 each.

• The SEC had 49 players selected in the 2010 NFL Draft. The number represents the most SEC players ever taken in the NFL Draft. The SEC had the most players taken among conferences in the draft. Behind the SEC's 49 selections were the Big Ten (34), ACC (31), Big 12 (30) and Pac-10 (29).

• Since 1990, the SEC has had 782 total selections in the NFL Draft, an average of 37.2 selections per year. The Big Ten is second with 672 selections.

• The SEC has now led or tied for the most selections in the NFL Draft for 11 of the last 13 seasons and the last four drafts.

SEC BOWL AGREEMENTS

The Southeastern Conference has agreements to send nine of its member institutions to postseason bowl games following the 2010 season.

The winner of the SEC Championship Game will automatically participate in the Bowl Championship Series comprised of the Sugar, Rose, Orange and Fiesta Bowls.

The Capital One Bowl has the second selection, making its pick following the BCS selections. The bowl must select the team with the next best overall record or a team that is within one win of the team with the next best overall record.

The AT&T Cotton and the Outback Bowls share the third and fourth selections from the SEC. The Cotton Bowl has the first preference of teams from the Western Division and the Outback Bowl has first preference of teams from the Eastern Division. The Cotton or Outback Bowl can select teams outside of its divisional preference, but must not select them before the opposite bowl selects from its divisional preference.

The Chick-fil-A Bowl has the fifth selection of preference from the SEC.

New to the SEC bowl rotation this year, the Gator Bowl has the sixth selection from the SEC.

The Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl has the seventh selection from the SEC.

In selections 8-9, the AutoZone Liberty and Birmingham Bowls share the selection over the four-year agreement.

Following the 2010 college football regular season, the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship. The BCS National Championship Game, which will stand alone from the four traditional BCS bowls but will be hosted by each of the bowls once during a four-year cycle.

The BCS consists of the Discover Orange, Allstate Sugar, Rose Bowl Game, Tostitos Fiesta Bowl and the Tostitos BCS National Championship Game. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

ESPN will televise all of the Bowl Championship Series games.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

CBS SPORTS

CBS Sports continues to be the exclusive national network broadcaster of SEC home football games, including the SEC Championship Game. CBS Sports will showcase the top conference matchups each week of the package with the "SEC Game of the Week". The agreement also includes a prime time game and doubleheader opportunities. In addition, CBS Sports continues its coverage of SEC regular-season basketball. In addition to the broadcast rights on CBS Sports, this 15-year contract includes certain digital, internet, wireless, Video-on-Demand, data and enhanced highlight rights across all CBS platforms, including CBS College Sports Network and CBSsports.com. Also, simulcasts of CBS Sports games will be available for distribution by the CBS College Sports Network.

ESPN

ESPN is the exclusive national cable home and the syndication rights holder for the SEC, including every SEC home football game (excluding those on the network broadcast package).

ESPN and ESPN2: The networks have increased coverage by combining to televise a minimum of 20 SEC games annually, including Saturday night and two primetime Thursday matchups.

ESPNU: The 24-hour college sports network presents an SEC Game of the Week (generally in primetime and a minimum of 13 games annually) as well as the studio show *SEC Weekly*.

SEC Network (ESPN Regional Television): The nation's largest syndicator of collegiate sports programming, is the official over-the-air syndication home for the SEC and will feature an SEC Game of the Week (generally at noon ET), with a minimum of 13 games each season throughout the SEC footprint and beyond. In addition, ESPN produces the integrated SEC Studio show, hosted by Dari Nowkhah, with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia and NFL standout.

ESPN360.com: Simulcasts of SEC game telecasts are offered on the broadband sports network.

ESPN Mobile TV: Live games are simulcast on mobile phones.

ESPN International: The agreement includes global rights to present live games and encore presentations.

ESPN Deportes: ESPN holds domestic Spanish-language rights for SEC football on the 24-hour, U.S.-based network.

ESPN GamePlan: The out-of-market college football pay-per-view service, offers SEC action.

ESPN Classic: The network may telecast select SEC live games as well as historic and immediate encore presentations.

ESPN.com: Extensive SEC content, including highlights, will be presented online.

COMCAST/ CHARTER SPORTS SOUTHEAST

Comcast / Charter Sports Southeast (CSS), the regional sports channel focusing on college sports in the southeast, has an agreement with ESPN to televise live Southeastern Conference (SEC) content including a minimum of six football games, twenty men's basketball games, and sixteen women's basketball games as well as fifty SEC Olympic sports each year. The agreement began with the 2009-10 academic year and goes for five years.

FOX SPORTS NET

Fox Sports Net's (FSN) regional sports networks serving the SEC territory – FOX Sports South, FOX Sports Carolinas, FOX Sports Tennessee, Sun Sports, FOX Sports Southwest and FOX Sports Houston – will be the outlets for a minimum of 92 SEC athletic events each year. Events will include eight live, exclusive football games, 20 men's basketball games, 24 women's basketball games (16 regular season, eight tournament), 16 baseball games (10 regular season, six tournament) and 24 additional Olympic sporting events (softball, volleyball, soccer, gymnastics). SEC athletic events on FSN will be distributed to more than 22 million cable and satellite households throughout the SEC territory.

INSTITUTIONAL MEDIA PACKAGES

As part of the SEC's television contracts, each conference institution was able to maintain a contractual television arrangement of its own. As part of this arrangement, each SEC institution has the ability to televise one pay-per-view football game per year as well as to host its own tape-delayed game package, coaches' TV shows as well as other sport packages.

SEC FOOTBALL SHOWS ON TELEVISION**SEC Weekly on ESPN**

SEC Weekly, a one-hour program airs Wednesdays at 5 p.m. ET on ESPN, throughout the academic year and will cover SEC sports, including sport-by-sport previews, reviews, specials and features on student-athletes. The show is hosted by Cara Capuano with analyst Matt Stinchcomb, a former University of Georgia All-America and NFL player. *SEC Weekly* is a product of ESPN's landmark 15-year agreement with the Southeastern Conference. ESPN will complement the show with SEC game telecasts, including football, basketball, Olympic sports and select conference championships.

SEC Gridiron Live

SEC Gridiron LIVE, airing live every Wednesday at 10 p.m. ET, breaks down every SEC game with footage, interviews and analysis. Tim Couch, former Kentucky standout and top pick in the 1999 NFL Draft, joins the live, weekly one-hour show as an analyst, with host Charles Davis and analyst Randy Cross. Also new to the SEC Gridiron LIVE team is social media host Kristina Akra. SECGridironLIVE.com is the hub for the show's social networking component, allowing viewers to participate in the live show and interact instantaneously with the broadcast team and SEC fans across the country.

CBS College Sports SEC Tailgate

Beginning Sept. 18, CBS Sports will start SEC programming with its live pre-game show COLLEGE FOOTBALL TODAY followed by the "SEC Game of the Week" CBS College Sports Network will broadcast SEC TAILGATE on select Saturdays at 2:00 PM, ET, from the site of CBS Sports' SEC Game of the Week. The show brings fans a fast paced and authoritative look at football and life in the SEC. The show captures all the excitement, traditions and festivities from the various campuses and stadiums across the SEC, and features local SEC legends and celebrity alumni.

THIS IS THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

SEC MISSION STATEMENT

"The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

THE SEC

The Southeastern Conference sponsors championships in 20 sports – 11 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.

2009-10 ANOTHER BANNER ATHLETIC YEAR FOR THE SEC

The SEC claimed four national championships in the 2009-10 year. SEC teams have won at least four national titles every year since 1991. In eight of its 20 sponsored sports, the SEC had either the national champion or the national runners-up. The SEC had national championships in football (Alabama), men's indoor track & field (Florida), women's swimming & diving (Florida) and baseball (South Carolina).

In its 77 year history, the Southeastern Conference has won 183 team national championships, including 67 since 2000. In this decade, the SEC has won at least one national championship in 16 of its 20 sponsored sports with the exception of women's cross country, volleyball, soccer and softball.

SEC LEADS ALL CONFERENCES IN 2009-10 OVERALL SPORTS CONFERENCE VS. CONFERENCE SURVEY

In a statistical survey that is based on NCAA championship and rankings, the Southeastern Conference placed first in both men's and women's sports. The survey, compiled each year since 1986 by Bo Carter, takes into account final NCAA championship standings in 10 men's and 11 women's sports and poll rankings in football. Each conference gets 20 points for a team that wins a national championship, 19 for a second place finish and down to 1 point for a 20th place finish. Wrestling is included in the men's totals, but the sport is not sponsored by the Southeastern Conference.

In the 10 men's sports for the survey, the SEC had 398 points with the Pac-10 coming in second with 396 points, followed by the Big 12 with 395 points, Big Ten with 279.5 points, ACC with 238 points and the Big East with 83 points. In the 11 women's sports the SEC sponsors, the SEC led the way with 502.5 points followed by the Pac-10 with 480 points, the Big 12 with 382 points, ACC with 369 points, Big Ten with 221 points and the Big East with 164 points.

Combining the 21 sports in the survey, the SEC had 900.5 points to pace all conferences followed by the Pac-10 with 876 points, Big 12 with 777 points, ACC with 607 points, Big Ten with 500.5 points and the Big East with 247 points. The SEC has had the highest men's point total in 17 seasons since 1986-87, the first year this survey was done, and in 11 of the last 12 seasons. The SEC has had the highest women's point total five times since 1986-87, including three of the last six years.

SEC LEADS DIVISION I CONFERENCES IN MOST FIRST-TEAM ESPN THE MAGAZINE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

The Southeastern Conference had 15 of its student-athletes earn first-team ESPN The Magazine / CoSIDA Academic All-America status in 2009-10, more than any other Division I conference in the nation. The Big 12 had 14 while the Big Ten and Pac-10 had 13 student-athletes each earn the honor.

The SEC had 36 total student-athletes earn either first, second or third team mention. That total is second overall to the Big 12 Conference, which had 39. The Big Ten was third with 34 total student-athletes earned first, second or third team mention.

The SEC's academic success of its student-athletes in 2009-10 was not just Academic All-Americans. The league honored 2,424 of its own student-athletes who made the SEC Academic Honor Roll. The league also honored Auburn swimmer Jordan Anderson and Tennessee track & field athlete Phoebe Wright with its McWhorter Scholar-Athletes of the Year as well as naming a scholar-athlete of the year in each of its sports.

Among honors given by the NCAA, SEC student-athletes also shined. Three student-athletes from the SEC – Florida's Tim Tebow (football), Georgia's Courtney Kupets (gymnastics) and Alabama's Brittany Rogers (softball) were honored this past year with the Today's Top VIII Award from the NCAA. Since 2004, the SEC has had 10 student-athletes awarded this honor, more than any other conference in the country.

The SEC also had 13 student-athletes receive NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships in 2009-10, more than any other conference in the nation.

SEC SPORTSMANSHIP STATEMENT

The SEC has developed a sportsmanship statement for its institutions to follow. It states: "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifested not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program. It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

SEC TOPS IN FAN SUPPORT

The Southeastern Conference has led the nation in total attendance in football every year since 1981 (29 straight years). Since 1988, the SEC has led the nation in average attendance. More than 6.5 million fans witnessed first-hand, the excitement of SEC football in 2009. The average capacity of the 12 SEC stadiums during the last 10 years has been 97 percent. Every year since 1988, the SEC has had at least four teams ranked in the top 10 in average attendance.

In men's basketball, the SEC has finished second in national average attendance for four straight seasons and has finished in the top three every year since 1994 (17 straight years). Kentucky has led the nation in 14 of the last 15 years in attendance. In 2009-10, five SEC schools finished in the top 30 in average attendance.

In women's basketball, after finishing third in the nation for 10 straight seasons, the SEC was second in national average attendance in 2009-10. The SEC has had at least two schools in the top 25 in average attendance every year since 1999-2000. Tennessee has led the nation in attendance in 10 of the last 11 seasons. In 2009-10, the SEC had four schools finish in the top 25 in average attendance.

In baseball, the SEC and one of its institutions have led the NCAA in total and average attendance for the last 13 seasons, and 18 of the last 24 years. The SEC and its member institutions own virtually all regular season, conference tournament, NCAA Regional and Super Regional attendance records. The SEC has broken its own national record each of the last five seasons in total attendance, after having set a goal of 1.5 million fans in 2005 as part of the league's "Drive for 1.5 ... Pack the Parks" promotion.

THE COACHES

Derek Dooley is in his first season at Tennessee and in his fourth season overall with a record of 19-25 (.432). The Volunteers' offensive coordinator is Jim Chaney and the defensive coordinator is Justin Wilcox.

Steve Spurrier is in his sixth season at South Carolina with a record of 40-30 (.571) and in his 26th season overall with a record of 229-111-2 (.673). Spurrier serves as the Gamecocks' offensive coordinator and the defensive coordinator is Lorenzo Ward.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN TENNESSEE HAS THE BALL

Matt Simms ranks ninth in the SEC in passing yards per game at 179.0. He threw a career-high three touchdowns against UAB, and his season high of 259 passing yards happened against Florida. Tauren Poole has recorded four 100-yard games and ranks sixth in the SEC with 85.0 rushing yards per game. Gerald Jones tied a career-high with seven catches vs. Alabama, recording 52 receiving yards. Jones' 19 receptions in 2010 are tied with Luke Stocker for the most on the Vols. Jones has 187 yards receiving and leads the team with 46.8 receiving yards per game. Denarius Moore has 18 receptions this season for 257 yards and a team-high four receiving TD's (five overall).

The Gamecocks lead the SEC and are ranked No. 5 in the nation with 24 sacks (3.43 per game). Devin Taylor has 6.5 sacks and 10.0 tackles for loss thru the first seven games. He has 28 total tackles to rank seventh on the team and ranks third in the SEC in sacks. Melvin Ingram had his best game as a Gamecock with 2.0 sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss in the victory over Alabama. Ingram now has 6.0 career sacks with 3.5 this season. Stephon Gilmore had a stellar outing vs. Alabama as well, sharing the team lead with nine tackles, including a career-best 2.0 sacks.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN SOUTH CAROLINA HAS THE BALL

Chris Walker leads the front four with 28 tackles (2.0 for loss) this season and is second on the team with four quarterback hurries. Gerald Williams leads the squad with 2.5 sacks and is second with 4 tackles for loss. Nick Reveiz ranks 3rd in the SEC with a career-high 65 tackles. He reached double figures in tackles for the fifth time this year with 11 vs. Alabama. Prentiss Wagner leads the team with two interceptions, both returned for TDs. Janzen Jackson is second on the team with 40 tackles.

Alshon Jeffery leads the SEC and is third in the nation in receiving yards per game, averaging 121.1 yards per contest. He also leads the league with 7.0 catches per game. With 158 yards against Vanderbilt, Jeffery moved into the all-time top-10 in career receiving yards at Carolina with 1,611 yards. Stephen Garcia is second in the SEC and fifth in the nation with a pass efficiency rating of 170.2. Marcus Lattimore is on pace to become South Carolina's all-time leader in single-season touchdowns.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Chad Cunningham is up to fourth in the SEC and 27th nationally (NCAA minimum is 3.6 punts per game) with a punting average of 43.8. Michael Palardy made his first career field goal, a 33-yarder against Alabama that closed the first half and pulled UT to within 13-10. Served as Tennessee's placekicker last three games and is 5-for-5 on PAT's. He also punted once for 51 yards at LSU, his first collegiate attempt. He has handled kickoff duties in five games.

Through seven games, Spencer Lanning has punted 26 times for an average of 44.7 yards per punt, ranking him 20th in the nation and third in the SEC in punting average. He is also 4-for-6 on field goal attempts on the season, but has only attempted one in the last four games.

THE COACHES

Urban Meyer is in his sixth season at Florida with a record of 61-13 (.824) and 10th overall with a record of 100-21 (.826). The Gators' offensive coordinator is Steve Addazio and the defensive coordinator is Teryl Austin.

Mark Richt is in his 10th season at Georgia and overall with a record of 94-31 (.752). The Bulldogs' offensive coordinator is Mike Bobo and Todd Grantham serves as the defensive coordinator.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN FLORIDA HAS THE BALL

John Brantley has completed 125 of 208 passes (62.0 percent) for 1,266 yards and six touchdowns with five interceptions for a passer rating of 117.9. Trey Burton has scored a touchdown on nine of his 52 offensive touches (not including pass attempts) this season. Jeff Demps leads the Gators with 482 rushing yards through seven games, averaging 6.5 yards per carry. Deonte Thompson leads the UF receiving corps with 25 receptions for 353 yards (14.1 avg.), an average of 50.4 yards per game. In SEC play, Carl Moore has 15 catches for 256 yards (17.1 avg.).

Junior DeAngelo Tyson has started seven games at nose for Georgia this season. He posted a career-high five tackles against UK, including half a sack. Also versus the Wildcats, senior DE Kianté Tripp, who has played OL and TE in his career, tallied a career-best four tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss. Thanks to 5.5 more sacks in his last three games, junior OLB Justin Houston remains the SEC leader with 9.0. Houston is also second in the conference in tackles for loss (14.5) after exploding for 3.5 TFLs at UK. Houston also added a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and 2.5 sacks against the Wildcats. Akeem Dent managed a career-high 15 stops at Kentucky and is second in the league with 77 stops.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN GEORGIA HAS THE BALL

Justin Trattou has tallied a career-high nine tackles in back-to-back games and has six tackles for loss during SEC play. A.J. Jones has 32 tackles, including three tackles for loss, and two pass breakups this season, while Brandon Hicks has 16 tackles and 1.5 sacks. Jonathan Bostic has three interceptions this season, tying for the team lead. Ahmad Black has led the team in tackles four times this season, tallying a career-best 13 against LSU, a then-personal-high 12 vs. Miami, 10 in the Mississippi State game and eight against USF. He leads the team for the season with 60 tackles, including three for loss.

For the first time in history, the Bulldogs have scored more than 40 points in three straight SEC games during a trio of victories. Washaun Ealey set a new school record with five rushing touchdowns in a game against Kentucky. On a career-high 28 carries, Ealey had 157 yards versus the Wildcats, which marked the third 100-yard game of his career. Kris Durham was the leading receiver in each of the first three games while A.J. Green was out and is the team leader in 2010. He has 22 catches for 453 yards and two touchdowns on the year.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Demps leads the SEC with a 32.5-yard kick return average (min. five). He has returned eight kicks for 260 yards with a long of 54. He had a kickoff return of 40-plus yards in each of the first three games this season. Andre Debose recorded an 88-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against LSU. Chas Henry leads the nation in yards per punt with a 49.3 average (min. 15 punts). He also has helped the Gators to the best net punting average in the nation at 44.6 yards.

Junior cornerback Brandon Boykin sped to his fourth kickoff return for a touchdown (third 100-yard return) in his career to tie an SEC record against Kentucky. So far in 2010, Drew Butler has averaged 45.5 yards on 33 punts, 11 that went for 50+. Blair Walsh is now 14-for-17 on FGs for the year and 49-for-62 in his career. He missed his first extra point of his career at Kentucky after making 119 straight.

The Georgia-Florida series began in 1904, a 52-0 Bulldog win in Macon... Georgia leads the series 47-39-2, including 40-37-1 in Jacksonville... The last UGA win was 2007, where the Georgia's defense sacked Tim Tebow six times in that matchup... The game may most be remembered for the Bulldogs' on-field celebration following the first of three Knowshon Moreno touchdown runs... THE COACHES

Gene Chizik is in his second season at Auburn with a record of 15-5 (.750) and in his fourth season overall with a record of 20-24 (.455). The Tigers' offensive coordinator is Gus Malzahn and the defensive coordinator is Ted Roof.

Houston Nutt is in his third season at Ole Miss with a record of 21-12 (.636) and 18th overall with a record of 132-82 (.617). The Rebels' co-offensive coordinators are Mike Markuson and Dave Rader and the defensive coordinator is Tyrone Nix.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN AUBURN HAS THE BALL

Cam Newton leads the SEC and ranks sixth nationally (second among quarterbacks) in rushing, averaging 134.6 yards per game, and has a nation-best 14 rushing touchdowns. Newton ranks third nationally in passing efficiency (172.08) and became the first quarterback in school history to throw at least two touchdown passes in each of the first five games of a season. Michael Dyer had his second 100-yard rushing performance against LSU, and now has 543 yards rushing this season.

The Rebel defense ranks fifth in the SEC in sacks (19). Ole Miss has allowed the most points in the league, surrendering 32.0 points per game. The Rebels are 10th in total defense (370.6), but sixth in rushing defense (125.0). Allen Walker currently ranks second in the SEC in forced fumbles with three and third on the team in tackles. Against Arkansas, Walker forced off his second career pass and forced a fumble. Jonathan Cornell leads Ole Miss and ranks 13th in the SEC in tackles (7.3 pg). He also ranks seventh in the league in TFLs (1.36 pg) and 11th in sacks (0.5 pg).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN OLE MISS HAS THE BALL

Auburn's defense has excelled against the run this season, ranking third in the SEC and 16th nationally in rushing defense, allowing just 103.4 yards per game. Nick Fairley has emerged as a force at defensive tackle for Auburn, leading the SEC in tackles for loss with 17.0, which is second most in the nation, and ranking second in the league in sacks with 7.5, which is tied for 10th most. Josh Byrnes led Auburn in tackles last season with 104, and is leading again this season with 53 tackles, including 5.0 tackles for loss.

Ole Miss is ranked third in the SEC in rushing offense (211.1), fifth in total offense (410.3) and sixth in scoring offense (31.4). The Rebels have allowed the fewest sacks in the league, giving up just seven all season. Quarterback Jeremiah Masoli is a dual threat, ranking second on the team with 400 yards rushing and averaging 180.0 yards passing per game. Markeith Summers turned in his second career 100-yard receiving game against the Razorbacks with three catches for 104 yards and two TDs. Brandon Bolden currently ranks seventh in the SEC averaging 79.9 yards per game.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Wes Byrum has made 27 of his last 32 field goal attempts after hitting just 11-of-19 in 2008. He scored 17 points on three field goals and eight PATs vs. Arkansas Oct. 16. Demond Washington ranks eighth in the SEC averaging 25.2 yards per kickoff return, and had 126 kickoff return yards against Arkansas State. Oterio McCalebb returned a kick-off 99 yards against Arkansas.

Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks third nationally in punt returns, averaging 20.6 per return on eight returns. Tyler Campbell averages a league-best 45.9 yards per punt. Bryson Rose has started out the 2010 season an outstanding 36-for-38 on kicks. Rose converted on a 22-yard field goal and all three PATs at Arkansas and set a career-high with 13 points against Fresno State. Rose ranks in the SEC in PAT percentage (1.000/1st), scoring (7.4 ppg/4th) and field goals (1.14 pg/4th).

THE COACHES

Joker Phillips is in his first season at Kentucky and overall. The Wildcats' offensive coordinator is Randy Sanders and the defensive coordinator is Steve Brown.

Dan Mullen is in his second season at MSU and overall with a record of 11-9 (.550). Les Koenning serves as the offensive coordinator and the co-defensive coordinators are Manny Diaz and Chris Wilson.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN KENTUCKY HAS THE BALL

Mike Hartline has had back-to-back career games. He posted his second straight 300-yard game with a career-high 353 yards and four touchdowns vs. Georgia. Hartline currently ranks second in the SEC in passing yards per game (268.0) and is third in total offense (266.1 yards per game). Chris Matthews has an SEC-high seven TD catches this season. Matthews had 12 catches for 177 yards against South Carolina, both career highs. It was his second 100-yard receiving performance of the year and his career. Randall Cobb currently leads the Wildcats in pass receiving with 47 for 511 yards and five touchdowns, is second in rushing with 195 yards and three TDs.

State ranks 14th nationally in scoring (17.0 points per game allowed) and 23rd in tackles for loss (7.13 per game). Chris White posted a team-season-high 14 tackles in last week's win over UAB. White now has 71 total tackles on the year, the third highest total in the SEC. Corey Broomfield is tied for the national lead among active players with three career pick-sixes and the total has set the Mississippi State school record and tied for second-most in the SEC. The Bulldogs are ranked 33rd nationally in turnovers with a plus-4 margin.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN MISSISSIPPI STATE HAS THE BALL

UK ranks third in the SEC in pass defense, limiting the opponent to just 176.8 yards per game in the air. Danny Trevathan is having an impressive season as he paces the defense with a league-leading 81 tackles. He has posted double-figure tackles in five games this season, including four in a row. The last Wildcat to record double-figure tackles in four-straight games was Jeff Snedegar in 1997. Trevathan also ranks eighth in the league in the tackles for loss category with nine TFL. Winston Guy is second on the team in tackles with 54 stops.

The Bulldogs currently rank 15th nationally and second in the SEC with a 219.3 ypg average on the ground. Vick Ballard had scored at least one touchdown each of the first six games, and he remains tied for the SEC lead with both a total of 72 points and 12 touchdown scored. Chris Relf has improved his career completion percentage to 53% after beginning the season at 48%. He's passed for five touchdowns and has not thrown an interception during the Bulldogs' five-game winning streak. LaDarius Perkins ran for 131 yards (his first 100-yard effort) on 18 carries last week vs UAB.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Cobb is a capable punt returner and ranks fourth in the SEC in punt return average with 9.8 yards per runback. He has two punt return touchdowns in his career, including a 50-yard scoring return this season. For the season Ryan Tydlacka ranks fourth in the SEC at 45.1 yards per punt. Derrick Locke is UK's all-time leader in kickoff return average at 27.3 per return, including two 100-yard returns.

Heath Hutchins may not be leading the nation in punting yards, but the senior has punted 32 times and allowed only 17 return yards. After dropping 11 punts inside the 20 a year ago, Hutchins has already pinned opponents deep in their own territory 14 times this season. He's also forced 14 fair catches with three fumbled and turned back over to State.

THE COACHES

Robbie Caldwell is in his first season at Vanderbilt and overall. The Commodores' offensive coordinator is Des Kitchings and the defensive coordinator is Jamie Bryant.

Bobby Petrino is in his third season at Arkansas with a record of 17-14 (.548) and eighth overall with a record of 61-33 (.649). The Razorbacks' offensive coordinator is Garrick McGee and the defensive coordinator is Willie Robinson.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN VANDERBILT HAS THE BALL

Larry Smith surpassed the 1,000-yard mark for passing yards in the South Carolina game. His 1,005-yard total ranks ninth all-time among Vanderbilt junior QBs. Smith needs 379 passing yards to overtake Mike Wright (1,383 yards, 1977) into eighth place. John Cole surpassed 50 career catches vs. the Gamecocks. He has 52 receptions in 17 career appearances. Cole also has a reception of 32 yards or more in three of the last four games. Since the 2003 opener, Vanderbilt is 14-0 when a running back reaches 100 rushing yards.

Arkansas ranks second in the SEC and 13th in the NCAA in sacks, averaging 2.86 per game in 2010. Defensive end Jake Bequette leads the team and is sixth in the SEC with 5.0 this season, while fellow DE Tenarius Wright's 3.0 sacks are tied for 12th in the conference. Jerry Franklin leads the team and is ninth in the SEC with 56 tackles this season and has paced the team in tackles five times this season. Franklin ranks second on the team with 7.5 tackles for a loss. Anthony Leon leads the team and is tied for fifth in the SEC with 10.0 tackles for a loss. He also is tied for third on the team with 2.5 sacks in 2010.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR WHEN ARKANSAS HAS THE BALL

Casey Hayward shares the NCAA lead with five interceptions. Hayward, believed to be the first Commodore of the modern era to achieve interceptions in four consecutive games, also tops the squad with seven career picks. Tim Fugger ranks third nationally with four forced fumbles. Only two Commodore defenders since 1983 have posted more forced fumbles in a season than Fugger. John Stokes is the team's second leading tackler (53 total stops) and has established a new single-season career high for tackles.

Ryan Mallett leads the SEC and ranks ninth in the NCAA with 291.4 passing yards per game. His SEC-leading total of 56 completions of 15 yards or more is fourth in the nation, while his 20 completions of 25- plus yards are second in the SEC and tied for 14th in the country. Knile Davis leads Arkansas with 470 rushing yards this season. Greg Childs is tied for second in the SEC and 16th in the NCAA with six touchdown receptions this season. He also ranks third in the SEC and 29th in the NCAA with 81.7 receiving yards per game. Joe Adams leads the SEC and ranks fourth in the nation with his 18.1 yards-per-catch average.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Norman continues to move up VU all-time kickoff return charts. Norman, who had 155 yards on eight returns at Georgia two weeks ago, moved up three positions to No. 6 all-time on the list. He is averaging 24.8 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 44th in the NCAA. Norman is now averaging 26.0 yards per kickoff for his career. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2 yard average.

Zach Hocker is a perfect 29-for-29 on PATs and 6-of-7 on field goals. His 85.7 field goal percentage puts Arkansas on top of the conference. In Hocker's first SEC game, he made a 48-yard field goal that was the longest for the Razorbacks since 2000. He then matched that with a 48 yarder against Alabama and made his third of 45+ yards with a 46 yarder vs. Ole Miss. Against Ole Miss, Adams returned a punt 97 yards for a touchdown, the longest of his career and longest punt return for a touchdown in Arkansas history.
