## WHAT TO WATCH FOR...

- This is the 37th meeting all-time between Ole Miss and Auburn dating back to 1928 ... Auburn leads the all-time series 27-9 ... The Rebels are just 2-9 versus the Tigers in Oxford, with their last win coming in 2008.
- This game will be the 85th Homecoming game at Ole Miss since 1924 ... The Rebels are 67-15-2 (.810 winning pct.) all-time in Homecoming games and have won 13 of their last 15 ... Ole Miss lost last year's Homecoming game 27-7 to Louisiana Tech ... This is the first time that Auburn will serve as Ole Miss' Homecoming opponent.
- The Rebels are seeking their first SEC victory since beating Kentucky on Oct. 2, 2010.
- Ole Miss has not lost when it has scored first this year (3-0), but is winless when the opponent scores first (0-3).
- The Rebels rank 25th nationally in rushing offense (213.0 ypg) ... They rank top five among SEC teams in total offense, rushing, passing, third-down conversion percentage and first downs.
- Ole Miss ranks fourth in the SEC and top 20 in the NCAA in both sacks (2.8/game) and tackles for loss (7.7/game).
- On offense, Ole Miss has scored in 17 of its 19 red zone trips (89.5 percent, 4th in SEC), while on defense the Rebels have allowed just 16 scores in 24 chances (66.7 percent, T-3rd in SEC).
- Junior RB **Jeff Scott** ranks seventh in the SEC with 85.0 rushing ypg and has two 100-yard performances.
- Sophomore WR **Donte Moncrief** ranks fifth in the SEC with 75.5 receiving ypg and second with five TD catches.

**WORKING CREDENTIALS:** To request credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: sportssystem.com/OleMiss. All requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working press only. Working space in the Vaught-Hemingway Stadium press box will be allotted on the following basis: (1) Daily newspapers and television stations covering for daily news programs; (2) Sports editors of Mississippi daily newspapers; (3) Radio personnel for an originating broadcast; (4) Official school daily, one seat only; (5) Television sports directors and approved special coverage; (6) Press and TV working photographers, weekly press representatives, non-broadcasting radio representatives and internet sites whose primary purpose is to gather news and disseminate it.

**MEDIA WILL-CALL:** If not received by mail, credentials may be picked up at the media "Will Call" table, located next to the press box elevators at Gate 6 on the west side of Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, beginning three hours prior to kickoff. Please be mindful that parking passes cannot be picked up at will-call and must be received prior to gameday.

**PARKING:** The lot just to the west of the Turner Center is reserved for media parking. Entry is available from Hill Drive, and the satellite truck lot entrance is across the street. A golf cart is available to help members of the media transport heavy equipment from the press parking area to the press box. Please be mindful that parking passes cannot be picked up at will-call and must be received prior to gameday.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Credentials for photographers will be issued on the basis of circulation, with priority granted to agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis. Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes. All photographers must exchange their photo pass for a vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be done at the media "Will Call" table next to the press box elevators. Gameday flip cards will be available at that location.

**SIDELINE ACCESS:** Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/ videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media "Will Call" without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. Vests must be worn at all times on the sideline. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area. This includes during pre-game activities.

**RECRUITS:** Per NCAA rule, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their visit (official or unofficial) to campus, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. Contact includes in-person conversations, phone calls, text messages, e-mails, etc. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

**REAL-TIME DATA RIGHTS:** The acceptance of media credentials is an acknowledgement of the University of Mississippi's rights to the game and play-by-play coverage and your agreement to abide by any restrictions Ole Miss may place on real-time play-by-play coverage and use of comprehensive game statistics. Failure to abide by these restrictions implemented by Ole Miss may result in revocation of press credentials. Ole Miss reserves the right to grant approval for distribution of real time play-by-play, game-related statistics and information through the Internet.

**TELEPHONES:** The Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/ Hollingsworth Field Press Box contains an adequate number of telephones for general use by visiting media. The telephones are available to all media outlets and are not reserved for any single outlet. Personal phones may be ordered at individual seats by contacting AT&T at 1-800-945-6500. Please alert the Athletics Media Relations office if you are ordering a phone so your press box seat location will correspond with the work order.

**GAMEDAY SERVICES:** Members of the media covering Ole Miss will be provided with pregame notes for both teams, a game program and a flipcard. Statistics and a running play-by-play will be handed out after each quarter. Approximately 30 minutes following the completion of the game, a final statistical book, including complete team and individual stats, running play-by-play and postgame quotes from players and coaches, will be available.

**POSTGAME INTERVIEWS:** For home games, Coach Hugh Freeze will hold a postgame news conference with the media in the team meeting room of the Indoor Practice Facility. Athletics Media Relations office representatives will be available to assist in postgame interviews. Complete postgame plans will be announced on gameday in the press box by the Athletics Media Relations Director (MRD). The MRD will accompany members of the press wishing to go to the sidelines, beginning with five minutes remaining in the final quarter.

**WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE:** Coach Freeze holds a weekly press conference each Monday during the season, beginning at 1 p.m. (CT), in the team meeting room of the Indoor Practice Facility, which is adjacent to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone. The number for the two-way teleconference may be obtained by contacting the Athletics Media Relations office at (662) 915-7522. Requested players and assistant coaches, will be available following the press conference. Media who wish to interview players or assistant coaches on Monday must email their request to kyle@olemiss.edu by 3 p.m. Sunday.

**PRACTICES:** Ole Miss football practices are open to media Tuesday through Thursday for periods 1 through 4. Video is permitted for any drill during the open periods that does not include offense vs. defense (i.e. 7-on-7, 11-on-11), although media may be alerted of other portions that are not available for video. Media should remain at the bottom of the stairs to the practice fields (or when indoors, in the IPF northwest lobby) until alerted by Media Relations that practice is open. Coach Freeze and select players will be available following practice Tuesday and Wednesday, and assistant coaches will be available upon request after practice Tuesday through Thursday.

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST AUBURN

**October 29, 2011 • Auburn, Ala. • #23 Auburn 41, Ole Miss 23:** Senior running back Brandon Bolden rushed for a season-high 114 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns, but Ole Miss fell to No. 23 Auburn 41-23 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

**October 30, 2010 • Auburn, Ala. • #1 Auburn 51, Ole Miss 31:** Freshman Jeff Scott rushed for 134 yards and a touchdown and junior Brandon Bolden added two more rushing scores, but Ole Miss fell to the top-ranked Auburn Tigers 51-31. Cam Newton caught a touchdown pass, to go with the two TD passes he threw, and Mike Dyer ran for 180 yards for Auburn.

**October 31, 2009 • Auburn, Ala. • Auburn 33, #22 Ole Miss 20:** Chris Todd passed for 212 yards, Ben Tate ran for 144 yards and Walt McFadden returned an interception for a TD to lift Auburn to a 33-20 win over No. 22 Ole Miss. The Tigers scored 23 points in the third quarter. Dexter McCluster had his second straight huge game for the Rebels, rushing for 186 yards on 22 carries and catching four passes for another 17.

**November 1, 2008 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 17, Auburn 7:** Jevan Snead threw two touchdown passes, Cordera Eason rushed for 104 yards and Ole Miss capitalized on a series of fourth-quarter mistakes by Auburn to beat the Tigers 17-7. Ole Miss cornerbacks Cassius Vaughn and Marshay Green each had their first career interceptions, helping to kill drives with the game on the line.

**October 27, 2007 • Auburn, Ala. • #23 Auburn 17, Ole Miss 3:** Ole Miss contained No. 23 Auburn's offense, but could not get any offense of its own going as the Tigers prevailed 17-3 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. The Rebels managed just 193 yards of total offense. BenJarvus Green-Ellis led the Rebels with 62 yards on 13 carries. Auburn's Brandon Cox completed 16-of-26 passes for 189 yards and a 34-yard touchdown pass to Rod Smith in the final minutes of the game that sealed the win.

**OLE MISS HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE**

**Hugh Freeze** (Southern Miss, 1992) is in his first season at the Ole Miss helm, after being named the University's 37th head football coach on Dec. 5, 2011. A proven winner at every level he has coached, Freeze now boasts a 33-10 career record, including last year's 10-2 season at Arkansas State in which the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference title and Freeze was tabbed Sun Belt Coach of the Year. It is his second stint at Ole Miss, as he was a member of the Rebel coaching staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator with two of the top classes in UM history.

**AUBURN HEAD COACH GENE CHIZIK**

Gene Chizik (Florida, 1985) guided Auburn to a national title, SEC championship and three bowl victories in his first three seasons at the helm. Now in his fourth year, Chizik has recorded a 31-14 record as the Tigers' head coach and owns a career mark of 36-33. He coached at Iowa State for two years before moving to the Plains. Auburn went 8-5 with an Outback Bowl victory in Chizik's first season before claiming the 2010 SEC and BCS national championships the following year with a perfect 14-0 record. Last year, the Tigers went 8-5 again and won the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

**AUBURN SCOUTING REPORT**

Auburn is off to a 1-4 start, including an 0-3 record in league play. The Tigers' lone win came against Louisiana-Monroe, 31-28 in overtime. Most recently, Auburn fell by a score of 24-7 to Arkansas at home. The Tigers' offense is led by a two-man rushing attack in Tre Mason (307 yards, 59 carries, 1 TD) and Onterio McCalebb (262 yards, 49 carries, 2 TDs), while Emory Blake leads all AU receivers with 22 catches, 340 receiving yards and two scores. McCalebb also has a kick return touchdown to his credit. The Tigers' quarterback, Kiehl Frazier, has completed 56-of-103 passes for 684 yards with two TDs and eight interceptions.

**FAST START FOR FREEZE**

- Nearby Independence, Miss., native **Hugh Freeze** has gotten off to a fast start as the Ole Miss head coach.
- The Rebels are 3-3 and eclipsed last year's win total in just four games.
  - The Rebels rank top five in the SEC in total offense (4th, 439.0 ypg), rushing (4th, 213.0 ypg) and passing (5th, 226.0 ypg).
  - The Ole Miss offense eclipsed 500 total yards in back-to-back games (UCA, UTEP) for the first time since doing so against UAB and Arkansas in 2009.
  - The 49 points against UCA were the most by an Ole Miss team since a 55-38 win over Fresno State in 2010.
  - The 39-0 win at Tulane was the team's first shutout since beating Mississippi State 45-0 in 2008.

**STOUT RUNNING GAME**

- Even though **Hugh Freeze** offenses have been known for their prolific passing attacks, Ole Miss has excelled in the running game so far this season.
- Ole Miss ranks fourth in the SEC and 25th nationally in rushing offense (213.0 ypg) after finishing 10th in the league last year (129.6 ypg).
  - Ole Miss leads all SEC teams with 79 first downs by a rush (next closest is 63 by Georgia).
  - The Rebels have scored 15 rushing touchdowns, tied for third-most among SEC teams.
  - Junior RB **Jeff Scott** ranks seventh in the SEC in rushing (85.0 ypg) and has posted two 100-yard efforts.
  - As a team, Ole Miss eclipsed 300 rushing yards against UTEP (330) and Tulane (304).

**SWARMING DEFENSE**

- In its last three games, Ole Miss has posted a shutout of Tulane and quality defensive showings against No. 1 Alabama and Texas A&M.
- In its first shutout since 2008, the Rebel defense held Tulane to 159 total offensive yards and 14 rushing yards.
  - Ole Miss "won" the second half against Alabama (7-6), limiting the Crimson Tide to two field goals after the break.
  - The Rebels held the Crimson Tide to season lows in points (33), total yards (305) and passing yards (180).
  - Ole Miss forced a season-high six turnovers (four fumbles, two interceptions) against a Texas A&M team that had only turned the ball over once in its first four games.
  - The Rebels sacked Texas A&M QB Johnny Manziel four times and recorded 13 tackles for loss against the Aggies.
  - Ole Miss ranks fourth in the SEC and 16th in the NCAA with 2.83 sacks per game.
  - Ole Miss ranks fourth in the SEC and 17th in the NCAA with 7.67 TFLs per game.

**RED HOT IN THE RED ZONE**

- Ole Miss has scored in 17 of its 19 red zone trips this year (89.5 percent), which ranks fourth among SEC teams.
- The Rebels have scored a touchdown in 15 of their 19 chances (78.9 percent), second-best among league foes.
- Ole Miss is one of only four SEC teams that has yet to turn the ball over inside the red zone.
- On defense, Ole Miss is allowing its opponent to score just two out of every three chances (16 of 24, 66.7 percent), which is tied for third-best among SEC squads.

### THE SIGNIFICANCE OF 30

The number 30 has proven to be a key indicator of Ole Miss' success so far. When the Rebels hold the other team to less than 30 points, they win. When giving up 30 or more, they have lost each time.

### GREAT SCOTT

Although he stands at only 5-foot-7, junior RB **Jeff Scott** has played big for the Rebels this year. He ranks seventh in the SEC and 52nd in the NCAA with 85.0 yards per outing and has an average of 6.0 yards per carry. He is tied for eighth among SEC players with 6.0 points scored per game and has reached the end zone five times in the last four games. The Miami, Fla., native eclipsed the century mark in rushing yards against UTEP (111) and Texas A&M (108) and now has five career 100-yard rushing games. In the Texas game, he picked up 95 yards on just eight carries, including a 48-yard TD scamper. He scored twice against Tulane with 62 yards on 11 carries. Scott was a preseason All-SEC first team pick by USA Today and made the preseason watch list for the Paul Hornung Award (nation's most versatile player).

### FEED MONCRIEF

Sophomore WR **Donte Moncrief** continues to prove himself as one of the top receivers in the SEC. He ranks fifth in the SEC with 75.5 receiving yards per outing and eighth with 4.5 catches per game. His five touchdown catches are second-most among SEC receivers. He has failed to score in just one game this season. Against No. 12 Texas, he posted his second 100-yard receiving game of the year with a career-high 144 on seven catches.

### ROOKIE LEADERS

Redshirt-freshman LB **Denzel Nkemdiche**, true freshman DB **Trae Elston** and true freshman DT **Issac Gross** have already asserted themselves as defensive leaders in their first collegiate games. Nkemdiche has started all six games at Stinger and leads the team with 38 tackles, 8.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and two forced fumbles. He ranks fifth among SEC players in TFLs (tops among freshmen) and tied for fifth in fumbles forced. Elston was promoted to starting Rover for the Tulane game and ranks seventh on the team with 23 tackles, including 16 in the last three games. Gross has started five of six games at nose tackle and has 17 tackles, including 3.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks.

### ODDS AND ENDS

- Ole Miss tops all SEC teams with 140 first downs (79 rush, 53 pass, 8 penalty).
  - The Rebels are T-2nd in the SEC in fourth-down conversion percentage (75.0, 6-of-8) and 1st in opponents fourth-down conversion rate (20.0, 2-of-10).
  - Ole Miss has not lost when it has scored first (3-0) and has not won when the opponent scores first (0-3).
  - The Rebels average the third-fewest penalties per game among SEC teams (4.7) and fifth-least penalty yards per game (41.5) despite season highs against Texas A&M (10 for 71 yards).
  - Ole Miss has already completed its non-league schedule and closes out the season with eight straight SEC foes.
  - In addition to Freeze, all but one of the assistant coaches (**Derrick Nix**) are new to the team this year. However, four assistant coaches had served a prior stint at Ole Miss - **Maurice Harris, Grant Heard, Matt Luke** and **Dan Werner**.

**FRESHMAN WALTON LIKES THE END ZONE**

True freshman RB/RS **Jaylen Walton** likes to score touchdowns, and he's not picky about how he does it. Walton reached the end zone in each of his first three college games - one rushing, one receiving and one kick return. Amazingly, he scored three TDs on his first 11 touches (six rushes, one reception, four kick returns) of his college career. Against Texas, he made a highlight-reel move along the sideline on his way to the fifth 100-yard kick return for a touchdown in school history.

**REBELS PITCH A SHUTOUT**

Ole Miss' 39-0 win over Tulane was the team's first shutout since a 45-0 win over Mississippi State in 2008. It was the 208th shutout in school history. The Rebels held the Green Wave to 14 rushing yards, which marked the second time this year that an opponent failed to get 50 yards on the ground against the Rebel "D" (UTEP, 37).

**NKEMDICHE HONORED FOR BIG GAME IN TUSCALOOSA**

Coming off a stellar performance against top-ranked Alabama, Ole Miss redshirt-freshman linebacker **Denzel Nkemdiche** was named Week 5 SEC Co-Defensive Player of the Week. He shared the honor with Georgia defensive back Sanders Commings. Nkemdiche, all 5-foot-11 and 203 pounds of him, racked up a career-high 11 tackles against the Crimson Tide. Three of those tackles were for a loss, including a quarterback sack that set the Tide back 10 yards. He also forced two Alabama fumbles. He led a Rebel defense that held Alabama to a season low in points and yards, limiting the Tide to just six second-half points.

## GRIFFING RECOGNIZED AS SEC LEGEND

Glynn Griffing has been selected as the Rebels' representative for the 2012 SEC Football Legends Class. Griffing was the quarterback and co-captain of Ole Miss' undefeated 1962 national championship team, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year. It is the only perfect season in school history. The SEC Legends class will be honored at the 2012 SEC Football "Weekend of Champions" Nov. 30-Dec. 1 in Atlanta. The annual SEC Legends Dinner presented by AT&T will be held Nov. 30 at the Hyatt Regency in Atlanta and the group will also be recognized prior to the SEC Championship Game, which will be held at the Georgia Dome on Dec. 1.

## FORWARD TOGETHER REBELS

The Forward Together capital campaign, which seeks to raise \$150 million in support of a comprehensive initiative aimed at new facility construction and existing facility enhancements for Ole Miss Athletics, has reached approximately \$75 million as of the start of the 2012 football season. Among the football improvements planned are renovations and improvements to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium concourse area, expansion of the north endzone of Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to improve the overall aesthetic look and feel of the stadium and creation of an Ole Miss Athletics Hall of Fame. The plans also include a new, state-of-the-art basketball arena to replace Tad Smith Coliseum.

## LOVIN' THE LONE STAR STATE

- This year, Ole Miss hosted three schools from the state of Texas (UTEP, Texas, Texas A&M) for the first time in program history.
- The last time the Rebels played three teams from Texas in the same season was in 1957 - Trinity (in San Antonio), Houston (in Jackson, Miss.) and Texas (in the Sugar Bowl).
- Ole Miss is the first school in SEC history to play regular-season home games in the same season against Texas and Texas A&M. LSU played both schools in the 1948 regular season, but opened the year at Texas and two weeks later played Texas A&M in Baton Rouge.

- Sophomore WR **Donte Moncrief** recorded his first career game with 100 receiving yards, catching eight passes

for 104 yards and a TD ... Junior WR **Philander Moore** caught his first touchdown as a Rebel on a 25-yard reception from Wallace in the fourth quarter ... Senior TE **Jamal Mosley** posted career highs with four catches and 79 receiving yards and caught the second touchdown of his career with an 11-yard reception from Brunetti in the fourth quarter ... Junior WR **Korvic Neat** posted career highs with six catches for 75 yards.

- Freshman RB **Jaylen Walton** ran in a 10-yard touchdown on his first career touch in the first quarter.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Redshirt freshman LB **Denzel Nkemdiche** made his Rebel debut and led all tacklers with eight tackles, including three TFLs ... Junior DB **Dehendret Collins** also made his debut and had seven tackles and a pass break-up.

- Junior DB **Frank Crawford** picked off the first pass of his career in the fourth quarter.

- Senior **E.J. Epperson** earned the start at defensive end after spending the first three years of his Rebel career on the offensive side of the ball.

- With two field goals made, Rose moved into seventh place in school history with 30 career field goals ... He moved into a tie for sixth place all-time with 178 points scored by a kicker.

## HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE

A Mississippi native, inspirational leader and one of the nation's top rising coaches, Hugh Freeze was the first choice to return championships to Ole Miss Football and was introduced as the Rebels' 37th head coach on December 5, 2011.

Freeze, a noted speaker and recruiter throughout his career, has enjoyed success at nearly every coaching level over the past 18 years, from high school to NAIA to FBS, and each stop has featured a high-scoring offense and the ability to motivate young people. The most recent stop for the former Ole Miss assistant was a record-setting run at Arkansas State.

With Freeze as head coach in 2011, the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference championship and became just the third school in Sun Belt history to finish undefeated in league play with a perfect 8-0 mark. The 10-2 overall record marked the program's first 10-win season since 1986, when ASU was a member of the I-AA Southland Conference.

In the best debut season ever by an A-State head coach, Freeze became just the 14th FBS first-year head coach to win 10 regular season games. He also returned ASU to a bowl game for the first time since 2005 and was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year.

While dominating the Sun Belt statistical categories, the Red Wolves finished the season ranked top 25 in the nation in total offense (24th), total defense (24th), passing offense (16th), rushing defense (13th), pass efficiency defense (21st), scoring defense (25th), tackles for loss (eighth) and sacks (15th). They were also one of only two teams in the NCAA to lead their conference in both total offense and defense.

Freeze's first season in Jonesboro saw him serve as Arkansas State's offensive coordinator, guiding the Red Wolves' offense to a record-breaking year in 2010.

He made an immediate impact on ASU's program, leading the team to a No. 43 national ranking in total offense one year after the Red Wolves finished toward the bottom of the NCAA FBS rankings at No. 95. In just their first year under Freeze's up-tempo spread offense, the Red Wolves broke nine offensive school records that included 4,841 yards of total offense ranked No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference.

Prior to his arrival at Arkansas State, Freeze compiled a 20-5 record over the 2008 and 2009 seasons at the helm of the Lambuth University football program.

Freeze was named the American Football Coaches Association's Southeast Region Coach of the Year in 2009 after leading the Eagles to their best regular season in school history with an 11-0 record. Under Freeze's direction, Lambuth won the Mid-South Conference West Division, advanced to the second round of the NAIA playoffs for the first time since 1999, finished the year with a 12-1 mark and ascended to the No. 6 ranking in NAIA.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Lambuth, Freeze served on the Ole Miss staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach. He originally arrived in Oxford as Assistant Athletics Director for External Affairs before being named the Rebels' recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach before the 2006 season.

In his first year as recruiting coordinator, he helped bring in the nation's ninth-ranked recruiting class, the highest recorded rank in the history of the program. Ole Miss' 2007 signing class was tabbed 25th nationally, and he was responsible for nine commitments in the 2008 signing class.

While maintaining his duties as recruiting coordinator, he moved to wide receivers coach in 2007 and tutored current NFL star Mike Wallace to a top-10 SEC finish in receiving yards.

Before going to Ole Miss, Freeze served 13 years at Briarcrest Christian School in Memphis, Tenn., as a classroom teacher, coach and administrator. He was the Saints' head football coach from 1995 to 2004, running the no-huddle "spread system" for six years that led to six straight state championship games. He compiled a 99-23 record, which included an undefeated season in 1996, while at Briarcrest and led the school to state championship titles in 2002 and 2004.

**AUBURN, Ala.** -- Senior running back Brandon Bolden rushed for a season-high 114 yards on 13 carries and two touchdowns, but Ole Miss fell to No. 23 Auburn 41-23 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

After falling behind 14-0 early, the Rebels responded rushing for a season-high 172 yards in the first half, led by Bolden, who recorded his first 100-yard rushing performance of the year and eighth of his career.

The Rebels put together a nice drive late in the first quarter that resulted in a 1-yard TD run by Bolden to make it 14-7 Auburn.

Junior Bryson Rose connected on a 39-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter as the Rebels pulled to within 14-10. Rose has now made 15 consecutive field goal attempts dating back to last season and is now three field goals shy of the SEC record for consecutive field goals made.

After Auburn added a field goal to go up 17-10, the Rebels used a 9-play 60-yard drive culminating in another Bolden 1-yard TD run to even the score heading into the break.

The Tigers (6-3, 4-2 SEC) scored a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to break the halftime deadlock and go up 31-17.

Rebel quarterback Randall Mackey finished the night 15-of-27 for 157 yards.

## LAST GAME: TEXAS A&M 30, OLE MISS 27

**OXFORD, Miss.** — On a chilly Saturday evening at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, the Ole Miss Rebels fell in heartbreaking fashion, 30-27, to Texas A&M. Ole Miss (3-3, 0-2 SEC) led by 10 points in the fourth quarter against the Aggies, but couldn't hold on to the victory.

Leading by four points with just over three minutes remaining in the game, Ole Miss had possession of the ball and faced a fourth-and-1 opportunity from its own 39-yard line. Already two-for-two for the game, the Rebels went for it again, but junior running back Jeff Scott was stopped at the line of scrimmage and Texas A&M (4-1, 2-1 SEC) took over on downs.

The Aggies wasted little time with the ball, converting on their fourth play from scrimmage with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Johnny Manziel to Ryan Swope in the back left corner of the endzone.

Ole Miss took a 27-17 lead, its largest of the game, when Wallace hit sophomore wide receiver Donte Moncrief for a four-yard touchdown.

After nearly getting tackled for a safety, Texas A&M regrouped to drive 99 yards for a touchdown, but after missing the extra point attempt, Ole Miss still led by four points at 27-23.

Wallace finished with a season-high 305 yards passing for Ole Miss. The Ole Miss defense caused a season-high six turnovers on the evening against a Texas A&M offense that had only turned the ball over once all season. The Rebels offense finished with 464 total yards.

## OLE MISS 49, CENTRAL ARKANSAS 27

Game #1 • Sept. 1, 2012

Attendance: 50,554 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

**OXFORD, Miss.** - Sophomore quarterback Bo Wallace went 20-24 for 264 yards and two touchdowns, and Ole Miss (1-0) opened the Hugh Freeze era by coming back from a six-point halftime deficit to defeat Central Arkansas 49-27 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Playing in front of 50,554 fans on a gorgeous Saturday evening, the Ole Miss Rebels fought off a resilient Central Arkansas team by outscoring the Bears 35-7 in the second half.

Ole Miss' opening possession of the season nearly resulted in a punt, but Freeze made the gutsy call and went for it on fourth-and-inches from Ole Miss' own 31-yard line. After a QB sneak from Wallace for the first down, the Rebels' offense shifted into overdrive.

On the very next play, with no passing options open, Wallace showed his mobility by scampering for 13 yards. An end-around to senior Randall Mackey followed for another first down before Wallace again showed his wheels with a quarterback keeper up the middle for 25 yards and a touchdown three plays later.

Central Arkansas entered the halftime break with a 20-14 lead, but Ole Miss responded in the second half by outscoring the Bears 35-7, including 35-unanswered, and erasing all doubt in the game's outcome.

The Rebels began their second half scoring in a rather unconventional manner. After marching down the field to the UCA six-yard line, Wallace rushed up the middle and attempted to dive into the end zone but the ball was popped free. Flying through the air, the ball eventually landed in the back half of the endzone where junior wide receiver Ja-Mes Logan was on the spot and recovered the ball for the touchdown. After a Bryson Rose extra point, the lead was Ole Miss' once again, 21-20, and the Rebels would never look back.

Ole Miss followed up its first touchdown drive of the second half with another one on the ensuing possession that was capped off by a 53-yard touchdown throw from Wallace to Donte Moncrief down the middle. Moncrief finished the game with eight receptions for a game-high 104 yards and a touchdown. It was the first 100-yard receiving game of Moncrief's young career.

## OLE MISS 28, UTEP 10

Game #2 • Sept. 8, 2012

Attendance: 53,133 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

**OXFORD, Miss.** - Two first-half touchdown passes of 50-plus yards by sophomore quarterback Bo Wallace, along with two crucial defensive stands, led Ole Miss (2-0) to a 28-10 win over UTEP (0-2) in front of 53,133 fans at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels' 2-0 start is its first since 2009.

Wallace was 15-22 passing for 174 yards and three touchdowns. The Pulaski, Tenn., native also rushed for 53 yards and a score.

Wallace's top target was sophomore wide receiver Donte Moncrief, who had three receptions for 72 yards and a touchdown. Junior wide receiver Ja-Mes Logan had a team-high five catches for 44 yards.

After holding the Miners on their opening possession, Ole Miss took just four plays to drive 73 yards for a touchdown. The drive was highlighted by a picture-perfect 55-yard touchdown pass from Wallace to sophomore wide receiver Donte Moncrief, who got behind the UTEP cornerback and hauled in the pass that traveled 45 yards in the air.

UTEP opened the second quarter with first down at the seven-yard line, but failed to get into the endzone on the first three plays. Facing fourth down with the ball on the one-yard line, the Miners rolled the dice and went for it. The Rebels defense was up to the challenge, however, and tackled Nick Lamaison on the quarterback keeper two yards behind the line of scrimmage.

The Rebels used the momentum gained from the fourth-down stop to drive 97 yards in 3:25 to gain a two-touchdown lead. Again, the Rebels found pay dirt off a big play, as Wallace hit freshman running back Jaylen Walton down the right side for a 51-yard touchdown.

The Rebels defense bent for a second-straight possession, but again didn't break as sophomore cornerback Cody Prewitt picked off UTEP quarterback Carson Meger in the Ole Miss endzone and returned it 16 yards to maintain the 14-0 lead for the Rebels.

Ole Miss used a methodical, 15-play, 84-yard drive capped off with a four-yard touchdown run by Wallace to the right corner of the endzone with 28.3 seconds left to take a 21-0 lead into the half.

After 10 unanswered points by the Miners in the third quarter narrowed the Rebels lead to 21-10, Ole Miss got back on the board with 11:18 left on the clock in the fourth quarter. Wallace capped off the eight-play drive by hitting H.R. Greer for a three-yard touchdown pass with Greer diving to extend the ball over the pylon in the right corner.

## #12 TEXAS 66, OLE MISS 31

**OXFORD, Miss.** - In a high-scoring affair that saw a total of 97 points scored, the Ole Miss football team (2-1) could not stop the No. 12 Texas (3-0) offense, and lost its first game of the season 66-31 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Playing in front of 61,797 fans, the fourth-largest crowd in school history and the largest ever for a non-conference game, the Rebels accumulated 19 first downs and 399 yards of offense, but couldn't get the Longhorns' offense off the field. The Longhorns scored on seven-straight possessions, including six touchdowns, spanning from the first quarter to the final minute of the third quarter.

Trailing 10-0 with just over three minutes remaining in the first quarter, Ole Miss got on the board with an impressive 12-play, 89-yard drive that started from its own 11-yard line. The Rebels faced a tough third-and-17 from its own 41-yard line, but sophomore quarterback Bo Wallace found junior wide receiver Korvic Neat down the middle for 30 yards and new life. From there, the Rebels needed just four more plays before senior running back Randall Mackey rushed to the right side from three yards out for the touchdown.

Wallace and Donte Moncrief connected for the third consecutive game. Wallace connected with Moncrief in the third quarter on a beautiful 75-yard touchdown pass.

Wallace and Moncrief have connected for 50-plus yard touchdowns in each of Ole Miss' first three games. Moncrief finished the game with seven receptions for 144 yards and a touchdown.

Freshman running back Jaylen Walton capped off the scoring for the Rebels with an eye-opening 100-yard kickoff return down the left sideline in the fourth quarter.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** - The Ole Miss defense held No. 1 Alabama to just six points in the second half, but turnovers in the first half proved to be too much to overcome as the Rebels fell to the Crimson Tide 33-14 at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Ole Miss (3-2, 0-1 SEC) briefly held the lead when Jeff Scott scored on a 1-yard run early in the second quarter, but Alabama erased it quickly on the ensuing kickoff, when Christian Jones raced 99 yards to the endzone to give the Crimson Tide a 13-7 advantage.

Alabama (5-0, 2-0 SEC) added two more touchdowns to go into the locker room leading 27-7.

The Rebels were able to mount an impressive 16-play, 70-yard scoring drive in the third quarter to cut Alabama's lead to 13, and the defense held the Crimson Tide scoreless in the third quarter.

Quarterback Bo Wallace ended the game 15-of-26 for 123 yards, while Jeff Scott recorded 49 yards rushing on 19 carries and the touchdown. Scott has now scored four times in the last three games.

On the defensive side of the ball, Cody Prewitt recorded a career-high 13 tackles while Denzel Nkemdiche made a career-best 11, including three for a loss, and caused two fumbles.

Alabama came into the game averaging 204 yards a game on the ground, but the Rebel defense held them to just 125 yards.

## TEXAS A&M 30, OLE MISS 27

**OXFORD, Miss.** — On a chilly Saturday evening at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, the Ole Miss Rebels fell in heartbreaking fashion, 30-27, to Texas A&M. Ole Miss (3-3, 0-2 SEC) led by 10 points in the fourth quarter against the Aggies, but couldn't hold on to the victory.

Leading by four points with just over three minutes remaining in the game, Ole Miss had possession of the ball and faced a fourth-and-1 opportunity from its own 39-yard line. Already two-for-two for the game, the Rebels went for it again, but junior running back Jeff Scott was stopped at the line of scrimmage and Texas A&M (4-1, 2-1 SEC) took over on downs.

The Aggies wasted little time with the ball, converting on their fourth play from scrimmage with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Johnny Manziel to Ryan Swope in the back left corner of the endzone.

Ole Miss took a 27-17 lead, its largest of the game, when Wallace hit sophomore wide receiver Donte Moncrief for a four-yard touchdown.

After nearly getting tackled for a safety, Texas A&M regrouped to drive 99 yards for a touchdown, but after missing the extra point attempt, Ole Miss still led by four points at 27-23.

Wallace finished with a season-high 305 yards passing for Ole Miss. The Ole Miss defense caused a season-high six turnovers on the evening against a Texas A&M offense that had only turned the ball over once all season. The Rebels offense finished with 464 total yards.
