SAGARIN RATINGS: 'DORES HAVE FACED THIRD TOUGHEST SCHEDULE

Vanderbilt has faced one of the nation's toughest schedules during the first half of the 2012 season, according to a leading college football statistical service.

Sagarin's College Football Ratings has Vanderbilt's six-game schedule ranked No. 3 among 120 FBS schools. Only new SEC member Missouri and Washington from the PAC-12 have faced tougher slates.

Three of Vanderbilt's six opponents are ranked among the top 11 teams in the initial BCS Poll released Oct. 14: No. 2 Florida, No. 7 South Carolina, No. 11 Georgia. A fourth opponent (Northwestern) is 6-1 and just out of the Top 25.

The combined record of the four teams that have defeated Vanderbilt is 23-3. The record of Vanderbilt's five early-season, bowl eligible opponents is 26-7.

NOTES ON THE AUBURN SERIES

- ★ Vanderbilt's 14-13 victory in 2008 stopped a run of Auburn dominance in the series. Prior to 2008, the Tigers had captured the last 13 games dating back to 1978.
- ★ The 2008 game also featured ESPN's popular College GameDay broadcasting from the Vanderbilt campus.
- ★ Auburn was the opponent in Vanderbilt's first postseason bowl appearances. The Commodores and Tigers met in the 1955 Gator Bowl, with Vanderbilt topping No. 8 Auburn 25-13 in Jacksonville, Fla.
- ★ Vanderbilt controlled the series from World War I to 1950s. The Commodores were 13-3 against the Tigers from 1915 to 1950.
- ★ From 1946-50, Vandy was 5-0 vs. Auburn, with four wins being shutouts.
- ★ All 18 of the games between the teams hosted by Vanderbilt have been played on campus. As the visiting team, the Vanderbilt has played in three different Alabama cities: Montgomery, Birmingham and Auburn.

ALABAMA RESIDENTS ON VANDY ROSTER

Nine players on the Commodore roster, including five possible starters this week, hail from the state of Alabama.

Only three states are more represented on the Vanderbilt roster: Tennessee and Georgia (19 each) and Florida (13).

The starters from Alabama include the Commodores' top two offensive weapons in RB **Zac Stacy** (Sr., Centreville) and WR **Jordan Matthews** (R-Jr., Madison) and a pair of the team's top tacklers in LB **Chase Garnham** (Jr., Fairhope) and DE **Walker May** (R-Jr., DE). The fifth potential starter is DT **Jared Morse** (Jr., Oxford).

Other 'Dores from the state are WR **Jacquese Kirk** (R-Fr., Jasper), DL **Torey Agee** (Fr., Opelika), LB **Harding Harper** (Fr., Montgomery) and CB **Torren McGaster** (Fr., Daphne).

STACY REACHES 2,500 CAREER RUSH YARDS

Zac Stacy (Sr., RB) moved into second place on two Vanderbilt career rushing charts last Saturday with 86 yards and a touchdowns vs. Florida.

Stacy's 86-yard total pushed him beyond 2,500 career yards and helped the senior surpass Carl Woods (1983-86)

into second place all-time among Commodores with 2,501 rushing yards. He also has 24 career rushing TDs, tied for second on the Vanderbilt lists with former quarterback Marcus Wilson (1989-92) with 24 TDs.

Stacy had 86 yards in 24 carries against the Gators. His TD came on a 1-yard plunge. He also had an apparent 57-yard score nullified by penalty.

Stacy ranks eighth in the SEC with 499 rushing yards on 99 carries. He is averaging 5.0 yards per rush and has the SEC's longest carry of the year – an 86-yarder for TD vs. Presbyterian).

Stacy is currently 132 yards shy of breaking the all-time Vanderbilt rushing record of 2,632 yards held by Frank Mordica (1976-79). He also ranks second in the SEC behind only Marcus

Lattimore of South Carolina in career rushing yardage.

Stacy is just three rushing touchdowns of breaking the team mark of 26 TDs held by Dean Davidson (1947-50).

Stacy's 5.3-yard career rushing average easily ranks as the highest among Vanderbilt's Top Ten all-time rushers. He has 73 fewer than Mordica.

Stacy has seven games of 100+ rushing yards in his career.

MATTHEWS: SEC RECEPTIONS LEADER

Jordan Matthews (Jr., WR) has opened the 2012 campaign just as he finished in 2011– as one of the SEC's most productive receivers.

After catching eight passes for 131 yard and a TD vs. Florida, Matthews' average of 7.2 receptions per game tops the SEC. He has 43 catches on the season. He is also one catch shy of 100 for his career.

Matthews' 102.8 average receiving yards also ranks second in the SEC behind Arkansas' Cobi Hamilton (107.7 ypg.). Matthews has 617 yards on the season.

Matthews opened the year by catching eight passes for 147 yards and a TD vs. South Carolina. He had 118 receiving yards at Georgia, and added eight catches at Northwestern. He also had a 9-reception effort Oct. 6 at Missouri.

Matthews has surpassed 100 receiving yards in six of his last 12 games. During that span, Matthews is averaging 106.7 receiving yards. All of Matthews' 100+yard receiving games have come in SEC action.

Matthews' 147-yard receiving total vs. South Carolina ranks as the program's third highest total in a season opener. The effort vs. South Carolina included a 78-yard TD catch, the team's longest pass play since the Duke game in 2010.

2012 COMMODORES: SEVERAL AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT OVER 2011 SQUAD

In many ways, the 2-4 Commodores of 2012 are out performing the 2011 Commodores, who were 3-3 at this point of the season en route to an eventual AutoZone Liberty Bowl appearance in Memphis.

A comparison of current NCAA statistics reveals the 2012 'Dores are much improved on offense and close on defense to James Franklin's initial squad in 2011.

The comparison of 2011-12 appears relevant when one considers that the 2012 schedule through six games is arguably tougher than the 2011 slate. This year, Vanderbilt has faced three Top Ten teams and two others that went to bowls; in 2011, the Commodores faced three Top 25 ranked teams and two teams experiencing subpar campaigns midway through the season.

The 2012 Vanderbilt offense is performing at a much improved level than a year ago. The unit is producing 103.9 more yards of total offense per game, including 87.4 passing and 16.4 rushing, and 5.3 more first downs. The 1.2-point decrease in scoring also is slightly slanted because the 2011 Commodore defense produced three early-season scores while the current unit has a lone turnover for TD this year.

The youthful Commodore defense is performing close to the 2011 unit that ranked among the SEC's top six in virtually every category. The defense is allowing fewer first downs and virtually the same amount of points as a year ago. The average total defense is 21.9 yards higher, with opponents getting far less passing yards and more rushing yards than in 2011.

The most glaring difference in the squads is turnovers. The 2012 unit has committed one more turnover than it has forced. In 2011, Vanderbilt had forced two more turnovers than the squad had committed.

PREP TEAMMATES TO SQUARE OFF

Five Commodores will face prep teammates when Vanderbilt hosts Auburn.

- **Ja'karri Thomas** (Fr., LB) and Auburn's T.J. Davis (Fr., DB) were classmates and defensive teammates at Godby H.S. in Tallahassee, Fla.
- **Jared Morse** (Jr., DT) attended Oxford (Ala.) H.S. with a pair of Tigers, Chandler Shakespeare (Jr., RB).
- **Grant Ramsay** (R-So., OL) attended Pope (Ga.) H.S. north of Atlanta with Auburn's Alex Kviklyls (R-Fr., PK).
- **Jake Sealand** (Fr., LB) was a teammate at Tucker H.S. in Atlanta with Auburn's Justin Garrett (So., LB).

KENT AMONG SEC'S TOP PUNTER

Fifth-year senior punter **Richard Kent** continues to perform at an All-Southeastern Conference level. And there's no other league in the NCAA that approaches the punting quality witnessed in the SEC.

Kent averaged 44.6 yards on five punts against Florida. Three of his attempts landed inside the Gators' 20-yard line.

Kent was recognized as the SEC's Co-Specialist of the Week Oct. 6 for his performance against Missouri.

Kent is enjoying one of the finest seasons ever by a Vanderbilt punter, averaging 45.1 yards in his final season. Though Kent's average would rank among the best seasons ever by a Commodore, he currently ranks fifth in the SEC. Florida sophomore Kyle Christy tops the conference with a 46.4-yard average.

The SEC is loaded with punters. Five of the NCAA's top 18 punters hail from the conference.

Kent's net punting average of 42.8 yards also ranks among the NCAA leaders. Opponents have returned just nine of Kent's 31 punts this season, totalling 68 yards.

Kent has nine punts of 50 yards or more, including a 67-yarder at Northwestern which ranks as the SEC's third longest punt this season. While 39% of his punts have landed inside the opponent 20-yard line, just two have been touchbacks.

A former walk-on, Kent has been remarkably consistent as a three-year starter. He has placed at least one punt inside the opponent's 20-yard line in 13 straight games, and 30 of 31 career appearances. He has also boomed punts of 48 or more yards in 13 consecutive games.

HAND, PELTON COACHED TOGETHER

Vanderbilt offensive line mentor **Herb Hand** and Auburn defensive line coach **Mike Pelton** coached together on the 2010 Commodore squad.

Both Hand and Pelton were new to the Vanderbilt program in 2010, having joined Robbie Caldwell's staff from the University of Tulsa and Iowa State, respectively.

Hand was the only coach off the 2010 Commodore staff hired by James Franklin after he accepted the Vanderbilt job in December 2010.

CONSISTENT STARTING ROTATION ON DEFENSE

Nine 'Dore defensive players have earned starting assignments in Vanderbilt's first six games.

The list includes **Rob Lohr** (R-Sr., DT), **Johnell Thomas** (R-Sr., DE), **Walker May** (R-Jr., DE), **Chase Garnham** (Jr., LB), **Archibald Barnes** (R-Sr., LB), **Karl Butler** (Jr., LB), **Trey Wilson** (Sr., CB), **Andre Hal** (Jr., CB) and **Javon Marshall** (R-Jr., safety).

On offense, seven players have started every game: **Zac Stacy** (Sr., RB), **Ryan Seymour** (R-Sr., OG), **Josh Jelesky** (R-Sr., OG), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Jr., OT), **Andrew Bridges** (R-So., OT), **Jordan Matthews** (Jr., WR) and **Chris Boyd**. (R-So., WR).





EIGHT VANDERBILT TEAM CAPTAINS

Eight veterans, including three offensive contributors and four defensive players, will serve as team captains for the upcoming season. The group represents both the junior and senior classes.



BARNES

ARCHIBALD BARNES **R-Sr. • LB**

Ranks fourth on team with 34 tackles. Played in all 13 games in 2011, setting career highs in solo tackles (37), total tackles (59), TFLs (4.5), sacks (two) and INTs (two).



JOHNSON

WESLEY JOHNSON **R-Jr. • OL**

Team's offensive lineman of the year in 2011, starting at center, guard and tackle while playing nearly every snap. Has currently started 31 consecutive games.



MARSHALL

JAVON MARSHALL **R-Jr. • Safety**

Leads team lead with 29 solo tackles and ranks third with 32 total tackles. Shared starting safety role in 2011, playing in all 13 games despite injury and making 42 total tackles and grabbing two picks.

WALKER MAY **R-Jr. • DE**

Has 14 tackles, including 3.5 for losses, and a QB sack. Started eight games in 2011, including the last seven games, making 30 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

Enjoying solid season, hitting 10-of-13 field goals, including every attempt inside 45 yards. He is the only returning captain among the eight players.

Has passed for 1,068 yards and three TDs this year. Played in all 13 games in 2011, starting seven, while going 108-216 passing for 1,524 yards and nine TDs.

ZAC STACY **Sr. • RB**

Leads team with 499 rushing yards and 4 TDs on 99 carries (5.0-yard avg.). Team's leading rusher and offensive MVP in 2011, going for 1,193 yards and 14 TDs, earning All-SEC honors.



THOMAS

JOHNELL THOMAS **R-Sr. • DE**

Has contributed 17 total tackles this year, including two stops resulting in losses. Played in all 13 games in 2011 while starting five, making 26 total tackles and five sacks.

ATTENDANCE UP AT VANDERBILT

The Commodores have played before one sellout and the largest crowd for a home opener in more than a decade during James Franklin's second year on campus.

The program also expects to play before a second consecutive capacity crowd Saturday when the Commodores host Auburn.

In three home dates, the Commodores are averaging 38,078 fans. In those games, Vanderbilt Stadium has been at 94.4 percent of capacity.

An announced audience of 38,393 cheered for the Commodores in home opener against South Carolina on Aug. 30. It was the largest crowd to view a season opener in Vanderbilt Stadium since 39,885 fans entered the turnstiles to watch MTSU-Vanderbilt on Aug. 30, 2001.

The capacity crowd of 40,350 at the Florida-Vanderbilt game also was the program's first sellout since November 2008.

About 35,000 attended Vandy's road shutout of Presbyterian on Sept. 15.

COMMODORES HONOR SNEDEKER AT FLORIDA GAME

The Commodores honored 2012 PGA Tour FedEx Cup champion and Vanderbilt alum **Brandt Snedeker** during the Florida game.

Snedeker captured the FedEx Cup by winning the season-ending Tour Championship. Snedeker's late-season finish earned him a captain's pick on the U.S. Ryder Cup squad. One of Snedeker's Ryder Cup teammates was former Auburn standout **Jason Dufner**.

MATTHEWS, BOYD: SEC'S MOST PRODUCTIVE RECEIVING DUO

Jordan Matthews (Jr.) and **Chris Boyd** (R-So.) rank as the Southeastern Conference's top receiving duo.

Combined, Matthews and Boyd are averaging 170.3 receiving yards per game. Following the Commodore receivers are Arkansas' Cobi Hamilton and TE Chris Gragg (166.2 ypg), Texas A&M's Mike Evans and Ryan Swope (141.3 ypg) and Tennessee's Justin Hunter and Cordarrelle Patterson (135.3 ypg).

Matthews, the No. 1 receiver in the SEC in catches, ranks second in the league with a 102.8-yard receiving average.

Boyd also ranks No. 8 in the SEC with a 67.5-yard average.

In SEC games, Matthews tops the league with a 122.0-receiving yard average, 37 yards more than the No. 2 receiver (Arkansas' Hamilton).

Matthews and Boyd both topped 100 receiving yards at Georgia on Sept. 22, becoming just the eighth Vandy duo to ever accomplish the feat.

FRANKLIN IN YEAR 2: EIGHT WINS TO DATE

Head Coach **James Franklin**, after becoming the first coach to lead the Commodores to a bowl game in his first season, has a chance to enjoy one of the most successful two-year starts to a career in program history.

With eight wins under his belt, Franklin already has more victories in his first two seasons than any Vanderbilt head coach since **Gerry DiNardo** (9 wins, 1991-92).

NOTES FROM THE FLORIDA GAME

★ **Chris Boyd** (R-So., WR) pushed his Southeastern Conference lead in yards per catch with a 37-yarder in the first quarter to spark Vanderbilt's first touchdown.

Boyd, second among Commodores with 19 receptions, is averaging 21.3 per catch during his second season as a starter. The 37-yarder allowed Boyd to expand his yards per catch lead over Georgia's Tavarres King, who did not play Saturday and averages 19.0 yards. They are followed by LSU's Odell Beckham (17.5 yards), Mississippi State's Chad Bumphis (16.7 yards) and Arkansas' Cobi Hamilton (16.4 yards).

Boyd also ranks 8th in the SEC with 405 receiving yards.

Boyd's receiving teammate, **Jordan Matthews** (Jr., WR) topped the SEC last year with a 19.1-yard average.

★ **Archibald Barnes** (R-Sr., LB) set a single-game career high with 12 total tackles against the Gators. The performance included five solo tackles.

Barnes' tackle total is a season high for the Commodore defense, bettering the 11-tackle tally by **Kenny Ladler** (Jr., safety) against Georgia.

★ Vanderbilt's 23 first downs were the most this season against a Southeastern Conference opponent.

★ **Wesley Tate** (R-Jr., RB) put together his best rushing performance as a Commodore. Tate demonstrated the powerful, down-hill rushing style that coaches witnessed last spring when he was moved from receiver.

Tate finished with 66 yards on 10 carries, including a 20-yard rush after intermission.

★ **Jordan Rodgers** (R-Sr., QB) set a season high with 237 passing yards, and matched another with 17 completions. Though he connected with **Jordan Matthews** for eight passes, Rodgers also hit seven other Commodores.

Rodgers has enjoyed success against Florida. In two starts against the Gators, Rodgers is 36-of-59 for 533 yards and three TDs.

★ A 1:03 stretch late in the third quarter hurt Vanderbilt's best chances to upset the No. 4 Gators.

Trailing 11-7, the Commodores marched the second half kickoff to the 76 yards inside the Florida 10-yard line. Facing a 2nd & 4 from the Gator 7-yard line, the 'Dores lost nearly 20 yards due to a penalty and quarterback sack. On fourth down, Florida then blocked a Vanderbilt field goal attempt from 44 yards, denying the Commodores points after a 16-play drive that lasted more than ten minutes.

Five plays after the field goal block, Florida used a successful fake punt to push its lead to 18-7.

★ **Jordan Matthews** (Jr., WR) has posted remarkable numbers against the Gators. In two starts, he has accumulated 17 catches, 291 receiving yards and 2 TDs. In 2011, he set single-game career highs of nine catches and 170 receiving yards at Florida.

As a freshman in 2010, Matthews also caught the first of 12 career touchdown receptions vs. Florida.

★ **Steven Scheu** (R-Fr., TE) was the team's second leading receiver behind **Jordan Matthews** with three catches, good for 21 yards. Both totals represent career highs for the first-year tight end.

★ **Zac Stacy** (R-Sr., RB) surpassed 20 carries for the second consecutive game. He had 24 rushes against the Gators after a 29-carry effort in Vanderbilt's win at Missouri Oct. 6.

It marks just the second time in Stacy's career that he had at least 20 carries in consecutive games. Stacy did so previously in his first two games as a Commodore, as a true freshman in 2009.

★ **Kenny Ladler** (Jr., safety) posted seven tackles and contributed his first forced fumble of the season. Ladler leads the Commodores with 42 total tackles.

★ While Vanderbilt is doing a good job preventing turnovers, they are struggling to produce miscues. The Commodores' lone turnover – a fumble by scrambling quarterback **Jordan Rodgers** – proved to be the game's only turnover.

★ Junior **Karl Butler** continues to play well at outside linebacker. Butler had five tackles, including the first quarterback sack as a Commodore.

A first-year starter, Butler is enjoying a break-through season. His 29 total tackles and 18 solo stops – both single-season career highs – rank among the team's top five performers.

★ The Commodores ran 23 more offensive plays, posted eight more first downs and enjoyed a 6:20 advantage in time of possession against the Gators.

★ Vanderbilt showed across-the-board improvement in third down conversions. Their 41 percent conversion rate (7-of-17) marked a season best in SEC competition. The Commodore defense also limited Florida to just 2-of-11 third down conversions.

★ While **Carey Spear** (PK, Jr.) is having an excellent year for the Commodores (10-of-13 in FGs), opposing kickers are even more impressive. Opponents are 10-of-10 in field goals against the Commodores, including a 3-of-3 effort by Florida senior Caleb Sturgis.

Two legendary running backs benefited from Agee's blocks: Heisman Trophy winner Bo Jackson at Auburn and NFL all-time leading rusher Emmitt Smith with the Dallas Cowboys.





EIGHT 'DORES BECOME FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Eight Commodore players have earned their first career starts during the first five games of 2012.

Five offensive players have enjoyed their initial starting assignments. **Austyn Carta-Samuels** (R-Jr., QB) started against Presbyterian. A pair of sophomores, **Joe Townsend** and **Spencer Pulley**, have both started twice on the offensive line at center. Two redshirt freshmen, **Kris Kentera** and **Steven Scheu**, have started at tight end.

Three defensive players have witnessed first starts: **Eric Samuels**, (Sr., safety), **Karl Butler** (R-Jr., LB) and **Jared Morse**, (Jr., DT).

FOUR COMMODORE FRESHMEN HAVE PLAYED

Linebacker **Jake Sealand** became the fourth true freshmen have seen action for the Commodores this season when he contributed in the victory at Missouri Oct. 6.

Other freshmen to contribute are defensive end **Caleb Azubike**, linebacker **Darreon Herring** and running back **Brian Kimbrow**.

Azubike shares the team high with a pair of quarterback sacks. Herring has posted 12 tackles and Kimbrow ranks second on the team with 185 rushing yards and has averaged 21.5 yards as a kick returner. Sealand has four tackle and a forced fumble.

TWENTY FIRST-TIME CONTRIBUTORS THIS SEASON

Twenty underclassmen have experienced their initial action in a Commodore uniform midway through the 2012 season.

Pulley, Kentera and Scheu have also earned starting assignments.

VANDERBILT RESULTS IN NON-SEC ACTION

Vanderbilt has registered victories in five of its last six regular season games against non-SEC opponents.

Vanderbilt has defeated Presbyterian at home (58-0, Sept. 15) and lost at Northwestern (13-23, Sept. 8) in non-conference games this year. The team has two non-SEC games remaining: vs. Massachusetts on Oct. 27 and at Wake Forest on Nov. 24.

The Commodores fell to Northwestern on Sept. 8 in their first non-SEC game of the year.

In 2011, the 'Dores went 4-0 in regular season, non-SEC play during James Franklin's first year at Vanderbilt. It marked the first time since 1994 for Vanderbilt to register an unblemished out-of-conference regular season.

In February 2009, Friedgen designates Franklin as his successor at Maryland... The Terrapins go 9-4 overall in 2010, finishing second in the ACC's Atlantic Division and winning the Military Bowl... Quarterback Danny O'Brien earns ACC Rookie of the Year and Freshman All-America honors under Franklin's mentorship, ranking third nationally among freshmen in pass efficiency rating... O'Brien throws for 22 touchdowns against only eight picks after becoming the team's starter in Week Four... Franklin's 2010 offense ranks among the nation's best in limiting turnovers... Torrey Smith also flourishes in 2010, catching 67 passes for 1,055 yards to earn first-team All-ACC honors... For the fourth time in his career, Franklin also is honored as a Top 25 recruiter by Rivals.com for helping to secure a class that included a number of four-star athletes... In 2008, the Terps defeat four ranked teams en route to a win in the Humanitarian Bowl to cap an 8-5 record. Terp WR Darrius Heyward-Bey becomes No. 9 overall pick of the 2009 NFL Draft.

2006-07 KANSAS STATE (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks)

As K-State's offensive coordinator, Franklin helps the Wildcats to a 7-6 record in 2006, including a 45-42 win over No. 4 Texas. Kansas State also plays in the Texas Bowl, its first postseason appearance in three years... In 2007, under Franklin's guidance, K-State offense becomes first in team history to feature a 3,000-yard passer, 1,500-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season... QB Josh Freeman (eventual 2009 first-round pick of Tampa Bay) sets numerous school records, including 3,353 passing yards... WR Jordy Nelson becomes an All-America player by catching 122 passes, and is a high draft pick of the Packers... In 2011, he starts on Green Bay's world champion squad.

2005 GREEN BAY PACKERS-NFL (assistant coach/wide receivers)

Assisting Head Coach Mike Sherman, Franklin mentors a strong receiving arsenal that includes Donald Driver, Javon Walker and Robert Ferguson catching passes from Brett Favre... Despite an injury to Walker, the Packers rank sixth in team receiving yards... Driver sets career highs with 86 receptions for 1,221 receiving yards.

2000-04 MARYLAND (wide receivers/recruiting coordinator)

Franklin helps Maryland to three consecutive bowl games starting with the 2001 squad... Franklin's second class of 22 prospects ranks among program's finest. For first time ever, every signee is 3-stars or better. The class includes six elite players from Tennessee.

VANDERBILT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

★ GOING BOWLING

Vanderbilt reached bowl eligibility for the first time since 2008 and reached six wins for just the fifth time since 1955.

★ BEST FIRST YEAR SINCE 1975

Franklin's six wins were the most by a first-year Vanderbilt coach in 36 years. Fred Pancoast's first 'Dore team won seven games in 1975.

★ FIRST 3-0 START SINCE WORLD WAR II

Franklin's 3-0 start in his first season marked the first time a Vanderbilt coach won his first three games since 1945.

★ TIED FOR MOST HOME WINS OF MODERN ERA

The six wins at Vanderbilt Stadium in 2011 tied with the 1982 season for the most in the modern era.

★ UNDEFEATED OUT-OF-CONFERENCE

Vanderbilt's 4-0 mark in non-conference games marked the first undefeated record outside the SEC since 1999.

★ TIED FOR MOST IMPROVEMENT IN SEC

Vanderbilt's improvement from 2-10 in the 2010 season to 6-6 in 2011 tied with Georgia for the biggest increase in winning percentage in the conference (UGA went from 6-6 in 2010 to 10-2 in 2011).

HILLENMEYER: VANDERBILT'S 2012 SEC LEGEND

Former All-Southeastern Conference linebacker **Hunter Hillenmeyer** is Vanderbilt's selection to the 2012 class of SEC Football Legends.

Hillenmeyer, a product of Montgomery Bell Academy in Nashville who went on to enjoy an eight-year career with the Chicago Bears, will be honored Nov. 30-Dec. 1 in Atlanta.

Hillenmeyer topped the NCAA with 168 total tackles as a senior middle linebacker in 2002. He also paced the SEC the same year with 116 solo tackles, earning All-SEC honors.

A 23-game career starter, Hillenmeyer also was a superb student-athlete. In 2002, he was selected as one of six Division I-A National Scholar Athletes by the College Football Hall of Fame and National Football Foundation.

Barlow will coach defensive backs and serve as defensive recruiting coordinator. Gattis will mentor wide receivers and serve as offensive recruiting coordinator.

MARC PANU — RECENT YOUTUBE SENSATION

On Aug. 10, **James Franklin** surprised fourth-year player **Marc Panu** (FB, Mableton, Ga.) by presenting the walk-on with a full scholarship for 2012-13. Franklin broke the news to Panu in a team meeting and the moment was captured for posterity, however no one imagined the amount of attention the moment would garner.

Within one week, the video of the announcement had received over 330,000 views on YouTube, while Panu and Franklin had been interviewed by media outlets ranging from The Tennessean to FOX News.

Panu began at Vanderbilt as a walk-on LB/DE and was named defensive scout team MVP as a freshman. In 2010, he appeared in 11 games on special teams. When Franklin arrived at Vanderbilt for the 2012 season, Panu moved to fullback and saw action in all 12 regular season games as a short-yardage blocker and special teams contributor.

COMMODORE NOTES

The Vanderbilt football program and athletics department has undergone several upgrades and renovations since last fall. Here's a look at some of new and improved areas on West End.

LOOK GOOD, PLAY GOOD

Head Coach James Franklin and the senior members of the football team unveiled the team's 2012 uniforms during a pep-rally style event at the Barnes & Noble Vanderbilt Bookstore on July 11.

The stylish uniforms, designed by the Vanderbilt football staff, are made with Nike's high-tenacity Cordura knit fabric and feature black, gold and white jerseys and pants. The final piece of equipment that was shown to the crowd was a white helmet. Last season, Vanderbilt debuted a black helmet that the team wore in addition to their gold helmet.

The Commodores can mix-and-match any combination of the black, gold and white elements (helmet, jersey and pants), creating 27 possible combinations.

Several key changes are incorporated in the 2012 design:

- For the first time since 1994, "Vanderbilt" will be displayed on the front of Commodore jerseys. The name will be in all caps above jersey numbers.
- A gold "anchor" emblem adorns the homeplate or front "V" neck of all jerseys. Last year, the Star V logo was stitched there.
- "Anchor Down" text is stitched in the interior of each jersey neckline.
- Nike's iconic "flywire" stitching is incorporated into the high impact shoulder area of each jersey.
- The gold jersey top features black shoulder coverings, black lettering and black numbers. Last year, the gold jersey had white numbers.
- All jerseys have an updated circular SEC patch stitched over the right breast. The Nike swoosh is over the left breast.
- Star V logos will adorn each hip of the pants. In 2011, a lone Star V logo was located on the left front of the uniform pant.

STADIUM, PROGRAM UPDATES

Several upgrades have been put in to place prior to the start of the 2012 season at Vanderbilt Stadium.

The most noticeable is the new video board in the north end zone of the stadium. The high definition board measures 40 x 71 feet and is one of the largest video boards in college football.

In front of the video board is a new grass berm for fan seating. The berm can accommodate approximately 400 fans and provide one of the most unique seats in the country.

The field itself has a new look and feel, as the old grass playing field has been replaced with a synthetic turf called Legion 46. Installed by Shaw Sportex, the field has several new features. The redzone features the phrase "Anchor Down," an anchor logo has replaced the traditional X that marks the kickoff location and the end zones are painted black with "Vanderbilt" and "Commodores" framed by the Star-V logo. The Star-V logo remains at midfield, with Southeastern Conference logos on the 25-yard lines.

In addition, new lighting has been installed at Vanderbilt Stadium. While they aren't as noticeable until nightfall, they will improve television viewing drastically while focusing more light on the field (and less in the stands), creating a more dramatic stage for Commodore football.

Across Jess Neely Drive, football was one of several Vanderbilt programs to benefit from renovations and additions at the McGugin Center. New meeting rooms and a 140-seat auditorium-style classroom all adjacent to the coaches offices will benefit football, while meeting rooms have also been added to McGugin for Vanderbilt's Olympic sports.

THREE EARN PRESEASON ALL-SEC

Vanderbilt was represented on both sides of the football when the Southeastern Conference announced Preseason All-SEC teams in advance of SEC Media Days.

★ **Zac Stacy** (Sr., RB) was named second team running back by both the coaches and writers that cover the league. Stacy set several school records as a junior, including the single-season rushing record at 1,193 yards. Stacy added 14 rushing touchdowns and eclipsed 100 yards in five games, including a stellar 198-yard performance against Army and a 135-yard, two-touchdown performance against Kentucky that earned him SEC Player of the Week honors.

UPDATE: Stacy has 499 rushing yards on the season, ranking eighth in the SEC. Ranks second on team's all-time rushing yards and TD lists.

★ **Trey Wilson** (Sr., CB) was named third team defensive back by the writers after making 30 tackles, three interceptions and 11 pass break-ups in 2011. He became the first Vanderbilt player since 1974 to return to interceptions for touchdowns in the same season, returning picks against Ole Miss and Elon. He also had another pick against the Rebels and earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance.

UPDATE: Wilson set one team record and matched another in the win over Presbyterian, recording his third career interception return for a TD. The score went for 100 yards, matching Archibald Barnes' record set last year vs. Tennessee.

★ **Rob Lohr** (R-Sr., DT) received third-team defensive honors. He has started 28 consecutive games for the Commodores. In 2011, he was second on the team with five sacks and 11.5 tackles for loss. He also forced a pair of fumbles and made 41 total tackles. He leads all active Vanderbilt players in career sacks (nine) and tackles for loss (20.5).

UPDATE: Lohr has 10 tackles this year, including 1.5 resulting in a loss.

VANDERBILT'S NEW RADIO FLAGSHIP

Vanderbilt football and men's basketball games will be carried on one of the nation's strongest radio signals following a flagship agreement announced in August between Vanderbilt Athletics and Nashville's **NewsRadio WLAC AM-1510**.



Starting with the Vanderbilt football opener against South Carolina, all Commodore football and men's basketball games will air on WLAC 1510, a station that boasts one of the nation's most powerful evening signals. WLAC can be heard across middle America, from Canada to the Gulf of Mexico.

The flagship agreement was finalized in August by Vanderbilt Athletics, its multimedia rights holder IMG College and Clear Channel Media & Entertainment (CCM+E), one of America's largest media companies.

NewsRadio WLAC 1510 will air all radio programming related to Vanderbilt football and men's basketball, including game broadcasts and weekly coach's call-in shows.

FRESHMAN CLASS AMONG BEST EVER

Vanderbilt's freshman class is regarded as perhaps the most talented recruiting class ever to enroll at Vanderbilt.

Four members of the class – **Caleb Azubike**, **Darreon Herring**, **Brian Kimbrow** and **Jake Sealand** – have played this season.

The 2012 signing class represents the first in school history where every recruit in the class was rated three stars or better, while the group also includes four four-star players. Those four four-star players are the most recruits of that caliber to ever be in one class at Vanderbilt. In fact, Vanderbilt had signed just three four-star players in the decade prior.

Of the 22 signees, 15 are nationally ranked at their position.

Vanderbilt was especially successful in its home state of Tennessee, where all six recruits who are staying in their native state to become Commodores were among the top-25 players in Tennessee.

Vanderbilt Gets First SEC Road Win in Two Years, Tops Missouri 19-15

COLUMBIA, MO. – A botched Missouri extra-point snap and a bobbled punt attempt that led to a safety helped Vanderbilt beat Missouri 19-15 Saturday night, depriving the former Big 12 school of its first Southeastern Conference win.

Zac Stacy rushed for 72 yards and two touchdowns on 29 carries for Vanderbilt (2-3, 1-2), which earned its first conference win. Jordan

Rodgers was 14 of 24 for 182 yards and one interception.

Missouri (3-3, 0-3) took an early 6-0 lead and kept Vanderbilt from gaining a first down until nearly nine minutes into the second quarter. Missouri couldn't muster much offense after an early injury to quarterback James Franklin, who

sprained his left knee on a first-quarter run and didn't return.

Vanderbilt's first points of the game came when Missouri punter Trey Barrow couldn't handle a snap while standing in the back of Missouri's end zone, with the ball rolling out the back. A 5-yard Stacy run late in the second half gave the Commodores a 9-6 lead they wouldn't relinquish.

NASHVILLE – No one will overlook Jeff Driskel again, not after the Florida quarterback ran the ball better than even Tim Tebow.

Driskel ran for 177 yards and three touchdowns, and the fourth-ranked Gators beat Vanderbilt 31-17 on Saturday night to stay undefeated going into their big showdown with No. 3 South Carolina. Driskel ran only 11

times, and the sophomore set the Florida record for yards rushing by a

quarterback, topping Tebow's 166 yards against Mississippi in 2007 on 27 carries. Vanderbilt watched Gators running back Mike Gillislee so closely that Driskel didn't even think the Commodores laid a hand on him on any of his TD runs.

The Gators (6-0, 5-0 SEC) finished off their last SEC road trip outside of the state of Florida with their 22nd straight win over Vanderbilt. Florida, which rallied in the second half to beat Texas A&M, Tennessee and LSU already this season, took control early this time. The Gators scored 21 straight points, including 11 in the second quarter where they took the lead for good.
