San José State record: 1-0. The Spartans opened the 2014 season with a 42-10 win over North Dakota.

Auburn record: 1-0, 1-0 SEC. The Tigers defeated Arkansas, 45-21, in their season, home and conference opener.

San José State head coach Ron Caragher: In his second season as the San José State head coach. Has a record of 7-6 with the Spartans. Overall, he is in his eighth season as a major college head coach with a 51-28 record. He is 0-0 as a head coach against Auburn and 0-2 as an assistant coach against the Tigers. Caragher was an assistant coach at Kentucky during the 2003 through 2006 seasons. Caragher's first six seasons as a head coach were at the University of San Diego.

Auburn head coach Gus Malzahn: In his second season at Auburn. Has a major college coaching record of 22-5, including 13-2 with the Tigers. He is 0-0 as a head coach against San José State.

San José State-Auburn series: This is the first meeting between these teams.

Aiming for 2-0: The last time a San José State team started a season 2-0 was in 1987 when the Spartans finished with a 10-2 record. Twelve times in this 26-year span, San José State played at least one top-25 nationally-ranked team in its first two games.

The nationally-ranked opponent: San José State faces an Auburn team with an opportunity to post back-to-back wins over nationally-ranked opponents for the first time in University history. The Spartans closed last season toppling undefeated Fresno State, 62-52, #16-ranked by the Associated Press.

Opening a regular season successfully: San José State's record in season-opening games now is 40-51-6 record with its win over North Dakota. The 32-point positive differential was the most in a season opener since a 51-0 victory at New Mexico State in 1988.

2014 schedule compared to 2013: San José State's 2014 opponents combined for a .552 (85-69) winning percentage last season. Auburn (12-2) and Fresno State (11-2), are the two teams on the 2014 schedule to win 10 or more games and compete in a bowl game. Minnesota (8-5), UNLV (7-6), Navy (9-4), Colorado State (8-6), Utah State (9-5) and San Diego State (8-5) played in a 2013 bowl game.

See the USA: The Auburn game marks the first of seven San Jose State road contests. By the end of the season, the Spartans will play at least one road game in the four continental time zones.

BYU, Boise State, New Mexico State also are playing road games in the four continental U.S. time zones. Utah State and Wyoming have road contests in four different time zones with a road game at Hawai'i.

Another Iron Bowl triangle: San José State is the third program in the last five years to play non-conference football games with Alabama and Auburn.

Florida Atlantic lost to Auburn, 30-14, in 2011 and 2013 and was defeated by the Tigers, 45-10, in 2013. Florida Atlantic lost to Alabama, 40-7, in 2012.

Chattanooga lost at Auburn, 62-24, in 2010, and at Alabama, 49-0, in 2013.

San Jose State lost at #1-Alabama, 48-3, to open the 2010 season. Linebacker **Vince Buhagiar** started in the Alabama game as a first-time freshman and led the Spartans with nine tackles. Defensive end **Cedric Lousi**, a first-time freshman like Buhagiar, played in the game in a reserve capacity. Lousi was not credited with any tackles.

San José State to join California-based schools playing Auburn: San José State is the fifth California based school and third in the California State University system to play Auburn in football.

Previously, California State University system members Fresno State and Cal State Fullerton played at Auburn in 1990 and 1996 respectively. Cal State Fullerton discontinued football after the 1992 season. Fresno State, like San Jose State is in the Mountain West.

The University of the Pacific (UOP), located in Stockton, 70 miles east of San Jose State played at Auburn in 1989. The UOP Tigers discontinued football after the 1995 season.

San Jose State is not even the first school in Santa Clara County to play Auburn. In 1936, after blanking the Spartans, 20-0 on October 17, Santa Clara University, seven driving miles from San Jose State, made it two shutouts in a row stopping Auburn, 12-0 on October 30, in a game played at San Francisco's Kezar Stadium. Back in the 1930's, Kezar Stadium was the host site for the annual East-West Shrine All-Star Game.

While the Spartans finished the season with a 5-4 record and Auburn going 7-2-2 with a tie in the Baccardi Bowl, Santa Clara finished 1936 as the sixth-ranked team in the final Associated Press poll after a 21-14 win over LSU in the 1937 Sugar Bowl.

San Jose State's Greg Robinson finally faces Auburn: New San Jose State defensive coordinator **Greg Robinson** has more than 35 years of college and professional football coaching experience. He worked at six schools (Pacific, Cal State Fullerton, North Carolina State, Syracuse, Michigan and Texas) that played Auburn, but was not at any of these universities in a game against Auburn.

Robinson was the New York Jets defensive line coach and later defensive coordinator (1990-94) when Auburn grads Fred Baxter and safety Kevin Porter played in New York. Later, Robinson was Kansas City's defensive coordinator (2001-03) when Tigers' running back Tony Richardson and offensive tackle Victor Riley played for the Chiefs.

Caragher becomes the third at San Jose State: **Ron Caragher** became just the third San José State football head coach to lead the Spartans to season-opening victories in each of his first two seasons.

E.R. Knollin, the Spartans' coach from 1924 through 1928, directed San José State to just 13 victories, but the first two came in the 1924 and 1925 season openers against Hollister Junior College and Santa Rosa Junior College, respectively.

More recently, **Darryl Rogers**, the most school's most successful football coach of the 1970's, led the Spartans to season-opening triumphs against Santa Clara in 1973 and 1974. Rogers' teams posted a composite 22-9-3 win-loss record in three seasons.

Caragher's 2013 and 2014 season-opening wins were against Sacramento State and North Dakota.

Spartans continue scoring flurry: In its last three games dating back to last season, San José State scored 156 points. The Spartans opened 2014 with a 42-10 win over North Dakota.

The Navy (52), Fresno State (62) games marked the first time the Spartans scored 50 or more points in consecutive games and the most points scored in back-to-back contests since the end of the 1948 and start of the 1949 seasons.

The most points scored by a San José State team previously in three consecutive games against American-based four-year institutions only were 151 in three 1948 games.

The most points scored by the Spartans in four consecutive games are 190 produced by the 1990 San Jose State team in the final four games of the season.

San José State sets team passing record in opener: San José State tied its single-game team record for passing accuracy in the North Dakota win completing 23-of-26 passes. Starter **Blake Jurich** was 22-of-25 and **Joe Gray** was 1-of-1 for the Spartans. In 2008, San Jose State also completed 23-of-26 passes in a 23-10 loss at Stanford.

A first since 2007 in the offensive line: Redshirt freshmen **Jeremiah Kolone** and **Nate Velichko** became the first pair of freshman to start at the two offensive guard positions since 2007. That year, true freshman **Moa Ngatuwai** earned the starting right guard for the season opener. **Fred Koloto**, also a true freshman, started at left guard for the third game in 2007 before finishing the season as the starting left tackle.

One of the youngest offensive lines: Left tackle **Wes Schweitzer** and center **David Peterson** began 2014 as the only San José State offensive linemen with starting experience. Their 23 starts ranked San José State as fourth fewest among FBS schools at the start of the season.

Spartans make it 10-2 when rushing for 150: San Jose State opened the 2014 season with 150 yards rushing in the North Dakota win. Since 2011, the Spartans are 10-2 in games in which they gained 150 or more yards rushing. The two losses were to Navy in 2013 and UCLA in 2011.

No sacks allowed in opener: Despite only two players with meaningful playing experience in the offensive line, San Jose State was not forced into a quarterback sack in its win over North Dakota. The Spartans now have two complete games dating back to last season without yielding a quarterback sack.

Tyler Winston sets school mark: Wide receiver **Tyler Winston** caught 10 passes for 96 yards in two touchdowns in the 42-10 win over North Dakota. Including the 2013 season-ending games against Navy and Fresno State, respectively, Winston became the first San José State player to catch 10 or more passes in three consecutive games. The 2013 Mountain West Freshman of the Year caught 10 passes each against Navy and Fresno State.

Most punt return yardage in a game in a while: San Jose State opened the season with a resounding improvement in its punt return aspect of special teams play.

In his first game as the Spartans' punt returner, **Tyler Ervin** returned two punts for 73 yards and a touchdown. In one game, Ervin exceeded San Jose State's output for the 2011, 2012 and 2013 seasons and was two yards shy of matching the team's 2010 punt return yardage.

Tyler Ervin ties school record: **Tyler Ervin** tied a San José State career record when he scored a touchdown on a 40-yard punt return against North Dakota. Ervin is the Spartans' career leader for kickoff returned for a touchdown with three and now has a punt return for a six-pointer giving him four.

In 23 games for San José State, he scored touchdowns four different ways - rushing (2), pass receiving (1), kickoff returns (3) and punt returns (1).

Former Spartans **Trestin George (2000-03)**, who went on to play in the Arena Football League, and **Walt Roberts (1962-64)**, who played six seasons with three National Football League teams, share the school record scoring a San José State touchdown five of the six ways (rushing, pass receiving, fumble, interception, punt return and kickoff return).

Ervin is the second Spartan with four career punt and kickoff returns for a touchdown. Jimmie Lassiter was the first with two punt and two kickoff returns for touchdowns during the 1970 through 1972 seasons.

Season captains named: Defensive tackle **Travis Raciti** and center **David Peterson** were named team captains for the 2014 season. Head coach Ron Caragher indicated game captains would be added throughout the year. Raciti becomes the seventh player in the program's history to be named a team captain in more than one season.

Jurich successful in debut as a starting QB: **Blake Jurich** can claim being the first graduate student to be a starting quarterback at San José State and the first Spartan quarterback in 12 years to be named a starter for a season opener and be integral in the victory.

In 2002, **Scott Rislov** led San José State to a 33-18 win over Arkansas State in a neutral site game in Little Rock, Ark.

Jurich completed 22 of 25 passes for 250 yards and three touchdowns in the 42-10 victory over North Dakota on August 28.
