FOOTBALL OPENS 2015 SEASON IN CHICK-FIL-A KICKOFF

» Auburn begins the 2015 season Saturday, September 5, in the Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Classic at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, taking on the ACC's Louisville Cardinals. CBS will televise the 2:30 p.m. CT contest; the winner receives the Old Leather Helmet trophy.

SERIES HISTORY

» Saturday's game will be just the second-ever meeting between Auburn and Louisville. The Tigers defeated the Cardinals, 16-3, in the 1974 season opener at Legion Field in Birmingham, Ala. Auburn is 120-75-9 in games against current members of the ACC.

IN SEASON OPENERS

» Auburn is 94-26-2 (.779) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won eight of their past nine openers dating back to the 2006 season opener.

Auburn's total of 94 season-opening victories is just two behind Alabama (96) and tied with Arkansas (94) for the most among current SEC schools.

The September 5 game is the latest opener for Auburn since opening the 2009 season September 5 vs. Louisiana Tech. The Tigers also opened the 1992 season September 5 (at Ole Miss).

DOMESUCCESS

» The Tigers hold a 6-4 record all-time at the Georgia Dome, winning three SEC Championship Games (2004, 2010, 2013) and three bowl games (1997, 2007, 2011). Auburn is 9-7-1 all-time in games in domed stadiums.

KICK OFF COVERAGE

» Auburn's 2015 campaign will be its 123rd season of college football

» Auburn has won eight out of its last nine season openers dating back to the 2006 opener

» Defensive coordinator Will Muschamp, defensive backs coach Travaris Robinson and linebackers coach Lance Thompson are new to Malzahn's coaching staff for the 2015 season

» The Tigers have won a SEC title three times since 2004, tied for the most among SEC schools

» With 734 all-time victories, Auburn is the 13th-winningest FBS football program in the nation and one of 18 teams with 700+ wins

» Auburn is one of five schools in the nation to have at least one 1,000-yard rusher in every season since 2009

» Gus Malzahn enters his third year as Auburn's head coach with a 20-7 record. During his first two seasons, Malzahn led Auburn to the 2013 BCS National Championship Game, the 2013 SEC Championship and produced two of the nation's most prolific offenses

» Since the start of the 2013 season, Auburn has averaged 293.2 rushing yards per game, sixth best among FBS teams

» Auburn's 2014 defense picked off 22 passes in 2014, led by Jonathan Jones with six interceptions. Eight different players recorded at least one interception last season

THE LAST TIME VS. LOUISVILLE

» BIRMINGHAM (9/14/1974) - The Auburn football team, which barely escaped a trap here, was not exactly living it up in the dressing room in Legion Field following a close battle with Louisville.

The Tigers were happy to come away with a 16-3 victory over a team which somehow did not get the word that it was supposed to lay down and play dead against an SEC opponent.

Not an Auburn fan in the sparse crowd of 25,000 breathed a sigh of relief until early in the fourth quarter, when AU quarterback Phil Gargis galloped 47 yards to set up the first Auburn touchdown and break a 3-3 tie. Gargis’ run put Auburn at the Louisville 12, and he scored five plays later.

Auburn’s defense limited Louisville to four first downs and 94 total yards. Three of those first downs came in the second half. On the next possession, a Louisville fumble on its own 2 was recovered by Auburn’s Liston Eddins, and Gargis sneaked it into the endzone on the next play for the Tigers’ final score.

Auburn coach Shug Jordan was quick to praise the scrappy Cardinals. “Louisville’s linebackers Larry Fluellen and Joe Phillips must have made 100 tackles between them. They were about as quick as you will see and made moving the football a real hard job. Let’s give the Louisville team credit; they played some fine football.

“Phil Gargis made a fine run in the fourth quarter that gave us an offensive lift. Our entire defensive unit was magnificent and I deeply appreciate the effort they made,” said Jordan.

When asked if he was concerned about Auburn’s inability to move the ball on Louisville, Jordan replied, “That is the understatement of the year. I was gravely and deeply concerned and to be quite frank very disgusted at times. However, it was a typical opening game and we have to go back to Auburn and begin making preparations to play Chattanooga and Tennessee.”

AUBURN AND THE ACC

» Auburn holds a 120-75-9 overall record against current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

» The Tigers are 2-2 in their last four meetings against ACC foes in the Georgia Dome dating back to 2001. Overall, Auburn is 3-2 vs. the ACC in the Georgia Dome.

» Saturday's game with Louisville marks the first time Auburn has played an ACC opponent in the regular season since 2012 (Clemson).

AUBURN IN THE RANKINGS

» Auburn ranks sixth in the 2015 preseason AP poll, the second consecutive season the Tigers have been ranked sixth in the preseason poll and the 18th time in program history the Tigers have been in the preseason top 10.

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 298-103-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 165-29-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 133-74-4 all-time.

» Auburn plays five teams ranked in the preseason AP Top 25:

- 3. Alabama
- 9. Georgia
- 14. LSU
- 17. Ole Miss
- 18. Arkansas

Additionally, Auburn plays three other teams that are receiving votes. Mississippi State and Texas A&M are the top two teams among the others receiving votes while Louisville is seventh among other teams receiving votes.

» Auburn is among five schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-14 : Wisconsin (10), Oregon (8), Auburn (7), Boise State (6), and Nebraska (6).

The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013) and Cameron Artis-Payne (2014).

» Gus Malzahn has produced 12 1,000-yard rushers in nine years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, at least one in each season. Malzahn has had five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in a season three times (Arkansas 2006; Auburn 2010, 2013). His 2007 Tulsa offense had three 1,000-yard receivers.

STARTING QB JEREMY JOHNSON

» Sophomore QB Jeremy Johnson is making the second opening day start of his Auburn career.

» Johnson is the first Auburn QB to start back-to-back season openers since Chris Todd (2008-09).

» Johnson, a Montgomery, Ala., native, threw for a career-high 243 yards and two touchdowns versus Arkansas in 2014 to open the season.

Johnson was the first Auburn quarterback to throw for more than 200 yards in a half since Cam Newton in 2010 vs. South Carolina in the SEC championship game (281 yards in first half). Johnson, who completed his first eight passes, finished 12-16 for 243 yards, with touchdown passes to D'haquille Williams (18 yards) and Melvin Ray (49 yards).

» In the three games where he has played a full half of action (Western Carolina and Florida Atlantic in 2013 and Arkansas 2014), Johnson has completed 39-53 passes for 636 yards and eight touchdowns with two interceptions for a 216.65 passing efficiency rating. His eight career touchdown passes have been to seven different receivers.

D'HAQUILLE WILLIAMS

» Junior college product D'haquille "Duke" Williams enjoyed an auspicious Auburn debut in 2014, leading the Tigers with 45 receptions for 730 yards (16.2 yds/catch) and five TD.

» His 100-yard receiving games last season:

- vs. Arkansas, 9/154 yds, 1 TD
- at Alabama, 7/121 yds
- at Kansas State, 8/110, 1 TD
- at Mississippi St., 6/108 yds, 2 TD

RICARDO LOUIS

» Senior Ricardo Louis has 52 career catches for 622 yards and five career TD catches, along with 420 rushing yards and one rushing TD.

» He was the first Auburn receiver in program history to rush for more than 100 yards with a 102-yard effort against South Carolina in 2014.

» Louis' most famous score is the 2013 "Prayer In Jordan-Hare," where he caught a tipped pass from Nick Marshall on 4th-and-18 for a 73-yard touchdown that won the Georgia game with 0:25 remaining in the contest.

MELVIN RAY

» Senior Melvin Ray has caught 13 career passes for 290 yards and two touchdowns. Twelve of his 13 career catches have gone for either a first down or a touchdown.

» His two career scores were a 50-yarder from Nick Marshall in the BCS Championship in 2013 and a 49-yard strike from Jeremy Johnson in the 2014 season opener against Arkansas.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

» The Tigers' streak of 23 games scoring at least 20 points was snapped with the loss at Georgia; that string extended back through the start of the 2013 season. Since 2001, Auburn is 108-19 (.850) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 164-27-1 (.857) when scoring 20 or more points.

30+ POINTS

» Prior to the 20-14 win at Kansas State, Auburn had scored 30 points or more in 12 consecutive games, a school record. The previous best was in 1994, when the Tigers scored 30+ points in eight straight games.

Auburn had its string of 88 consecutive games won when scoring 30 or more points snapped in the BCS title game concluding the 2013 season, a 34-31 loss to Florida State. The streak began after a 56-49 four-overtime loss to Georgia in 1996. In its history, Auburn is now 312-8 (.975) when scoring at least 30 points.

FIRST DOWNS

» Auburn had 20 or more first downs in 20 of its last 22 games. In 27 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 23 times.

In 14 of its last 22 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2014, the Tigers averaged 24.2 first downs per game; under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 24.0 first downs.

TOTAL OFFENSE QTRS UNDER MALZAHN

» Auburn has gained at least 200 yards of total offense in a quarter 10 times in 26 games under Gus Malzahn and four times last season. Seven of those quarters were against SEC teams.

WELCOME WILL MUSCHAMP

» In 12 years as a defensive coordinator or head coach (at LSU, Auburn, Texas and Florida), Will Muschamp has led a defense that finished among the top 10 nationally in total defense 10 times.

» In five years as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp has led a defense that has finished in the top 10 nationally in total defense four times.

» Muschamp's defense has finished in top 20 nationally in scoring defense 10 times in 12 years as a defensive coordinator or head coach.

» During Muschamp's first tenure as Auburn defensive coordinator (2006-07), AU allowed only 15.4 pts/gm (third nationally), 124.4 rush ypg, 170.7 pass ypg and 295.1 total yards per game.

» In four of his eight years as an FBS defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defense

has held opponents to less than 100 rushing yards per game.

» In eight years as an FBS defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in seven seasons.

INTERCEPTORS

» With 22 interceptions last season, Auburn ranked fifth nationally and well surpassed its interception total from 2013 (13). The best-ever Auburn seasons for interceptions: **34** (1969); **25** (1968); **24** (1970); **22** (1972, 1986, 1987, 1994, 1996, **2014**); **21** (1960, 2002).

The Tigers ranked first in the SEC and fifth nationally.

» Eight different players intercepted at least one pass last season. It was the first time since 1973 that two Auburn players had at least six interceptions each for the season: Jonathan Jones (6) and Jermaine Whitehead (6), the fifth-most interceptions in a season in Auburn history and the most since Walter McFadden had six in 2009.

It was the first time a pair of Auburn players picked off at least six passes in the same season since Roger Mitchell and Jim McKinney each had six in 1973.

» Jonathan Jones ranked 13th nationally in interceptions per game (0.5) and eighth in passes defended per game (1.4) last season as a junior, earning second team all-SEC honors.

Heading into the 2015 campaign, Jones is a preseason All-America candidate and is on the watch lists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Senior Bowl.

» The Auburn defense has 35 interceptions in 27 games since the beginning of the 2013 season. Prior to that, the Tigers had 24 interceptions in 37 games since early in the 2010 campaign.

TOP TACKLERS

» Safety Johnathan Ford was Auburn's leading tackler for the 2014 season with 93 stops, 62 of them solo. Linebackers Cassanova McKinzy (91) and Kris Frost (87) were next on the list. McKinzy (189) and Frost (151) each have more than 100 career tackles.

A sophomore last season, Ford was the second underclassman to lead Auburn in tackles during the last two seasons. McKinzy, who led Auburn in tackles (75) as a sophomore in 2013, was the first underclassman to lead AU in that category since sophomore Zac Etheridge in 2008.

DANIEL CARLSON

» Sophomore Daniel Carlson will work as a placekicker this season, but as a redshirt freshman, he handled the majority of punting, placekicking and kickoff duties, the first Tiger to do all three since Damon Duval (1999-2002).

Carlson earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors in his debut vs. Arkansas, averaging 53.3 yards on three punts, downing two inside the 20, and posting seven touchbacks on kick-offs.

His field goals of 46 and 42 yards earned him SEC special teams player of the week honors vs. LSU. Connecting on five field goals and three PAT at Alabama, Carlson's 18 points kicking tied the Auburn single game record set by Al DelGreco vs. Kentucky in 1982. Five field goals made, a career high for Carlson, was the most by an Auburn kicker in a game since Jaret Holmes vs. UAB in 1996. His 51-yard field goal in the Outback Bowl was a career long.

For the year, Carlson was 57-57 on PAT attempts -- third among Auburn single-season leaders for FG made and the best 100% season

in AU history. Carlson was second in Auburn single-season kick scoring with 111 points, tied with Cody Parkey (2013) and his 18 made field goals were third best in a season at Auburn.

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his nine seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last five seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989)

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore at LSU in 1935 and John Vaught at Ole Miss in 1947

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM » 87,451

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl.

The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 37 sell-out games, including the last nine consecutively.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.6 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication hold an overall record of 303-75-7 there.

The 2014 season was the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare Stadium.
