FOOTBALL HOSTS JACKSONVILLE STATE IN 2015 HOME OPENER

» Auburn begins its 2015 home campaign Saturday, September 12, hosting the Jacksonville State Gamecocks in an 11:00 a.m. CT game at Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn. College football's largest videoboard will make its official debut. The SEC Network will televise the contest.

Saturday's game will be just the second morning kickoff under head coach Gus Malzahn. The Tigers previously defeated Tennessee 55-23 in a game that kicked off at 11 a.m. CT in Knoxville in November, 2013. The last morning start time at Jordan-Hare Stadium was Auburn's 51-7 homecoming defeat of Alabama A&M in November, 2012. Malzahn's last morning kickoff at Auburn was a 41-34 win over Mississippi State in September, 2011, while he served as offensive coordinator.

SERIES HISTORY

» Saturday's game will be the first meeting on the gridiron for the Tigers and the Gamecocks. Auburn has an all-time record of 92-47-2 against teams from the state of Alabama, including contests against Alabama, Alabama A&M, UAB, Birmingham-Southern, Camp Sheridan, Marion Institute, Maxwell Field, Montgomery, North Alabama A.C., Samford and Spring Hill.

The recent announcement of a 2018 matchup with Alabama State extends Auburn's commitment to play all of the state's current FCS schools. Along with this year's Jacksonville State matchup, Auburn hosted Samford last season and Alabama A&M in 2012 (and again for 2016).

IN HOME OPENERS

» Auburn is 97-15-3 (.857) all-time in home openers. There were no games played in Auburn during the 1896 season.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» The Tigers enter Saturday's game with a 26-game non-conference home winning streak, dating back through 2007

» Saturday's contest will be the 10th consecutive sell-out at Jordan-Hare Stadium, a record string since the stadium expanded to its current capacity in 2004. It will be Auburn's 16th straight regular-season game in front of a capacity crowd, back through the 2013 game at Tennessee

» With 735 all-time victories, Auburn is the 13th-winningest FBS football program in the nation and one of 18 teams with 700+ wins



» The Tigers have won a SEC title three times since 2004, tied for the most among SEC schools

» Gus Malzahn is in his third year as Auburn's head coach with a 21-7 record. During his first two seasons, Malzahn led Auburn to the 2013 BCS National Championship Game, the 2013 SEC Championship and produced two of the nation's most prolific offenses

» Auburn is one of five schools in the nation to have at least one 1,000-yard rusher in every season since 2009

» In the season opener, 21 players saw their first career action in an Auburn uniform

» Auburn's 2014 defense picked off 22 passes in 2014, led by Jonathan Jones with six interceptions. Eight different players recorded at least one interception last season

- » Six players on the 2015 Auburn roster have already received bachelor's degrees.

» Five of those are working toward graduate degrees in adult education, while Kozan is pursuing an MBA. There are only nine non-seniors in college football who will be playing this season with a bachelor's degree, two of them Auburn juniors Coleman and Kozan. The others:

- » Garrett Adcock (New Mexico, OL, Biology); Tyler Compton (Old Dominion, OL, Mathematics); Colin McElroy (Old Dominion, QB, Economics); Nate Peterman (Pitt, QB, Communications); J.J. Prince (Purdue, OL, Economics); Connor Brewer (Virginia, QB, Communications); and Albert Reid (Virginia, TB, Criminology).

SEC HONOR ROLL

» There were 31 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2014 season, including current team members Peyton Barber, Alec Brown, Daniel Carlson, Shon Coleman, Aaron Garrison, Gray King, Alex Kozan, Chris Laye, Damian Lewis, Duncan McKinney, Tyler Stovall, Tucker Tuberville and Jonathan Wallace. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher.

ACADEMIC TOP TIGERS

» The Academic Top Tiger program recognizes Auburn student-athletes who post a 3.0 GPA or higher in either semester of a school year. The 2014-15 list recognized 42 members of the football team, including Tré Williams, Andrew Williams, Sean White, Jonathan Wallace, Tucker Tuberville, Keenan Sweeney, Tyler Stovall, Braden Smith, Josh Shockley, Dontavius Russell, Nick Ruffin, Ike Powell, Kamryn Pettway, Jonathan Parslow, Duncan McKinney, Tray Matthews, Damian Lewis, Chris Laye, Alex Kozan, Gray King, Raashed Kennion, Austin Golson, Aaron Garrison, Deshaun Davis, Daniel Carlson, Jack Bjork and Peyton Barber from the current squad.

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had nine representatives on the 2014-15 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Austin Golson, Kamryn Pettway, Ike Powell, Dontavius Russell, Josh Shockley, Braden Smith, Keenan Sweeney and Tré Williams.

IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn holds a 162-52-5 (.750) all-time record in games played during the month of September, and has won 37 of its last 46 September matchups. The Tigers are 99-18-1 (.843) all-time at home in September, and 63-34-4 (.641) in games on the road during that month.

NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

» The Tigers have a 26-game home non-conference winning streak. Auburn's last home non-conference loss was a 26-23 OT defeat to South Florida in 2007.

» Overall, Auburn has won 12 consecutive regular season games against non-conference competition since a 26-19 loss to No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 season opener.

» Auburn's all-time regular season record in non-conference play since SEC action began in 1933 is 239-67-6.

» Auburn finished 4-0 in its regular season non-conference schedule for 2014, the 27th time since joining the SEC in 1933 that the Tigers did not lose a game in non-conference regular season action. The Tigers are 1-0 in non-conference play this season.

AUBURN IN THE RANKINGS

» Auburn ranks sixth in the 2015 preseason AP poll, the second consecutive season the Tigers have been ranked sixth in the preseason poll and the 18th time in program history the Tigers have been in the preseason top 10.

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 299-103-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 165-29-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 134-74-4 all-time.

» Auburn plays five teams ranked in the preseason AP Top 25: Alabama (3), Georgia (9), LSU (14), Ole Miss (17) and Arkansas (18). Additionally, Auburn plays three other teams that received preseason votes: Mississippi State, Texas A&M and Louisville.

» This season marks the fourth time Auburn has been ranked in the preseason top 10 at least two consecutive seasons, along with 1958-59, 1984-85-85, and 1987-88-89-90.

ON THE RUN

» With his 115-yard rushing performance against Louisville, sophomore Peyton Barber becomes the 62nd player in Auburn history to rush for 100 yards in a game. Barber carried the ball 24 times versus Louisville; previously in his career, he showed 10 carries for 54 yards in six games.

» Barber's performance was the 31st 100-yard rushing performance by an Auburn player in Gus Malzahn's 28 games as the Tigers' head coach. The Tigers have had at least one 100-yard rusher in 23 of Malzahn's 28 games as head coach; six different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn.

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 18-5. The Tigers have had a 100-yard rusher in eight of the last 10 season openers.

» Auburn has produced the SEC's leading rusher each of the last two seasons:

- 2013 Tre Mason 129.7 ypg (2013)
- 2014 Cameron Artis-Payne 123.7 ypg

» Only two times since 1948 has a school produced the SEC's leading rushing three consecutive years: Auburn (1954-56) and Georgia (1980-82)

LARGEST VIDEO BOARD IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

» Jordan-Hare Stadium is now home to the nation's largest video board, which will make its debut September 12 when the Tigers host Jacksonville State.

» The video structure is 200 feet wide and 105 feet tall, while the board itself ranges 190x57 feet and 10.830 square feet. The cost of the project is \$13.9 million.

» Auburn is among five schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-14, along with Wisconsin (10), Oregon (8), Auburn (7), Boise State (6), and Nebraska (6).

The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013) and Cameron Artis-Payne (2014).

» Gus Malzahn has produced 12 1,000-yard rushers in nine years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, at least one in each season.

Malzahn has had five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers.

Malzahn has had two 1,000-yard rushers in a season three times (Arkansas 2006; Auburn 2010, 2013). His 2007 Tulsa offense had three 1,000-yard receivers.

» Auburn offenses under Malzahn have enjoyed a lot of success in eight neutral site games. In those eight contests with Malzahn serving as either offensive coordinator or head coach, Auburn has totaled 2,141 rushing yards (267.6 ypg) and 23 touchdowns.

In five games played in domes, the Auburn offense put up 1,500 rushing yards (300 ypg) and 16 touchdowns. The best game in either category was the 2013 SEC Championship victory over Missouri, which included 545 rushing yards and seven touchdowns.

STARTING QB JEREMY JOHNSON

» Sophomore QB Jeremy Johnson was the first Auburn QB to start back-to-back season openers since Chris Todd (2008-09).

» His nine career touchdown passes have been to seven different receivers: Ricardo Louis (2), Sammie Coates (2), Quan Bray, Jay Prosch, Melvin Ray, Tony Stevens, C.J. Uzomah and D'haquille Williams.

RICARDO LOUIS

» Against Louisville, senior Ricardo Louis scored on a 33-yard pass from Jeremy Johnson and also scored on an 8-yard run, making him the first Auburn player to score a receiving and a rushing TD in the same game since Tre Mason against Florida State in the BCS Championship game in 2013, and the first Auburn receiver to do so since Ben Obomanu vs. Alabama in 2005. It was Louis' first career game scoring multiple touchdowns.

» Louis now has caught a touchdown pass in consecutive games for the second time in his career. He had a 66-yard touchdown reception in the Outback Bowl vs. Wisconsin last season. Previously, he caught touchdowns in consecutive games vs. San Jose State and Kansas State in 2014.

» Louis has 55 career catches for 676 yards and six career TD catches, along with 441 rushing yards and two rushing TD.

» He was the first Auburn receiver in program history to rush for more than 100 yards with a 102-yard effort against South Carolina in 2014.

» Louis' most famous score is the 2013 "Prayer In Jordan-Hare," where he caught a tipped pass from Nick Marshall on 4th-and-18 for a 73-yard touchdown that won the Georgia game with 0:25 remaining in the contest.

D'HAQUILLE WILLIAMS

» Junior college product D'haquille "Duke" Williams now shows 48 receptions for 770 yards (16.1 yds/catch) and five TD in his two-year Auburn career.

» His 100-yard receiving games last season:

- vs. Arkansas, 9/154 yds, 1 TD
- at Alabama, 7/121 yds
- at Kansas State, 8/110, 1 TD
- at Mississippi St., 6/108 yds, 2 TD

MELVIN RAY

» Senior Melvin Ray has caught 15 career passes for 309 yards and two touchdowns. Thirteen of his 15 career catches have gone for either a first down or a touchdown.

» His two career scores were a 50-yarder from Nick Marshall in the BCS Championship in 2013 and a 49-yard strike from Jeremy Johnson in the 2014 season opener against Arkansas.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

» Since 2001, Auburn is 109-19 (.852) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 165-27-1 (.858) when scoring 20 or more points.

The Tigers' streak of 23 consecutive games scoring at least 20 points was snapped with the loss at Georgia; that string extended back through the start of the 2013 season.

30+ POINTS

» Prior to the 20-14 win at Kansas State in 2014, Auburn had scored 30 points or more in 12 straight games, a school record. The previous best was in 1994, when the Tigers scored 30+ points in eight straight games.

In its history, Auburn is now 313-8 (.975) when scoring at least 30 points.

FIRST DOWNS

» Auburn has had 20 or more first downs in 21 of its last 23 games. In 28 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 24 times.

In 14 of its last 23 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2014, the Tigers averaged 24.2 first downs per game; under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 23.9 first downs.

TOTAL OFFENSE QTRS UNDER MALZAHN

» Auburn has gained at least 200 yards of total offense in a quarter 10 times in 28 games under Gus Malzahn and four times last season. Seven of those quarters were against SEC teams.

FIRST-TIME TIGERS

» Nine true freshmen made their debut for Auburn in the Louisville game: Montavious Atkinson, Byron Cowart, Chandler Cox, Carlton Davis, Jeremiah Dinson, Jeff Holland, Tim Irvin, Kerryon Johnson and Darrell Williams. Cox and Irvin were the first true freshmen to start an Auburn season opener since Reese Dismukes in 2011. The last Auburn true freshman to start on defense was Daren Bates in 2009.

» Redshirt freshmen seeing their first action included Deshaun Davis, Kamryn Pettway, Dontavious Russell, Josh Shockley and Andrew Williams.

» Auburn had seven other players appearing in the Orange and Blue for the first time Saturday: Blake Countess, Austin Golson, Tray Matthews, Kevin Phillips, Jovon Robinson, Jason Smith and Maurice Swain.

» First-time starters for Auburn in the Louisville game: Blake Countess, Chandler Cox, Austin Golson, Tim Irvin, Carl Lawson, Tray Matthews and Dontavious Russell.

WELCOME WILL MUSCHAMP

» In 12 years as a defensive coordinator or head coach (at LSU, Auburn, Texas and Florida), Will Muschamp has led a defense that finished among the top 10 nationally in total defense 10 times.

» In five years as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp has led a defense that has finished in the top 10 nationally in total defense four times.

» Muschamp's defense has finished in top 20 nationally in scoring defense 10 times in 12 years as a defensive coordinator or head coach.

» During Muschamp's first tenure as Auburn defensive coordinator (2006-07), AU allowed only 15.4 pts/gm (third nationally), 124.4 rush ypg, 170.7 pass ypg and 295.1 total yards per game.

» In four of his eight years as an FBS defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defense has held opponents to less than 100 rushing yards per game.

» In eight years as an FBS defensive coordinator, Muschamp's defense has allowed fewer than 20 points per game in seven seasons.

» Auburn has 29 players on NFL rosters at the start of the 2015 regular season, representing 17 different NFL teams.

» Four more former Tigers are on NFL practice squads: Quan Bray (Indianapolis); Brandon King (New England); Trovon Reed (St. Louis); Jermaine Whitehead (San Francisco).

» Auburn had 43 players in NFL preseason camps in 2015, representing 22 different NFL teams.

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) & Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65).

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 16 of the last 17 Pro Bowls. Auburn has had at least one former player in eight of the last 11 Super Bowls.

INTERCEPTORS

» Tray Matthews opened the Louisville game with a 35-yard interception return on the first play from scrimmage. It was the first interception on an opening drive by Auburn since the 2013 Arkansas game (11/2/13).

» With 22 interceptions last season, Auburn ranked fifth nationally and well surpassed its interception total from 2013 (13). The best-ever Auburn seasons for interceptions: **34** (1969); **25** (1968); **24** (1970); **22** (1972, 1986, 1987, 1994, 1996, **2014**); **21** (1960, 2002).

The Tigers ranked first in the SEC and fifth nationally behind Louisville (26), TCU (26), Louisiana Tech (26) and Ohio State (25).

» Eight different players intercepted at least one pass last season. It was the first time since 1973 that two Auburn players had at least six interceptions each for the season: Jonathan Jones (6) and Jermaine Whitehead (6), the fifth-most interceptions in a season in Auburn history and the most since Walter McFadden had six in 2009).

It was the first time a pair of Auburn players picked off at least six passes in the same season since Roger Mitchell and Jim McKinney each had six in 1973.

» Jonathan Jones ranked 13th nationally in interceptions per game (0.5) and eighth in passes defended per game (1.4) last season as a junior, earning second team all-SEC honors.

Heading into the 2015 campaign, Jones is a preseason All-America candidate and is on the watch lists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Senior Bowl.

» The Auburn defense has 36 interceptions in 28 games (1.29/gm) since the beginning of the 2013 season. Prior to that, the Tigers had 34 interceptions in 49 games dating back to the final 10 games of 2009.

TOP TACKLERS

» Safety Johnathan Ford led Auburn with 12 tackles in the win over Louisville, his second career double-figure tackle game.

Ford was Auburn's leading tackler for the 2014 season with 93 stops, 62 of them solo. Linebackers Cassanova McKinzy (91) and Kris Frost (87) were next on the list.

» Auburn had seven double-figure tackle efforts last season, all by current players:

- 14 Kris Frost (South Carolina)
- 13 Kris Frost (Samford)
- 12 Johnathan Ford (Ole Miss)
- 12 Cassanova McKinzy (Texas A&M)
- 12 Kris Frost (Wisconsin)
- 11 Joshua Holsey (Kansas State)
- 10 Cassanova McKinzy (San José State)

» Ford now shows 110 career tackles, the third member of the 2015 team with more than 100 career stops, along with seniors Cassanova McKinzy (195) and Kris Frost (159).

KICKER DANIEL CARLSON

» Sophomore placekicker Daniel Carlson's 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville, a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record, is the longest kick in college football this season. It was a career long for the sophomore; his previous long was 51 yards vs. Wisconsin last year.

The 56-yarder was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2003 (57 yds, Philip Yost vs. Western Kentucky) and ties John Riley (at Tennessee, 1969) for the third-longest FG in Auburn history.

That kick tied for the 13th longest in SEC history and was the longest in the SEC since Marshall Morgan of Georgia's 56-yarder in 2013.

» Carlson is now 2-2 in his career on field goals of at least 50 yards, making a 51-yarder in the Outback Bowl and a 56-yarder in the season opener vs. Louisville. The 56-yarder was one yard short of the Auburn record, shared by Neil O'Donoghue (1969) and Philip Yost (2003).

He is the just the third AU placekicker with FGs of 50+ yards in back-to-back games, along with John Riley (1969; Tennessee/56, Kentucky/54) and John Vaughn (Washington State/52, Miss State/55). In 1987, Win Lyle had FGs of 55 and 52 yards in a game vs. Tennessee.

» Carlson has made 61 consecutive PAT kicks, the sixth longest string in Auburn history.

Last season, Carlson was 57-57 on PAT attempts -- third among Auburn single-season leaders for FG made and the best 100% season in AU history. Carlson was second in Auburn single-season kick scoring with 111 points, tied with Cody Parkey (2013) and his 18 made field goals were third best in a season at Auburn.

» All six of Daniel Carlson's kickoffs vs. Louisville went for touchbacks. For his career, 56 of his 87 kickoffs (64.4%) have resulted in touchbacks.

MORE FROM THE LOUISVILLE GAME...

» Justin Garrett's 82-yard fumble return for a touchdown was the longest fumble return for a TD for Auburn in records dating back to 1969. The last AU fumble return TD was by Daren Bates vs. New Mexico State in 2012 (62 yds). It was the first touchdown of Garrett's career.

» Auburn's four sacks vs. Louisville matched its season-high from any game in 2014. The Tigers recorded four sacks against San José State and Ole Miss last season.

» This was the fourth consecutive game Auburn has forced at least one opponent interception. It was the first interception on an opening drive by Auburn since the 2013 Arkansas game (11/2/13).

» Auburn shut out an opponent in the first half for the first time since the 2012 Alabama A&M game (11/17/12), a span of 29 games.

» Gus Malzahn's offenses have scored 59, 43, 56 and 31 points in their last four games in the Georgia Dome (averaging 47.25 ppg)

FAST FACTS

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his nine seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last five seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989)

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM » 87,451

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl.

The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons. Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 37 sell-out games, including the last nine consecutively.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the sixth-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.6 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication hold an overall record of 303-75-7 there.

The 2014 season was the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare Stadium.

ACADEMICS

- » In the 2014-15 academic year, 108 student-athletes graduated from Auburn University.
- » A record 346 student-athletes received the Top Tiger Award in 2014-15 with a GPA of 3.0.
- » During the 2014-2015 academic year, more than 200 Auburn University student-athletes were honored as members of the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- » Thirty-two current and former football student-athletes graduated during the 2014-15 academic year, including Cam Newton and Carnell Williams.
- » Six current Tigers have received their degrees, including: Shon Coleman, Devonte Danzy, Justin Garrett, Keymiya Harrell, Alex Kozan and Blake Countess (Michigan).
- » During Autumn of 2014, Auburn swimmer Tofey Leon was selected as a Rhodes Scholarship Finalist. Former Auburn University football player Partick Young was a nominee for the Rhodes Scholarship while former Auburn University football player Ashton Richardson was selected as one of 40 Marshall Scholarship recipients.

FINANCIALS

- » In the last 23 years, the Athletics Department budget has grown from \$21 million to \$128.7 million.
- » In back-to-back years, the Auburn football program had its highest sale of season tickets in school history in 2014 and 2015. In 2015, Auburn sold out of season tickets on June 8, two months earlier than in 2014.
- » Men's basketball season ticket sales increased 122.8% for the 2014-15, selling out premium seating for the first time in the history of Auburn Arena. TUF sales are up 75% year-to-date in 2015-16.
- » Baseball season ticket sales increased 23.4% in 2015.

FACILITIES

- » During 2014, Auburn Athletics funded more than \$7.5 million in facility improvements.
- » Installed prior to the 2015 season, Jordan-Hare Stadium boasts the nation's largest video board, which is 57 feet tall by 190 feet wide.
- » Opened in August 2014, the state-of-the-art Auburn Wellness Kitchen provides student-athletes, students and the general population a dining facility that has six action stations and accommodates those with special dietary needs.
- » The 2014-15 academic year witnessed the launch of the SEC Network which saw major infrastructure work completed necessary to support the SEC Network and War Eagle Productions.

GAME DAY

- » Auburn's game day experience named by outside parties as offering the best tailgating and the best traditions.
- » Per a survey done by the SEC, in which they measured 60 attributes related to the overall game day experience, Auburn scored better than the SEC average on 56 of the 60 measured attributes. Two of the below average rated attributes related to food & beverage prices, for which we in response reduced the price of water and hot dogs to very positive response from our fans.
- » Over 96% of Auburn's donors and fans indicate that the frequency of communication, the transparency of communication, and the content of communication from Auburn Athletics meets or exceeds their needs.

WINNING

- » Auburn has finished in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Director's Cup for 10 consecutive years.
- » Auburn has won 13 national titles since 2004, which is third-most in the SEC. National Champion teams include Football, Men's Swimming and Diving, Women's Swimming and Diving, Equestrian, and Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- » Auburn has won 20 SEC titles in the past 10 years, tied for fourth-most in the conference.
- » Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sports participated in postseason competition in 2014-15, with four programs achieving Top 10 finishes nationally.
- » The Auburn football team has won a National Championship and two Southeastern Conference Championships in the last five years, and played for the national title for the second time in four years in 2013.
- » No school has won more SEC Football Championships in the last 10 years than Auburn.
- » The Auburn softball team had its best season in school history, advancing to its' first-ever Women's College World Series, where it advanced to the semifinals.
- » Gymnastics advanced to the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years and second time in school history in 2015, finishing sixth while breaking 52 program records.

GAME 1

Auburn's defense set the tone, scored some points and helped the Tigers to a cushy lead through the first half and beyond in the season-opener.

Good thing the defense played well early and Peyton Barber rushed for 115 yards, because the combo helped the Tigers to a 31-24 win Saturday in the Georgia Dome.

Auburn led 24-0 in the third quarter before Louisville made it interesting, cutting its deficit to seven with 2:18 to play. The Tigers played keep-away from there.

The Tigers happily showed off their new defense early, setting up an early touchdown following an interception, scoring again on an 82-yard fumble return by Justin Garrett and generally frustrating offensive-minded Louisville until the second half.

Will Muschamp, the former Auburn defensive coordinator who returned to his former job last December, was a complement to Gus Malzahn's offense, Barber, quarterback Jeremy Johnson and receiver Ricardo Louis' offensive exploits.

Johnson threw for a touchdown and ran for another, Louis caught a touchdown pass and ran for another and Barber came off the bench, replacing the injured Roc Thomas, to break through the 100-yard barrier, gaining 95 of those in the second half when Auburn needed him most.

Auburn led 24-0 midway through the third quarter and everything seemed to be in fine shape.

The latter half of the game was more of a challenge, and losing defensive end Carl Lawson to an injury didn't help.

Lawson wasn't the only one who missed time after being hurt.

Auburn played on.

The rebuild offensive line helped Auburn to 190 rushing yards.

Johnson hit 11-of-21 passes for 137 yards and a touchdown and three interceptions.

Auburn's defense showed the way this time in the first half, setting up a Johnson 1-yard touchdown run following a Tray Matthews interception on Louisville's first play; and Garrett's 82-yard fumble return to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 6:54 left in the second quarter.

That was the longest fumble return since at least 1969 when Auburn began recording that stat.

Daniel Carlson then hit a career-best 56-yard field goal to make 17-0 with 34 seconds left in the half. That was the longest Auburn field goal since 2003 when Philip Yost hit a 57-yarder and the third longest in school history.

A 33-yard Johnson-to-Ricardo Louis touchdown pass made it 24-0 with 11:21 in the third quarter. Louisville finally scored on a 33-yard John Wallace field goal with 7:07 left in the third, then made it 24-10 on a 10-yard run by Lamar Jackson.

Louis' 8-yard touchdown on an end around gave Auburn a 31-10 lead with 10:04 remaining in the game. The Cardinals scored to make it 31-17 with 6:21 remaining. Louisville cut it to 31-24, but didn't get the ball back.

Auburn went young early, starting true freshmen Chandler Cox and Tim Irvin. They were the first true freshmen to start on opening day since Reese Dismukes in 2011.
