FOOTBALL HOSTS SAN JOSÉ STATE FOR HOMECOMING

» Auburn hosts the San José State Spartans of the Mountain West Conference on Saturday, October 3, in a 3:00 p.m. CT game at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in Auburn, Ala. The SEC Network will televise the Homecoming contest.

The San José State game will be the 12th consecutive sell-out at Jordan-Hare Stadium, a record string since the stadium expanded to its current capacity in 2004. Auburn announced a sell-out of all seats for the 2015 home season before the home opener. It will be Auburn's 19th straight regular-season game in front of a capacity crowd, back through the 2013 Georgia game.

SERIES HISTORY

» This will be just the second meeting on the gridiron between Auburn and San José State. Last year. Last season, Auburn was a 59-13 winner over the Spartans on September 6 at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

» Auburn has previously faced four current members of the Mountain West Conference, posting a 4-0 mark. That includes wins over Fresno State (1996, 62-0), Wyoming (2000, 35-21) Utah State (2011, 42-38) and San José State (2014, 59-13), all at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

» Auburn has a 5-3 record all-time against teams from the state of California. Those games: 1936: Santa Clara (L, 0-12); 1986: Southern Cal (Citrus Bowl, W, 16-7); 1989 Pacific (W, 55-0); 1990: Cal State Fullerton (W, 38-17); 1996: Fresno State (W, 62-0); 2002: Southern Cal (L, 17-24); 2003: Southern Cal (L, 0-23); 2014: San José State (W, 59-13).

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Daniel Carlson has three of the 25 longest field goals in college football this season. His 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville is the second-longest in college football so far in 2015

» Peyton Barber has rushed for 100 yards in three games already this season: vs. Louisville (115), Jacksonville State (125) and Mississippi State (137)

» With 736 all-time victories, Auburn is the 13th-winningest FBS football program in the nation and one of 18 teams with 700+ wins

» Senior captain Jonathan Wallace is one of 11 FBS student-athletes named to the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his commitment to community service

» Eighteen of senior Melvin Ray's 22 career receptions have gone for either a first down or a touchdown

» Auburn's defense held Mississippi State to 56 rushing yards, the fewest rushing yards for an AU opponent since Kansas State (40 yards) last year and the fewest by an SEC opponent since Mississippi State (38 yards) in 2008

» Five of those are working toward graduate degrees in adult education, while Kozan is pursuing an MBA. There are only nine non-seniors in college football who will be playing this season with a bachelor's degree, two of them Auburn juniors Coleman and Kozan. The others:

- » Garrett Adcock (New Mexico, OL, Biology); Tyler Compton (Old Dominion, OL, Mathematics); Colin McElroy (Old Dominion, QB, Economics); Nate Peterman (Pitt, QB, Communications); J.J. SEC HONOR ROLL

» There were 31 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2014 season, including current team members Peyton Barber, Alec Brown, Daniel Carlson, Shon Coleman, Aaron Garrison, Gray King, Alex Kozan, Chris Laye, Damian Lewis, Duncan McKinney, Tyler Stovall, Tucker Tuberville and Jonathan Wallace. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher.

ACADEMIC TOP TIGERS

» The Academic Top Tiger program recognizes Auburn student-athletes who post a 3.0 GPA or higher in either semester of a school year. The 2014-15 list recognized 42 members of the football team, including Tré Williams, Andrew Williams, Sean White, Jonathan Wallace, Tucker Tuberville, Keenan Sweeney, Tyler Stovall, Braden Smith, Josh Shockley, Dontavius Russell, Nick Ruffin, Ike Powell, Kamryn Pettway, Jonathan Parslow, Duncan McKinney, Tray Matthews, Damian Lewis, Chris Laye, Alex Kozan, Gray King, Raashed Kennion, Austin Golson, Aaron Garrison, Deshaun Davis, Daniel Carlson, Jack Bjork and Peyton Barber from the current squad.

SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had nine representatives on the 2014-15 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Austin Golson, Kamryn Pettway, Ike Powell, Dontavius Russell, Josh Shockley, Braden Smith, Keenan Sweeney and Tré Williams.

NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

» The Tigers now have a 27-game home non-conference winning streak. Auburn's last home non-conference loss was a 26-23 OT defeat to South Florida in 2007.

» Overall, Auburn has won 13 consecutive regular season games against non-conference competition since a 26-19 loss to No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 season opener.

» Auburn's all-time regular season record in non-conference play since SEC action began in 1933 is 240-67-6.

SEC NUMBERS

» In SEC action all-time, Auburn holds a 302-237-18 overall record. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 125-53-6 all-time. In all SEC games played away from Auburn, the Tigers are 177-184-12 overall.

IN OCTOBER

» Auburn is 304-157-18 (.652) all-time in the month of October, and has won 14 of its last 21 October contests. Auburn's all-time home record in October is 168-33-3 (.827). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 136-124-15 (.521) during the month of October.

HOMECOMING

» Saturday's game will mark the 102nd observance of Homecoming at Auburn and the 89th homecoming game. Homecoming at Auburn began in June, 1913, when Dr. Charles Thach, president of what was then Alabama Polytechnic Institute, issued a proclamation calling for "the observance of a Homecoming for all those loyal sons who, as former Auburn students, have passed through her portals and received her honors."

Homecoming festivities were held in connection with the spring commencement

exercises until 1924, when Auburn beat Clemson, 13-0, in Auburn's first Homecoming game. The game was played on old Drake Field, now the parking lot for the student union.

Until the first section of Jordan-Hare Stadium was completed in 1939, Auburn often observed Homecoming in Montgomery or Columbus, Ga., since adequate campus facilities were not available. Auburn did not have Homecoming games in 1930 and 1938. There was no team in 1943 because of World War II.

» Auburn is 76-8-4 in Homecoming games. Mississippi State (16 times) has been the most common Homecoming opponent.

Auburn has won 23 straight Homecoming contests, a school record for consecutive Homecoming victories; the previous best of 18 straight Homecoming wins was from 1953-69. Its last Homecoming loss came in 1991 against Mississippi State (24-17).

Auburn has scored 25 or more points in 28 of the last 32 Homecoming games, including 30 or more points in 26 of those contests.

» At halftime, the Homecoming Queen will be crowned on the east side of the field. More than 50 applicants went through two rounds of interviews before five finalists were announced. The queen is elected by a vote of the Auburn student body. All applicants must be an undergraduate with senior status, maintain a 2.5 GPA or better and be nominated by one of 300 campus organizations.

ON THE RUN

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 25 of 31 games under head coach Gus Malzahn.

Six different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (32 100-yard rushing performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 18-6.

LARGEST VIDEO BOARD IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

» Jordan-Hare Stadium is now home to the nation's largest video board, which made its debut September 12 when the Tigers hosted Jacksonville State.

» The video structure is 200 feet wide and 105 feet tall, while the board itself ranges 190x57 feet and 10.830 square feet. The cost of the project is \$13.9 million.

» With his 115-yard rushing performance against Louisville, sophomore Peyton Barber became the 62nd player in Auburn history to rush for 100 yards in a game. Barber carried the ball 24 times versus Louisville; previously, he showed 10 carries for 54 yards in six games.

» Barber followed that up with 125 yards rushing vs. Jacksonville State, including the game-winning 4-yard TD run in overtime, making him the 22nd Auburn player who has rushed for 100 yards in at least two straight games. An Auburn player has posted consecutive 100-yard games 45 times in the program's history.

» Barber rushed for a career-best 137 yards on 27 carries against Mississippi State.

» Auburn has produced the SEC's leading rusher the last two seasons:

- 2013 Tre Mason 129.7 ypg (2013)
- 2014 Cameron Artis-Payne 123.7 ypg

» Auburn is among five schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-14, along with Wisconsin (10), Oregon (8), Auburn (7), Boise State (6), and Nebraska (6).

The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013) and Cameron Artis-Payne (2014).

QB SEAN WHITE

» Sean White was the first Auburn freshman QB to make his first start in an SEC game since Jeff Klein at Tennessee in 1999. Auburn has had six freshman QB starters since 2000.

» Against Mississippi State, White was 20-28 passing for 188 yards with one interception in his college debut.

RICARDO LOUIS

» Senior Ricardo Louis has 68 career catches for 768 yards and six career TD catches, along with 450 rushing yards and two rushing TD.

Louis has caught a pass in 20 consecutive games played, back to the 2013 Georgia game.

» Against Louisville, Louis scored on a 33-yard pass from Jeremy Johnson and also scored on an 8-yard run -- the first Auburn player to score a receiving and a rushing TD in the same game since Tre Mason against Florida State in the BCS Championship game in 2013, and the first Auburn receiver to do so since Ben Obomanu vs. Alabama in 2005.

It was Louis' first career game scoring multiple touchdowns, and the second time he

caught a TD pass in consecutive games.

» Louis' career-best 10 receptions vs. Jacksonville State were the most by an AU player since Emory Blake (10) vs. Arkansas in 2012. Louis tied for the fourth-best single game in AU history, and only the eighth player at Auburn with 10 or more receptions in a game.

» He was the first Auburn receiver in program history to rush for more than 100 yards with a 102-yard effort against South Carolina in 2014.

» Louis' most famous score is the 2013 "Prayer In Jordan-Hare," where he caught a tipped pass from Nick Marshall on 4th-and-18 for a 73-yard touchdown that won the Georgia game with 0:25 remaining in the contest.

MELVIN RAY

» Senior Melvin Ray has caught 22 career passes for 374 yards and four touchdowns. **Eighteen of his 22 career catches have gone for either a first down or a touchdown.**

» His 10-yard TD reception from Jeremy Johnson vs. Jacksonville State tied that game with just 1:22 remaining in regulation. He had a nine-yard TD catch from Johnson at LSU.

The other two career scores were a 50-yarder from Nick Marshall in the BCS Championship in 2013 and a 49-yard strike from Johnson in the 2014 season opener against Arkansas.

D'HAQUILLE WILLIAMS

» D'haquille "Duke" Williams now shows 56 receptions for 860 yards (15.4 yds/catch) and six TD in his two-year Auburn career.

» His 100-yard receiving games last season:

- vs. Arkansas, 9/154 yds, 1 TD
- at Alabama, 7/121 yds
- at Kansas State, 8/110, 1 TD
- at Mississippi St., 6/108 yds, 2 TD

WHEN SCORING 20+ AND 30+

» Since 2001, Auburn is 110-20 (.852) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 166-28-1 (.857) when scoring 20 or more points.

In its history, Auburn is now 313-8 (.975) when scoring at least 30 points.

FIRST-TIME TIGERS

» There have been 11 first-time starters on defense and 17 first-time starters overall for Auburn this season.

» Ten true freshmen have made their Auburn debut, including nine in the Louisville game: Montavious Atkinson, Byron Cowart, Chandler Cox, Carlton Davis, Jeremiah Dinson, Jeff Holland, Tim Irvin, Kerryon Johnson and Darrell Williams. Cox and Irvin were the first AU true

freshmen to start a season opener since Reese Dismukes in 2011; the last Auburn true frosh to start on defense was Daren Bates in 2009. Jalen Harris saw his first action vs. Jacksonville State.

» Redshirt freshmen seeing their first action this season include Deshaun Davis, Kamryn Pettway, Dontavius Russell, Josh Shockley, Sean White and Andrew Williams.

» Auburn had seven other players appearing in the Orange and Blue for the first time vs. Louisville: Blake Countess, Austin Golson, Tray Matthews, Kevin Phillips, Jovon Robinson, Jason Smith and Maurice Swain.

» First-time starters for Auburn vs. Louisville: Blake Countess, Chandler Cox, Austin Golson, Tim Irvin, Carl Lawson, Tray Matthews, Dontavius Russell;

First-time starters vs. Jacksonville State: Peyton Barber, Nick Ruffin, Raashed Kennion;

» Auburn has had 20 or more first downs in 23 of its last 26 games. In 31 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 26 times.

In 15 of its last 26 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2014, the Tigers averaged 24.2 first downs per game; under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 23.6 first downs.

WELCOME WILL MUSCHAMP

» In 12 years as a defensive coordinator or head coach (at LSU, Auburn, Texas and Florida), Will Muschamp has led a defense that finished among the NCAA top 10 in total defense 10 times. Muschamp's defense has finished in top 20 nationally in scoring defense 10 times in 12 years as a defensive coordinator or head coach.

» In five years as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp has led a defense that has finished in the top 10 nationally in total defense four times.

INTERCEPTORS

» Tray Matthews opened the Louisville game with a 35-yard interception return on the first play from scrimmage. It was the first INT on an opening drive by Auburn since the 2013 Arkansas game.

» Johnathan Ford recorded an interception in the Jacksonville State game, the fourth pick of his career.

» The Auburn defense has 37 interceptions in 31 games (1.23/gm) since the beginning of the 2013 season. Prior to that, the Tigers had 34 interceptions in 49 games dating back to the final 10 games of 2009.

» Auburn had 43 players in NFL preseason camps in 2015, representing 22 different NFL teams.

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) & Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65).

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 16 of the last 17 Pro Bowls. Auburn has had at least one former player in eight of the last 11 Super Bowls.

» Jonathan Jones ranked 13th nationally in INT/game (0.5; 6 total) and eighth in passes defended per game (1.4; 11 PBU total) last season, earning second team all-SEC honors.

Heading into the 2015 campaign, Jones was a preseason All-American and is on watch lists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, Jim Thorpe Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Senior Bowl.

Jones is one of 30 semifinalists for the Senior CLASS Award, for seniors utilizing their complete athletic eligibility, remaining committed to their school and pursuing the many rewards a senior season brings. Ten finalists will be selected mid-season, with the winner being announced in January.

TOP TACKLERS

» Three Auburn players recorded 10 tackles each in the LSU game: Kris Frost, Johnathan Ford and Tré Williams (career high). The last time three Auburn defenders had 10+ tackles in a game was against ULM in 2012: Daren Bates (14), Demetruce McNeal (11), Jake Holland (10).

» Three current players have more than 100 career tackles: Cassanova McKinzy (221), Frost (182) and Ford (133).

» Ford led Auburn with 12 tackles in the win over Louisville and added 12 more stops against Jacksonville State and 10 at LSU, giving him four career double-figure tackle games.

The last Auburn player with 10+ tackles in three straight games was Demetruce McNeal in 2012 at Vanderbilt (12), vs. Texas A&M (10) and vs. New Mexico State (10).

» Linebacker Cassanova McKinzy led Auburn with 13 tackles against Jacksonville State, his sixth career double-figure game, and sacked JSU's QB Eli Jenkins for a 16-yard loss on 3rd-and-goal in overtime.

» Blake Countess led Auburn with nine tackles, 2 PBU and a TFL against Mississippi State.

KICKER DANIEL CARLSON

» Sophomore Daniel Carlson's 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville, a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record, **is the second-longest kick in college football this season.** It was a career long; his previous was 51 yards vs. Wisconsin last year.

The 56-yarder was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2003 (57 yds, Philip Yost vs. Western Kentucky) and ties John Riley (at Tennessee, 1969) for the third-longest FG in Auburn history.

» Carlson is the only kicker nationally this season to make three field goals of 49+ yards.

» Carlson is 3-3 on career FG of at least 50 yards, making a 51-yarder in the Outback Bowl, a 56-yarder (one yard short of the Auburn record) in the season opener vs. Louisville, and a 51-yarder vs. Mississippi State.

He is the just the third AU kicker with FGs of 50+ yards in back-to-back games, along with John Riley (1969; Tennessee/56, Kentucky/54) and John Vaughn (Washington State/52, Miss State/55). In 1987, Win Lyle had FGs of 55 and 52 yards in a game vs. Tennessee.

» Carlson has made 67 consecutive PAT kicks, the fifth longest such string in Auburn history.

Last season, Carlson was 57-57 on PAT attempts -- third among Auburn single-season leaders for FG made and the best 100% season in AU history. Carlson was second in Auburn single-season kick scoring with 111 points, tied with Cody Parkey (2013) and his 18 made field goals were third best in a season at Auburn.

» This season, 14 of Carlson's 17 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks, the third best percentage (82.4%) nationally. For his career, 64 of 98 kickoffs (65.3%) have been touchbacks.

» Carlson has scored 132 points (24-31 FG, 67-67 PAT) during his two-year career.

PUNTER KEVIN PHILLIPS

» Junior college transfer Kevin Phillips' 50.0 yd/punt average at LSU (6/300) was the best for an Auburn punter since Daniel Carlson averaged 53.3 yds/punt (3/160) against Arkansas in the 2014 season opener.

» Phillips' 56-yard punt at LSU was a career long, and the longest Auburn punt since the 2014 season opener vs. Arkansas, when Daniel Carlson had a 62-yarder.

» With four punts of 50+ yards at LSU, Phillips had the most 50-yd punts in a game for Auburn since the school record of five 50+ yard punts by Skip Johnston vs. Florida (53.2 avg) in 1978.

MORE FROM THE MSU GAME...

» Nine different receivers caught at least one pass for Auburn, a season high.

» Mississippi State was the first Auburn opponent held without a rushing touchdown since last year vs. Samford and the first time against an SEC opponent since last year vs. Texas A&M.

» Auburn's 36:10 time of possession vs. Mississippi State was the most for the Tigers since the 2007 Ole Miss game (36:23).

#5 Auburn 59, San Jose' State 13

» AUBURN, Ala. (Sept. 6, 2014) -- There were the points, sure. But offensive-minded coach Gus Malzahn liked most everything else, too.

Defense? Check. Special teams? Check. Quarterback and running back play? Check and check.

Auburn ran past San Jose State 59-13 before a sellout crowd of 87,451 Saturday night in Jordan-Hare Stadium behind a mix of big plays and consistency.

Malzahn's first post-game assessment?

"The positives, we had three interceptions on defense, and a punt return for a touchdown," said Malzahn, the Auburn coach who saw his Tigers improve to 2-0 after backing up its 45-21 win over Arkansas in the season-opener with another dominating performance on Saturday.

Cameron Artis-Payne rushed for more than 100 yards for the second straight game while running for three touchdowns.

Auburn scored seven touchdowns, including a 55-yard punt return by veteran Quan Bray, and a 3-yard touchdown run by freshman Roc Thomas on his first-ever Auburn carry.

Auburn's defense was solid again, thanks in part to interceptions by Jermaine Whitehead, Rudy Ford and Trovon Reed; and Auburn's offense used three quarterbacks again and mixed in some running backs again.

Nick Marshall started at quarterback and played the first three quarters. When he left, Auburn was up 45-13.

Marshall scored on a 27-yard touchdown run. He threw a 4-yard touchdown pass. There were the feel-good stories of two long-time Tigers.

Bray masterfully returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown. Reed, the receiver-turned-defensive back, intercepted a pass in the end zone to turn back a late San Jose State opportunity.

Defensive end Montravius Adams didn't intercept a pass. But he had a sack and, overall, three tackles for a loss, and the fans cheered every one.

"I think it got guys got rolling," Malzahn said.

"Montravius got in there. As the game went on, our guys really got back there."

The sack, said Malzahn, "was a big play in the game. It gives everybody positive emotion and momentum."

Auburn can consider all of that, and its 2-0 start, during next week's off week, though Malzahn said that really won't be the priority.

Saturday was another easy win, but he said Auburn benefitted from it.

"We've got to get better. We have to worry about us," he said.

"We have to feel like when we watch this tape we did improve from Week One to Week Two.

"Overall, I feel like we've done that."

Artis-Payne rushed for 177 yards and a touchdown in the win over Arkansas, then went for 112 yards and three touchdowns against San Jose State. He did most of that work in the first half, when it mattered, when he rushed for 106 yards.

Marshall was second in rushing, like he was last year, by running for 103 yards. Corey Grant rushed for 89 yards. Marshall averaged 9.4 yards a run, Grant averaged 8.9 yards a run. Artis-Payne averaged 7.

Malzahn said Artis Payne "did a good job. Corey did a good job in there, too. We've got to have those two guys."

Bonus points: "He's got a good understanding of the overall offense; he's a good pass protector," Malzahn said.

Everybody seemed to get into the act in the first half on the way to Auburn's 38-10 lead. Artis-Payne scored three touchdowns in the first two quarters. Bray made his spectacular 55-yard punt return for a touchdown, sidestepping tacklers and outracing everyone to the end zone. Duke Williams, who caught nine passes in the opener, caught four more, all in the first half.

Marshall played the first three quarters, reversing the role he played with backup quarterback Jeremy Johnson in the first game. Like the opener, Jonathan Wallace finished up at quarterback.

Whitehead intercepted a pass, his second of the season, to set up one TD. Ford intercepted a pass to set up a 27-yard Daniel Carlson field goal on the last play of the half.

Auburn scored on one drive by doing nothing but running the ball. It scored other times by mixing it up.

Marshall threw a touchdown pass, a 4-yarder to Ricardo Louis.

The stats didn't lie. Auburn had 321 yards at the half. They coasted from there, finishing with 493.

FAST FACTS

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his nine seasons as a collegiate coach.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last five seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989)

» His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM » 87,451

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451, with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the east side and college football's largest videoboard - debuted in 2015 - spanning the south end.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the seventh-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 79.5 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication and hold an overall record of 304-76-7 there.

The 2014 season was the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span.

Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl.

The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons.

Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 39 sell-out games, including the last 11 consecutively.

ACADEMICS

- » In the 2014-15 academic year, 108 student-athletes graduated from Auburn University.
- » A record 346 student-athletes received the Top Tiger Award in 2014-15 with a GPA of 3.0.
- » During the 2014-2015 academic year, more than 200 Auburn University student-athletes were honored as members of the All-SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- » Thirty-two current and former football student-athletes graduated during the 2014-15 academic year, including Cam Newton and Carnell Williams.
- » Six current Tigers have received their degrees, including: Shon Coleman, Devonte Danzy, Justin Garrett, Keymiya Harrell, Alex Kozan and Blake Countess (Michigan).
- » During Autumn of 2014, Auburn swimmer Tofey Leon was selected as a Rhodes Scholarship Finalist. Former Auburn University football player Partick Young was a nominee for the Rhodes Scholarship while former Auburn University football player Ashton Richardson was selected as one of 40 Marshall Scholarship recipients.

FINANCIALS

- » In the last 23 years, the Athletics Department budget has grown from \$21 million to \$128.7 million.
- » In back-to-back years, the Auburn football program had its highest sale of season tickets in school history in 2014 and 2015. In 2015, Auburn sold out of season tickets on June 8, two months earlier than in 2014.
- » Men's basketball season ticket sales increased 122.8% for the 2014-15, selling out premium seating for the first time in the history of Auburn Arena. TUF sales are up 75% year-to-date in 2015-16.
- » Baseball season ticket sales increased 23.4% in 2015.

FACILITIES

- » During 2014, Auburn Athletics funded more than \$7.5 million in facility improvements.
- » Installed prior to the 2015 season, Jordan-Hare Stadium boasts the nation's largest video board, which is 57 feet tall by 190 feet wide.
- » Opened in August 2014, the state-of-the-art Auburn Wellness Kitchen provides student-athletes, students and the general population a dining facility that has six action stations and accommodates those with special dietary needs.
- » The 2014-15 academic year witnessed the launch of the SEC Network which saw major infrastructure work completed necessary to support the SEC Network and War Eagle Productions.

GAME DAY

- » Auburn's game day experience named by outside parties as offering the best tailgating and the best traditions.
- » Per a survey done by the SEC, in which they measured 60 attributes related to the overall game day experience, Auburn scored better than the SEC average on 56 of the 60 measured attributes. Two of the below average rated attributes related to food & beverage prices, for which we in response reduced the price of water and hot dogs to very positive response from our fans.
- » Over 96% of Auburn's donors and fans indicate that the frequency of communication, the transparency of communication, and the content of communication from Auburn Athletics meets or exceeds their needs.

WINNING

- » Auburn has finished in the top 10 percent of the NACDA Director's Cup for 10 consecutive years.
- » Auburn has won 13 national titles since 2004, which is third-most in the SEC. National Champion teams include Football, Men's Swimming and Diving, Women's Swimming and Diving, Equestrian, and Women's Outdoor Track and Field.
- » Auburn has won 20 SEC titles in the past 10 years, tied for fourth-most in the conference.
- » Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sports participated in postseason competition in 2014-15, with four programs achieving Top 10 finishes nationally.
- » The Auburn football team has won a National Championship and two Southeastern Conference Championships in the last five years, and played for the national title for the second time in four years in 2013.
- » No school has won more SEC Football Championships in the last 10 years than Auburn.
- » The Auburn softball team had its best season in school history, advancing to its' first-ever Women's College World Series, where it advanced to the semifinals.
- » Gymnastics advanced to the NCAA Super Six for the first time in 22 years and second time in school history in 2015, finishing sixth while breaking 52 program records.
- » Men's Swimming & Diving team has recorded 23 consecutive top-10 NCAA finish and has won 18 of the last 22 SEC Championships (including 16 consecutive titles from 1997-2012).
- » Women's Golf has won three SEC titles in the last seven years, five in the last 11 years, and seven in the last 16.

Auburn's defense set the tone, scored some points and helped the Tigers to a cushy lead through the first half and beyond in the season-opener.

Good thing the defense played well early and Peyton Barber rushed for 115 yards, because the combo helped the Tigers to a 31-24 win Saturday in the Georgia Dome.

Auburn led 24-0 in the third quarter before Louisville made it interesting, cutting its deficit to seven with 2:18 to play. The Tigers played keep-away from there.

The Tigers happily showed off their new defense early, setting up an early touchdown following an interception, scoring again on an 82-yard fumble return by Justin Garrett and generally frustrating offensive-minded Louisville until the second half.

Will Muschamp, the former Auburn defensive coordinator who returned to his former job last December, was a complement to Gus Malzahn's offense, Barber, quarterback Jeremy Johnson and receiver Ricardo Louis' offensive exploits.

Johnson threw for a touchdown and ran for another, Louis caught a touchdown pass and ran for another and Barber came off the bench, replacing the injured Roc Thomas, to break through the 100-yard barrier, gaining 95 of those in the second half when Auburn needed him most.

Auburn led 24-0 midway through the third quarter and everything seemed to be in fine shape.

The latter half of the game was more of a challenge, and losing defensive end Carl Lawson to an injury didn't help.

Lawson wasn't the only one who missed time after being hurt.

Auburn played on.

The rebuild offensive line helped Auburn to 190 rushing yards.

Johnson hit 11-of-21 passes for 137 yards and a touchdown and three interceptions.

Auburn's defense showed the way this time in the first half, setting up a Johnson 1-yard touchdown run following a Tray Matthews interception on Louisville's first play; and Garrett's 82-yard fumble return to give the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 6:54 left in the second quarter.

That was the longest fumble return since at least 1969 when Auburn began recording that stat.

Auburn went young early, starting true freshmen Chandler Cox and Tim Irvin. They were the first true freshmen to start on opening day since Reese Dismukes in 2011.

GAME 3

Auburn didn't have an answer for LSU running back Leonard Fournette, who trumped a comeback bid that started from way back Saturday in Tiger Stadium.

The big running back rushed for 228 yards and three touchdowns, and was the engine that carried LSU over Auburn 45-21.

Auburn quarterback Jeremy Johnson ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, but it wasn't enough to overcome LSU's 24-0 halftime advantage.

Auburn came out with some life to start the second half. Johnson raced 65 yards straight up the middle for a touchdown early in the third quarter. It was the longest TD run by an Auburn quarterback since Cam Newton scored on a 71-yard run in 2010.

But Fournette was strong early, going 29 yards for a touchdown to go over 200 yards on the day for a 31-7 lead with 10:56 left in the third quarter. Later, Johnson threw a 9-yard TD pass to Melvin Ray to cut it to 38-14 and then a 10-yard touchdown pass to Duke Williams.

Auburn fell to 2-1 overall and 0-1 in the SEC heading into next Saturday's home game against Mississippi State. LSU improved to 2-0 overall and 2-0 in the league.

Fournette didn't waste time letting his intentions known. He raced 71 yards on the first offensive play of the game and had 169 rushing yards by halftime. LSU led 24-0 by then behind Fournette and quarterback Brandon Harris, who had 63 rushing yards in the first half.

LSU had the ball 8½ more minutes in the first half.

Punter Kevin Phillips had four kicks of 50+ yards. Auburn had three defenders with double-figure tackles for the first time since 2012: Kris Frost, Johnathan Ford and Tré Williams.

GAME 4

Quarterback Sean White was steady in his first college game and the defense showed some moxie, but neither was enough to stop Mississippi State from beating Auburn 17-9 Saturday night in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

White, a redshirt freshman, was 20-of-28 for 188 yards passing and showed a willingness to run after being named Auburn's starting quarterback earlier in the week. The Tigers' defense kept Auburn close enough.

Auburn finished with more yards and first downs than State.

Peyton Barber had more than 100 yards rushing before the third quarter was done and finished with 137, his third 100-plus rushing game this season. Auburn wasn't afraid to mix in Roc Thomas and Kerryon Johnson, either.

The Tigers fell to 2-2. State improved to 3-1. Auburn will try to rebound next Saturday's homecoming game against San Jose State in a 3 p.m. game in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Carlson's 30-yard field goal cut State's lead to 14-3 with 9:41 left in the third quarter, and his 30-yarder made it 14-6 with 3:06 left in the quarter. Auburn was close to doing more. The Tigers had been inside the State 10 four times by then, but had only two field goals to show for it.

State's Westin Graves' 45-yard field goal made 17-6 with 1:11 left in the third quarter. Carlson's 51-yarder made it 17-9 with 1:07 left in the game.

Auburn's defense kept the game close in the first half in a bounce-back performance from the previous game at LSU, though State led 14-0 at the break. The Bulldogs rode the arm of Prescott to do it. He hit 16-of-20 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns in the first half.

But White was steady in his own right in the first half, completing 9 of 10 passes for 92 yards.

The first half stats were close enough, with State holding a 200-180 edge in total yards. But Auburn was turned away early when White was

intercepted near the end zone, and then the Tigers missed a short field goal in the final minute of the first half.

Defensive coordinator Will Muschamp called for a change of attitude, and drilled the point home with a different starting lineup, one that included two true freshmen starting in the secondary and different starting linebackers from the previous week.

State scored its first-half touchdowns on a 32-yard pass from Prescott to Gabe Myles and a 17-yard pass from Prescott to De'Runnya Wilson.
