FOOTBALL HOSTS ARKANSAS STATE

» Auburn hosts Arkansas State on Saturday, September 10, for Family Day at Jordan-Hare Stadium (87,451) in Auburn; the SEC Network will televise the 6:30 p.m. CT contest. Auburn's 2016 Olympians and the 1976 football team will be recognized as part of in-game festivities Saturday night.

There have been 17 consecutive sellouts at Jordan-Hare Stadium; Auburn has played in front of 28 consecutive regular-season sellout crowds at home and away; the last regular season non-sellout was in 2013 at Tennessee.

SERIES HISTORY

» Auburn holds a 3-0 lead in the series with Arkansas State. The Tigers were 27-0 winners over ASU during the 2006 season, and Auburn defeated the Red Wolves 52-26 in the 2010 season opener. The Tigers defeated ASU 38-9 in 2013, Gus Malzahn's first season as Auburn head coach after serving as head coach at Arkansas State in 2012. All three of those contests were at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

» Auburn holds a 23-0 all-time mark against current members of the Sun Belt Conference, with wins over Appalachian State (1-0), Arkansas State (3-0), Georgia Southern (1-0), Idaho (2-0), Louisiana-Lafayette (4-0), ULM (9-0) and New Mexico State (3-0).

AUBURN COACHES VS. PREVIOUS TEAMS

» Gus Malzahn isn't the first Auburn head coach to play against a school where he was previously head coach. Malzahn was head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, and his Auburn team defeated the RedWolves 38-9 in 2013.

Five other Auburn head coaches played their previous schools. Tommy Tuberville was 7-3 vs. Ole Miss while at Auburn, Terry Bowden was 1-0 against Samford, Pat Dye was 2-0 against East Carolina, Jack Meagher was 0-2 vs. Rice, and Mike Harvey was 1-0 against Alabama.

KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn's 2016 campaign is its 124th season of college football

» There were 17 first-time players for Auburn in the opener with Clemson, and seven first-time starters

» This will be the 84th night game at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1981. Auburn is 65-16-2 under the lights at home all-time, 14-6 during the Malzahn era

» Auburn is 26-5 under Gus Malzahn when scoring at least 24 points

» Auburn will travel fewer miles this regular season than any other FBS team, just 1,748 total

» Nine of the teams on Auburn's 2016 schedule played in a bowl game last season

» Daniel Carlson's 53-yard field goal against Clemson was his sixth career field goal of 50+ yards, setting the Auburn career record. That FG was third-longest in the FBS this season

» Marlon Davidson was the first Auburn true freshman to start the season opener on the defensive line in recent history (records dating back to the 1985 season)

» Auburn has 28 former players on NFL opening day rosters, representing 19 different NFL teams

» Auburn has produced eight 1,000 rushers since 2010, most among FBS teams, ahead of Nevada (7), Wisconsin (7), Baylor (7) and San Diego State (7)

» Academic Top Tigers are student-athletes who post a 3.0 GPA or higher in either semester of a school year. SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

» Auburn football had seven representatives on the 2015-16 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Marquel Harrell, Mike Horton, Kerryon Johnson, Raymond Lester, Ryan Meneely, Ian Shannon and Prince Tega Wanogho.

IN SEPTEMBER

» Auburn holds a 163-55-5 (.745) all-time record in games played during September, and has won 38 of its last 50 September matchups. The Tigers are 100-20-1 (.838) all-time at home in September, and 63-35-4 (.640) in games on the road during that month.

STARTING OFF

» Auburn had seven first-time starters against Clemson: DE Marlon Davidson, LB Darrell Williams, CB Javaris Davis, LB Deshaun Davis, C Xavier Dampeer, WR Ryan Davis, and WR Darius Slayton.

» In the season opener, 17 players saw their first career action for Auburn. That includes:

Six true freshmen: Marlon Davidson, Nate Craig-Myers, Derrick Brown, Kyle Davis, John Broussard Jr. and Tré Threat;

Five redshirt freshmen: Darius Slayton, Javaris Davis, Mike Horton, Tyler Carr and Griffin King;

Four transfers: Paul James III, Darius James, T.J. Neal and John Franklin III;

Sophomore Markell Boston and senior Greg Hall Jr. also saw their first action for the Tigers on Saturday.

» On the 2016 squad, 35 players now have at least one college start to their credit, 16 on the Auburn offense and 19 on defense. The Tigers had 22 different starters on offense and 22 on defense last season.

ON THE RUN

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 29 of 40 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Seven different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (36 100-yard rushing performances). Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 22-7.

» Auburn is among three schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-15, along with Oregon (9), Auburn (8) and Boise State (7). The Tigers' 1,000-yard rushers during that string: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013), Cameron Artis-Payne (2014) and Peyton Barber (2015).

» FBS programs with two 1,000-yard rushers in multiple seasons since 2010 (FBS):

- 3 Nevada
- 2 Auburn
- 2 Wisconsin

FIRST DOWNS

» Auburn has had 20 or more first downs in 28 of its last 36 games. In 41 games under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has gained 20 or more first downs in a game 31 times.

In 16 of its last 36 games, Auburn has gained at least 25 first downs. In 2015, the Tigers averaged 19.8 first downs per game; under Gus Malzahn as head coach, Auburn has averaged 22.5 first downs.

SEAN WHITE

» Sophomore Sean White is the 10th different quarterback to start a season opener under Gus Malzahn in his 11 seasons as a collegiate coach. The only QB to start two Malzahn season openers has been Jeremy Johnson (2014, 2015 at Auburn).

» White is 93-164 passing (.567) in eight career games (with six starts), throwing for 1,306 yards with one TD and five career interceptions.

» White was the first Auburn freshman QB to make his first start in an SEC game since Jeff Klein at Tennessee in 1999. Auburn has had six freshman QB starters since 2000.

» In his 2015 debut against Mississippi State, White was 20-28 passing for 188 yards with one interception. For the season, he was 83-143 (58.0) in completion percentage.

» White was the first Auburn quarterback to throw for 250 or more yards in three consecutive games since Dameyune Craig in 1997 and was the first AU freshman to ever accomplish the feat.

» White was the second freshman signal-caller to throw for at least 250 yards in multiple games in Auburn history, joining Stan White, who topped the mark four times in 1990.

» With the 2015 win at Kentucky, White was the first Auburn freshman quarterback to win an SEC road game since Jason Campbell at Vanderbilt in 2001.

White's 255 passing yards at Kentucky (17-27) were the second-most by an AU freshman in an SEC game; Stan White threw for 338 yards against Tennessee in 1990. Those 255 passing yards were sixth-most by an AU freshman QB and most since Jeff Klein (270 vs. UCF) in 1999. White topped all those marks with 258 yards passing (12-28, 1 TD, 1 INT) vs. Ole Miss.

JEREMY JOHNSON

» Senior QB Jeremy Johnson has thrown at least one TD pass in eight of his nine career starts. He is 6-3 as a starter.

His 19 career TD passes have been to 10 different receivers: Melvin Ray (3), Ricardo Louis (3), D'haquille Williams (2), Sammie Coates (2), Tony Stevens (2), Jason Smith (2), Quan Bray, Marcus Davis, Jay Prosch, Roc Thomas and C.J. Uzomah.

» Johnson topped the 1,000-yard career passing mark vs. Jacksonville State last season. For his career, Johnson has completed 148-241 passes for 1,949 yards with 19 TDs and 10 INTs.

THE RECEIVING CORPS

» Marcus Davis' 56 yards receiving vs. Clemson were a career best, and his fourth career game with five or more catches (2013 vs. MSU, 2015 vs. UK, 2015 vs. UGA).

» Sophomore Will Hastings hauled in his first career reception – an 8-yard catch – in the first quarter vs. Clemson, giving Auburn its initial first down of the game. Hastings' three receptions against Clemson led to two third-down and a fourth-down conversion.

» Junior Stanton Truitt had two receptions against Clemson, after catching just three total during his first two seasons.

» Kyle Davis' 43-yard reception against Clemson was the longest by an Auburn freshman since 2002.

WHEN SCORING 20+ AND 30+

» Since 2001, Auburn is 115-21 (.846) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 171-29-1 (.853) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is now 317-9 (.972) when scoring 30 points.

TOP TACKLERS

» Two current Auburn players have totalled more than 100 career tackles each at Auburn: Johnathan "Rudy" Ford (222) and Montravius Adams (112).

» Ford now ranks 11th among tacklers at Auburn since 2004 (when press box defensive stats were first official), passing Jermaine Whitehead (218 from 2011-14). Cincinnati Bengal Karlos Dansby and current LB coach Travis Williams are next on the list with 225 each.

» Safety Nick Ruffin was the leading tackler in the season opener against Clemson with a career-best 10 tackles.

» Five current players have at least one career double-figure tackle game to their credit: Johnathan Ford (8) Carlton Davis (1) Joshua Holsey (1) Nick Ruffin (1) Tré Williams (1)

» Ford had seven double-digit tackle games last season and ranked fourth in the SEC with 118 total tackles, the most for a season at Auburn since Dontarrious Thomas (122) in 2001.

Since 2001, only three other Auburn defenders have recorded more than 100 tackles in a season: Daren Bates (104 in 2011), Josh Byrnes (104 in 2009) and Neiko Thorpe (102 in 2011).

» Ford's 14 tackles vs. San José State, Kentucky and Ole Miss were a career high, the most by an Auburn player since Kris Frost tallied 14 tackles vs. South Carolina in 2014.

Ford led Auburn with 12 tackles in the win over Louisville and added 12 more stops against Jacksonville State and 10 at LSU.

The last Auburn player with 10+ tackles in three straight games was Demetruce McNeal in 2012 at Vanderbilt (12), vs. Texas A&M (10) and vs. New Mexico State (10).

» With 222 career tackles, Ford ranks fifth among current Power 5 defensive backs, behind Devon Edwards (Duke), Ryan Janvion (Wake Forest), Quin Blanding (Virginia) and Jordan Sterns (Oklahoma State).

THE LAWSON IMPACT

» Nobody packs a punch for the Auburn defense like junior defensive end Carl Lawson. The preseason All-America candidate appeared in only seven games last season, but his impact was noticeable every minute he was on the field, earning him team captain honors.

INTERCEPTORS

» Joshua Holsey's third-quarter interception against Clemson was the second pick of his career, making him the fifth member of the current squad with multiple career interceptions.

» The Auburn defense has 50 interceptions in 41 games (1.22/gm) since the beginning of the 2013 season.

» In 2015, the Tigers intercepted at least one pass in nine of 13 games. Auburn intercepted a pass in five consecutive games prior to the Georgia contest. Seven different Auburn players had at least one interception last season.

» Auburn recorded multiple interceptions in four games last season: San José State, Ole Miss, Texas A&M, Idaho.

» Carlton Davis recorded interceptions as a true freshman against San José State, Kentucky and Texas A&M last season. He was the first Auburn freshman to record multiple interceptions since 2009, and the first freshman to record an INT in consecutive games since 2003. He earned SEC all-freshman honors, the first Auburn DB to do so since Daren Bates (2009).

LOU GROZA FINALIST DANIEL CARLSON

» With his 53-yard field goal against Clemson, Auburn's first score of the 2016 campaign, junior Daniel Carlson became the Tigers' career leader with six FG of 50 yards or longer, surpassing Neil O'Donoghue (five from 1975-76).

His 53-yarder was the third longest field goal in the FBS this season.

» Carlson's 56-yard field goal vs. Louisville in 2015, a Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game record, was the fifth-longest kick in college football last season. That 56-yarder was the longest by an Auburn kicker since 2003 (57 yds, Philip Yost vs. Western Kentucky) and tied John Riley (at Tennessee, 1969) for the third-longest FG in Auburn history.

» "Legatron" was one of only three kickers nationally in 2015 to make four field goals of 51+ yards. Carlson's four 50+ yard FG in a season broke the AU single season record of three set by John Riley in 1969. The Lou Groza Award finalist made an Auburn record 23 field goals last season:

- 23 **Daniel Carlson** (2015)
- 22 **Scott Etheridge** (1992)
- 20 **John Vaughn** (2006)

» Auburn has 28 players on 2016 NFL opening week-end rosters, representing 19 different NFL teams

» Signed to NFL practice squads were Peyton Barber (Tampa Bay), Blake Countess (Los Angeles), Nick Marshall (Jacksonville), Chad Slade (Houston), Jermaine Whitehead (Green Bay) and Gabe Wright (Cleveland)

» Auburn letterman Kevin Greene was inducted to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August, the second Tiger so honored. Greene played for the Rams, Steelers, Panthers and 49ers in 15 NFL seasons (1985-99), leading the league in sacks twice. A five-time Pro Bowler, he had 160 career sacks, third best in league history at the time of his retirement.

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) & Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 16 of the last 17 Pro Bowls. Auburn has had at least one former player in eight of the last 11 Super Bowls

» Against Texas A&M in 2015, Carlson was 4-4 on FG, the sixth time in his career he made at least three field goals in a game.

» Carlson made an Auburn record 16 consecutive field goals, breaking the mark set in 1997:
 16 **Daniel Carlson** (2015)
 12 **Jaret Holmes** (1997)
 11 **Damon Duval** (2000)
 10 **Gardner Jett** (1970-71)

» Carlson has scored 227 points (43-53 FG, 98-98 PAT) during his three-year career, seventh all-time among Auburn kickers. He's just the ninth Auburn player ever to score more than 100 points in a season.

» Carlson is fifth in Auburn career field goals made (43), and just one of four Auburn kickers all-time to make 15+ FG in multiple seasons:
Wes Byrum (2007, 2009, 2010)
Daniel Carlson (2014, 2015)
Jim Von Wyl (1990, 1991)
Win Lyle (1987, 1989)

» Carlson is 6-7 on career FG of at least 50 yards. He's the just the third AU kicker with 50+-yard FGs in back-to-back games, along with John Riley (1969; Tennessee/56, Kentucky/54) and John Vaughn (Washington State/52, Miss State/55). In 1987, Win Lyle had FGs of 55 and 52 yards in a game vs. Tennessee. His 50+-yard kicks:

- 53 vs. Clemson (2016)
- 52 at Kentucky (2015)
- 52 vs. Ole Miss (2015)

» Carlson has made 98 consecutive PAT kicks, the fourth longest such string in Auburn history. He is tied for sixth in career PAT made at Auburn.

In 2014, Carlson was 57-57 on PAT attempts -- third among Auburn single-season leaders for FG made and the best 100% season in AU history. Carlson was second in Auburn single-season kick scoring with 111 points, tied with Cody Parkey (2013) and his 18 made field goals were third best in a season at Auburn.

» In 2015, 49 of Carlson's 69 kickoffs were touchbacks, the fifth best percentage (71.01%) nationally. For his career, 102 of 154 kickoffs (66.2%) have been touchbacks.

PUNTER KEVIN PHILLIPS

» Senior Kevin Phillips' 68-yard punt against Clemson was a career long and the 11th longest in AU history. It's the longest punt since a 71-yarder by Kody Bliss vs. Tulane in 2006. It was Phillips' 11th career punt of 50+ yards.

» In 2015, 17 of Phillips' 55 punts landed inside the 20 and 10 were longer than 50 yards. He had only seven punts returned.

» Phillips' 50.0 yd/punt average at LSU last season (6/300) was the best for an Auburn punter since Daniel Carlson averaged 53.3 yds/punt (3/160) against Arkansas in the 2014 season opener.

» Phillips' 56-yard punt at LSU in 2015 was a career long, and the longest Auburn punt since the 2014 season opener vs. Arkansas, when Daniel Carlson had a 62-yarder.

» With four 50+ yard punts at LSU, Phillips had the most 50-yd punts in a game for Auburn since a school record five 50+ yard punts by Skip Johnston vs. Florida (53.2 avg) in 1978.

ON SPECIAL TEAMS

» Auburn is second in the longest string of games without having a punt blocked. The Tigers' last blocked punt attempt was vs. Mississippi State in 2009, a string of 91 games.

» Auburn kickers have converted 125 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013 Tennessee game, the 11th longest active streak in the FBS. Daniel Carlson has 98 consecutive made PAT in his career.

» The Tigers were fourth in the nation in kickoff returns in 2015, averaging 27.94 yards per runback. The long return of the season was 61 yards by Blake Countess vs. San José State.

MORE FROM THE CLEMSON GAME...

» All three Auburn quarterbacks (Sean White, Jeremy Johnson, John Franklin III) completed at least one pass and combined to start the game 5-5. The last time three Auburn quarterbacks completed at least one pass in the same game: 2013 vs. Florida Atlantic (Nick Marshall, Jeremy Johnson, Jonathan Wallace).

» Sophomore running back Kerryon Johnson finished with a career-high 94 yards on a career-high 23 carries; he ran for his third career touchdown in the fourth quarter. Johnson's previous career best was 36 yards on nine carries last season at Kentucky.

» Marlon Davidson was the first Auburn true freshman to start the season opener on the defensive line in recent history (records dating back to the 1985 season).

» True freshman Derrick Brown recovered his first career fumble in the second quarter. It was forced by sophomore Darrell Williams, his first career forced fumble.

» Recording their first collegiate career tackles were Javaris Davis, Marlon Davidson and Darrell Williams.

» Recording their first career receptions were Will Hastings, Ryan Davis and Kyle Davis. Chandler Cox had his first career rushing carries.

» Auburn's 29-game home non-conference winning streak was snapped in the opener against Clemson. Auburn's last previous home non-conference loss was a 26-23 OT defeat to South Florida in 2007.

Auburn had won 14 consecutive regular season games against non-conference competition since a 26-19 loss to No. 14 Clemson in the 2012 season opener. Auburn's all-time regular season record in non-conference play since SEC action began in 1933 is 241-68-6.

» DL Montravius Adams, OL Alex Kozan, WR Marcus Davis and DL Carl Lawson served as team captains for the Clemson game.

» Auburn is now 103-150-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. Auburn is 45-39-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-64-2 on the road and 31-47-2 against ranked teams on a neutral field.

SEC NUMBERS

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 304-241-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 125-56-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 179-185-12 overall.

IN SEASON OPENERS

» Auburn is now 95-27-2 (.774) all-time in season openers. The Tigers have won nine of their past 11 openers dating back to the 2006 season opener, and three of four season openers under Coach Gus Malzahn. Auburn's total of 95 season-opening victories is just two behind Alabama (97) and tied with Arkansas (95) for the most among current SEC schools.

» Auburn is now 98-16-3 (.850) all-time in home openers. There were no games played in Auburn during the 1896 season.

» Auburn will travel fewer miles from home this regular season than any other FBS team. To their four road contests, the Tigers will log only 1,748 miles. The five teams with the fewest travel miles:

» The Tigers have 741 total victories, 13th among the all-time winningest FBS football programs. » Auburn has played in front of 27 consecutive regular-season sellout crowds, including 17 consecutive sell-outs at Jordan-Hare Stadium; the last regular season non-sellout was in 2013 at Tennessee.

» Auburn continues its five-game homestand on Saturday, September 17, hosting Texas A&M in the SEC opener for both teams. That 6:00 p.m. CT game at Jordan-Hare Stadium will be televised by ESPN or ESPN2. Arkansas State plays at Utah State that evening.

» AUBURN, Ala. (Sept. 7, 2013) -- Auburn's Gus Malzahn said he didn't think his Tigers would hold Arkansas State's high-powered offense to zero touchdowns.

But Auburn did.

The Tigers ran their no-touchdown defense to six-plus quarters and unleashed their bevy of running backs en route to a 38-9 victory over the Red Wolves.

"I think this team has potential," Malzahn said when it was over.

The storyline before the game was how Malzahn was coaching against the team that gave him his first head coaching job, just a year ago. But the game was about the development of quarterback Nick Marshall, a running game that wore down Arkansas State and a defense that hasn't allowed a touchdown in 19 straight series.

Arkansas State tried, but saw three up-close series end in Brian Davis field goals.

"That's two weeks in a row our defense stood up down there," Malzahn said. "That was definitely a good thing."

Malzahn was proud of that because he said the Red Wolves "have some phenomenal skill guys."

Auburn and Malzahn improved to 2-0, beating the Red Wolves and Washington State, the team that beat Southern California 10-7 on Saturday night. The Tigers can match last season's win total if they beat Mississippi State in their SEC opener next Saturday in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

Meanwhile, Auburn snapped the nation's second-longest winning streak -- a nine-gamer -- when it beat the Red Wolves.

Marshall came in after an up-and-down debut against Washington State and looked far more comfortable in his second game in Malzahn's offense.

He threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to freshman Marcus Davis and a perfect 68-yard TD strike to Sammie Coates in the first half.

"The big pass play was huge. It gave us a big sigh of relief," Malzahn said.

By halftime, Marshall had thrown and rushed for more yards than he had in the Tigers' 31-24 win over Washington State in the opener. He finished hitting 10-of-17 passes for 147 yards and those two touchdowns, plus 53 yards rushing.

"He was more comfortable this game than the last game. I feel like that will improve," Malzahn said.

"Anytime you have a quarterback who is a run threat...it opens everything up."

The offense was far more than just Nick Marshall, however. The trio of Corey Grant, Tre Mason and Cameron Artis-Payne rushed for a combined 241 yards. Artis-Payne led the way with 102 yards and a touchdown. Mason went for 99 and a score. Grant, who had 144 yards in the opener, had 40.

"My big deal is just consistency. I do feel like we improved from last week," Malzahn said.

Malzahn said the tempo of his offense was a lot better, and tempo and pace are his keys.

Marshall was 7-of-12 passing for 139 yards by the half. Mason, Grant and Artis-Payne were on their way, too.

Grant scored on a 17-yard run in the first quarter. Mason scored on an 11-yard run in the third quarter. Artis-Payne added a 12-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

Cody Parkey added a 35-yard field goal -- his fourth of the season -- in the fourth quarter.

Malzahn celebrated when it was over, and remembered his Arkansas State players he left behind.

"It was pretty emotional. There are a bunch of great kids over there," he said. "I wish them nothing but the best."

FAST FACTS

- » Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his 10 seasons as a collegiate coach
- » Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last six seasons with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012
- » Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989)

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM » 87,451

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451, with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the east side and college football's largest videoboard - debuted in 2015 - spanning the south end.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the seventh-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.9 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication and hold an overall record of 305-79-7 there.

The 2014 season was the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span.

Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl.

The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons.

Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 44 sell-out games, including the last 16 consecutively.

GAME 1

Gus Malzahn said his quarterback race was close all August, then showed just how close it was Saturday night.

Auburn got things together in the second half, threw into the end zone on the game's two final plays, but Clemson survived for a 19-13 win.

Sean White, Jeremy Johnson and John Franklin III, quarterbacks all, took snaps; and running back Kerryon Johnson and even H-back Chandler Cox stepped through the revolving quarterback door as well. They set up Daniel Carlson field goals and a late Kerryon Johnson TD run. It wasn't enough despite a comeback second half. Clemson's high-powered offense did just enough against a tough-minded Auburn defense in front of a sold out Jordan-Hare Stadium on opening night.

No. 2 Clemson came in with all the offensive fanfare, but Carlson's 32-yard field goal with 13:46 remaining cut Clemson lead to 13-6. Auburn then cut it to 19-13 with 3:22 left on a 9-yard Kerryon Johnson touchdown run.

Sean White's final two passes in the end zone were batted away in the final seconds.

A Deshaun Watson pass to Hunter Renfrow, who made a nothing-you-can-do-about-it great catch, made it 19-6 with 9:59 left. Clemson turned Auburn away on a fourth-down pass from the 8, before Johnson's touchdown run minutes later.

Auburn tried to catch Clemson off guard the whole game. Receiver Stanton Truitt got three quick carries. Sean White, Jeremy Johnson and John Franklin III all threw a pass in the first quarter. Kerryon Johnson finally hit the half with 10 rushing yards, but, as a team, Auburn had just one.

The Tigers picked it up in the second half.

Johnson hit his first three passes and led Auburn to its first score, a Carlson 53-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. It was the sixth time that Carlson had blasted a field goal of at least 50 yards in his career, an Auburn record. Kevin Phillips also had a career-best 68-yard punt in the first half.

Auburn's defensive line held steady early and it took a fourth-down 1-yard run by Wayne Gallman to finally get Clemson a 7-3 lead with 7:34 left in the first quarter.

Auburn's defense turned away another scoring opportunity when

Derrick Brown recovered a fumble caused by Darrell Williams. But Clemson tacked on a Greg Huegel field goal with 0:07 seconds left in the first half for a 10-3 lead.

Clemson scored first in the second half on a 40-yard field goal for a 10-point lead. Auburn was still hanging around, though, despite the fact Clemson has run 49 plays for 255 yards. Auburn had run 26 plays for 38 yards.

Auburn found its offense by mixing White, Johnson and Franklin, driving to the Clemson 5 late in the third quarter. But Johnson was stopped on fourth-and-2.
