### 81st IRON BOWL

» No. 18 Auburn visits No. 1 Alabama Saturday, November 26, 2016, in a 2:30 p.m. CT game at Bryant-Denny Stadium that will be televised by CBS.

» In this 81st Iron Bowl, Auburn and Alabama will meet for the 69th consecutive year since 1948. Auburn trails the overall series by a 35-44-1 record. Auburn leads the Iron Bowl 15-8 when the game is played on campus. Auburn's longest win streak in the series is six games from 2002-07.

» Auburn has an all-time record of 50-66-7 in regular-season finales since 1892. Auburn is 51-65-7 all-time in the last game of the regular season played away from Auburn. In final road games of the season that were not played at a neutral site, Auburn is 14-34-4 all-time.

» In all-time SEC play, Auburn holds a 309-243-18 mark back through 1933. In SEC games played in Auburn, the Tigers are 128-57-6 all-time; away from Auburn, the Tigers are 181-186-12 overall.

### RANKINGS

» The Alabama game is the 15th matchup of AP-ranked teams for Auburn during Gus Malzahn's tenure. The Tigers are 8-6 in those meetings between ranked teams, including a 4-0 mark in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

» Auburn's record as a ranked team all-time is 304-106-6. Ranked Auburn teams at home are 169-30-2; away from Auburn, ranked Tiger squads are 135-76-4 all-time.

» Auburn is 105-151-6 all-time facing ranked opponents. The Tigers are 47-40-2 at home against ranked teams, 27-64-2 on the road and 31-47-2 vs. ranked teams on a neutral field.

### KICKOFF COVERAGE

» Auburn has held 10 of its last 12 opponents to fewer than 20 points and allowed only 15 touchdowns in the last 11 games

» In 2016, 12 different Auburn receivers have caught a pass of at least 20 yards and nine different players have a 20+-yard rush

» The Tigers are averaging 548 yards total offense in their eight wins this season

» At 35.73 ypg, the Tigers have the fewest penalty yards in the SEC and the seventh fewest nationally. Auburn has had more than 40 penalty yards only three times this season

» Lou Groza Award semifinalist Daniel Carlson has hit 140 consecutive PAT, the longest string in Auburn history. He leads the SEC and is sixth nationally in scoring with 115 points (10.5 ppg)

» Auburn is second nationally in red zone defense (.667) behind Florida

» Carl Lawson ranks 14th nationally with 9.0 sacks this season; he and Montravius Adams are Rotary Lombardi Award semifinalists

» Auburn leads the nation with 65 passes broken up and is second with 74 passes defended (behind UCF)

» Auburn has held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing touchdown

» Doak Walker Award semifinalist Kamryn Pettway is the top rusher in the SEC with 138.3 rushing yds/gm (1,106 rushing yards). He led the nation in rushing during October by 25 yards per game, averaging 199 ypg

» Auburn has allowed only 56 points in the second half of its seven SEC games (8.0 ppg)

» Opponents are having to gain 23.44 yards for every point scored against the Auburn defense this season

**NFF CAMPBELL TROPHY**

» Alex Kozan is one of 156 semifinalists for the William Campbell Trophy, recognizing the top senior scholar-athlete in college football. The National Football Foundation will announce 12-14 finalists November 1, and each of them will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, presented by Fidelity Investments.

**SEC HONOR ROLL**

» There were 24 Auburn representatives on the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the 2015 season, including current team members Daniel Carlson, Tyler Carr, Chandler Cox, Austin Dupper, Austin Golson, Alex Kozan, Kevin Phillips, Ike Powell, Dontavious Russell, Braden Smith, Tyler Stovall, Keenan Sweeney and Tre' Williams. Team members had a 3.0 GPA for the previous school year or a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher.

**ACADEMIC TOP TIGERS**

» Academic Top Tigers are student-athletes who post a 3.0 GPA or higher in either semester of a school year. The 2015-16 list recognized 43 members of the football team, including Daniel Carlson, Tyler Carr, Byron Cowart, Chandler Cox, Carlton Davis, Deshaun Davis, Jeremiah Dinson, Austin Dupper, Austin Golson, Marquel Harrell, Jalen Harris, Mike Horton, Jaunta'vius Johnson, Kerryon Johnson, Kaleb Kim, Griffin King, Alex Kozan, Raymond Lester, Richard McBryde, Ryan Meneely, Kevin Phillips, Ike Powell, Dontavious Russell, Ian Shannon, Bailey Sharp, Josh Shockley, Braden Smith, Tyler Stovall, Keenan Sweeney, Prince Tega Wanogho, Darrell Williams and Tre' Williams from the current squad.

**SEC FIRST-YEAR ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL**

» Auburn football had seven representatives on the 2015-16 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll, recognizing freshmen and transfer student-athletes with a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher. Current team members honored included Marquel Harrell, Mike Horton, Kerryon Johnson, Raymond Lester, Ryan Meneely, Ian Shannon and Prince Tega Wanogho.

» When a ranked Auburn team faces a ranked opponent, the Tigers' all-time record is 73-65-4 (30-12-1 at home, 21-34-1 away and 22-19-2 on a neutral field).

» The Tigers are 83-123-5 all-time when facing ranked SEC opponents (37-31-2 at home, 27-58-2 away, 19-34-1 neutral field).

Ranked Auburn teams vs. ranked SEC opponents are 53-45-3 overall (24-8-1 at home, 18-28-1 at the opponent's home field and 11-9-1 on a neutral field).

» Gus Malzahn has coached 43.1% of his games (22-51) against teams ranked in the AP poll, the highest percentage in Auburn history. The top five:

- 43.1 Gus Malzahn (22-51)
- 38.4 Gene Chizik (20-52)
- 35.2 Tommy Tuberville (44-125)
- 33.8 Pat Dye (47-139)
- 29.1 Shug Jordan (77-265)

**TOTAL OFFENSE**

» Auburn has posted more than 575 yards total offense in four of eight home games (706 vs. Arkansas State, 688 ULM, 632 Arkansas, 598 Alabama A&M).

» Auburn scored 215 points from the ULM to Vanderbilt games (43.0 ppg), the most points over a five-game span since the Tigers scored 228 points over the last three games of 2013 and the first two games of 2014.

» Auburn has 17 scoring plays on offense of 20 yards or more in 2016. The Tigers finished 2015 (13 games) with just seven.

» Auburn has outscored opponents 212-85 in the first half and 163-71 in the second half.

» Auburn's 706 yards of total offense against Arkansas State were the second-most in school history (record: 712 vs. Western Carolina, 2013).

Auburn's 452 yards of offense in the first half were the most for the Tigers in a first half since 484 in 2010 vs. Chattanooga. It was the third 400+ yard first half under Malzahn (2013 vs. Florida Atlantic & Western Carolina).

Auburn is one of only 11 FBS teams to post a 700-yard total offense game in 2016.

**ON THE RUN**

» Auburn (297.8 ypg) is one of five teams nationally (New Mexico, Army, Navy, Air Force) averaging more than 290 rushing yds/game.

» Auburn has produced a 100-yard rusher in 37 of 51 games under head coach Gus Malzahn. Ten different Tigers have rushed for 100 yards in a game under Malzahn (47 100-yard rushing performances).

Auburn's record with a 100-yard rusher during the Malzahn era is 29-8; with two 100-yard rushers in the same game, it's 10-0.

» **The Tigers' 543 rushing yards vs. Arkansas, the best in the nation this season**, set an SEC record for any regular-season game between SEC opponents (previous: Arkansas vs. South Carolina in 2007, 542 yards). The previous Auburn regular-season SEC rushing best was 444 at Tennessee (2013).

Auburn's 543 rushing yards, third-best in school history, were the seventh-best single-game performance in SEC history. **The Tigers now own three of the top seven single-game rushing totals in SEC annals.**

Auburn's 462 rushing yards vs. Arkansas State ranked sixth in school history, and 451 rushing yards against Alabama A&M ranked seventh in Auburn records.

The 2016 team ranks sixth on Auburn's single-season rushing list with 3,276 yards to date.

» Auburn has rushed for 32 TDs this season and allowed only four scores on the ground. The +28 rushing TD differential is fourth nationally behind Michigan (+35), Navy (+30) and Louisville (+30).

» Auburn is tied for eighth nationally with 32 rushing touchdowns. The Tigers have averaged 36 rushing TD per season under Malzahn.

» Kamryn Pettway is the 27th 1,000-yard rusher in Auburn history. His 1,106 yards to date are the 10th 1,000-yard season posted by an Auburn player since 2009.

Pettway's 6.39 yards-per-carry average is the best mark for an Auburn 1,000-yard rusher since Brent Fullwood's mark of 8.33 yds/carry in 1986. Pettway's average ranks sixth all-time among Auburn's 1,000-yard rushers.

» Pettway is the top rusher in the SEC (138.2 ypg) with 1,106 yards and seven TD. He has six 100-yard performances in eight games:

- 236 Ole Miss
- 192 Arkansas
- 173 Vanderbilt
- 169 Mississippi State
- 152 Arkansas State
- 123 Texas A&M

» In his last four games, Pettway has rushed for 770 yards and six TD (192.5 ypg), the most yards by an Auburn player over a three-game span since Tre Mason rushed for 778 yards in the last four games of 2013.

He is the first Auburn running back to record 150+ yards in four straight regular season games since Bo Jackson in 1985.

» With a career-high 236 yards at Ole Miss, Pettway was the 19th player in Auburn history to rush for more than 200 yards; it was the 10th best rushing total in Auburn history.

» Pettway is averaging 159.4 ypg against SEC opponents with five 100-yard games and seven touchdowns.

» Pettway has rushed 100 times on first down for 618 yards and five TD, an average of 6.18 yards per first-down carry. He's rushed the ball 16 times on third down and picked up a first down 13 times, and also picked up a first down on his only fourth-down carry.

» At Mississippi State, Pettway rushed for 169 yards on 39 carries, the fifth-most carries in Auburn history.

He had 125 yards on 27 carries at halftime, the most carries in a half ever by an Auburn player who gained 100 yards in the first half, and according to ESPN, the second-most carries in a first half in college football in the last 10 years.

Pettway scored three rushing TD against Mississippi State, his first multiple-TD game; he scored twice vs. Arkansas and Ole Miss.

» Sophomore Kerryon Johnson shows 165 rushes, 823 yards and 11 touchdowns this season, all eclipsing his 2015 totals. He scored in four straight games between the Birmingham Bowl and Texas A&M - the first since Cameron Artis-Payne did it in five straight in 2014.

Johnson had 124 yards against Arkansas State, 146 against ULM and 108 against Alabama A&M. He has 1,031 career rushing and 1,955 all-purpose yards. His 11 scores this season rank among the Auburn all-time top 20.

» Auburn has more rushes of 20 or more yards (30) through 11 games in 2016 than the Tigers had in 13 games during 2015 (18).

Auburn ranks fourth nationally with 102 rushes of 10+ yards, 17 rushes of 30+ yards and 11 carries of 40+ yards.

» John Franklin III's 80-yard TD run against ULM was Auburn's longest play of the season, the ninth-longest run in Auburn history and the second-longest ever by an Auburn QB (Phil Gargis 82 yds vs. Florida State, 1976). It was the longest run by an SEC QB this season. Franklin is averaging 10.5 yards per carry on 38 carries.

» True freshman Kam Martin totalled 176 yards rushing in the second half against Alabama A&M, with two scores. That's the second-highest second-half rushing total in Auburn records (189, Stephen Davis vs. Arkansas, 1994), the most yards by an Auburn freshman since 2010 and the fifth-best by an Auburn freshman ever.

» True freshman Eli Stove, making his first start vs. Arkansas, had a 78-yard touchdown run on Auburn's first offensive play of the game, the fourth carry of his career. He finished with 91 yards.

Stove's TD run was the 16th-longest in Auburn history and third-longest by a freshman.

» With rushing TD of 31 and 20 yards and a 45-yard TD reception against Arkansas, Stanton Truitt was the first Auburn player since Mario Fannin (2008 vs. Georgia) to score a rushing and receiving TD in an SEC game.

» The three schools with at least one 1,000-yard rusher per season from 2009-15: Oregon (9), Auburn (8) and Boise State (8). Auburn's 1,000-yard rushers during that span: Ben Tate (2009), Cam Newton (2010), Michael Dyer (2010 and 2011), Tre Mason (2012 and 2013), Nick Marshall (2013), Cameron Artis-Payne (2014), Peyton Barber (2015), Kamryn Pettway (2016).

QB SEAN WHITE

» In his last nine games, sophomore Sean White is 119-177 (67.2%) for 1,504 yards, 9 TD/2 INT. That's an average of 167.1/gm with a 153.13 efficiency rating.

» In SEC games this season, White is 88-137 (64.2%) for 1,021 yards; his QB efficiency rating in those games is 133.55.

» White has 26 completions of 20+ yards this season, compared to 13 last year. He leads the SEC and ranks 18th nationally in completion percentage (.652). His passing efficiency rating is 146.9.

» Going 17-23 with three TD passes for 244 passing and 304 total yards vs. Arkansas State, White was the first Auburn QB to complete at least 70% of his passes with at least three passing TDs and 300 yards total offense since Cam Newton vs. Chattanooga in 2010.

» In the first half of games this season, White is 70-96 (72.9%) passing for 901 yards, with five TD vs. one INT for a 166.86 QB rating.

» White is 212-341 passing (.622) in 17 career games (with 15 starts), throwing for 2,810 yards with 10 TD against seven career interceptions. He's 9-6 as a starter, and has passed for 200+ yards in eight of those starts.

**THE RECEIVING CORPS**

» Senior Tony Stevens has 29 receptions for 466 yards on the year with three scores, surpassing his previous season high (14 in 2015). A team-high 22 of Stevens' 29 receptions on the season have gone for a first down or TD.

Stevens had the first two-score game of his career vs. Arkansas State, and notched his first 100-yard receiving game with 109 yards on four catches vs. ULM.

» True freshman Kyle Davis' first two catches went for 40+ yards: a 43-yard reception vs. Clemson and a 42-yard one-hander vs. Arkansas State. The first Auburn freshman with a 40-yard reception since 2002, he added a 48-yard TD against ULM and has 11 catches for 235 yards (21.4 avg.) for the season.

» Sophomore Ryan Davis has made five catches in three games this season: for 36 yards vs. Texas A&M, for 31 yards vs. LSU; and a career-best 56 yards against ULM. He added his first career TD against Mississippi State. He has 25 catches for 194 yards for the season.

» Eight different targets have accounted for Auburn's 11 receiving touchdowns, the latest being Darius Slayton with a 21-yard scoring

catch against Vanderbilt. Slayton has 14 receptions for 236 yards (16.9 avg.) this season.

» Two of Jason Smith's three catches this season have gone for at least 20 yards. The senior caught a 32-yarder at Ole Miss and caught a 20-yarder vs. Vanderbilt.

**UNDERCLASS EXPLOSION**

» Auburn's freshmen and sophomore skill position players have combined for 4,479 of the Tigers' 5,209 yards of total offense (86.0%).

» 39 of the Tigers' 59 explosive plays (plays of 20+ yards) on offense have been credited to freshmen or sophomores.

**FIRST DOWNS**

» Auburn is third in the SEC with 23.3 first downs per game, including 36 vs. ULM, 32 vs. Arkansas State, 27 vs. Alabama A&M and 26 vs. Texas A&M, Arkansas and Ole Miss.

Auburn's 256 first downs are the eighth-most in a season in Auburn records.

» The Tigers have gained 25+ first downs in six of 11 games this season. Auburn has 20+ first downs in seven of 11 games this season.

» Under Gus Malzahn, the Tigers have gained 20 or more first downs in 38-51 games, with 22 games with 25+ first downs. Auburn has averaged 22.7 first downs per game under Malzahn.

**DEFENSIVE DOMINATION**

» Auburn has held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD. That's the longest streak without a rushing score since 2003-04 (8) and the longest streak within one season since 1957.

Auburn has allowed only four rushing TD this season, none in the last eight games, ranking second nationally. Those four rushing scores allowed through 11 games are the fewest since 2004.

» Auburn has 35 players on NFL rosters, representing 21 different NFL teams

» On NFL practice squads: Blake Countess (Los Angeles), Chad Slade (Houston), Gabe Wright (Cleveland), Trovon Reed (San Diego)

» Auburn letterman Kevin Greene was inducted to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August, the second Tiger so honored. Greene played for the Rams, Steelers, Panthers and 49ers in 15 NFL seasons (1985-99), leading the league in sacks twice. A five-time Pro Bowler, he had 160 career sacks, third best in league history at the time of his retirement.

» Auburn has had 29 players taken in the first round and four No. 1 overall draft picks: Cam Newton (Carolina, '11), Aundray Bruce (Atlanta, '88), Bo Jackson (Tampa, '86) & Tucker Frederickson (NY Giants, '65)

» At least one former Tiger has been selected to 16 of the last 17 Pro Bowls. Auburn has had at least one former player in eight of the last 11 Super Bowls

» Auburn ranks fourth nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 14.3 ppg, the lowest average at Auburn since 2006 (13.9 ppg). Auburn has allowed multiple TD in a game only four times this season (Arkansas State, Texas A&M, Mississippi State, Ole Miss). The 15 TD allowed (4 rush, 10 pass, 1 INT) by Auburn are the fewest allowed through 11 games since 2004 (13).

» Only five FBS defenses have not allowed an opponent 30-point game this year: Auburn, LSU, Michigan, Washington, Ohio State.

» Auburn has held its last 11 opponents below their season scoring average for the first time since 2005.

» The Auburn defense has held opponents to 85 first-half points, while the Tigers have scored 188 points in the first half.

» Ten of Auburn's 11 opponents have been held to 20 points or fewer this season. Auburn has allowed 157 points this season, the fewest points the Tigers have allowed in the first 11 games of a season since 2006 (152).

» The Auburn defense ranks 18th nationally in total defense at 334.5 yards per game, the best average since 2008. The Tigers have held eight of 11 opponents this season to 300 yards or fewer. Auburn held Alabama A&M to 130 total yards, the 11th time under Malzahn Auburn has held an opponent to less than 300 yards. Auburn held three consecutive opponents (ULM, MSU, Ark) to less than 300 yards total offense for the first time since 2007-08, and for the first time in a season since 2004.

» The Auburn defense ranks third in the SEC on third down, allowing an opponent success rate of just 32.6 percent.

» Auburn is holding its opponents to just 11-40 (.275) on third down in the third quarter and 23-81 (.284) in the second half.

» The Auburn defense ranks third nationally in red zone touchdowns allowed, giving up a TD on opponent red zone trips just 33.3 percent of the time. The Tigers are second nationally in overall red zone defense at 66.7 percent, second only to Florida.

» Auburn has allowed only 10 passing scores this season, which ranks 13th nationally.

» Auburn's 15 TD allowed ranks fourth nationally, behind LSU, Alabama, and Michigan, and tied with Ohio State and Wisconsin. The four rushing TD allowed are tied for second with Louisville, Michigan and Ohio State, one more than national leader Alabama (3).

FOR NO GAIN

» The Tigers have 72 TFL on the season, led by Carl Lawson with 13.0, Montravius Adams with 8.0 and Marlon Davidson with 6.0. Eleven of those TFL came in the win over Arkansas, the most since 2013. Against Arkansas State, Texas A&M, ULM, Arkansas and Alabama A&M, the Auburn defense did not allow a point on drives that included TFL.

» After 11 games, Auburn has 25 team sacks, surpassing its 2015 season total (19). Lawson leads Auburn with 9.0 sacks (ninth best nationally). Sixteen of Auburn's 21 sacks came during the six-game win streak. Nine different players have combined to record those 25 sacks. Last season, Auburn finished with 19 sacks from 13 different players.

THE LAWSON IMPACT

» Defensive end Carl Lawson had 10.5 tackles for loss (-37 yards) and 5.0 sacks (-25 yards) in 21 career games before the 2016 campaign. In 2016 alone (11 games), Lawson has recorded 12.5 TFL (-77 yards) and 9.0 sacks (-62 yards), leading Auburn in both categories.

» A Rotary Lombardi Award semifinalist, Lawson needs just 0.5 sack to enter the Auburn single season top 10 and just 2.0 sacks to join the career top 10 in that stat.

» Going back to 1997, Lawson's 9.0 sacks through the first 11 games are the most by any Auburn player, and more than the year-end leader had in 13 of those 19 seasons. He recorded 7.5 of those sacks during Auburn's six-game win streak, and 18 of his 23 QB hurries this season during those six games. Lawson is 14th in the nation in sacks, and the -62 yards on those sacks are 21st-best nationally.

» At Mississippi State, Lawson recorded two sacks (his third career multiple-sack game) and a forced fumble, earning SEC defensive lineman of the week honors.

TOP TACKLERS

» Five current players have totaled more than 100 career tackles each at Auburn: Johnathan "Rudy" Ford (273), Montravius Adams (141), Tre' Williams (124), Joshua Holsey (113) and Tray Matthews (112). Ford has led the team in tackles 10 times in his career.

» Ford is third among tacklers at Auburn since 2004 (when press box defensive stats were first official); next up is Neiko Thorpe (279, 2008-11).

» Eight current players have at least one career double-figure tackle game at Auburn: Johnathan Ford (9); Carlton Davis, Deshaun Davis, Joshua Holsey, Tray Matthews, Nick Ruffin, Darrell Williams, Tré Williams (1)

» Safety Tray Matthews was Auburn's top tackler with nine stops vs. LSU, with 11 at Ole Miss and with eight at Georgia.

Linebackers Deshaun Davis and Tre' Williams led the team in tackles against Texas A&M with six each.

Tre' Williams was Auburn's leading tackler against ULM with nine stops, with eight at Mississippi State, and with seven tackles against Arkansas.

Safety Nick Ruffin was the leading tackler in the season opener against Clemson with a career-best 10 tackles.

Linebacker Darrell Williams led Auburn with a career-best 11 stops against Vanderbilt.

**DEFENDING THE PASS**

» Auburn leads the nation with 65 passes broken up and is second nationally with 74 passes defended (behind UCF).

» Joshua Holsey's fourth-quarter interception against Vanderbilt was his second pick in as many games, his third interception of the season and fourth of his career.

Holsey's 47-yard return at Ole Miss was the longest by an Auburn player since a 78-yard return by Robenson Therezie vs. Ole Miss in 2013. Holsey also had an interception against Clemson.

Redshirt freshman Javaris Davis recorded interceptions against ULM and Arkansas, and Stephen Roberts had his first career interception at Mississippi State.

Tray Matthews recorded his first interception of the season at Georgia.

Against Alabama A&M, Montravius Adams and Stephen Roberts added their second career picks. Eight members of the current squad have multiple career interceptions.

» The Auburn defense has 58 interceptions in 51 games since the beginning of 2013.

» Joshua Holsey's five PBU vs. Ole Miss were the most for an Auburn player since 2001 when Rashaud Walker had five against LSU.

**LOU GROZA FINALIST DANIEL CARLSON**

» Junior Daniel Carlson tied an Auburn and SEC record with a 6-6 field goal performance against LSU, hitting from 51, 37, 31, 29, 29, and 29 yards, his eighth career game with three or more FG made.

» A Groza Award semifinalist for the second straight year, Carlson is Auburn's all-time leader in field goal percentage (.829, 63-76), a mark that ranks fourth in SEC history.

» Carlson leads the nation with an 84.1% touchback percentage (53-63) this season. For his career, 152 of 213 kickoffs (71.4%) have been touchbacks.

» Against Arkansas State, Carlson set an Auburn record for most points scored by a kicker (21), making three field goals, six PAT and scoring a 20-yard rushing touchdown on a fake field goal attempt (the first Auburn TD on a fake FG since 2000). Carlson broke the record of 18 points scored in a game he (at Alabama, 2014) shared with Al Del Greco (vs. Kentucky, 1982).

» Carlson has scored 329 points kicking (63-76 FG, 140-140 PAT) during his three-year career, second all-time among Auburn kickers.

Just the ninth Auburn player ever to score more than 100 points in a season, his overall scoring total of 335 points is also second in Auburn history, behind Wes Byrum (363 from 2007-10).

His 115 points scored this season rank fourth in Auburn single-season scoring.

» With two 53-yard field goals and a 51-yarder this season, Carlson is the Tigers' career leader for FG of 50 yards or longer with eight, surpassing Neil O'Donoghue (five from 1975-76). **His 53-yarders against Clemson and Vanderbilt are the 11th-longest FG in the FBS this season.**

» Carlson is 8-11 on career FG of at least 50 yards. He's one of only two AU kickers with three career FG of 53 yards or longer, along with Neil O'Donoghue (1973-76). Carlson's 50+-yard kicks:

**ON SPECIAL TEAMS**

» Auburn is sixth nationally in punt return yards allowed, with just seven total yards allowed this season on three returns.

» Kerryon Johnson's average of 26.39 yards per kick return through his first 23 career returns ranks first all-time in the Auburn record book.

» Montravius Adams' block of a ULM field goal attempt was Auburn's first field goal block since Blake Countess against Memphis in last year's Birmingham Bowl.

Adams blocked an Ole Miss PAT attempt, the first blocked PAT by Auburn since Angelo Blackson vs. Alabama in 2014.

Maurice Swain blocked an Alabama A&M field goal attempt.

» Auburn ranks second in the longest current string nationally of games without having a punt blocked. The Tigers' last blocked punt attempt was vs. Mississippi State in 2009, a string of 101 games.

» Auburn kickers have converted 167 consecutive PAT attempts back to the 2013 Tennessee game, **the fourth longest active streak in the FBS behind Florida State, Michigan and Memphis.**

» Auburn did not punt against ULM, the second time this season the Tigers were not forced to punt, along with Arkansas State.

**NOTEWORTHY FROM THE AAMU GAME...**

» This was the first shutout for the Auburn defense since 2008 vs ULM.

» Auburn held an opponent to less than 30 yards rushing for the second time this season: Arkansas (25), Alabama A&M (28).

» Jeremy Johnson scored his eighth and ninth career rushing touchdowns, his first since the 2015 Birmingham Bowl, and threw his 20th career TD pass. He surpassed 2,000 passing yards in his career and has 2,097 overall.

» Over the last seven games, Auburn has outscored its opponents 282-82, and outscored its opponents in the first half 152-45.

» Despite standing just +3 in turnover margin (15/12), Auburn holds a commanding 70-20 lead in points off turnovers.

» On the 2016 squad, 41 players now have at least one college start to their credit, 21 on the Auburn offense and 20 on defense.

» Since 2001, Auburn is 122-21 (.852) when scoring 20 or more points in a game. Dating back to 1993, Auburn is 178-29-1 (.857) when scoring 20 or more points. All-time, Auburn is now 323-9 (.974) when scoring 30 points.

» Auburn is 234-180-20 (.562) all-time in November. Auburn's all-time November home record is 96-37-5 (.711). Away from Auburn, the Tigers are 138-143-15 (.645) in November.

**THE LAST TIME VS. ALABAMA**

**#2 Alabama 29, Auburn 13**

» AUBURN, Ala. (Nov. 28, 2015) -- Jeremy Johnson threw a highlight reel touchdown pass to Jason Smith, but in a game of field goals, it wasn't enough to carry the day for Auburn at the Iron Bowl.

Alabama's Adam Griffith kicked five field goals and the Tide threw a touchdown pass of its own in the third quarter and added a touchdown late to beat Auburn 29-13 Saturday in the 80th renew of the rivalry.

The Johnson-to-Smith 77-yard touchdown pass was the stuff of the Prayer in Jordan-Hare win over Georgia, and Auburn's Kick Six win over Alabama in 2013. But while Smith made a great catch by tipping the ball to himself while running full speed, it didn't result in a win.

Auburn ended the regular season with a 6-6 record. Four of the losses were one-possession games, losing by eight or fewer points. The loss to Alabama was by double digits, thanks to a Tide touchdown with 26 seconds left.

It was a rebound for Griffith at Jordan-Hare Stadium. He missed a long field goal try on the last play of the 2013 Iron Bowl, the miss that Chris Davis turned into the Kick Six 109-yard return that beat Alabama on the final play.

This time, Griffith kicked four field goal in the first half for a 12-6 Alabama lead. He outdueled Auburn's Daniel Carlson, who hit two of his three tries.

Griffith hit field goals of 27, 40, 26 and 50 yards in the first half. Carlson ran his streak to 16 consecutive field goals when he hit field goals of 24 and 48 yards. He missed one after that.

Auburn fans cheered before the game upon seeing the return of Cam Newton, one of the stars of Auburn's 2010 Iron Bowl win. The fans cheered again when the big video board showed Davis' Kick Six return.

Neither offense did much around the end zone in the first

half. Auburn finished with 146 yards with Jovon Robinson's 53 rushing yards leading the way. Johnson hit 3-of-7 passes for 56 yards in the first half and finished hitting 10-of-23 passes for 169 yards.

Alabama finished with 465 yards, 271 of those came via Derrick Henry runs. Auburn finished with 260 yards.

Both quarterbacks did better in the third quarter than the first half. Alabama's Jake Coker stepped away from trouble twice on one drive, and the second dramatic getaway resulted in a 34-yard touchdown pass to ArDarius Stewart.

Alabama then benefitted from two personal foul penalties on Auburn on one play, gaining those 30 yards without trying, setting up Griffith's final field goal, a 46-yarder. Alabama's final touchdown came on a Henry 25-yard run with 26 seconds left.

## AUBURN - ALABAMA SERIES NOTES

### The 41-Year Break

Auburn and Alabama did not play for 41 years, from 1908 through 1947. There are two common misconceptions about the reason for the 41-year lapse. The first is that a fight broke out after a 6-6 tie in 1907 and caused both schools to discontinue the series. The second is that the state legislature got the two schools back together. Neither is true.

Auburn and Alabama quit playing because of money and officiating. Auburn wanted a northern umpire for the 1908 game, Alabama wanted a southern umpire. Auburn wanted to bring 22 players and allow \$3.50 per day for expenses. Alabama wanted to bring 20 players and allow \$3 per day for expenses. The two schools could never reach an agreement on these items and they became the bone of contention for years. After a period of time, scheduling became a problem. The two schools quit playing in all sports.

They renewed their athletic rivalry - the rivalry off the field never quit - in 1948 after actually "burying the hatchet" in Birmingham's Woodrow Wilson Park. In the winter and spring of 1948, Auburn president Dr. Ralph B. Draughon and Alabama president Dr. John Gallalee decided the disagreement had gone on long enough and agreed the series should be renewed after doggedly fighting what they considered interference into their internal affairs by the state legislature. Several cities, including Montgomery and Mobile, were considered for the game site. Birmingham was chosen because it had the largest stadium in the state, 44,000-seat Legion Field.

Alabama won that renewal game, 55-0, in 1948. The Tide was a prohibitive favorite the next year, too, but Auburn pulled off one of its biggest upsets ever, 14-13, and one of the nation's great football rivalries was reborn.

### Punt Bama Punt/1972

One of the most incredible Auburn-Alabama games was played Dec. 2, 1972. A few days before, Alabama head coach Bear Bryant incited the rivalry when he told reporters that he would rather, "beat that cow college once than beat Texas 10 times." That set the stage as second-ranked Alabama brought a 10-0 record into Legion Field to meet the ninth-ranked Tigers, who were 8-1.

For the entire game, Bama's defense held the Auburn offense in check. With 5:30 remaining in the game, 16-point favorite Alabama held a seemingly insurmountable 16-3 lead. Yet the Tigers came roaring back for one of the best finishes in Auburn-Alabama history. Auburn's Bill Newton blocked two Alabama punts and David Langner ran both in for touchdowns as Auburn came back to win 17-16. Newton and Langner will forever be remembered for their play in the "Punt Bama Punt" game.

### Bo Over The Top/1982

One of the more memorable games from the 1980s was the 1982 affair, which is remembered for "Bo Over The Top." Auburn had a nine-year losing streak against Alabama entering the game, but Bo Jackson's 1-yard leap over the Alabama goal line on fourth down with 2:26 left capped a 66-yard drive and gave Auburn a 23-22 victory, setting the stage for what Auburn people consider the Tigers' "coming out" party in the 1980s.

### The New Chapter/1980s

Though Alabama dominated the series through the 1960s and '70s,

the rivalry reached new heights in the '80s, when the average margin of victory was a mere 6.4 points. Some classic battles were waged in the decade.

Two games that epitomize the series came in 1985 and 1986. Auburn won the 1986 meeting on a Lawyer Tillman reverse into the end zone with 32 seconds remaining to down Bama 21-17. Alabama won the 1985 game, 25-23, on a 52-yard Van Tiffin field goal as the clock expired. Twenty-five years ago, a new page was added to the rivalry in 1989 when Alabama came to Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time.

### Sack Attack/2005

In Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2005, Auburn set a new school record by sacking Alabama quarterbacks 11 times. Auburn recorded five sacks during the first quarter alone, while holding Alabama to minus-17 yards of offense in the period. Seven different players had at least half a sack for Auburn in the game.

### The Comeback/2010

In the largest comeback in school history, No. 2 Auburn erased a 24-0 deficit to beat No. 9 Alabama 28-27 in Tuscaloosa Nov. 26, 2010.

Alabama scored on each of its first three possessions to take a 21-0 lead into the second quarter. The Crimson Tide had a first-and-10 from its 40 when QB Greg McElroy connected with RB Mark Ingram. As Ingram raced down the sideline to the Auburn 19-yard line, Tigers lineman Antoine Carter raced 40 yards from the line of scrimmage to strip the ball from behind. The ball rolled into the end zone where Auburn's Demond Washington recovered for a touchback. Although Auburn had to punt on the ensuing possession, the turnover stymied Alabama's momentum.

After a field goal made it 24-0 with 8:01 left in the second quarter, the Tigers made it a 24-7 game on Cam Newton's 36-yard touchdown pass to Emory Blake. Auburn then scored on the second play of the second half as Newton hit Terrell Zachery on a 70-yard touchdown pass to make it 24-14.

A 1-yard sneak by Newton made it 24-21 with 4:25 left in the third quarter. The Crimson Tide converted a field goal following an Auburn turnover to take a 27-21 lead into the fourth quarter. Newton notched his third touchdown pass of the game when he hit Philip Lutzenkirchen on a 7-yard pass that gave the Tigers a 28-27 lead with 11:55 left in the game.

Auburn's defense held Alabama in check as the Tigers completed the improbable rally to finish a 12-0 regular season.

### Kick Six/2013

Chris Davis returned a missed Alabama field goal 109 yards (100 officially) as time expired to give No. 4 Auburn a 34-28 win over top-ranked Alabama and send it to the SEC Championship Game. With one second remaining, Alabama, which ended the game 0-4 on field goals, lined up for a 57-yard attempt. Adrian Griffith, attempting his first field goal of the night after Cade Foster missed two field goal attempts and had a third blocked, sent his kick to the very back of the end zone where Davis caught it. Davis followed his blockers to the Auburn sideline and raced the entire length of the field to send the sellout crowd of 87,451 onto the field from the stands.

# GUS MALZAHN » HEAD COACH

## FAST FACTS

» Gus Malzahn has won or played for a conference title in six of his 10 seasons as a collegiate coach

» With the win over Alabama A&M, Malzahn has 35 victories in his first four seasons as Auburn head coach the second-most in Auburn history behind only Terry Bowden.

» Malzahn's teams have won their conference championships in three of the last six seasons - with Auburn in 2010 and 2013 and Arkansas State in 2012

» In his fourth season, Malzahn is already seventh among Auburn football coaches all-time in total wins.

The leaders (and seasons coached): **176**, Ralph "Shug" Jordan (25); **99**, Pat Dye (12) and Mike Donahue (18); **85**, Tommy Tuberville (10); **48**, Jack Meagher (9); **47**, Terry Bowden (6); **35**, **Gus Malzahn (4)**; **33**, Gene Chizik (4); **32**, 29, Doug Barfield (5); **22**, Chet Wynne (4)

His 35 wins in his first four seasons are one behind Terry Bowden's 36 for the most in the first four seasons at Auburn.

» Two of the four most productive offenses in SEC history were Malzahn concoctions: Auburn 2013 (7,018) and Auburn 2010 (6,989)

» Since 2000, in the seven seasons Malzahn has been at Auburn, the Tigers have posted 17 50-point games; in the 10 seasons without Malzahn, Auburn has recorded just seven 50-point games. The Tigers have recorded three 50-point games in a season twice since Malzahn took over as Auburn head coach (2013 and 2016).

» Just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining Bernie Moore (LSU, 1935) and John Vaught (Ole Miss, 1947)

» Malzahn is 28-8 at home as a collegiate head coach (5-1 in 2012 at Arkansas State; 8-0 in 2013, 6-1 in 2014, 3-4 in 2015 and 6-2 in 2016 at Auburn). He started his Auburn tenure with 13 consecutive home victories.

» In six seasons at Auburn as an assistant or head coach, Malzahn's teams have had at least one first-team all-SEC selection each year

» Malzahn's Auburn teams scored at least 20 points in his first 23 games as head coach; his Auburn teams have scored 20 points or more in 42 of 51 games

» Has produced 14 1,000-yard rushers in 10 years as a college head coach/offensive coordinator, at least one each season. Malzahn has coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers

» His 20-7 record was the second-best start in Auburn history, only behind Terry Bowden, who started 20-1-1 in 1993-94

» 2013 national coach of the year awards: Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Bear Bryant, Home Depot, Associated Press, Liberty Mutual, Sporting News, SB Nation, USSA Amos Alonzo Stagg

» In 14 seasons as a high school head coach in Arkansas, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame

» Auburn has produced a rusher with 100 or more yards in 37 of 51 games under Malzahn

**JORDAN-HARE STADIUM > 87,451**

Jordan-Hare Stadium is Auburn's showcase football stadium, which seats 87,451, with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the east side and college football's largest videoboard - debuted in 2015 - spanning the south end.

Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium is the nation's 11th-largest on-campus stadium with a capacity of 87,451. It is the seventh-largest in the SEC.

The Tigers have won 78.8 percent of their games in Jordan-Hare Stadium since its 1939 dedication and hold an overall record of 311-81-7 there.

The 2014 season was the 75th anniversary of Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later, 14,000 more seats were added, and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (after a member of Auburn's first football team and eventual dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span.

Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season.

The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph "Shug" Jordan. The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl.

The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.

On game days, Auburn's Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium becomes the sixth-largest city in the state of Alabama as Auburn has averaged at least 80,000 fans per game for the last 21 seasons.

Since Jordan-Hare Stadium expanded to its current capacity prior to the 2004 season, the Tigers have tallied 49 sell-out games.

**GAME 1**

Gus Malzahn said his quarterback race was close all August, then showed just how close it was Saturday night. Auburn got things together in the second half, threw into the end zone on the game's two final plays, but Clemson survived for a 19-13 win. Sean White, Jeremy Johnson and John Franklin III, quarterbacks all, took snaps; and running back Kerryon Johnson and even H-back Chandler Cox stepped through the revolving quarterback door as well. They set up Daniel Carlson field goals and a late Kerryon Johnson TD run. It wasn't enough despite a comeback second half. Clemson's high-powered offense did just enough against a tough-minded Auburn defense in front of a sold out Jordan-Hare Stadium on opening night.

No. 2 Clemson came in with all the offensive fanfare, but Carlson's 32-yard field goal with 13:46 remaining cut Clemson lead to 13-6. Auburn then cut it to 19-13 with 3:22 left on a 9-yard Kerryon Johnson touchdown run.

Sean White's final two passes in the end zone were batted away in the final seconds.

A Deshaun Watson pass to Hunter Renfrow, who made a nothing-you-can-do-about-it great catch, made it 19-6 with 9:59 left. Clemson turned Auburn away on a fourth-down pass from the 8, before Johnson's touchdown run minutes later.

Auburn tried to catch Clemson off guard the whole game. Receiver Stanton Truitt got three quick carries. Sean White, Jeremy Johnson and John Franklin III all threw a pass in the first quarter. Kerryon Johnson finally hit the half with 10 rushing yards, but, as a team, Auburn had just one.

The Tigers picked it up in the second half.

Johnson hit his first three passes and led Auburn to its first score, a Carlson 53-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. It was the sixth time that Carlson had blasted a field goal of at least 50 yards in his career, an Auburn record. Kevin Phillips also had a career-best 68-yard punt in the first half.

Auburn's defensive line held steady early and it took a fourth-down 1-yard run by Wayne Gallman to finally get Clemson a 7-3 lead with 7:34 left in the first quarter.

Auburn's defense turned away another scoring opportunity when

Derrick Brown recovered a fumble caused by Darrell Williams. But Clemson tacked on a Greg Huegel field goal with 0:07 seconds left in the first half for a 10-3 lead.

Clemson scored first in the second half on a 40-yard field goal for a 10-point lead. Auburn was still hanging around, though, despite the fact Clemson has run 49 plays for 255 yards. Auburn had run 26 plays for 38 yards.

Auburn found its offense by mixing White, Johnson and Franklin, driving to the Clemson 5 late in the third quarter. But Johnson was stopped on fourth-and-2.

**GAME 2**

Auburn's offense is alive and well and, last seen, scoring just about every way possible Saturday night in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Tigers blasted Arkansas State 51-14, rebounding from a season-opening loss to No. 2 Clemson when the offense couldn't find its way.

The offense certainly found its way against Arkansas State with old-school rushing, steady passing from Sean White and even a fake field goal that went for a touchdown. Auburn had 706 yards of offense, breaking the 700-yard mark for just the second time in school history.

The defense was steady when it mattered, repeating the solid performance it had in a 19-13 loss to Clemson.

Coach Gus Malzahn, who played three quarterbacks in the opener, turned to White, who directed Auburn's first eight scoring drives. White only came out when his helmet popped off, and for a few direct snaps to Johnson, before John Franklin III took over with Auburn leading by 34.

White capped off his big night when he scrambled to his right before throwing an 8-yard touchdown pass to Tony Stevens to make it 48-14.

Auburn will look to carry that momentum into its Southeastern Conference opener against Texas A&M at 6 p.m. next Saturday in Jordan-Hare.

How did Auburn do it in the first half when it streaked to a commanding 38-7 lead? With White passing, the rushing of Kerryon Johnson and Kamryn Pettway and a fake field goal that turned into touchdown run for kicker Daniel Carlson.

Pettway led Auburn with 152 yards rushing. Johnson had 124 more.

White hit 17-of-23 passes for 244 yards and three touchdowns. He ran for 60 more.

Auburn's first half set the tone with two 100-yard rushers, a one-handed highlight-reel catch by Kyle Davis – “circus catch,” said – and a Johnson 47-yard touchdown run when he started this way, but ran all the way that way to reach the end zone.

Oh, a falling-down White flipped him the ball at the last instant to send Johnson on his way.

There was also a 29-yard touchdown pass to Will Hastings and a 24-

yard touchdown pass to Tony Stevens.

Did we save the best for last? Sure we did.

Carlson, one of the best kickers in America, scored on 20-yard run when holder Tyler Stovall flipped the ball over this head to Carlson darting to right. Touchdown Auburn.

Auburn finished the first half with a whopping 452 yards. Kerryon Johnson had 103 of those rushing. Kamryn Pettway, who didn't get a carry in the opener, had 101 more.

White hit 10-of-14 passes for 173 yards and two touchdowns. Auburn converted 7-of-8 third-down tries in the half.

Auburn kept it up to start the second half, scoring on a 37-yard Carlson field goal to make it 41-3. Carlson kicked another one midway through the fourth quarter to make it 51-14.

**GAME 3**

Auburn's defense made Texas A&M settle for field goal after field goal. That was enough for the Aggies in Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday night.

Texas A&M beat the Tigers 29-16 in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams, thanks, mostly, to Daniel LaCamera's dead-eye field goal kicking. His five field goals gave the Aggies the edge, enough to counter Kerryon Johnson's 2-yard Auburn touchdown run in the fourth quarter.

The No. 17 Aggies improved to 3-0. Auburn fell to 1-2 with both losses coming to nationally ranked teams. Another one of those, LSU, will visit Jordan-Hare next Saturday.

The Tigers can point to their defense for that one. A&M converted only 2 of its 15 third-down plays and settled for field goals on four of five trips to the red zone.

The first half Saturday was indeed a battle of field goals and defense. LaCamera kicked three field goals, of 46, 35 and 31 yards. Auburn's Daniel Carlson countered with one of 37 yards.

The touchdowns were hard to come by.

"It was an extremely tough loss," said coach Gus Malzahn. "We have to find a way to get better."

Malzahn the turning point was the third quarter, saying his defense played well "and gave the offense opportunities."

But, he said, "we didn't have explosive plays."

"Our whole offense is a work in progress. We were inconsistent, to say the least."

Kamryn Pettway, the workhorse in the first half, scored on a 1-yard run for a 7-0 Auburn lead midway through the first. But a LaCamera field goal and a 5-yard touchdown pass-and-catch from Trevor Knight to Josh Reynolds provided the Aggies with a 10-7 lead with 12:07 left in the second quarter. Two more LaCamera field goals padded the lead. Auburn raced the clock, and made it, at the end of the first half to set up Carlson's field goal to cut the halftime deficit to 16-10.

A&M scored on...what else?... a LaCamera field goal in the third. That trumped Auburn's 35 yards of offense. LaCamera kicked another field

goal in the fourth to make it 22-10. Auburn threatened after that, making to the A&M 12, but was stopped on fourth down with 7:22 left in the game.

The Aggies came right back on an 89-yard touchdown run by Trayveon Williams.

One of the Auburn highlights was the play of Tony Stevens, who had a career-best eight catches for 86 yards.

Pettway rushed for 123 yards. Sean White hit 18-of-27 passes for 126 yards. John Franklin III replaced White in the fourth quarter when Malzahn said he was looking for a spark. Franklin rushed nine times for 47 yards. He was 4-of-8 passing for 27 yards.

Talk about your dramatic finishes...

Daniel Carlson had a game to remember and Auburn's defense stopped LSU at the 15-yard line as time ran out in a crazy 18-13 victory in a game that featured eight field goals.

It wasn't truly decided until the replay official said time ran out before LSU's final play, which looked, ever so briefly, as a 15-yard game-winning touchdown pass. LSU initially celebrated a win. The officials said no.

Carlson tied a school record with six field goals, and, obviously, scored all the points for Auburn.

Carlson was an equal-opportunity kicker, hitting three in the first half and three more in the second. Auburn's defense did the rest, holding LSU to 14 first downs. "The best kicker in college football," said Auburn coach Gus Malzahn.

But the game was close, with LSU driving in the final seconds. Carl Lawson had a big sack to slow LSU, moving the Bengal Tigers back from the 14 to the 20. LSU was fighting the clock, got off a few more snaps, but eventually, time ran out.

Malzahn said he was confident that time had run out before the snap, and the officials only had to do their "due diligence" to say Auburn won.

Auburn's defense set the tone early when it held LSU to only five first downs in the first half. The Bengals Tigers finished with 14.

Auburn tried, but couldn't do this against No. 5 Clemson and No. 10 Texas A&M. The third time was a charm against a nationally ranked team.

No. 18 LSU couldn't overcome Auburn's improving defense.

Malzahn said he turned over the play calling for this game to offensive coordinator Rhett Lashlee so he could manage the game easier as a head coach. Auburn outgained LSU 388-338 yards.

Malzahn said Lashlee did a "really good job."

Malzahn said White "played an outstanding game" and continued to show a toughness that impresses. He was 19-of-26 passing for 234 yards. Kerryon Johnson led Auburn with 93 yards rushing, and added 68 more receiving yards.

The first half belonged to Auburn's defense and Carlson. He kicked field goals of 51, 29 and 29 yards. The last of those was Carlson's 50th in his career, and gave Auburn a 9-7 lead with 5:14 left in the second quarter.

Auburn was better in the red zone, out of the red zone and just about every place the Tigers set foot in Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday.

Kerryon Johnson had his career-best rushing day by halftime, quarterbacks Sean White and John Franklin III accounted for five touchdowns and Auburn blasted Louisiana-Monroe 58-7 to send a homecoming crowd home happy.

The Tigers, who spent the week saying it needed to score more red-zone touchdowns, certainly scored in the red zone. But Auburn didn't always even bother with the red zone. White threw 48-yard touchdown passes to both Kyle Davis and Tony Stevens, and a regular-ol' 36-yarder to Stevens to set up another score. Franklin scored on an 80-yard sprint on his second. A few minutes later, he threw a 39-yard pass to Nate Craig-Myers to make it 56-7 with 1:08 left in the third quarter.

Auburn added a safety by Gary Walker in the closing seconds.

Johnson had a career-best 127 yards and two touchdowns at the half. He finished with 146 yards, giving way to young back midway through the third quarter.

It was a win, and a confidence boost, as the Tigers, which started the season with five straight home games, turn their attention to their first road game when it plays at Mississippi State next Saturday. Auburn improved to 3-2.

The ULM Saturday was just what Auburn needed to feel better about the offense after beating LSU 18-13 the week before with six field goals. The Tigers scored eight touchdowns against the Warhawks.

And had 618 yards. After three quarters. The Tigers finished with 688 yards.

The Tigers said after beating LSU with six field goals that they needed to be more productive in the red zone. They were from the beginning Saturday, scoring touchdowns on all three red-zone opportunities in the first half.

Auburn wasted little time against its Sun Belt opponent, scoring on its first possession, starting when Sean White turned a called pass play into a 3-yard touchdown run. White threw a 48-yard touchdown pass to Kyle

Offense. Defense. Oh, my, everybody got into act for Auburn on Saturday.

Sean White's accurate passing, bulldozer Kamryn Pettway's 169 yards rushing on a workhorse 39 carries and a defense that dominated early led the Tigers to a complete 38-14 Southeastern Conference victory over Mississippi State at Davis Wade Stadium.

The Tigers led 35-0 at the halftime, and had a mountain of stats to prove it. "Breathing room," was how coach Gus Malzahn described it.

Certainly, the Tigers showed they were feeling right at home in their first road game of the season.

Auburn is on a roll, with consecutive wins over LSU, Louisiana-Monroe and now Mississippi State heading into next week's open date.

White was sharp in the first two quarters, hitting 13-of-16 passes for 185 yards and a touchdown, a performance that set up everything else for the Tigers. He finished passing for 204 yards.

Pettway stepped in for Kerryon Johnson, who suffered an early injury, and had a whopping 27 first-half carries for 125 yards, then carried it 12 more times for good measure.

The defense added a touchdown when Carl Lawson jarred the ball loose, and fellow defensive lineman Montravius Adams raced to the end zone on a 13-yard scoop and score.

Auburn won its third straight to improve to 4-2 overall and 2-1 in the SEC Mississippi State fell to 2-3 overall and 1-2 in the league.

How did Auburn score? Let's us count the ways.

White, who completed passes to eight different players, threw a 13-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Davis for the first score. That was followed by three straight Pettway touchdowns, from 1, 3 and 2 yards, the last of those coming with 1:54 left in the second quarter for a 28-0 lead.

Nine seconds later, it was 35-0 on Adams' touchdown.

The stat sheet told the first-half story. Auburn hit the break with 335 yards and 17 first downs. State had just 91 yards and five first downs.

The Tigers had only 23 yards of offense in the third quarter, but it hardly impacted the scoreboard.

Auburn's only score in the second half was a Daniel Carlson 25-yard field goal with 1:39 remaining after grabbing that big halftime lead.

Auburn did all of that with Johnson, the SEC's third-leading rusher, watching most of the game after injuring an ankle after just three carries.

How bad was it for Mississippi State? The Bulldogs recovered an Auburn fumble in the second half — and was penalized 30 yards on the play for two dead-ball unsportsmanlike conduct penalties.

Sean White, Kamryn Pettway and Stanton Truitt kept Auburn's red-hot offense in hyper-drive Saturday night, running and passing and helping the No. 21 Tigers beat No. 17 Arkansas 56-3 in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

White threw for one touchdown and ran for another, Pettway turned in another workhorse performance with 192 yards on 27 carries and Truitt scored three times as the Tigers got their fourth consecutive win to improve to 5-2 overall and 3-1 in the Southeastern Conference. Arkansas fell to 5-3 overall and 1-3 in the league.

Auburn finished with a staggering 544 yards rushing, the most ever by one SEC team against another. Arkansas had just 25. The Tigers finished with 632 yards.

Auburn's defense didn't let Arkansas do much of anything with early sacks and late sacks and taking away most everything the Razorbacks wanted to do.

Arkansas was so accustomed to seeing Pettway running by the middle of the third quarter that all it took was to fake a handoff to him to free White to run untouched around end on a 1-yard touchdown scamper to make it 35-3. Freshman Kam Martin got into the act with a 51-yard touchdown run with 4:27 left.

Auburn did all of it without Kerryon Johnson, the Tigers' leading rusher coming in, who was held out after hurting his ankle against Mississippi State two weeks ago.

The speedy Truitt, Malzahn said, "was a great change of pace" to Pettway. They combined for five touchdowns.

Auburn easily played on while erasing last year's four-overtime loss to Arkansas. The offense grabbed the touchdown headlines.

The defense made sure Arkansas didn't.

Malzahn said holding Arkansas to 25 yards rushing 'was really unbelievable.'

Auburn started fast. Real fast. The Tigers scored on their first play, then scored again and then again before the first quarter was done.

Auburn led 28-0 until Adam McFain hit a 54-yard field goal on the final play of the first half.

That didn't matter. Auburn had done its damage by then, first when Eli Stove raced 78 yards for a touchdown on the Tigers' first snap. It was the first time Auburn had scored on its first snap of a game since Carnell Williams did it against Alabama in 2003.

The Tigers didn't stop there.

Pettway scored on a bulldozer 9-yard run eight minutes later.

Then Stanton Truitt, the receiver-turned-running-back-turned-receiver scored two times in a row, first on a 20-yard run, then on a 45-yard pass from Sean White.

Truitt was virtually untouched on both plays as Auburn built a 28-0 lead.

All the while Arkansas was doing what it does best: Hogging the ball. At one point, Arkansas had held the ball 16 minutes, 27 seconds to Auburn's 5 minutes, 4 seconds -- yet the Tigers led 21-0.

Auburn rode the see-saw with Ole Miss forever, then came up big in the fourth quarter to score a 40-29 victory Saturday night for its fifth straight victory.

A crowd of 65,927 -- the second largest crowd in Vaught-Hemingway Stadium history -- were treated all kinds of yardage and scores before Auburn took the lead and put the Rebels away despite a huge passing night from Ole Miss' Chad Kelly in a game in which the teams combined for more than 1,100 yards.

The craziness started in the first half and continued through the fourth quarter. Auburn finally took the lead, for good, on a 30-yard Daniel Carlson field goal to make it 30-29 with 12:25 left to play. He kicked 47-yarder four minutes later just to make sure.

A big Josh Holsley interception -- a pick that coach Gus Malzahn said was the play of the game -- set up a 3-yard Kerryon Johnson touchdown, his second of the game, to make it 40-29 with 5:58 left.

That was after a wild first half that simply would not stop in the second half. A 15-yard touchdown pass from Sean White to Jalen Harris -- his first career reception -- gave Auburn a 27-22 lead with 3:11 left in the third quarter. But Kelly answered that for a 29-27 Ole Miss lead with a touchdown pass with 3:11 left in the third. He passed for 465 yards. Auburn's Kamryn Pettway countered with 236 yards rushing on 30 carries.

White passed for 247 yards and ran for 27 more.

The first half was a crazy see-saw affair. Each team scored every single time it had the ball -- nine times in all -- on the way to a 22-20 Ole Miss halftime lead. By the time it was over, Ole Miss had 32 first downs and Auburn had 26.

Ole Miss had 570 yards. Auburn had 554. But the Tigers adjusted along the way. The Rebels scored only once in the second half.

Kelly, already the SEC's leading passer, negated Auburn's strong defensive line with quick passes. He passed for 297 yards in the first half on the way to 465 on a whopping 59 attempts. Ole Miss rolled up 351 total yards in the first half. Auburn countered with 272 yards, taking a different route to get there.

Pettway rushed for 148 yards and touchdown in the first half.

Sean White came off the bench to provide a spark, and Auburn ran its winning streak to six consecutive games with a 23-16 hard-fought victory over Vanderbilt in Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday.

White, usually Auburn's starting quarterback, didn't play in the first half while nursing an injury. He was fit to play in the second half.

Auburn, down 13-10 at the break, called on White to straighten things out. He did.

So did Josh Halsey, whose interception in the final 30 seconds ended Vandy's hopes.

Auburn improved to 7-2 overall and 5-1 in the Southeastern Conference. Vanderbilt fell to 3-4 overall and 1-4 in the league.

White took over for starter John Franklin III, who completed two of four passes in the second half. Auburn ran only 25 plays in the first two quarters, so the Tigers turned to White.

But he was well enough to help win the game.

Kamryn Pettway rushed for 173 yards to go over the 1,000-yard mark for the season, but hurt himself on a 61-yard run late in the game and Malzahn wouldn't guess whether his running back would be available for next Saturday's game at Georgia. Daniel Carlson kicked three field goals to become Auburn's all-time field goal kicker, now with 61 his career.

White started the second half and quickly produced results, completing five straight passes on his first drive, including a 21-yard touchdown pass to Darius Slayton for a 17-13 lead. White was 7-of-7 passing before his first miss. But Daniel Carlson fixed that with his second field goal of the game, this time a 53-yarder, to put Auburn up 20-13 with 5:57 left in the third quarter.

Vandy's Tommy Openshaw made it 20-16, but Carlson stretched the lead on a 32-yard field goal with 11:01 left in the fourth quarter. The Tigers did all of that despite being slowed by injuries before the game even started, then picking up more as the game played out.

Auburn didn't do much offensively in the first half on its 25 plays, though Kerryon Johnson still managed a touchdown on a 3-yard run, and Carlson hit a 45-yard field goal. But Vandy had success in the middle of

the field, scoring on an 8-yard pass from Kyle Shurmur to Jared Pinkney, and two Tommy Openshaw field goals for a 13-10 lead at halftime.

Franklin provided a running spark early, using his quickness to lead Auburn in rushing in the first half with 59 yards. Pettway, the SEC's leading rusher, had a modest 52 yards in the first half. Franklin threw only four passes in the first half, hitting two of them for nine yards.

**GAME 10**

Auburn's offense got sidetracked without SEC leading rusher Kamryn Pettway as old rival Georgia knocked off the No. 9 Tigers 13-7 Saturday in Sanford Stadium.

Pettway, who has 1,106 yards rushing this season, didn't dress for the game because of a leg injury. The Tigers stumbled without him, especially in the second half.

The Tigers finished with 164 yards as Georgia snapped Auburn's six-game winning streak. The Tigers are 7-3 overall and 5-2 in the SEC.

Auburn led 7-0 at halftime, but Maurice Smith intercepted Sean White and returned it 34 yards for a touchdown just 23 seconds into the second half to tie it at 7-all.

The Tigers couldn't find their way in the third quarter, gaining just 19 yards. Georgia used that to finally take a 10-7 lead early in the fourth quarter when Rodrigo Blankenship kicked a 45-yard field goal. Blankenship missed a 49-yard try a few minutes later. But Georgia got the ball back, ate up the clock and added a late field goal.

Kerryon Johnson assumed his duties as Auburn's primary back, the one he had when the season began, with a workhorse 15 carries in the first half for 74 yards. He completed a pass and caught a pass, too. Auburn didn't stop there. Without Pettway, the Tigers pressed their play calling with an end around to Eli Stove, a 16-yard run by White and a 6-yard run by H-back Chandler Cox.

Yet, the Tigers had only 132 yards at half, and only 25 of those were by the pass.

Johnson took a direct snap and darted up the middle on a 3-yard touchdown run with 28 seconds left in the first quarter. The rest of the first half was played, mostly, between the 20s.

White was limited to seven throws and four completions. Georgia mixed it up with 17 pass attempts and 16 rushes. The Bulldogs won the stat battle in the first half by going for 161 yards.

But Auburn had the points and a 7-0 lead at halftime.

Johnson rushed 22 times for 99 yards. White was 6-of-20 passing for 27 yards.

Jeremy Johnson went out in style in his last game in Jordan-Hare Stadium.

The Auburn senior quarterback ran a touchdown and threw for another in the game's first six minutes and accounted for three touchdowns in all to lead the Tigers to a 55-0 Senior Day victory over Alabama A&M, the last stop before next Saturday's Iron Bowl date with Alabama.

Johnson, subbing for the injured Sean White, was playing in his just his third game of the year after starting most of the games last year.

He wasn't at all rusty, hitting seven of his first eight passes. He finished rushing for two touchdowns and passed for another. His backup, John Franklin III, was just as sporty, as was backup running back Kam Martin and a lot of other Tigers. Don't forget the defense. It was Auburn's first shutout since 2008.

"It's very hard to shut people out in college football," said coach Gus Malzahn. "The defense played great all year. To get a shutout the last game is really special."

Auburn improved to 8-3, gaining 598 yards in the process. Alabama A&M, limited to 130 yards, fell to 4-7.

Auburn honored Johnson and 19 other seniors, and redshirt junior Carl Lawson, in pregame Senior Day ceremonies. Johnson took it all to heart. Kam Martin, too, who rushed for 172 yards, all in the second half.

The Tigers didn't fool around, scoring on their first two possessions with Johnson looking sharp from the game's first play. He was 13-of-18 passing at the half despite a couple of drops. He finished hitting 14 of 19 passes for 147 yards, and rushed for 42 yards for good measure.

Johnson accounted for two early touchdowns, one on a 7-yard run, another on a 14-yard pass to Kyle Davis.

Kerryon Johnson scored on a 2-yard run with 3:51 left in the second quarter, and Daniel Carlson's 41-yard field goal two minutes later made it 24-0 at halftime.

Jeremy Johnson scored on a 1-yard run early in the third quarter to make it 31-0.

Reserve quarterback John Franklin III replaced Johnson and promptly ripped off a 45-yard run. Martin scored on an 18-yard run on the next play to make it 38-0. Franklin raced 39 yards for a touchdown just a few minutes later.

Daniel Carlson hit a 19-yard field goal to make it 48-0 with 42 seconds left in the third quarter. Martin scored again on 17-yard with 9:52 remaining. That was plenty.

Auburn didn't have SEC leading rusher Kamryn Pettway for the second straight game, so the Tigers turned to Kerryon Johnson to carry the load in the first half. He carried it 18 times for 108 yards. Jeremy Johnson rushed for 39 more.
