**THE GAME:** The No. 1/1/1 University of Alabama football team faces the No. 15/16/16 Auburn Tigers in the Tide's final regular season matchup of 2016 season. The meeting between the Crimson Tide and Tigers is scheduled for a 2:30 p.m. CT kickoff on CBS. Verne Lundquist and Gary Danielson will call the game from the booth with Allie LaForce on the sidelines. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as the sideline reporter.

**RANKINGS:** Alabama remains No. 1 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls this week following Saturday's 31-3 win over Chattanooga. Auburn is No. 16 in both the AP and Amway Coaches' polls. The Tide was No. 1 and Auburn was No. 15 in the most-recent College Football Playoff rankings, which were released on Tuesday, Nov. 15.

**AUBURN:** The Tigers enter Saturday's contest with an 8-3 overall record and a 5-2 mark in the Southeastern Conference. Auburn opened the season with a 19-12 home loss to No. 2/2 Clemson on Sept. 3 before rebounding to post a 51-14 home win over Arkansas State on Sept. 10. The Tigers lost to No. 17/20 Texas A&M on Sept. 16 to fall to 1-2 on the year but then won six straight games, starting with home wins over 18/17 LSU (18-13) on Sept. 24 and Louisiana-Monroe (58-7) on Oct. 1, at Mississippi State (38-14) on Oct. 8, at home vs. No. 17/17 Arkansas (56-3) on Oct. 22, at Ole Miss (40-29) on Oct. 29 and at home vs. Vanderbilt (23-16) on Nov. 5. The streak was snapped with a 13-7 loss at Georgia on Nov. 12. The Tigers rebounded to defeat Alabama A&M, 55-0, on Nov 19. Auburn is led by head coach Gus Malzahn, who has a five-year career record of 44-19, including a four-year mark of 35-16 (25-14 in SEC play) at Auburn.

**IRON BOWL HISTORY:** Alabama and Auburn will square off for the 81st Iron Bowl matchup on Saturday at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide holds a 44-35-1 advantage in a series that dates back to the 1893 season. UA and AU first met on Feb. 22, 1893, at Birmingham's Lakeview Park with the Tigers claiming a 32-22 victory in the inaugural matchup. Alabama has had the upper hand in recent meetings, claiming six of the last eight matchups with four of those wins leading to a Crimson Tide national championship, including a come-from-behind 26-20 win in Auburn in 2009, a 42-14 win in 2011, a 49-0 victory in 2012 and a 29-13 victory in Auburn last season.

**NEXT GAME:** Alabama will head to the Georgia Dome in Atlanta to represent the SEC Western Division in the SEC Championship game on Saturday, Dec. 3. The Crimson Tide would square off with Eastern Division winners Florida for the conference championship.

**SENIOR DAY:** Saturday's matchup with Auburn will be Alabama's senior day. **STREAKING:** Alabama owns the longest winning streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision, having won 23 consecutive games dating back to last season (a loss on Sept. 19, 2015, vs. Ole Miss). The 23-game streak is the third-longest in school history (28 games twice: 1991-93 & 1978-80) and is the longest under the direction of head coach Nick Saban (previous long: 19 games in 2009-10). During this stretch, the Crimson Tide have won 11 games at Bryant-Denny Stadium, eight straight road matchups and four consecutive neutral-site contests while going 15-0 against teams from the Southeastern Conference. Alabama has outscored its opponents by 578 points (860-282; 37.4-12.3), an average of 25.1 points per game, during the streak.

**SABAN'S 47TH GAME AS AP No. 1 AT ALABAMA:** Saturday's game against Auburn will be Nick Saban's 47th career game coaching Alabama as the Associated Press No. 1 team, the most games coached as No 1 at one school. At 41-5 (.891), Saban has won more games coaching a No. 1 team at one school than any other coach in college football history. Woody Hayes and Bobby Bowden are tied for second with 40 wins each. Bowden was 40-5 at Florida State as No. 1 and Hayes went 40-4-1 with Ohio State. Saban accomplished the feat in his 10th season at Alabama while Bowden spent 34 seasons at FSU and Hayes was at OSU for 28. The Crimson Tide have been ranked No. 1 in 34 percent of its 134 games under Saban. Florida State was No. 1 in 10.8 percent of Bowden's 417 games and Ohio State was No. 1 in 16.7 percent of the 276 games coached by Hayes.

**ALABAMA AS THE NATION'S NO. 1:** The University of Alabama has played 70 games as the nation's top-ranked team since the inception of the Associated Press poll in 1936. In those games the Crimson Tide boasts a 60-10 (.857) record. Those numbers get even more impressive when you look at the 10 seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban (2007-present). Since the ninth game of the 2008 season (112 games), Alabama has played 46 games while being ranked No. 1, posting a 41-5 (.891) record during that span.

**SEC WESTERN DIVISION TITLE:** Alabama's 51-3 win over Mississippi State coupled with Auburn's 13-7 loss at Georgia on Nov. 12, clinched Alabama's 12th SEC Western Division title. The Crimson Tide will represent the Western Division against SEC Eastern Division champion Florida in the SEC Championship Game to be played Saturday, Dec. 3, at The Georgia Dome in Atlanta. Alabama will be making its 11th appearance in the SEC Championship game with the Crimson Tide holding a record of 6-4 in 10 previous appearances.

**10-WIN SEASONS:** With the 51-3 victory over Mississippi State on Nov. 12, Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for the ninth consecutive season. The nine straight years with 10 wins extends the school record. The previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 121 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 36 times, equaling Oklahoma for the most 10-win seasons in college football history. Alabama has produced 11 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2016). Bryant had a school-record 13 10-win seasons at Alabama, while Saban is second with nine.

**FOUR STRAIGHT VS. RANKED TEAMS:** Alabama became just the third top-ranked team in the poll era to win four straight games against ranked opponents when they knocked off No. 15 LSU on Nov. 5. The Tide knocked off No. 16 Arkansas (49-30), No. 9 Tennessee (49-10), No. 6 Texas A&M (33-14) and the Tigers (10-0). In 1943, No. 1 Notre Dame played ranked opponents in four straight games and beat them all. In 2001, No. 1 Miami had a four-game winning streak against ranked opponents over a five-week span that included an open date.

**FACING OFF WITH THE BEST:** The Crimson Tide has the fourth-toughest schedule in college football this season per ESPN.com's preseason College Football Power Index, trailing only Southern California, Ole Miss and Florida State. Alabama will, by season's end, face off with nine teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago and will have met four teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25.

**BEATING THE BEST:** The Crimson Tide is 45-12 (.789) against the Associated Press top 25, including a 24-6 (.800) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. This season, the Tide has faced six teams ranked in the AP poll, defeating then-No. 20 USC, 52-6, then-No. 19 Ole Miss, 48-43, then-No. 16 Arkansas, 49-30, then-No. 9 Tennessee, 49-10, then-No. 6 Texas A&M, 33-14 and, most recently, then-No. 15 LSU, 10-0, by an average score of 40.1-17.2. Alabama is scheduled for two more matchups against a team currently in the top 25 (No. 16 Auburn and No. 13 Florida in the SEC Championship Game). Alabama finished 8-1 in 2015 against the AP Top 25 after going 5-2 in 2014, 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 in 2010.

**SCORING SUCCESS:** Alabama leads the SEC in scoring offense (40.3 points per game) and scoring defense (11.4 ppg). Nationally, the Tide ranks 14th in scoring offense and second in scoring defense.

**ALWAYS IN THE HUNT:** Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in only three regular season games that did not have national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU in 2010, Alabama was essentially eliminated from a chance to remain in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without national championship implications during this span.

**13 STRAIGHT VS. RANKED TEAMS:** Alabama has won 13 straight games vs. ranked opponents, the longest streak since Southern California won 16 straight from 2002-05 under Pete Carroll and the third-longest run all-time. The streak began at Georgia (Oct. 3) last season with a 38-10 win over the No. 8 Bulldogs in Athens. In those 13 games, the Tide is 7-0 against top-10 teams and 3-0 vs. the top five (LSU, Michigan State and Clemson). The Tide's last loss to a top-25 team was Sept. 19, 2015, against Ole Miss (37-43).

**ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008:** Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 109 games, the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015. Boise State is second with 100 wins.

**THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM:** Alabama has won 26 of the last 27 games at its home stadium. Prior to the Sept. 19, 2015, loss to Ole Miss, the Crimson Tide had not lost a game at home since falling to Texas A&M in 2012. Alabama boasts the fifth-best all-time home winning percentage in the FBS at .822 (251-53-3) at Bryant-Denny Stadium since the stadium opened in 1929. Houston's TDECU Stadium, which opened in 2014, is the leader an .857 percentage (18-3). while Marshall's Joan C. Edwards Stadium (1991) is second with an .839 percentage (151-29). Georgia Southern's Paulson Stadium, which opened in 1984 is third at .837 (185-36), while Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (1970) is fourth with an .827 (254-53) mark, just ahead of Alabama.

**NON-OFFENSIVE WINS:** Alabama's defense and special teams has outscored the Crimson Tide's opponent in four games this season. In the season opener, Marlon Humphrey's 18-yard interception return accounted for seven of the Tide's 52 points, while the Trojans managed two field goals. Against Kent State, Xavian Marks' 75-yard punt return for a touchdown was the difference in Alabama's shutout victory. The defense once again proved to be enough against Kentucky with Ronnie Harrison's 55-yard fumble return going for seven points in a 34-6 win over the Wildcats. Defense and special teams provided two touchdowns in a 49-10 win over Tennessee on Oct. 15.

**ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL**

Alabama has been ranked in 755 of the 1,117 *Associated Press* college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 464-127-8 (.781) all-time record in games when ranked in the *Associated Press* college football poll, including a 106-15 (.876) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 142nd consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started five seasons at No. 1 (2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

## ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. *USA TODAY* has administered the poll for the past 26 seasons (1991-2016), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012 and 2015 seasons, while beginning at No. 1 in 2016. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and five *USA TODAY* (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2015) coaches poll national titles.

**NON-OFFENSIVE TDs IN THE SABAN ERA:** Jonathan Allen's 30-yard fumble return vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22 marked the 56th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era and the 12th for the Crimson Tide this season, extending the Crimson Tide's single-season record under Saban. Alabama scored at least one touchdown on defense or special teams in the first eight games this season, including multiple non-offensive scores in the first three SEC road contests this season (Ole Miss, Arkansas and Tennessee). Alabama scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating back to the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, and had 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return. The streak was snapped in the Tide's 10-0 win over LSU on Nov. 5.

**TIDE LEADS THE NATION IN NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** Alabama's 12 non-offensive touchdowns in 2016 tops the Football Bowl Subdivision. Ohio State and Houston have six, Akron has five and Michigan and Pittsburgh have four non-offensive scores. The Crimson Tide scored at least one non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015 through the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016, and has tallied 22 non-offensive TDs in its last 21 games dating back to the Georgia game on Oct. 3, 2015.

**NFL DRAFT:** The Crimson Tide saw seven former Alabama players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Ryan Kelly who went 18th overall to the Indianapolis Colts. Linebacker Reggie Ragland was the next to go (41st, Buffalo Bills) followed by Derrick Henry (45th, Tennessee Titans), A'Shawn Robinson (46th, Detroit Lions), Jarran Reed (49th, Seattle Seahawks) and Cyrus Jones (60th, New England Patriots), all in the second round. Running back Kenyan Drake rounded out the 2016 NFL Draft class when he was chosen by the Miami Dolphins at 73rd overall in the third round.

**LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL:** Alabama has had more draft picks over the last six drafts (44) than any other college in the nation. Fifteen of those picks have been first-round selections and 25 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 44 features four Super Bowl Champions, seven Pro Bowl selections, one All-Pro and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

**FITZPATRICK, HOLCOMBE EARN CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS:**

Alabama defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick and linebacker Keith Holcombe were voted to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team on Nov. 3. The honor is the first for both and the 11th and 12th for Alabama since 2009. Fitzpatrick carries a 3.34 grade point average in Human Performance/Exercise Science as well. Holcombe is also majoring in Human Performance/Exercise Science and has a GPA of 3.69. Fitzpatrick and Holcombe now advance to the national ballot with a chance to be voted to the Academic All-America Team later this season. Alabama has earned Academic All-America honors seven times under head coach Nick Saban, the most notable being Barrett Jones, who was the first four-time honoree in CoSIDA Academic All-America history.

**ALABAMA DEGREES:** Alabama's success on the field over the past nine seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. **The 2016 squad features 10 players who already have degrees in hand going into the season opener with USC.** Over the previous eight seasons (2008-15) Alabama saw **94 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate)** by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive **11 players earn a master's degree** before stepping foot on the field. In 2015, the Crimson Tide led all bowl teams with a total of 29 players who earned their degrees prior to the start of postseason play. Three of the 29 earned their master's degrees during the 2015 season.

**GRADUATING WITH THE BEST:** The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide ranks fourth among Associated Press Preseason Top 25 teams for its graduation rate of 86 percent. Ahead of Alabama are only Stanford (99 percent) and Notre Dame (93 percent) and UCLA (89 percent). Alabama's percentage was the Southeastern Conference's highest graduation success rate (GSR) of all 14 SEC football programs.

**ACADEMIC PROWESS:** The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under head coach Nick Saban.

- A total of nine Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with USC.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 86 this year, the highest across all 14 SEC football programs.
- In 2015, for the third consecutive year, Alabama football led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play (29 in 2015, 22 in 2014; 28 in 2013).
- Alabama's last four national title football teams (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015) included 89 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2015-16, Alabama tied for the lead in the in number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

**CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY:** Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered their time across numerous areas last season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

#### **HOWARD A FINALIST FOR THE SENIOR CLASS AWARD:**

Alabama tight end O.J. Howard was selected as one of 10 finalists for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award, it was announced on Nov. 3. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Finalists were chosen by a selection committee from the list of 30 candidates announced in September. Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winner, and fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website through December 12. Fan votes will be combined with media and Division I head coaches' votes to determine the winner. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the football bowl season in early January.

**HOWARD NOMINATED FOR WUERFFEL TROPHY:** Alabama tight end O.J. Howard has been nominated for the 2016 Wuerffel Trophy. Howard completed his undergraduate degree in May 2016 and is pursuing a masters degree in sports business management. Howard, a 2016 Allstate/AFCA Good Works Team nominee, volunteers his time as a regular visitor to children's hospitals in Birmingham, with Habitat for Humanity and has been a regular visiting the VA hospital while with the Crimson Tide. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy Winner, Danny Wuerffel, the trophy is presented in Fort Walton Beach, Fla., annually to the college football player that best combines exemplary community service with academic and athletic achievement. Former Alabama offensive lineman Barrett Jones is among the past recipients of the award. Jones was honored following the 2010 season.

**ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE:** The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 10 national championships in five different sports and 22 SEC championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2015-16 academic year - football and women's golf.
- The overall cumulative grade-point average of Alabama student-athletes in 2015-16 was 3.16.
- Twelve Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2015-16
- Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition 350 times during the 2015-16 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 82, 59 and 126 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 83 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 113 Academic All-America honorees, which ranks third nationally over that span behind only Nebraska (136) and Notre Dame (125). Alabama passed Stanford (106) and Penn State (99) round out the top five.
- Since 2010, Alabama leads all NCAA Division I schools with 65 Academic All-America honors. Stanford is second over that span with 62, while Nebraska is third at 53.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**FOSTER A FINALIST FOR THE BUTKUS AWARD:** Alabama senior linebacker Reuben Foster was selected as one of five finalists for the 2016 Butkus Award, the Dick Butkus Foundation announced on Nov. 21. The Butkus Award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker. The signal-caller of the Crimson Tide linebacking corps, Foster has put together an impressive senior campaign, helping to lead one of the nation's top-ranked defenses. He has collected a team-high 75 tackles while adding 9.0 tackles for loss (-39 yards) and two sacks (-18 yards). The Auburn, Ala., native has totaled three quarterback hurries and a pair of pass breakups for the season.

**ALLEN AND FOSTER FINALISTS FOR THE NAGURSKI AWARD:** Alabama seniors Jonathan Allen and Reuben Foster were selected to a list of five finalists for the 2016 Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) and Charlotte Touchdown Club announced Nov. 17. The Nagurski Trophy is presented annually to the National Defensive Player of the Year. Allen has a team-high 13 quarterback hurries to go with his 46 tackles, seven of which are sacks (-55 yards), which ranks second on the team. He has returned a team-leading two fumble recoveries for 105 combined yards and two touchdowns. His 25 career sacks places him second on the Tide's all-time list behind former Crimson Tide standout and NFL Hall of Famer Derrick Thomas. Foster has been the Crimson Tide's heartbeat of the defense with a team-high 75 tackles. As the main signal caller for one of the nation's top-ranked units, the senior has led the team in tackles in six of the Crimson Tide's 11 games this season and has helped the Alabama defensive unit limit opponents to only 11.4 points per game on the season. This year's winner will be announced on Dec. 5.

**ALLEN A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE WALTER CAMP AND MAXWELL PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARDS:** Defensive lineman Jonathan Allen was selected to a list of 15 semifinalists for the 2016 Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and one of 18 semifinalists for the Maxwell Award. Allen is joined on both lists by teammate Jalen Hurts. Both awards honor the player of the year in college football. Former Alabama running back Derrick Henry was the 2015 Walter Camp winner. Maxwell finalists will be announced on Nov. 21. Walter Camp finalists will be announced on Wednesday, November 30.

**ALLEN AND FOSTER NAMED TO SEMIFINALIST LIST FOR THE BEDNARIK AWARD:** Jonathan Allen and Reuben Foster were named to the list of 18 semifinalists for the Bednarik Award, given annually to college football's defensive player of the year. Finalists for the Bednarik Award will be announced on Nov. 21.

**FITZPATRICK A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE JIM THORPE AWARD:** Sophomore defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick was named to the list of 16 semifinalists for the prestigious Jim Thorpe Award, the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame announced Oct. 24. The Jim Thorpe Award is presented annually to the nation's top defensive back. Fitzpatrick is in the midst of a breakout season in 2016, as he leads the Crimson Tide in interceptions (4), ranks second in pass breakups (6) and leads the secondary in sacks (1.5) and tackles for loss (4.0). He has three career interception returns for touchdowns, tying him for the Alabama career lead. Through 11 games this season, Fitzpatrick has recorded 48 tackles, three tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, four interceptions, six pass breakups and one forced fumble.



**207:54:** After the win over Chattanooga, the Alabama defense has not surrendered a touchdown in the last 207 minutes and 54 seconds of game action, dating back to the third quarter of the Texas A&M game (October 22) when the Aggies' Christian Kirk caught a 25-yard touchdown pass. The Crimson Tide blanked the Aggies over the final 27:54 of that game and then shut out No. 15 LSU, 10-0, in Baton Rouge the following week. The Tide then limited Mississippi State to a field goal on Nov. 12 in a 51-3 victory and defeated Chattanooga, 31-3, on Nov. 19. Alabama ranks No. 2 nationally in scoring defense, surrendering just 11.4 points per game.

**TIDE LEADS NATION IN DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:**

Jonathan Allen's 30-yard fumble return vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22 was Alabama's FBS-best ninth defensive touchdowns this season. Ohio State has scored six times on defense while Houston and Wyoming have scored five times defensively this season. Alabama has now scored nine touchdowns on 18 forced turnovers this season (four of 10 interceptions, five of eight fumbles).

**GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK:** Alabama's 40 sacks through the first 11 games (3.64 per game) of the season ranks second nationally. Tim Williams leads the way and ranks sixth in the SEC with 8.0 sacks with Jonathan Allen and Ryan Anderson close behind with 7.0 and 6.5, respectively. The Crimson Tide's 40 sacks already ranks tied for seventh in school history. Alabama finished with 53 sacks in 15 games (3.53) in 2015, the most by a Nick Saban-coached team at Alabama.

**10 POINTS OR FEWER:** Alabama's 31-3 win over Chattanooga marked the 65th time the Crimson Tide has held an opponent to 10 points or fewer under head coach Nick Saban since the start of the 2007 season and the eighth time in 2016. In 2015, Alabama held six opponents to 10 points or less and recorded two shutouts. In 2014, Alabama shut out two opponents and held seven opponents to two touchdowns or less. Alabama held nine of 13 opponents to 10 points or less in 2013 with three shutouts. Seven opponents were limited to 10 points or less in 2012, four of which were shutouts. Alabama was successful in holding opponents to single digits in nine games in 2011 and eight times in 2010. Alabama kept opponents within that range seven times in both 2008 and 2009 and in 2007 did it twice. Alabama has shut out the opposition 19 times during the Saban era.

**HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE:** Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense has surrendered only 154 touchdowns over the last 105 games. That is 42 fewer than the second most in the nation (Florida with 196).

**POINTS HARD TO FIND:** Through 11 games in 2016, the Alabama defense has surrendered only 125 points (11.4 ppg) to rank second nationally and first in the SEC in scoring defense. The Tide has held eight of its 11 opponents — USC (52-6), Western Kentucky (38-10), Kent State (48-0), Kentucky (34-6), Tennessee (49-10), LSU (10-0) and Mississippi State (51-3), Chattanooga (31-3) — to 10 points or less this season and has allowed only six red zone touchdowns in 17 trips inside the 20 by opponents.

**NO GO IN THE RED ZONE:** Alabama only ranks 55th nationally in red zone defense, having surrendered 14 scores in 17 opponent trips inside the 20-yard line. But a closer look at the numbers reveals how dominant the Crimson Tide defense has been once an opposing offense reaches the Tide 20. Of the 14 opponent scores in 11 games, only six have been touchdowns, the fewest in the country.

**HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200:** During head coach Nick Saban's last 121 games at the Capstone (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to fewer than 200 yards of total offense 42 times, the most recent being Chattanooga (184) on Nov. 19. The Tide has also held USC (194), Kent State (166), Kentucky (161), Tennessee (163) and LSU (125) below the 200-yard mark this season. Alabama's best performance under Saban came in 2009 when the Tide held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense.

**HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300:** In head coach Nick Saban's tenure at Alabama, the Tide has limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 85 times, or 63.4 percent of the time. UA opened the 2016 season by limiting USC to just 194 yards in the Tide's 52-6 victory and followed that up by holding Western Kentucky to 239 yards on Sept. 10. Alabama held Kent State to 166 yards on Sept. 24, Kentucky to 161 on Oct. 1, Tennessee to 163 yards on Oct. 15, Texas A&M to 278 yards on Oct. 22, LSU to 125 on Nov. 5, Mississippi State to 274 yards on Nov. 12 and, most recently, Chattanooga to 184 yards on Nov. 19.

**TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND:** Alabama has allowed only three rushing touchdowns so far this season. In 2015, the Crimson Tide allowed just seven rushing touchdowns in 15 games, second-lowest total in the country. The Tide leads the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 81. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 64 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 98 since 2007.

**RUSHING DEFENSE:** Alabama has surrendered only 16 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the lowest in the nation. Alabama has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in the past 19 games (Nick Chubb, UGA). Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 11 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Chubb (146 on Oct. 3, 2015), Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss' BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

**DEFENSE STYMIES LSU:** Alabama posted its second shutout of the season in a 10-0 win over LSU on Nov. 5. The Tide defense limited the Tigers to just 125 total yards on 51 plays, an average of 2.5 yards per play. A closer look at the box score shows just how dominant the defensive performance was. Of LSU's 125 yards, 41 came on one pass play in the Tigers' second drive of the evening. LSU averaged 1.7 yards per play on its other 50 snaps and had only 25 yards of offense in the game's second half.

**OVERWHELMING DEFENSE VS. KENT STATE:** Alabama posted its first shutout of the season in a 48-0 win over Kent State on Sept. 24, but the true domination is found with a closer look at the box score. Alabama's first-team defense limited Kent to just 61 total yards on 27 plays before heading to the bench after the first drive of the second half. The more amazing part was the Tide surrendered a 47-yard run on the first play of the game and then allowed just 14 yards to KSU on the next 26 plays (0.54 yards per play).

**THREE NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS EQUALS RECORD:** Alabama's three non-offensive touchdowns at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 marked the third time in the last four seasons the Crimson Tide defense and special teams have found the end zone three times in the same game. The Tide took three interceptions back for scores against Texas A&M in 2015 and had punt, interception and kickoff returns against Virginia Tech in 2013. Prior to 2013, the last time the Crimson Tide had scored three non-offensive touchdowns in a game was Sept. 30, 1995, against Georgia.

**ALLEN & WILLIAMS MOVING UP CAREER SACK LIST:** Jonathan Allen's first quarter sack vs. LSU on Nov. 5 gave him seven sacks in 2016 and moved the senior into a tie for second place on the Alabama career sack list with 25 with Kindal Moorehead (1998-2002). Tim Williams' team-high eight sacks this season give him 20 for his career which ranks eighth all time in Alabama history. The Crimson Tide's all-time leader for career sacks is Derrick Thomas (1985-88) with 52.0.

**ALLEN, ANDERSON AMONG UA CAREER TACKLES FOR LOSS LEADERS:** Jonathan Allen enters this Saturday's meeting with Auburn in eighth place on the Alabama career tackles for loss list with 36.5 for a loss of 202 yards. E.J. Junior (1977-80) and Jarrett Johnson (1999-2002) are tied for seventh at 39.0. Derrick Thomas (1985-88) is the Alabama career leader with 68.0 TFLs. **FITZPATRICK LEADING THE SECONDARY:** Sophomore Minkah Fitzpatrick continued his breakout season against Chattanooga on Nov. 19. The Thorpe Award semifinalist recorded three tackles to up his season total to 48, good enough for fourth on the team. He leads the Tide in interceptions with four (including a school-record 100-yard return vs. Arkansas) and is second in pass breakups with six. He has also forced one fumble and recorded four tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

**HARRISON POSTS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES VS. CHATTANOOGA:** Sophomore defensive back Ronnie Harrison recorded a career-high 11 tackles vs. Chattanooga on Nov. 19. Harrison made eight solo stops, along with three assists, to lead the Tide in tackles in the 31-3 win over the Mocs. The Tallahassee, Fla., native is second on the team - and leads the secondary - in tackles this season with 60 along with 1.5 tackles for loss, two interceptions, five pass breakups, two quarterback hurries, two fumble recoveries and a blocked kick. Harrison also has two of Alabama's nation-leading 12 non-offensive touchdowns this season. He returned a fumble 55 yards for a touchdown vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1 and also scored on a 58-yard interception return at Tennessee on Oct. 15.

**BACK-TO-BACK CAREER GAMES FOR FOSTER:** Against Texas A&M on Oct. 22, linebacker Reuben Foster equaled his career high with 12 tackles. He then followed it up with 11 stops in a shutout win over LSU that included half a sack and 1.5 tackles for loss. Foster previously had 12 stops at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 to give him three double-digit tackle games this season. The senior leads the Tide in total tackles (75), solo tackles (40) and assists (35) this season to go with 9.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and four quarterback hurries and two pass breakups. For his career, Foster has notched 182 tackles, 103 solo stops and 20.0 tackles for loss.

**FITZPATRICK'S RECORD RETURN AT ARKANSAS:** Sophomore Minkah Fitzpatrick's 100-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 is the longest in school history, breaking the previous record of 98 yards set by Mark McMillan vs. Chattanooga on Oct. 5, 1991. The score also gives Fitzpatrick three career interception returns for touchdowns, tying him for the Alabama career lead with Antonio Langham (1990-93), C.J. Mosley (2010-13) and current teammate Eddie Jackson (2013-present).

**HAMILTON'S CAREER NIGHT VS. ARKANSAS:** Linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton established a new career high for tackles with nine stops against Arkansas on Oct. 8. The junior also added a sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and forced a fumble in the 49-30 win over the Razorbacks. Hamilton ranks third on the team in tackles with 55 and has 8.5 tackles for loss of 32 yards and two sacks (-17 yards).

**ANDERSON SETS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES:** Ryan Anderson's nine tackles vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 are a new career high. His previous career high was six, set against Texas A&M in 2014. Anderson has 41 tackles this season along with a team-high 14.5 tackles for loss (-77 yards), 6.5 sacks, eight quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery, three forced fumbles and two pass breakup. His numbers this season continues his hot streak that ended the 2015 season. In the final six games of the 2015 campaign, Anderson recorded eight tackles for loss and six sacks. Twelve of his career 17 sacks and 22.5 of his 35.5 career tackles for loss have come in his last 17 games played. In his time at Alabama, the redshirt senior has accumulated 35.5 tackles for a loss of 168 yards and added 17 sacks for -125 yards.

**JACKSON EQUALS UA CAREER INTERCEPTION RETURNS FOR TOUCHDOWNS RECORD:** Senior Eddie Jackson tied the Alabama career record for interception returns for touchdowns with his 55-yard return against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Jackson has three touchdowns on interceptions in his career, equaling the record held by Antonio Langham (1990-93), C.J. Mosley (2010-13) and Minkah Fitzpatrick (2015-present). Jackson had two returns for touchdowns in 2015 - a 50-yard score against Georgia on Oct. 3 and a 93-yard return against Texas A&M on Oct. 17. The return against the Aggies is the fourth-longest interception return for a touchdown in Alabama history.

**BACK-TO-BACK GAMES WITH INTERCEPTIONS FOR TOUCHDOWNS:** Ronnie Harrison's 58-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Tennessee on Oct. 15 and Minkah Fitzpatrick's school record 100-yard interception return for a score vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 marks the second time this season the Tide has returned interceptions for scores in consecutive games. On Sept. 10, Eddie Jackson found the end zone on a 55-yard return against Western Kentucky and Marlon Humphrey returned a pick 18 yards for a touchdown against USC on Sept. 3. Prior to 2016, the most-recent instance of back-to-back games with interceptions for touchdowns was in 2008 when Rashad Johnson returned interceptions for scores against Arkansas State and LSU on Nov. 1 and Nov. 8.

**DEFENSE EARNS WALTER CAMP DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR LSU PERFORMANCE:** Alabama's defense was named as the Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week following the Crimson Tide's 10-0 shutout victory over LSU in Baton Rouge. The Tide defensive unit was the second team to earn the weekly individual award since 2004. Alabama's defense stifled the LSU offense, limiting the Tigers to only six first downs and 125 yards of total offense in the shutout victory in Baton Rouge. The Tide defense recorded five sacks and limited a 15th-ranked LSU team to just 33 rushing yards on 27 total attempts. Alabama allowed a 41-yard pass on the Tigers' second offensive drive of the night, but did not allow a play beyond 13 yards the rest of the evening. Alabama also kept the Tigers out of the red zone all night.

**ANDERSON NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Alabama senior linebacker Ryan Anderson was named the Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in the Tide's 10-0 shutout of LSU in Baton Rouge on Nov. 5. Anderson finished his night in Baton Rouge with six total tackles, including one sack (-4 yards), one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry. The senior linebacker played a key role on the Crimson Tide defense that limited LSU to only 125 total yards and just 1.2 yards per carry on the ground and 3.8 yards per attempt. Alabama forced a 3-and-out on nine of the Tigers' 12 possessions and did not allow LSU to reach the end zone all evening.

**ALLEN EARNS MULTIPLE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS FOR PERFORMANCE VS. TEXAS A&M:** Senior defensive end Jonathan Allen was named the SEC & FWAA/Nagurski Defensive Player of the Week and the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week following his performance against Texas A&M on Oct. 22. Allen finished the matchup against the Aggies with one sack for a loss of eight yards, along with a career-high four quarterback hurries. He totaled six tackles on the day, three of which were solo stops, and added his second defensive score of the season. Allen picked up an Aggie fumble and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter to put the Tide in front by two scores.

**FITZPATRICK GARNERS FOUR DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS AFTER ARKANSAS PERFORMANCE:** Defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick was named the SEC, Bednarik Award and Walter Camp FBS Defensive Player of the Week and Thorpe Award Player of the Week for his performance at Arkansas on Oct. 8. Fitzpatrick set a career high with three interceptions, returning one 100 yards for a touchdown, and recorded five tackles and two pass breakups in the Tide's 49-30 win. His three interception returns for touchdowns ties him for the Alabama career record with Antonio Langham (1990-93), C.J. Mosley (2010-13) and current teammate Eddie Jackson (2013-Present).

**ALLEN NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR USC PERFORMANCE:** Senior defensive end Jonathan Allen was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance against USC on Sept. 3. Allen led an Alabama defense that limited No. 20 USC to just 194 yards of offense and six points in the Crimson Tide's 52-6 win. The senior leader recorded a team-high two sacks for a loss of 15 yards along with four solo tackles and two pass breakups and was a disruptive force throughout the game.

**VETERAN DEFENSE:** The 2016 Alabama defense includes five starters from a season ago. Those five returned 245 total tackles, 32 tackles for loss and 16 sacks to this year's team. Of those returning starters, three come from the Tide secondary, including senior Eddie Jackson, who recorded 46 tackles, three tackles for loss and six interceptions entering the season. Jackson set a school record with 230 return yards on his interceptions and took two back for touchdowns a year ago. Senior linebacker Reuben Foster leads all returnees with 73 total tackles. Returning senior defensive lineman Jonathan Allen was the team leader in tackles for loss (14.5) and sacks (12.0) in 2015.

## OFFENSIVE NOTES

**HURTS A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE WALTER CAMP, MAXWELL AND DAVEY O'BRIEN AWARDS:** Freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts has been named one of 18 semifinalists for the Maxwell Award, one of 18 semifinalists for the Davey O'Brien Award and one of 15 semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award. The Maxwell and Walter Camp awards are presented each season to college football's player of the year while the O'Brien recognizes college football's top quarterback. Hurts is joined on the Maxwell and Walter Camp lists by teammate Jonathan Allen. Hurts has excelled at quarterback since taking over the full-time starter duties in week two. The freshman signal-caller has thrown for 2,168 yards and 19 touchdowns through the air while adding 803 yards rushing and 11 scores on the ground. He has completed 64.8 percent of his passes and boasts a 146.91 efficiency rating to rank fourth in the SEC. Hurts' 276.7 yards per game of total offense leads all freshmen in the SEC and also sets him at sixth among all conference players. Finalists for the Maxwell Award will be announced on Nov. 21. O'Brien finalists will be announced on Nov. 22. Walter Camp finalists will be announced Nov. 30.

**HOWARD A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE JOHN MACKAY AWARD:** Senior tight end O.J. Howard has been named one of eight semifinalists for the John Mackey Award, the Friends of John Mackey announced Nov. 14. The Mackey Award is presented annually to the top tight end in college football. Howard has put together a standout senior season, catching 30 passes for 359 yards to average 12.0 yards per catch while adding two touchdowns. He has at least one catch in every game this year and has improved as the season wears on, recording 16 catches for 150 yards and a touchdown across his last four contests. Howard has also improved on his blocking this season, helping the Crimson Tide rushers accumulate 2,748 yards through 11 games to average 249.8 yards per game on the ground. Mackey Award finalists will be announced on Nov. 22.

**ROBINSON A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE OUTLAND AWARD:** Junior left tackle Cam Robinson was selected as one of five semifinalists for the Outland Trophy, the Greater Omaha Sports Commission announced on Nov. 16. Robinson, who has started every game at left tackle since stepping foot on campus three years ago, anchors the Crimson Tide offensive line. His play has helped the Alabama offense rank 14th nationally and first in the Southeastern Conference in scoring offense at 41.2 points per game. The Monroe, La., native has blocked for 10 100-yard rushing games this season and 27 100-yard rushers during his three year career. This season, he has recorded 22 knockdown blocks in 11 games while protecting Alabama quarterbacks from some of the top edge pass rushers in the nation.

**FIRST-YEAR QUARTERBACKS:** Alabama opened the 2016 season with a new starting quarterback for the fifth time under head coach Nick Saban and has played two first-year starters so far this season. Blake Barnett took the game's opening snap for the Crimson Tide against USC on Sept. 3 and Jalen Hurts has been under center for the first snap in every game since. Since 2009, Alabama's rookie signal callers have posted a record of 64-4 (.941) and won three national championships.

**TIDE TOPS SEC IN SCORING:** Through 11 games in 2016, Alabama leads the SEC in scoring, averaging 40.3 points per game. The Tide has scored 57 touchdowns, converted 15 field goals and 56-of-56 on PAT kicks (0-for-1 on two-point conversions) for 443 points. Alabama's 57 touchdowns also leads the conference — three more than second-place Tennessee. Nationally, Alabama ranks 14th in the FBS in scoring.

**RUSHING DIFFERENTIAL:** Alabama has outrushed its opponents 2,748 to 758 through the first 11 games of the season, an average of 249.8 yards per game to 68.9 yards per game. That number gets even better in SEC games, with the Tide averaging 271.6 yards per game to just 74.1 of its opponents. Alabama has rushed for 23 touchdowns this season, compared to just three for its opposition.

**SCORING STREAK CONTINUES:** Alabama's school record consecutive games scoring streak was extended to 209 games with Jalen Hurts' 47-yard first quarter touchdown pass to Calvin Ridley vs. Chattanooga on Nov. 19. Alabama was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000.

**RUSHING TO SUCCESS:** Alabama is 88-4 (.957) since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, at Ole Miss and vs. Ohio State in 2014, and against Ole Miss in 2015. The Crimson Tide rushed for 140 yards or more 10 times in 2015 and has done so nine times this season.

**BALL PROTECTION:** In its past 120 games dating back to a win over Tulane on Sept. 6, 2008, Alabama has turned the ball over only 144 times (80 fumbles, 64 interceptions) for 1.20 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 125 times in 105 games (1.19/game). Since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively low 51 interceptions in 2,802 attempts (1 INT every 54.9 attempts). Dating back to the 2009 season, the top two running backs in the rotation have lost a fumble only 21 times. Over that 120 game span, the top two running backs have recorded 3,053 touches, losing a fumble once every 145.3 touches.

**OFFENSE PRODUCES FOUR TOP-FIVE MARKS VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE:** Alabama's offensive performance vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 ranks among the best single-game outings in school history. The Tide's 397 passing yards and 31 completions both rank as the fifth-best in UA history in their respective categories. The five touchdown passes thrown ties for the second-most all-time behind the seven thrown by the Tide vs. Southern Miss in 1950. The 615 yards in total offense ties for 11th in Alabama history.

**FIRST QUARTER SCORING AFTER LSU:** Jalen Hurts' four-yard touchdown pass to Calvin Ridley in the first quarter vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 marked the first time Alabama has scored an opening-quarter touchdown in the game following the LSU contest since 2001, when Santonio Beard scored on a six-yard run with 7:51 to go in the quarter.

**HIGH-SCORING HALF VS. KENT STATE:** Alabama's 41-point outburst in the first half against Kent State on Sept. 24 was a season high for Alabama in the opening two quarters and the most since tallying 49 against Charleston Southern on Nov. 21, 2015. The Tide had tallied 17 points in the first half in each of the first three games of the season. The 21 first-quarter points equals the previous season high for a quarter, set in the third quarter of the season opener with USC.

**ALABAMA DEEP AT WIDEOUT:** The Alabama receiving corps boasts one of the deepest and most talented groups in the nation. The Crimson Tide have four receivers (WR/TE) with at least 1,000 career receiving yards and 75 career receptions. Sophomore Calvin Ridley has 146 career grabs for 1,685 yards (11.5 ypc) and 14 touchdowns. Redshirt junior ArDarius Stewart has 114 career catches for 1,532 yards and 11 scores while tight end O.J. Howard has 99 catches for 1,490 yards (15.1 ypc) and six scores. Graduate transfer Gehrige Dieter has 1,680 career receiving yards and 12 touchdowns on 141 receptions combined between Bowling Green and Alabama. He has 12 catches for 186 yards with the Crimson Tide and had 129 catches for 1,494 yards for the Falcons.

**HURTS SETS QB RUSHING RECORD:** Quarterback Jalen Hurts' 68-yard rushing performance vs. Chattanooga on Nov. 19 moved the freshman into first place on the Alabama single-season quarterback rushing list with 803 yards. The previous record was 791 yards by Steadman Shealy in the Crimson Tide's 1979 national championship season. Hurts' rushing total is the most for an Alabama quarterback under Nick Saban. The previous high was 350 yards by Blake Sims in 2014.

**HURTS MOVING UP SINGLE-SEASON TOTAL OFFENSE LIST:** Jalen Hurts' 204 yards in total offense vs. Chattanooga on Nov. 19 (136 passing/68 rushing) gives him 2,971 total yards this season (2,168 passing, 803 rushing), an average of 270.1 yards per game and the sixth-highest mark in school history. **HURTS THE FIRST MEMBER OF THE 300-100 CLUB:** Jalen Hurts' 347 yards passing/100 yards rushing performance vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 5 marked the first time in Alabama football history that a quarterback has passed for 300 yards and rushed for 100 yards in a single game. Through 11 games this season, the freshman quarterback is averaging 270.1 yards in total offense per game, the fourth-best average in the SEC.

**HURTS OVER 100 RUSHING AND PASSING AGAIN VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE:**

Jalen Hurts rushed (110) and passed (347) for more than 100 yards in a game for the fourth time this season vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12. Hurts also accomplished that feat at LSU on Nov. 5 (114 rushing/107 passing) at Tennessee on Oct. 15 (132/143) and at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 in his second college start (146/158). Prior to this season, the last Tide signal caller to rush for more than 100 yards in a game was Tyler Watts in 2001 (110 vs. Ole Miss on October 13, 2001). Hurts is also the only quarterback to throw and rush for 100 yards in a game under Nick Saban in his 21 years as a college head coach.

**HURTS POSTS THIRD-BEST TOTAL OFFENSE MARK IN UA HISTORY VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE:**

Jalen Hurts' 447 yards in total offense against Mississippi State on Nov. 12 is the third-highest single-game total in school history, trailing only Blake Sims (484 vs. Florida on Sept. 20, 2014) and Scott Hunter (457 vs. Auburn on Nov. 29, 1969).

**HURTS SETS NEW CAREER HIGHS THROUGH THE AIR:**

Jalen Hurts' 28 completions, 37 attempts, 347 yards and four touchdowns vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 are all new career highs. His previous single-game highs in completions, attempts and yards were set in a 23-of-36, 287-yard performance vs. Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Hurts had thrown two or more touchdowns in a game seven times this season. The 28 completions against Mississippi State ties for the fifth-most in school history.

**HURTS ONE SHY OF ALABAMA SINGLE-GAME TOUCHDOWN PASSES RECORD:**

Jalen Hurts' four touchdown passes vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 is one shy of the Alabama single-game record of five set by Gary Hollingsworth at Ole Miss on Oct. 7, 1969.

**HURTS EQUALS ALABAMA SINGLE-GAME TOUCHDOWN RESPONSIBILITY RECORD:**

With five touchdowns vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 (four passing, 1 rushing), quarterback Jalen Hurts equaled the Alabama single-game record in that category, which has been reached three times previously, most recently by Santonio Beard vs. Mississippi State on Oct. 12, 2002.

**STEWART EQUALS ALABAMA SINGLE-GAME TOUCHDOWN RECEPTION MARK:**

ArDarius Stewart's three touchdown receptions vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 equaled the Alabama single-game record, which has been reached six times previously, most recently by Amari Cooper vs. Auburn on Nov. 29, 2014.

**STEWART SETS NEW PERSONAL BEST FOR RECEIVING YARDS VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE:** In addition to establishing a new career best in touchdown catches, ArDarius Stewart's 156 yards receiving vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12 is a new single-game best for the redshirt junior. His previous yardage best was 120 yards vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 this season. His previous high in touchdowns was two vs. USC in the 2016 season opener. Stewart also had a career-long 71-yard reception against the Trojans. Stewart leads the team in receiving yards this season with 683 yards on 39 receptions (17.5 ypr) and in touchdown receptions with seven.

**HURTS SETS CAREER HIGH IN RUSHING TDS VS. VOLUNTEERS:** Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts established a new career high in rushing touchdowns with his three scores vs. Tennessee on Oct. 15. The freshman found the end zone on runs of 45, 2 and 1 yards against the Volunteers. Hurts previous career high was two rushing touchdowns set in his Alabama debut vs. USC on Sept. 3 and equaled on Oct. 8 at Arkansas.

**HURTS & SCARBROUGH ECLIPSE 100 ON THE GROUND AT TENNESSEE:** Quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for 132 yards and three touchdowns on 12 carries and running back Bo Scarbrough ran for 109 yards and a score on five carries in Alabama's win over Tennessee on Oct. 15, giving Alabama two 100-yard rushers in the same game for the 23rd time in Crimson Tide history and the second time this season. Hurts (146 yards) and Damien Harris (144) also topped the century mark at Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

**CAREER NIGHT FOR JACOBS AGAINST UK:** Freshman running back Josh Jacobs established new career highs in rushing attempts and yards with 16 carries and 100 yards rushing vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1. The yardage total also gave him his first 100-yard game at Alabama. Jacobs added three catches for 44 yards against the Wildcats to finish with 144 yards of total offense on 19 touches.

**RIDLEY'S CAREER NIGHT VS. KENTUCKY:** Calvin Ridley's 11 receptions and 174 yards vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1 established new career bests for the sophomore receiver. Ridley reached his previous high of nine catches twice, most recently against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Ridley's previous career high in yards was 140 vs. Arkansas last season. His two touchdowns against the Wildcats equaled his career best set against Michigan State in last season's CFP semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

**SIMS' CAREER DAY VS. KENT STATE:** Cam Sims' four catches and 54 yards against Kent State on Sept. 24 led all Tide receivers in the game and surpassed his previous career highs of three receptions (twice, last vs. Western Carolina in 2014) and 33 yards (vs. Western Carolina, 2014). Sims has five receptions for 66 yards in his three appearances this season, pushing his career totals to 18 catches for 174 yards, an average of 9.7 yards per reception.

**HURTS POSTS FIFTH-BEST QB RUSHING EFFORT AT OLE MISS:** Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts became the first Tide signal caller to rush for more than 100 yards since Tyler Watts in 2001 (110 vs. Ole Miss on October 13, 2001) in a win at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. Hurts accounted for 146 yards on the ground and threw for 158 more to accumulate 304 yards of total offense on the day. His rushing total ranks fifth in Alabama history for rushing yards by a quarterback.

**HARRIS & HURTS BOTH ECLIPSE 100 ON THE GROUND AT OLE MISS:** Running back Damien Harris rushed for a career-best 144 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries and quarterback Jalen Hurts ran for a team-high 146 yards on 18 carries in the win over Ole Miss on Sept. 17, giving Alabama two 100-yard rushers in the same game for the 18th time in Crimson Tide history. It also marked the first time a quarterback has figured into that achievement since Jeff Rutledge and running back Johnny Davis did so against Auburn in 1977.

**BIG DAY FOR HARRIS VS. OLE MISS:** Running back Damien Harris had a career day at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. The sophomore ran for 144 yards on 19 carries, a 9.0 average, and had a 67-yard run that set up Alabama's go-ahead touchdown. He improved as the game wore on. Harris went into halftime with six rushes for 29 yards and broke out in the second half with 10 rushes for 115 yards and a touchdown. Harris' numbers are even more impressive as the game goes along. He has averaged 9.4 yards per carry (31 rushes for 291 yards) in the third and fourth quarters this season.

**HURTS FIRST TRUE FRESHMAN TO START AT QB IN 32 YEARS:** With his start against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10, Alabama's Jalen Hurts became the first true freshman to start at quarterback for Alabama since Vince Sutton in 1984. Sutton's first start was against Southwestern Louisiana on Sept. 22 that season. He would go on to also start against Vanderbilt, Georgia, Penn State and Tennessee.

**HURTS SETS PASS YARDS RECORD FOR STARTING DEBUT & FRESHMAN:** In his first career start at quarterback for the Crimson Tide, true freshman Jalen Hurts completed 23-of-36 attempts for two touchdowns while passing for 287 yards without an interception against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. In addition to breaking the previous record for passing yards in a starting debut of 285 yards set by Brodie Croyle versus Arkansas on September 28, 2002, Hurts' performance also surpassed the previous Crimson Tide freshman passing yards mark of 167 yards set by Vince Sutton against Tennessee on October 20, 1984. Hurts connected on three passes of 40 yards or longer in the performance.

**HURTS SHOWS VERSATILITY IN FIRST GAME:** In his first game as a collegiate quarterback on Sept. 3 vs. USC, true freshman Jalen Hurts had a versatile performance that opened up the Crimson Tide offense after a sluggish start. Hurts entered the game on the Tide's third offensive possession and lost a fumble on his first play, but he quickly settled into the role and ignited the Tide offense through the air and on the ground. Hurts ended the night against the Trojans accounting for four touchdowns (two rushing, two passing), the first time a Tide player has had two TDs both passing and rushing since Tyler Watts in 2001. Hurts passed for 118 yards and two touchdowns with one interception while completing 6-of-11 pass attempts. He rushed for 32 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries. Hurts' longest pass completion was a 71-yard touchdown strike to ArDarius Stewart in the second quarter.

**HURTS EARNS THREE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS FOR MISSISSIPPI STATE PERFORMANCE:** Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts was named the Southeastern Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week as well as the Davey O'Brien and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose National Player of the Week for his efforts in the 51-3 win over Mississippi State on Nov. 12. Hurts accounted for 447 yards of total offense, throwing for a career-high 347 yards while adding 100 yards rushing to become the only quarterback in Alabama history to rush for 100-plus yards while passing for 300-plus yards. He accounted for five total touchdowns, throwing for four and rushing for one score, which tied the school record for total touchdowns in a game. The Mississippi State game marked Hurts' fourth time this season that the freshman quarterback has rushed for 100 or more yards while passing for at least 100 yards in the same contest. His 447 yards of total offense against the Bulldogs is the third-highest single-game total in school history, while his four touchdown passes was one shy of the Alabama single-game record of five set by Gary Hollingsworth at Ole Miss on Oct. 7, 1969.

**HURTS NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AT TENNESSEE:** Freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts was selected as the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week for his performances at then-No. 9 Tennessee on Oct. 15. Hurts excelled once again, accounting for 132 yards rushing and 143 yards through the air in Knoxville to earn freshman of the week honors. He rushed 12 times for 132 yards to average 11.0 yards per carry while totaling a career-high three rushing touchdowns. Hurts also added a 16-of-26 performance for 143 yards through the air to help the Tide finish off the Vols, 49-10.

**WILLIAMS EARNS SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS FOLLOWING TENNESSEE GAME:** Freshman offensive tackle Jonah Williams picked up SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors following the Tide's 49-10 win over then-No. 9 Tennessee. Williams shined once again at right tackle, helping clear a path for the Tide's 594 yards of total offense. The freshman posted a grade of 90 percent and did not allow a quarterback hurry or a sack while committing no penalties. He provided the time for Alabama to rush for a Saban-era high 438 yards on the ground with five rushing touchdowns. Williams' blocking helped quarterback Jalen Hurts (132) and running back Bo Scarbrough (109), eclipse the 100-yard rushing barrier. The Tide averaged 7.8 yards per play and 8.9 yards per rush.

**HURTS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK VS. ARKANSAS:** Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance at Arkansas. Hurts completed 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 20 yards and two scores on eight carries. The rushing, passing and touchdowns responsible for (4) equal his career high, which has been done on multiple occasions.

**JACOBS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK VS. KENTUCKY:** Alabama freshman running back Josh Jacobs was named SEC Freshman of the Week following his effort vs. Kentucky. Jacobs made his first career start against the Wildcats and posted career highs in carries (16) and rushing yards (100) to help lead the Tide to a 34-6 Homecoming victory. He is UA's second-leading rusher this season with 307 yards on 37 carries (51.2 ypg) with three TDs.

**HURTS NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AT OLE MISS:** Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Ole Miss on Sept. 17. Starting in his first SEC road game, the freshman signal-caller became the first Tide quarterback to rush for more than 100 yards since Tyler Watts in 2001 in the win over the Rebels. Hurts accounted for 146 yards on the ground and threw for 158 more to accumulate 304 yards of total offense on the day. Hurts' rushing total ranks fifth in Alabama history for rushing yards by a quarterback.

**WILLIAMS EARNS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK NOD FOR USC DEBUT:** Alabama freshman offensive lineman Jonah Williams was named SEC Freshman of the Week following his performance against USC on Sept. 3. Williams made his collegiate debut as Alabama's starting right tackle and was a vital component on a unit that rolled up 465 yards in total offense and averaged 5.4 yards per attempt on the ground. The Tide offensive line played a big part in career nights from running back Damien Harris and receiver ArDarius Stewart as Alabama topped the 50-point mark in a season opener for the first time since 2007.

**RIDLEY LED ALL SEC FRESHMAN RECEIVERS:** In 2015, Calvin Ridley broke the school and SEC single-season freshman record for receptions with 89. He finished with the second-highest catch total by a true freshman receiver in FBS history behind Antonio Brown's mark of 102 at Central Michigan in 2007. Ridley also set the Alabama single-season freshman receiving record for yards with 1,045, eclipsing the previous mark of 1,000 held by Amari Cooper (2012).

**SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES**

**SCOTT AMONG THE NATION'S BEST PUNTERS:** Through 11 games, punter JK Scott is averaging 48.5 yards per punt on 42 attempts which is second nationally and first in the SEC. Scott has forced 10 fair catches and dropped 17 punts inside the 20. He leads the nation with 23 of his 42 punts traveling more than 50 yards (54.8 percent), including six of 60 yards or more, which is second nationally. His season-long boot of 66 yards was at LSU, with two traveling 63 yards at Ole Miss and Arkansas. He also had a 60-yarder vs. Texas A&M. He has placed 65 punts inside the 20 and booted 59 punts of 50 yards or more in 36 career games.



**GRIFFITH NOW FOURTH ON ALL-TIME SCORING LIST:** With two extra points vs. Chattanooga on Nov. 19, senior placekicker Adam Griffith now has 93 points in 2016 (14 field goals and 51 PAT) to give him 321 career points (50 FG, 171 PAT), good for fourth place on the Tide's career scoring list, five points shy of third place Michael Proctor who had 326 points (65 field goals, 131 PATs) from 1992-95. Griffith also ranks fourth on Alabama's all-time kick-scoring list just behind Proctor. Leigh Tiffin (2006-09) is Alabama's all-time scoring and kick scoring leader with 385 points (83 field goals, 136 PATs).

**GRIFFITH AMONG CAREER PAT & FIELD GOAL LEADERS:** With his two PATs vs. Chattanooga on Nov. 19, placekicker Adam Griffith has now converted 171 of 172 attempts, the second-most in school history. Jeremy Shelley (2009-12) holds the Alabama record with 172 PATs on 175 attempts. Griffith's 50 career field goals (on 74 attempts) is fifth place on Alabama's career list. Van Tiffin (1983-86) is fourth at 59.

**CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH PUNT RETURN TDs:** Xavian Marks' 75-yard third quarter punt return for a touchdown against Kent State on Sept. 24 and Eddie Jackson's 85-yard punt return for a score against Ole Miss on Sept. 17 gave the Tide punt returns in consecutive games for only the second time since 1944. The only other occurrence was Nov. 14 and 21, 2015, when Cyrus Jones returned punts 69 yards and 43 yards for scores at Mississippi State and at home against Charleston Southern, respectively. Based on records available at this time (dating back to 1944), these are believed to be the only two occurrences in Alabama football history.

**JACKSON FINDING THE END ZONE:** Eddie Jackson's 85-yard punt return for a touchdown at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 and 75-yard return vs. Tennessee on Oct. 15 are the first for Alabama since Cyrus Jones went 57 yards for a score against Michigan State in the 2015 CFP Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl. Jackson's return at Ole Miss ties for the eighth-longest in school history. The two punt returns for touchdowns this season ties him for fourth on the single-season list in that category.

**SCOTT NAMED SEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AT LSU:** Junior punter JK Scott was named the Southeastern Conference Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance in the Tide's 10-0 shutout of LSU in Baton Rouge on Nov. 5. Another standout night from Scott helped flip the field on the Tigers and keep LSU from ever getting significant field position on the Tide defense. Scott averaged 51.6 yards per kick on his five punts for 258 yards. He booted a long of 66 yards with four of his five punts going for 50-plus yards. The Denver, Colo., native netted 44.4 yards on his five kicks with two punts pinning the LSU offense inside its own 15-yard line. Three of his punts were returned for 16 yards (5.3 yards per return) with two fielded inside the LSU 10-yard line, including his 54-yard kick in the third quarter that was fielded at the LSU 3-yard line and immediately stopped for no gain.

**SCOTT EARNS SEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS AT ARKANSAS:** Junior punter JK Scott was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Arkansas on Oct. 8. Scott averaged 51.5 yards per punt on four attempts with two touchbacks and two kicks inside the 20-yard line. He also equaled his season-long punt with a 63-yard boot on his first punt of the game. Scott also had a 63-yard effort at Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

**JACKSON NAMED SEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR OLE MISS PERFORMANCE:** Senior Eddie Jackson was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. The senior defensive back took the field as the Tide's punt returner against Ole Miss and returned two Rebel punts for a total of 95 yards. Jackson's 85 yard effort for a touchdown late in the second quarter sparked an Alabama's rally that led to the Tide's 48-43 win. The performance in Oxford marked the first time in Jackson's career that he has returned punts for Alabama.

## SERIES NOTES

**THE ALABAMA-AUBURN SERIES:** The Alabama Crimson Tide and Auburn Tigers meet in the 81st Iron Bowl on Saturday, November 26, at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama holds a 44-35-1 lead in a series that dates back to the 1893 season. The Crimson Tide and Tigers first met on Feb. 22, 1893, at Birmingham's Lakeview Park with the Tigers claiming 32-22 victory in the inaugural matchup. Alabama has had the upper hand in recent meetings, claiming six of the last eight meetings. Four of the Crimson Tide's last five wins in the series have eventually led to a national title, with a come-from-behind 26-20 win in Auburn in 2009, a 42-14 win in 2011, a 49-0 victory in 2012 and a 29-16 win in Auburn in 2015.

**UA-AU WINNER GETS "FOY TROPHY":** On July 13, 1948, the two circles of Omicron Delta Kappa, a national leadership honor society from Alabama and Auburn, joined together to sponsor a trophy devoted to sportsmanship between the two universities. The ODK-James E. Foy V Sportsmanship Trophy is a tradition which symbolizes the good relationship between the two schools. Originally the trophy was displayed in Birmingham in Loveman's store window the week prior to the football game between the two universities. Then, in a parade preceding the game, the trophy would be carried in a convertible with the Omicron Delta Kappa presidents from each school on either side. The parade was stopped in the 1960s but the trophy has continued to be awarded every year. The trophy is now awarded to the winner at halftime of the Alabama-Auburn basketball game on the winner's home court. The trophy remains in their care until the next year's presentation takes place. In January 1978, the trophy was dedicated to Dean James E. Foy V upon his retirement as the Dean of Student Affairs at Auburn University. He began serving in that position in 1950 after serving as Assistant Dean of Students at The University of Alabama.

**SABAN VS. AUBURN:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 8-6 in his career against the Auburn Tigers, including a 3-1 mark at Bryant-Denny Stadium against the Tigers. Saban is 6-3 in Iron Bowl games as the head coach at Alabama. His LSU teams went 2-3 against Auburn from 2000-04.

**IRON BOWL RANKINGS:** For the 31st time since 1980, at least one team is ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 entering the annual Iron Bowl. Neither team was ranked in 1982, 1998 and 2003. Alabama is No. 1 in the current AP poll and is ranked entering the Iron Bowl for the 42nd time in history. Auburn is 16th. The Crimson Tide is 30-11 against the Tigers when ranked in the AP poll. Auburn has been ranked a total of 28 times in Iron Bowl history and has compiled a 19-9 record when ranked in the AP Top 25. The highest-ranked team owns a 44-10 record in the series since 1955.

**TELEVISED GAMES:** The 2016 Alabama-Auburn game will be the 42nd televised game between the two in-state rivals, dating back to the series' first televised game in 1964. Alabama owns a 23-18 record in the previous 41 TV games. The Alabama-Auburn game is being televised for the 23rd consecutive year.

## GENERAL NOTES

**SABAN'S HOME RECORD:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 121-19 (.864) in home games during his college head coaching career. He owns the advantage at every stop he has made during his collegiate coaching career, including a 62-7 (.899) mark while at Alabama. Saban has won 33 of his last 35 contests at Bryant-Denny Stadium and has lost back-to-back matchups only once, with consecutive losses coming at the end of the 2007 season (LSU and ULM).

**SABAN'S SEC HOME RECORD:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban owns a 49-10 (.831) all-time record when playing in a Southeastern Conference game at home, going 16-4 (.800) during his time at LSU and owning a 33-6 (.846) record at Alabama. While with the Crimson Tide, Saban has posted four perfect home SEC slates and has not lost more than one home conference game in any season other than 2007 (two losses). All six of his losses at home have been by seven points or less with half of those by three or fewer. Under Saban, Alabama has outscored its SEC home opponents 1,281-556 (32.8-14.2 points per game) and has limited the opposition to 14 points or less on 24 occasions, including six shutout victories.

**SABAN VS. SEC OPPONENTS:** Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban owns a 102-26 (.797) career record in 128 games against SEC opponents. While at Alabama, he has compiled a 72-13 (.847) record versus conference foes, and is outscoring opponents by a staggering 3,370-1,300, or 39.6-15.3 points per game. Of his 13 losses against SEC opponents while at Alabama, all but two (Florida, 2008 and South Carolina, 2010) have been by seven points or less. Saban's first matchup with an SEC team came in the 1995 Independence Bowl against LSU, where his Michigan State Spartans fell, 45-26, to the Tigers. He would later go on to coach LSU to 30-12 overall record against conference opponents.

**SABAN VS. AP TOP 25:** Alabama's 10-0 win at No. 15 LSU on Nov. 5 gives head coach Nick Saban 69 career wins vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams, good for third all-time. Former Penn State head coach Joe Paterno leads the list with 86, four victories ahead of Florida State's Bobby Bowden (82). Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth at 66. Recently retired Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth at 64. Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (69-37, .651) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

**SABAN WINS 101st SEC GAME:** With his 101st conference win vs. Mississippi State on Nov. 12, Alabama head coach Nick Saban is quickly moving up the charts for victories in SEC regular season contests (includes SEC championship games) against conference opponents. His 101 wins ranks fifth all-time in SEC history. Three of the four coaches ahead of Saban on the list are already in the College Football Hall of Fame (Paul "Bear" Bryant, Johnny Vaught, Vince Dooley). Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .795 (101-26). He is second in league history in winning percentage in all games at .823 (159-34). Saban is eighth on the SEC career wins list at 159. Tennessee's Robert Neyland is seventh at 173.

**102-6 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF:** Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 103-6 (.945) when leading at the half. Alabama led Chattanooga, 14-3, at the half on Nov. 19 and has held the lead in 20 of its last 25 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season, including nine of 11 games this season. Alabama had converted 36 straight halftime leads into wins before falling at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2013. The Crimson Tide converted 28 consecutive halftime leads into victories before seeing that streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. In 2007, Alabama held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing to LSU, 41-34, in 2007 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, the Tide led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win in Death Valley. Alabama lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season, after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 5-8 under Saban when trailing at halftime after coming away with a victory against Ole Miss on Sept. 17 after entering the locker room down 24-17 at the break. The five wins in the Saban era when trailing at the half: 34-24 over No. 7 Virginia Tech in 2009 (in Atlanta); a 24-15 over No. 9 LSU in 2009; 24-20 at Arkansas in 2010; 27-14 vs. Arkansas in 2015 and 48-43 at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. His Tide teams are 5-3 when tied at halftime, and Alabama's five wins under Saban when tied at halftime: at LSU in 2008, (27-21), at Auburn in 2009 (26-21), against Tennessee in 2011 (37-6), against Tennessee in 2015 (19-14) and against LSU in 2016 (0-0).

**SABAN'S ROAD RECORD:** With Alabama's 10-0 win at LSU on Nov. 5, head coach Nick Saban clinched his sixth perfect road season with the Tide (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016). Saban owns a 64-29-1 (.686) mark in road games across his four career stops, including a 36-6 (.857) mark while at Alabama. Saban has lost more than one game on the road in only two seasons (2007, 2010). Alabama has won 23 of its last 25 road games dating back to the start of the 2011 season and is riding a nine-game road winning streak.

**200 WINS:** Alabama head coach Nick Saban recorded his 200th on-the-field collegiate victory against his alma mater Kent State on Sept. 24. It was his 109th on-the-field win during his 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa. He recorded his first nine collegiate wins at Toledo in 1990, then won 34 games in five seasons at Michigan State and 48 contests in five years at LSU. With the win over Texas A&M on Oct. 22, his 116 wins at Alabama are the second most in school history. Saban boasts a 116-18 (.866) record at Alabama and a 207-60-1 (.774) record as a collegiate football coach (202-60-1/111-18 with vacated victories). Saban's first five victories at Alabama were vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

**SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS:** Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in his first 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (1).

**AGAINST NO. 1:** Alabama's eight wins over the nation's No. 1 team is the most of any program in college football history. The Crimson Tide has squared off against the top-ranked team in the AP poll 12 times in its history, going 8-4. And once again, the record gets even better under the direction of head coach Nick Saban, under whom the Tide is 5-1 against the No. 1. This includes national championship game victories over LSU, Notre Dame and Clemson, an SEC Championship Game victory against Florida and a regular-season win over Mississippi State in 2014. UA's lone loss was a 9-6 overtime defeat to LSU in the 2011 regular season, a loss avenged later that season in the BCS Championship Game, 21-0.

**FIRST TIME STARTERS:** Safety Hootie Jones became the 14th Crimson Tide student-athlete to make his first career start when he took the field for the opening defensive snap vs. No. 6 Texas A&M on Oct. 22. Running back Bo Scarbrough started for the first time against Tennessee on Oct. 15. Freshman running back Josh Jacobs recorded his first career start vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1. Wide receiver Cam Sims was in the starting lineup for the first time against Kent State on Sept. 24. Jalen Hurts (QB), Gehrig Dieter (WR) and Anthony Averett (DB) made their starting debuts vs. Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Ryan Anderson (LB), Dalvin Tomlinson (DE), Tim Williams (LB), Blake Barnett (QB), Miller Forristall (TE), Damien Harris (RB) and Jonah Williams (OT) started for the first time vs. USC in the 2016 season opener on Sept. 3.

**LARGEST DEFICIT OVERCOME:** Alabama erased a 21-point second-quarter deficit at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, tying the largest deficit overcome in the program's history (not just in a victory, but in any game). Trailing, 24-3, with less than three minutes remaining in the second quarter, the Tide launched a comeback that equaled a 21-point comeback against a previous Rebels squad in a memorable 62-27 Alabama win in 1989. The Tide used a punt return touchdown by Eddie Jackson, and fumble return touchdowns by Da'Ron Payne and Jonathan Allen to punctuate the victory.

**ALABAMA OPENS SEASON WITH A BANG:** Alabama's 46-point margin of victory over No. 20 USC was its largest against a top 20 team since it beat No. 14 Syracuse by 55 points (61-6) in the 1953 Orange Bowl. It is also the third largest margin of victory against any ranked team in program history with the largest coming in the 59-0 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in 2014.

**RETURNING SUCCESS:** The Crimson Tide returned 14 starters and 46 letterwinners from its 2015 squad that finished 14-1 as the SEC and national champions. The 2016 team returned five starters on a veteran defense including seniors Jonathan Allen, Eddie Jackson and Reuben Foster. The offense welcomed back key pass catchers in tight end O.J. Howard and receivers Calvin Ridley and ArDarius Stewart.

**ALABAMA'S TV RECORD:** Alabama has compiled a 250-131-4 (.655) all-time record in 385 televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts). The Crimson Tide was 14-1 in televised games in 2015 and is 11-0 this season.

**104 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 120 GAMES:** With the Tide's 31-3 victory over Chattanooga on Nov. 19, Alabama has played in 104 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 season. The Crimson Tide was featured on CBS seven times in 2015, including at Georgia, Texas A&M, Mississippi State and Auburn; home against Tennessee and LSU and against Florida in the SEC Championship Game. The ABC family of networks hosted the other eight contests during the 2015 season, including the season opener against Wisconsin and Clemson (ABC), against Middle Tennessee, Louisiana-Monroe and Charleston Southern (SEC Network) and on ESPN for the Ole Miss, Arkansas and Michigan State games. In 2014, Alabama was televised in eight games on the ABC family of networks including contests with West Virginia (ABC), FAU (SEC Network), Southern Miss (ESPN2), at Arkansas (ESPN), at Tennessee (ESPN2), Western Carolina (SEC Network), the most-viewed college football game ever on ESPN, the Iron Bowl against Auburn and the Sugar Bowl against Ohio State (ESPN). The Tide also played in six contests that were televised on CBS, including versus Florida, at Ole Miss, against Texas A&M, in the Bayou against LSU, versus top-ranked Mississippi State, and finally in the SEC Championship against the Missouri Tigers. Eleven of the Crimson Tide's 13 games in 2013 were televised nationally with the Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Mississippi State and Oklahoma games on ESPN, the Texas A&M, Tennessee, LSU and Auburn games on CBS, the Colorado State and Kentucky games on ESPN2. Alabama played 12 nationally televised games in 2012, with one game on ABC, six on CBS and five on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one on ABC, two on ESPN and ESPN2, and one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three on ESPN, two on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, the Tide played two games on ABC (including the BCS title game), and six on CBS, while ESPN televised two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games televised nationally, including five on CBS, three on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

**ALABAMA-USC DRAWS HUGE RATINGS:** The season opening matchup on ABC's Saturday Night Football between the Alabama Crimson Tide and USC Trojans was college football's highest-rated game of the day, achieving a 4.9 overnight rating nationally, which was up 14 percent from the same window last season when Alabama's season opener with Wisconsin averaged a 4.3 overnight rating and was also the highest-rated game of the day.

**NEW HIRES:** Nick Saban made three new additions to his 2016 staff during the offseason, hiring Derrick Ansley to coach the secondary, Karl Dunbar to lead the defensive line and bringing in Brent Key to coach the offensive guards and centers. Ansley rejoins the Crimson Tide staff after four seasons at Tennessee (2012) and Kentucky (2013-15). He previously served as a graduate assistant under Saban in 2010 and 2011. Dunbar is returning to college football after a decade in the National Football League with the Bills, Jets and Vikings from 2006-2015. Dunbar also worked as a defensive line coach with the Bears in 2004. He previously coached at the college level with LSU, Oklahoma and Nicholls (La.) State. Key joined the Alabama staff after 11 seasons at UCF, most recently serving as the Knights' offensive coordinator and running backs coach.

**SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS:** Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban ranks third all-time among college coaches who have tutored first round draft picks. Saban has coached a total of 23 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 18 from Alabama.

**CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS:** The Alabama football program is well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2016-17 season with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 44 former players (active or injured reserve) working on an active NFL roster this season, the second-most nationally behind only LSU (45). In the last eight NFL Drafts, Alabama has had 55 players selected, including 18 players in first round, 17 in the second and third rounds, five in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 202-60-1 (.770) record as a college head coach to date (207-60-1, .774 on-field record). He has five national championships – four at Alabama – seven conference championships and 17 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in 2015.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships and the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships. He has won five titles in his last 13 years coaching college football after capturing CFP National Championship following the 2015 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in the poll era to win five national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant).

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He then took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise approximately \$5.5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

**ARLINGTON, Texas** — True freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts accounted for four touchdowns (two passing, two rushing) while receiver ArDarius Stewart and running back Damien Harris had career-best performances, supplementing a suffocating performance by the Crimson Tide defense to lead the No. 1 ranked University of Alabama football team to a 52-6 victory over the 20th-ranked University of Southern California Trojans before a crowd of 81,359 at AT&T Stadium.

The 46-point margin of victory was the largest Alabama winning margin over a top-20 ranked opponent since a 35-0 win at sixth-ranked Florida in 1991, and was the second-largest victory margin over a top 20 team in Crimson Tide history following only a 55-point win (61-6) over Syracuse in the 1953 Orange Bowl (1952 season). The largest Alabama victory margin ever against a ranked team was a 59-0 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in 2014.

Defensively, Alabama was stifling after allowing a scoring drive to open the game. The Tide was dominant at the line of scrimmage, holding the Trojans to 64 yards rushing on 30 attempts, an average of 2.1 yards per rush. Redshirt freshman cornerback Anthony Averett recorded a team-best eight total tackles, including seven solos. Additionally, cornerback Minkah Fitzpatrick had six tackles and broke up two passes, defensive end Jonathan Allen had two quarterback sacks and the team broke up seven passes, had nine tackles for loss and three sacks. Sophomore cornerback Marlon Humphrey returned an interception for a touchdown in the first half.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts set a school record for passing yards by a quarterback in a career starting debut, throwing for 287 yards and two touchdowns to lead the top-ranked Crimson Tide football team to a 38-10 victory over the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers before a crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium on The University of Alabama campus.

In addition to breaking the previous record for passing yards in a starting debut of 285 yards set by Brodie Croyle versus Arkansas on September 28, 2002. Hurts' performance also surpassed the previous Crimson Tide freshman passing yards mark of 167 yards set by Vince Sutton against Tennessee on October 20, 1984.

Tide wide receiver Calvin Ridley's 129 yards and a touchdown on nine catches led all receivers, while receiver ArDarius Stewart had five catches for 90 yards and a touchdown, including a 52-yarder. Running back Damien Harris rushed for 45 yards on 11 carries to lead the Tide on the ground.

Defensively, Alabama was as stingy as ever, allowing the only touchdown of the season with just 46 seconds remaining after WKU recovered a Tide fumble at the Alabama 26-yard line. Linebacker Reuben Foster recorded a team-best six total tackles, including five solos, and Eddie Jackson posted an interception return for a touchdown.

Punter JK Scott averaged 46.4 yards on five punts, placing three inside the Tide 20 and two traveling more than 50 yards with a long of 58.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — Alabama's top-ranked football team erased a 21-point second-quarter deficit, tying the largest deficit overcome in the program's history by scoring three non-offensive touchdowns, to defeat the 19th-ranked Ole Miss Rebels, 48-43. The win came before a stadium-record crowd of 66,176 (capacity: 64,038) at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The largest crowd ever to attend a college football game in the state of Mississippi witnessed a wild one as the Crimson Tide snapped a two-game losing streak to the Rebels, outscoring Ole Miss by a 45-13 margin after trailing, 24-3, with less than three minutes remaining in the second period. That comeback tied the Alabama football record for the largest deficit overcome in a game. The Tide used a punt return touchdown by Eddie Jackson, a fumble return touchdown by Da'Ron Payne and an interception return by Jonathan Allen to punctuate the victory.

Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts became the first Tide signal caller to rush for more than 100 yards since Tyler Watts in 2001 (110 vs. Ole Miss on October 13, 2001). Hurts accounted for 146 yards on the ground and threw for 158 more to accumulate 304 yards of total offense on the day. Tide wide receiver Calvin Ridley's 81 yards on eight catches led Tide receivers, while receiver Gehrig Dieter had two catches for 47 yards. Running back Damien Harris rushed for a career-best 144 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries to lead the Tide running backs on the ground.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — Alabama shutout Kent State, 48-0, before a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium on the campus of The University of Alabama. A strong start by the Crimson Tide quickly ended any question about the outcome as Alabama racked up a 21-0 lead after one quarter and led, 41-0, at halftime.

Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts accounted for 218 total yards on the day, passing for 164 yards and rushing for 54 yards. Tide wide receiver Cam Sims had a career-best four catches for 54 yards while tight end O.J. Howard caught three passes for 60 yards and a touchdown. Receiver Trevon Diggs caught three passes for 23 yards and Derek Kief had three catches for 17 yards as 12 Alabama players caught at least one pass and nine players had at least one rushing attempt in the game. Freshman running back Joshua Jacobs rushed for 97 yards on 11 attempts and scored two touchdowns.

Tide linebacker Reuben Foster recorded a team-best seven total tackles, including two solos. As a unit, the Tide defense had three quarterback sacks, five tackles for loss, forced one fumble and was credited with six quarterback hurries.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — Sophomore wide receiver Calvin Ridley had a career-best performance with 11 catches for 174 yards and two scores, and the Crimson Tide defense produced another dominant performance to lead top-ranked Alabama to a 34-6 Homecoming victory over the Kentucky Wildcats in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium on the Alabama campus.

Ridley caught scoring passes of 10 and 19 yards from Tide quarterback Jalen Hurts and also had a 46-yard catch to highlight a solid performance by the Alabama offense. Hurts threw for 262 yards and two scores on the night, completing 20 of 33 attempts, while freshman running back Joshua Jacobs rushed for 100 yards on 16 carries and caught three passes for 54 yards on the night. Jacobs' rushing outing marked his first 100-yard rushing performance for the Tide.

Alabama was methodical after falling behind 3-0 early, building a 17-3 halftime lead on Jacobs' one-yard touchdown run and a 55-yard fumble return for a score by Tide linebacker Ronnie Harrison in the second quarter. Ridley's two touchdown catches came in the third quarter, putting the game away at 31-3 entering the final period.

Overall, the Tide gained 488 yards (315 passing and 173 rushing), picked up 25 first downs, and averaged 6.5 yards per play. Kentucky gained 161 yards (89 passing and 72 rushing), along with converting 12 first downs and averaging 2.8 yards per play. Tide linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton recorded a team-best eight total tackles, including four solos. As a unit, the Tide defense had four quarterback sacks, nine tackles for loss, forced three fumbles and was credited with six quarterback hurries. Tide punter JK Scott punted only once, a boot that traveled 58 yards. Placekicker Adam Griffith connected on two of three field goal attempts, hitting from 44 and 24 yards, missing from 35.

**FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.** — Twotouchdowns by the defense and an explosive performance by the offense highlighted a big road victory as the No. 1-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide beat the 16th-ranked Arkansas Razorbacks, 49-30, before an overflow crowd of 75,459 on Frank Broyles Field at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium (capacity: 72,000).

Alabama's freshman quarterback, Jalen Hurts, accounted for four touchdowns (two rushing and two passing) while the Tide's defense punctuated an inconsistent performance with back-breaking scores on a pair of interception returns for touchdowns.

Hurts passed for 253 yards and two touchdowns with one interception while completing 13-of-17 attempts. The interception snapped a string of 139 clean attempts by Hurts, the second-longest in Crimson Tide history. Running back Damien Harris rushed for 122 yards on 13 carries, including a 57-yarder while averaging 9.4 yards per attempt, along with 60 yards and a touchdown on three catches. Wide receiver ArDarius Stewart returned to action after missing time with an injury to catch five passes for 120 yards, including a 67-yard reception. Freshman running back Josh Jacobs had a 56-yard run and gained 57 yards on three attempts early in the game before leaving with an injury.

Linebackers Shaun Dion Hamilton and Ryan Anderson led the Tide with a game-high nine tackles. Hamilton had four solos, including one quarterback sack and 1.5 tackles for loss along with a forced fumble while Anderson had one sack and two tackles for loss. The Tide defense produced three interceptions, forced three fumbles, had six quarterback sacks, nine tackles for loss, broke up five passes and was credited with 12 quarterback hurries on the night.

**KNOXVILLE, Tenn.** — Freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for 132 yards and three touchdowns to key a dominant running attack while the Crimson Tide defense and special teams contributed touchdowns of their own as the top-ranked University of Alabama football team decisively defeated the ninth-ranked Volunteers of the University of Tennessee, 49-10, before a capacity crowd of 102,455 at Neyland Stadium on the UT campus.

Hurts directed the Tide offense to five touchdowns, Eddie Jackson returned a punt 79 yards for a score, and free safety Ronnie Harrison returned an interception 58 yards for a touchdown as Alabama moved ahead early and remained in command all afternoon. The Alabama defense limited the explosive Tennessee offense to a season-low 163 yards, including season lows in rushing (32 yards) and passing (131). Meanwhile, the Tide offense grinded out 594 yards of total offense, the most in a game since 2010 (591 vs. San Jose State) and the 16th-most yards gained in a single game in Alabama history (the most ever by an Alabama team against Tennessee).

The Tide rushed for 438 yards against the Vols, the most by an Alabama team since the Tide rushed for 457 yards against Tennessee in a 56-28 win in 1986 in Knoxville. Two Alabama players rushed for more than 100 yards in the game as Hurts had 132 and three touchdowns while Scarbrough finished with 109 and a touchdown on five carries. Hurts completed 16 of 26 pass attempts for 143 yards, throwing one interception. Wide receiver ArDarius Stewart had eight catches for 54 yards and wide receiver Calvin Ridley had five catches for 65 yards to lead the Tide.

Alabama's defense produced 10 tackles for loss, three quarterback sacks, broke up six passes, intercepted a pass and had numerous quarterback hurries in the game. Free safety Ronnie Harrison led the impressive effort with seven total tackles (six solos), intercepted a pass that he returned 52 yards for a touchdown and broke up two passes on the day. Linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton had six tackles (five solos), including two for losses. Cornerback Minkah Fitzpatrick also had six tackles (four solos).

Tide freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts threw for 164 yards while completing 15 of 25 attempts for two touchdowns with two interceptions. Sophomore running back Damien Harris led all rushers with 125 yards on 18 attempts while Hurts gained 93 yards and a touchdown on 21 rushes. Senior tight end O.J. Howard led all receivers with eight catches for 69 yards and a touchdown while wide receiver ArDarius Stewart had 57 receiving yards and receiver Calvin Ridley had 27 yards and a touchdown.

A&M quarterback Trevor Knight completed 14 passes on 31 attempts for 164 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. Junior running back Keith Ford led A&M with 62 yards. Wide receivers Christian Kirk and Josh Reynolds both hauled in touchdowns for the Aggies, with Kirk gaining 58 yards through the air on nine catches while Reynolds pulled in 27 yards on two receptions.

Alabama linebacker Reuben Foster led the Tide defense with 12 tackles, including eight solo stops. Alabama had five sacks for 50 yards on the day, with 11 tackles for loss for minus-74 yards. **BATON ROUGE, La.** — In a defensive battle that was worthy of what has become one of college football's great rivalries, the No. 1-ranked University of Alabama football team scored all of its points in the fourth quarter to take a 10-0 win over the 15th-ranked LSU Tigers in Tiger Stadium. The win improves Alabama to 9-0 overall and 6-0 in the Southeastern Conference while LSU falls to 5-3 overall, 3-2 in the SEC.

Linebacker Reuben Foster led Alabama with 11 tackles, including two solo stops. Marlon Humphrey had six solo stops and eight overall. Foster, Dalvin Tomlinson, Ryan Anderson, Tim Williams, Jonathan Allen and Rashaan Evan were all in on the Tide's five sacks on a night that also saw the Crimson Tide tally nine tackles for loss. Alabama also limited LSU to six first downs on the night and 125 total yards.

Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts scored his 10th rushing touchdown of the season and 22nd overall in the fourth quarter, while completing 10-of-19 passes for 107 yards with one interception. He also tallied a team-high 114 yards and a touchdown on 20-rushing attempts. Wide receiver ArDarius Stewart hauled in three catches for a team-best 55 receiving yards. Punter JK Scott had a big night, averaging 51.6 yards on five punts with a season long of 66 yards.

After rushing for a school-record 284 yards in his last outing, LSU running back Leonard Fournette was held to just 35 yards on 17 attempts Saturday night. The Tiger's Danny Etling was 11-of-24 with one interception and 92 yards on the night. DJ Chark led LSU's receiving corps with 45 yards on three catches.

**TUSCALOOSA, Ala.** — The No. 1-ranked University of Alabama football team used a record-setting day by freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts to beat Mississippi State, 51-3, in front of a sellout crowd of 101,821 Saturday afternoon in Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Crimson Tide improved to 10-0 on the season and 7-0 in Southeastern Conference play while the Bulldogs fell to 4-6 overall and 2-4 in the SEC.

Hurts became the first player in Alabama football's storied history to throw for 300 yards (347) and rush for 100 yards (100) in the same game. His primary passing target on Saturday afternoon, wide receiver ArDarius Stewart, became the sixth player in UA history to catch three receiving touchdowns in the same game. Stewart ended the day with a 156-yard outing on eight catches.

In addition to Hurts' 100 yards, which included a touchdown run, running back Josh Jacobs gained 89 yards on nine rushes, averaging 9.9 yards per carry. Kicker Adam Griffith made all three of his field goal attempts, all in the first half, from 28, 30, and 39 yards out. Defensively, 27 different players notched at least one tackle, including six each from linebacker Reuben Foster, defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick, linebacker Rashaan Evans and defensive tackle Dalvin Tomlinson. Linebacker Ryan Anderson, linebacker Tim Williams and defensive tackle Raekwon Davis all had sacks that drove the Bulldogs back a combined 29 yards.

Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts was 15-of-21 passing for 136 yards and three touchdowns. Tide sophomore wide receiver Calvin Ridley caught seven passes for 94 yards and a touchdown; senior wide receiver Gerhig Dieter caught three passes, with two going for touchdowns; and sophomore running back Damien Harris ran for 91 yards and touchdown to lead all rushers.

Defensively, sophomore defensive back Ronnie Harrison led the Tide with 11 tackles, including eight solo stops. Senior defensive lineman Jonathan Allen and senior linebacker Reuben Foster both notched two tackles for loss.

The victory set a record for Alabama head coach Nick Saban, who earned his 41st win while directing the nation's top-ranked team at the Capstone. Saban's Tide teams have won 41 of 46 games when ranked number one. Also, the 46 games coaching the nation's top-ranked squad ties Saban for that total with Ohio State legend Woody Hayes.
