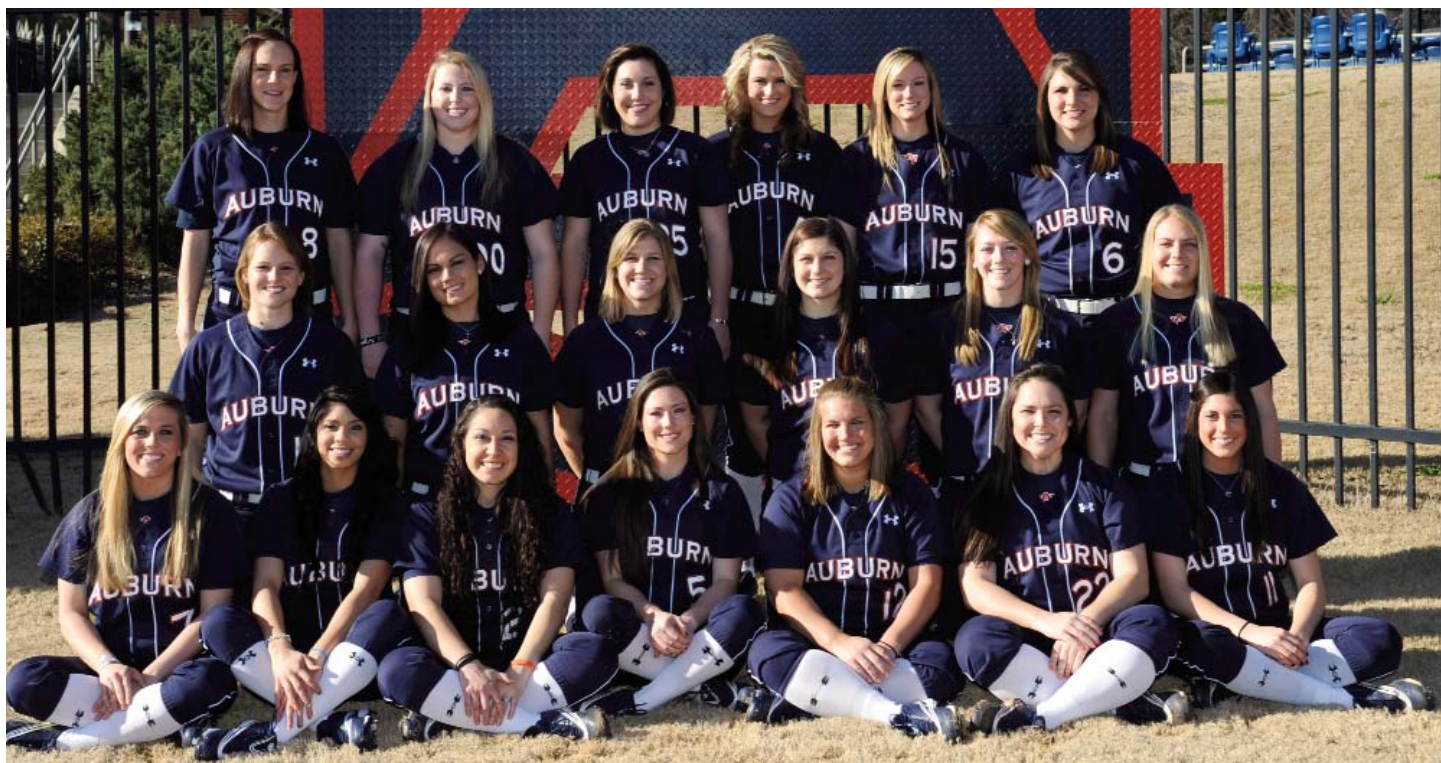

## 2012 Auburn Softball

### NCAA Austin Regional ♦ Austin, Texas ♦ May 18-20

♦ Auburn is making its fifth consecutive appearance in NCAA Regional play, which is the longest streak in program history. The Tigers are making their ninth overall trip to the NCAA postseason. Auburn's first regional appearance came in 2002 and the Tigers have missed out just twice since then (2003 & 2007). Auburn has a 7-16 all-time record in regional play, including a 1-7 record in first-round games.

♦ Senior SS Lauren Guzman was named to the All-SEC Second Team after leading the Tigers with a .352 batting average in conference play this season. In SEC play this season, Guzman hit .333 with runners in scoring position and .355 with six RBI with two outs. Additionally, Guzman committed just five errors and struck out five times in league play. The Miami, Fla., native started every SEC game on the Auburn schedule since arriving as a freshman in 2009, a streak of 105 league games. Guzman is the 22nd

♦ Freshman CF Brannndi Melero was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. Melero was second on the team with a .260 batting average. A native of Canyon Country, Calif., Melero started every game in center field in SEC play and had a .514 (19-for-37) success rate advancing base runners. It marks the second consecutive season the Tigers had a player earn SEC All-Freshman honors after Morgan Estell was named to the team in 2011. Melero is the sixth Tiger to earn All-Freshman Team honors.

♦ The Tigers will face Houston for the first time in program history when the teams meet in the opening round of the NCAA Austin Regional. Auburn has played only one of the teams in the Austin Regional, losing 6-1 to Northwestern in the second game of the 2003 season.

♦ The trip to Texas will be a homecoming for three Tigers. Senior Jenee Loree, junior Brooke Lathan and sophomore Maris Medina each call Texas home. Loree was born in Austin but attended Dwyer High School in Jupiter, Fla. Lathan is from Livingston (HS) and attended the University of Houston from 2010-11 before transferring to Auburn this season. Medina is from San Antonio and attended Smithson Valley High School.

♦ The Southeastern Conference tied a league record by advancing nine teams to NCAA Regional play this season. The SEC led all conferences with nine bids to the tournament. The SEC has sent at least seven teams to the NCAA Tournament each year since 2007. The league set a conference record with nine participants in the 2009 season.

♦ The last time Auburn made a trip to Texas was for the 2008 NCAA College Station Regional. The Tigers went 1-2 in the Regional, defeating Stephen F. Austin and losing twice to Louisiana Tech. Senior pitchers Angel Bunner and Lauren Schmalz each competed in the Regional. Bunner went 1-0 in two appearances while Schmalz went 0-1 in two appearances.

♦ Senior shortstop Lauren Guzman has started 229 consecutive games, which is the longest streak in Auburn history. Guzman has started every game on the Tigers' schedule since coming to Auburn in 2009. Guzman broke the previous record of 221 held by Ashley Griffin (2003-06) from Feb. 25, 2003, to May 20, 2006. Additionally, Guzman has not been lifted from a game since April 13, 2010, a span of 128 straight games and 883 innings.

♦ Auburn set a season high with six stolen bases in its 2-1 win over Mississippi State on May 6. The six stolen bases tied the program record for most steals against an SEC opponent and were one short of the team single-game record of seven set against Mercer in 2003. The Tigers swiped six bags against an SEC foe once before, with that coming on March 18, 2007, against Ole Miss.

♦ Hilary Mavromat's game-tying home run in the fifth inning of game three vs. Mississippi State was Auburn's 43rd home run of the season and the eighth consecutive solo home run for the Tigers. Nine of AU's last 10 home runs have been solo shots with the lone exception coming from Caitlin Schultze who hit a two-run homer vs. Ivy Renfro in the seventh inning of game three against Tennessee on April 8. Of Auburn's 43 home runs, 25 (58 pct.) have been solo shots.

♦ Senior pitcher Lauren Schmalz earned the save in each of Auburn's wins over South Carolina. Schmalz entered each game with the tying or go-ahead run on base but did not allow an inherited runner to score. In game one, Schmalz inherited runners at third and first with one out and AU leading 1-0 in the bottom of the sixth inning and retired four straight to end the game. In game two, Schmalz inherited a runner at third base with one out in the sixth inning with AU leading 3-2 and retired five straight to end the game. In game three, Schmalz inherited the bases loaded with two outs in the fifth inning with AU leading 4-1 and retired six straight before allowing a pair of two-out singles in the seventh. Schmalz pitched a total of 5.1 innings, allowing only the two hits. The three saves gave Schmalz eight for her career and moved her into a tie for fourth in the AU career record books. Prior to the save in game one, Schmalz's last save came on April 9, 2011 against Mississippi State.

♦ Auburn notched its second walk-off win of the season in the series opener against Arkansas. The Tigers and Razorbacks went to the eighth inning tied 2-2. Auburn loaded the bases on an error and a pair of walks, all with no outs. Junior OF Baylee Stephens then drilled the first pitch of the at-bat off the wall in center to score Caitlin Schultze from third for a walk-off single. Auburn's first walk-off win this season came in game three against Kentucky on March 25.

♦ Auburn set an attendance record in its doubleheader against Alabama as 3,628 fans packed Jane B. Moore Field Tuesday night. That broke the previous high for a doubleheader of 3,125 set on April 3, 2010, also against Alabama. Although not counted as a single game, Auburn's first game against the Tide on Tuesday drew 1,822 fans which is the most fans to ever witness one game at Jane B. Moore Field. The highest single-game home attendance for the Tigers is 1,723 fans set against Alabama on April 13, 2008.

♦ Auburn tied the program record for consecutive wins with 15 before suffering its first loss of the season. The Tigers' first loss this season came against No. 16 Michigan, 4-0, on March 2 at the Citrus Classic. The 2012 Tigers tied the record set by the 2011 team that won 15 straight from Feb. 12 to March 4, losing 6-0 to No. 10 Oklahoma in Norman.

♦ Auburn has appeared on TV 19 times since the 2010 season, including three regular season and SEC Tournament televised game in 2012. Auburn's second game of a double-header against Alabama on March 27 appeared on ESPNU. The Tigers also appeared on ESPNU on April 7 against the Tennessee Lady Vols. Game two of the Auburn-Arkansas series on April 22 aired on Fox Sports Net/Sports South. The Tigers and Lady Vols played on ESPNU for a second time this season in the opening round of the SEC Tournament on May 10.

♦ Tina Deese is in her 16th season as Auburn's head coach. Deese is the longest tenured softball coach in the Southeastern Conference and the third-longest tenured head coach at Auburn. Men's tennis coach Eric Shore is the longest tenured head coach at Auburn at 22 years, followed second by women's golf head coach Kim Evans at 18 years. Deese's career record is 818-556-1 and her Auburn record is 532-433-1.

In her 15th season as Auburn's head coach Tina Deese led the 2011 Tigers back into the NFCA top 25 and to series wins over No. 4 Georgia and No. 18 Kentucky. Auburn posted seven wins over top 25 teams in 2011, including wins over No. 19 Oklahoma State, No. 11 Tennessee and No. 3 Florida in the SEC Tournament.

Auburn's win over the Gators put the Tigers in the semifinals of the conference tournament for the first time since 2005. Auburn lost to eventual tournament champion Tennessee by a score of 2-1.

Auburn advanced its fourth consecutive, and eighth overall, NCAA Regional in 2011. The Tigers traveled cross-country for the Seattle Regional hosted by the University of Washington. Additionally, the 2011 Tigers set a program record with a 15-game winning streak to open the season.

Now in her 16th season as Auburn's head coach, Deese has led the Tigers to eight of the past nine NCAA Regionals and 12 of the past 13 Southeastern Conference Tournaments.

Deese is the longest tenured coach in the Southeastern Conference.

Averaging nearly 40 wins per season since 2004, the Tigers advanced to a third consecutive NCAA tournament in 2010, taking part in the nationally-televised Atlanta Regional.

With the SEC agreeing to a new multi-media partnership with the ESPN family of networks, CBS, Fox-Sports Net, the SEC Network, CSS and Sirius/XM Radio, the Tigers had 15 televised games since the 2010 season including home games against Alabama, Arkansas and Tennessee.

Under Deese's guidance, the 2010 Tigers extended the program's streak of placing at least one player on the All-SEC Team to seven consecutive years as junior Kyndall White earned Second Team honors.

With a roster that featured 14 underclassmen, the Tigers posted four-year highs in home runs, RBI, total hits and batting average in 2010. The Auburn pitching staff had the league's third-best ERA, third-lowest opponent batting average and the second-most strikeouts during the season.

Playing with just three seniors and eight freshmen, the 2009 Tigers were limited in experienced players. But Deese and the coaching staff got the Tigers off to a strong start with wins over No. 18 North Carolina, No. 11 Cal and 2009 regional teams Jacksonville State, FIU and Cal-Fullerton.

Although injuries prevented the 2009 squad from being at full strength down the stretch, the Tigers were still able to earn berths in the SEC Tournament in Knoxville, Tenn., and the NCAA Regional hosted by Georgia Tech in Atlanta.

Deese put together one of her strongest teams in 2005 as the Tigers rolled to a program-record 50 victories and hosted its first ever NCAA Regional at picturesque Jane B. Moore Field. For a second straight season, the Tigers finished in the top 25 of both collegiate polls.

Deese was also responsible for starting the softball program at Huntingdon College in Montgomery, Ala.

In her eight seasons at Huntingdon, Deese amassed a 286-123 record. She led her teams to seven straight winning seasons and third-place finishes in the NAIA in 1992 and 1994. In 1992, Deese was named NAIA District 27 Coach of the Year.

Prior to her arrival at Huntingdon, Deese served as a pitching coach at her alma mater, Florida State, from 1985-86. Deese began her playing career in 1982 as a member of Golden West College's (Calif.) Varsity Softball team. She helped lead the team to the California State Championship in 1983 and was named the California State Championship Most Valuable Player.

Her accomplishments at Golden West led her to Florida State where she once again was greeted with immediate success. In 1984, her first season with the Seminoles, Deese led the nation in strikeouts per seven innings at 11.6. As a result, she was named the Lady Seminoles Most Valuable Player while helping lead the team to the Florida State Championship. She was also named to the All-Southeast Region First Team -- a feat she duplicated her second season and final season at Florida State.

Deese received a bachelor of science degree in leisure services and studies from Florida State in 1986. She later received a bachelor of arts degree from Huntingdon College in human performance and kinesiology in 1994. She completed her master of arts in teaching from Troy State University in 1995.

Deese and her husband, Allen, have one son, Kyler, 18, and daughter, Jessi, 14.

In 2011, Auburn was ranked in both the ESPN and NFCA top 25 polls, spending 12 weeks in the NFCA poll and reaching a high of 21st. Auburn also registered its first-ever series win over a top-five team, taking two-of-three games from No. 4 Georgia.

Additionally, the 2011 Tigers set a program record with a 15-game winning streak to open the season.

Johnson joined Auburn in 2009 and helped make an immediate impact defensively as the Tigers' cut their errors by one-quarter and their fielding percentage jumped 14 points from the previous season. After showing modest improvement in Johnson's first season, the Tigers' offense saw significant improvement in 2010 as the team set four-year highs in batting average, home runs, hits and RBI.

Individually, Johnson helped Kyndall White earn Second Team All-SEC honors in 2010 and Myesha Finney earn Second Team All-Southeastern Conference honors in 2009. Additionally, Johnson helped Elizabeth Eisterhold, Amber Harrison and White establish career highs in batting average, home runs and RBI, while Lauren Guzman set career bests in batting average and home runs.

Additionally, Johnson helped utility player Morgan Estell earn Freshman All-SEC honors in 2011, the first Auburn player to earn freshman honors since 2007. He guided the Braves to a 46-14 overall record in 2008 and the Peach Belt Conference championship, going 17-1 in league play. Johnson also led the Braves to the program's first ever NCAA Regional appearance in 2008.

For his effort, Johnson and his coaching staff earned NFCA South Atlantic Region Coaching Staff of the Year honors in 2008.

During the 2008 season, the Braves set or tied 33 school records including most wins in a season (46) and most conference wins (17). UNCP players earned a total of six all-region awards and three All-America honors under Johnson's tutelage in 2008. The Braves were ranked 15th nationally for winning percentage (.767) and 36th in earned run average (2.0).

At one point in 2008, the Braves were ranked fifth nationally in the NFCA II Top 25 Poll finishing the year ranked 28th in the country.

While at UNC-Pembroke, the Braves broke 73 school records and had 39 players earn Peach Belt Academic Honor Roll accolades.

# Tigers face an early season 'Challenge'

Elizabeth Eisterhold considers herself a line-drive hitter.

But, if some of those line drives happen to go over the wall, she's not necessarily opposed to that.

"I don't really shoot for home runs. I shoot for getting good contact with the ball," Auburn's senior catcher said.

"If they go out, they go out. If they don't, hopefully it's a hit."

Eisterhold hit three home runs and totaled eight RBIs over the four-game, season-opening Tiger Invitational last weekend.

She hit four all last season.

While coach Tina Deese was impressed with her catcher's power display, she was more excited about the three walks she drew over the course of the weekend.

You see, with slap hitters like Kelley Smiley and Caitlin Stangl graduated, Deese feels the team is in need of some run manufacturers, not just run producers.

"They really helped provide us a short game," Deese said.

"We need to be think-

ing about manufacturing runs. We're going to be more of a power-centric team than a short-game centered team this year.

"But we're going to have to bring the short game: find ways on, find ways to steal bases."

Auburn scored 30 runs over its opening weekend — after taking a 6-0 win over Alabama State last Thursday — and connected on all seven stolen-base attempts, with senior shortstop Lauren Guzman taking three.

Deese hopes to see more of the same as the competition takes a significant step up this weekend.

Auburn trades in opponents such as Bowling Green, Wright State and Indiana-Purdue Fort Wayne for traditional powerhouses such as No. 4 Oklahoma, No. 15 Oklahoma State and No. 23 Georgia Tech in the SEC/ACC/Big 12 Challenge, running Friday through Sunday at Jane B. Moore Field.

The Tigers play Oklahoma State on Friday at 3 p.m., Oklahoma on Saturday at 3, Virginia Tech on Sunday at 11 a.m. and Georgia Tech on Sunday at 2.

No. 2 Alabama is also part of the Challenge, but the two rivals didn't draw each other.

"Playing these caliber teams is good for us heading into conference," Deese said.

"It's probably going to paint a pretty vivid picture of what it is we need to take care of. Hopefully, it'll point out some weaknesses of ours."

Auburn didn't show many weaknesses at the Tiger Invitational.

The Tigers' senior pitching trio of Angel Bunner, Jenee Loree and Lauren Schmalz gave up eight runs on 16 hits over the four games, striking out 32 batters in 25 innings.

Loree one-upped her classmates, pitching the third no-hitter of her Auburn career against IPFW

on Saturday.

"The last inning is the hardest, because you start to overanalyze," Loree said.

"You're thinking, 'Oh no. I'm going to ruin it.' I just had to take a deep breath and be like, 'Jenee, this is for the team to get a win. That's the bottom line.'"

While Deese said continuity in the circle can definitely be a plus, it can also be a detriment when experienced hitters from some of the nation's elite teams have already seen Auburn's pitchers throw. Auburn split two games against Oklahoma State last season and fell 6-0 to Oklahoma in Norman.

But to reach — or exceed — the bar set by last year's NCAA Regionals berth, Loree and the rest of the Tigers know how important it is to get a measuring stick of this caliber early in the season.

And maybe even make a statement of their own.

"It's on our home turf, so we've got to put our chest out and let everyone know that they're in Auburn," Loree said.

"We're going to put up a fight no matter what. Hopefully, we set where our season's going to go from this weekend."

**Tigers sock 4 HRs in win**

PANTHERSVILLE, Ga. — No. 24 Auburn got a home run each from Baylee Stephens and Morgan Estell and two from Brooke Lathan to cruise to a 9-1 victory in five innings over Georgia State on Wednesday night.

Auburn improved to 9-0 with the victory and will next travel to Boca Raton, Fla., for the Strike Out Cancer Tournament hosted by Florida Atlantic University. The tournament runs Friday through Sunday.

Jenée Loree started and went the distance to improve to 3-0. Loree allowed one earned run on two hits with one walk and nine strikeouts.

Branndi Melero gave the Tigers a 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning with a bases-loaded single to center that scored Estell.

With two on and two outs, Brooke Lathan took a 3-1 pitch over the fence in left-center for a 4-0 Auburn lead. It was Lathan's second home run of the season.

The Panthers answered in the bottom of the first, with Jessica Clifton reaching on a one-out single and scoring on a Loree wild pitch.

Lauren Guzman gave the Tigers a 6-1 lead in the top of the second with a two-run double to center, scoring Caitlin Schultze and Estell.

Estell opened the top of the fourth inning with her second home run of the season, taking a 1-0 pitch over the fence in center to give the Tigers a 7-1 lead.

Another leadoff home run, this time off the bat of Lathan in the top of the fifth, gave Auburn an 8-1 lead. It was Lathan's second home run of the game and her third of the season.

Two batters later, Stephens connected on her second home run of the year and the Tigers' fourth of the game, taking a 1-2 pitch to center to make it a 9-1 game. The four home runs were Auburn's most since it hit five against Alabama State last Feb. 12.

Dedication to game puts Guzman in AU record book

Lauren Guzman's father made one thing clear from the time Auburn's senior shortstop first picked up a bat.

Droughts happen. Consistency comes and goes. As a softball player, there's no avoiding the ups and downs.

But, Dago told his daughter, the key is to show up every day, no matter what.

"I don't miss practice. I don't miss games, since I was 4," Guzman said. "I woke my dad up every single day — 'Let's practice' — at age 4. And it's always been that way."

Guzman's work ethic put her in Auburn's record books.

Entering her final home series this weekend, the senior has started every game in her career. Guzman's 226th straight game in the Tigers' 3-1 loss against Mississippi State on Friday extended her program record, and she'll go for No. 227 at 1 p.m. Saturday in the series' second game, which is also Senior Day.

The streak surpassed former shortstop Ashley Griffin's mark of 221 straight games.

As Guzman's career progressed, her father continued urging her to be reliable. He sent frequent texts, motivational quotes popping up on her phone almost daily.

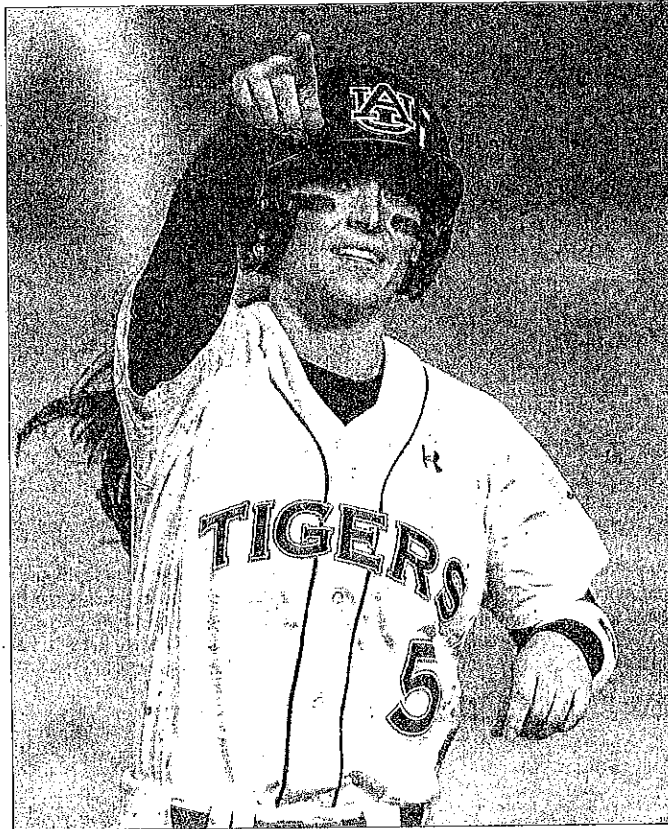
And while Guzman said they meant a lot to her, she didn't need any reminders of how important it was to be in the lineup every day.

"You have no choice," Guzman said. "If you love the game, you'll be there playing hard, playing through whatever (injury) that you have until basically you can't any more. I love the game, so as long as all my body parts are attached, I'm going to play. That means a lot to me."

"When you love something, you don't ever want to be without it. That's how I am about softball."

There is nothing likely about 226 straight games.

Injuries are always around the corner, and Guzman has had her share. She had shoulder surgery to repair a torn labrum after her freshman season. "The minute we get done" with the season, Auburn coach Tina Deese said, Guzman will likely need another surgery because of an undisclosed injury.

break the record, Deese said, didn't surprise her.

Like Griffin, Guzman seemed destined to make immediate contributions as a freshman. Even during recruitment, Deese said she tabbed Guzman to be her shortstop.

And she has been — every day the past four years.

"I'm glad she's going to go down in the record books because, quite honestly, that's going to be a tough record to break," Deese said. "It's an important record to me because of the stretch of the games, the number of the games. It's probably more meaningful to me than it is to her, because that's what she expected to do. That's what Guzman does."

Deese was quick to note Guzman's record isn't merely a participation award.

Guzman earned the starting spot to start her career, and has only gotten better since. Entering the weekend, she led Auburn with a .348 batting average (minimum 50 at-bats). She also had ranked among team leaders with 20 RBIs and 25 runs scored.

And defensively, Deese said, Guzman is even better.

"She has shined," the head coach said. "To me, even in the SEC, there's no better set of hands than Guzman's got. There may be some

Tournament play next week, Guzman's streak will end soon.

Finality hit her last weekend.

Standing in the visitor dugout at South Carolina, she watched the Gamecocks' Senior Day. Freshmen spoke of seniors, then handed them flowers. There were plenty of tears.

Some were from Guzman.

"And it had nothing to do with me," Guzman said. "But I was just like, 'No.' I guess that's when it really started to hit me."

"It's one of those things you don't want to think about, but it's there. It hits you in bits and pieces. So I guess it's just kind of a reminder to have fun, because I take everything so seriously. If anything goes wrong, I get so down on myself. But it makes you think, 'Let's have fun. Relax. Because you're not going to get these games back. You're not going to get these years back.'"

When she stepped on the bus after the game, Guzman reached for her phone.

She flipped to a text message her dad sent following her record-breaking game against Arkansas the previous weekend. In it, Dago told his daughter he was proud of her, that she was motivation to him.

Guzman didn't need the reminder. She said it was nice to see, anyway.
