TEAM QUICK NOTES

*Baylor is 44-45 all-time at conference tournaments, 32-33 in the Big 12 Championship and 34-35 in tournament format.

*Baylor and Oklahoma are the only two Big 12 programs to qualify for all 20 Big 12 Championships.

*Baylor had six players earn All-Big 12 honors: Troy Montemayor (1st team), Daniel Castano (2nd team), Kameron Esthay (2nd team), Steven McLean (2nd team), Matt Menard (honorable mention) and Drew Tolson (honorable mention) -- BU has had multiple All-Big 12 selections in all 20 years as a league member.

*C Matt Menard and RHP Troy Montemayor were named two of 43 semifinalists for the 2016 Gregg Olson Award on May 20. The annual award honors college baseball's breakout player of the year.

*Baylor has won four of its last six games.

*Baylor won its first series over Texas (in Austin) on May 19-21 since a sweep in Waco on April 26-28, 2013.

*Baylor's pitchers issued no walks vs. Texas on May 19 -- fewest all season and first time with no walks in a game for BU since April 29, 2014, vs. Sam Houston State.

*Baylor won 10 or more game in Big 12 play for the 18th time in 20 seasons and first time since going 12-11 in 2013.

*Baylor has won five of its 12 three-game series in 2016 and 26 of 56 since 2012.

*Baylor is 8-11 on the road in 2016.

*Baylor won its first Big 12 Conference series over TCU on May 13-15 after losing the first three. BU won its first three-game series over TCU since a sweep on Feb. 18-20, 2000, in a split series with two games in Waco.

*With a 2-1 decision over No. 10 TCU on May 13-15, Baylor earned its first series win over a Baseball America ranked opponent since sweeping No. 13 Cal Poly on Feb. 13-15, 2015, in Waco.

*With a 2-1 decision over No. 10 TCU on May 13-15, Baylor claimed its first series win over a Baseball America top 10 ranked opponent since taking two of three from No. 4 Cal State Fullerton on March 7-9, 2014, in Waco.

*Baylor has 31 home runs in 51 games in 2016, which are 14 more than the team had in 55 games in 2015 -- BU has 30 or more home runs for the first time since blasting 46 in 2012.

*Baylor is 197-291-1 all-time against opponents ranked by Baseball America, 32-39 since 2011 and 3-3 in 2016 -- the Bears are 90-148 all-time against top 10 teams and 2-1 this year.

*Sophomore RHP Troy Montemayor was 1 of 40 named to the 2016 NCBWA Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List on April 28 -- he's one of two on the list in the Big 12.

TEAM QUICK NOTES CONTINUED...

*Troy Montemayor has 14 saves in 15 tries this season and in his career -- he's the ninth player in BU history to record 10 or more saves in a season (first since Josh Michalec set the single-season Baylor and Big 12 records with 21 saves in 2014) and ranks tied for third on BU's single-season saves list and took sole possession of eighth on BU's career list -- he's had six straight scoreless appearances covering five innings.

*Among Big 12 leaders, Montemayor is first in saves (14), Richard Cunningham is third in triples (4) and fifth in HBPs (11), Steven McLean is fourth in HBPs (13), Richard Cunningham is third in triples (4) and fifth in HBPs (11)

*Among NCAA leaders, Montemayor is tied for fifth in saves and McLean is 68th in HBPs.

*Senior RHP Austin Stone earned Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic Service Award on May 14 for his outstanding community service to Shriners and the Little League Challenger Division teams.

*Baylor is 401-182 all-time at Baylor Ballpark and 16-16 under Steve Rodriguez.

*Baylor has finished its home schedule with a .500 record or better (16-16 in 2016) in all 18 seasons at Baylor Ballpark (since 1999).

*Baylor is 6-5 in midweek games in 2016.

*Baylor has scored at least one run in the first inning 14 times in 51 games and has scored 28 first-inning runs in 2016.

*Baylor had 11 Academic All-Big 12 selections (7 1st team, 4 2nd team) on May 12 to give the Bears 10 or more honorees for the fifth straight season and nine or more honorees for the eighth straight season. BU leads all Big 12 members with 127 all-time first team selections.

*Baylor reached its 20th win of the season on April 30, marking the 45th straight season with at least 20 wins for BU (since 1972).

*Baylor claimed its second walk-off win on April 27 vs. Incarnate Word (8-7) with Steven McLean's RBI single in the ninth inning (also walked off on UTSA on March 29).

*Baylor tied a season-high with 20 hits and with 19 runs was one run shy of tying a season-high in runs on March 26 at Dallas Baptist in a 19-6 win -- both came on Feb. 27 vs. Stony Brook.

*Matt Menard was 1 of 74 players on the initial 2016 Johnny Bench Award watch list, which honors the nation's top catcher each year, released March 8.

*Baylor's first five-game winning streak since April 23-30, 2013, came to an end on March 4.

*Dating back to last season, Baylor's first four-game road winning streak since 2012 came to an end on March 4.

*On Feb. 27 vs. SBU, Baylor scored 16 or more runs in consecutive games for the first time since April 5-7, 2009, when the Bears scored a 21-9 win at Kansas and 18-1 win vs. Northwestern State.

*Baylor's first win of the Steve Rodriguez era was Feb. 20 vs. Washington (9-5) and fueled by a 7-run, 2-out rally in the 6th inning as 7 straight batters reached base safely.

BAYLOR IN THE BIG 12 BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

Baylor is just one of two teams (Oklahoma) to qualify for all 20 Big 12 Baseball Championships and owns a 32-33 all-time record in the event. The Bears are 12-7 in opening games, 8-10 in elimination games and 0-6 in title games. In tournament format, BU is 34-35 in the event. BU's title appearances are as follows:

1999: No. 5 Nebraska 4, No. 2 Baylor 3 | 2000: No. 2 Nebraska 11, No. 1 Baylor 3 | 2003: No. 3 Texas 10, No. 5 Baylor 8 (10 inn.) | 2005: No. 1 Nebraska 1, No. 2 Baylor 0 | 2007: No. 5 Texas A&M 14, No. 6 Baylor 6 | 2010: No. 4 Texas A&M 5, No. 6 Baylor 3 (10 inn.)

Last season in tournament format, No. 8 Baylor topped No. 1 TCU 6-5 before falling 4-3 to No. 5 Texas, eliminating No. 4 Texas Tech 5-4 and being eliminated by No. 5 Texas 4-0 to end the season.

TOLSON NAMED BIG 12 PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Junior right-hander Drew Tolson was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week, the league office announced May 23. The Houston native was huge on May 19 at Texas in the series opener as he tossed a season-high eight innings to up his career-high win total to six. Tolson allowed one run on six hits with no walks and three strikeouts, retiring the first nine batters of the game and 16 of the first 17. His stellar effort helped Baylor secure a spot in the Big 12 Championship for the 20th straight season (Big 12 record shared with Oklahoma for reaching every single Big 12 Championship).

The honor marks the first weekly award for Tolson from the Big 12 and gives Baylor back-to-back weeks of winning the accolade for the first time since doing so three straight weeks from March 3-17, 2014 (Josh Michalec, Dillon Newman, Austin Stone).

Tolson's recognition is the fourth for Baylor this season as Josh Bissonette was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on March 28 and Daniel Castano was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week on March 7 and May 16. Tolson gave the Bears their 36th all-time Big 12 Pitcher of the Week selection.

CASTANO NAMED BIG 12 PITCHER OF THE WEEK FOR SECOND TIME

Junior left-hander Daniel Castano was named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week, the league office announced May 16. The Austin native earned the series-clinching win over No. 10 TCU on May 14 at Baylor Ballpark, allowing two runs on seven hits and two walks with two strikeouts in seven-plus innings. Castano's effort helped BU win its first series over a Baseball America ranked opponent since sweeping No. 13 Cal Poly on Feb. 13-15, 2015, in Waco and first series win over a top 10 ranked Baseball America opponent since taking two of three from No. 4 Cal State Fullerton on March 7-9, 2014, in Waco.

The honor marks the second for Castano this season as he was named Big 12 Co-Pitcher of the Week on March 7 for the first time in his career after he tossed a gem at No. 21 Houston on March 4 to earn the win, allowing five hits and two walks with a then-career-high-tying six strikeouts in a then-season-high seven scoreless innings. The accolade is Castano's third of his career from the league as he was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on April 21, 2014.

Castano's recognition from the league gives BU three this season as Josh Bissonette was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on March 28. Castano gave the Bears their 35th all-time Big 12 Pitcher of the Week selection.

BISSONETTE NAMED BIG 12 NEWCOMER OF THE WEEK

Freshman infielder Josh Bissonette was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on March 28. The Anaheim Hills, Calif., native went 6-for-13 (.462) with four runs, one double, two home runs, five RBI, 1,000 slugging percentage, two walks and .533 on-base percentage in four games for Baylor. At UT Arlington on March 22, he had a walk. In a win over No. 29 Dallas Baptist on March 24, he went 1-for-3 with a walk and two RBI. On March 25 at No. 29 DBU, he went 1-for-3 with a run scored. On March 26 in the series winner at No. 29 DBU, he went 4-for-5 (career-high four hits) with a career-high three RBI, career-high three runs scored, two homers (first two collegiate homers) and a double to extend his on-base streak to a career-high-tying eight games and give him a three-game hitting streak. His two homers mark the second time this season a Baylor player had done so (Darryn Sheppard vs. Stony Brook on Feb. 27).

Bissonette's honor gave Baylor two weekly Big 12 awards this season as Daniel Castano was named Big 12 Co-Pitcher of the Week on March 7. Bissonette is the eighth BU player in program history to earn the newcomer honor and first since Justin Arrington on March 2, 2015.

CASTANO NAMED BIG 12 CO-PITCHER OF THE WEEK

Castano was named Big 12 Co-Pitcher of the Week on March 7 as he tossed a gem at No. 21 Houston on March 4 to earn the win, allowing five hits and two walks with a career-high-tying six strikeouts in a season-high seven scoreless innings. Over his last two starts, Castano is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in 13 innings as he's given up just eight hits and five walks with 11 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .170 batting average.

Castano garnered the honor for the first time in his career and it marks the second time he's received a weekly award from the league as he was named Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on April 21, 2014. He shared the honor with Oklahoma State's Tyler Buffett as he became the first Baylor pitcher to receive the accolade since Sean Spicer on Feb. 16, 2015. Castano's recognition gives BU a weekly award winner in all 20 seasons as a Big 12 member and its 34th all-time Big 12 Pitcher of the Week selection.

MENARD NAMED TO 2016 JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

Junior catcher Matt Menard was named to the 2016 Johnny Bench Award watch list, the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced on March 8. Menard is on the list for the award that is given annually to the top division one collegiate catcher for the first time in his career and is one of 74 recognized. The semifinalists will be announced on May 18 (Menard was not a semifinalist), three finalists on June 6 and winner will be honored on June 30 in Wichita, Kansas, at the 19th annual Greater Wichita Sports Banquet.

Steve Rodriguez, who enjoyed a successful playing and coaching career at Pepperdine University, was introduced as Baylor University's 19th head baseball coach on June 12, 2015.

"We are excited to introduce Steve Rodriguez and welcome him and his family to Baylor," said Baylor Vice President and Director of Athletics Ian McCaw. "Steve is a dynamic leader, players' coach, tireless recruiter and wonderful mission fit for our program. His highly successful coaching career and major league baseball playing experience will afford our student-athletes a rewarding experience as we build a championship program."

An All-America second baseman on Pepperdine's 1992 NCAA College World Series championship team, Rodriguez has spent the last 12 seasons as head coach at his alma mater, leading the Waves to a 401-300* (.572) record, including a 178-109 (.620) mark in West Coast Conference play, with eight NCAA Tournament appearances, five WCC regular-season titles, three WCC Championship Series crowns and a pair of WCC Tournament titles to his credit. He ranks as the second-winningest coach in program history, his 701 games coached are a school-record and he also earned a pair of WCC Coach of the Year awards.

"I am absolutely thrilled to be the next head coach of the Baylor baseball program," Rodriguez said. "Baylor's incredible commitment to athletic success, academics and faith makes this team the ultimate baseball program to be a part of for my family. We are honored and privileged to be part of Baylor Athletics, and we are excited about the future of Baylor baseball."

In 2015, Pepperdine went 32-29 overall, 17-10 in the WCC and captured the WCC Tournament title for the second straight season to earn its eighth NCAA Tournament bid under Rodriguez. The Waves eliminated Clemson and Arizona State in Fullerton Regional action before falling to eventual College World Series entrant Cal-State Fullerton in the NCAA Regional final.

Rodriguez earned 2014 WCC Coach of the Year honors after leading the Waves to a 43-18 overall record (18-9 WCC), the program's most wins since 1999 and the seventh-most in program history, and a sweep of the WCC regular-season and tournament titles. Pepperdine went on to win the San Luis Obispo Regional with a 3-0 record to advance to its first-ever NCAA Super Regional (since the round was instituted in 1999), dropping a heart-breaking three-game series at nationally seeded TCU. Following the 2014 season, he served as an assistant coach with USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team.

Introduced as Pepperdine's 16th head coach on June 18, 2003, Rodriguez guided the Waves to NCAA Tournament appearances in each of his first five seasons as skipper (2004-08), averaging more than 37 wins per season in the process and winning at least 30 games every year, while capturing a pair of outright WCC crowns (2004 and 2005) and a share of the 2006 league title. Pepperdine also won three consecutive WCC Championship Series from 2004-06, advancing to the NCAA Regional final each season, and hosting its first-ever NCAA Regional in 2006.

The Waves were picked to finish fifth in the 2012 WCC preseason coaches poll, but beat San Diego in the final game of the regular season to clinch the league title and would go on to finish second at the NCAA Stanford Regional. For his efforts, Rodriguez was honored with his first WCC Coach of the Year award.

Rodriguez recruited and coached seven All-Americans at Pepperdine, including 2012 WCC Player of the Year Joe Sever, 2012 Brooks Wallace Award winner Zach Vincej and first-team All-American Aaron Brown, and his players earned 85 All-WCC honors. Four of his former players have reached the major leagues - Chase d'Arnaud, Barry Enright, Eric Thames and Danny Worth -- and his players were drafted by MLB clubs 43 times. The Waves tied a school record with nine players taken in the 2007 MLB Draft and had at least two players selected in 10 drafts.

In addition to enriching Pepperdine's proud history on the diamond, Rodriguez and his staff were also tireless fundraisers for the program. Those efforts have paid off with the installation of new stadium seats (2004), a new, state-of-the-art scoreboard (2007), a new backstop (2008), a new padded outfield wall (2009) and new turf in the batting cages (2011).

Prior to becoming just the third Pepperdine player to later become the program's head coach, Rodriguez served as a Waves' assistant coach for four seasons, during which time Pepperdine compiled an overall record of 145-98 (.597), including an 88-32 (.733) mark in WCC play. The Waves captured the 2001 WCC title and made NCAA Tournament appearances in 2001 and 2003.

A fifth-round draft pick of the Boston Red Sox in 1992, Rodriguez played professionally for seven seasons with the Red Sox, Detroit Tigers, Los Angeles Dodgers and Montreal Expos organizations. He reached the majors with both Boston and Detroit in 1995.

A two-time All-American, he was named the 1992 WCC Player of the Year as the Waves posted a 48-11 mark and captured the program's first-ever College World Series title. Rodriguez was named to the All-CWS team and was part of two memorable plays in Omaha: a grand slam that helped defeat Texas in the semifinal round and a late-inning defensive gem in the Waves' 3-2 win over Cal State Fullerton in the championship game. During his three seasons (1990-92) at Pepperdine, the Waves posted a 126-51-5 (.706) record, including a 72-26 (.735) mark in league play, with league titles and NCAA Tournament trips in 1991 and 1992.

Rodriguez' career batting average of .367 ranks second on the Waves' all-time list, and despite playing just three seasons of collegiate baseball, he is tied for third on the school's all-time career runs scored chart (187) and is fourth in hits (271). A first-team All-WCC selection in 1991 and 1992, Rodriguez made a big splash as a sophomore in 1991 when he batted .419, the third-highest single-season average in school history. His 104 base hits that season set a Pepperdine single-season record that still stands and he still ranks among the top 10 in five different single-season categories. In 2001, Rodriguez was named one of the WCC's Top 50 athletes of all time, and was selected to the conference's 40th Anniversary baseball team in 2007.

The two-time member of Team USA played in the 1991 Pan American Games and earned "Player of the Series" honors against Mexico and Cuba. He was also named "Player of the Series" against Korea while a member of Team USA in 1992.

Following his professional playing career, Rodriguez enrolled in classes at Riverside Community College and Chapman University before returning to Pepperdine, where he received a bachelor's degree in public relations in December of 2001. He earned a master's degree in educational technology from Pepperdine in 2003.

Rodriguez and his wife, Kimberlee, have a daughter, Julia, who is a freshman at Baylor, and a son, Nolan. In October 2007, he was honored by the City of Malibu with the Jake Kuredjian Award for his service to the community. In January 2010, Rodriguez won the Top Chef Award at the Baseball Coaches Cooking Challenge hosted by the ESPN Zone in Anaheim, Calif., and successfully defended his title in 2011.
