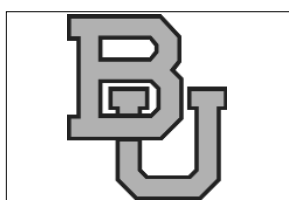

QUICK HITS

- **TOURNAMENT:** Baylor is 36-34 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, including a 5-6 mark in Houston Regional games.
- Baylor has played 30 total games against 12 teams in the 2011 NCAA Tournament. BU is 16-14 in those games.
- The Bears are making their 12th appearance in an NCAA Regional in the last 14 seasons.
- Baylor is one of only 14 schools in the nation with at least 12 regional appearances since 1998.
- Baylor finished the regular season with an 11-9 record in true road games. BU was 5-12 on the road in 2010.
- Baylor won each of its last three series by winning the rubber match in games started by Brooks Pinckard.
- In its last three Big 12 series, Baylor won a series at Nebraska for the first time since 1997, a series at Oklahoma State for the first time since 2003 and a series vs. a top-15 opponent (Oklahoma) for the first time since 2006.
- The Bears have hit 27 home runs in their last 27 games after hitting only 7 in the first 28 games of the season.
- Baylor hit 24 home runs in Big 12 play, two more than any other team in the conference.
- Baylor is 27-5 this season when scoring four or more runs in a game and 2-21 when scoring three or fewer.
- Baylor has grounded into only one double play in 25 games away from Baylor Ballpark this season.
- Baylor has turned 46 double plays this season and the Bears have only been doubled up 25 times.
- The Bears are 17-8 following a loss during the 2011 season.
- Baylor was the only program in the nation to have four players named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District teams in the university division. Chris Slater, Steve DalPorto, Logan Vick & Kolt Browder were honored.
- Baylor's series win at OSU was its first road series win over a ranked opponent since 2006 at Long Beach State.
- Baylor has come from behind to win 13 games this season, and the Bears have eight last at-bat wins.
- Baylor has six walk-off wins this year after recording only one walk-off win during the 2010 season.
- Brooks Pinckard is the 17th different player in Big 12 history to steal 30 or more bases in a season.
- Baylor had won six straight regular season weekend sets before dropping the series finale against Texas Tech in 10 innings. Baylor has had a winning record in 10 of its last 15 regular season weekends.
- Baylor had four players named All-Big 12 by the *Waco Tribune-Herald*. Max Muncy (1B) and Brooks Pinckard (UTL) were named first-team, while Logan Verrett (SP) and Max Garner (RP) were second-team honorees.
- Baylor is the only Big 12 team not to be swept or sweep a series all season.

TEAM QUICK HITS (CON'T.)

- The Bears split the first two games in eight of nine Big 12 series in 2011.
- For the second time in program history, Baylor players won both Big 12 Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week. **Logan Verrett** (Pitcher) & **Chris Slater** (Player) took the honors on March 14.
- Baylor's 12-1 win over No. 5 Texas A&M on April 16 was its largest ever over a top-5 ranked team.
- Baylor is 24-16 in extra-inning games since the start of the 2003 season, including 4-3 this season.
- Baylor head coach **Steve Smith** recorded his 600th career victory when Baylor beat FIU on March 15.
- Baylor has ranked in the nation's top 25 in attendance in all 12 years since Baylor Ballpark opened in 1999.
- Eight players on Baylor's roster have been selected in previous MLB Drafts, tied for third-most in the Big 12.
- With Jake Miller's Big 12 Conference Player of the Week award on May 23, the Bears have had four different Big 12 Players of the Week for the first time in program history. (Max Muncy, Chris Slater & Landis Ware).
- Baylor is 38-18 in its last 56 games at Baylor Ballpark, including a 19-12 mark in Big 12 Conference games.

INDIVIDUAL QUICK HITS

- LHP **Crayton Bare** has pitched in 16 games out of the bullpen in 2011 after pitching in just four games in 2010.
- **Bare** has allowed only six runs in 19 career relief outings.
- Baylor is 7-3 on the season in games started by RHP **Trent Blank**.
- **Blank** earned the win by allowing one run over 5.1 innings at No. 5 Texas A&M (4/16).
- **Blank** allowed one run in 5.0 innings at No. 8 Texas (4/10), but he did not factor in the decision.
- **Blank** picked up two wins in relief last week, going 3.0 shutout innings vs. Dallas Baptist & 4.0 shutout innings vs. Oklahoma.
- RHP **Kolt Browder** has allowed eight hits and struck out 13 in 10.1 innings over 12 relief appearances (.216 OBA).
- 2B **Steve DalPorto** has started 43 of Baylor's 55 games at second base and three times at shortstop in 2011.
- **DalPorto** had his career-long hitting streak snapped at eight games in the middle game of the Texas Tech series (3/19).

- **Ludy** had the Bears' first four-hit game of the season and hit game-winning RBI triple in 10th inning at UT Arlington (4/12).
- **Ludy** has two walk-off hits this season — single vs. Texas Tech (3/19) and single vs. Oklahoma (5/21).
- OF **Wes Mercurio** hit the first pitch he saw in 2011 for a three-run pinch hit homer in the series finale at Georgia.
- 3B **Jake Miller** had a 10th-inning walk-off double in the series finale vs. Oral Roberts (2/20).
- **Miller** became the 4th Bear to win Big 12 Player of the Week this season when he was named on May 23.

- **Muncy** Big 12 overall ranks: 10th batting average (.329), t-10th hits (70), t-6th home runs (9), t-7th RBI (43), t-7th total bases (112), t-6th walks (35), 8th on-base percentage (.433), 9th slugging percentage (.526).
- **Muncy** Big 12 ranks (conference games only): 7th batting average (.349), 4th hits (37), t-3rd home runs (5), t-3rd total bases (61), t-4th walks (17), 5th on-base percentage (.444), t-4th slugging percentage (.575).

BAYLOR VS. 2011 NCAA TOURNAMENT FIELD

Baylor has played a total of 30 games against 12 teams in this season's NCAA Tournament field. The Bears have combined to go 16-14 against Dallas Baptist (1-0), Florida International (1-0), Georgia (2-1), Kansas State (2-1), Oklahoma (2-1), Oklahoma State (2-2), Oral Roberts (2-1), Rice (1-0), TCU (0-2), Texas (1-3), Texas A&M (1-2) and Texas State (1-1). Baylor's last 10 games have all been against NCAA Tournament teams, and the Bears have gone 5-5 in those games.

If the Bears win the Houston Regional, they are guaranteed to play a team they've already faced this season. Baylor has played all four teams in the Fort Worth Regional that is paired with Houston for a Super Regional matchup. The Bears would play either Dallas Baptist, Oklahoma, Oral Roberts or TCU with a trip to Omaha on the line.

BAYLOR NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

Baylor is making its 12th regional appearance in the last 14 years and its 17th overall. The Bears are 36-34 all-time in the NCAA tournament, including 30-23 in Regionals, 4-5 in Super Regionals, and 2-6 in the College World Series. Baylor is 21-11 at neutral sites and 3-10 on the road in the Regional round of NCAA Tournament play. In all NCAA Tournament games, the Bears are a combined 4-12 on the road and 23-17 at neutral sites.

The Bears' last victory on an opponents' home field in the NCAA Tournament was a 3-2 victory at Southern Mississippi in 2003. Since then, Baylor lost twice at Rice in 2006, in 10 innings at LSU in 2009 and at TCU in 2010.

In 2007, the Bears lost their opening-round game to second-seeded TCU and rebounded to eliminate fourth-seeded Prairie View A&M. Baylor led 5-3 heading to the ninth inning in an elimination game against TCU, but the Horned Frogs rallied for seven runs in the frame and won 10-5. Prior to the 2007 regional, Baylor had won five consecutive regional first-round games and had reached the championship round in five straight regional appearances.

In 2009, the Bears knocked off 21st-ranked and second-seeded Minnesota, 5-0, in the opening round, setting up a game with No. 2 national seed LSU for a spot in the championship round. The homestandings Tigers knocked off Baylor, 3-2, in 10 innings, sending the Bears to an elimination game against Minnesota. Baylor led 5-2 after six innings, but the Bears gave up 13 runs over the next three frames, and a seven-run rally in the ninth wasn't enough to complete the comeback.

Last year, the Bears dropped the tournament opener against Arizona, but bounced back to eliminate Lamar in the second game and reached the regional final by knocking off Arizona on the third day. However, the Bears were eliminated later that night by TCU.

BAYLOR VS. RICE SERIES HISTORY

Baylor is 126-87-1 in the all-time series against Rice, including a 44-50-1 mark in games played on Rice's home field. The Owls are 5-2 against the Bears in neutral site meetings, with Baylor winning the most recent matchup, a 12-8 win in 10 innings on the final day of the Houston College Classic on March 6. That win snapped a six-game losing streak in the series. Baylor is 12-31 against Rice during the Steve Smith era, and the first meeting in the series came on April 25, 1919.

The Bears and Owls have met five times in NCAA Tournament play, with Baylor winning the first meeting before dropping each of the last five. The Bears advanced to the championship round of the 2001 Houston Regional by beating Rice 11-10 on May 26, but Rice came back to beat the Bears each of the next two days to take the regional championship. In 2006, Baylor won its opening round game before being knocked off by Rice on June 4, but the Bears bounced back to beat Arizona State on the same day and advance to the championship round, where they were eliminated with another loss to Rice on June 5.

Baylor was sent to the Houston Regional again in 2007, but the Bears and Owls didn't meet, as Baylor eliminated Prairie View A&M and dropped a pair of games against TCU.

HEAD COACH STEVE SMITH

Steve Smith enters his 17th season as head coach of Baylor's baseball program in 2011. In his first 16 years, Smith guided the program to unprecedented heights, including the most successful 10-year run in the program's 106-year history and a College World Series appearance in 2005.

The 2008 American Baseball Coaches Association president, Smith has compiled a 588-387-1 career record, all at Baylor. He ranks second among the program's 18 head coaches in career victories and joins his college coach — Mickey Sullivan — as the only coaches in any sport to amass at least 500 career victories at Baylor.

Smith has led Baylor to 11 NCAA Regional appearances, three NCAA Super Regional appearances, one College World Series appearance and two Big 12 Conference titles. He also has coached 12 All-America selections and eight USA Baseball National Team members while at Baylor.

The 2005 USA Baseball National Team head coach, Smith came to Baylor from Mississippi State where he was an assistant under Ron Polk for five seasons. Prior to that, he served as a graduate assistant for Mark Johnson at Texas A&M from 1987 to 1989.

A former standout pitcher at Baylor in 1982-1983, Smith led the Southwest Conference with a 1.72 ERA as a junior. He was drafted in the fifth round of the 1983 Major League draft by the San Francisco Giants and played four years of pro ball before moving into the coaching ranks.

Smith has tutored eight pitchers in the last 14 years who were selected in the first round of the Major League Baseball draft. He also has coached at least one all-conference pitcher in each of the last 16 seasons.

Smith is married to the former Melinda Newcom of Fort Worth. Melinda, also a Baylor graduate, was a Baylor yell leader from 1981 to 1983. They have two sons, Ryan (17) and Case (15).

BAYLOR VS. ALCORN STATE SERIES HISTORY

Baylor and Alcorn State have never met, but the Bears are 14-0 all-time against teams from the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC). Baylor has twice played a team from thw SWAC in the NCAA Tournament, knocking off Southern 10-3 on May 31, 2003 at the Hattiesburg Regional and Prairie View A&M 9-2 on June 2, 2007 at the Houston Regional.

PINCKARD KEEPING PACE WITH 30 DIVISION I TEAMS

When NCAA baseball statistics were released on May 31, Brooks Pinckard was tied for fifth in the nation with 32 stolen bases. With 51 games played, Pinckard averages .63 steals per game.

Pinckard's average was at least as high as 30 Division I teams, including six NCAA tournament teams: Southern Miss (.44), North Carolina State (.49), New Mexico (.49), Oklahoma State (.50), Stanford (.56) and South Carolina (.59).

Pinckard posted the fifth 30-plus steal season in program history and the 20th in Big 12 Conference history. He needs eight more to tie Mike Robison (40 in 1991) for the single-season record at Baylor, and he needs 10 more to tie Kansas' John Nelson (42 in 2000) for the Big 12 Conference single-season record.

Pinckard became the 17th different player in Big 12 Conference history to steal 30 or more bases in a season. Three Big 12 players have accomplished the feat twice, giving the league 20 individual seasons of 30-plus stolen bases. Pinckard joins Robison, Matt Trozzo and Anthony Hensley as the only Baylor players to swipe 30 or more bags in one season.

PINCKARD NAMED TO OLERUD TWO-WAY PLAYER AWARD WATCH LIST

Baylor center fielder and right-handed pitcher Brooks Pinckard was one of two players from the Big 12 Conference among the 25 players named to the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award watch list, as announced by the College Baseball Foundation May 5.

The Olerud Award recognizes a player who makes an impact both on the mound and at the plate. The second-annual award will be presented in Lubbock, Texas, on July 3 as part of the College Baseball Hall of Fame's Night of Champions.

Pinckard was joined by Texas Tech's David Paiz as the only Big 12 players on the watch list. The inaugural winner of the Olerud Award, Florida State's Mike McGee, was also on the list.

CARDIAC CUBS WALKING OFF WITH WINS

Baylor has six walk-off wins in 2011 after recording only one such victory last season. Baylor's only walk-off win in 2010 came in its 50th game of the season, when Brooks Pinckard knocked a two-run single to clinch the Bears' spot in the Big 12 Championship by winning the series opener against Oklahoma State on May 21.

Baylor won seven games with runs in its final at-bat during the entire 2010 season, but the Bears have already scored the winning runs in their final at-bat in eight games in 2011.

BOUNCE BACK BEARS

Baylor didn't lose consecutive games until its 25th and 26th games of the season. The Bears are 17-8 following a loss in 2011, and prior to dropping a pair of midweek games at the end of March, the Bears hadn't lost consecutive regular-season games since losing a pair of games at Texas on May 1-2, 2010.

In fact, the Bears hadn't lost two in a row with both games at Baylor Ballpark in more than a year before dropping a pair of midweek games against UTSA (3/29) and Lamar (3/30). The last time that happened was when BU had a five-game losing streak from Feb. 27 through March 5, 2010. All five of those losses came against different teams, and the Bears snapped out of the losing streak by winning eight in a row.

Starting with that eight-game winning streak, the Bears have gone 38-18 on their home field, including a 19-6 mark in non-conference games.

CONTINUITY IS KEY

Baylor's starting lineup hasn't changed much since the start of the season. The Bears have used the same player in nearly every game in six different positions, and Baylor has split the other two positions among two players. With the exception of left field, where an injury forced Logan Vick to miss 13 starts, the only position where the Bears have started more than two players at least five times is at designated hitter.

Joey Hainsfurther (26 starts) and Josh Ludy (29 starts) have split catching duties, while Chris Slater (20 starts) and Cal Towey (30 starts) have shared time in right field.

Max Muncy has started every game this season at first base. In fact, Muncy has started at first base in 114 of 115 games since the start of his Baylor career.

Steve DalPorto (43 starts) and Lawton Langford (11 starts) have manned second base, while third baseman Jake Miller (46 starts) and center fielder Brooks Pinckard (37 starts) have started the majority of games at their positions, and Landis Ware (51 starts) has manned the shortstop position. Vick started the first 80 games of his career in left field before a hamstring injury forced him to miss 13 straight starts. Slater (seven starts) and Dan Evatt (22 starts) join Vick (23 starts) in left field, and since returning from the injury, Vick has made 14 starts in center field.

The Bears have used six players in the DH spot: Ludy (20 starts), Hainsfurther (15 starts), Evatt (11 starts), Josh Turley (three starts), Slater (two starts), Pinckard (three starts) and Towey (one start).

BAYLOR RANKED NATION'S 17TH-BEST PROGRAM

Baylor was listed as the nation's 17th-best collegiate baseball program since the NCAA Tournament expanded to 64 teams in 1999, according to a study by *Baseball America* prior to the 2007 season. The publication's study focused on 11 categories, including winning percentage, NCAA Tournament appearances, tradition, All-Americans and players drafted in the top 10 rounds.

With 150 total points, Baylor was the third highest-rated Big 12 Conference program behind only top-rated Texas and 11th-rated Nebraska. Miami, Fla., Stanford, Cal State Fullerton, Rice, Louisiana State, Florida State, Clemson, South Carolina and Southern California rounded out the top 10 of the 64-team list. Other Big 12 programs on the list were Texas A&M (24th), Oklahoma State (29th), Oklahoma (35th), Texas Tech (40th) and Missouri (59th).

Baseball America last did such a study in 1997 and focused only on the 1990s. Baylor ranked 80th in that study; the Bears' 63-spot jump was the second-largest behind only Tulane, which climbed from 83rd in 1997 to one spot ahead of Baylor at No. 16 in this study. With that, Baylor ranked second in the publication's list of top five "rising" programs; Rice and Wake Forest, both up 59 spots, tied for third on the list, followed by Nebraska (up 51 spots).

Programs were awarded one point for every .010 above a .500 winning percentage, five points for each regional appearance, seven points for each super regional appearance, 10 points for each College World Series appearance, 20 points for each national title, one point for each CWS appearance prior to 1999, five points for each first-team All-American, three points for each second-team All-American, two points for each third-team All-American, two points for each player drafted in the top 10 rounds and two points for each former player to play in the Major Leagues during the period of study.

With 19 players drafted in the top 10 rounds since 1999, Baylor tied Louisiana State, Nebraska, North Carolina and Texas A&M for 11th in that category. The Bears tied for 15th in total All-Americans since 1999.

MILLER NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF WEEK; BEARS TAKE TWO FROM NO. 13 OKLAHOMA

Baylor infielder Jake Miller was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Player of the Week on May 23. Miller hit two home runs in Baylor's series win against No. 13 Oklahoma - the Bears' first series win over a top-15 ranked opponent since 2006.

Miller's award came one week after fellow sophomore Max Muncy took the honor. Miller joins Muncy, Landis Ware and Chris Slater to give the Bears four different Player of the Week award winners in a season for the first time in program history.

A native of Houston, Texas, Miller hit .467 (7-for-15) with two home runs, one double, four RBI and two runs scored to help Baylor to a 3-1 week and third consecutive Big 12 series win. Miller reached base at a .500 clip and slugged a team-leading .933 during the week.

Miller recorded a RBI double and a single in the May 17 win over Dallas Baptist. Two days later, he hit a game-tying home run on the ninth pitch of his at-bat in the second inning of the Bears' series-opening win over Oklahoma. He also had two singles in the series opener.

With Baylor trailing 3-1 in the second game of the OU series, Miller hit another game-tying home run, this time a two-run shot in sixth inning, in addition to a walk and a single in the game. Miller's performance helped the Bears win their third consecutive Big 12 series and take fifth place in the Big 12 regular season standings.

Miller joined Muncy (May 23), Ware (March 7) and Slater (March 14) to give the Bears four different Big 12 Players of the Week this season. Josh Ford (twice), Michael Griffin and Paul Witt were honored in 2004, the only previous time Baylor has had four Player of the Week awards in one season.

MUNCY NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF WEEK AFTER BEARS WIN SERIES IN STILLWATER

Max Muncy was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Player of the Week on May 16. The honor is the first time Muncy has received a conference weekly award in his career.

Muncy, a sophomore from Keller, Texas, hit .471 (8-for-17) with two home runs, one double, four RBI and four runs last week. He also drew a pair of walks, posted a .526 on-base percentage and a .882 slugging percentage with 15 total bases. He started all four games at first base and extended his hitting streak to seven straight.

Muncy's performance helped the Bears win a series at No. 19 Oklahoma State for the first time since 2003. The series win was the Bears' first on the road over a ranked opponent since taking two of three from Long Beach State in 2006.

Muncy joined Landis Ware (March 7) and Chris Slater (March 14) to give the Bears three different Big 12 Players of the Week in the same season for just the third time in program history. Josh Ford, Michael Griffin and Paul Witt all won the award during the 2004 season, while Dustin Dickerson, Shaver Hansen and Aaron Miller were all honored in 2009.

SLATER & VERRETT TAKE BIG 12 WEEKLY HONORS AFTER 5-0 WEEK

For the second time in program history, Baylor baseball student-athletes earned both Big 12 Conference Player and Pitcher of the Week, the league office announced March 14.

Chris Slater earned his first-ever Player of the Week award, while Logan Verrett was honored as Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Week for the second time in his career. Verrett and Slater join Mark McCormick and Josh Ford as the only Baylor players to win both Big 12 Conference weekly honors in the same week.

Slater, a senior from Plano, Texas, hit .600 (12-for-20) with two doubles, one triple, one walk, seven RBI and seven runs scored to lead the Bears to a 5-0 record during the week. He entered the week with three hits in 19 at-bats on the season, but with four consecutive three-hit games, his batting average jumped from .158 to a team-leading .385.

A junior from Corpus Christi, Texas, Verrett allowed only one hit in a complete-game shutout against Louisiana Tech on Friday night at Baylor Ballpark. He gave up an infield single leading off the game, then held the next 27 batters hitless and faced just one batter over the minimum while recording a Baylor Ballpark-record-tying 14 strikeouts.

Verrett only allowed four balls out of the infield, all of which were flyouts. He faced only two three-ball counts and only threw two balls to six of 28 batters faced.

VERRETT NAMED NATIONAL PLAYER OF WEEK AFTER RECORD-SETTING ONE-HITTER

Baylor junior right-handed pitcher Logan Verrett was named Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week, as announced by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* March 14.

Verrett earned the award after allowing only one hit in a complete-game shutout against Louisiana Tech on March 11 at Baylor Ballpark. He allowed an infield single leading off the game, then retired the next 20 batters in order before an error in the seventh inning.

Verrett also tied a Baylor Ballpark record with 14 strikeouts – 12 of which were swinging – including each of the last four batters of the game. He was efficient, needing just 110 pitches – 80 of which were strikes – and only going to a three-ball count twice in the game. His 14 strikeouts were the most by a Baylor pitcher since Jason Jennings struck out 14 at Kansas on April 2, 1999.

He faced just one batter over the minimum due to a two-out walk in the eighth inning. The Bulldogs only reached second base one time in the game, after a walk and stolen base in the eighth inning. Louisiana Tech managed to hit the ball out of the infield four times against Verrett and all four were flyouts.

Verrett became the sixth Baylor student-athlete to be named a National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball*. Previous winners include Jon Topolski (1998), Kyle Evans (2000), Jared Theodorakos (2002), Cory VanAllen (2004) and Raynor Campbell (2010).

Theodorakos was named after tossing a complete-game one-hitter at Southern California in 2002, the last time a Baylor pitcher allowed one hit or less in a 9-inning game before Verrett did so.

WARE NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF WEEK AFTER STRONG SHOWING IN HOUSTON

Baylor shortstop Landis Ware was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Baseball Player of the Week for games played during the week of Feb. 28-March 6.

Ware, a senior team captain from Chandler, Ariz., went 7-for-10 at the plate and had multiple-hit games in all three contests to lead the Bears to two wins in the Houston College Classic. For his efforts, Ware was named to the all-tournament team along with teammate Logan Verrett.

In Baylor's win over No. 21 Rice, Ware led off the bottom of the 10th inning with a double off the left-field wall, and he scored the game-winning run on Max Muncy's walk-off grand slam.

EXTRA SPECIAL

Despite going 1-5 in extra-inning games in 2010, Baylor is 24-16 in such games since the start of the 2003 season. Baylor was 4-1 in extra-inning games in 2009, 1-3 in 2008, 2-1 in 2007, 0-1 in 2006, 6-1 in 2005, 1-0 in 2004 and 5-1 in 2003. Baylor is 4-3 in extras so far in 2011.

The Bears won all four regular season games that went to extra innings in 2009, but fell to No. 2 national seed LSU 3-2 in 10 innings in the second game of the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional.

Seven of the 24 wins over the past eight seasons have come on an opponent's home field (Arizona twice, Arizona State, Texas, Vanderbilt and UT Arlington twice). Four of the 24 wins were either neutral-site games or games at Baylor Ballpark in which the Bears were the visitor. Four of the 24 wins have come in postseason play, including two at the Big 12 Tournament and one at the College World Series.

BAYLOR LEADS NATION WITH FOUR ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONOREES

Four Baylor baseball student-athletes earned Capital One Academic All-District VI honors, the College Sports Information Directors of America announced May 5. Baylor was the only program in the nation with four selections in the University Division.

Chris Slater was named to the first team, while Kolt Browder, Steve DalPorto and Logan Vick earned second-team recognition. The four selections tied a program record set when Baylor placed four student-athletes on CoSIDA's academic all-district team in 1999, and the Bears have had at least two academic all-district honorees in six straight seasons with 16 total selections during that span.

NINE BEARS NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-CONFERENCE

Nine Baylor baseball student-athletes were named to the 2011 Academic All-Big 12 Conference Baseball Team. The Bears placed seven players on the first team and two on the second team, and Baylor's Kolt Browder was one of two honorees with a perfect 4.0 grade point average.

The Bears' academic all-conference selections give them three consecutive seasons with at least nine honorees. Baylor had a school-record 11 players honored in 2009 and followed that up with 10 selections a season ago.

Baylor baseball student-athletes have earned 89 first-team academic all-conference awards in the league's 15-year history, 15 more than any other school in the league. Nebraska (74) ranks second, followed by Oklahoma State (59), Kansas (52), Missouri (51), Kansas State (43), Oklahoma (43), Texas (41), Texas Tech (37) and Texas A&M (29).

Among Baylor's seven first-team selections was Browder, a sophomore mechanical engineering major, who joined Kansas State's Jason King as the only student-athletes on the teams with perfect 4.0 GPAs. Browder was also one of only two selections with a perfect GPA when he was named to the first team during his redshirt freshman season in 2010.

The six remaining Baylor student-athletes on the first team were sophomore pitcher Crayton Bare (finance), sophomore infielder Steve DalPorto (business), senior pitcher Jon Ringenberg (health science studies), senior outfielder Chris Slater (finance), junior pitcher Ross Speed (finance) and sophomore outfielder Logan Vick (business).

Additionally, senior shortstop Landis Ware (graphic design) and junior pitcher Logan Verrett (speech communication) were named to the second team.

Speed was named to the first team for a third consecutive season, while Browder, Ringenberg and Slater earned their second-consecutive first-team honors. Ware has been a first or second team selection in each of the last three seasons. It was the first Academic All-Big 12 selection for Bare, DalPorto, Verrett and Vick.

SLATER PICKED AS ONE OF 10 FINALISTS FOR LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Baylor senior outfielder Chris Slater is one of 10 NCAA baseball Division I student-athletes selected as a finalist for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in baseball.

Slater, a Plano, Texas native, joins Texas' Cole Green as the only players on the list from Big 12 Conference schools. A member of the Dean's List and Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll and in each of his first seven semesters at Baylor, Slater is on track to graduate with Finance degree in May.

Slater was a second-team Academic All-American and first-team Academic All-Big 12 selection in 2010. He's also a two-time recipient of the Academic Achievement Award which is given to the Baylor student-athlete with the highest GPA.

After playing in just 35 games and making four starts in his first two years with the Bears, Slater made 22 starts and appeared in 42 games in 2010. He hit .341 with 20 RBI, 22 runs scored and a team-leading .557 slugging percentage. He was one of two players on the team to walk more often than strikeout.

The 10 finalists will be placed on the official ballot that will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans. The winner of the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for baseball will be announced on June 24 at the College World Series.

BAYLOR WINS PAIR IN HOUSTON COLLEGE CLASSIC

Baylor played in the Houston College Classic for the seventh time in 2011. The Bears knocked off Houston behind a strong start from **Logan Verrett** in the opener. Verrett allowed one earned run in 6.2 innings and struck out seven to get the win. Baylor couldn't hold a pair of leads against Utah and was held to one hit after the fourth inning in a 4-3 loss in the second game, but the Bears bounced back to win a back-and-forth game against Rice in the finale. **Max Muncy's** walk-off grand slam in the 10th gave Baylor a 12-8 victory. It was Baylor's first walk-off home run since Feb. 27, 2007. **Verrett** and **Landis Ware** were named to the all-tournament team.

Howard is the top-ranked player in Arizona and No. 123 nationally, according to *Perfect Game Cross Checker*. Stone is ranked 52nd in the state of Texas and Kirkland checks in at No. 79 on PGCC's list of Texas top prospects. Smith is the oldest of Baylor head coach Steve Smith's two sons.
