# 2005-2006 OUTLOOK

The good news for Baylor basketball in 2005-2006 is that the Bears will field a nearly full, albeit young, squad for the first time in **Scott Drew's** three seasons. The bad news is that Baylor will only play half a season due to NCAA sanctions brought on by the former coaching staff.

So for the third straight season, Drew's team is saddled with an unprecedented task. After two seasons of playing with half a team (Baylor has dressed seven or fewer scholarship players for 57 straight games), the Bears will now become the first team in modern-day college basketball history to play a regular-season schedule with no non-conference games.

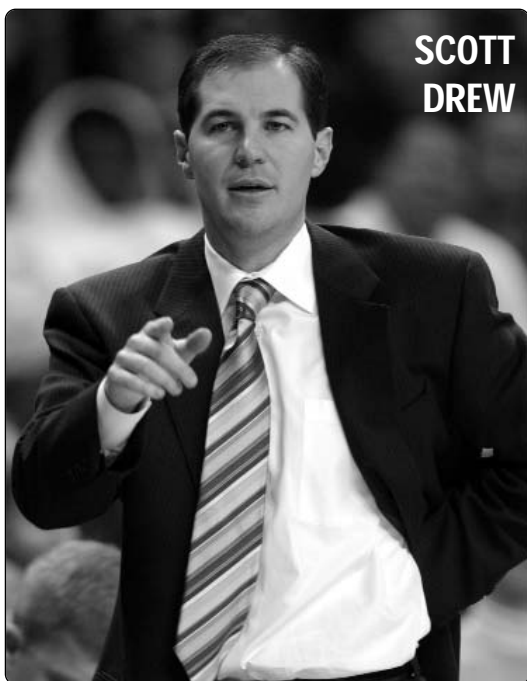
"We're in uncharted waters again," Drew said. "We've been the first two seasons with half a team on scholarship and a bunch of walk-ons playing; and we'll be in uncharted water this season starting an abbreviated schedule in January. You can't call anyone and ask them, 'How do you handle half a season?' It's never happened before."

The squad Drew will debut during conference play is by far his most talented, but is heavy on youth and newcomers. The 14-man pre-fall roster lists nine underclassmen, including seven players who have yet to dress for a game, and just two seniors.

"We face the challenges that are raised from playing half a season and the uncertainties that are raised in half a season; as far as playing time, roles and chemistry," Drew said. "It's a very talented team, but it's a very young team."

In addition to the influx of newcomers, Baylor will return the core of last season's team. Baylor returns 93 percent of its scoring and 90 percent of its rebounding from the 2004-2005 squad, which was the least experienced in the nation (the 2004-2005 Bears returned only one scholarship player and scrapped their way to a 9-19 season).

"We're an unknown," Drew said. "Just like professional teams that make huge moves in the off-season, you have no idea how they are going to respond or how long it is going to take them to jell. With the changes we've had and with the new guys

coming in and without time to adjust, it's hard to tell."

In Year Three of the Drew Era the Bears will carry a near-full compliment of 11 scholarship players - two shy of the maximum. Back are seven of Baylor's eight regular players (including sophomore **Aaron Bruce**, the nation's top-scoring freshman last season) and a seven-footer who redshirted last year (**Mamadou Diene**). They will be joined by the school's most highly thought of recruiting class in recent memory.

The incoming recruiting class, rated the nation's 16th-best class by *Rivals* and No. 17 by *HoopScoop*, includes three national top-100 high school freshmen (**Henry Dugat**, **Curtis Jerrells** and **Kevin Rogers**), a top-5 junior college transfer (**Mohamed Kone**) and what some have referred to as the top international signee (**Jari Vanttaja**).

The group will join Diene and five returning scholarship players to give Drew his first legitimate basketball squad in three seasons at Baylor.

"Our biggest obstacle last year was our lack of height," Drew said of having just one scholarship player taller than 6-6. "This year we are in a situation where we have five guys over 6-foot-6 and we have guys that can rebound. So we've answered that question. We have height and we have athleticism and we have talent."

Back to lead the Bears and run the offense from the point is All-America and Big 12 Player of the Year candidate **Aaron Bruce (6-3, So.)**, the only Bear to start all 28 games last season. Bruce, a freshman All-American last season who led the nation's freshmen in scoring with 18.2 points per game, led the Bears in scoring, minutes (34.8 mpg), assists (3.8 apg), 3-pointers (69), free throws (96) and free throw percentage (82.8%).

"Aaron is one of those players that can make other players around him look better," Drew said.

Bruce, an All-Big 12 honoree last season, spent the summer playing on and serving as captain of Australia's under-21 national squad.

"Aaron will get a chance this year to display his passing ability more," Drew said. "With added talent and depth around him we expect Aaron's assists to increase. He is great at getting out in transition, and he'll be able to get out now that he won't have to have the rebounding responsibility he had before. Aaron can throw up some double-double numbers now."

## MORE BRUCE ALMIGHTY

The Bears will once again be led by sophomore guard **Aaron Bruce**, coming off a sensational rookie year in which he led the nation's freshmen in scoring and earned All-Big 12 and freshman All-American accolades. Bruce, an All-America and Big 12 Player of the Year candidate, is the league's leading returning scorer (18.2 ppg). He spent the summer leading his country as captain of the under-21 Australian national team. Baylor coaches expect his overall play to improve in 2005-2006 with the increase in talent level of his teammates.

## HALF A SEASON

Due to NCAA sanctions brought on by the previous coaching staff, Baylor will not play any regular-season non-conference games this season (thought to be unprecedented in modern-day college basketball). Head Coach **Scott Drew** plans to begin practice Oct. 14 as usual, though the Bears will not suit up for a game until their first Big 12 Conference contest in January.

## PLENTY OF NEWCOMERS

Baylor's 2005-2006 roster lists six newcomers and a redshirt who has yet to dress for a game. The seven rookies include five true freshmen [**Henry Dugat**, **Curtis Jerrells**, **Kevin Rogers**, **Carl Sims** and **Jari Vanttaja**], one redshirt freshman [**Mamadou Diene**] and one junior college transfer [**Mohamed Kone**].

## BU RECRUITING CLASS RANKED 16<sup>TH</sup> NATIONALLY

Baylor's 2005 signee class was rated the nation's 16th-best class by *Rivals* and No. 17 according to *HoopScoop*. The class includes three national Top-100 freshmen and a premier junior college transfer. The signees include four prep seniors, **Henry Dugat** of Dayton (Texas) High School, **Curtis Jerrells** of Del Valle High School in Austin, Texas, **Kevin Rogers** of South Oak Cliff High School in Dallas and **Jari Vanttaja** of Oulu, Finland; as well as **Mohamed Kone** of the College of Southern Idaho. ## SWANSON'S SENIOR EXPERIENCE A RARITY

Fourth-year senior **Tommy Swanson** enters the 2005-2006 season as not only the most experienced member of the Bear squad -- he's also a rare veteran in Baylor's recent basketball history. This winter Swanson becomes just the second Baylor player in the last six years to enter his senior season with more than 60 career games played as a Bear (Swanson has 73 GP; joins former teammate **Matt Sayman**).

## BEARS REACH NEW HEIGHTS... LITERALLY

Unlike last season when Baylor's roster had a noticeable lack of height--with only two players taller than 6-6 (one a walk-on)--the 2005-2006 roster boasts six such players: **Kevin Rogers** (6-8), **Mark Shepherd** (6-9), **Tommy Swanson** (6-10), **Jari Vanttaja** (6-10), **Mohamed Kone** (6-11) and **Mamadou Diene** (7-0).

## BEARS RETURN RARE EXPERIENCE

Baylor returns four starters (**Aaron Bruce**, **Tim Bush**, **Richard Hurd** and **Tommy Swanson**) and seven lettermen (four starters plus **Patrick Fields**, **Mark Shepherd** and **Kevis Shipman**) from last year's young and inexperienced squad that finished 9-19. The four returning starters is the highest total for a Bear team since 1996-1997, when Head Coach **Harry Miller** returned four starters from a 9-18 squad and finished 18-12 in the first season of the Big 12 Conference. The 2005-2006 Bears return 93 percent of last seasons scoring and 90 percent of their rebounding.

## INTERNATIONAL ROSTER

Baylor's 14-man 2005-2006 roster boasts 10 Americans and four players from overseas. The four, all signed by **Scott Drew** in the last two years, include sophomore **Aaron Bruce** (native of Australia), redshirt freshman **Mamadou Diene** (native of Senegal), junior **Mohamed Kone** (native of the Ivory Coast, a French citizen) and freshman **Jari Vanttaja** (native of Finland).

## MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Sophomore **Richard Hurd**'s older brother **Lamar Hurd** is the starting point guard at Oregon State.
- Two Baylor players were formerly at other Division I schools. Junior **Tim Bush** played 10 games as a freshman at LSU in 2002-03 and junior **Patrick Fields** was a redshirt at Mississippi in 2002-03.
- Nine of the 14 players on Baylor's roster are Texas natives.
- For the third straight year, Baylor enters the season without its full allotment of scholarships. In 2005-2006 the Bears have 12 available scholarships and have 11 filled heading into fall practice (BU dressed seven or fewer scholarship players in each of the last two seasons).
- Four Baylor players won state championships in high school: **Patrick Fields** (2002 Texas 5A - San Antonio John Jay), **Kevin Rogers** (2005 Texas 4A - Dallas South Oak Cliff), **Mark Shepherd** (2003 Texas private 5A - Austin St. Michael's) and **Kevis Shipman** (2002 Texas 4A - Dallas Lincoln).

# BAYLOR HEAD COACH SCOTT DREW

On Aug. 22, 2003, Scott Drew assumed the head coaching position at Baylor University and took over one of the most daunting rebuilding projects in collegiate basketball history.

Two years into his Baylor tenure, basketball followers nationwide have recognized Drew's accomplishments under unprecedented circumstances (all 57 games Drew has coached at Baylor his teams have dressed seven or fewer scholarship players) as he and his staff have quietly served notice that Baylor basketball is on the rise.

After signing back-to-back Top 20 recruiting classes and milking better-than-expected seasons out of two severely limited squads, Drew has turned heads and given Bear fans a glimpse of the program's potential.

Spirits are high in Central Texas as the Baylor faithful have seen plenty of encouraging signs in the no-quit playing style of the Bears' recently outmanned teams and the never-ending optimism of their young coach.

Drew, at 34 one of the youngest head coaches in Division I basketball, has long been considered a top-level national recruiter. That reputation was evidenced quickly at Baylor when his first two recruiting classes (the first of which was signed during an abbreviated period after his hiring) were rated 10th and 16th, respectively, in the nation. The two classes are widely considered the best back-to-back groups of basketball recruits to ever sign with Baylor.

Drew and his teams have made a positive impression on the court as well, though not necessarily measured solely on wins and losses.

In his first season in 2003-2004, Drew inherited a team with half the allotted scholarship players and he added a handful of walk-ons. The team – which was summarily dismissed by all preseason prognosticators as having no chance to be competitive and perhaps finish winless – surprised everyone by winning eight games, including three Big 12 contests.

Drew and his overachieving Bears finished the

season 8-21 and won over the hearts of Baylor fans and basketball fans alike with their scrappy play and no-quit attitudes. The team exceeded all expectations and Drew was praised for his efforts and mentioned in Big 12 Coach of the Year discussions.

In his second season in 2004-2005 Drew took the court with the nation's most inexperienced team, having returned just one scholarship player-Tommy Swanson-from his first campaign. The Bears fought their way to a better record than the previous season, 9-19, including an impressive 73-72 road upset at Purdue.

Success in the basketball world runs strong in the Drew family, from Scott (head coach at Baylor) and brother Bryce (former NBA player and current Valpo assistant coach) to father Homer (head coach at Valparaiso).

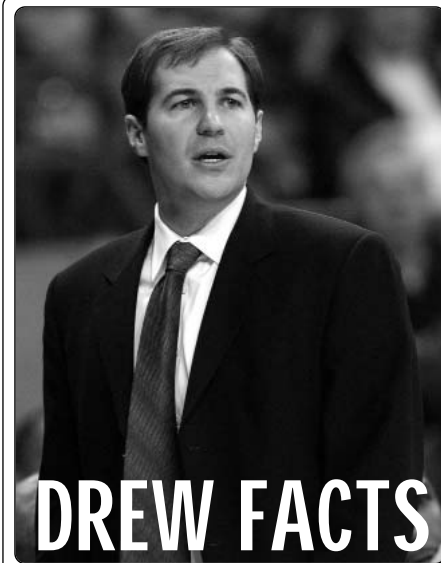
Drew came to Baylor after a decade coaching at Valparaiso University, the final year as head coach. He led the Crusaders to a 20-11 record and into the NIT in 2002-2003. Valpo earned the Mid-Continent Conference regular season championship with a 12-2 league record in 2003.

The previous nine seasons, Drew served as an assistant at Valpo under his father, the legendary Homer Drew. He was promoted to associate head coach for the 2001-2002 season. Drew coached his father's 200th win at Valpo (against Oakland on Jan. 27, 2001) when Homer was ill.

In 10 seasons at Valpo, Scott Drew helped lead the team to six NCAA Tournament berths, including the magical 1997-1998 squad that shocked the nation by advancing to the Sweet 16. Valpo made five straight NCAA appearances from 1996-2000.

The younger Drew is recognized as an outstanding recruiter and was responsible for three national top 20 recruiting classes during his last five years at Valpo.

Drew was named the 1998-99 National Recruiter of the Year by *Court Vision* and helped produce what *HoopScoop* named the nation's sixth-best recruiting class in 2001 (per average

talent), the 13th-best in 1999 (per average talent) and the 27th-best in 2003 (per average talent), a class that included three top 100 national recruits.

Drew was part of the coaching staff that led Valpo to nine straight Mid-Continent Conference championships, including dual regular season and tournament titles in 1994-95, 1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99 and 2001-2002. The Crusaders were regular season champions in 2000-2001 and 2002-2003, and won the conference tournament in 2000.

Drew was the driving force behind Valpo's international pipeline that produced more than 10 players from Europe, Africa and South America from 1995 to 2003. He has European coaching experience, having served as head coach of the Athletes In Action team which toured Croatia and Bosnia in the summer of 1997. In August 1995, Drew assisted the AIA team that traveled to Germany, Macedonia, Bulgaria and Greece.

Drew is a current member of the National Invitation Tournament committee and has previously served as a first vice president for the NABC Assistant Coaches Committee.

A 1993 graduate of Butler University with a Bachelor of Liberal Arts degree, Drew earned a master's degree from Valparaiso in 1994. Drew worked with Butler's men's basketball program from 1991-93.

Drew and his wife Kelly are the parents of one daughter, Mackenzie.

The Bears pulled within 10 at 51-41 on **Tommy Swanson's** three-point play with 9:27 left. Baylor trailed by 15 with 2:17 to go before OSU's 14-0 run to finish the game. The Cowboys held Baylor to a season-low 30.9 percent from the floor. Bush finished with a team-high 19 points.
