MEDIA CREDENTIALS

- ▶ **All requests for working media, radio, television or photo credential requests should be made in writing** by sports editors or sports directors of accredited media outlets on company letterhead. All requests should be made as early as possible and should be **limited to working media only. Requests made within 24 hours of the game may not be considered.**
- ▶ All credential requests should be sent to Baylor Assistant Athletic Media Relations Director **Chris Yandle** at christopher_yandle@baylor.edu.
- ▶ Credentials will be available for day-of-game pickup at the Ferrell Center's media will call table (media entrance on the west side of the Whetsel Practice Facility).
- ▶ Credentials are not transferable and use by anyone other than working media is unauthorized. Credentials used in an unauthorized manner will be revoked immediately. Media allowing unauthorized individuals use of credentials will have credentials revoked for the remainder of the season. All credentials are the property of the Baylor Athletic Department and must be returned upon request.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

- ▶ Only properly credentialed photographers will be allowed in the designated photo areas of the Ferrell Center as specified by the NCAA and Big 12 Conference. Photo credentials are subject to revocation by the Baylor Athletic Media Relations Office at any time.

WEEKLY INTERVIEWS

- ▶ Head coach Scott Drew and Baylor players will be made available for interviews in person or by telephone on a regular basis during the season, at times to be announced. **All interviews with Baylor student-athletes must be coordinated through Chris Yandle in the Athletic Media Relations Office and requested with 24 hours advance notice.** Telephone interviews will be fulfilled at a time that does not interfere with the student-athlete's academic or practice schedule.

GAMEDAY MEDIA SERVICES

- ▶ Statistics, game notes, telephones and work space are available in the Ferrell Center's Media Center for use before and after the game.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

- ▶ **The Baylor locker room is closed to the media.** Coach Drew and player interviews will be conducted in the Ferrell Center's Media Center following the NCAA 10-minute cooling off period.

WEBSITES AND NEW MEDIA

- ▶ Web-based media sponsoring "message boards" or "chat rooms" that allow posting of anonymous information or rumors are **ineligible** for credentials or access to Baylor media functions. If a news-gathering medium has an online site that sponsors anonymous forums, they may continue to request credentials under their traditional medium (newspaper, magazine, radio or television), but will not be granted additional passes or access for online staff.
- ▶ Any online service that places emphasis on the recruitment of potential student-athletes will not qualify for credentials.
- ▶ Credentials will not be granted to any online agency operating sites that are in any way affiliated with gambling, or to "freelance" or "fan-based" sites that are not affiliated with a legitimate news gathering organization.
- ▶ Live, real-time updates of BU home games are the property of Baylor University and unauthorized transmission of such is not permitted.

The Ferrell Center is located on the campus of Baylor University at the intersection of University Parks Drive and LaSalle Avenue.

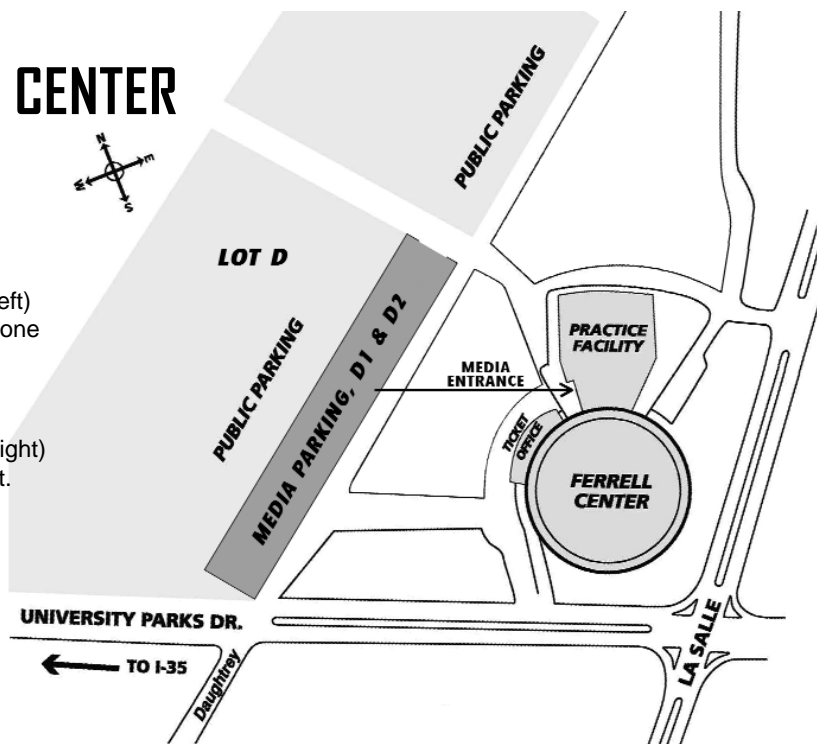
FROM NORTH (Southbound on I-35):

08|09 BAYLOR BEARS BASKETBALL SEASON PREVIEW

After one of the most successful seasons in recent memory, the upstart Baylor Bears are poised for another run to the postseason as Scott Drew's program aims for its first Big 12 Conference championship and are seeking their first-ever back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids in program history. Baylor, which produced just its fourth 20-win season in school history, returns arguably one of the nation's best backcourts that features seniors **Henry Dugat** and **Curtis Jerrells**. Not to be overshadowed by the senior duo, Louisiana products **Tweety Carter** and **LaceDarius Dunn** complete the Bears' incredibly quick and talented backcourt that accounted for nearly 63 percent of the scoring offense a season ago. However, **Kevin Rogers** and his frontcourt mates received help in the off-season with the additions of Texas prep standouts **Anthony Jones** and **Quincy Acy**. Jones and Acy add much-needed size to the post position, but potentially the biggest position on the court for the Bears in 2008-09 will be the play of their seven-footers, **Mamadou Diene** and **Josh Lomers**.

After a record-setting 2007-08 season in which they won 21 games and advanced to their first NCAA Tournament in 20 years, the upstart Baylor basketball program is poised to go where no other team has gone before in school history - back-to-back NCAA tournaments. Sixth-year head coach Scott Drew has built Baylor into one of the best teams in the Big 12 Conference and his Bears are a legitimate title contender. Behind one of the best backcourts in the country, BU posted just the fourth 20-win season in the program's 102-season history en route to its best Big 12 finish and a NCAA appearance. Drew, who assembled the greatest scoring team in school history last season, believes his Bears have gone from the hunters to the hunted in 2008-09.

"Every program goes through a natural maturation," Drew said, "and we have continued to climb and become more successful. Now, instead of being the hunters, we are now becoming the hunted."

Gone are reserves Richard Hurd, Mark Shepherd and Aaron Bruce, the school's seventh-leading scorer with 1,330 career points, who is currently playing professionally with the Adelaide 36ers in his native Australia. Despite the loss of Bruce, the Bears return a strong dynamic foursome in the backcourt, while also adding one of the most exciting Texas high school prospects. What Drew's teams have been able to accomplish in his first five seasons has been nothing short of remarkable and is a testament to him and his coaching staff's dedication.

A preseason No. 21 pick by ESPN.com's Andy Katz in June, the Bears are believed to be one of the frontrunners this season in the Big 12 - a change for a program which posted a fourth-place finish last season in the league (the best finish in school history).

"Being ranked in the preseason is a credit to last year's team accomplishments and this season's expectations," Drew said. "However, preseason polls don't mean much because it's the final poll that counts the most."

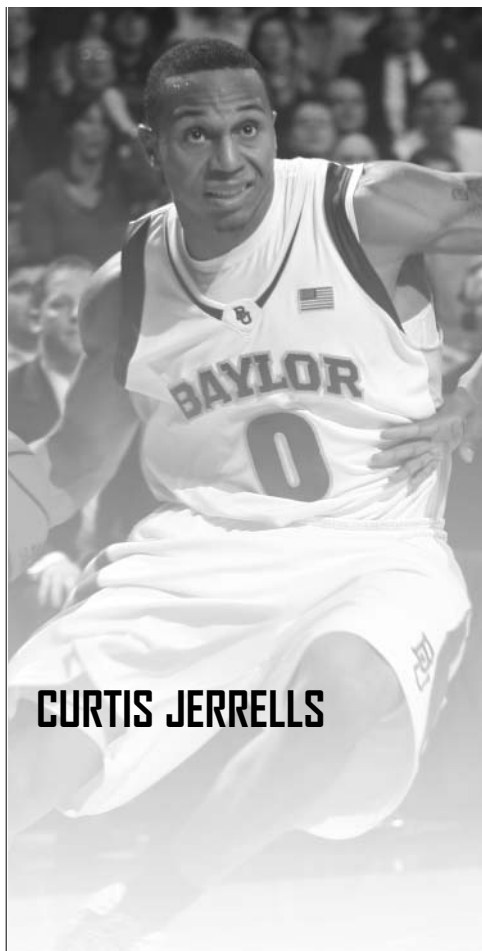
"The fact that we were able to win so many close games allowed us to gain confidence, which transpired into several firsts for the program. The effects of last season's successes have been tremendous as far as respectability with recruits across the country, as well as this season's television schedule and increased ticket sales."

Baylor returns eight letterwinners which have combined for 278 starts in 485 career games. Averaging a school-record 81.3 points per game, the Bears' sharpshooting offense featured a balanced attack with five players scoring at least 9.0 points per contest. Curtis Jerrells led the team with 15.3 points per game, while becoming the 20th player in school history to reach 1,000 career points.

With more than 80 percent of the team's scoring returning in 2008-09, Baylor's hopes of posting back-to-back NCAA tournament trips appear to be well within reach. Behind the many records that fell last season, expectations have grown exponentially over the summer.

"Every team at the beginning of the season sets high goals," Drew said. "We are like every other team - we want to win every game."

"We are excited to have an opportunity to potentially get back to the NCAA tournament and stay a little longer. We now have the confidence and experience to compete for a Big 12 title this season."

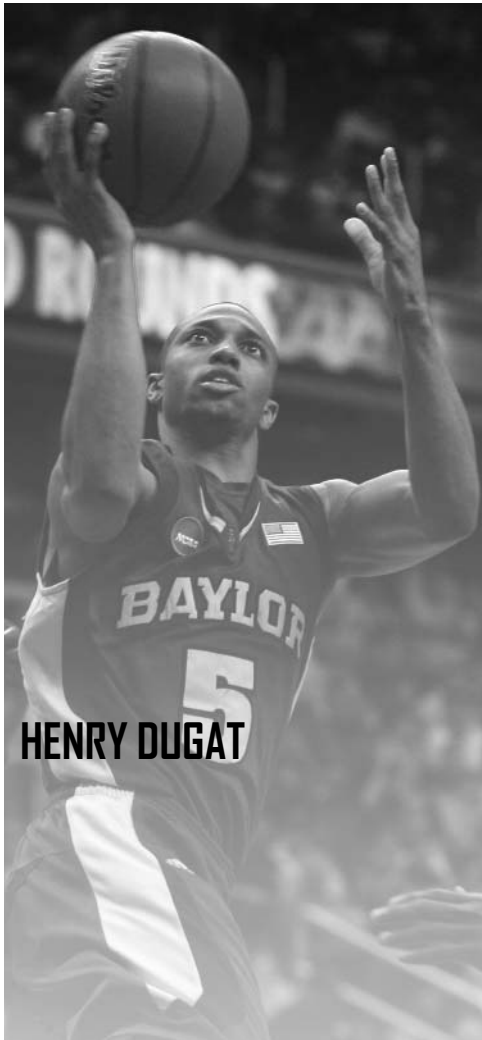

Jerrells, **Henry Dugat**, **Tweety Carter** and **LaceDarius Dunn** provide Baylor with one of the nation's best and most athletic backcourts. Baylor's "Big Four" were responsible for nearly 65 percent of the team's record-setting offensive production last season. Carter (9.6) is the only returning guard that did not average double figures in scoring. Baylor has something many teams in the Big 12 do not - a solid four-guard nucleus that can dictate the pace of the game at any moment.

Baylor returns its starting five from last season's NCAA Tournament game with Purdue - Jerrells, Dugat, Carter, Kevin Rogers and Mamadou Diene.

Jerrells was a unanimous first team All-Big 12 selection, becoming only the second BU player to be named to the All-Big 12 first team (Terry Black, 2001). He later earned fourth team All-American honors by Yahoo.com. Like the departed Bruce, Jerrells will most likely leave his name scattered throughout the Baylor career record book. Jerrells enters the season as the school's 12th all-time scorer and is on pace to become the first player in school history to lead the team in scoring all four seasons. In addition to his scoring ability, Jerrells ranks eighth in career assists per game (3.69) and sixth in all-time 3-pointers made (141).

"CJ has had a phenomenal career so far and continues to progress every day," Drew said. "He really improved his assist-to-turnover ratio last year and hopefully he can take it to 3 to 1 this season. Curtis is working on the defensive end and his offensive output speaks for itself."

Dugat started all 32 games alongside Jerrells in the backcourt and finished third on the team in scoring with 12.2 points per game. He enters his senior season tied for fifth on Baylor's career 3-point shooting list with a 39.0 shooting percentage.

Fourth-year veterans Dugat and Jerrells provided experience and stability last season and enter their senior season as leaders on the veteran squad. The exceptionally

quick Dugat is the most athletic and fastest player on the court for the Bears.

"Henry made his biggest strides last year on the defensive end," Drew said. "He was disruptive in the passing lines and he should become a factor on both the offensive and defensive sides of the ball. He is an explosive scorer and is capable of scoring in bunches."

Carter and Dunn, two of the greatest prep players in Louisiana high school history, round out Baylor's athletic quartet. Carter, the team's top on-ball defender, played all 32 games last season, starting the final eight at guard. In the final eight games as a starter, he averaged 12.4 points per game, while connecting on 19-of-41 from 3-point range (46.3 percent). Carter finished second on the team in assists (89) and 3-point shooting percentage.

"Last year, Tweety really improved his shooting percentages and finished second in assists," Drew said. "There is no reason why he can't continue to improve in all areas of his game. He is one of the best on-ball defenders in the league and a tremendous scorer."

Dunn, one of the highest-rated Baylor signees in program history, lived up to his prep billing as he was a Big 12 All-Freshman and Freshman All-American selection in 2007-08. Dunn finished second on the team in scoring (13.6 ppg), while leading the Big 12 from the free throw line (83.7 percent). He also shot 41.6 percent from 3-point range, which ranks as the fourth-best single-season as well as the third-best career percentage in school history. The 6-foot-4 guard from Monroe, La., has quickly become one of the Big 12's best sharpshooters and is one of Baylor's biggest scoring threats.

"Lace is coming off an excellence freshman season that garnered him Freshman All-American honors," Drew said. "I look for him to continue improving defensively as well as his assist-to-turnover ratio as he continues to mature in all facets of the game. He can score with the best in the nation."

Not to be forgotten in the guard rotation is the addition of freshman walk-on Kendall Wright, who is on scholarship as a member of the Baylor football team. Wright was a three-sport standout in football, basketball and track at Pittsburg (Texas) High School.

"Kendall has a ton of athleticism and can really score," Drew said. "He will be able to help the team in numerous ways once he joins us."

The catalyst behind Baylor's 'Big Four' has been its success rate from beyond the 3-point arc. The five-guard system combined for 228 of Baylor's 275 made 3-pointers a year ago. Departed guard Aaron Bruce accounted for 43 of the team's remaining 47 3-pointers made last season. Dunn and Carter were the only two BU players to shoot better than 40 percent from 3-point range, while Dugat and Jerrells followed with 38.6 and 33.3 percent, respectively.

"Our 3-point weapon is the main focal point of our offense," Drew said. "Without it, we struggle. That is why we continue to improve in other areas, including defense and offensive production in the paint. Shooting the 3 really opens up the offense and makes us go."

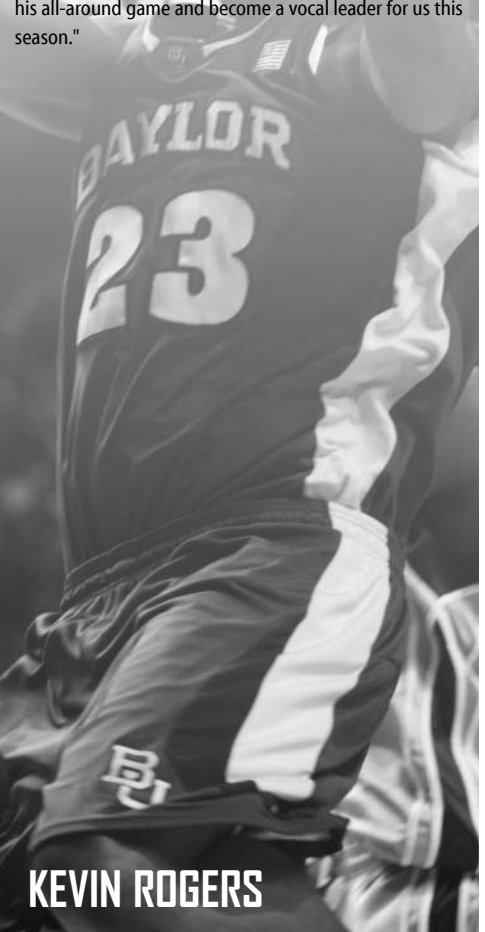

Baylor's six-man frontline combines size, depth and athleticism which will help take some of the scoring pressure off the guards. Returning for their senior seasons are Kevin Rogers, Mamadou Diene and Delbert Simpson. Rogers has quickly become one of the most consistent forwards in the Big 12 Conference.

Rogers earned third team All-Big 12 honors last season after averaging 12.3 points and 8.5 rebounds per game as a junior. He was also picked to the Big 12 All-Underrated team by the media. Rogers has made 62 consecutive starts dating back to the beginning of his sophomore season. He recorded 12 double-doubles last season - the third-most in the Big 12 - and ranks fourth among active Big 12 players with 17 career double-doubles.

"Kevin was our most consistent interior player last season," Drew said. "He went to the basket strong every time, took fouls and got to the free throw line. It's a huge advantage anytime you can average 8.5 rebounds a game and be a double-double guy like Kevin. He should improve his all-around game and become a vocal leader for us this season."

Diene missed the first seven games of last season because of an ankle injury; he underwent ankle surgery following the season. Diene played in the final 25 games, including a start in the Bears' NCAA Tournament game against Purdue. In May, he was named the Big 12 Male Sportsperson of the Year, becoming the first Baylor male to receive the prestigious, eight-year award. He also finished third in the Big 12 and 75th nationally with 1.64 blocks per game. He currently ranks second in career blocks and career blocks per game in school history behind current L.A. Clipper Brian Skinner.

"Mamadou was healthy this summer and rehabbed for six weeks following ankle surgery at the end of the season," Drew said. "He had a chance to strengthen and rejuvenate his ankles. We look for him to have a great senior season so long as he can stay injury-free."

Simpson, a 6-foot-8 junior college transfer last season, chipped in 2.3 points and 2.2 rebounds in 25 games in a reserve role. The athletic senior power forward adds much-needed depth to the Baylor frontcourt.

"Delbert had some really good moments in his first season," Drew said. "We need him to be more consistent with those good moments. He helped us win big games at South Carolina and Missouri. He had a good summer and should take another step forward in his senior season."

Junior Texan **Josh Lomers** is the fourth returning big man for the Bears. The physical seven-footer shot 61.1 percent from the floor last season, while starting 24 games

at center. Lomers has played in 61 of the Bears' 63 games in his first two seasons.

"Josh had a chance to become, bigger, faster, stronger and more athletic this summer," Drew said. "He should to continue to progress on the court as long as he stays healthy."

Adding to the four frontline veterans are redshirt freshman **Fred Ellis** and true freshmen **Anthony Jones** and **Quincy Acy**.

"Fred has gotten stronger in the weight room," Drew said. "He provides us with a player inside and out, while giving us added length on the perimeter and quickness on the interior."

Acy is expected to make an immediate impact early on at Baylor. Acy, an all-area basketball selection at Horn High School (Mesquite, Texas), averaged 17.8 points, 7.8 rebounds and three blocks per game as a senior and was named District 12-5A Defensive Player of the Year. Acy ranked No. 4 in the 2008 TexasHoops.com Texas Top 100, No. 45 in the 2008 Rivals.com 150 and No. 67 by HoopScoop.

"We've added two highly recruited players in Anthony Jones and Quincy Acy," Drew said. "They will both help us tremendously this season. Quincy could make an immediate impact on the court."

Jones was a second team 2008 EA SPORTS All-American pick and was named TABC Classic 4A All-State as a senior. He enters BU as one of Texas' most prized high school prospects after averaging 13.3 points, 4.9 rebounds and 3.1 blocks last season for Houston's Yates High School. "Anthony has great length and will be a complete mismatch player," Drew said. "He can hurt the opponent both inside and out. Like all freshmen, he will have to adjust to the physicality of the Big 12. He has a very bright future at Baylor. He can shoot the 3, handle the ball and block shots. He will help alter and contest shots and give us an added shot blocker."

BIG 12 SCHEDULE

Following its historic 2007-08 season, Baylor will play a school-record seven Big 12 Conference games on ESPN's family of networks during the 2008-09 campaign.

"To have 15 of our 16 Big 12 games televised at the regional and national level is a testament to how hard our team has worked and how far this program has come," Drew said. "Now, our alumni and fans that aren't able to come to all our games have the opportunity to watch us perform on a national stage."

"We are excited to play so many games on the ESPN network, including our two 'Big Monday' games with Kansas and Texas. It is going to be an exciting season."

Last season, Baylor played five games on ESPN's family of networks (ESPN, ESPN 2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic). The Bears posted a 2-3 record and are 7-7 all-time on the ESPN network.

For the first time in program history, Baylor will be featured twice on ESPN's "Big Monday", first at home against defending national champion Kansas on Feb. 2 and then at Texas on March 2. In addition to Baylor's seven nationally televised games, the Bears will play eight conference games on the rebranded Big 12 Network (previously branded as ESPN Plus).

Baylor will open the Big 12 Conference portion of its 2009 schedule at the Ferrell Center against the Texas Tech Red Raiders on Saturday, Jan. 10, at 12:30 p.m. A rematch of last season's epic five-overtime win in College Station follows on Wednesday, Jan. 14, when the Bears visit Texas A&M on ESPN 2. After a Big 12 Network showdown at home with Oklahoma State on Saturday, Jan. 17, the Bears travel to Kansas State (Jan. 21) and Oklahoma (Jan. 24) for a pair of ESPN network contests.

Texas ventures to the Ferrell Center on Tuesday, Jan. 27 for the first half of a home-and-home with the Bears that will be featured on the Big 12 Network. The Bears then face the Missouri Tigers on the Big 12 Network on Saturday, Jan. 31, before returning home to host defending national champion Kansas on ESPN on Monday, Feb. 2.

Three more ESPN dates follow at Texas Tech (Feb. 7) on ESPNU, home against Oklahoma (Feb. 11) on ESPN 2 and at Texas (March 2) on ESPN.

The Bears conclude their conference schedule with four of their last five games on the Big 12 Network. Baylor's Valentine's Day matchup with the Texas A&M Aggies is the only Big 12 Conference game for the Bears that has yet to be picked up for television.



► BEARS DEBUT AT NO. 21 IN ANDY KATZ'S SUMMER ESPN.COM TOP 25 POLL

- A season after BU cracked the Top 25 for the first time since 1969, the Bears premiered at No. 21 in Andy Katz's ESPN.com summer Top 25 poll in June: *"The Bears return essentially in tact, save Aaron Bruce. And that means Baylor...enters the season as one of the top teams in the Big 12. Winning the Big 12 isn't out of the question...the Bears, with a 1-2 punch of Curtis Jerrells and LaceDarius Dunn, have enough scoring - and now experience - to make a run at the league title."*

► 1,000-POINT CLUB COULD GET BIGGER

- Last season, guard **Curtis Jerrells** became the 20th player in school history to eclipse the career 1,000-point plateau joining departed senior **Aaron Bruce**. This season, the Bears could have as many as four players join the 1,000-point ranks. Seniors **Kevin Rogers (880)** and **Henry Dugat (861)** are the first two players in striking distance of the career milestone, while underclassmen **Tweety Carter (575)** and **LaceDarius Dunn (421)** could possibly make a run, too.

► BAYLOR SPORTS ONE OF BIG 12'S MOST EXPERIENCED TEAMS IN 08-09

- Baylor returns four of its five starters from last season's NCAA Tournament team and nearly all of its statistical production for the second season in a row. The Bears return 86.7 percent of last season's points (2254-of-2601), 87.0 percent of rebounds (1041-of-1196) and 82.0 percent of assists (318-of-388). In addition, BU returns 81.1 percent of its minutes played (5355-of-6600).
- Baylor returns eight letterwinners which have combined for 278 starts in 485 career games. Averaging a school-record 81.3 points per game, the Bears' sharpshooting offense featured a balanced attack with five players scoring at least 9.0 points per contest.

► MEN'S HOOPS TO PLAY SEVEN BIG 12 GAMES ON ESPN NETWORK

- Following its historic 2007-08 season, the Baylor men's basketball team will play a school-record seven Big 12 Conference games on ESPN's family of networks during the 2008-09 campaign.
- Last season, Baylor, which finished 21-11 overall and concluded with its first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1987-88, played five games on ESPN's family of networks (ESPN, ESPN 2, ESPNU, ESPN Classic). The Bears posted a 2-3 record and are 7-7 all-time on the ESPN network.
- For the first time in program history, Baylor will be featured twice on ESPN's "Big Monday", first at home against defending national champion Kansas on Feb. 2 and then at Texas on March 2. In addition to Baylor's seven nationally televised games, the Bears will play eight conference games on the rebranded Big 12 Network (previously branded as ESPN Plus).

► AS GOOD AS ADVERTISED

- Sophomore **LaceDarius Dunn** was touted as one of the nation's best recruits when he entered his freshman season in 2007-08. Dunn finished second on the team with 13.6 points per game, while being named to the media's Big 12 All-Freshman and All-Reserve teams. He also was named Big 12 Rookie of the Week twice and later earned Freshman All-America honorable mention honors by *CollegeHoopsNet*.

► FILLING THE VOID

- Although Baylor returns four of its five starters from last season, the Bears will undoubtedly have to fill a major void left by four-year standout **Aaron Bruce**, who left BU as the seventh-leading scorer in school history with 1,330 points.

► DIENE NAMED BIG 12 MALE SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR

- Mamadou Diene** was named the 2007-08 Big 12 Male Sportsman of the Year in May.
- Diene is first Baylor male to receive the prestigious, eight-year-old award and the second student-athlete in school history, joining women's basketball player Jessica Stratton in 2004. He is the first-ever men's basketball student-athlete in the conference to receive the award.
- Since his arrival from Senegal, Mamadou has been active in the Baylor community participating in service projects such as the Waco Independent School District's Raise Your Game, South Bosque Elementary School and the Hillcrest Professional School Health Fair. He is a member of BU's Student-Athlete Advisory Council, has been selected as the 2008 Wilma Rudolph Award winner and participated in the 2006 NCAA Leadership Conference in Orlando, Fla.

► THE BIG DANCE

- Last season, Baylor made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1988 and only its second since 1950.
- Baylor has never made the NCAA Tournament in consecutive seasons and has only advanced to play in the "Big Dance" five times - 1946, 1948, 1950, 1988, 2008.**

► JERRELLS' LEADS ONE OF NATION'S BEST BACKCOURTS

- A consensus first-team All-Big 12 selection in 2008, senior guard **Curtis Jerrells** led the Bears in points (15.3), assists (3.78) and minutes (31.2) per game. He currently ranks 12th in school history with 1,185 career points, eighth in assists per game (3.69) and sixth in 3-pointers made (141).
- Jerrells was named all-conference first team by the league's coaches and the Associated Press, only the second Baylor player to earn Big 12 first-team honors (joins **Terry Black** in 2001). He led the Bears in scoring (14.9 ppg, ninth in Big 12), assists (3.7 apg, sixth in Big 12) and minutes (31.1 mpg) for the third straight season.
- The senior guard has started all 80 career games since arriving at Baylor.

► BU TO PLAY IN ANAHEIM CLASSIC

- Baylor will participate in the second annual Anaheim Classic, an eight-team tournament played Thanksgiving weekend in Anaheim, Calif.
- The 12-game, bracketed collegiate basketball tournament features eight schools that combined to win more than 62 percent of their games last season. The games will air live on either ESPN2 or ESPNU and will be played at the Anaheim Convention Center adjacent to Disneyland on Nov. 27, 28 and 30. Tournament pairings and game times will be announced at a later date.
- Baylor is one of three schools in the 2008 Anaheim Classic field that earned a berth in the 2008 NCAA Tournament, along with Cal State Fullerton of the Big West and St. Mary's of the West Coast Conference. Arizona State of the Pac-10 and the Atlantic 10's Charlotte competed in the National Invitation Tournament (NIT); while UTEP of Conference USA participated in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) event. Completing the 2008 Anaheim Classic field are Providence of the Big East and Wake Forest of the ACC.

► HIGHEST-SCORING BEARS TEAM EVER FINISHED 11TH NATIONALLY IN POINTS

- Baylor averaged 81.3 points per game, highest among Big 12 schools and the 11th most nationally a year. That figure, bolstered by six overtime periods, was the highest total at BU since the '93-94 team finished with an 85.5 scoring average.
- Baylor's 2,601 total points was a new school record.

► SUCCESS FROM THE LINE

- Baylor was successful from the foul line in 2007-08, shooting 74.3 percent (528-711) on free throws, which led the Big 12 Conference. That percentage is the fourth-best figure in school history.
- LaceDarius Dunn** led the team and the Big 12 at the line with a 83.7 free throw percentage, followed by **Aaron Bruce (79.1 percent)** and **Kevin Rogers (77.1 percent)**.

► THREE ALL-BIG 12 PERFORMERS RETURN

- Baylor returns three All-Big 12 performers from a year ago - **Curtis Jerrells**, **Henry Dugat** and **Kevin Rogers**. In fact, Jerrells is one of only two first teamers returning in 2008-09 - the other four first team picks were drafted in the 2008 NBA Draft.

► NO LEAD SAFE VS. COMEBACK BEARS

- Baylor notched eight wins last season after trailing by 9 or more points. In three additional games, the Bears erased double-digit deficits before being edged at the whistle (two of those in overtime).

► BEARS VS. NATIONALLY RANKED FOES

- Baylor's first-round matchup against [20/18] Purdue was the Bears' seventh game against a ranked opponent in 2007-08. The Bears finished 2-5 vs. ranked teams, with wins over [24/25] Kansas State Feb. 23 and an epic 116-110 five-overtime win over [18/16] Texas A&M Jan. 23 that snapped a 29-game losing streak vs. ranked opponents.

► MR. ROGERS' NEIGHBORHOOD

- Forward **Kevin Rogers**, who averaged 12.3 points and a team-high 8.5 rebounds (fifth in Big 12), was named an All-Big 12 selection by both the Associated Press (third team) and the league's coaches (honorable mention). He was also selected to the Big 12 All-Underrated Team by the league's media. He recorded 12 double-doubles last season, including eight in league games - the fourth-highest total among Big 12 players.
- Rogers was named to the 2007 Big 12 All-Improved team after a sophomore season in which he doubled his scoring (12.8 from 6.1 ppg) and nearly doubled his rebounding from his freshman season (7.6 from 4.0 rpg).



On Aug. 22, 2003, Scott Drew assumed the head coaching position at Baylor University and took over one of the most daunting rebuilding projects in collegiate basketball history.

In his fifth season in Waco, Drew and the Baylor program turned the corner, posting just the fourth 20-win season in the school's history en route to its first NCAA Tournament bid since 1987-88.

NATIONAL ATTENTION

The Bears' success in 2007-08 brought national exposure to the reclamation project orchestrated by Drew and his staff. Media outlets praised the efforts of Drew and he was named the Big 12 coach of the year by *Rivals.com* and the District VII Coach of the Year by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA).

Despite being picked to finish ninth in the Big 12 by the league's coaches, the Bears raced to a 12-2 non-conference record (including a Paradise Jam championship) and opened conference play 4-0. The 16-2 start was Baylor's best since 1946 and resulted in the school's first national ranking since 1969. The Bears finished 21-11 overall record and earned the school's best-ever Big 12 finish with a fourth-place tie at 9-7.

Not to be outdone, Curtis Jerrells became just the second first-team All-Big 12 selection in Baylor history as he was named to the top squad by both the league's coaches and the AP. Baylor had three players named to the 2007-08 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 team, tying the school record which was set during the inaugural Big 12 season in 1996-97.

Baylor's place in the national men's hoops spotlight carried over to 2008-09 as the Bears were featured on *ESPN.com's* PreseasonTop 25 by Andy Katz in June.

THE PROGRAM'S FUTURE FOUNDATION

Drew began his overhaul in 2003 when he took over a program decimated by tragedy, player departures, depleted rosters and NCAA restrictions. He slowly and methodically turned the program around by recruiting a solid foundation of talented high school players that, after earning valuable playing experience early in their careers, have brought wins to Baylor as upperclassmen under Drew.

Drew's recruiting success (three of his first four classes were rated among the top 20 nationally), particularly under less-than-ideal circumstances, has stocked the program with top-100 national prospects and provided optimism to Bears fans.

Long considered a top-level national recruiter, Drew's reputation was upheld immediately upon his arrival in Waco when his first three Baylor recruiting classes were rated 10th, 11th and 17th, respectively, in the nation (widely considered Baylor's top consecutive recruiting classes ever). The three-player 2007 class, while not ranked among the nation's top 20, did include the school's highest-ranked recruit in memory - LaceDarius Dunn, ranked 24th nationally by *Scout.com*.

In his first season in 2003-04, Drew inherited a team with half the allotted scholarship players and he added a handful of walk-ons. The team - which was summarily dismissed by all preseason prognosticators as having no chance to be competitive and perhaps finish winless - surprised everyone by winning eight games, including three Big 12 Conference contests.

Drew and his overachieving Bears finished the season 8-21 and won over Baylor fans and basketball fans alike with their

scrappy play and no-quit attitudes. The team exceeded all expectations and Drew was praised for his efforts and mentioned in Big 12 Coach of the Year discussions.

In his second season Drew took the court with the nation's most inexperienced team (one returning scholarship player). The 2004-05 Bears fought their way to a better record than the previous season, 9-19, including an impressive 73-72 road upset at Purdue.

In his third season, Drew's 2005-06 Bears overcame perhaps their biggest challenge to date, when despite being banned from playing any non-conference games (due to violations of the previous coaching staff), Drew's very young Baylor squad defied the odds and won four Big 12 games (matching its conference win total from the previous two seasons) and finished the abbreviated season 4-13. The Bears played through the early season handicap and made news in the latter half of the season with noticeably improved play, evidenced by wins in two of the final four games (two losses by a combined seven points) and wins in four of their final five home contests.

Drew's 2006-07 squad showed glimpses of the success to come, when a team loaded with freshmen and sophomores played a full schedule and with a full allotment of scholarships for the first time in four seasons and posted a 15-16 record - Baylor's most wins in six years. The Bears finished the season with three wins in their final six games, including the school's first win in a Big 12 Championship game since 2001.

PRIOR TO BAYLOR

Success in the basketball world runs strong in the Drew family - from Scott and brother Bryce (former NBA player and current Valparaiso associate head coach) to father Homer (head coach at Valparaiso).

Drew came to Baylor after a decade of coaching at Valparaiso, the final year as head coach. He led the 2002-03 Crusaders to a 20-11 record and into the NIT. Valpo earned the Mid-Continent Conference regular season championship with a 12-2 league record.

The previous nine seasons, Drew served as an assistant at Valpo under his father, the legendary Homer Drew. He was promoted to associate head coach for the 2001-02 season. Drew coached his father's 200th win at Valpo (against Oakland on Jan. 27, 2001) when Homer was ill.

In 10 seasons at Valpo, Scott Drew helped lead the program to six NCAA Tournament berths, including the magical 1997-98 squad that shocked the nation by advancing to the Sweet 16. Valpo made five straight NCAA appearances from 1996-2000.

The younger Drew was responsible for three national top-20 recruiting classes during his last five years at Valpo.

Drew was named the 1998-99 National Recruiter of the Year by Court Vision and helped produce what *HoopScoop.com* named the nation's sixth-best recruiting class in 2001 (per average talent), the 13th-best in 1999 (per average talent) and the 27th-best in 2003 (per average talent), a class that included three top 100 national recruits.

Drew was part of the coaching staff that led Valpo to nine straight Mid-Continent Conference championships, including dual regular season and tournament titles in 1994-95, 1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99 and 2001-02. The Crusaders were regular season champs in 2000-01 and 2002-03, and won the conference tournament in 2000.

Drew was the driving force behind Valpo's international pipeline that produced more than 10 players from Europe, Africa and South America from 1995 to 2003. He has European coaching experience, having served as head coach of the Athletes In Action team which toured Croatia and Bosnia in the summer of 1997. In August 1995, Drew assisted the AIA team that traveled to Germany, Macedonia, Bulgaria and Greece.

THE DREW COACHING FAMILY

In the basketball world, the Drew name is synonymous with winning. Baylor head coach **Scott Drew** spent a decade coaching at Valparaiso, helping lead the Crusaders to six NCAA appearances in nine seasons as an assistant under his father **Homer**, the winningest coach in Valpo history. Also, Scott's brother **Bryce**, sister **Dana**, and brother-in-law **Casey Shaw** were each highly decorated collegiate players.

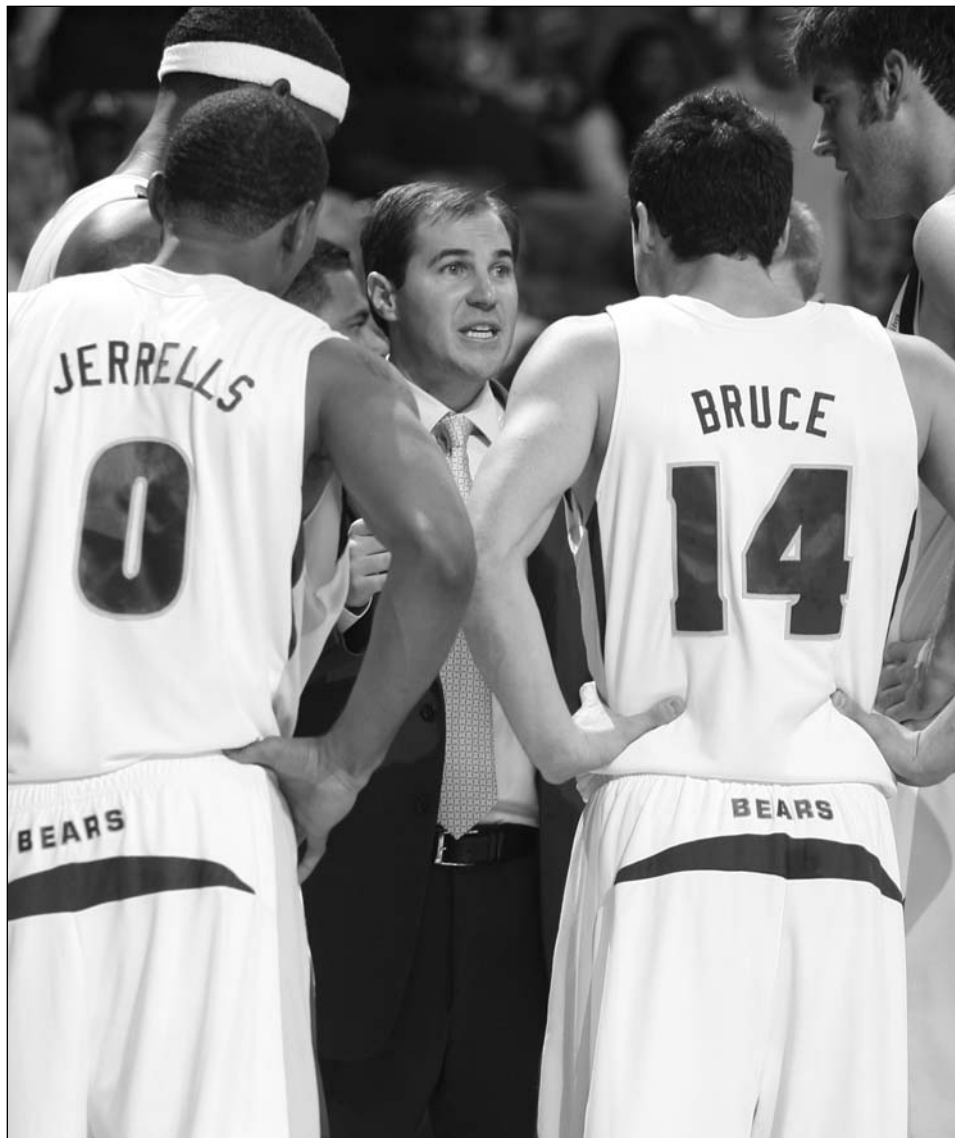
- **Homer Drew**, past and present head coach at Valparaiso, served 14 seasons as head coach at Valpo before handing over the reins to Scott for the 2002-2003 season. When Scott left Valpo for Baylor, Homer returned to coach the Crusaders.
- **Bryce Drew**, a 1998 first-round pick by the Houston Rockets, played six seasons in the NBA and is now an assistant at Valpo under his father. Bryce is best known for hitting the game-winning shot to beat Mississippi in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Tournament. That season, Bryce earned all-conference honors for the third straight season as Valpo advanced to its first-ever Sweet 16.
- **Dana Drew-Shaw** was a two-time MAC Player of the Year at Toledo. She was MAC all-tournament three times, the only player in MAC history to win the award more than once, and was a two-time first-team Academic All-American.
- **Casey Shaw** finished his career at Toledo in the top five in career points and rebounds and was a 1998 second-round draft choice of the Philadelphia 76ers. A three-time all-conference selection, Shaw was named third-team Academic All-America as a senior.

Drew is a former first vice president for the NABC Assistant Coaches Committee and previously served on the National Invitation Tournament committee.

A 1993 graduate of Butler University with a Bachelor of Liberal Arts degree, Drew earned a master's degree from Valparaiso in 1994. Drew worked with Butler's men's basketball program from 1991-93.

LaceDarius Dunn scored a career-high 38 points, including six 3-pointers, to lead Baylor past Texas Tech 86-73 at the United Spirit Arena. Baylor finished eight 3-pointers on 19 attempts, led by 6-of-9 shooting from Dunn. The Bears trailed by a point at halftime but started taking control with a 16-6 run in the first 6 minutes of the second half for a 52-43 lead. Baylor later went on a 10-2 run that put the Bears ahead 66-54 with 8:12 remaining. BU went up 78-63 on a dunk by **Kevin Rogers** with just more than 3 minutes to go, and Tech had no more answers after that. Dunn's 38 points was the most by a Baylor player since 1988, the sixth-most in school history, and the highest recorded by a freshman.

In its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1987-88, Baylor was unable to end its 58-year winless drought at the "Big Dance" as the Purdue Boilermakers defeated the Bears 90-79 in the first round of the West Region at Washington, D.C. **Curtis Jerrells** had 27 points and eight assists, **LaceDarius Dunn** and **Henry Dugat** scored 15 and 13, respectively. Jerrells' 27 points broke the record for most points scored by a BU player in the NCAA Tournament (22 by Darryl Middleton). Baylor fell to 3-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, while the Bears' 79 points were the most by a BU team in the tournament. BU led 11-10 before Purdue's Scott Martin hit a 3-pointer and a baseline jumper to ignite a 9-2 run. After a Dunn triple, Purdue scored 13 of the next 15 points to go up 32-18. Baylor eventually fell behind by 25 points in the second half, 54-29, and got no closer than 11 points.
