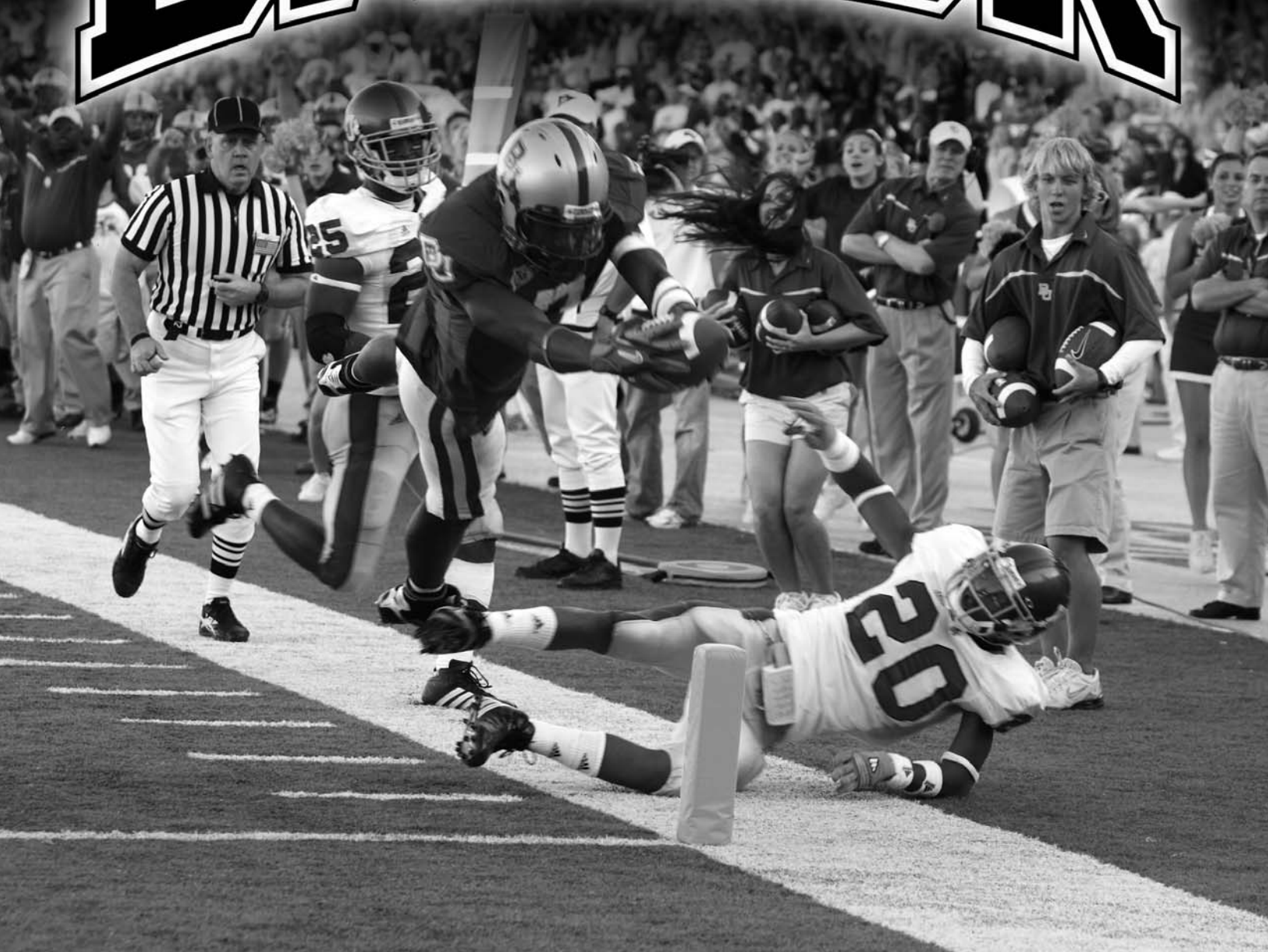

GAME RECAPS

No. 22 TCU 17, BAYLOR 7
SEPT. 3 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 42,733

TCU scored 17 unanswered second-half points to erase a 7-0 halftime deficit and rally past Baylor in the season opener for both teams. It was the first football meeting between the two former Southwest Conference schools since 1995, the league's final season.

Marcus Jackson's 84-yard TD pass to Aaron Brown with 1:17 remaining in the third quarter gave TCU a 10-7 lead, its first of the game. The Frogs pushed their lead to 17-7 when Jackson connected with Quinton Cunigan from three yards out at the 9:32 mark in the fourth.

Jackson, who spelled senior starter Jeff Ballard at the start of the third quarter, finished 11-of-13 for 148 yards and two TDs. Ballard, who was 7-of-14 for 85 yards and one interception, did not play in the second half after taking a solid hit from **Geoff Nelson** late in the second quarter.

Baylor grabbed the momentum three plays into the second quarter when **C.J. Wilson** picked off Ballard's third-and-seven pass and returned it 46 yards to the TCU 20. Four plays later, the Bears grabbed the game's first lead when **Shawn Bell** hit **Mikhail Baker** in the front right corner of the end zone for a 21-yard TD.

The Bears' next drive was thwarted when a third-and-five conversion to the TCU 12 was called back for holding. The next play resulted in an eight-yard loss, and Baylor was forced to punt.

That was a sign of things to come for the Bears, who twice in the third quarter committed turnovers inside the TCU 20.

TCU quelled Baylor's momentum on the opening kickoff of the second half as Donald Massey raced 69 yards down the right sideline to the Baylor 27. However, the Bears' defense forced the Frogs to settle for a Chris Manfredini 27-yard field goal.

Bell finished 31-of-47 for 286 yards with one touchdown and one interception. He established a Baylor record for completions in a regulation game, breaking a 40-year-old mark and one shy of his overall school record of 32 established in the 2004 double-overtime game against Texas A&M.

Terrance Parks led Baylor receivers with seven catches for 65 yards. **Trent Shelton** snagged five passes, tying Baylor's all-time record for consecutive games with at least one catch at 34.

BAYLOR 47, NORTHWESTERN STATE 10
SEPT. 9 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 31,125

In a game marred by penalties, **Shawn Bell** established a career high with 288 yards passing and tied a school record with four TD passes in a 47-10 Baylor victory.

The game saw 31 total penalties, five shy of the NCAA record. Northwestern State was flagged 20 times, one less than its school record and three away from the NCAA record. It was the most penalties ever incurred by a Baylor opponent.

Bell connected on 24-of-41 passes, including nine passes for 158 yards and one touchdown to **Trent Shelton**. It was the first 100-yard game for Shelton, who recorded his 35th consecutive game with at least one catch. That broke **Reggie Newhouse's** Baylor record, established over the 2000, 2001 and 2002 seasons.

Meanwhile, **C.J. Wilson** snagged a pair of first-quarter interceptions, the second of which he returned 52 yards for a TD. One play after Wilson's first pick, Bell connected with Shelton for a 46-yard scoring strike.

Baylor added a pair of **Ryan Havens** field goals in the second quarter to take a 20-0 halftime lead. Northwestern State scored 10 third-quarter points, but Bell answered with the first of two TD passes to **Trey Payne**.

The Bears salted the game away with three TD passes in the fourth quarter; the last was **Thomas White's** second TD catch of the game and **Blake Szymanski's** first career TD pass.

Bell connected with nine different receivers. **Mario Price**, who earned his first career start at tailback, caught five passes for 34 yards. Bell became the first Baylor quarterback to toss four TD passes in a non-overtime game since 1966 when **Terry Southall** accomplished the feat against Syracuse.

WASHINGTON STATE 17, BAYLOR 15
SEPT. 16 • QWEST FIELD • SEATTLE, WASH. • 41,358

Loren Langley's 17-yard field goal with nine seconds remaining capped a 14-play, 81-yard drive as Washington State defeated Baylor 17-15 at Seattle.

Baylor trailed 14-9 with less than six minutes to play when the Bears' defense silenced the crowd at Qwest Field. **Nick Moore** forced a fumble, which **Anthony Arline** picked up and returned 40 yards for a touchdown. That gave Baylor a 15-14 lead with 5:24 remaining in the game, but the Bears failed on a crucial two-point conversion attempt.

Washington State then converted on two third downs in the game-winning drive. Baylor kept the Cougars out of the end zone, denying WSU on three rushes from the 1. The Cougars fumbled on the first rush, but Washington State recovered.

That set the stage for Langley's game-winning field goal.

Baylor built a 9-0 lead through the first quarter. The Bears got a safety when Washington State's first drive of the game ended with an errant snap on a punt that went through the back of the end zone. It was Baylor's first 2-0 lead since 1980 at Texas Tech.

On the ensuing drive, Baylor marched 59 yards on seven plays for a touchdown. **Shawn Bell** capped the drive with a 12-yard TD pass to **Justin Fenty**. It was Fenty's first career reception, and it came on his third career play from scrimmage.

Washington State got on the board with 4:25 remaining in the second quarter when Gary Rogers connected with Jason Hill from 13 yards out. It was the first first-half score allowed by Baylor in the 2006 season.

The Cougars captured the lead on their second possession of the third quarter on a 10-play, 82-yard drive. WSU used a trick play to take the lead as Dwight Tardy connected with quarterback Alex Brink on a halfback pass from 4 yards out.

Bell finished the day with 256 yards on 31-of-48 passing; however, he was intercepted twice for the first time in five games and only the fourth time in his career.

Bell's favorite target was **Brandon Whitaker**, who established career highs with nine catches for 57 yards. Whitaker had the most receptions by a Baylor running back since 1987 and was one shy of the Baylor record.

ARMY 27, BAYLOR 20 OT
SEPT. 23 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 36,218

Tony Moore converted a crucial fourth down in overtime and later scored on a 4-yard run to give Army a 27-20 victory over Baylor.

Army had the ball first in the extra period, and facing fourth-and-one from the 16 called timeout and decided to go for it. Moore appeared to bobble the handoff, but pulled it in and gained 2 yards. He then picked up another first down on a 10-yard screen play — the same play he scored on earlier in the game — right before scoring the winner.

Baylor failed to get a first down on its possession. The game ended on **Shawn Bell's** incomplete pass on fourth-and-6 from the 21.

Austin Miller kicked a 47-yard field goal with 7:29 left in regulation to put Army ahead 20-17.

Baylor responded by going 73 yards in 14 plays for **Ryan Havens'** tying 24-yard field goal with 45 seconds left. Bell, who finished 25-of-33 for 241 yards, completed all six of his passes on the drive.

Baylor took a 10-0 lead in the first-quarter thanks to a Bell-to-**Trent Shelton** 7-yard TD pass and a 47-yard Havens field goal.

Army's first three possessions Saturday night ended at the Baylor 19. Miller missed his first two attempts before finally kicking a 36-yarder with 5:23 left in the first half.

The first miss was officially listed as a blocked kick, but Miller's 37-yarder got only a couple of feet off the ground and went into the back of an Army lineman. Miller was wide left on a 36-yard attempt early in the second quarter.

Jeremy Trimble returned a punt 59 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 10-10 in the third quarter for the Black Knights.

Paul Mosley ran 2 yards for Baylor's first rushing touchdown of the season and a 17-10 lead late in the third quarter.

That 27-yard scoring drive was set up when Army quarterback David Peveto was blindsided on a blitz by safety **Maurice Linguist** and lost the ball. **Vincent Rhodes** recovered.

But Army quickly responded as Peveto threw a screen pass to Moore for a 21-yard score to re-tie the score at 17-17.

BAYLOR 17, KANSAS STATE 3
SEPT. 30 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 30,752

Baylor's defense held a Big 12 opponent out of the end zone for the first time ever and **Shawn Bell** recorded his 12th career 200-yard passing game as the Bears registered Baylor's first-ever win over Kansas State 17-3.

The Bears, who were out-scored 227-48 in the teams' first five meetings, became the first team to hold Kansas State without a touchdown since a 26-3 loss to Syracuse in the 2001 Insight.com Bowl.

Kansas State out-gained Baylor 341-312 on 10 more plays, but two key turnovers thwarted Wildcat scoring opportunities.

On its second possession of the game, Kansas State marched 74 yards in 10 plays to the Baylor 14 where the Wildcats faced third-and-six. Clayton Thomas rushed to the Baylor 10; but **Anthony Arline** forced Thomas to fumble, and **Alton Widemon** pounced on the loose ball.

Widemon again recovered a fumble in the third. Josh Freeman connected with Yamon Figs down the left sideline on a 2nd and 20 from Kansas State's 20. Figs got past **James Todd**, who chased down Figs and forced the fumble at the Baylor 12.

Those were K-State's only two ventures into the Baylor red zone.

Bell finished 25-of-46 for 282 yards and two TDs, tying **Don Trull's** school record for career 200-yard games. The first scoring strike was a 75-yard toss to **Trent Shelton**, who snagged the pass near midfield and raced down the left sideline for the game's first score. It was the longest pass play of Bell's career and tied for the 20th-longest pass in Baylor history.

Kansas State got a 41-yard Jeff Snodgrass field goal late in the first half as Baylor held its sixth consecutive opponent without a first-quarter score for the first time since the 1990-91 seasons.

Baylor held Kansas State on three plays to open the second half, and **Queito Teasley** returned the ensuing punt 47 yards to the Wildcats' 33. The Bears followed with a seven-play drive that culminated in a Bell-to-**Dominique Zeigler** 11-yard TD pass.

The Bears added a 22-yard **Ryan Havens** field goal late in the third, capitalizing on the first of **Dwain Crawford's** two interceptions on the night.

Zeigler finished with eight catches for 73 yards, while Shelton recorded his second 100-yard game of the season (3-107).

BAYLOR 34, COLORADO 31 OT
OCT. 7 • FOLSOM FIELD • BOULDER, COLO. • 47,065

Joe Pawelek leapt to snag Bernard Jackson's pass at the goal line on third-and-seven, ending the game and giving Baylor a 34-31 victory in triple-overtime.

Baylor's game-winning points came off the foot of **Ryan Havens**, who booted a 22-yard field goal in the first possession of the third overtime. Colorado rushed twice for a total of four yards on the two plays prior to Pawelek's interception.

While Havens' field goal and Pawelek's interception were the deciding plays, the game's biggest play came on fourth-and-seven at the Colorado 10 in the second overtime. That is when **Shawn Bell** found **Trent Shelton** in the front left corner of the end zone for a TD. Havens' extra point tied the game at 31-31 and sent it to a third extra period.

Pawelek's game-ending interception was Baylor's third pick of the day and the second in which Pawelek played a roll. Early in the second quarter, Pawelek blitzed and got a clean shot on Jackson. The ball popped out of Jackson's hand, and an alert **Corey Ford** jumped to pull it out of the air. That set up Baylor's first score of the day, a 47-yard Havens field goal.

That cut the Colorado lead to 7-3 as the Buffaloes took the game's first possession 80 yards in 11 plays, capped by Mell Holliday's 32-yard scoring run.

Baylor gained its first lead just under the two-minute mark in the second quarter as Bell connected with Trey Payne from 17 yards out.

Colorado knotted the score at 10-10 on a Mason Crosby field goal late in the third, but Baylor recaptured the lead at the 9:24 mark in the fourth on **Paul Mosley's** 28-yard TD run. The Buffaloes responded immediately, marching 80 yards in 12 plays to re-tie the game at 17-17; the drive culminated with a 9-yard Byron Ellis TD run with 4:13 remaining. That sent the game to overtime as neither team scored again in regulation.

Mosley, who also had a 1-yard TD run in the first overtime, finished with 85 yards rushing on 20 carries.

Bell was 31-of-44 for 272 yards and two TDs, breaking a Baylor record with his 13th career 200-yard game.

Pawelek led all players with 14 tackles, including 11 solo stops.

No. 6 TEXAS 63, BAYLOR 31**OCT. 14 • ROYAL-TEXAS MEMORIAL STADIUM • AUSTIN, TEXAS • 41,358**

Sixth-ranked Texas overcame a 10-0 first-quarter deficit and turned five Baylor turnovers into 35 points as the Longhorns defeated the Bears 63-31 in the third-highest scoring game in Baylor football history.

Baylor stunned the Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium crowd of 88,966 on its first offensive play. **Shawn Bell** executed a play-action fake perfectly and hit a streaking **Trent Shelton** down the middle of the field for a 67-yard TD pass.

The Bears held Texas to a three-and-out on the ensuing possession and then marched 51 yards in nine plays to the Texas 10. However, Baylor was forced to settle for a 27-yard **Ryan Havens** field goal.

The remainder of the first half belonged to Texas, though, as the Longhorns scored four second-quarter TDs to build a 28-10 lead.

Baylor answered on the opening drive of the second half, driving 80 yards in 10 plays. **Dominique Zeigler** capped the drive with an end-around pass back to Bell for a 17-yard TD. It was the first TD pass of Zeigler's career and the first TD reception of Bell's career.

After two Texas TD drives, Baylor pulled back to within 16 points at 42-24 when **Paul Mosley** split through the middle on a 56-yard TD run to end the third quarter.

Texas put the game away midway through the fourth, scoring three TDs in a 104-second span. The last two TDs came off Baylor turnovers, including the Horns' second defensive score of the game.

Baylor capped the scoring with 13 seconds remaining as Bell connected with **Jacoby Jones** from nine yards out.

Bell finished 25-of-47 for 303 yards, two TDs and one interception. It was the first 300-yard game of Bell's career and the first by a Baylor quarterback since **Aaron Karas'** 359-yard day against Kansas in 2002.

Shelton notched his third 100-yard game of the season, snagging six passes for 114 yards and a score. **Thomas White** established career highs with six receptions for 95 yards. Shelton and White were two of 11 different Baylor players to record at least one reception in the game.

Baylor was held to 27 yards rushing, 56 of which came on Mosley's TD run. Baylor lost 40 yards rushing on five sacks.

BAYLOR 36, KANSAS 35**OCT. 21 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 36,125**

Shawn Bell's 10-yard TD pass to **Dominique Zeigler** with 68 seconds remaining capped the third-largest comeback in Baylor history as the Bears rallied from 18 points down in the fourth quarter for a 36-35 Homecoming victory.

The comeback tied Baylor's 1936 21-18 victory at Texas as the program's biggest fourth-quarter comeback as the Bears scored 19 points in the game's final 9:22 to stun the Jayhawks.

The game-winning TD pass was Bell's fifth of the day, breaking a Baylor single-game record which he already shared with three others. Bell also established Baylor single-season and career TD pass records during the game.

Baylor's chances to snap an eight-game Homecoming losing streak looked slim when Anthony Webb intercepted Bell with 12:40 remaining in the fourth. The Bears got the ball back at the 10:38 mark, but Bell missed on a first-down pass attempt.

From that point on, though, Bell was 13-of-17 for 222 yards and three TDs, the first of which was a 42-yard strike to **Trent Shelton** on third-and-12.

Baylor got the ball back at the 5:33 mark and quickly marched 84 yards on four plays, culminating in a 4-yard Bell-to-Mosley TD pass. The key play in the drive was a swing pass to Zeigler that resulted in a 60-yard gain to the Kansas 4. The Bears scored on the next play, but the two-point attempt failed leaving the deficit at 35-30.

After forcing Kansas into a three-and-out, the Bears regained possession with 2:43 remaining. Baylor's game-winning drive covered 58 yards in nine plays. The key play on the drive was Zeigler's diving catch falling out of bounds at the Kansas 10 on third-and-10. Baylor scored on the next play.

Dwain Crawford intercepted Adam Barmann's fourth-and-22 pass on the game's final play. It marked the second time in three weeks that Baylor ended a game with an interception.

Bell finished 33-of-55 for 394 yards, establishing Baylor records for completions and yards in a game. It marked the fifth time in Bell's career and second time this season that Baylor trailed or was tied in the fourth quarter and Bell led the Bears to victory.

Zeigler finished with seven catches for 122 yards, while Shelton snagged six receptions for 104 yards and two scores.

No. 22 TEXAS A&M 31, BAYLOR 21**OCT. 28 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 51,385**

Mike Goodson rumbled 64 yards on a third-and-four with 2:15 remaining to seal 22nd-ranked Texas A&M's 31-21 victory over the Bears in front of a stadium-record crowd of 51,385.

The Bears suffered more than just the loss of the game as senior quarterback **Shawn Bell** sustained a career-ending knee injury during the fourth quarter.

Texas A&M snapped a 21-21 tie on Layne Neumann's 22-yard field goal with 6:32 remaining. Baylor managed one first down on its ensuing possession, but the Bears were forced to punt the ball away with 4:14 to play.

The Aggies picked up one first down and then essentially put the game away with Martellus Bennett's TD run.

Baylor had one final chance as **Dominique Zeigler** tried to connect with a wide open **Trent Shelton** on a flanker pass; however, the ball just tipped off Shelton's hands and landed incomplete. Bell's replacement, redshirt freshman **Blake Szymanski**, was intercepted four plays later to end Baylor's chances.

Bell finished the game 14-of-20 for 260 yards and one TD. He ended his career as the owner of 21 school records, including every major career and season passing record save career passing yardage, in which he finished second (329 yards shy of **J.J. Joe's** mark).

Zeigler caught five passes for 180 yards and a TD; he had 166 yards on four snags in the first half.

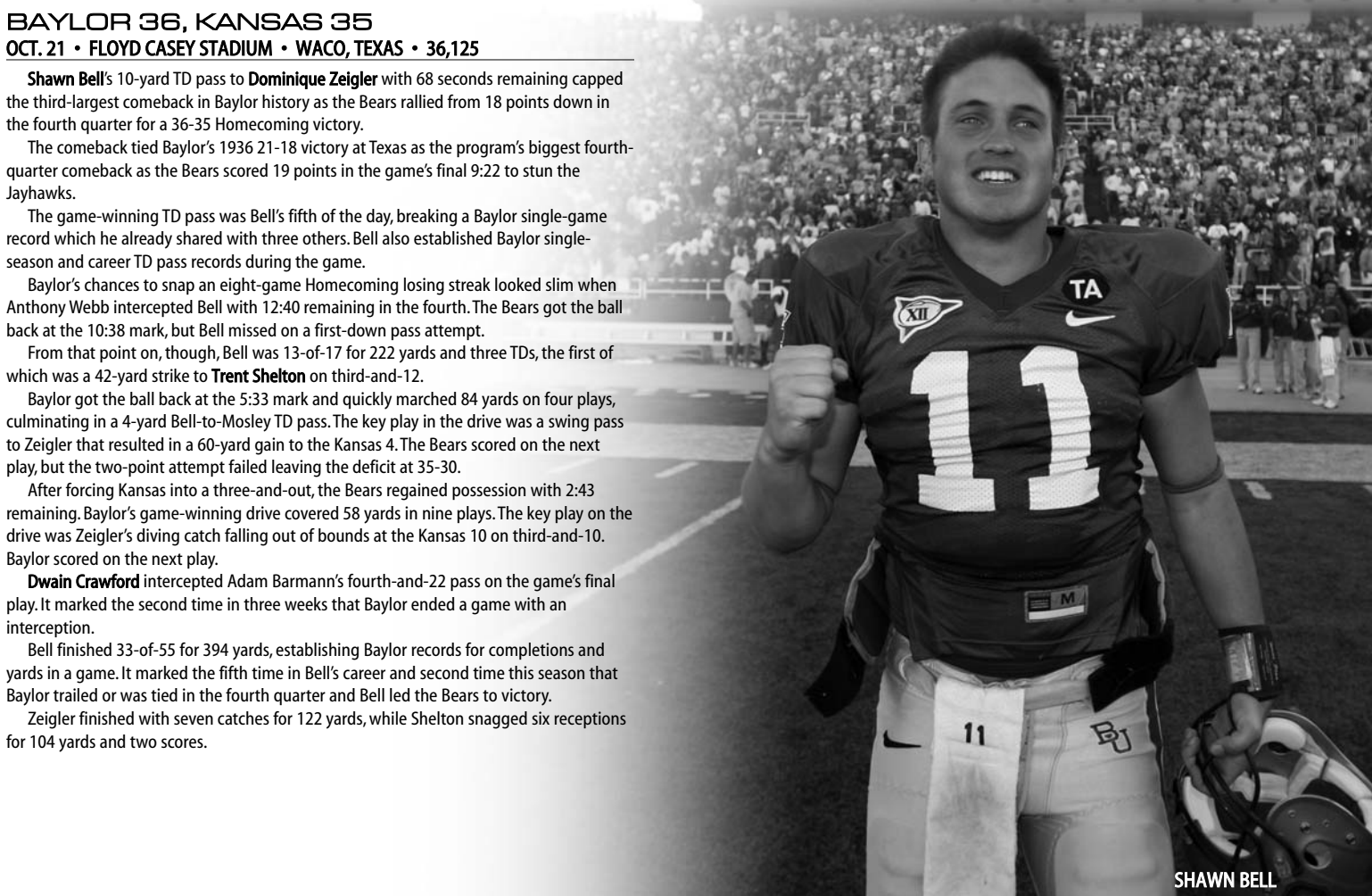
Texas A&M took the game's first lead on a 3-yard Bennett TD reception from Stephen McGee with 8:13 remaining in the first quarter; however, the Aggies missed the extra point.

Baylor answered 78 seconds later on a 79-yard Bell-to-Zeigler TD pass.

After a 2-yard Jorvorskie Lane TD run early in the second quarter, **Brandon Whitaker** found the end zone from 3 yards out at the 9:27 mark.

The Aggies recaptured the lead on the first half's final score with 7:12 remaining before the break. On third-and-five, McGee connected with Bennett, who bounced off a would-be tackler and raced 75 yards for a TD.

Baylor pulled even again at 21-21 on the first possession of the third quarter. **Paul Mosley** capped an 11-play, 80-yard drive with a 1-yard TD run at the 10:19 mark.

TEXAS TECH 55, BAYLOR 21
NOV. 4 • JONES AT&T STADIUM • LUBBOCK, TEXAS • 51,303

Texas Tech outscored Baylor 48-7 in the game's final 38 minutes, overcoming an early 14-7 deficit for a 55-21 victory over the Bears at Jones AT&T Stadium.

Graham Harrell torched the Baylor secondary for 483 yards and four TDs on 35-of-52 passing. Three of his TD strikes went to Joel Filani, who finished with 212 yards on eight receptions.

As a team, Texas Tech tallied 682 yards of total offense. Meanwhile, Baylor managed just 217 yards, its lowest single-game output in more than a year.

Tech marched 80 yards on 10 plays on the game's first possession; the Raiders capped the drive with a 20-yard Harrell-to-Edward Britton TD pass.

Baylor answered with 4:24 remaining in the first quarter. **Blake Szymanski**, who was making his first career start in place of the injured **Shawn Bell**, connected with **Trent Shelton** for a 56-yard TD strike.

A **James Todd** interception set up Baylor's next score as he picked off a Harrell pass at the Tech 28 and returned it to the Red Raiders' 3.

One play later, Szymanski dropped back to pass and then sprinted into the end zone off right tackle.

However, that was the only lead the Bears would enjoy as Tech scored the next five TDs to take a commanding 42-14 lead by midway through the third quarter.

Baylor finally snapped the Tech 35-0 run on another Szymanski 3-yard TD run late in the third quarter.

Szymanski finished the game 16-of-30 for 197 yards with one TD and one interception. He also had 25 yards rushing on 22 rushes, six of which were sacks.

Thomas White led the Bears in receiving with five snags for 46 yards.

Joe Pawelek led Baylor defensively with nine tackles, including one sack.

OKLAHOMA STATE 66, BAYLOR 24
NOV. 11 • BOONE PICKENS STADIUM • STILLWATER, OKLA. • 35,430

Keith Toston rushed for 92 yards and two touchdowns and Oklahoma State capitalized on six Baylor turnovers for a 66-24 win.

Bobby Reid hit tight end Brandon Pettigrew for two first-half touchdowns as the Cowboys built a 38-3 halftime lead on the strength of 28 second-quarter points.

Blake Szymanski passed for 262 yards and two touchdowns for the Bears, but he was intercepted three times and lost a fumble. The loss eliminated Baylor from bowl consideration.

The Cowboys took control early, scoring 49 unanswered points to take a 52-3 lead early in the third quarter. Five Oklahoma State touchdowns came after Baylor turnovers.

Oklahoma State led 38-3 at halftime. On the second play of the second half, defensive tackle Darnell Smith returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown. Five plays later, free safety Donovan Woods returned **Dominique Zeigler's** fumble 57 yards for another touchdown for the Cowboys.

Reid started the rout, hitting Pettigrew over the middle on a 9-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter that put the Cowboys ahead 10-3. The play came after Oklahoma State's Paschal Smith recovered **Trent Shelton's** fumbled punt return.

Toston's touchdown runs of 27 and 8 yards put the Cowboys ahead 31-3 in the second quarter. After Martel Van Zant intercepted Szymanski at the Baylor 42, Reid again hit Pettigrew, this time for a 13-yard score.

Dantrell Savage rushed for 116 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries for the Cowboys — all in the first half. Reid finished 9-of-10 passing for 88 yards before being replaced by Zac Robinson in the second half.

Szymanski led Baylor on three second-half scoring drives, connecting for touchdowns with **Trey Payne** from 8 yards and **David Gettis** from 11 yards.

Paul Mosley finished with 62 yards on eight carries and a touchdown to lead the Baylor rushing attack.

No. 6 OKLAHOMA 36, BAYLOR 10
NO. 18 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS • 31,221

No. 16 Oklahoma scored 23 third-quarter points to pull away from Baylor en route to a 36-10 victory at Floyd Casey Stadium.

Reggie Smith returned one of his two interceptions 42 yards for a TD and set up another score with his other, and third-string tailback Chris Brown ran 24 times for 169 yards and a score.

Oklahoma overcame five turnovers, including fumbles by Smith and Brown that led to Baylor's only scores.

Malcolm Kelly fumbled at the end of a 57-yard gain while the sophomore was running down the sideline toward the end zone in the first quarter. That was one of three turnovers by the Sooners in the first half, when their only two touchdowns came only 69 seconds apart.

The next catch for Kelly was his 21-yard TD on the opening possession after halftime as Oklahoma scored 23 points in less than 10 minutes. Kelly finished with five catches for 115 yards, a week after he tied the school record with 11 catches.

After Alonzo Dotson sacked **Blake Szymanski** for a safety, Juaquin Iglesias returned the ensuing free kick 88 yards for a TD to make it 36-3 with 5:30 left in the third quarter.

Brown had a 35-yard run on the play before Kelly's touchdown, and had a 27-yard gain on the Sooners' first scoring drive.

Paul Thompson threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Joe Jon Finley with 5:23 left in the first quarter, on the drive that Kelly had two third-down catches. After a 15-yard grab for one first down, Kelly was cutting across the middle on another third down when he reached back to make a one-handed grab of a pass thrown behind him.

Baylor then had only two plays before Smith's interception return made it 13-0.

Smith also set up Baylor's only offense score on the ensuing possession, when he botched a punt that was recovered by **Braelon Davis** at the Oklahoma 24. **Ryan Havens** kicked a 38-yard field goal.

Davis also recovered the fumble by Kelly, when he dropped the ball at the Baylor 10 trying to fend off another defender, and returned a fumble by Brown in the fourth quarter 56 yards for a touchdown.

Szymanski was 22-of-45 for 188 yards and the two interceptions. He was sacked five times.
