PRESEASON NOTES:

ALL-EVERYTHING LB JOEPAW NATION'S LEADING TACKLER

In addition to being a returning All-American, preseason All-American, 2008 Academic All-American, candidate for the Butkus Award, Lombardi Award and Lott Trophy, senior linebacker **Joe Pawelek** is also the nation's leading active career tackler with 313 tackles heading into the 2009 season (11 tackles ahead of second-place **Sean Weatherspoon** of Missouri). Pawelek ranked seventh nationally in tackles last season (10.7 tackles per game) and seventh in interceptions (0.5 interceptions per game) - the only player ranked in the top 10 of both categories.

LAKE BACK TO PUNISH OPPOSING BALL CARRIERS

Two-time All-Big 12 safety **Jordan Lake** returns for his senior season as a Jim Thorpe Award and All-America candidate in 2009. The fearless Lake, described as a "cruise missile" by the *Columbia Daily Tribune* and named the Big 12's "Hardest Hitter" by *Sporting News*' preseason publication, led all Big 12 defensive backs with 97 tackles in 2008. He boasts nine career double-digit tackle games.

Sophomore quarterback **Robert Griffin III** has received plenty of ink this off-season following his breakout true-freshman season in 2008. 2009 OUTLOOK



Baylor enters year No. 2 of the Art Briles

Era in 2009, and excitement surrounding the
Bears football program is riding high. Baylor
fans are eager to see how much the Bears, led
by senior All-America linebacker Joe Pawelek,
senior All-Big 12 safety Jordan Lake and
returning Freshman All-America quarterback
Robert Griffin III, can improve on last year's
promising inaugural season under Briles.

"We really feel good about the direction we are going and about how we are going to get there," Briles said. "What we have to do is turn it into reality on the field, but that is going to happen and we are very confident of that."

Baylor fans are hoping Briles and Co. will end the program's 14-year bowl drought dating back to the 1994 Alamo Bowl.

When asked about the strengths of his veteran squad (20 starters return from the 2008 squad) at the conclusion of spring practice, Briles quickly stated, "solid, focused leadership. The ingredients of this team are focus, energy, leadership and belief."

OFFENSE

Ten starters return from an offense that was argueably the school's most prolific since the mid-90s, averaging 376.4 yards and 28.0 points per game in Briles' first season at Baylor. This year's returning players accounted for 91.2 percent of last season's total offense (4,121 of 4,517 yards).

The two departed starters left huge holes to fill, though, as Baylor looks to replace departed tackles **Dan Gay** and **Jason Smith**; two All-Big 12 honorees and NFL linemen.

"It all starts with our offensive line," Briles said. "We have to be dominant up front, both sides of the ball. That's where we have to be men. That never needs to be a doubt concerning our football team."

The **OFFENSIVE LINE** does return two honorable mention All-Big 12 players in senior quard **James Barnard** and senior center **J.D.**

Walton, a Rimington Award candidate. The other returning starter, senior **Jordan Hearvey**, missed spring drills while recovering from a 2008 knee injury that caused him to miss the season's final four games.

"When the heads turn up front offensively, they're looking at J.D. at center," Briles said. "What he has done and what he will do is take that role and help us be a physically intimidating offensive line which is what we have to be."

Penciled into one starting tackle is junior transfer **Danny Watkins** (Butte College), a Canadian who enrolled in January and went through spring drills. Expected to battle for time at the other tackle position are junior college transfer **Marquis Franklin** (Blinn College) and returnees **Cameron Kaufhold**, a redshirt freshman, and junior **Chris Griesenbeck**. Remaining options at guard include incoming freshman **Ivory Wade** (Dickinson, Texas) and sophomore transfer **Philip Blake** (Tyler JC), as well as sophomore **John Jones** and redshirt freshman **Jake Jackson**.

"Danny's a solid addition at left tackle and we'll fill the other gaps as the summer unfolds," Briles said.

The **BACKFIELD** returns relatively unchanged, led by sophomore quarterback Griffin, junior tailback **Jay Finley**, and senior big slot/fullback **Andrew Judy**.

Griffin turned heads nationally with a sensational freshman season that earned him 2008 Freshman All-America and Big 12 Freshman of the Year honors. The dual-threat athlete, described by ESPN.com's Bruce Feldman as "the fastest man to ever play quarterback in college football," threw for 2,091 yards and 15 touchdowns and ran for 843 yards and 13 TDs. Coaches expect even more from the 19-year-old in his second season under center. Griffin's more-than-capable backup at QB is senior Blake Szymanski, a veteran with 13 career starts who ranks in the top 10 of eight career passing categories and owns five single-game school records.

"Robert gives us an added dimension offensively," Briles said. "He's a dynamic player that has an intellect and intensified discipline that

compliment his competitive nature. He will make us a team to be reckoned with. We feel really good about Blake with his maturity and experience being at that position also."


Finley is back after rushing for a team-high 865 yards and seven touchdowns as a sophomore last season. His 72.1 yards-per-game ranked fifth in the Big 12 and led a Baylor 2008 rushing attack that ranked third in the Big 12 and 21st nationally with 195.8 average yards.

"Jay is a guy that fits our system really well," Briles said. "He is proven. He's a person that we certainly have a lot of confidence in."

Finley leads a stable of rushers in 2009 that includes redshirt freshman **Jarred Salubi**, a local product from Waco High School, and sophomore **Terrance Ganaway**, a transfer from the University of Houston.

The **RECEIVING CORP** returns eight of its top nine pass catchers from last season, including sophomore **Kendall Wright**, who led the team with 50 receptions for 649 yards and five TDs en route to being named an honorable mention Freshman All-American. Also in the mix at inside receiver are senior **Ernest Smith**, who caught three touchdowns in just seven receptions last season, senior **Justin Fenty** and junior **Krys Buerck**, who returns to receiver after playing cornerback in 2008.

"Kendall had an outstanding year last year and needs to continue to progress as a football player and leader of the team," Briles said. "We feel great about the inside receivers and it's been a great move moving Ernest inside, he's going to be a lot more productive for us."



Returning at wideout is veteran **David Gettis**, a senior with 18 career starts and the Bears' third-leading receiver in 2008 (29 catches, 391 yards). Other options at wide receiver include two promising redshirt freshmen, **Lanear Sampson** and **Terrance Williams**, veteran senior **Mikail Baker**, and incoming freshman **Josh Gordon** (Houston Lamar HS).

"We need our outside guys, David and Mikail, to step up and be seniors," Briles said. "We feel really good about our young wide receivers Terrance and Lanear. Both of those guys really showed a lot this spring as far as capability."

Fifth-year senior **Justin Akers** returns as starting tight end (14 catches, 2 TDs), and versatile junior **Brad Taylor** will contribute at tight end, H-back and inside receiver.

"Akers has a big body, soft hands and is starting to live up to his ability to be a great player," Briles said.

DEFENSE

"The great thing defensively is that we have a lot of returning starters back," Briles said. "So a lot of these guys have been through the wars and we're now ready as a program to take it to the next level."

Ten starters are back from the 2008 defense (nine remain on defense after the move of Buerck to receiver) and six of the top seven tacklers, highlighted by two-time All-Big 12 defenders Lake and Pawelek. Gone are linemen Leon Freeman (end) and Vincent Rhodes (tackle), as well as part-time starter at cornerback Dwain Crawford.

The **DEFENSIVE LINE** returns fifth-year seniors **Trey Bryant**, a noseguard with 23 career starts, and **Jason Lamb**, end-turned-tackle with a team-high 36 games played, on the interior, as well as Penn State transfer **Phil Taylor**. Taylor is penciled in as a starter at tackle after dominating play on the practice squad in 2008 and in 2009 spring drills. Sophomore **Nicolas Jean-Baptiste** and redshirt freshman **Kaeron Johnson** provide depth on the inside.


"The defensive line starts inside with Phil and Trey," Briles said. "Both of them have to be extremely dominant and forceful with legalized aggression. They have to be tough guys that get after it and bring a tough mentality to our football team. Lamb didn't get to go through the spring

(due to injury) but he will factor in there on the defensive line."

Slated starters at defensive end coming out of the spring are sophomores **Zac Scotton** and **Tracy Robertson**. The young duo (Scotton: 2 starts, 9 tackles; Robertson: 9 games played, 5 tackles) are listed ahead of junior **Jameon Hardeman** and redshirt freshman **Fred Plesius**, who moved from linebacker during the spring.

"Tracy and Scotton both had good springs," Briles said. "Fred came in there and did a good job for us. We feel comfortable with the explosion that we have at defensive end."

Senior All-American <u>Pawelek</u>, the nation's leading active tackler (313) heading into 2009, leads a deep and experienced



LINEBACKING CORP that includes returning starters at outside linebackers and three veteran reserves. Pawelek, a returning All-American and Academic All-American, ranked seventh nationally in tackles last season (10.7 tackles per game) and seventh in interceptions (0.5 interceptions per game) – the only player ranked in the top 10 of both categories. His 313 career tackles stand three shy of Baylor's all-time top 10 list.

"You can't find anyone in the nation that you would rather have calling your defensive signals than Joe Pawelek," Briles said. "He's exactly what you want in that position. He's a guy who can help take us to the next level, which is where we're going."

Returning starters flanking Pawelek are junior **Antonio Johnson**, third on team with 72 tackles (one sack, one interception), and senior third-year starter **Antonio Jones**, fourth on squad with 71 tackles (also three sacks). Veteran backups include juniors **Earl Patin** (52 tackles, three sacks) and **Chris Francis** (23 tackles, one interception) and sophomore **Elliot Coffey** (14 tackles).

"The linebacking unit is the strength of our football team," Briles said. "Antonio Johnson came in and had a great year for us last year, he's very explosive and brings great speed to that position."

Highlighting the **DEFENSIVE SECONDARY** is free safety **Lake**, a fifth-year senior and Thorpe Award candidate. Lake totaled 97 tackles and three interceptions en route to first-team All-Big 12 honors in 2008. His 8.1 tacklesper-game ranked fifth in the Big 12.

"Jordan is coming off another great year," Briles said. "He's doing a great job of leading and had a great spring. He's been through the wars and understands what it takes and how we're going to get there."

The returning starter at 'hero' safety is fifthyear senior **Jeremy Williams** (54 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss). Additional safeties include newcomers **Byron Landor**, a junior transfer from Blinn College, and incoming freshman **Denerick Demby** (Spring Westfield HS), and recently converted-from-offense seniors **Jeremy Sanders** and **T.J. Scranton** (in spring Sanders moved from running back, Scranton from receiver).

"Jeremy also had a great spring," Briles said.
"Byron Landor will be coming in and he's an excellent player who will definitely compete for playing time at the safety position."

At the corners are three returnees with starting experience from last season: juniors **Tim Atchison** (three starts, 31 tackles) and **Antareis Bryan** (three starts, 33 tackles, one interception), and sophomore **Trentson Hill** (five starts, 30 tackles, one interception). Junior **Clifton Odom** and sophomore converted receiver **Romie Blaylock** provide depth.


"Antareis stepped up and had a good spring," Briles said. "He took care of the things he needed to take care of which was becoming stronger and more physical. Trentson had a good spring and Tim had a solid spring so we feel good about those guys at cornerback."

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Bears return both kickers in junior punter **Derek Epperson** and sophomore placekicker **Ben Parks**, as well as senior deep snapper **Carter Brunelle**. Epperson, a third-year starter, was a 2008 All-Big 12 and a Ray Guy Award

semifinalist and has been named a 2009 preseason All-American. Epperson's 44.3 punting average ranked ninth nationally, and the team's 38.8 net punting average ranked seventh nationally. Parks hit on 6-of-9 field goals and 39-of-44 PATs in 2008. Fifth-year senior kick returner **Mikail Baker** boasts a career kickoff return average of 24.7 (third best in school history).

"You can buy a lot of things but you can't buy experience," Briles said. "Our kickers have some experience now. They've lived through it, felt it and now they'll know how to deal with it. Derek had a great year and I think he'll be one of the top punters in America."



BAYLOR PRESEASON NOTES CONTINUED:

MORE GRIFFIN...

Robert Griffin III was named a 2008 Freshman All-American after his standout rookie season (as the nation's youngest starting QB at 18 years old) in which he set an NCAA FBS record of 209 passes without an interception to start a career (also broke BU's record for overall completions without a pick). Griffin threw for 2,091 yards and 15 TDs (only three interceptions) and ran for 843 yards and 13 TDs as a true freshman.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE IN 2009

After playing eight teams that went to bowl games in each of the last two seasons, Baylor is again slated to face eight returning bowl teams on its 2009 schedule, including five of its eight Big 12 opponents.

Baylor's 12 2009 opponents combined for a 96-58 (.623) record last season and eight played in bowl games—Wake Forest (Eaglebank champs), UConn (International champs), Oklahoma (BCS Championship), Oklahoma State (Holiday champs), Nebraska (Gator champs), Missouri (Alamo champs), Texas (Fiesta champs) and Texas Tech (Cotton). Baylor's eight 2009 Big 12 foes were 69-35 (.663) last season and recorded three of the league's four bowl wins.

The Bears play three of four 2009 non-conference games at home (Connecticut Sept. 19, Northwestern State Sept. 26 and Kent State Oct. 3) after opening on the road against Wake Forest (Sept. 5). Baylor plays six home games at Floyd Casey Stadium (Big 12 home games: Oklahoma State Oct. 24, Nebraska Oct. 31 and Texas Nov. 14) as well as hosting a seventh "home" game vs. Texas Tech at the Dallas Cowboys' new stadium in Arlington in the season finale on Nov. 28. Baylor's Big 12 road games are Oct. 10 at Oklahoma, Oct. 17 at Iowa State, Nov. 7 at Missouri and Nov. 21 at Texas A&M.

BEARS RETURN HIGH PRODUCTION NUMBERS

The veteran 2009 Baylor squad returns a high percentage of its statistical output from the 2008 season. The Bears return more than three-quarters of the production of most pertinent stat categories, listed below:

EPPERSON TABBED PRE-SEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Junior punter **Derek Epperson**, who inherited Baylor's punting chores from three-time All-American and two-time Ray Guy Award winner **Daniel Sepulveda**, is a consensus preseason All-Big 12 selection and has been tabbed a preseason All-American (first-team by *Lindy's* and *Yahoo! Sports/Rivals.com*), second-team by *Sporting News/Walter Camp*). Epperson is tied for ninth in Baylor history with 24 career punts of 50-plus yards and tied for sixth all-time with five punts of 60-plus yards.

"COUSIN PHIL" TAYLOR NAMED PRESEASON BIG 12 NEWCOMER OF YEAR

Phil Taylor, a defensive tackle who sat out the 2008 season at Baylor after transferring from Penn State, was named the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year by a vote of the league's media. Taylor has been projected an All-Big 12 performer by preseason publications (second-team by *Phil Steele*, third-team by *Athlon*). The 6-4, 355-pound defensive tackle will have two seasons of eligibility with the Bears.

WALTON ANCHORS LINE AS RIMINGTON AWARD CANDIDATE

Senior center **J.D. Walton**, an All-Big 12 honorable mention pick in 2008 (Associated Press) and preseason All-Big 12 selection in 2009 (third-team *Athlon*, fourth-team *Phil Steele*), is an All-America and Rimington Award candidate. Walton has started all 24 games of his career since transferring from Arizona State in 2006. He anchored BU's 2008 offensive line that generated 2,349 rushing yards, the most at Baylor since 1981, as well as 29 rushing TDs.

BRILES' PROLIFIC OFFENSE

The impact of head coach **Art Briles**' coaching on Baylor's football program was evident immediately during Season One in 2008, nowhere moreso than in the stats piled up by the BU offense. The Bears put together the most prolific offensive season since the mid-1990s, with balanced rushing-passing totals (2,349/2,168) and an effecient passing game that set a school record for fewest interceptions (five, in 290 attempts). RETURNING AWARD-WINNERS

Baylor returns eight players who received on-field honors in 2008. The Bears return one All-American, five All-Big 12 honorees and two freshmen All-Americans. The returning award-winners are headlined by senior linebacker **Joe Pawelek**, a 2008 third-team All-America pick by *Phil Steele* and a three-year All-Big 12 selection (consensus first-teamer in 2008). Additional 2008 All-Big 12 returners include first-teamer **Jordan Lake** (senior safety), second-teamer **Derek Epperson** (junior punter) and honorable mention selections **James Barnard** (senior offensive guard) and **J.D. Walton** (senior center). Freshmen standouts from 2008 back as sophomores are **Robert Griffin** (quarterback, first-team) and **Kendall Wright** (wide receiver, third-team), each freshman All-Americans last season and Griffin was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year by multiple outlets. Running back **Jay Finley** (junior) was named second-team All-Texas by *Dave Campbell's Texas Football*.

POSITION CHANGES

Eight Bears played new positions during 2009 spring training, including five that switched sides of the ball. Three offensive players were moved to the defensive backfield: running back Jeremy Sanders (senior) and receiver T.J. Scranton (senior) moved to safety and receiver Romie Blaylock (sophomore) moved to cornerback. Krys Buerck (junior) moved back to receiver after playing last season at cornerback. Sam Sledge (senior) moved from defensive tackle to big slot (fullback). Fred Plesius (redshirt freshman) moved from linebacker to defensive end. Jason Lamb moved from defensive end to defensive tackle and fellow senior Ernest Smith moved from wide receiver to the inside receiver position.

RETURNING STARTERS & LETTERMEN

The Bears 2009 roster includes 20 returning starters and 47 returning lettermen from last season. Nine starters are back on offense (as well as a 10th, **Krys Buerck**, who was a defensive starter in 2008 and returns to offense for 2009), nine starters return from the defense (eight that will play defense in 2009) and both specialists return.

MOST RETURNING STARTERS SINCE...

Baylor's 20 returning starters (18 offense & defense plus two kickers) represent the school's most since 1969, when head coach **Bill Beall** inherited 20 returning starters (10 offense, 10 defense) in his first season in Waco. The only other BU team to bring back more than 18 starters over the last 40 years was **Grant Teaff**'s 1978 squad that returned 19 (17 offense & defense and two kickers).

THREE NEWCOMERS PARTICIPATE IN SPRING

Spring drills represented the first action for three new Bears: 2008 signee **Nick Florence** (quarterback, Garland, Texas), Penn State transfer **Phil Taylor** (defenisive tackle) and December signee and junior college transfer **Danny Watkins** (offensive tackle, Butte College).

SPRING SCRIMMAGE RECAP - April 2, 2009

Robert Griffin III passed for 310 yards and three touchdowns to highlight Baylor's 130-play spring scrimmage April 2 at the Highers Athletic Complex practice fields.

Griffin played roughly half of the scrimmage and added a 1-yard rushing touchdown to go along with his three passing TDs, while rushing for 41 yards.

In total, Griffin had a hand in four of five touchdowns during the controlled scrimmage.

The three passing touchdowns by Griffin were to three different receivers as junior running back **Jay Finley** took a screen pass 60 yards on just the third play run by the first-team offense. **Justin Akers** and **Brad Taylor** also hauled in touchdown receptions from 35 yards and 43 yards, respectively. Griffin completed 19-of-25 passes on the day.

Senior QB **Blake Szymanski** finished the scrimmage with 113 yards on 17-of-29 passing. Freshman **Jared Salubi** carried the ball a scrimmage-high 12 times for 40 yards, while Finley chipped in with 27 yards on six carries.

Sophomore **Kendall Wright**, who participated in the final week of spring after playing on the BU basketball team, led a receiving corps that totaled 458 receiving yards. Wright made five catches for 68 yards. Senior TE **Justin Akers** had in four receptions for 61 yards and a TD.

Senior **Jeremy Williams** led the defense with eight tackles. **Rodney Chadwick** tallied six tackles, while **Earl Patin** and **Antonio Johnson** each had five respectively. **Michael Williams** made the game's lone pick as he stepped in front of a Griffin pass inside the 5-yard line.

HEAD COACH ART BRILES



Art Briles assumed Baylor's head coaching post Nov. 28, 2007, ushering in a new era and a new attitude to the storied Bears football program.

In his first season on the sidelines in Waco it was quickly evident that the Briles Era was underway at Baylor; from the innovative offense, the reintroduction of a solid running game and a record-setting quarterback, to competitive games and no acceptance of moral victories.

Briles' 2008 Bears squad finished with a 4-8 record, but six of eight defeats were at the hands

of ranked opponents (four in top 10) and three losses came by a touchown or less.

Highlights of Briles' first season at Baylor included the emergence of sensational true freshman quarterback Robert Griffin III, the Big 12's top newcomer and freshman All-American, a rushing attack that ranked 21st nationally and third in the Big 12 with 195.8 yards per game (2,349 yards, most since 1981) and 29 touchdowns, and a memorable 41-21 home win over Texas A&M.

Baylor's 1.33 turnover margin ranked fourth nationally and junior linebacker Joe Pawelek ranked seventh nationally in tackles (10.7) and interceptions (.50).

Briles is a proven developer of professional talent, evidenced over the last three NFL drafts where his proteges include the first lineman selected in 2009 (second overall pick Jason Smith from Baylor), the first receiver selected in 2008 (33rd pick Donnie Avery of Houston) and the third quarterback selected in 2007 (36th pick Kevin Kolb of Houston).

A native of West Texas, Briles became Baylor's 25th head football coach after resurrecting the University of Houston's football program in a five-year stretch from 2003 to 2007.

Briles, who inherited a Houston program that was just two years removed from an 0-11 season and won eight total games from 2000 to 2003, posted a 34-28 record with the Cougars and guided them to four bowl games. He ranks as the program's third-winningest head coach behind College Football Hall of Famer Bill Yeoman (160 wins in 26 seasons) and Clyde Lee (37 victories in seven seasons).

Briles guided Houston to an 8-4 regular-season record and a Texas Bowl invitation in his final season (he did not coach the Cougars in the bowl game). Coupled with their 10-win 2006 campaign, the Cougars registered consecutive seasons of at least eight victories for the first time since the 1989 (nine) and 1990 (10) campaigns. The 2007 Cougars finished the season ranked fourth nationally in total offense (501.9 ypg) and made college football history by becoming the first program to produce a 300-yard receiver and a 200-yard rusher in the same game.

In 2006, Briles earned Conference USA and Sportexe Division I-A National Coach of the Year honors after guiding the Cougars to a Conference USA title, a Liberty Bowl appearance and the program's first 10-win season since 1990 with a final mark of 10-4.

The Cougars enjoyed the nation's seventh-best turnaround in 2006, a four-game improvement in the win column over their 6-6 mark in 2005. Houston's 2006 C-USA title, just five years removed from a winless 2001 campaign, marked only the fifth time in the past 30 seasons that a I-A program went from winless to conference champions.

One of nine finalists for the 2006 Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year award, Briles' offense led Conference USA and ranked sixth nationally at 439.9 yards per game. Cougar quarterback Kevin Kolb was Conference USA's consensus 2006 Offensive Player of the Year, as 13 Houston student-athletes earned postseason honors from the media and 12 were honored by the league's coaches. Kolb ended his career ranked third in NCAA history for total offense and fourth in passing yards.

Briles' 2005 UH team finished 6-6 overall, led Conference USA in total offense and played in the Fort Worth Bowl, and his 2004 squad was 3-8.

His rookie season at UH saw the Cougars make school history; as they finished 7-6 and earned a berth in the 2003 Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. He became just the second UH head coach to take Houston to a bowl game in his first season at the helm, joining Yeoman, his college coach. Briles' innovative offense produced a 1,000-yard rusher (Anthony Evans), a 1,000-yard receiver (Brandon Middleton) and a 3,000-yard passer (Kolb)—one of only five Division I-A teams to accomplish that feat.

Briles arrived to Houston from Texas Tech, where he spent three years (2000-02) as the Red Raiders' running backs coach. The Tech ground

game flourished under Briles' direction, increasing its production every year and producing a 2001 first-team All-Big 12 performer in Ricky Williams. The Red Raiders won seven or more games each season Briles was on Mike Leach's staff and went bowling every year.

Prior to moving into the collegiate coaching ranks at Texas Tech, Briles spent 12 seasons (1988-99) as head coach and athletic director at Stephenville [Texas] High School. His Yellowjacket teams won four state championships, capturing back-to-back crowns in 1993 and 1994 and repeating that feat in 1998 and 1999.

Briles, a former Texas High School Coaches Association president, has spent his entire coaching career in the state of Texas. Following in his father's footsteps, Briles began his coaching career as an assistant at Sundown [Texas] High School in 1979 before moving to Sweetwater [Texas] High School as an assistant from 1980-83. He landed his first head coaching job at Hamlin [Texas] High School (1984-86), where he also served as athletic director.

From Hamlin, Briles went to Georgetown [Texas] High School as head coach and athletic director for two seasons (1986-87) before moving to Stephenville in 1988. While coaching in the high school ranks, Briles developed six Division I quarterbacks and had five signal callers throw for over 3,000 yards in a season.

A former wide receiver for the Cougars from 1974 to 1977, Briles was a member of the 1976 Cougar squad that captured the Southwest Conference championship in UH's first season in the league. He later played in the 1977 Cotton Bowl against fifth-ranked Maryland, a game the Cougars won 30-21.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Tech in 1979 and a Masters of Education degree from Abilene Christian in 1984.

A Big Country Athletic Hall of Fame inductee for his West Texas exploits, Briles and his wife, Jan, have three children: Jancy, a graduate of the University of Houston who works in the Dallas Cowboys Public Relations office; Kendal, a Cougar letterman and UH graduate who serves as an assistant coach on his father's Baylor staff; and Staley, a UH graduate. Briles was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in April 2008.
