**2003:** Started all 12 games for Baylor at outside safety and was also one of the Bears' top kickoff and punt return specialists ... Finished third on the team in tackles with 67 stops, 46 of which were solos ... Also recorded 6.5 tackles for losses totaling 47 yards and 2.5 quarterback sacks for 37 yards lost ... Tallied a team-high two interceptions to go with five pass breakups, a pair of fumble recoveries and a forced fumble ... Returned a fumble 30 yards for a touchdown in season-finale against Oklahoma State ... After totaling just eight tackles in Baylor's first three games, he was credited with five or more stops in each of its last nine games, including a career-high 10 tackles (nine solos) at Kansas ... Had two pass breakups against both Colorado and at Kansas, while his interceptions came against Southern Methodist and at Texas A&M

... His 24-yard interception return against the Aggies was the longest by a Bear in 2003 ... Returned 26 kickoffs for 641 yards and 29 punts for 232 yards ... His 26 kickoff returns ranked fourth on BU's single-season list, while his 641 yards stand third and his 24.7 yard average was sixth-best ... His 24.7 yard kickoff return average ranked fourth in the Big 12 and 29th nationally ... Andrews' 29 punt returns ranked seventh on the school's one-season list, while his 8.0 return average was 10th in the league and 71st nationally ... Long kick return of 46 yards came against UAB, while his long punt return of 31 yards in the SMU game was a season-long by a Bear.

**2002:** Played in all 12 games as a reserve safety and member of the special teams as a true freshman ... Credited with 26 tackles, one tackle for loss and two pass breakups ... Returned an interception 27 yards against Texas Tech ... Had a season-high six tackles at Texas ... Recorded four stops at Oklahoma State and three against Kansas State.

**High School:** Longview High School, Longview, Texas ... All-purpose player was a first-team member of the *Texas Football* pre-season Super Team as a defensive back ... First-team all-district 12-5A senior running back led district in rushing with 1,291 yards and in touchdowns with 15 ... As a junior caught 40 passes for 775 yards and four touchdowns, rushed 27 times for 232 yards (8.6 ypc), returned 11 punts for 112 yards and returned 11 kickoffs for 292 yards (26.5 ypr) ... Earned honorable mention 5A all-state honors from the Texas Sports Writers Association ... Rated as Texas' 58th-best prospect and one of the nation's top 42 cornerbacks according to Max Emfinger ... Named one of the top 100 prospects in Texas by *The Dallas Morning News* (43rd), *Fort Worth Star-Telegram*, *Houston Chronicle* and *Waco Tribune-Herald* (top 30) ... For the season, Bell hit 60-of-91 passes with one touchdown and one interception for 576 yards ... Connected on 61.2 percent of his throws for the year and rushed 16 times for 23 yards, an average of 1.4 yards per play ... Saw limited action over BU's first nine games of the season, but came off the bench against Texas Tech to hit 14-of-18 passes for 138 yards with no interceptions ... His performance against the Red Raiders earned him his first career start the following week at No. 1 Oklahoma and he responded by going 16-of-30 through the air for 108 yards and one interception, then came back the next week against Oklahoma State to hit 21-of-33 passes for 219 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions ... His totals against the Cowboys for completions, attempts, yards and touchdowns were all career bests ... Also picked up a career-high 34 yards rushing on four carries against the Cowboys ... Bell's first touchdown pass was a 12-yard strike to Robert Quiroga against Oklahoma State, while his 29-yard pass to Rashad Armstrong in the same game was a career-long completion ... Named to fall Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

**2002:** Redshirted as a true freshman, but was named to both the fall and spring Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.

**High School:** China Spring High School, China Spring, Texas ... Finished stellar prep career ranked third all-time in Texas high school history with 8,437 career passing yards and 525 career completions ... One of the Lone Star state's top middle linebacker prospects, Hixson was a two-year starter for coach Todd Dodge at Southlake Carroll (Texas) High School ... Ranked 39th on *The Dallas Morning News'* area Top 100 list and was *Waco Tribune-Herald's* Top 100 selection and a member of the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram's* Area 75 list ... As a senior, earned first-team 5A all-state honors from both the Associated Press and the Texas Sports Writers ... Tallied 211 tackles in 2003 to go with nine tackles for loss, 6.5 sacks, four pass breakups, four fumbles caused, three fumble recoveries and a safety ... Led Dragons to a 15-1 record in 2003 and a runner-up finish in Class 5A Division II ... Earned team's defensive player-of-the-week honors six times as a senior ... Recorded 25 tackles, including one for a loss, in Dragons' 37-21 semifinal victory over Allen in 2003 playoffs ... Credited with 23 tackles in Carroll's 2003 quarterfinal win over Irving ... Had more than 200 tackles as a junior in helping Southlake Carroll to a 16-0 record and the 2002 Class 5A Division II title ... "He's one of those guys that's born for the position," Dodge said. "He's wired the right way as far as his intensity and as far as his study of the game." ... Played in 47 consecutive games and helped Dragons to a 41-6 record over that stretch ... Named to *Dave Campbell's Texas Football* Top 300 2003 preseason list ... Turned down offers from Tulane, Oklahoma State and South Florida to sign with the Bears ... The son of Chuck and Susan Hixson, Ben was born July 22, 1985.

## Roman James

**DB · 6-1 · 180 · Sharon, Mass. (Sharon)**

The son of former New England Patriots standout strong safety Roland James, Roman James was a star running back, wide receiver and defensive back for his father at Sharon (Mass.) High School ... As a senior, racked up 782 rushing yards and 527 receiving yards while scoring 10 touchdowns (four rush, six receiving) ... Averaged 23.5 yards per kickoff return and 18.0 yards per punt return in final prep season ... Ranked as the Eagles' No. 2 tackler in 2003 with 75 stops to go with six interceptions ... Had 18 interceptions in three-year varsity career ... Earned All-Scholastic honors from the *Boston Globe* and the *Boston Herald* as a senior ... Named all-Hockomock Conference as a junior (wide receiver) senior (defensive back) ... Selected as the *Boston Globe's* MVP of the 2003 Thanksgiving Day clash between Sharon and Easton's Oliver Ames as he recovered a fumble for a touchdown and caught a touchdown pass in the Eagles' 28-7 win over their longtime rivals-the school's first Thanksgiving Day victory since 1990 ... "Roman has good knowledge of the game," said his father and high school coach. "He runs well, is a hard hitter and covers a lot of ground." ... In his fourth season on Sharon's varsity basketball team ... His father, Roland, was a first-round draft choice by the New England Patriots and spent 10 seasons (1980-90) with the organization, including four years (1984-87) where one of his

teammates was current Baylor coach Guy Morriss ... The elder James ranks third on the Patriots' all-time interceptions list with 29 picks and is 10th all-time in punt returns ... The son of Roland and Carmelle James, Roman was born Dec. 5, 1985.

## Jacoby Jones

**RB · 5-11 · 205 · Bangs, Texas (Bangs)**

Earned first-team Class 2A all-state honors from the Texas Sports Writers and was a second-team Associated Press pick ... Finalist for *Texas Football's* 2003 Class 2A player of the year honor ... Two-time all-West Texas and all-Big Country offensive Most Valuable Player, three-time district offensive MVP honoree ... *Waco Tribune-Herald* Top 100 selection ... Ranked as one of Texas' top 20 prep running backs in 2003 by *Texas Football* magazine and was rated No. 28 overall by Lonestar 100 ... As a senior, rushed 370 times for 3,459 yards and 45 touchdowns for coach Bo Robinson's 11-5 Class 2A Division I runner-up Bangs (Texas) High School Dragons ... A three-year starter, Jones was one of the state's most prolific ground-gainers ever and finished his career 818 carries, 7,611 yards and 99 touchdowns ... Had 41 career 100-yard rushing games, which ranks as the second-best all-time mark in Texas schoolboy history ... Rushed for 1,500 in playoff games throughout career ... Second-team all-state selection as a junior after rushing for 2,467 yards and 29 touchdowns in leading the Dragons to a 13-2 record and a runner-up finish in the Class 2A Division I playoffs ... Also plays basketball and runs track for the Dragons ... Earned district MVP honors in basketball as a junior ... "He's got a lot of ability and he's a hard worker," said Robinson. "Jacoby made the big plays at critical times for us. If it was fourth and three, he'd find a way to make the play." ... Selected Baylor over Kansas, Texas-El Paso and New Mexico State ... The son of Mae Jones and the late John Jones Jr., Jacoby was born Dec. 26, 1985.

## Anthony McDonald

**DB · 6-2 · 190 · Copperas Cove, Texas (Copperas Cove)**

Rated as one of the Top 20 defensive backs in the Lone Star state by *Dave Campbell's Texas Football* magazine ... Ranked 11th on *Waco Tribune-Herald's* Central Texas Top 25 list ... Two-year starter for coach Jack Welch's Copperas Cove Bulldawgs ... Recorded 55 tackles, eight pass breakups, one interception and a forced fumble for the 6-4 Bulldawgs as a senior ... Credited with 44 tackles and three interceptions as a junior when Copperas Cove finished 7-4 and earned a Class 4A Division II playoff bid ... One of McDonald's three interceptions as a junior was an 89-yard touchdown return against Odessa Permian ... Also played wide receiver as a prep ... "The thing you see in Anthony is his potential," said Welch. "He's got good height, great size, great speed. His future is in his own hands. He can be as good as he wants to be." ... The son of Wanda Fajardo, Anthony was born Feb. 13, 1986.

### Marcus Mead

**LB • 6-1 • 218 • Alva, Okla. (Alva)**

Two-way starter (running back and linebacker) for coach Steve Gale at Alva (Okla.) High School will focus on the defensive side of the ball as a Bear ... School's first NCAA Division I-A recruit since 1984 ... Named to the *Enid News'* All-Northwest Oklahoma all-star team and was tabbed District 1-2A linebacker of the year ... Earned honorable-mention all-state honors from the *Daily Oklahoman* ... Rushed 182 times for 1,047 yards and 10 touchdowns as senior ... Also recorded 86 tackles in 10 games ... Three-year letterwinner served as team captain during senior season ... Missed five games during junior season due to injury, but still had 55 rushes for 329 yards and four scores to go with 26 tackles, including three for losses ... Ran track (100m, 200m, long jump) as a junior ... "He's tremendously strong for a senior coming out of high school," Gale said. "That's probably what sells him, too. He's self-motivated and loves to play the game. Besides his physical attributes, his work ethic and intensity level are what sets Marcus off from other players." ... Selected Baylor over Marshall ... The son of Chandler and Karen Mead, Marcus was born Aug. 28, 1985.

### Geoff Nelson

**DE • 6-2 • 220 • Cedar Hill, Texas (Cedar Hill)**

Garnered unanimous first-team all-district 4-5A honors as a senior for coach Joey McGuire at Cedar Hill (Texas) High School ... Earned 2003 honorable-mention 5A all-state recognition from the Texas Sports Writers ... Led the 2003 Longhorns to a 6-4 record, an impressive turnaround from his junior season when they finished 2-8 ... Moved to defensive end as a senior, after playing two seasons at linebacker, and responded with 82 tackles, including 55 solo stops, 17 tackles for loss, nine sacks, 10 quarterback hurries, seven forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and three pass breakups ... Named *The Dallas Morning News* player of the week for his performance in the Longhorns' 28-17 season-ending victory over Mansfield Summit that sealed the school's first winning season since 1995 ... Recorded 16 tackles, four sacks, three caused fumbles, two fumble recoveries and a pass breakup against Mansfield Summit ... **WR • 5-9 • 160 • La Marque, Texas (La Marque)**

One of two members of La Marque (Texas) High School's 16-0 and 2003 Class 4A Division II state championship squad to sign with the Bears, Payne was a two-time all-district and all-Galveston County performer for coach Bryan Erwin's Cougars ... Hauled in 96 passes for 1,472 yards and 16 touchdowns over his final two seasons while helping the Cougars to a 27-3 record ... Had 52 receptions for 859 yards and 13 touchdowns as a senior en route to unanimous all-district honors and a place on the all-Galveston County team ... Caught 44 balls for 613 yards and three scores as a junior when La Marque finished 11-3 and reached the quarterfinal round of the Class 4A Division II playoffs ... "He's a tremendous

receiver with great feet and excellent hands," said Erwin. "I think he is the best route runner in the stage." ... National Honor Society member ... Three-year letterwinner in football also picked up a pair of letters on the baseball diamond ... Selected Baylor over SMU, Brigham Young and Iowa State ... Born Sept. 19, 1985 in Galveston, Texas, Trey is the son of Robert Payne Jr., and Tanya Payne.

### Marlon Price

**DB • 6-2 • 185 • Lancaster, Texas (Lancaster)**

Played both quarterback and safety as a senior for coach Andrew Jackson at Lancaster (Texas) High School ... Transferred to Lancaster after playing his first three years at Duncanville (Texas) High School, where he started at strong safety as a junior ... Regional qualifier in the 110- and 300-meter hurdles at Duncanville, and was also a member of the school's 4x400-meter relay team ... The son of Melvin and Cathy Price, Marlon was born June 11, 1986.

### Vincent Rhodes

**DE • 6-2 • 250 • Denison, Texas (Denison)**

Talented two-way player for coach Bob Brown at Denison High School was a 2003 all-state honoree as both an offensive and defensive lineman ... The 2003 District 11-4A MVP was named to the Class 4A first-team all-state honor squad by the Associated Press at offensive tackle and was a second-team all-state pick by the Texas Sports Writers at defensive end ... Rhodes recorded 50 pancake blocks and didn't allow a sack for a 9-2 squad that averaged more than 400 total-offense yards ... On the defensive side of the ball, he was credited with 60 tackles, including 11 behind the line of scrimmage, 12 sacks, three forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and a pass breakup ...
