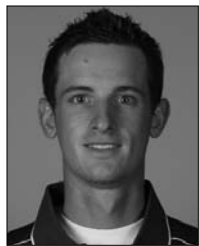
Twin Rivers Golf is located off U.S. Highway 84 in the southwest portion of Waco. The facility can be easily accessed, using Interstate 35:

- From the north, drive south on Interstate 35. Take the Highway 6/Loop 340 exit and get on Highway 6 headed west (turn right). Turn left (south) on Highway 84, and the club will be a few miles down on the right just past the river and before you get to Speegleville Road.
- From the south, drive north on Interstate 35. Take the Highway 6/Loop 360 exit and get on Highway 6 headed west (turn left and take the overpass above I-35). Turn left (south) on Highway 84, and the club will be a few miles down on the right just past the river and before you get to Speegleville Road.

DIRECTIONS TO HIGHERS ATHLETIC COMPLEX

The Alwin O. and Dorothy Highers Athletic Complex, which includes the Simpson Athletics and Academic Center and the Jay and Jenny Allison Indoor Practice Facility, is located on the right bank of the Brazos River at 1500 South University Parks Drive in Waco. Those traveling to the Highers Complex via Interstate 35 should take the University Parks Drive exit (#335B); the facility is located one-half mile east of Interstate 35 (left side of road), just past the Mayborn Museum.

Fall 2009 (Junior): Competed in all five fall tournaments, including three top-15 finishes • Made Baylor debut at *Golfweek's* Conference Challenge in Riverside, Iowa • Shot an even-par 216 to finish as Baylor's highest finisher in 12th place • Led after the first round with a 4-under 68 • Carded second opening-round 68 at the William H. Tucker, finishing 12th overall at 2-under (68-72-74=214) • Finished 75th at the Wolverine in Ann Arbor, Mich., with a final score of 20-over (78-78-80=236) • Fall's best finish came at Lone Star Invitational, where he finished tied for fourth at 6-under (70-69-71=210) • Placed 30th at Baylor Intercollegiate, shooting 8-over (78-78-67=221) • Carded a career-low 67 during Baylor Intercollegiate final round • Named to Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll (fall 2009).

Summer 2009: Competed in the 56th KCC Invitational • He and his partner won the Stewart Flight • Advanced to second round of match play at Men's North & South Amateur at Pinehurst No. 2 after posting 72 to qualify in stroke play • Advanced to match play at Michigan Amateur after shooting a 66 and 69 in stroke play to qualify.

Greg Priest, who was named the ninth head coach in school history on Aug. 25, 2003, is in his eighth season at the helm of the Baylor men's golf program. Last season, the Bears advanced to the NCAA Championship for just the fifth time in program history and extended their streak to 13 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances — one of the nation's longest active streaks.

Baylor posted seven top-five finishes in 14 tournaments during the 2009-10 season, which culminated in the program's fifth NCAA Championship appearance (1960, 1966, 1967, 2002, 2010) and the first for Priest as head coach. The Bears, who tied for fifth at the 2010 NCAA South Central Regional, finished 25th at the NCAA Championship in Ooltewah, Tenn. Joakim Mikkelsen was named PING All-Central Region — the first Baylor golfer to earn all-region honors since Ryan Baca in 2006. Earlier in the season, he became the first Baylor golfer in nearly three seasons to win a tournament, claiming the Border Olympics title in 2010.

In 2008-09, the Bears won three tournaments including winning the first two tournaments to open the fall slate with victories at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate and the Hartford Hawks Invitational. Baylor added a third victory in the spring when it won the Border Olympics. At the Big 12 Championship, Baylor finished fifth, while senior Bill Allcorn led after three of the tournament's four rounds, before finishing second overall. The Bears later advanced to their 12th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance, earning a bid the NCAA South Central Regional in Stillwater, Okla. Sophomore Cody Paladino finished third overall at the regional, becoming the first golfer in program history to earn an individual berth to the NCAA Championships.

Baylor had a solid start to both the fall and spring seasons in 2007-08 as the Bears won the Saint Mary's College Invitational in September and later followed it up with a win at the Rice Intercollegiate in February. Included in BU's victory at Saint Mary's was Wes Williams winning the individual title with a 2-under 214 for the tournament. At the Border Olympics, sophomore Colton Williams won the individual title with an impressive 9-under 207 after three straight under-par rounds. Williams would later be named to the 2008 All-Big 12 team and card a top 10 finish at the Big 12 Championship to earn all-tournament honors. Baylor's fifth-place Big 12 finish was the best under Priest's watch.

In Priest's fourth season (2006-07), the Bears notched just one tournament win in 12 events, while finishing in the top 10 eight

times. BU carded a 277, its lowest round of the year, to tie for the team championship with a 13-under par at the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate. Baylor's 840 at Bulls Bay was the third-lowest score in school history. The Bears concluded the season with an 18th-place finish at the NCAA Central Regional.

In 2005-06, Baylor enjoyed one of its most successful regular-season campaigns, capturing four team titles, three runner-up finishes and five individual crowns. Baca, a senior, was named the program's first PING first-team All-American and was a Ben Hogan Award semifinalist. He also set the single-season stroke average record and the 54-hole tournament scoring record. The Bears finished seventh at the Big 12 Championship, where junior Chase Thomas was named to the all-tournament team. The squad finished 20th at the NCAA West Regional, in its ninth straight postseason appearance.

In his second year, Priest led the Bears to their eighth straight NCAA Regional appearance, four top-three finishes, including the tournament title at the Border Olympics. Jeremy Alcorn earned PING All-American and All-Big 12 first-team honors and was twice named Big 12 Golfer of the Month.

In his first season at Baylor, Priest guided the Bears to four top-five finishes, including a victory at the Hyatt Dorado Beach Intercollegiate. Baca earned his second straight All-Big 12 selection, while Jon Antunes was named to multiple all-academic teams and was a Cleveland Golf All-America Scholar.

Priest came to Baylor from the University of Texas, where he spent three seasons as an assistant coach. During his tenure in Austin, the Longhorn golf program compiled three national top-10 finishes, including a third-place finish at the 2002 NCAA Championship, and captured back-to-back Big 12 championships in 2002 and 2003.

Prior to his stint at Texas, Priest spent two seasons (1998-2000) as head coach of both the men's and women's golf programs at Sam Houston State. Priest led the Bearkats to consecutive third-place finishes in the Southland Conference in 1999 and 2000 and seven top-10 team finishes.

In his first season at Sam Houston State, Bearkat golfers Brandt Kieschnick and David Bolen were co-individual medalists at the Southland Championships. Kieschnick also earned 1999 Southland Player of the Year honors and Ryan Polzin was named the 2000 conference newcomer of the year. The Bearkat women earned four tournament titles in Priest's two seasons. Before taking the reigns at SHSU, Priest was head coach at Tyler Junior College for two seasons (1996-98).

His 1997 and 1998 squads won back-to-back national championships, and Priest was honored as the National Junior College Athletics Association Division II Coach of the National Tournament both seasons. Tyler's Cameron Conway won the individual medalist title at the 1997 NJCAA Division II Championships. Priest also led Tyler to its first-ever Texas State Junior College championship in 1998. Priest began his coaching career as head coach at Pleasant Grove High School in Texarkana, Texas, in 1994.

Former four-year letterman Austin Burk returned to Baylor for his second stint as assistant coach for the men's golf program. Burk, who served as Baylor's assistant coach during the 2006-07 season, was named assistant men's golf coach in July 2010 after spending three seasons as assistant golf coach at Rice University in Houston.

A prosperous 2009-10 season began with the Owls capturing their first team championship since 1998 and continued through the program's first NCAA postseason appearance in 13 years. Along the way, Rice won a pair of tournament titles, saw golfers win a total of three individual tournaments including a conference championship and claim the best showing at a conference championship since the 1930s.

The Owls' season got off to a fast start when the team won the UTA/Waterchase Invitational. The Owls had three players birdie the tournament's final hole en route to a two-stroke victory. Rice also began the spring season with a team title. The Owls won the 10th Annual Rice Intercollegiate presented by Srixon by 19 strokes.

Rice was also the runner-up at three other tournaments including the Conference USA Golf Championship. The Owls tied for second at C-USA Championship marking the squad's best finish since winning the 1939 Southwest Conference title. The Owls had finished no higher than seventh in its previous four C-USA Championships and had finished no higher than fourth at a conference championship since the 1981 Southwest Conference Championship.

Individually during the year, Rice golfers have won three championships including a five-stroke victory by Christopher Brown at the Conference USA championship. Brown, who claimed two tournament titles, was one of two golfers to receive all-conference honors. Freshman Jade Scott won the David Toms Intercollegiate in the fall and went on to be named the Conference USA Freshman of the Year.

Academically, all 10 Rice golf student-athletes were named to the Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, three Rice golfers received the Conference USA Commissioner's Medal for achieving a 3.75 grade point average or better.

In three seasons at Rice, Burk was a part of 24 top-10 team finishes, including 12 such performances during the 2009-10 season.

During the 2008-09 season, the Owls' best outing was a runner-up finish at the Rice Intercollegiate presented by Srixon. Rice also finished in a tie for third at the Pacific Invitational during the fall campaign.

Academically, Rice had eight golfers earn 2009 Conference USA Commissioner's Honor Roll recognition. Three members of the team received the Conference USA Commissioner's Academic Medal for carrying at least a 3.75 grade point average.

Prior to Rice, Burk served as the assistant men's golf coach at Baylor, helping the Bears to five top-three finishes including a win at the Hootie at Bulls Bay.

As a student-athlete at Baylor, Burk won the 2001 Texas Collegiate Amateur, was a member of the 2001 Big 12 championship team and qualified for the Nationwide Tour Permian Basin Open. Following graduation, he competed on the Tight Lies and Grey Goose Tours.

He was the head boys' and girls' golf coach at Vanguard Preparatory School in Waco in 2003, leading the boys' team to the state tournament.

Burk, a fifth generation Baylor graduate, was a member of the Bears' golf team from 2000-03. He earned his bachelor's degree in education with a concentration in recreation and leisure services in 2004. A member of the Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA), he has a daughter, Caroline.

For the second straight day, the Baylor men's golf team struggled with its short game as the Bears finished fifth at *Golfweek's* Conference Challenge at Blue Top Ridge.

Baylor matched its team score from Monday's second round, shooting 7-over 295 during Tuesday's final round. Florida State won the Challenge, firing a 7-under 281 to finish at 11-under 853 for the tournament. The host Iowa Hawkeyes finished second at 3-under 861, followed by Coastal Carolina (+2 866) in third and California (+5 869) in fourth. Florida State's Drew Kittleson and Iowa's Brad Hopfinger shared individual medalist honors, each finishing at 9-under 207.

BORDER OLYMPICS

March 5-6 | Laredo, Texas (Laredo CC)

Baylor sophomore **Joakim Mikkelsen** captured individual medalist honors for the first time in his career, winning the Border Olympics by two strokes at Laredo Country Club.

Mikkelsen finished at 3-under (70-68-75=213), two shots ahead of Auburn's Kyle Kopsick (68-75-72=215). It was the fourth time this season Mikkelsen finished a tournament under par — 1-under 215 at William H. Tucker, 5-under 211 (Wolverine), 3-under 210 at Baylor Intercollegiate and Border Olympics.

Mikkelsen, who finished in the top 10 for the third time this season, is the first Baylor golfer to earn individual medalist honors since Colton Williams won the Border Olympics in 2008. The Drammen, Norway, native is the fourth Baylor Bear to win the Border Olympics since 1988.

Baylor, which entered the final round in fourth place overall, finished the Border Olympics in eighth place at 27-over. Texas State took home the team title at 12-over, four shots ahead of second-place Oklahoma (16-over). Lamar (17-over), UT Arlington (18-over) and Auburn (19-over) round out the rest of the top five.

NCAA SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL

Baylor earned the fifth NCAA Men's Golf Championship berth in school history as the Bears held off the Georgia Bulldogs on the first playoff hole at the NCAA South Central Regional.

The Championship berth marked the first for Baylor under seventh-year head coach Greg Priest and only the second of the Big 12 era. Baylor last advanced to the NCAA Championship in 2002, when it finished 19th. The Bears also played in the NCAA Championship in 1960, 1966 and 1967.

Baylor and Georgia were tied for fifth place after 54 holes at 5-over 869. With the first – and deciding – playoff hole set on the par-4 No. 18, the Bears and Bulldogs were broken up into two groups. The first group was Bryant Macpherson (par), T.J. Mitchell (2-over) and Rob Bennett (1-over) of Georgia and **Ryan O'Rear** (par) and **Cody Paladino** (par) of Baylor. The second group was Russell Henley (par) and Harris English (par) of Georgia and **Payne Gniewek** (par), **Lorenzo Scotto** (1-over) and **Joakim Mikkelsen** (1-under) of Baylor. After dropping the high score, Baylor was 1-under and Georgia was 1-over, which allowed the Bears to advance to the NCAA Championship.

Sophomore **Joakim Mikkelsen**, who entered the regional as the team leader in nearly every statistical category, sunk a birdie putt in the second group on hole No. 18 to clinch Baylor's spot in the Championship.

Baylor's season came to an end when the Bears missed the cut with a 25th-place finish at the 2010 NCAA Men's Golf Championship at The Honors Course.

When play was suspended due to darkness late Wednesday, the Bears were tied for 20th with five holes remaining in their second round. After play resumed, Baylor entered Thursday's final round of stroke play tied for 22nd with Tennessee, Illinois and defending national champion Texas A&M. The Bears (294-295-295=884) finished stroke play knotted with Tennessee (297-292-295=884) for 25th place at 20-over par.

Freshman **Ryan O'Rear**, who was tied for third overall through the first 18 holes, finished 90th with a 7-over 223. Juniors **Payne Gniewek** and **Cody Paladino** carded matching final-round scores of 74 to tie for 95th at 8-over 224. GCAA/PING All-Central Region selection **Joakim Mikkelsen** finished 135th at 14-over. PGA TOUR

BEN CRANE (PORTLAND, ORE.), 1994

Ben Crane made the cut in 17 of 22 PGA TOUR events in 2010, including a victory at the Farmers Insurance Open, a third-place finish at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial and a fourth-place showing at THE PLAYERS Championship. He earned over \$2.5 million (\$2,671,250) in 2010 and finished 18th in the FedEx Cup point standings (1,607).

Crane made the cut in 20 of 27 events in 2009, posting nine top-25 finishes. Crane made the cut in 19 of 25 events in 2008, finishing 59th overall in the FedEx Cup point standings.

He played the 2008 season on a Major Medical Exemption, starting the year with a 12th-place finish at the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic and a fourth-place showing at the FBR Open. Crane finished tied for sixth at THE PLAYERS and followed with a second consecutive top-10 finish two weeks later at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial. At the Deutsche Bank Championship in Sept. 2008, he fired a third-round 8-under 63 to finish tied for 10th – this fourth top-10 finish in 2008.

Crane played all four majors in 2006, with his best finish coming at the British Open, where he tied for 11th. For the season, he posted a 70.89 scoring average

Crane has three career PGA TOUR victories and two Nationwide Tour victories and has won in excess of \$13 million during his career.

JIMMY WALKER (NEW BRAUNFELS, TEXAS), 1997-2001

Jimmy Walker played 25 events on the PGA TOUR in 2010, finishing 84th in the FedEx Cup standings. In 2009, he played in 25 events, including 24 on the PGA TOUR. Walker played in 29 events during the 2008 season – 24 on the PGA TOUR and five on the Nationwide Tour, making 15 cuts. He posted a career-low 70.78 scoring average in 25 PGA TOUR events in 2010, finishing with six top-25 finishes.

His best two PGA TOUR finishes came in 2010 when he finished tied for third at the Valero Texas Open. He also finished fourth at The Greenbrier Classic in West Virginia. His previous best finish came in 2009 when he finished tied for eighth at the Buick Open, besting his previous top PGA TOUR finish at the 2005 MCI Heritage (tied for 17th).

Walker was named the 2004 Nationwide Tour Player of the Year and finished the year atop the Tour's money list.

Walker has three professional victories, the 2004 BellSouth Panama Championship and the 2004 Chitimacha Louisiana Open, both on the Nationwide Tour, as well as the 2007 National Mining Association Pete Dye Classic on the PGA TOUR.

He has earned over \$3 million over this career, including more than \$2 million in four years on the PGA TOUR.

NATIONWIDE TOUR

JASON HILL (ROCKWALL, TEXAS), 1990-93

Jason Hill played in five events on the 2008 Nationwide Tour, making one cut. Hill played in seven Nationwide Tour events in 2007, making one cut, posting a 72.50 stroke average. He did not make the cut in five Nationwide Tour events in 2006 and making his Tour debut in 2005.

Hill has played in 88 career events, making 30 cuts and recording seven top-25 and five top-10 finishes. He recorded his first professional victory at the 2001 Buy.com Steamtown Classic on the Nationwide Tour.

Hill's career-best PGA TOUR finish was a pair of ties for 14th at the 2002 FedEx St. Jude Classic and the 2002 Michelob Championship at Kingsmill.

JERRY SMITH (OSKALOOSA, IOWA), 1985-86

Jerry Smith made the cut in five of 19 PGA Tour events in 2007. For his career he has posted 14 top-25 and six top-10 finishes. He recorded a 72.54 scoring average. He did not play any tournaments in 2008.

Smith ranked 855th on the money list with \$63,335 in earnings. His career-best finish was a tie for third at the 2001 National Car Rental Golf Classic and he has won \$1.9 million during his career.

BRIAN WILSON (FORT WORTH, TEXAS), 1984-87

Brian Wilson did not play any tournaments in 2008. During his career, he finished in the top 25 six times, including a pair of top-10 finishes.

He made the cut in 15 of 25 events during the 2002 season, including seven top-25 finishes. His best effort was tying for second at the Price Cutter Charity Championship, followed by a tie for ninth at the Omaha Classic, where he fired a final round 64.

Wilson tied for second at the 2000 PGA TOUR National Qualifying Tournament to earn his 2001 card. He made the cut in 12 of 31 events during his rookie year and finished 183rd on the money list with \$169,440 in earnings. Wilson was a rookie on the Nationwide Tour in 2000 after playing the Asian Tour for 11 years.

ADAMS GOLF PRO TOUR

JEREMY ALCORN (IRVING, TEXAS), 2004-07

Former Baylor All-American **Jeremy Alcorn** made his Adams Golf Pro Tour debut in Dec. 2008 at the Cypresswood Tradition Open, finishing tied for 10th. He played in 12 events on the Adams Golf Pro Tour circuit in 2008 and 2009.

Alcorn later posted back-to-back third-place finishes at the Blackhorse North Championship in Feb. 2009 and Canongate at Panther Trail Championship in March 2009.

He recorded his first career professional win at Jamie Hilton's Hillcrest Childrens Golf Classic in May 2009 at Waco's Twin Rivers Golf Club. Alcorn shot 279 over four rounds, winning \$15,000.

BILL ALLCORN (ABILENE, TEXAS), 2006-09

Bill Allcorn, a four-time Academic All-Big 12 selection at Baylor, made his Adams Golf Pro Tour debut at the Avid Golfer Classic in June 2009. Although he failed to make the cut in his first professional event, Allcorn finished 47th at the Adams Golf Texarkana Classic this following week.

RYAN BACA (RICHMOND, TEXAS), 2003-06

Ryan Baca, the last Baylor golfer to earn All-America honors in 2006, made his professional debut in May 2007 on the Adams Golf Pro Tour Series. Baca participated in eight events in 2007, making the cut five times. He posted four top-20 finishes as a rookie.

In his first full year on the circuit, Baca made the cut in 21 of 23 events, including the first 12 events. Baca finished in the top 10 in 11 of those first 12 events and the top five in five.

Baca has played in 53 career Adams Golf Pro Tour Series events, making the cut 45 times. He has posted 20 top-10 and 11 top-five finishes on tour.
