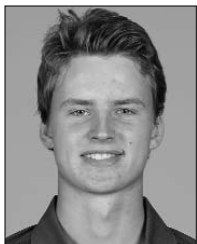

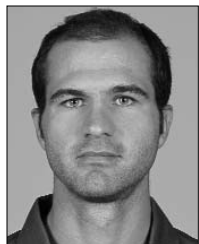

Greg Priest, who was named the ninth head coach in school history on Aug. 25, 2003, is in his ninth season at the helm of the Baylor men's golf program. In 2010-11, Baylor advanced to its 14th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance – one of the nation's longest active streaks.

In a follow-up to their 2010 NCAA Championship run, the Bears notched six top-five finishes, including two tournament victories, during the 2010-11 season. Despite a seventh-place finish at the 2011 NCAA Florida Regional, Baylor posted its lowest 54-hole NCAA postseason score in program history, shooting 5-under 859. Payne Gniewek's 7-under 209 tied a Baylor NCAA postseason 54-hole low, tying him for sixth place overall.

Baylor posted seven top-five finishes in 14 tournaments during the 2009-10 season, which culminated in the program's fifth NCAA Championship appearance (1960, 1966, 1967, 2002, 2010) and the first for Priest as head coach. The Bears, who tied for fifth at the 2010 NCAA South Central Regional, finished 25th at the NCAA Championship in Ooltewah, Tenn. Joakim Mikkelsen was named PING All-Central Region - the first Baylor golfer to earn all-region honors since Ryan Baca in 2006. Earlier in the season, he became the first Baylor golfer in nearly three seasons to win a tournament, claiming the Border Olympics title in 2010.

In 2008-09, the Bears won three tournaments including winning the first two tournaments to open the fall slate with victories at the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate and the Hartford Hawks Invitational. Baylor added a third victory in the spring when it won the Border Olympics. At the Big 12 Championship, Baylor finished fifth, while senior Bill Allcorn led after three of the tournament's four rounds, before finishing second overall. The Bears later advanced to their 12th consecutive NCAA Regional appearance, earning a bid the NCAA South Central Regional in Stillwater, Okla. Sophomore Cody Paladino finished third overall at the regional, becoming the first golfer in program history to earn an individual berth to the NCAA Championships.

Baylor had a solid start to both the fall and spring seasons in 2007-08 as the Bears won the Saint Mary's College Invitational in September and later followed it up with a win at the Rice Intercollegiate in February. Included in BU's victory at Saint Mary's was Wes Williams winning the individual title with a 2-under 214 for the tournament. At the Border Olympics, sophomore Colton Williams won the individual title with an impressive 9-under 207 after three straight under-par rounds.

Williams would later be named to the 2008 All-Big 12 team and card a top 10 finish at the Big 12 Championship to earn all-tournament honors. Baylor's fifth-place Big 12 finish was the best under Priest's watch.

In Priest's fourth season (2006-07), the Bears notched just one tournament win in 12 events, while finishing in the top 10 eight times. BU carded a 277, its lowest round of the year, to tie for the team championship with a 13-under par at the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate. Baylor's 840 at Bulls Bay was the third-lowest score in school history. The Bears concluded the season with an 18th-place finish at the NCAA Central Regional.

In 2005-06, Baylor enjoyed one of its most successful regular-season campaigns, capturing four team titles, three runner-up finishes and five individual crowns. Baca, a senior, was named the program's first PING first-team All-American and was a Ben Hogan Award semifinalist. He also set the single-season stroke average record and the 54-hole tournament scoring record. The Bears finished seventh at the Big 12 Championship, where junior Chase Thomas was named to the all-tournament team. The squad finished 20th at the NCAA West Regional, in its ninth straight postseason appearance.

In his second year, Priest led the Bears to their eighth straight NCAA Regional appearance, four top-three finishes, including the tournament title at the Border Olympics. Jeremy Alcorn earned PING All-American and All-Big 12 first-team honors and was twice named Big 12 Golfer of the Month.

In his first season at Baylor, Priest guided the Bears to four top-five finishes, including a victory at the Hyatt Dorado Beach Intercollegiate. Baca earned his second straight All-Big 12 selection, while Jon Antunes was named to multiple all-academic teams and was a Cleveland Golf All-America Scholar.

Priest came to Baylor from the University of Texas, where he spent three seasons as an assistant coach. During his tenure in Austin, the Longhorn golf program compiled three national top-10 finishes, including a third-place finish at the 2002 NCAA Championship, and captured back-to-back Big 12 championships in 2002 and 2003.

Prior to his stint at Texas, Priest spent two seasons (1998-2000) as head coach of both the men's and women's golf programs at Sam Houston State. Priest led the Bearkats to consecutive third-place finishes in the Southland Conference in 1999 and 2000 and seven top-10 team finishes.

In his first season at Sam Houston State, Bearkat golfers Brandt Kieschnick and David Bolen were co-individual medalists at the Southland Championships. Kieschnick also earned 1999 Southland Player of the Year honors and Ryan Polzin was named the 2000 conference newcomer of the year. The Bearkat women earned four tournament titles in Priest's two seasons. Before taking the reigns at SHSU, Priest was head coach at Tyler Junior College for two seasons (1996-98).

Tyler's Cameron Conway won the individual medalist title at the 1997 NJCAA Division II Championships. Priest also led Tyler to its first-ever Texas State Junior College championship in 1998. Priest began his coaching career as head coach at Pleasant Grove High School in Texarkana, Texas, in 1994.

Priest was a member of the golf team at East Texas State, and as a student assistant, received the school's Robert Parnell Scholarship.

Former four-year letterman Austin Burk returned to Baylor for his second stint as assistant coach for the men's golf program. Burk, who served as an Baylor's assistant coach during the 2006-07 season, was named assistant men's golf coach in July 2010 after spending three seasons as assistant golf coach at Rice University in Houston.

In his first season back at Baylor, the Bears finished seventh at the 2011 Big 12 Championship in Hutchinson, Kan. The Bears capped off their 2010-11 season with their 14th consecutive NCAA postseason appearance with an invitation to the NCAA Florida Regional in Ocala, Fla. Baylor concluded the season with a seventh-place finish.

A prosperous 2009-10 season began with the Owls capturing their first team championship since 1998 and continued through the program's first NCAA postseason appearance in 13 years. Along the way, Rice won a pair of tournament titles, saw golfers win a total of three individual tournaments including a conference championship and claim the best showing at a conference championship since the 1930s.

The Owls' season got off to a fast start when the team won the UTA/Waterchase Invitational. The Owls had three players birdie the tournament's final hole en route to a two-stroke victory. Rice also began the spring season with a team title. The Owls won the 10th Annual Rice Intercollegiate presented by Srixon by 19 strokes.

Rice was also the runner-up at three other tournaments including the Conference USA Championship. The Owls tied for second at the C-USA Championship marking the squad's best finish since winning the 1939 Southwest Conference title. The Owls had finished no higher than seventh in their previous four C-USA Championships and had finished no higher than fourth at a conference championship since the 1981 SWC Championship.

Individually during the year, Rice golfers won three championships including a five-stroke victory by Christopher Brown at the Conference USA championship. Brown, who claimed two tournament titles, was one of two golfers to receive all-conference honors.

In three seasons at Rice, Burk was a part of 24 top-10 team finishes, including 12 such performances during the 2009-10 season.

Prior to Rice, Burk served as the assistant men's golf coach at Baylor, helping the Bears to five top-three finishes including a win at the Hootie at Bulls Bay.

As a student-athlete at Baylor, Burk won the 2001 Texas Collegiate Amateur, was a member of the 2001 Big 12 championship team and qualified for the Nationwide Tour Permian Basin Open. Following graduation, he competed on the Tight Lies and Grey Goose Tours.

He was the head boys' and girls' golf coach at Vanguard Preparatory School in Waco in 2003, leading the boys' team to the state tournament.

Burk, a fifth generation Baylor graduate, was a member of the Bears' golf team from 2000-03. He earned his bachelor's degree in education with a concentration in recreation and leisure services in 2004. A member of the Golf Coaches Association of America (GCAA), he is married to the former Amber Alcalá, a 2008 Baylor graduate. They have one daughter, Caroline.

Entering the final day as the tournament leader, the Baylor men's golf team put together its best round of the season to win the Charleston Shootout by 14 strokes.

Baylor, which owned a four-stroke lead entering the final round, was 4-under through 36 holes before firing a season-low 4-under 284 Tuesday. It was the Bears' first tournament win since claiming the 2009 Border Olympics in Laredo, Texas, and their lowest 54-hole score since the 2008 Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate (839). Baylor, seeded 13th in the three-day championship, wrapped up its first regular-season match play event with an 0-4 record, finishing 16th in the Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championship at Hawks Ridge GC. **Jerry Ruiz** was the only Baylor golfer to win multiple matches, posting a 2-2 mark. Ruiz defeated Pacific's Alex Johnson, 2 and 1, and followed with a win over South Carolina's Dean Hester, 3 and 2. **Payne Gniwewek** and **Cody Paladino** were the only other Baylor golfers to post individual match wins.

Joakim Mikkelsen's final-round 66 helped Baylor solidify its fourth top-five showing this season as the men's golf team finished third at the Border Olympics.

Mikkelsen established 18-, 36- and 54-hole career lows as the Drammen, Norway, native shot 11-under-par 205 to finish tied for third. It was Mikkelsen's fifth career top-five finish and his second and three tournaments. His 54-hole score of 205 is tied for the eighth-lowest in program history.

Baylor reeled off three straight sub-par rounds to finish the Border Olympics at 18-under-par (287-275-284=846). No. 18 Arkansas claimed the Border Olympics team title by five strokes (32-under-par 832), while No. 28 Oklahoma finished second at 27-under-par 837. Rice came in fourth at 16-under-par, followed by No. 30 Liberty 11-under-par in fifth place.

WYOMING COWBOY CLASSIC

April 4-5, 2011 — Scottsdale, Ariz. (Talking Stick GC)

Junior **Joakim Mikkelsen** provided yet another career performance, helping the Baylor men's golf team to a three-stroke victory at the Wyoming Cowboy Classic. It was Baylor's second victory of the season, marking its first season with multiple tournament victories since 2008-09.

A day after shooting a season-low 273 in the second round, Baylor shot a final-round 281 to finish at 4-under-par (282-273-281=836). Arizona finished second at 1-under-par 839, followed by Colorado State in third at 1-over-par 841.

Less than two weeks after establishing a 54-hole career low and placing third at the Border Olympics, Mikkelsen set 18-, 36- and 54-hole career lows for a second time. The Drammen, Norway, native carded the lowest individual round by a Baylor golfer since 2007 (Colton Williams) with a final-round 65 to finish second overall — one stroke behind medalist Tarquin Macmanus of Arizona (8-under-par 202). Mikkelsen, whose 65 is the lowest third-round score since Colton Turnquist (65) in 2005, has posted six consecutive rounds of par or better, while shooting under-par in seven of his last 12 rounds overall.

NCAA FLORIDA REGIONAL

May 19-21, 2011 — Ocala, Fla. (Golden Ocala GC)

The Baylor men's golf team was unable to claim one of the coveted top-five spots, concluding its season with a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Florida Regional.

Baylor, which took a one-stroke lead through seven holes, shot a final-round 289 to finish the tournament at 5-under-par (284-286-289 = 859). Baylor's three-day tally was the lowest 54-hole NCAA postseason score in program history, besting its 862 in the 2000 NCAA Central Regional.

Host Florida won the NCAA Florida Regional by a six-stroke margin, finishing 18-under-par. Also advancing to the NCAA Championship in Stillwater, Okla., were defending national champion Augusta State, Kennesaw State, North Carolina State and Arkansas. Missouri's Jace Long torched the course with a final-round 10-under 62 to finish tied for first, earning an individual berth to the NCAA Championship.

Senior **Payne Gniewek** concluded his college career with a final-round 69, tying for sixth place overall at 7-under-par (71-69-69 = 209). Gniewek's 209 tied a Baylor 54-hole low in NCAA postseason play (**Ryan Baca**, 2006 NCAA West Regional) and posted the Bears' best individual finish since **Jimmy Walker** finished fifth at the 2001 NCAA Central Regional.

Baylor and Georgia were tied for fifth place after 54 holes at 5-over 869. With the first — and deciding — playoff hole set on the par-4 No. 18, the Bears and Bulldogs were broken up into two groups. The first group was Bryant Macpherson (par), T.J. Mitchell (2-over) and Rob Bennett (1-over) of Georgia and **Ryan O'Rear** (par) and **Cody Paladino** (par) of Baylor. The second group was Russell Henley (par) and Harris English (par) of Georgia and **Payne Gniewek** (par), **Lorenzo Scotto** (1-over) and **Joakim Mikkelsen** (1-under) of Baylor. After dropping the high score, Baylor was 1-under and Georgia was 1-over, which allowed the Bears to advance to the NCAA Championship. Sophomore **Joakim Mikkelsen**, who entered the regional as the team leader in nearly every statistical category, sunk a birdie putt in the second group on hole No. 18 to clinch Baylor's spot in the Championship.

The Baylor men's golf team was unable to claim one of the coveted top-five spots, concluding its season with a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Florida Regional. Baylor, which took a one-stroke lead through seven holes, shot a final-round 289 to finish the tournament at 5-under-par (284-286-289=859). Baylor's three-day tally is the lowest 54-hole NCAA postseason score in program history, besting its 862 in the 2000 NCAA Central Regional. Senior **Payne Gniewek** concluded his college career with a final-round 69, tying for sixth place overall at 7-under-par (71-69-69=209). PGA TOUR

BEN CRANE, 1994

In his fifth season on the PGA Tour, **Ben Crane** made the cut in 13 of 19 events in 2011, including two top-10 and seven top-25 finishes. His best finish in 2011 was a sixth-place showing at The Heritage; he also tied for ninth at the World Golf Championships-Accenture Match Play Championship.

In 2010, Crane made the cut in 19 of 24 PGA Tour events, including a victory at the Farmers Insurance Open, a third-place finish at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial and a fourth-place showing at THE PLAYERS Championship. He earned over \$2.8 million in 2010 and finished 27th in the FedEx Cup point standings.

Crane made the cut in 20 of 27 events in 2009, posting nine top-25 finishes. Crane made the cut in 19 of 25 events in 2008, finishing 59th overall in the FedEx Cup point standings. He played the 2008 season on a Major Medical Exemption, starting the year with a 12th-place finish at the Bob Hope Chrysler Classic and a fourth-place showing at the FBR Open. Crane finished tied for sixth at THE PLAYERS and followed with a second consecutive top-10 finish two weeks later at the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial. At the Deutsche Bank Championship in Sept. 2008, he fired a third-round 8-under 63 to finish tied for 10th — this fourth top-10 finish in 2008.

Crane played all four majors in 2006, with his best finish coming at the British Open, where he tied for 11th. For the season, he posted a 70.89 scoring average. Crane has three career PGA Tour victories and two Nationwide Tour victories and has won in excess of \$14 million during his career.

JIMMY WALKER, 1997-2001

Jimmy Walker finished his fourth season competing on the PGA Tour. His 2011 season featured four top-10 and six top-25 finishes, including fourth-place showings at the Sony Open in Hawai'i, Northern Trust Open and The Greenbrier Classic. Walker finished 2010 ranked 72nd in the FedEx Cup standings, making the cut in 13 of 27 events and posting a career-low 70.77 scoring average.

In 2009, he played in 25 events, including 24 on the PGA Tour. Walker played in 29 events during the 2008 season — 24 on the PGA Tour and five on the Nationwide Tour, making 15 cuts. He posted a career-low 70.78 scoring average in 25 PGA Tour events in 2010, finishing with six top-25 finishes.

His best PGA Tour finish came in 2010 when he finished tied for third at the Valero Texas Open. Walker was named the 2004 Nationwide Tour Player of the Year and finished the year atop the Tour's money list. Walker has three professional victories, the 2004 BellSouth Panama Championship and the 2004 Chitimacha Louisiana Open, both on the Nationwide Tour, as well as the 2007 National Mining Association Pete Dye Classic on the PGA Tour.

He has earned more than \$4 million in his career, including over \$3.4 million in four years on the PGA Tour.

ADAMS GOLF PRO TOUR SERIES

JEREMY ALCORN, 2004-07

Former Baylor All-American **Jeremy Alcorn** made his Adams Golf Pro Tour debut in Dec. 2008 at the Cypresswood Tradition Open, finishing tied for 10th. He played in 12 events on the Adams Golf Pro Tour circuit in 2008 and 2009.

Alcorn later posted back-to-back third-place finishes at the Blackhorse North Championship in Feb. 2009 and Canongate at Panther Trail Championship in March 2009. He recorded his first career professional win at Jamie Hilton's Hillcrest Childrens Golf Classic in May 2009 at Waco's Twin Rivers Golf Club. Alcorn shot 279 over four rounds, winning \$15,000.

BILL ALLCORN, 2006-09

Bill Allcorn, a four-time Academic All-Big 12 selection at Baylor, is in his third year on the Adams Golf Pro Tour Series. His career-first professional tour win was the 2010 El Paso Desert Open. His second tour win was at the 2011 Mary Bird Perkins Merrill Lynch Open. He made his Adams Golf Pro Tour debut at the Avid Golfer Classic in June 2009.

RYAN BACA, 2003-06

Ryan Baca, the last Baylor golfer to earn All-America honors in 2006, made his professional debut in May 2007 on the Adams Golf Pro Tour Series. Baca participated in eight events in 2007, making the cut five times. He posted four top-20 finishes as a rookie.

In his first full year on the circuit, Baca made the cut in 21 of 23 events, including the first 12 events. Baca finished in the top 10 in 11 of those first 12 events and the top five in five.

Baca has two tournament wins on the Adams Golf Pro Tour Series — 2010 Orr Hyundai Texarkana Classic and 2011 Bay Oaks Golf Open.

WILL DOUGHTIE, 2001-04

Will Doughtie is in his third year on the Adams Golf Pro Tour Series. Doughtie made his tour debut in June 2009 at the Coca-Cola Wal-Mart Open. He posted his first Adams Tour win at the 2010 Falcon Point Classic.
