Baylor Men's Tennis Finishes With Empty Feeling

Bears make some progress in 'disappointing' season.

Looking back at the 2001 Baylor men's tennis season, one can take one of two viewpoints -- the classic "half-full or half-empty" scenario.

Those who see the glass as half-empty point to the team's fall from national prominence. After winning the Big 12 Conference in 2000 and finishing the year ranked seventh in the nation, the 2001 edition dropped to second in the conference and concluded the year ranked 30th after losing in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. No players represented Baylor in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships, snapping a three-year streak, and the team finished with a 12-12 record, the worst in head coach Matt Knoll's five seasons at Baylor.

Optimists consider that the team lost four of six starters from last season's conference champion team and filled three of those lineup spots with true freshmen. The Bears battled through one of the toughest schedules in collegiate tennis, playing 13 matches against top-25 teams. Baylor defeated then-No. 19 Texas in Austin for the first time in school history and followed that one week later by hosting the Big 12 Championships at the new Baylor Tennis Center.

So which way does Knoll see the glass -- half-empty or half-full?

"I'm disappointed," he said. "You hope that you will be at a certain level year in and year out. That's your goal -- to be nationally competitive.

"At the same time, we had some challenges from losing the guys we did. We placed second in the Big 12. We beat Texas in Austin for the first time. There were some good things that happened."

After opening the season with a pair of road losses to top-20 teams, the Bears bounced back to win their next six in a row. A loss to then-No. 20 Miami began a stretch where Baylor faced only two unranked teams in their final 16 matches; the Bears went 6-10 to end the season, with five of those losses coming to top-10 teams. A loss to No. 40 Tulane in the NCAA first round sent the Bears home with their earliest exit since 1998.

"Our schedule was such that these guys got two years of experience in one year. They were really tested in the heat of battle," Knoll said.

Individually, the Bears had plenty of bright spots. Senior Mark Williams set school records for career singles and career doubles wins, finishing his four years at Baylor with 94 victories in each category. Williams was also honored by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association as the Region VI Arthur Ashe Award winner and as the region's nominee for the national Rafael Osuna Award. Both awards honor the player who best represents sportsmanship and leadership. Williams also received his second-straight academic all-America selection.

Reiner Neurohr was named Big 12 Freshman of the Year. Sophomore Zoltan Papp won the award last year for the Bears, giving the team back-to-back winners.

"That's a significant accomplishment, and it's a credit to Reiner's talent and effort. He grew a lot this year," Knoll said.

Freshman Matias Marin came to Baylor in January and settled in at the No. 5 spot in the lineup, where he won the Big 12 positional gold medal. The Bears won three other silver medals (Nos. 4 and 6 singles, No. 1 doubles).

"We had chances to win out there, but we didn't always get our hands around it," Knoll said. "But if second in the Big 12 and 28th nationally is disappointing, then that's a testimonial to how far the program has come.

"I'm excited about next year. We are in good position to take a step forward into the neighborhood we want to be in."

Knoll-ing Right Along

Head coach Matt Knoll is 93-58 in his six seasons, 85-42 at Baylor (five seasons)... His 75th win at Baylor came on the road against Tulane (2/11)... Knoll was named to the Region VI Advisory Committee for the 2001 NCAA Men's Tennis Championships.

(Facing) Simply the Best

During the 2001 regular season, Baylor faced 14 of the 64 teams selected for the 2001 NCAA Tournament; the Bears compiled a 5-10 record against those teams (Baylor played Texas twice).

The Bears played 12 teams during the spring that qualified for the 2000 NCAA Tournament and nine teams that began the spring ranked among the top 25. That schedule easily ranked among the toughest in the nation.

Ten of the Bears' 12 losses in 2001 came against top-25 teams; five of those 10 came to top-10 squads. Baylor has only lost three times to a team not ranked among the top 25 since the start of the 1999 season. The Bears are 30-2 against unranked teams under head coach Matt Knoll.

Double(s) Trouble

Baylor was 11-1 when winning the doubles point, but the team was 1-11 when the opponent took the first point. The Bears swept doubles six times and won all six matches. The team's only loss after winning the first point came April 6 to Notre Dame (4-3).

Double(s) Your Pleasure

The team of Reiner Neurohr and Mark Williams was selected as the No. 5 alternate for the NCAA Men's Tennis Doubles Tournament. Despite ranking no lower than 28th this season, the team was passed over for selection in the field of 32.

Williams Heads Straight to the Top

Senior Mark Williams tied the school record for career singles victories with his 94th career win April 27 against Colorado in the first round of the Big 12 Championships.

Williams also set the Baylor career doubles wins record; he broke that mark during the fall and ended his career with 94 victories.

Climbing the Ladder

Other current Baylor players writing their names in the record books:

- Csongor Bibza finished his career ranked sixth in school history in career singles wins (47) and third in career doubles wins (74). His 27 doubles wins in 2001 tied for the third-highest total in Baylor history.
- Cory Ross' 24 wins as a freshman were the 10th highest single-season total in school history.
- Mark Williams won 21 doubles matches in 2000-01, the 10th-best mark in program history.

A Little Home Cooking Goes A Long Way

In five seasons under head coach Matt Knoll, the Bears are 43-16 at home. That mark includes matches played at the Streich Tennis Courts, Baylor Tennis Center, and various indoor courts.

The Bears saw a 22-match home win streak come to an end with a 7-0 loss to then-No. 3 Duke (3/15). Before that, the Bears' last loss at home came April 17, 1998, when the Bears lost to Texas A&M in the final match of the regular season.

Between April 16, 1999, and March 10, 2001, the Baylor men's and women's tennis teams won a combined 34 straight matches at home (16 by the men, 18 by the women).

Big 12 = Big Success

Baylor has won 20 of its last 23 regular season matches against Big 12 opponents. The stretch includes a 13-match win streak, which ended March 23 at home against Kansas. Prior to that, the Bears' last defeat by a conference opponent was a 4-3 loss April 22, 1999, on the road against then-No. 7 Texas.

Baylor in the Rankings

The Bears' No. 43 ranking (3/21) was the team's lowest at any point since Baylor entered the polls for the first time ever in December 1997 at No. 68.

The Baylor men's and women's tennis teams were both in the top 25 for 53 straight weeks, a streak which ended March 21 when the men fell to No. 43. The stretch began March 15, 2000, when the women moved up to No. 18.

Senior Mark Williams earned his first-ever career singles ranking in September (No. 68), and freshman Reiner Neurohr earned his first career singles ranking in December (No. 91).

The doubles team of Neurohr and Williams earned a ranking of No. 20 before even playing a match together. The pair moved as high as No. 4 in the nation (Dec. 2000).

Injury Troubles

The Bears lost 2000 Big 12 Freshman of the Year Zoltan Papp to an ACL tear suffered during the summer which forced him to miss the entire fall season... Senior Mark Williams suffered an abdominal injury against Mississippi State (1/27) which forced him to miss one match.

Honor Roll

The Baylor men earned two singles nominations and one doubles selection on the **preseason all-Big 12 team**. Senior all-American Mark Williams and 2000 Big 12 Freshman of the Year Zoltan Papp were named to the singles all-conference team, while the team of Williams and freshman Reiner Neurohr represented Baylor on the doubles listing.

Four current Bears were named to the **Fall 2000 Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll**: Reiner Neurohr, Sean O'Connor, Cory Ross, and Mark Williams. Former Bears Pawel Gajdzik, David Hodge, Johann Jooste and Johannes Michalsky also made the list, which honors all varsity athletes who register a semester GPA of 3.0 or better.

Sophomore Zoltan Papp was honored as **Big 12 Player of the Week** for April 15-21 after compiling a perfect 3-0 record for the week in singles.

Senior Mark Williams and Baylor tennis alumnus Johannes Michalsky made the **Academic All-Big 12** first team; former Baylor ace Johann Jooste was named to the second team. The honor was Williams' fourth academic all-Big 12 selection and the third time he has made the first team.

Senior Mark Williams was named **All-Big 12** in singles, and the doubles team of Williams and freshman Reiner Neurohr was named all-conference in doubles.

The Baylor men earned four **Big 12 position medals**. Freshman Matias Marin earned the gold at No. 5 singles, while Zoltan Papp (No. 4 singles), Cory Ross (No. 6 singles) and Neurohr/Williams (No. 1 doubles) each earned silver medals.

Senior Mark Williams was the Region VI honoree for both the **Arthur Ashe Award** and the **Rafael Osuna Award**. Both awards honor the player who best represents sportsmanship and leadership.

Reiner Neurohr was named **Big 12 Freshman of the Year** as he stepped into the Baylor lineup at No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles shortly after joining the Bears.

Senior Mark Williams earned **first-team academic all-district** and **third-team academic all-America** honors. He also received one of 13 **postgraduate scholarships** from the Big 12 Conference.

Bears Unveil New Tennis Facility

Baylor University unveiled the new Baylor Tennis Center on a prime-time stage April 26-29 as the Bears hosted the Big 12 Championships. The facility earned rave reviews from the league's coaches, who marveled at the latest addition to Baylor's athletic facilities.

The Baylor Tennis Center has six varsity courts plus a center court, which is flanked by two additional courts. Chairback seating for 1,268 tennis patrons overlook the main six courts; terraced berms at either end of the complex allow the facility to seat 1,500 fans at normal capacity, with room to add bleachers and increase seating to 4,500 when necessary.

A team clubhouse runs alongside the courts on the opposite side of the stands. When completed this summer, the building will house a pro shop, training rooms, meeting rooms, public and team locker rooms and coaches' offices. It will also include office space and locker rooms for the softball team.

In the near future, six indoor courts will be added behind the main grandstand.
